Dear Sheila.

You have asked for answers to two questions raised by the Comptroller at the August 22, 2012, meeting of the Board of Public Works ("BPW"):

- 1. What are the plans for the 500 Video Lottery Terminals ("VLT") that Penn National is returning to the State from the Perryville VLT location?
 - 2. Does the revised proposal for the Rocky Gap VLT facility require BPW approval?

As to the first question, the State Lottery Agency reports that the 500 VLTs from the Perryville location will be moved to Rocky Gap to provide the inventory needed there. Per legislation approved in the General Assembly's recent Special Session, the Lottery will continue to own the VLTs at Rocky Gap and Ocean Downs.

As to the second question, it is my view that the revised proposal of Evitts Resort, LLC ("Evitts") for the Rocky Gap VLT facility does not require BPW approval. The Office of the Attorney General ("OAG") previously advised that the revised proposal, which reduces the number of VLTs and locates the VLT facility in existing meeting and conference space at Rocky Gap Resort and Lodge, did not require an amendment to the Amended and Restated Ground Lease ("Rocky Gap Lease" or "Lease") that the BPW approved on June 20, 2012. Before the VLT Location Commission ("LC") approved the revised proposal for Rocky Gap on July 31, LC staff advised BPW staff and liaisons of this conclusion, and the related conclusion that no further BPW approval was needed, by email dated July 30. I agree with and reaffirm this advice: because the Board has already approved the Rocky Gap Lease, and the revised proposal did not require an amendment, the changes in the revised proposal do not call for BPW approval.

By way of background, Evitts's original proposal for a VLT license, which the LC approved on April 26, 2012, contemplated a 50,000 square foot facility adjacent to Rocky Gap Lodge, with 850 VLTs. The LC's approval of the license award was contingent on, among other things, BPW approval of the purchase agreement and ground lease; financial settlement of the purchase of the Resort; and submission of evidence of acceptable construction financing.

On June 20, 2012, BPW Secretary's Agenda Item 18 sought approval of: (1) the Rocky Gap Lease; (2) the MEDCO assignment to Evitts of the ground lease; (3) DNR's forgiveness of the outstanding debts owed to it; (4) the Purchase agreement between MEDCO and Evitts; and (5) the release by SHA of 17 acres of the DNR property, subject to a reversion. The agenda item contained a description of the plan for a 50,000 square foot facility housing 850 VLTS, with expected revenue of \$40 million in the first year of operations.

On Friday, July 27, Evitts advised the LC's Chair, staff, and counsel that it was unable to

secure financing for their proposal as originally planned, and put forth a revised proposed that Evitts could finance itself. Under the revised proposal, Evitts would use existing meeting and conference space for a VLT facility housing 500 VLTs; Evitts committed to replace the meeting and conference space within the 36 months, as required by State Government Article 9-1A-11(d) (2). Absent this revision to the proposal, Evitts advised that it would not be able to go to settlement, which was scheduled for the following Friday, August 3.

The LC was to meet, as previously scheduled, on Tuesday, July 31, days after Evitts had informed the LC, staff, and counsel of the changes. Over the weekend of July 28 and 29, the OAG reviewed the Rocky Gap Lease, with an eye to whether Evitts's proposed changes would require the Lease to be amended and returned to the BPW for approval. The OAG concluded that Section 5 of the Lease contained language that would accommodate changes of the nature that Evitts was proposing and that no amendment or further BPW approval of the Lease was necessary. See July 30, 2012, 6:03 email, forwarded below. These conclusions were cited by the Chair of the LC at the LC's July 31, 2012 meeting, the meeting at which the LC approved an addendum setting forth Evitts revised proposal, which was contingent on financial settlement on August 3, review and final site and design approval by DNR and (consistent with the statute), replacement of the conference and meeting space within 36 months of license issuance.

As noted, I agree with the OAG's previous conclusions that the existing BPW-approved Lease accommodates the changes that Evitts proposed. The LC has approved those changes, in at least partial reliance on this advice and the advice that the revised proposal would not require BPW approval. I think this advice was and is correct.

I will be pleased to address the Board at the September 19, 2012 meeting to discuss these matters and answer any questions. Thank you.

We wanted to give you a heads up about an issue with Rocky Gap that has emerged since Friday. Evitts informed us that they have been unable to secure financing and, as such, may not be able to go to settlement later this week. Evitts has suggested several options, the most attractive being to allow them to operate 500 video lottery terminals in the Lodge and Resort temporarily. Chairman Fry requested that Evitts submit a revised plan to the Commission and present the plan at tomorrow's meeting. The OAG has advised us that approval of a temporary facility does not require amendment of the ground lease or returning to the BPW for approval. However, you are welcome to attend the meeting, which begins at 1:00 p.m. in the Joint Hearing Room. In any event, we will keep you posted. If you have any questions, we will attempt to answer them.



RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Public Works approve the Department of Housing and Community Development lending \$144,000 in general obligation bond proceeds to the Bethai Company (dba My Thai Restaurant) to fund the capital improvement portion of the following project.

PROGRAM: The Neighborhood Business Development Program, operating as Neighborhood BusinessWorks, provides gap financing for small businesses starting up or expanding in locally-designated neighborhood revitalization areas throughout Maryland. Loans are made to Maryland-based local development corporations, microenterprises, nonprofit organizations, or small businesses. Loans and grants are made to these organizations whose activities contribute to the broader revitalization of the designated neighborhood (e.g., reuse of vacant/underutilized buildings or providing needed goods or services to area residents). Financing ranges from \$1,000 up to \$500,000 or 50 % of total project costs (whichever is less). Borrowers must contribute cash of at least 5% of the total project cost.



PROJECT: My Thai Restaurant operated and leased space in the basement of the Park Plaza Professional building at 800 N Charles Street in Mount Vernon for four years. On December 7, 2010 a five-alarm fire blazed through the historic building. The fire completely destroyed the interior and displaced all the tenants. The Bethai Company, dba My Thai Restaurant, plans to relocate the restaurant to a 5,702 sq. ft. location at 1300 Bank Street. This location was formerly occupied by two previous Neighborhood BusinessWorks projects, the restaurants Lemongrass and Tsunami; My Thai will occupy the vacant Lemongrass suite. The principal owners of the Bethai Company, James and Varattaya Wales, need assistance to rebuild their successful restaurant business.

Located on the edge of the Harbor East and Little Italy neighborhoods, 1300 Bank Street (known as the Holland Tack Factory building) sits at the intersection of Bank Street and South Central Avenue. The restaurant suite faces the Canal Street Malt House, a 38 unit-condominium development. The Harbor East/Little Italy area is a vibrant mix of business and residential properties and activity. The rejuvenation of many historic and architecturally significant buildings has enabled the community to attract interest. This neighborhood revitalization project will improve and occupy a vacant commercial property, as well as sustain and create jobs in Baltimore City.

Remarks: This property was purchased in 1851 by the Beneficial Society of the Laboring Sons "to provide a burial ground for citizens of color." Over 1,500 African-Americans were interred on the site between 1851 and 1949, when the Society disbanded and the property was given to the City of Frederick. A portion of the site was paved as an alley and the remainder became a "whites only" playground. The grounds were re-dedicated in 2003 as a place of remembrance for those buried there and for the history of African Americans in Frederick County.

Issuance of 90-day notice: Investment Activities in Iran

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works notify the companies listed in this Item that it intends to include them on a list of companies engaged in investment activities in Iran. Inclusion on the IAI List would make these businesses ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with a public body in Maryland for goods or services.

Authority: §17-701, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland

Background: Chapter 447, Laws of 2012 prohibits a person who is identified as engaging in investment activities in Iran from participating in procurements with a public body in the State. Specifically, a person engaged in such investment activities is ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or renew a contract for goods and services. Engaging in investment activities in Iran consists of:

- Providing goods or services of at least \$20.0 million in the energy sector of Iran; or
- For financial institutions, extending credit of at least \$20.0 million to another person for at least 45 days if the person is on the BPW list and will use the credit to provide goods or services in the energy of Iran.

This law requires the Board to use credible information - available to the public - to create a list of persons that they determine to be engaged in investment activities in Iran. Before the Board includes a person on the list the Board must provide the person with 90 days' written notice that:

- The Board intends to include the person on the list; and
- Inclusion on the list would make the person ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or renew a contract with a public body for goods or services.

During the 90-day period, the person may provide written documentation demonstrating that the person is not engaged in investment activities in Iran.

Action: Approval of this Item will permit Board staff to issue 90-day notices to the companies identified in this item.

REMARKS: Nature of Emergency: A collapse of the stone facing on one a wing wall on the historic Casselman River Bridge created an unsafe condition. This condition hindered public access to cross the bridge and to use the area under and around the bridge for fishing. Nature of Emergency: Patients at Eastern Shore Hospital Center require psychiatric services. In the past this service was provided by salaried staff with limited contractual support. As of June 2012, a crisis situation had developed as five of six psychiatrist staff positions were vacant including the Clinical Director's position. Due to the difficulty of filling positions at the State salary level and the timeframes involved, it was necessary to solicit these services as a contract. The solicitation was to procure a contractor to coordinate clinical services to assigned patients and advise other health care support staff of appropriate treatment techniques needed for individual cases; provide full psychiatric services to assigned patients as directed by the clinical director; provide individual, family and group therapy; review patient records and complete medical record documentation on patients in a timely manner to ensure documentation adequacy and compliance with hospital procedures; and meet with patients and their families to discuss treatment plans and address concerns.

Basis for Selection: Eastern Shore Hospital Center contacted eight locum tenens companies. In discussion with each company, the Hospital informed the vendors that before a contract would be signed, the company had to provide the hospital with a list of psychiatrists that were available or would become available within two to three months and their curriculum vitae with the intent of hiring at least four psychiatrists. Recognizing that this is a short-term solution to the problem, Eastern Shore Hospital Center continues to actively recruit through professional journals for psychiatrists and using local contacts. The issue is not exclusive to Eastern Shore Hospital Center. DHMH estimates that there are at least eleven psychiatrist vacancies on the Eastern Shore alone at hospital, acute general hospitals, and community programs. Through the efforts of the Clinical Director, DHMH was able to hire a psychiatrist who is working three days a week contractually on a trial basis who is considering a full-time position. The first psychiatrist from the agency started on July 9th and he has indicated that if his trial period is successful, he may be interested in long-term employment. Two other psychiatrists interviewed through this agency with a potential August start date have indicated likewise.

Both Thomas B. Finan Center and Springfield Hospital Center have used similar arrangements with locum tenens companies for obtaining psychiatrist services when needed. The contractor is ready, willing and able to place personnel on-site at the start of the contract period.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com*, the agency website, and through the Money Follows the Person Demonstration (MFP) Stakcholders email distribution list maintained by DHMH. Six vendors received direct notification of the RFP. All solicited prospective vendors are Maryland firms, and three are MBEs. A copy of the RFP was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

The Maryland Department of Disabilities (MDOD) and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) are partnering to implement peer outreach and support services as part of the Maryland Money Follows the Person Demonstration (MFP) Grant. MFP, a federal rebalancing initiative created by the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 and reauthorized by the Affordable Care Act of 2010, was designed to encourage states to transition eligible and interested Medicaid recipients currently residing in nursing facilities back to homes in their communities. MFP is funded through a federal grant that allows states to collect an enhanced federal match on services provided to individuals who transition from an institution to the community. Many nursing facility residents remain unaware of the community-based options available and the successes of others who have transitioned back to the community. Stakeholders involved in advising DHMH on the implementation of MFP in Maryland expressed continued interest in utilizing peers to share knowledge of community-based services. Furthermore, stakeholders identified additional roles for peers through MFP and consequently Maryland's Operational Protocol, which was recently revised, added peer support to the list of services available to nursing facility residents through the Demonstration.

DHMH, the single-state Medicaid agency, has requested MDOD's assistance in implementing peer outreach and support statewide as part of Maryland's MFP Grant. During the prior Demonstration period, DHMH made multiple attempts to procure contractors throughout Maryland; after three attempts, DHMH was unsuccessful in awarding a contract in two regions and the procurement process in the other three regions took as long as 18 months to make award recommendations. MDOD has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with DHMH to procure, award and administer peer outreach and support contracts in the following eight regions of the State of Maryland:

Metro Region - Prince George's and Montgomery counties (Sole Source contract); West Region - Garrett, Allegany, and Washington counties (Sole Source contract); Northwest Region - Frederick and Carroll counties (Sole Source contract); South Region - Charles, Calvert and St. Mary's counties (Sole Source contract); Central Region - Anne Arundel and Howard counties (approved by DBM);

East Region - Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico and Worcester counties (on this Item);

North Region - Baltimore and Harford counties (on this Item); and,

City Region - Baltimore City (on this Item).

MDOD recently entered into sole source contracts for four of the eight regions to implement nursing facility peer outreach and support services to eligible residents as follows: Independence Now, Inc. (IN) for the Metro Region; Resources for Independence (RFI) for the West Region; The Freedom Center (FC) for the Northwest Region; and Southern Maryland Center for Independent Living (SMCIL) for the South Region. MDOD identified the above-named vendors as the single entity in their respective regions with the background, experience, and expertise to provide peer outreach and support services to nursing facility residents. These contracts were approved by the BPW on the 5/23/2012 DBM BPW Agenda, Item 1-S.

In the remaining four regions MDOD identified multiple sources of vendors to provide peer outreach and support services. Therefore, competitive procurements were conducted to provide services in these regions. One of the contract awards (the Central Region) was within the delegated authority of DBM to approve. MDOD is requesting approval to enter into contracts for the remaining three regions of the State to implement nursing facility peer outreach and support services to eligible residents as follows: Community Change Management Consulting, LLC, for the CITY Region; The Holly Community (HC) for the Eastern Region; and Independent Marylanders Achieving Growth Through Empowerment, Inc., (IMAGE) for the Northern Region.

No MBE Participation Goal was established for these contracts. This project is targeted to a specific priority population. The skills and background required to perform under this contract require a broad knowledge of community-based service options, significant expertise in providing outreach to nursing facility residents as well as established relationships with administrative and direct care staff within the nursing facilities. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The Maryland State Department of Assessments and Taxation (SDAT) has been using the Marshall Cost Valuation Method for valuing commercial properties for 30 years, since 1981. From 1973 until 1981, SDAT used an internal cost estimating manual, the Maryland Cost Manual, which was developed internally, specifically for its own use. This was a three volume set of cost tables, that was the produced for SDAT by Mr. Tom Ball, who was once associated with the E. H. Boeckh Company, a nationally known cost estimating service. All assessors, starting with the State takeover of the assessment process in 1974, were trained in the use of the cost manual and its related methodology.

Over the last 30 years, Marshall & Swift Co. and the E.H. Boeckh Co. have been the two leading, nationally recognized, reliable, and easy-to-use sources for building cost information. In 2001 these two companies merged, creating what some might term a monopoly, offering a cost estimating system that has become the industry standard for the insurance industry, professional appraisers and assessment cost estimators. There are no alternative providers for this type of information.

Updating building cost estimates requires a high level of validation and support. At the same time, the building and construction industry is constantly introducing new materials and methods that challenge the past historical cost results. Multipliers must be developed, tested, and applied annually to bring historic cost estimates into line with current building cost levels. SDAT has more than 100 different commercial building types identified in the current Computer Assisted Mass Appraisal (CAMA) system. The Marshall Cost Manual was adopted as the preferred cost information source for commercial and industrial properties. The methodology used in Marshall was very similar to the Boeckh method, so the Marshall approach was easily adapted for use in Maryland. It has been asserted that the Marshall Cost rates are extremely reliable and authoritative on a national level, providing a high degree of validity and confidence in support of the commercial valuation process. For SDAT this is a very important consideration in producing building cost estimates for assessment purposes.

The Marshall method has been thoroughly intermixed with the Maryland commercial valuation system, which in essence means the Marshall method has become the Maryland method. SDAT is highly dependent on the Marshall method, providing cost information as a necessary component of the Maryland commercial assessment process. There is no alternative source for this specialized information.

SDAT has subscribed to Marshall's rates as a basis for SDAT commercial building cost estimates in each successive form, using the same basic methodology for more than 20 years. The Marshall method is the program the SDAT assessors know and rely on. It is nationally accepted as a valid and authoritative source of building cost data. If another source for building cost data was procured, it would require a significant amount of programming and training to affect the change. This change would be cost prohibitive to SDAT and have a negative fiscal impact to the State of Maryland.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreements require that only Primary Procurement Units (as defined in COMAR 21.05.09) may participate in such cooperative purchasing agreements. DBM as a Primary Procurement Unit has in turn approved the participation of DHMH's WIC Program via the requested approval of a contract with the Gerber Products Company to provide revenue-generating rebates on infant cereal.

This contract is a revenue-generating contract involving the WIC agencies in the States of Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey, and West Virginia, the Commonwealths of Pennsylvania, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico all of whom participated in a solicitation issued by the State of Virginia acting as the lead government agency. Because this procurement was conducted by Virginia on behalf of the above named governments, including Maryland, and only involves the payment of rebates, no MBE goal was established for this contract. Although Virginia started the process in a timely fashion, unexpected delays with issuing the IFB and the review process delayed awarding a new contract to Gerber Products Company. A three month extension of the previous contract through the state of West Virginia was obtained in order for Virginia to complete the procurement. Retroactive approval of the extension is being requested on this agenda as Item 12-S-MOD. This new contract was awarded by Virginia on July 23, 2012 with an August 1, 2012 start date to avoid a gap in rebate payments.

The Maryland WIC Program will receive a monetary rebate of an estimated \$1,315,440.00 with this contract for all infant cereal purchased with WIC checks in Maryland. Approving this contract allows the WIC Programs to comply with Federal Regulation 7-CFR 246.16a (g) that requires state agencies to explore methods of cost containment for the purchase of infant formula and other WIC foods.

The amount of revenue to be generated by this contract is based on the estimated monthly average of \$36,540.00 in rebates for the three year (36 month) period for the infant cereals provided under this contract. This was calculated based on redeemed checks for infant cereals multiplied by the rebate amounts. By Federal regulation, all revenues generated by this contract must be used to offset food expenditures for the women, infants and children served by the WIC Program.

Since the Maryland WIC Program was a named participant in the solicitation issued by Virginia for this service, under Maryland law it was required that notice of the solicitation be advertised on eMaryland Marketplace. This did not occur. However, this oversight was unintentional and no Maryland firm was disadvantaged by not having the opportunity to see such eMaryland Marketplace notice since Virginia directly solicited all companies who make infant cereal, none of which are located in Maryland.

Nonetheless, the above described failure to provide notice makes this contract voidable. The Board has the authority to ratify voidable contracts. By approving this Item the Board will ratify this contract notwithstanding the failure to provide required notice.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com* (eMM) with the system automatically notifying 22 vendors. In addition, the Division of Rehabilitation Services (DORS) directly solicited four vendors, two of which also received the eMM notice. Of the 24 solicited vendors, 21 are Maryland firms, two are certified minority businesses, and one is a certified small business.

Only one responsive bid was received in response to the IFB. One bid was delivered a day late, via FedEx, and could not be accepted. It was returned to the bidder upon notification of the late receipt. The recommended vendor is responsible, and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Moreover, the price has been deemed fair and reasonable. Koons Ford of Annapolis is one of only two vendors in Maryland that have dealer and mechanic certifications to complete high-end EMC installations. It was also determined that other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to Koons Ford of Annapolis.

Reasons given by vendors for not submitting a bid included: do not perform this type of service; do not install high-tech electronics in vehicles anymore; not interested in bidding on this vehicle conversion at this time; other commitments prevented timely bid submission; or do not currently have certified mechanics to allow them to perform these type of conversions.

The bid solicitations for vehicle modifications/conversions require line item prices, identifying the separate equipment and labor amounts. DORS compares prices from one consumer vehicle conversion to another with the same or comparable equipment. Even though each consumer vehicle is evaluated and prescribed adaptive equipment on an individual basis, there is a finite number of ways consumer functional limitations can be assisted by technology. Knowing the historical prices of the equipment allows DORS to provide management with an estimated price for each new "prescription". The estimate establishes the basis for the review and approval prior to engaging in the bid process. It also allows a validation of the reasonableness of the price of this single bid.

This vehicle modification contract will enable a consumer with a spinal cord injury with C5-6 Quadriplegia secondary to ATV accident in 2008 to have accessibility to drive his van from his wheelchair. These vehicle modifications on the DORS consumer's vehicle enable independent driving capabilities and independent living for the consumer. It will enable the consumer to transport himself to work and provide ongoing transportation independence and self sufficiency.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com*, through which 195 prospective vendors, 107 of which are Maryland firms, 48 Certified Small Businesses and 37 Certified Minority Businesses, were notified.

One proposal was received in response to the RFP, and it was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror was determined to be responsible; the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable; and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to PDG Rehabilitation Services, Inc. (PDGRS), the sole Offeror, which is a Maryland Certified Minority Business Enterprise and a Maryland Certified Small Business.

Three prospective offerors attended the Pre-Proposal Conference, one of which was PDGRS, to whom DORS is recommending the contract award. The remaining two Pre-Proposal Conference attendees were contacted to learn why they did not submit a proposal. Both stated that they did not have experience in business development procedures required to establish self-employment businesses for individuals with disabilities. Reasons provided by other vendors not responding to this solicitation were that they could not complete the requirements under the budget for this service; they could not meet a 10% MBE participation goal under established budget for this service; they were too small of an organization to meet requirements; or they did not perform the type of services required.

DORS provides for services for disabled individuals. One component of DORS' activities is to help individuals explore entrepreneurial self-employment as a vocational option by developing business plans, accessing financing and successfully opening and operating a business through DORS' Reach Independence through Self Employment (RISE) Program. RISE was expanded in 2002 to include supported business enterprises for individuals with significant cognitive impairments.

ITEM: 6-S (Cont.)

The RFP required that contractors must have a demonstrated ability to establish effective relationships with community partners who can further the mission of the RISE program. In addition, contractors had to provide qualified consultants who are (1) well-versed with business development procedures, (2) are sensitive to the needs of individuals with disabilities, and (3) are able to meet reporting and outcome requirements.

PDGRS's technical proposal demonstrated an expert understanding of the issues involved with entrepreneurship, loans, etc. and the importance of delivering assistance within the policies of the Agency. PDGRS's proposal also provided an understanding of the role of counselors for the individuals with disabilities who will be served by this contract and the challenges of meeting delivering services Statewide in a variety of rural and urban areas. And PDGRS's proposal clearly demonstrated its understanding of the need for this service, compliance with DORS policies, disability issues and business issues.

Businesses developed in the RISE Program are typically growth businesses, adding to economic output and Maryland job rolls. At a minimum, individuals are employed and the possibility of additional employment is created. For example, many RISE Program businesses intend to employ other persons with disabilities as an integral part of its business plan. This generates additional jobs and attendant economic and non-economic benefits geared to the target population.

A 10% MBE participation goal was established for this contract; however, the recommended contractor has committed to a 10.5% MBE participation goal.

BCCC has procured a new one-year sole source contract, effective 7/1/2012, under its delegated authority to continue services while the College performs a new competitive procurement for online tutoring services.

The NetTutor Online Tutoring Service is a web-based service provided by Link Systems International, Inc. that is customized for each institution and staffed with qualified, U.S.-based tutors. Tutors are required to have obtained a four-year degree from an accredited university, however, a master's degree or doctoral degree is preferred. Tutors must have experience teaching in the American education system and/or prior experience tutoring American students and helping students succeed. Tutors must also have demonstrated experience/expertise in the subject-area in which the candidate wants to tutor (upper-level courses in the subject area preferred).

BCCC published a competitive solicitation for online tutoring services on July 28, 2009, rather than continue its sole source contract with Smarthinking, Inc. based upon the determination that there were now other vendors that could perform online tutoring services. On September 9, 2009, recommendation of award was made to Link Systems International, Inc. ("Link Systems"), and a one-year contract was awarded by BCCC under its delegated authority with Link Systems.

On September 21, 2009, BCCC published a solicitation for a multi-year online tutoring services contract, with proposals due date of May 20, 2010. After evaluations were completed, recommendation of a multi-year contract award was made to Link Systems on July 26, 2010. However, due to delays and miscommunications by BCCC and Link Systems, this contract was never formally approved and finalized. In order to make sure that online tutoring services were not interrupted to BCCC students, BCCC amended the original 2009 one-year contract, extending the term and payments through a series of modifications and purchase orders. As the total cumulative contract amount has exceeded BCCC's delegated authority, without approval by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), retroactive approval of the original contract and extensions is now requested from the BPW.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Plaintiff filed this lawsuit in April 2009 against the Secretary of DHR seeking an injunction that would require the Secretary to ensure that all applications for food stamps, Medicaid and Temporary Cash Assistance were processed in a timely manner as required by federal and state law. A second plaintiff was added in August 2009. After a three day trial, the court found for the plaintiffs. Plaintiffs petitioned the court for fees and costs totaling \$953,287.55, which the State opposed. Thereafter, the State filed its opposition and the Court reduced the attorneys' fees awarded to the plaintiffs to \$524,308.15.

The Office of the Attorney General and DHR recommend payment of \$526,893.78, which represents \$524,308.15 in attorneys' fees and expenses and \$2,858.63 in interest.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: It is imperative to the success of the Exchange that these positions be requested and approved as quickly as possible. Maryland is considered THE LEADER in Exchanges in the country, but lacks the resources to build an effective Exchange. With only nine PINs, it is impossible for the Exchange to succeed; other states already have 20, 40, even 60 state employees dedicated to their Exchanges. The 33 positions are long-term positions that will support all key core functions of the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange as required by the Affordable Care Act and by the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange Acts of 2011 and 2012. This complement is based on specific requirements defined by the federal government, was developed with the support of consultants, reviewed with other states for competency and approved by the Center for Consumer Information and Insurance Oversight. Because many of the positions are specialized and are new and specialized activities for the State, it is most suitable to recruit for these positions as permanent positions and not contractual.

All positions requested are full-time positions and represent the ongoing needs of the Exchange. The Exchange's enabling legislation allows the Executive Director to set the classification, grade and compensation of the staff of the Exchange. In determining the position grades and salaries for these positions, the Exchange worked directly with DHMH to classify the positions based on the work being completed.

As mentioned above, the 33 requested positions will initially be supported entirely with federal funds. The Maryland Health Benefit Exchange Act of 2012 establishes a joint legislative and executive committee to conduct a study, in consultation with the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange, its Financing and Sustainability Advisory Committee, and other stakeholders, and to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on the financing mechanisms which should be used to enable the Exchange to be self-sustaining by 2015. Analysis of revenue models are now being assessed and include such options as 1) Qualified Health Plan (QHP) Assessment – Exchange Members Only; 2) QHP Assessment – Issuers Total Membership; 3) Assessment on All Carriers – Fully Insured Membership 4) Broad Based Assessment on Health Care Market (e.g. self-insured, hospital revenue, health related user fee) and; 5) Other Broad Based Assessments. The final recommendation and report is due to the Governor and the General Assembly December 1, 2012.

DBM REMARKS: The Secretaries of DBM and DHMH have certified that funds are available for the new positions for which approval is requested within the Rule of 100. If the Board approves this request, 33.4 positions will have been approved within the Rule of 100 for FY2013.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The State Buildings Energy Efficiency Program Manager will coordinate the development and implementation of the DOE - Better Building Challenge Program to reduce energy consumption in state buildings 20% by 2020. The current EmPOWER Maryland goal of 15% savings by 2015 would be enhanced by State Agencies leading by example in exceeding the EmPOWER electricity reduction goal. Funding for the program will come from the federal DOE annual Base Grant. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com* and on DBM's website. In addition, a copy of the RFP was sent directly to 39 prospective offerors, of which 12 are Maryland firms and nine are MBEs.

A total of 33 proposals from seventeen different offerors were received in response to the RFP, with some vendors proposing for multiple service categories. Two offerors were determined not to be responsible and six proposals from four offerors were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award due to non-compliance with MBE submission requirements. In total 11 proposals from six different offerors were removed from further consideration due to these not responsible or not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award determinations. Nonetheless, even after these eliminations 12 different offerors were deemed qualified to provide services in one or more Service Categories, with seven qualified offerors each for Telephonic and On-site interpretations and eight qualified offerors for Written Document translations.

The amounts reflected in the Offerors' financial proposals were based on models in the RFP used for evaluation purposes to establish firm fixed unit prices for interpretation and translation services.

The RFP provided for the possibility of multiple contract awards to the same or multiple vendors; one contract for each service category, and a secondary, backup contract for On-site interpretation services (Service Category II).

For Service Category I (Telephonic), Language Line Services, LLC was ranked number one technically and number two financially, with pricing about 6% higher than the prices of the lowest priced offeror. The offeror that was ranked number one in price was ranked number seven (last) technically. It was determined that Language Line Services, LLC was worth a 6% price differential versus the much lower technically ranked, lowest priced offeror. Accordingly, it was determined that Language Line Services, LLC had the most advantageous offer and is recommended for the Category I award.

• • •

For Service Category III (Written Document), Schreiber Translations, Inc. (Schreiber), the incumbent for this Service Category, was ranked third technically and second financially. The offerors ranked number one and two technically were financially ranked number six (over 24% higher in price) and number four (15% higher in price). Although the lowest priced offeror was about 17% lower in price than Schreiber, this lowest priced offeror was ranked forth technically. It was determined that Schreiber was worth its price differential over the lowest priced offeror, but that the two higher technically ranked offerors than Schreiber were not worth their price differentials over Schreiber. Accordingly, the determination was that Schreiber represented the most advantageous offer for the State and is recommended for the Category III award.

The MBE participation goals were determined based on a combination of researching opportunities for subcontractors and historical performance under the prior contracts. ... The goals remain the same as the previous contracts at 15% goals for the Telephonic interpretation and Written Document translation Service Categories.

Functional Area I – COTS Software
Functional Area II – Installation and Training Services
Functional Area III – Manufacturer's Software Maintenance

There will be a second level of competition through a Purchase Order Request for Proposal (PORFP) process for all COTS software and services offered under this contract. A PORFP will be sent to all Master Contractors awarded a Master Contract within the appropriate functional area who are authorized to provide the software and/or services for the requested manufacturer's product line.

In an effort to improve the efficiency of the previous COTS Master Contract, DoIT has increased the contract term to 15 years. Through constructive feedback, DoIT determined that a shorter contract term posed problems for COTS purchases, specifically in regard to software maintenance agreements. Since a maintenance agreement typically lasts for multiple years, but simultaneously cannot extend beyond the contract expiration date, the State was unable to take full advantage of these maintenance agreements. By increasing the contract term to 15 years, the State will receive the full benefit of any maintenance agreement associated with PORFPs from the COTS Master Contract.

DoIT recommends a \$36,000,000 ceiling for contract years one through three with the understanding that DoIT will return to the Board every three years, in conjunction with an advertised Expansion Window of the Master Contract, for approval of any additional successful Offerors and / or a ceiling increase if necessary. MDOT payroll's time entry system has brought huge benefits such as, tighter internal control of employee time, more accurate time keeping and instant leave balances. Further, it has eliminated paper documents, courier services and reduced errors relating to cost accounting. In addition, the system prevents employees from using unavailable leave due to its interface with the MDOT employee management information system (EMIS) and with other financial systems such as FMIS and the MDTA Solomons system. These enhancements have contributed to enhanced productivity and cost savings.

The proposed modification includes \$30,000 for the exercise of the one-year renewal option and \$121,014 for 12 months of system support and maintenance. The modification also includes \$359,754 to complete other modules such as: input time from other systems; interface with card reader systems; alert a supervisor of incomplete time reports via email; and perform associated tasks. All enhancements will be performed under a task order initiated and approved by MDOT.

Several factors have contributed to the compliance rate with the MBE subcontract goal. Due to the current state of the economy and MDOT budget constraints, many enhancement task orders that were designated as MBE subcontractor opportunities have not been initiated. The contractor will allocate 50% of the pending enhancement work to its MBE subcontractors, thereby improving its MBE compliance rate. . . Before recommending award of further options or modifications, MDOT will re-evaluate the contractor's MBE subcontractor performance.

REMARKS: DHMH is requesting a modification to the existing Medicaid Enterprise Restructuring Project (MERP) Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) contract under the system's early take over clause to upgrade the State's current Medicaid Incentive Payment Program (eMIPP), a subsystem of MMIS, to meet federal requirements for Year 2 of the Medicaid Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive Program (the Program).

The Medicaid EHR Incentive Program that runs from 2010 to 2021, provides incentive payments for eligible Medicaid providers to obtain Electronic Health Records. Approval of this modification to the current MERP MMIS contract will allow the State to move the current eMIPP subsystem of MMIS into the MERP system.

when the contract was originally awarded, but is necessary due to circumstances that came to light once work had begun.

When MTA conducted its normal community and business outreach at the start of construction, certain business owners in the area expressed concern regarding traffic patterns and disturbances during construction. The business owners and other stakeholders proposed, and MTA agreed, that the most effective and efficient way to address those concerns would be to request traffic management assistance from the Baltimore County Police Department. Due to overtime costs and overall resource constrains, MTA could not use its own Police force to provide traffic management services. MTA has allowed contractors to hire local police forces for this type of work on other Light Rail construction projects in Baltimore County. The cost of those traffic management services is not to exceed \$44,880.

Also, after work under this contract had begun, Baltimore County conducted a video inspection of sewer lines in the area. When MTA constructed the Light Rail line to Hunt Valley, MTA had committed to installing a new sanitary manhole and 60 feet of PVC pipe that would be part of Baltimore County's sewer system but was located on MTA property, partially under the Light Rail tracks. The county's video inspection revealed that this work had never been performed; MTA agreed to honor its previous commitment as part of this project. The cost of the manhole and 60 linear feet of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) pipe is \$145,000. Finally, during the design stage of the work before this contract was awarded, MTA inspected a driveway crossing at Schilling Circle and deemed it to be structurally sound. However, once the work was underway it was discovered that there was unanticipated rapid deterioration of this crossing. Therefore, because Light Rail service was already shut down for the work originally anticipated under this contract, and because the work to replace the additional crossing is the same type of work that the contractor is already doing, MTA decided to request that the contractor reconstruct this additional crossing, thereby avoiding future disruption to the business community as well as the riding public that would be caused by a second shutdown. The cost of removing and replacing the additional crossing is \$407,361.

All work shall be performed in accordance with the original terms and conditions of the contract. All work to be performed conforms to the original scope of work.

REMARKS: The project for which MTA is seeking this modification entails installation of replacement ties at select locations along the State-owned rail freight line between Massey and Centreville in Kent and Queen Anne's Counties in Maryland. The line is operated by the Maryland & Delaware Railroad Company (MDDE) under contract with the State, and MDDE also provides basic maintenance of way services under the Basic Maintenance of Way (BMOW) agreement between MDDE the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) and Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) of July 29, 2008. The BMOW agreement was approved by the Board on June 25, 2008 as MDOT Item 21-GM.

MDDE operates rail freight service over various State-owned lines on the Eastern Shore serving primarily shippers of agricultural products. MDDE is required to maintain active tracks to minimum standards established by the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA). Accordingly, a maintenance of way budget of \$400,000 was established under the BMOW agreement to support basic maintenance of three State-owned rail lines operated by MDDE.

Current conditions along the Centreville Line (which runs from Centreville in Queen Anne's County to Massey in Kent County) reflect years of deferred maintenance and require a constant level of attention by MDDE Maintenance of Way crews in order to maintain safe operations along the line. Installation of new ties at select locations along the line will stabilize the track for continued safe year-round operation and allow operation of longer trains hauling export grain traffic from an on-line shipper in Queen Anne's County.

The scope of the tie replacement project exceeds the BMOW budget established for the State-owned lines in FY13 (July 1, 2012 - June 30, 2013), and MDDE maintenance of way staff levels are inadequate to perform the large scale project in a timely manner.

In order to complete the tie replacement project in FY13, MTA proposes to amend the BMOW agreement of July 29, 2008 to increase the maintenance of way budget. This would establish a new BMOW budget for the period of July 1, 2013 - June 30, 2013 and enable MDDE to procure a contractor to complete the work.

The adjacent building, where the inmate patients wait for their treatment, could not be considered initially for deconstruction since there was no other place available for waiting. JCI is now able to accommodate waiting function in the hospital building by rearranging the functions and spaces in the building. This project is a significant part of a master plan that has been adopted by the State House Trust to improve the visitor's experience in the State House and enhances the public's understanding of the four centuries of history in this National Historic Landmark.
