ADMINISTRATOR'S REMARKS

The Wetlands Administrator recommends that the license be granted as the applicant's proposed activities are an exercise of his riparian rights to wharf out for navigation and to protect his property from shoreline erosion. He concurs with MDE that there will be no direct impacts to aquatic resources or upland habitat. After holding a public informational hearing, the Administrator received three public comments. The Administrator held his review in abeyance until the U.S. Army issued its individual permit authorizing the activities. On February 1, 2013, the Administrator addressed the public comments in writing. The Administrator concludes in his Report that the public comments are based on neighbors' past practice of accessing applicant's beach as their own and that a license must be granted based on the riparian rights that attach to applicant's property.

DESCRIPTION: Reference is made to Secretary's Agenda Item 9 (1/7/2004) in which the Board of Public Works approved the Department of Business and Economic Development lending \$1.75 million in general-obligation bond proceeds to MEDCO to use to acquire 113 acres south of the Cambridge-Dorchester Airport for the Dorchester Technology Park. The Item approved some of those funds being spent for pre-development costs. Upon Board approval, DBED encumbered the entire approved amount.

The County purchased the land using its own funds with the intention of being reimbursed by MEDCO once the infrastructure was in place. The County later elected, with DBED and MEDCO's concurrence, to maintain ownership of the Park and was not reimbursed for acquisition costs as the Board approval had contemplated. The only amount of the encumbered MCCBL funds that was spent was \$486,450 for development costs.

DBED now seeks to repurpose the remaining encumbered money and use it as a conditional grant directly to Dorchester County. The County would use the money to partially fund construction of an incubator to be located in the Technology Park. The \$2.3 million incubator will comprise approximately 15,000 square feet of office space on 4.6 acres. This will be the first technology incubator in the Eastern Shore Region. The proposed incubator and business development facility will focus on increasing the rate of start-up and survival of small businesses in the region.

The proposed DBED grant will require the County to operate the project as an incubator for eligible industry sectors for five years following project completion. The County's promise will be secured by a lien on the facility (including the 4.6 acres).

Copies of the solicitation notice were directly mailed to 53 potential Offerors, all of which are Maryland firms and eight are MBEs. Four proposals were received in response to the RFP, all of which were deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. F&D's proposal demonstrated a clear understanding of the Calvert County judicial system and the environment in which the services are to be provided. In addition, F&D's proposal indicated a depth of experience in family law with a thorough understanding of the nature and complexity of the work to be accomplished.

The focus of this Contract is to design and document a comprehensive and complete EM&V strategy for the EmPOWER Maryland Low Income Energy Efficiency Program (EmPOWER MD LIEEP) that meets the requirements of the Maryland Public Service Commission (PSC). Exercising this renewal option is in the best interest of the State because it is more cost-effective to continue with the current contract and build upon the system already in place with NCS Pearson, Inc. rather than have a new contract with very complex logistical and knowledge transfer issues. NCS Pearson, Inc. has built the test forms, administration manuals, and computer delivery interface, created test items for computer delivery, reports and item analysis programming that is being used currently. If the State were to conduct procurement for a new contract, all of these deliverables would be developed again from "scratch" rather than being able to build upon the existing deliverables or re-using them for the next test edition years. Additionally, due to substantial investment in startup costs, the cost for a new contract would be much more costly than the 2% increase in cost for the renewal option as compared with the contract costs for the preceding option year contract costs.

The MSAST, administered to students in grades 5 and 8 Statewide, is used to determine student and school achievements as required by the Federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act. Results are produced at the student, school, district and State levels.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to exercise the final renewal option for the Maryland School Assessment (MSA) in Reading and Mathematics 2013 - 2014 Test Edition. Along with the renewal option, this request also includes a modification for the removal of the Modified Assessments administered to students in grades 3 - 8 and the addition of the erasure analysis system (EA system) that is used to detect possible cheating in schools. This EA system has become the industry standard to determine if student responses, which are "fill in the circle" have been changed. The EA system can determine if answer choices have been changed from wrong to right, wrong to wrong or right to wrong.

The MSA, administered to students in grades 3 - 8 Statewide in reading and mathematics, is used to determine student and school achievements for accountability purposes as required by the Federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act. Results are produced at the student, school, district and state levels to determine achievements and accountability measures.

In 2008, the MSA contract was amended to include the Modified Maryland School Assessment (Mod-MSA), which is designed to measure the achievements of students with disabilities receiving special education services who meet specific participation requirements. The Mod-MSA differs in format from the MSA in that it provides students access to the grade level content standards that incorporate variations in test delivery to meet the specific learning characteristics of the student. The addition of the Mod-MSA added 12 additional tests to the contract scope. However, due to budget cuts, the Modified Assessments is being removed from this contract.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The ALT-MSA is Maryland's alternate assessment for students with significant cognitive disabilities who cannot participate in Maryland's general education assessment - the Maryland School Assessment (MSA), even with accommodations. As a component of the State's Education Accountability Program, all students in grades 3 - 8 and 10 in Maryland participate in either the MSA or the ALT-MSA.

Participation in the ALT-MSA is determined by the grade that a student would normally be in based on his or her age, rather than based on his or her level of cognitive functioning. The ALT-MSA consists of a portfolio of artifacts for reading and mathematics that are collected during the period from October - February each year. Each student portfolio also includes a videotape of the student engaged in a task representing one of his or her reading or mathematics or science mastery goals. Maryland's Freestate ChalleNGe program is endorsed by the State of Maryland and is in a cooperative agreement between The Maryland National Guard and the National Guard Bureau. REMARKS: The Engineer's Estimate was \$25,833,904.

This Solicitation was advertised on eMM and on the MAA Website. The solicitation was sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and five (5) minority business associations on November 14, 2012. Thirty-five (35) sets of specifications were sold and eleven (11) firms submitted bids.

The DBE goal established for this contract was 25%; however American Infrastructure will be exceeding the goal by 1.01%

MAA received a protest from Brawner Builders, Inc. the sixth lowest bidder (and whose bid was nearly \$3 million higher than the low bidder). Brawner's protest was based upon the way other bidders computed the construction quality control plan (CQC) for line items X-4-3.1A and X-4-31C. Brawner alleged that the bids submitted by the first five bidders were non-responsive because they failed to compute the CQC percentage as delineated on the bid form. However, the bid form contained clerical errors for the two line items which referred the bidders to the wrong items upon which to compute the percentage. Eight other CQC plan line items used the correct bid items upon which to make the computation. Because the two CQC items did not correctly state the bid items upon which to make the computation, MAA determined that it was in the State's best interest to take corrective action and delete these two bid items from the bid in accordance with GP2.17 which permits MAA to reject a bid in whole or part and in accordance with GP2.19D which permits MAA to make an award by item or groups by items or total bid when it has been determined that it is in the best interest of the State to do so.

The deleted items represent non-construction work and are a very small percentage of the estimated contract cost. The engineer's estimate for these deleted items was \$1,500 and \$2,160 respectively (compared to an engineer's estimate of approximately \$25 million for the entire contract). This action did not change the order of the bids and all bidders were notified of MAA's action on February 15, 2013.

MAA's corrective action effectively rendered Brawner's protest moot. Brawner filed a second protest on February 22, 2013 alleging that MAA action in deleting the flawed line items was inappropriate and contrary to Maryland law and public policy. MAA's corrective action, however, was in accordance with the Maryland law and the provisions of the solicitation. MAA denied the protest on March 7, 2013. Brawner did not file an appeal with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals.

The Runway 15R-33L RSA improvement program was previously described in MDOT Board Agenda Item 18-EX approved on May 23, 2012. The RSA improvements seek to address safety standards for runways dictated by the FAA. The work in this contract is necessary to be completed before the follow on contracts for Runway 15R-33L and final work on Runway 10-28 can be accomplished.

The Board previously approved a lease from MAA to the Maryland Transportation Authority for airport facilities projects including the runways in order to allow the Authority to issue passenger facility charge bonds. This lease was approved on November 14, 2012 as MDOT Board Agenda Item 14-LL. The bonds were issued by the Authority in December of 2012.

<u>Background</u> As the educational partner of Harford County Community College (HCC) the Harford County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) sponsors in-service programs and correctional and law enforcement academics. These non-credit programs are reviewed and approved by HCC.

Participants register for the programs, which are approved by the State of Maryland for continuing education credits. In lieu of per student tuition, the HCSO agrees to subsidize tuition to the College. The tuition subsidy is a set annual amount of \$21,600.00 payable in monthly installments of \$1,800.00.

In July 2012, the Harford County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) and the Harford County Community College (HCC) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to articulate this agreement.
