





RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Public Works approve Manor West LP granting three non-exclusive access easements over one-quarter of an acre of property comprising Weinberg Manor West property which secures DHCD financing. In combination with an existing easement on the property, the new easements will provide required access and utility maintenance so a contiguous property can be developed for affordable housing.

HISTORY: In 2008, DHCD provided \$5,110,000 in Maryland Bond Program financing and \$948,934 in Maryland Housing Rehabilitation Program Loan funds to Manor West L.P. to construct 109 units of affordable family rental housing on 2.2 acres of land in Baltimore City. Construction of Weinberg Manor West was completed in 2010. The project has been managed effectively. The occupants of the rental units are in compliance with program income and household composition requirements and the loan is being paid as required. The property consistently receives satisfactory or better physical condition ratings, has a debt service coverage ratio of 1.52, and is rated A by DHCD's risk rating process, the highest rating.

Manor South LP is now building an additional phase of the project, Weinberg Manor South, on contiguous property. It was determined that an existing easement on the Manor West site is inadequate to provide access and utilities maintenance for Manor South. Three additional easements (totaling 0.26 of an acre) are proposed. In order for Manor West LP to convey the easements to Manor South LP, the State must consent as the Manor West land secures the DHCD financing.

6. **DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT** (con't)

The location, size and nature of the proposed easements are typical of those for urban projects. The land contained in the easements remains in the hands of the borrower, but the use is restricted to ensure access and utility maintenance. Approving the proposed three easements will have no adverse effect on the State's security for Manor West.



13. <u>MARYLAND STADIUM AUTHORITY</u>: Baltimore City Convention Center Construction, Operation, and Contribution Agreement and Lease

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve modifying the Baltimore City Convention Center Construction, Operation, and Contribution Agreement and Lease (referred to as the Operating Lease) between the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore and the Maryland Stadium Authority as directed by the 2013 General Assembly, specifically:

- (1) Extending the State's responsibility to contribute two-thirds of the Baltimore City Convention Center's annual operating deficit from December 31, 2014 through December 31, 2019;
- (2) Extending the State's responsibility to annually contribute \$200,000 to a capital improvement fund for the Baltimore City Convention Center from December 31, 2014 through December 31, 2019; and
- (3) Extending the State's joint leasehold interest in the Baltimore City Convention Center from December 31, 2014 through December 31, 2019.

Background: In 1994, the General Assembly charged the Stadium Authority with constructing the Baltimore City Convention Center expansion. The statute required the State, through the Stadium Authority, to: (1) bear responsibility for two-thirds of the annual operating deficits of the Convention Center, and (2) make an annual matching contribution of \$200,000 to a capital improvements reserve fund for the Convention Center.

In 2008, the General Assembly extended the State's funding obligations for the Convention Center until December 31, 2014. Secretary's Agenda Item 14 (April 1, 2009). In 2013, the General Assembly approved a further extension of the obligations until December 31, 2019.

Based on the economic impact reports, the annual tax revenues received by the State from the operations by the Baltimore City Convention Center substantially exceed the State's annual funding responsibilities.

14. <u>MARYLAND STADIUM AUTHORITY</u> State Public School Construction Program

This initiative authorizes the Stadium Authority to issue up to \$1.1 billion in bonds to fund Baltimore City public school construction and renovation projects in accordance with the 10-Year Plan for School Construction adopted by the City Board on January 8, 2013. The Stadium Authority will have direct oversight of the program, manage the funds, and actively manage the construction of new school projects, with City Schools actively managing the renovation projects. State and local funds dedicated to the initiative are pledged to pay debt service on the bonds, and may also be used to cover administrative costs incurred in implementing the program.

The Memorandum of Understanding. The law requires the Stadium Authority, the IAC, the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, and Baltimore City to enter into a memorandum of understanding that governs the four-party relationship and sets parameters for the program. This memorandum of understanding must be approved by the Board of Public Works before any bonds are issued to support the program. The recommended memorandum addresses each of the 16 business points that the law specifies be addressed.





REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. Copies of the solicitation notice were sent directly to three prospective vendors, all of which are Maryland firms, and included one MBE. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

One proposal was received in response to the RFP, and it was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror was determined to be responsible, the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to The Kane Company, the sole Offeror.

The "No Bid" forms received by the Procurement Officer indicated that the project was too complex for some vendors; they were interested in submitting proposals for other projects; and the type of services requested were not within the vendors' capabilities.

The contract base term will cover the 2014 Gubernatorial Election and 2016 Presidential Election, as well as the delivery of new voting equipment and the return of the old voting equipment. Two one-year renewal options are available which would extend the contract through December 31, 2018. Statewide there are over 1,800 polling places in operation during election day and approximately 65 early voting centers in operation for 10 days prior to the election. It is critical that the proper equipment prepared specifically for each of the polling facilities be in place in a timely manner and that all security protocols be followed exactly. Communication plans and project management teams to liaison with the local boards of election are also included in this contract. Project managers will be assigned to the local boards of elections to establish strategies and account for individual circumstances of each county.

The Kane Company proposed a centralized communication center, as well as escalation procedures for unforeseeable issues that may arise. The Kane Company has experience with the proper delivery procedures for voting equipment through the past ten election cycles as a subcontractor on other SBE contracts.

A 15% MBE participation goal was established for this contract; however, the recommended awardee has committed to a 34% MBE participation goal with 8% for trucking and transportation services and 26% for project management to coordinate the communication center and meetings with local boards.

Whenever an agenda item is presented on the DBM Secretary's Agenda, DBM validates the information provided by the submitting agency for accuracy. This item was requesting approval of a new three-year contract to provide transportation services for Maryland voting equipment for the State Board of Elections (SBE). The information that DBM received from SBE was reviewed and was determined to be correct for the agenda submission. However, upon recently preparing a modification to the contract, SBE realized there was a typo in the agenda item referring to the contract expiration date and immediately contacted DBM.

The information pertaining to the approval request clearly stated the contract term was for threeyears with two one-year renewal options. The requesting agency remarks state that "[t]he contract base term will cover the 2014 Gubernatorial Election and 2016 Presidential Election, as well as the delivery of new voting equipment and the return of the old voting equipment. Two one-year renewal options are available which would extend the contract through December 31, 2018." However, the term dates listed on the first page of the item are "11/1/2013 - 12/31/2015" instead of 11/1/2013 - 12/31/2016, which is a base term of 3 years and 2 months. The contract and ADPICS both reflect the correct contract term. The attached edited agenda item pages show the "For the Record" corrections to the agenda item in yellow for easy identification.

If you would like any other documentation, I would be pleased to provide it.

I apologize for the additional work these errors have caused for you and your staff.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace* and posted on the DGS website and bid board.

One proposal was received in response to the RFP from the incumbent, and it was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror was determined to be responsible, the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to Bithenergy, Inc., the sole Offeror.

A survey of potential offerors that demonstrated an interest in this solicitation found that one firm was not interested in being a prime, but an MBE subcontractor; one firm did not submit a proposal because it believed the MBE requirement would be difficult to meet and commit to with the limited proposal window; one firm was unable to meet the timeline and requirements outlined in the RFP in order to respond to the solicitation; and one firm was included as a subcontractor for Bithenergy, Inc.

This contract is to host and manage an online energy and utility bill management service capable of initially processing a minimum of 12,000 invoices per month that may increase during the contract term. Presently, the comprehensive energy consumption and cost data for the approximately 58 agencies which pay a utility bill is housed in the State Energy Database. Utilities being tracked include electricity, natural gas, fuel oil, propane, water and sewer, district steam, and district chilled water. This Utility Record contract will continue and improve upon the existing State Energy Database which is currently being processed in EnergyCap Enterprise application.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on the *eMaryland Marketplace* and the DHMH website. Four potential bidders were directly emailed a copy of the solicitation, three of which are veteran owned businesses. A copy of the notice was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.


Speculation as to why only one bid was received is the extensive volume of services required by the contract, as well as the required experience and demanding response time (24-72 hours turnaround) to requested tests. The required experience, as well as demanding response time is justified and cannot be reduced in the specifications of the contract due to the nature of the services provided. SGHC requires an organization with a proven track record, who can handle the volume and scope of testing that is needed. Two vendors that were contacted for comments stated that solicitations in the future should allow more time to produce an extensive technical offer.

The bid for this contract was based on unit prices for each individual laboratory test provided. The actual bid price per unit to be paid for the specific laboratory test identified in this contract may not be contingent on any other factor or condition in any manner. The bid price entered is a fully loaded price that includes all cost/expenses associated with the provision of services as required. The bid price includes all labor, profit/overhead, general operating, administrative and other expenses and costs necessary to perform the work set forth in the contract.

An extensive search was conducted on the MBE website, as well as the small business reserve and veteran-owned small business websites, for services under the categories of "Laboratory", "Clinical Laboratory" and "Services". The search resulted in finding seven vendors; however, after further investigation, none could provide the appropriate services required for this contract. In addition, there were no vendors identified under these categories for a small business or a veteran-owned small business. The only service contained in this contract that could be subcontracted was courier services. However, it was determined that there are no MBEs that meet the mandatory requirements of a courier service with the ability to transport body fluids considered hazardous materials with full working knowledge of standard precautions, clean-up procedures in case of spill or the ability to respond to "STAT" requests for transportation, as well as being available 24/7 and transporting specimens under refrigeration. Therefore, no MBE participation or VSBE participation goals were established for this contract.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT), Office of Real Estate (ORE) has discovered, through recent requests for Task Order Proposals, that the required tasks involve a significant amount of field and research type work that could be completed by personnel with less years of experience/education than required by the original labor categories.

STV, Inc (STV) and several MBE subcontractors have expressed concern in requiring senior level staff to perform mid-level responsibilities. Subcontractors have stated that they do not have enough senior level staff available to perform the lower level work. It would be advantageous to the State to include additional, lower cost mid-level and technical support labor categories. This would allow MDOT to complete the objectives in each task at a lower overall rate. Based on MDOT's estimate of hours for each labor category, the reduction in hourly rate could provide a cost savings of approximately \$100,000 over the three-year base contract term.

There is no MBE compliance data available at this time because no invoices have been received from the contractors. However, there are active tasks being performed by the MBEs under the contract. MDOT currently has two active tasks for the STV contract that have a 90% and an 87% MBE participation goals.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Approval request to modify one CPA contract to reduce the number of Treatment Foster Care (TFC) Program beds from 66 to 58 and apply the eight bed difference towards a Mother Baby Program.

CPA Programs are defined in COMAR 07.02.21.03B (17) as a 24-hour substitute care program, operated by a licensed child placement agency or local department of social services, for children with serious emotional, behavioral, medical, or psychological condition.

The \$53,824 increase is based upon the difference in rates for the TFC Program and the Mother Baby Program. The overall bed count for this Provider remains the same. The total modified award amount assumes that each slot purchased will be occupied by a child for the entire eight months modification term. Based on history, this is unlikely to occur. This is a reimbursement contract. The Provider is paid solely for the actual children placed with them during the year, and then only for the actual number of days each child is with the vendor.

This CPA Provider was obtained through a non-competitive negotiation process. The procurement laws provide for procuring certain human, social and educational services under the State Finance and Procurement Article Section 13-106 and COMAR 21.14.01.03G (Non-Competitive Negotiated Procurement of Human, Social or Educational Services).

The Governor's Office For Children (GOC) is the single point of entry for private providers interested in supplying care under approved negotiated rates for youth of the various State agencies.

Procurement with the service provider has complied with the Law's requirement for Non-Competitive Negotiated Procurement of Human, Social or Educational Services. In accordance with COMAR 21.14.01.04, below are reasons for this method of procurement:


REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: This contract provides for the publishing of travel and tourism materials, which includes the annual development and production of *Destination Maryland* and *Calendar of Events*. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Taxi Access II is a transit service sponsored by the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) for persons eligible to ride on MTA's mobility service. Mobility service is mandated by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). This service allows eligible mobility patrons the opportunity to use participating local transportation service providers within the MTA designated service area. Taxi access is considered a premium service by providing same-day service typically within 40 minutes of the request, and riders are transported directly from their origin to their destination. Whereas traditional paratransit mobility service must be pre-scheduled typically for the next day and riders with similar trip parameters are grouped together for shared-riding.

This request includes a modification for settlement fees related to administrative and GPS fees for taxi services and to exercise the first of two one-year renewal options.

The modification is to provide funding for a settlement to MJ Management Services, LLC (MJM) for the payment of the administrative and GPS fees that are applicable to taxi services under this contract. MJM filed a claim with the MTA for these fees. MTA conducted discussions and negotiations with MJM as permitted by COMAR 21.10.04.04A for disposition of a contractor's claim. It was determined that the administrative and GPS fees for the current contract could be considered for payment in the claim.

This modification will resolve the claim through a settlement agreement allowing MJM to invoice for the administrative and GPS fees to cover the full contract term. The administrative and GPS fees total \$3,258,000 in a not to exceed cap amount. All fee payments shall be based on invoices that have been verified and reconciled by MTA. The Contract Manager shall review and verify all invoices prior to payment. The decision to approve or deny an invoice by the Contract Manager is final.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to extend the contract by three months while Maryland Supplemental Retirement Plans (MSRP) conducts a competitive sealed proposals procurement.

In September 2012, the incumbent manager completed a substantial restructuring of the stable value investment, involving several sub-managers and insurance contracts. The past 12 months have allowed sufficient time to fully conclude the restructuring and begin to mark new investment performance information in advance of a request for new fund manager proposals.

The MSRP Board of Trustees (the Board) has confidence in the expertise of the incumbent stable value manager for the duration of this extension. Information from stable value funds in other states indicate that the incumbent's current fee remains competitive.


As is customary in many investment manager agreements, the fees for this stable value arrangement are paid out of earnings or assets of the Stable Value Fund. These charges are invoiced and monitored through the Board of Trustees' staff and payment initiated through the bank custodian (currently Bank of New York Mellon of New York, NY.)

The Board has general oversight authority and responsibility for the above-mentioned Plans. MSRP enables State employees and teachers to participate in voluntary, tax-favored retirement savings plans. The Board has ongoing authority for (1) reviewing plans administration performance and results; (2) assisting with employee communication materials; and, (3) meeting tax, securities, and various other regulatory promulgations and requirements of administering the Plans.

PURPLE LINE LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP (P3)

ITEM: 12-GM

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

RECOMMENDATION: The Department of Transportation (MDOT) recommends that the Board of Public Works:

- (1) Designate the Purple Line Light Rail Transit (Purple Line), a public infrastructure asset, as a publicprivate partnership (P3); and
- (2) Approve the proposed competitive solicitation method for selecting a concessionaire for the Purple Line.

AUTHORITY: State Finance and Procurement Article, §10A-201(c), Annotated Code of Maryland. This law, enacted in 2013 (Maryland Laws, Chapter 5), authorizes P3s for public infrastructure assets when the Board of Public Works designates the project as a P3 and approves the agency's proposed solicitation method. The law requires the reporting agency to provide the Board the following:

- Copy of the presolicitation report
- Description of the process for soliciting, evaluating, selecting, and awarding the P3
- Preliminary solicitation schedule
- Outline of the organization and contents of the public notice of solicitation
- Summary of the key terms of the proposed P3 agreement

LEGISLATIVE NOTICE: MDOT submitted the Purple Line Presolicitation Report to the General Assembly's House Appropriations Committee, House Ways and Means Committee, and Senate Budget and Taxation Committee on August 5, 2013. On September 26, 2013, the chairs of the budget committees submitted a letter to the Governor, the Treasurer, and the Secretary of Transportation indicating that the budget committees have completed their review of the Purple Line Presolicitation Report, that the Report satisfies the requirements of the P3 legislation, and that the Report provides sufficient justification to warrant proceeding with the Purple Line as a P3.

OTHER NOTICES AND REVIEWS: MDOT also submitted the Purple Line Presolicitation Report to the Comptroller, the State Treasurer, and Department of Legislative Services (DLS) and posted it online on August 5, 2013.

MDOT has consulted with the Capital Debt Affordability Committee (CDAC) and the Office of the Attorney General to determine the treatment of the capital portion of the availability payments (APs) in relation to CDAC calculations, classification as debt, and eligibility for payment over a time period of approximately thirty years.

MDOT presented to CDAC proposed parameters for structuring the APs to avoid classification as tax-supported debt that would impact the State's debt affordability analysis (see below). MDOT believes that, since the capital portion of the APs would be supported by revenues rather than taxes, that portion of the AP's could be treated as non-traditional MDOT debt, need not be considered in CDAC calculations, and can be paid over a $30\pm$ time period.

The parameters which support this conclusion include the following concepts:

- All project-related debt will be directly held by the private concessionaire.
- Project-related debt will have no recourse to the State.

ITEM: 12-GM (Continued)

- The capital portion of APs would be paid by an annual operating appropriation from the Transportation Trust Fund with a non-tax revenue source serving as a backup pledge, similar to prior non-traditional debt transactions.
- A portion of MTA system-wide operating revenues, including revenues from the Purple Line, (which, like all other MTA transit revenues, will flow into the Transportation Trust Fund,) will be the source of revenue associated with the capital portion of the Purple Line APs.
- The capital portion of APs will be subject to legislative review and approval through the annual legislative cap placed on MDOT's non-traditional debt.
- MDOT/MTA would make deductions from APs if the concessionaire does not meet pre-determined performance targets, with the specific magnitude and triggers for deductions as negotiated contractual terms.
- P3 concessionaire required to commit equity at a sufficient level to incentivize asset delivery discipline and act as a buffer for debt repayment.
- MDOT/MTA would submit an annual report to the CDAC on the Purple Line revenues.

P3 DESIGNATION: MDOT submits the Presolicitation Report to the Board of Public Works with this Agenda Item in support of the request that the Board designate the Purple Line a P3. The Presolicitation Report and supporting documents may be accessed at <u>http://purplelinemd.com/en/p3</u>.

The proposed P3 will be structured using a Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain (DBFOM) delivery model. Implementing this P3 structure for the Purple Line will involve a long-term, performance-based agreement between MDOT, on behalf of its Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), and a private entity in which appropriate risks and benefits are allocated in a cost-effective manner. The private entity, known as the concessionaire, will be responsible for final design, construction, financing, operations, and maintenance of the Purple Line asset over an operating period of approximately 30 years. MDOT/MTA would have ownership of the asset and remain ultimately accountable for the Purple Line and its public function.

During the construction period MDOT will make progress or milestone payments according to a specified schedule. Once the line is operational, MDOT will make availability payments that are linked directly to service quality measures. These payments will be funded using appropriations from the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund, federal grants, and local government contributions. MDOT/MTA will make deductions from these payments if the concessionaire does not meet pre-determined performance targets.

MDOT/MTA has thoroughly considered the key project delivery risks and mitigation strategies in using the P3 delivery method for the Purple Line. MDOT/MTA has concluded that delivery of the Purple Line using a DBFOM approach is consistent with project goals and the State's P3 policies. A P3 due diligence effort considered a wide range of policy, operational, and financial factors in assessing whether to use a P3 delivery method for the Purple Line instead of a traditional project delivery method.

The following factors support the use of a P3 delivery method for the Purple Line:

- *Operational factors:* The Purple Line is a natural stand-alone asset and the P3 approach will increase the likelihood of consistently excellent, highly responsive service.
- *Risk transfer efficiencies*: The P3 will integrate various project elements into a single agreement that clearly outlines the optimal allocation of project risk between the public and private partners.
- *Whole life-cycle planning and cost optimization:* The P3 will provide greater incentive to make investment decisions that are optimized over the life of the asset.
- *Schedule discipline:* A P3 agreement structure focused on asset availability will provide strong incentives for the concessionaire to maintain schedule discipline during asset delivery.
- *Enhanced opportunities for innovation:* The P3 will provide the private sector with opportunities and incentives to propose enhancements to the asset design and delivery approach that could benefit long-term operating and maintenance performance.
- *Potential financial value:* Due to the operational benefits, risk transfer efficiencies, life-cycle planning, scheduling discipline, and innovation opportunities of the P3 approach, there is potential for long-term financial savings relative to a traditional project delivery approach.

SELECTION PROCESS DESCRIPTION: MDOT submits the Solicitation Plan to the Board of Public Works with this Agenda Item in support of the request that the Board approve the proposed competitive solicitation method for selecting a concessionaire for the Purple Line.

A Purple Line P3 project delivery team, led by MDOT and MTA executives and supported by technical, legal, and transaction experts, is prepared to commence competitive and transparent solicitation process to select a concessionaire. The solicitation process will be consistent with COMAR 11.01.17 (MDOT's P3 regulations). The competitive solicitation process will begin with a Request for Qualifications to which proposer teams will submit Statements of Qualifications (SOQ). Based on the SOQs, MDOT/MTA will select a shortlist of qualified proposers. Next, MDOT/MTA will issue a draft Request for Proposals (RFP) to the shortlisted proposers. A series of industry review meetings will be held with shortlisted proposers before MDOT/MTA issues the final RFP. After evaluating the offers received in response to the RFP, MDOT/MTA will select a preferred concessionaire. After selecting a preferred concessionaire and finalizing the P3 agreement, MDOT will submit the agreement to the Comptroller, the State Treasurer, the budget committees, and DLS. Following this review and comment period, MDOT will return to the Board of Public Works for approval of the final P3 Agreement.

SUMMARY OF DRAFT P3 AGREEMENT KEY TERMS*

P3 Agreement	The P3 Agreement will be a set of integrated contract documents that will include, at a minimum, a concession agreement setting forth legal and business terms under which the concessionaire will design, construct, supply light rail vehicles, finance, operate, maintain, rehabilitate the facility, as well as technical provisions that include the project scope, design-build, operations, maintenance, rehabilitation, and other related requirements. The concessionaire will not have a leasehold or other real property interest in the project.
Term	The Term of the P3 Agreement will be 35 years, assuming 5 years of construction and 30 years of operating and maintenance responsibility.
Governing Law	Maryland law will govern.
Federal Requirements	The concessionaire will be required to comply with applicable federal laws and other requirements.
Indemnity	The concessionaire will indemnify, defend, protect and hold harmless MDOT/MTA against certain claims or losses resulting from the concessionaire's responsibilities and liabilities under the P3 Agreement.
Third Party Commitments	The P3 Agreement will specify the responsibilities of the concessionaire for implementation of commitments to third-parties as part of the project.
Project Management Plan	Upon execution of the P3 Agreement, the concessionaire will prepare a project management plan for approval by MDOT/MTA which details specifics of the development, design, construction, testing and commissioning, operation and maintenance of the project. The plan will include, among other topics: management and staffing, labor relations, quality control, community impacts, environmental protection and mitigation, operations and maintenance, and maintenance of traffic.
Financing	The concessionaire will be responsible for financing a part of the project, and a comprehensive description of the financing plan will be incorporated into the P3 Agreement.
Taxes	The concessionaire will be responsible for payment of all applicable taxes and assumes the risk of future changes in tax laws.
Payments to Concessionaire	Payments to the concessionaire will include payments during construction from a combination of public and private funding. The public funding includes the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund, FTA New Starts grants, and local government contributions. The private funding will be concessionaire-provided funding (borrowed funds and equity). Once construction and testing is complete, availability payments will be made to the concessionaire. The availability payments will be based on the concessionaire's performance during the operating period. If the performance does not meet established standards, the availability payment will be reduced (see Noncompliance below). MDOT/MTA will have the right to offset any payment owed to the concessionaire.
Fare Policy and Collection	MDOT/MTA will retain responsibility for fare policy and collection.

Light Rail Vehicles	Concessionaire will supply light rail vehicles (LRVs) meeting specified requirements, from the supplier identified in the Proposal. The concessionaire will be responsible for assuring quality of LRVs. MDOT/MTA will provide quality assurance oversight including plant inspections.
Quality Assurance / Quality Control	The concessionaire will provide and implement a quality assurance/ quality control plan. MDOT/MTA will provide quality assurance oversight.
Noncompliance with operating standards and requirements	Noncompliance with operating standards and requirements will result in decreases in availability payments and may result in termination. Standards and requirements for operations, maintenance, workforce training, reporting, and other activities will be included in the P3 Agreement.
Renewal Work and Handback Requirements	The concessionaire will be required to maintain and rehabilitate the facility so that, at the end of the term, it will be handed back to the MDOT / MTA in an acceptable condition with defined remaining useful life parameters, as specified in the agreement. MDOT/MTA and the concessionaire will begin five years prior to the end of the Term to identify the schedule for completion of such work.
Contracting	The concessionaire may contract with others, but the contracts will not relieve concessionaire of responsibility.
Economic Empowerment Programs	The concessionaire will be required to implement economic empowerment programs such as community workforce partnerships as well as comply with goals for Disadvantaged Business Enterprises.







The statistics for FY 2013 indicate that these patrols logged an estimated 8,432 patrol hours and responded 7,070 times (or roughly 27 times per day on average) from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. These records indicated that these vehicles are very effectively supplementing the CHART Patrol Program during the core hours of 5 am to 9 pm, Monday through Friday at essentially no cost to the state.
