If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope.

Description: Baltimore City plans to renovate key areas of the 36-year old flagship Waxter Senior Center to meet ADA compliance, and fulfill life-safety and programmatic needs. The six public bathrooms do not meet ADA regulations and must be upgraded. A 4,000 square foot underused area on the first floor will be converted into a therapeutic exercise area. The therapeutic-pool locker room does not meet ADA regulations and will be upgraded to ensure ADA compliance. The center now has almost 2000 members, with an average daily attendance of approximately 100 members. These figures are expected to rise significantly when the facility is upgraded.

The Department of Aging has determined that the cost includes sufficient amounts for the project to conform to building, fire, handicapped access and all other code requirements, and that the project may be reasonably completed with the funds being requested.

All 66 units will serve households with incomes at or below 50% of the area median income. Fifty-eight units will receive U.S Department of Agriculture rent subsidies. Eight units will be restricted to households that do not exceed 50% of the area median income.

PROGRAM: The Neighborhood Business Development Program operating as Neighborhood BusinessWorks, provides flexible gap financing for small businesses starting up or expanding in Sustainable Community Areas throughout Maryland (those areas that are locally designated for the targeting of neighborhood revitalization). Loans and grants are made to Maryland-based small businesses, local development corporations, microenterprises, and nonprofit organizations whose activities contribute to the broader revitalization of designated Sustainable Communities (*e.g.*, reuse of vacant/underused buildings or providing needed goods or services to area residents). Financing may not exceed \$500,000 or half of total project costs. Loan applicants must provide cash of at least 5% of the total project cost.

PROJECT: The borrower, 407 PAA, LLC (Richard Naing) proposes to complete the historic renovation of the former Purnell Art Company building, a 14,000 SF townhouse office building, into a mixed use property consisting of one ground-level retail space, six apartment units and two parking garage spaces. This is a four-story (plus basement & sub-basement) office building with ground floor retail space. Borrower purchased the building at auction for \$568,000 in January 2012. By the time all the plans were submitted to Baltimore City for a building permit the City Building Code had changed and now requires a Sprinkler & Life Safety Fire Alarm System. Because the City's water pressure and water service line was inadequate for a sprinkler system, this required a new service, excavation of the public street and sidewalk, a new fire pump, a larger electric panel and new service to the building, as well as a redesign

PROJECT: (cont'd) of the building with new 2-hour fire rated walls. This work added significant costs. Due to these increased costs the project was temporarily halted. The primary lender, Carrollton Bank, has declined to provide additional construction funding which is why the borrower applied to DHCD for assistance to complete the project. The applicant has DHCD experience, having obtained Neighborhood BusinessWorks financing in 2009 to complete the historic renovation of the Hotel Brexton (this loan is in good standing). The project will help revitalize this historic part of Charles Street. The building is located next to the Sotto Sopra restaurant and faces the back of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

DESCRIPTION: The Eastern Shore Conservation Center will transform a complex of abandoned historic buildings into a thriving hub of offices for nonprofit organizations and affiliated businesses. The project will create a central location for the Eastern Shore Land Conservancy and other allied organizations and businesses. ESLC is working with Atelier 11 Architects on the design of the project. Grant funds will be used to acquire a historic brick warehouse and a building containing four attached rowhouses located within Easton's National Register Historic District and for related predevelopment costs. Acquisition and predevelopment costs are estimated at \$1,200,000. Grantee will provide \$700,000 from other private contributors. Estimated project cost is \$6,300,000.

PROJECT LOCATION:

DESCRIPTION: The Single Carrot Theatre will collaborate with Seawall Development Co. to rehabilitate an abandoned car repair shop on North Howard Street. Grant funds will be used to build-out a performing arts space that will house the Single Carrot Theatre. The build out will include: theatre hall to seat 100 people; rehearsal space that will also serve as educational programming space; lobby; set construction space; and administrative office space. In addition to the theatre, project includes a restaurant with outdoor seating. This project will contribute to the revitalization of the Remington neighborhood, home of Millers Court and the Paper Moon Diner, by increasing the neighborhood amenities that are attractive to future residents. The total cost of the build-out is estimated at \$753,329. Other financial contributors include Joseph and Harvey Meyerhoff Family Charitable Funds (\$125,000) and Seawall Development Co (\$268,329) and the applicant contribution of \$110,000.



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8. ST. MARY'S COLLEGE OF MARYLAND

Anne Arundel Hall Replacement

Recommendation: Encumber capital funds for archaeological investigative work under the supervision of Historic St. Mary's City. The funds will be used to pay contractual archaeologists for archaeological field work as well as for supplies and equipment required in direct support of this effort.

APPROP. CODE:

REMARKS: Based on the preliminary archaeological investigations, the cost to complete the archaeological remediation work for the impacts associated with constructing the Anne Arundel Hall Replacement site and parking lot site is estimated at \$1,900,000: \$1,000,000 is related to field work and the other \$900,000 is for laboratory analysis and curation of the artifacts removed in the field work phase. This work is being done in consultation with the Maryland Historical Trust. Historic St. Mary's City will conduct the archaeological field work associated with the project. Temporary contractual archaeologists will be hired exclusively for this project to supplement Historic St. Mary's City's permanent staff. State bond funds will not be used to pay for existing employees supported by current operating budgets.

9. STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program – Fiscal Year 2014

Recommendation: The Interagency Committee on School Construction recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the State School Construction Program for Fiscal Year 2014 in the amount of \$345.4 million.

The proposed \$345.4 million program comprises:

- Approximately \$187.5 million previously approved by the Board of Public Works (Secretary's Agenda Item 1 [Jan. 23, 2013])
- Approximately \$109.4 million in additional recommendations
- \$23.5 million for projects that improve energy efficiency
- \$0.4 million from the FY 2014 Air Conditioning Initiative
- \$24.6 million reserved for additional Air Conditioning Initiative projects.

Funding: The recommended Program will be funded by \$300 million in general-obligation bond proceeds authorized by the 2013 MCCBL (which includes \$25 million for the Air Conditioning Initiative); \$23.5 million from the FY 2013 Energy Efficiency Incentive Reserves; and \$21.9 million in reverted funds from the Statewide Contingency Account.

Background: The Interagency Committee has considered each local school system's capital improvement school construction program request submitted for Fiscal Year 2014. After evaluation, including discussions with local representatives, the Interagency Committee recommends the Fiscal Year 2014 Program to the Board of Public Works. The recommended Program reflects local priorities, while recognizing projects that address the mandates of the Bridge to Excellence in Education Act, urgent major projects that require a high level of State commitment to move forward, the high school science classroom initiative, and the highest priority systemic renovation projects. The Program provides a funding allocation for an eligible project at the Maryland School for the Blind. See Section 8-319 of the Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland. The Program reserves \$24.6 million for projects to install central air conditioning systems in schools that do not currently have central air conditioning systems; procedures for this new initiative have been developed and project applications must be submitted by late May 2013. The FY 2014 Program also includes planning approval for major projects and for projects that will address the Bridge to Excellence requirements for full-day kindergarten and for pre-kindergarten for disadvantaged four-year olds.

Background: The Aging Schools Program, administered by the Interagency Committee, funds capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance of existing school buildings. Allocations are based on the school district's proportion of pre-1970s building area that has not been renovated. For Fiscal Year 2014, each LEA's funding level is in the same proportion as in the statutory ASP program, which is based on a total authorization of \$6.1 million. The Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2013 increases the FY 2014 allocation for Baltimore County by an additional \$2 million. Vienna Greenbelt Project. The Board of Public Works has previously approved Program Open Space acquisitions of properties for the Vienna Greenbelt Project. See DGS Items 5-RP (10/20/10); 5-RP (4/15/09); 21-RP (6/11/08); 22-RP (6/11/08).

The Vienna Waterfront Park is an integral part of the Vienna Greenbelt Project. This proposed acquisition will allow the Town to expand the Vienna Riverwalk and acquire the last privately-held parcel of Nanticoke Riverfront property designated to become part of the Park. Acquisition will provide opportunities for environmental interpretation as well as direct public access to the Nanticoke River. The Nanticoke River is a premier component of the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National Historic Trail, appearing much as it did when Captain Smith explored the river in June 1608. The Town of Vienna has taken a leadership role in planning a waterfront park. The Discovery Center will serve as an ecotourism driver to surrounding communities and amenity to families wishing to experience the trail.

This acquisition is a further extension of the Greenbelt project and lies within the Target Ecological Area. This property meets criteria in accordance with Chapter 419, Laws of Maryland 2009 as it presents a unique acquisition opportunity as a result of its extraordinary location and the environmental value of the property, which scored 105 under the Program Open Space Targeting System.

Acquisition in Town's Name. When DNR acquires property with State-Side Program Open Space funds, it is standard practice to purchase the property in the name of the State to the use of the Department as mandated by sections 1-109(a) of the Natural Resources Article. However, that law permits the Board of Public Works to "exempt projects from the provisions of this section." In this case, DNR proposes that title to this property be vested in the Town of Vienna. The Vienna Greenbelt and Vienna Riverwalk projects are locally-managed. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: MDOA's Congregate Housing Services Program (CHSP) promotes independent living in senior housing by certifying providers who offer a package of services consisting of meals, housekeeping, personal assistance, and service management to residents who are 62 years of age and older and who require temporary or periodic assistance with daily living activities.

CHSP also provides a State subsidy for low-income seniors who lack sufficient resources to pay for the full cost of the package of services. The subsidy amount depends upon the actual income of each client in the congregate housing program. Under a sliding scale arrangement, clients pay a specified portion of their monthly income directly to the congregate housing service provider.

The Department then pays the provider the agreed upon subsidy amount. These contracts establish and control that relationship. The providers are generally housing authorities, management companies, and non-profit organizations.

There are two CHSP service models: Standard CHSP (SCHSP) and Individualized CHSP (ICHSP). SCHSP is a fixed package of services that are provided to all eligible residents. ICHSP services are offered on a more ala carte basis.

Sole Source procurement was deemed appropriate for these services under COMAR 21.14.01.06C in order to provide continuity of care. The continued availability of services must be ensured for recipients who, without these services, are at risk of having to relocate to a nursing home or other health-related institution in order to receive needed services. MDOA does not control access to the apartment buildings and their congregate dining facilities and cannot force a building owner to accept just any contractor selected by the MDOA.

Because these contracts are for State subsidies, there are no subcontracting opportunities; thus there was no MBE participation goal established for these contracts. However, Associated Catholic Charities, Inc. utilizes Germain Holdings, LLC dba Overlea Caterers, which is a Maryland Certified MBE, to provide meals for the seniors and is able to include a portion of the payments to Overlea Caterers for these SCHSP and ICHSP contracts. The percentage of the contracts that are counted towards the MBE participation is shown on the Attachment. In addition, Associated Catholic Charities, Inc., one of the two Prime Contractors, is a Maryland Certified MBE.

The RFP was directly emailed to 30 prospective offerors, of which 16 are Maryland firms and seven are MBEs. An additional 235 prospective offerors received the notice via eMM.

Eight proposals were received in response to the RFP; however, only seven were deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Penn Credit Corporation was ranked overall #1 with the highest ranked technical proposal and the lowest commission rate. The Comptroller of Maryland competitively acquires the services of both a primary and secondary collection service. The use of a secondary collection contract provides for competition between the primary and secondary contractor which encourages increased effort on the part of both firms to collect delinquent taxes and ultimately generate additional tax revenue for the State.

Copies of the solicitation notice were emailed directly to 14 prospective vendors, eight of which are Maryland firms, and none are MBEs. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

The single submitted proposal was evaluated by an evaluation committee. The technical proposal was deemed to be acceptable. In addition, the offeror was determined to be responsible, the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was also determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to Westat, Inc., the incumbent.

Individuals representing nine potential offerors attended the Pre-Proposal Conference; however, none of them submitted proposals, likely due to the highly specialized nature of services to be performed under the contract. However, it is not known the specific reasons for not proposing, since none of the potential offerors submitted the "No Response" Form from the RFP.

This purpose of this Contract is to provide quality assurance and database management services for the Maryland Cancer Registry (MCR). These services include registration and processing of cancer and benign brain and central nervous system (CNS) tumor reports for Maryland residents and non-residents diagnosed or treated in Maryland; quality assurance activities; preparation of reports; data processing; providing technical training for reporting entities in Maryland; and submitting Maryland data to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Program of Cancer Registries (NPCR) and the North American Association of Central Cancer Registries (NAACCR).

The recommended Contractor is required to conduct the above services in accordance with MCR and Departmental guidelines and the standards set by the NNPCR and NAACCR, and the confidentiality and data requirements of Annotated Code of Maryland Health – General §§ 18-203-204, Code of Maryland Regulations 10.14.01, and Public Law 102-515.

Due to the highly specialized nature of the services to be performed under the contract and the fact that the majority of the contracted costs are for specialized personnel who are certified in cancer record coding (Certified Tumor Registrars), the ability to subcontract work is severely limited. Although training will be required and computer hardware will need to be purchased, these costs are a minimal part of the overall budget for the Contractor. Therefore, no MBE participation goal was established for this Contract.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace* and the DHMH website. Copies of the solicitation notice were mailed directly to seven prospective vendors, all of which are Maryland firms.

Only one bid was received in response to this solicitation. The recommended contractor is responsible, and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Moreover, the price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to John P. Houlihan, P.C., the incumbent.

The Legal Assistance Program (LAP) is comprised of independent attorneys assisting residents in obtaining established rights and helping residents to obtain federal/state benefits which may be of assistance to them in their return to the community. The LAP refers cases to outside attorneys when the LAP is precluded from handling a case, an example would be in the case of a criminal matter. The referred attorney provides the legal service pro bono, should they accept the case in accordance with the Annotated Code of Maryland, Health General, Title 7.

Health General Title 7, Annotated Code of Maryland, requires that residents of State Residential Centers (SRC) be provided with legal counsel at the time they are proposed for admission to an SRC. The Bauer Consent Decree requires that, at least once a year, each individual with mental retardation who is admitted to a SRC shall be re-evaluated to determine that the individual still meets the requirements for admission, whether the services can be provided in a less restrictive setting, whether the individual's plan of habilitation is adequate and suitable, and whether the SRC has complied with and executed the plan of habilitation in accordance with the regulations. The Bauer Consent Decree requires that the legal counsel attend the annual re-evaluation or be provided with the written report of the re-evaluation.

The LAP provides legal assistance and representation to the residents primarily in four categories:

- Admission Hearings as provided in Health General Articles 7-502 and 7-503;
- Re-evaluations as provided in Health General Article 7-505;
- Habeas Corpus and Petition for Release as provided in Health General Articles 7-506 and 7-507; and,
- Transfer Hearings as provided in Health General Articles 7-802 and 7-804.

Extensive efforts were made to expand the list of law firms that would bid on these LAP contracts without success. These contracts require the attorney to provide the service at the SRC and interact with clients whose communication skills are seriously impaired or limited, which requires a greater expense of the attorney's time.

John P. Houlihan, P.C. has been providing these services for the residents at the Holly Center for many years. He knows most of the clients at the facility and has extensive records with them.

No MBE goal was established for these contracts because core services have to be performed by an attorney, and there is little ancillary activity to those performed by the attorney. In addition, for the services at the Holly Center, the relatively small annual value of the contract and the location where services are to be provided (Salisbury) are not favorable to subcontracting.

Prior to placing any youth with an Out-of-State Provider, regulations must be followed that require the Department to exhaust all In-State placement options and document all efforts to do so.

The Social Services Administration (SSA) of the Maryland Department of Human Resources (DHR) provides services to Maryland's most vulnerable foster children and their families. This contract is for a Maryland foster teen that requires extensive care and services. DHR was contacted by the previous Provider to remove the child from its treatment facility due to his severe mental and behavioral issues. Due to this notification, an emergency placement became necessary.

This 15-year-old deaf youth was previously placed at seven different residential Group Homes and Treatment Foster Care Homes in Maryland and one facility in New York, prior to being placed at the National Deaf Academy in the Florida. He was recommended for a Residential Treatment Center (RTC) due to his Intermittent Explosive Disorder, being bi-polar, and his Oppositional Defiance and Mood Disorder. He also has sexually inappropriate behavior and a history of fighting and running away (AWOL). All Maryland RTCs rejected him due to his deafness, AWOL risk and aggression.

Recommendations were made by a Forensic Psychologist for facilities in Wyoming, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Florida (the National Deaf Academy). None of the other facilities were able to provide the treatment services required for the deaf. The National Deaf Academy was made aware of the physical, emotional and behavioral needs of the child and accepted him as a placement. Subsequently, this placement was reported to the Board of Public Works (BPW) as an Emergency Procurement at the October 31, 2012 BPW meeting (Appendix 1). This new sole source contract replaces the emergency placement contract.

Residential Child Care programs are defined in COMAR 14.31.02.03B(13) as "a program of care provided in a residential setting by a provider on a 24-hour basis for longer than 24 hours to a child or children unless otherwise provided by State law" within a structured set of services and activities. COMAR 14.31.06.01 "articulates the standards that must be met and maintained by residential child care programs for children and youth. These requirements are designed to protect the health, safety, and well being of children placed in residential child care programs."

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) is the single point of entry for private providers interested in supplying care under approved negotiated rates for youth of the various State jurisdictions. DHR is responsible for the cost of placement until MD Medicaid is approved and initiated, except for educational costs that will continue to be supported under this Contract. The MD Medicaid support paperwork has been initiated, but not yet approved. This is a not-to-exceed (NTE) per diem contract where the provider is paid solely for the one child per day. As such, the DHR will not be charged for any unused capacity. If and, when MD Medicaid is approved, this Contract will only remain in effect to support any outstanding educational costs.

There is no MBE participation goal established for this contract as the National Deaf Academy facilities and services provided are totally outside the State of Maryland, and this contract is for only one youth.

Specialized sexual offender assessment and treatment are essential elements of the containment approach to sexual offender management and enables parole and probation agents to develop more appropriate supervision plans and implement more effective supervision strategies. These services have been successfully performed in three regions of the State as follows:

Contract A: Eastern Shore Psychological Services provides services in Region 1B, which includes Caroline, Dorchester, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico and Worcester Counties;

Contract B: Huber and Associates provides services in Region 2, which includes Baltimore City and Baltimore County; and

Contract C: Community Based Treatment Services provides services in Region 4A, which includes Carroll, Frederick and Howard Counties.

The requested funding amount for these renewal options is higher than the estimates in the original agenda item because at the time of award, it was unknown how many offenders would be referred for such services or from what areas of the State the referrals would come. Initially, sexual offenders already under the supervision at the time of contract award were referred for treatment. Newly-sentenced cases from the courts and newly-released offenders from the Division of Correction steadily added to that number. Most of the offenders remain in treatment for at least one year.

Exercising the renewal options is in the best interest of the State because these services are critical in providing supervised sexual offenders the specialized treatment they need to enhance community safety.

As soon as the issue was realized, DPSCS immediately notified the Contractor to cease providing enhanced services until this modification is approved. The issue arose because of confusion within DPSCS regarding the grant period and the funding amount.

Additionally, the DPSCS Grants Manager, who was responsible for overseeing the funding, had left the Department, resulting in a lack of oversight. To ensure this situation does not occur again, there has been a renewed coordination between all parties involved to define clear expectations and provide a better comprehensive understanding of grant reporting timeframes. In addition, DPSCS is in the process of hiring a new Grants Manager.

The original contacts with Gaudenzia, Inc. were to provide intensive substance abuse treatment to inmates at three DPSCS facilities. Services include extensive pre- and post-screening and assessment testing, assessment of criminal risk, assessment of the presence of mental health disorders, and readiness and motivation for change. The previous modification for enhanced prison-based residential treatment program services afforded the addition of staff to provide coordination of aftercare and community re-entry. These enhanced services will now be extended through the end of the contract term with this modification for additional funding.

While participation in prison-based therapeutic community (TC) programs has been shown to reduce recidivism, effectiveness is greatly enhanced when aftercare is provided. By linking the institutional and community phases of treatment, there will be a greater impact on recovery from alcohol and drug-involved offenders and lead to more positive outcomes. The goal of this expansion of services is to allow the Contractor to schedule offenders for additional treatment during the final phase of their sentence prior to release, and develop a continuum of care that includes prison-based aftercare services for offenders who complete the TC and institution outreach. This will allow the process of preparing the offender for re-entry into the community to begin. Additional staffing is being provided within the scope of work to expand the intensive substance abuse treatment services to inmates currently being treated.

Gaudenzia, Inc. performance has been satisfactory in meeting the requirements of the scope of work. The following are some examples of Gaudenzia's work:

- Continues to ensure that each inmate in the program receives 15 hours of direct staff interactive service per week;
- Maintains a therapeutic environment that emphasizes compliance with institutional rules and program parameters;
- Continues to deliver services that stabilize the substance abuse and/or dependent inmate and addresses their remediation needs;
- Conducts on-going risk and needs assessment of inmates participating in the program; and
- Has instituted a re-entry preparation program to minimize the probability of relapse or recidivism.

While investigating to find the "existing unknown conduit" behind the lift at the Keyser's Ridge Maintenance facility (as noted on the electrical demolition plan), five additional conduits were discovered that had not been identified at the front side of the lift during the original survey of the shop building. While relocating the five unforeseen electrical conduits at the front side of the new vehicle lift at the Keyser's Ridge facility eight additional electrical conduits were uncovered that were not shown on the plans. Four of these conduits fed receptacles, one fed a welding outlet, one fed a heater in the stairwell, one fed the pressure washer and one fed the exit and canopy lights. All under-slab electrical feeds must be relocated overhead and out of the way of current and future construction. An additional seventy-one days were added to the time on this contract as a result of these unforeseen site conditions.

The contract plans for the vehicle lift at Keyser's Ridge did not specify that the conduits carrying hydraulic, air, and electrical lines from the lift pit to the vehicle lift control panel be sealed. However, this work was performed to meet current fire codes and to keep water and debris from entering the conduits.

Additionally, a decision was made to relocate the Keyser Ridge Lift two feet further into the shop to allow additional circulation space between any vehicles located on the lift and the overhead door. This involved relocating the lift pits and associated floor drains in the pit. Also it was noted that the disconnect switch located adjacent to the existing transformer mounted on the shop bay wall was beyond reach without the use of a ladder. As the transformer needed to re-fed from Panel SL-1, the SHA Office of Facilities Management requested that a new disconnect switch be located in an accessible area from the shop floor.

A design change was necessary to revise the plumbing in the center of the new vehicle lift pit at the Keyser's Ridge facility to achieve proper drainage, as the existing outflow pipe form the pit was found to be lower in elevation then the inlet pipe carrying water from the pit.

Finally, SHA required the contractor to grind 1" of concrete from the bearing pad locations in the pit, thereby lowering the lift and eliminating a tripping concern.

REMARKS: This supplement provides funds to complete design and construction administration services for the RSA program, related to new FAA requirements; inclusion of the stream restoration design; changes in MDE Erosion and Sediment Control Manual; additional scope for the conversion of Runway 4-22 to a taxiway; changes in operations of the runway; and additional construction administration services. This supplement will allow the consultant to make the necessary modifications to their design, continue to provide coordination for programming project phasing, and continue coordination with stakeholders. The additional cost is necessary to further address the Federal and State program definition and regulatory changes.

The following elements have now been included:

1. New FAA Requirements (\$860,000):

Includes new construction to accommodate the Federal requirements including removal of existing Taxiways R and D and new construction of Taxiways R, D1, D2. This work also includes taxiway/runway fillet modifications and Runway 15R-33L profile corrections associated with new FAA AC 150/5300-13A.

2. Inclusion of Stream Restoration Design (\$300,000)

As part of the Runway 15R-33L Program, 1,000 feet of Kitten Branch Stream was placed in a box culvert. MAA was required by Corps of Engineers and Maryland Department of Environment Permits to perform stream restoration on the portion of Kitten Branch further downstream and off of the secure airfield area.

3. Changes in MDE Erosion and Sediment Control Manual (\$200,000)

In 2011, Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) issued revisions to their erosion and sediment control manual. The changes were significant and have impacted the design of erosion and sediment control measures. In addition, they have added requirements that only 20-30 acres can be impacted by construction at one time. Incorporation of this limitation has considerable effects on both the erosion and sediment control design and the construction phasing.

4. Conversion of Runway 4-22 to a Taxiway (\$100,000)

Runway 4-22 is being decommissioned as a runway to satisfy the RSA requirements that are federally mandated. In converting the runway to a taxiway, the issue of compliance with Runway Safety Area criteria becomes not applicable. The existing pavement will be remarked, signed and the edges delineated with reflectors to allow for its use as a taxiway.

5. Additional Construction Administration Services (\$600,000)

A number of factors lead to the need for additional construction administration services including: additional construction packages (5 vs. 3 original packages); additional CA services related to the additional scope items for the program; extended construction schedule (2014 vs. 2015).

6. Changes in Runway Operations (\$40,000)

The original intent of the program was to provide Runway 33L as a CAT I runway as it exists today. Through discussions with MAA and FAA, it was decided that Runway 33L should be a CAT II runway. Based on the current demand at the airport, the CAT II Runway will allow for more aircraft approaches during inclement weather conditions.

REMARKS: MAA will replace one (1) 2003 TYMCO/Isuzu sweeper vehicle with one (1) TYMCO Inc. Model DST6 sweeper vehicle. The current generation of sweepers used by MAA Field Maintenance has a useful life of seven (7) years. This vehicle that will be ten (10) years old when replaced has exceeded its useful life and it is no longer cost effective to repair.

The sweeper vehicle is utilized seven (7) days a week removing debris from roadways, runways/taxiways and aircraft parking areas. This sweeper is essential in eliminating material which may cause extensive damage to aircraft and jet engines.

Through market research the MAA compared the base price for the DST6 sweeper vehicle off of the (H-GAC) Buy contract with a base price of \$272,580 to a public bid by the State of Michigan at a cost of \$280,844. By comparing the base price to a similar vehicle, the price from TYMCO, Inc. is considered fair and reasonable.



In several other airports throughout the country, duty free concessionaires also offer duty paid items. U. S. Customs and Border Protection has granted written permission for Concessionaire to conduct such duty paid sales from its duty free stores at BWI Marshall with the provision that all non-tax paid merchandise must be segregated and clearly marked in the stores. Concessionaire has agreed to assure that the duty free merchandise will be separated from the duty paid merchandise, and that the sale of the duty free merchandise shall only be to international departing passengers providing proper evidence of same. Supplement No. 1 also adjusts the MMG from \$16,176.42 to \$18,385.25, which is based upon the standard rental rates for Retail Shop Space – Unfinished, and Office with Restricted Access, to reflect the actual square footages of the space assigned to Concessionaire.

DESCRIPTION: This contract provides for improvements to Runway 15R-33L to address deficient RSA areas, pavement rehabilitation needs and compliance with FAA Standards. This contract is the fourth construction package in support of the overall program for Runway Safety Area (RSA) and Standards Compliance for Runway 15R-33L at BWI Marshall.

REASON FOR REQUEST: The Maryland Aviation Administration is currently in the final design phase for a series of airfield improvements at BWI Marshall Airport. These improvements, collectively known as the BWI Runway Safety Area (RSA), Pavement Management & Standards Compliance Program seeks to address RSA standards as mandated by Congress, and dictated by the Federal Aviation Administration, to be completed by December 31, 2015.

As part of this program, Runway 15R-33L will be improved to meet not only RSA Standards, but also all current FAA Design Standards that can be practicably met. Additionally, the project will rehabilitate the existing asphalt pavement concurrent with the other required improvements in order to mitigate impacts to the travelling public. Overall, the runway improvements have been structured into five (5) proposed packages that will encompass all of the required improvements to Runway 15R-33L:

- 1) Runway 15R-33L Kitten Branch Diversion Project
- 2) Runway 15R-33L Standards Compliance Earthwork Project (est. 2013)
- 3) Runway 15R-33L Taxiway P and Runway 15R Deicing Pad Pavement Rehabilitation and Standards Compliance Project (est. 2013)
- 4) Runway 15R-33L RSA, Pavement Rehabilitation and Standards Compliance Project (est. 2014)
- 5) Runway 15R-33L NAVAIDs Relocation Project (est. 2014)

Initial program planning envisioned this project being completed in calendar year 2014. However, several design requirements changed during the course of the design, including the publication of new Airport Design Criteria by FAA. During the course of the project design, the FAA established new design standards that introduced significant new criteria affecting taxiway geometry. This change has greatly increased the limits of pavement to be addressed under this project. Additionally, the FAA issued guidance for revised airfield geometry principals to enhance safety by reducing the potential for runway incursions. The resultant changes significantly added several new taxiway improvements to the original scope of the project. The result has been a marked increase in the scope of the project and the

construction required to be completed within existing program timelines to ensure that all required work at BWI is completed prior to December 31, 2015.

In order to maintain the schedule of the overall program, MAA is seeking to expedite this procurement to allow the contractor to order long lead items and perform preparatory work in advance of the full closure. Taking this action will minimize the closure of the runway during 2014. Specifically, early procurement of lead items in the project critical path including runway and taxiway light cans, airfield lighting cable, airfield sign structures and light fixtures is critical to meeting the expanded project requirements within the time frame available.

Providing additional construction duration past early spring of 2015 is not feasible. Follow on improvements to Runway 10-28 cannot be undertaken without full utility of Runway 15R-33L being available. Completion of the improvements is a condition for all funding eligibility for the program as the FAA has required that all proposed runway improvements be complete by the 2015 mandate. Continued eligibility will ensure that a combination of Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) revenue, PFC revenue backed bond proceeds and Airport Improvement Program grant funds remains available for the program construction. Therefore, expedited procurement will provide the best opportunity for MAA to provide additional construction time and mitigate the increase in scope realized under this project.
