**Description**: The Department of Natural Resources requests the Board of Public Works to approve DNR disbursing funds from the Ocean Beach Maintenance Fund for the purpose of maintaining the Ocean City Beach Replenishment Project as required by the Local Cooperation Agreement, dated March 30, 1990, between the State of Maryland, the Local Sponsor, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The costs are categorized as maintenance or monitoring.

*Monitoring* at \$299,860: The monitoring program was developed in the General Design Memorandum to determine the project's performance and periodic renourishment and maintenance needs. Instrument surveys of the beach are completed in October and May to determine the condition of the project in relation to the design template. Bi-annual monitoring includes visual and instrument surveys of the beach, berm and dune, aerial photography, sediment sampling and wave data collection and analysis. Under the Local Cooperation Agreement, monitoring is cost-shared at the level of 53% federal and 47% non-federal. The non-Federal portion is further cost-shared at the rate of 50% State, 25% Worcester County and 25% Town of Ocean City. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers takes the lead in monitoring. Costs for FY 2015 monitoring also include maintenance of the offshore wave gauge and sub-surface investigations of potential sand sources for future periodic nourishment projects. 16

- C. Grant Increase (up to) \$2,606,687 Chesapeake Bay Water Quality Projects Biological Nutrient Removal (NR 06.22). MDE certifies that the proposed actions comply with the tax-exempt bond provisions of the Internal Revenue Code and do not constitute a change in use or private activity.

**Project Description**: The proposed project entails the planning, design and construction of Biological Nutrient Removal (BNR) and Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) upgrades at the existing 0.60 million gallons per day (mgd) Winebrenner Wastewater Treatment Plant. Upon completion of the BNR and ENR improvements, the Winebrenner Wastewater Treatment Plant will be capable of achieving an effluent concentration goal of 3.0 mg/l for Total Nitrogen (TN) and 0.3 mg/l for Total Phosphorus (TP). This will allow for 83% reduction in TN and 90% reduction in TP, significantly reducing nutrients to Antietam Creek and ultimately to the Chesapeake Bay.

Camden Yards Sports Complex Series 2014 Taxable Refunding Revenue

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Public Works approve the Maryland Stadium Authority issuing new bonds – to be known as Series 2014 Refunding Revenue Bonds, the proceeds of which will be used to repay the outstanding principal balance on the Camden Yards Sports Complex Taxable Revenue Bond Series 2011.

**Legal Authority:** Subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Stadium Authority may borrow money from any source for any corporate purpose and, more specifically, for construction of the Camden Yards. Sections 10-644(c) and 10-644(d), Economic Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

**Background:** Reference is made to Secretary's Agenda Item 20 (August 10, 2011) in which the Board of Public Works approved the Stadium Authority issuing \$11.1 million in revenues bonds to finance capital projects at Camden Yards. When the bonds were placed, the best interest rate and term was three years at a fixed interest rate of 1.32% per annum. The Series 2011 bond will mature on December 15, 2014 with a principal balance due of \$10,010,000.

General Assembly Fiscal Committees Review: State law requires that 45 days before seeking Board of Public Works approval "for each bond issue or other financing," the Stadium Authority must provide the General Assembly fiscal committees with a comprehensive financing plan for review. Section 10-641(c) of the Economic Development Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. By letter dated November 14, 2014, the fiscal committees instructed the Authority "to proceed with Board of Public Works review of the plan."

**Action:** The Stadium Authority recommends, with respect to its Series 2014 Refunding Revenue Bonds, that the Board of Public Works:

#### 1. Authorize the Stadium Authority to:

- (a) Issue, sell, and deliver up to \$9,585,000 in non-tax supported Revenue Bonds with \$9,510,000 of proceeds to be used to refund outstanding balance of the Camden Yards Sports Facilities Taxable Revenue Bond, Series 2011 and the balance of proceeds to be used for closing costs along with \$500,000 from the Series 2011 Debt Service Reserve Account; and
- (b) Repay this obligation with interest over a period not to exceed ten years.

This method more appropriately corresponds to current market conditions.

The Treasurer notified the Legislative Policy Committee, in accordance with Section 8-403 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, of her request to periodically lease-finance equipment acquisitions, in an aggregate amount not exceeding \$35 million, over a two-year period beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2016.

Following the December 2014 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase financing, the remaining balance of the \$35 million approved by the Legislative Policy Committee for equipment lease-purchase financing will be approximately \$29.8 million.

Nature of Emergency: On October 14, 2014, the voicemail system at State Center, 301 W. Preston Street, Baltimore suffered a system failure. The system had been functioning normally, needing only routine maintenance, and gave no indication that it was near failure. The system failure affected approximately 30 agencies and more than 9,000 employees in the Baltimore region, leaving all without voicemail. Further, Department hotlines that depend on the voicemail system to answer calls from Maryland citizens became inoperable. DoIT attempted to repair the voicemail system with no success. However, it was not possible to repair the system because the voicemail system was nearly 15 years old and the manufacturer had discontinued the model. DoIT was left with only one option: to procure a new voicemail system. With the number of agencies and personnel affected by the system failure and how dependent the State's employees are on voicemail, as well as the loss of critical hotline services, DoIT determined that the outage could result in serious damage to public health, safety and welfare. Immediate action to replace the system was necessary.

#### A1. <u>DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY</u> (cont'd)

Basis for Selection: DoIT's selection of a voicemail system was based on three factors: system capability, system compatibility, and system availability. The replacement system had to be capable of coordinating up to 15,000 voicemail boxes, 150 ACD splits, and 220 voicemail trees with submenus. The replacement system had to be compatible with the current system. DoIT required the hardware to be shipped to Baltimore no later than October 17, 2014. DoIT determined that the NEC voicemail system would meet all requirements.

*Nature of Emergency:* Exelon Corporation filed with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission to acquire more than 20% of the outstanding voting interest of Pepco Holdings, Inc. (PHI), the company that owns Potomac Electric Power Company and Delmarva Power and Light Company, both regulated electric distribution companies in Maryland. On August 19, 2014, Exelon and PHI filed an application for approval of a merger with the State Public Service Commission.

Maryland Law requires that the Commission fully examine and investigate an application involving any acquisition of the power to exercise substantial influence over the policies and actions any regulated electric distribution company in Maryland, which includes Pepco, PHI, and Delmarva Power and Light. The Commission must complete its review and issue a decision within 180 days of the application being filed. The Commission may extend its 180-day time limit by 45 days, which it has done in this case.

The Commission's technical staff requires a consultant to: (1) respond to issues pertaining to the proposed Exelon/PHI transaction; (2) provide legal assistance in reviewing the transactional documents connected with the merger, and flag issues of importance; (3) evaluate the potential impact on services and conditions of operation, employment, community investment, charitable contributions, and the Maryland housing market; (4) evaluate the potential impact on rates and charges paid by Pepco customers; and (5) evaluate if and how the proposed acquisition will affect Pepco's current ring fencing protocol and if it should be revised.

Basis for Selection: The RFP was issued on June 11, 2014, and was posted on the Commission's website. The Commission directly solicited 300 companies. The Commission received five acceptable proposals and selected Overland Consulting because: (1) Proposal reflected the most comprehensive analysis of the issues; (2) Has experience not only with utility mergers in general, but with a past Exelon merger; (3) Has extensive experience in electric company acquisitions; (4) Has most extensive and complete issues list; (5) Project team represented all relevant disciplines, including finance, operations, affiliate review, customer service and safety, and public interest/cost-benefit analysis; (6) Proposal reflected the best understanding of the issues to be reviewed in this matter; (7) Overland has access to an extensive data base of key factors, conditions and data requests; and (8) Overland has particular experience on the important issue of ring fencing.

When a residential DW or community water supply is impacted by petroleum or CHS and the potential responsible party (PRP) cannot or will not finance the installation of a GAC water treatment system, the Oil Control and Land Restoration Programs contract with a private water filtration company to install and maintain a GAC system. Once a GAC system is installed, Program staff or the environmental consultants, hired by MDE for investigation and site management activities, will initiate a sampling program to ensure that the treatment system is functioning properly and adsorbing petroleum contaminants or CHS prior to end use of the water supply system. The water filtration company will be notified to replace units as needed based on sampling results after filtration and/or maintenance schedules.

The purpose of this contract is to employ water filtration contractors to provide these services Statewide. The work to be performed may involve a rapid response within a 24 hour time period, or, in most cases, only the routine replacement of filter media. The Department does not contract for these services at commercial locations.

**REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:** The increase in funding for Contract E is necessary due to additional work to be performed by the contractor, within scope, as a result of the federal law "Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (Map 21)". Under the Map 21 provisions, MDOT State Safety Oversight (SSO) responsibilities for Rail Safety will be expanded and the process required to document these changes are numerous. The contractor will assist MDOT SSO in documenting these federal requirements and providing technical expertise in this specific area.

It is in the best interest of the State to exercise the single two-year renewal option for all five contracts because analytical support and resources to support MDOT's ongoing transportation policy and planning, environment, and rail safety oversight responsibilities are still needed during the next two years. These contracts provide MDOT with contractor support and resources that provide: innovative transportation analysis, program evaluation, statewide, regional, and local multi-modal planning services for the movement of people and goods; strategic planning and analysis for environmental quality initiatives; and rail safety, communication and outreach challenges faced by the Offices of Planning and Capital Programming, Environment, and Rail Safety.

The five contractors have consistently provided high quality service over dozens of task orders during the three-year base contract term. Each contractor has made a good faith effort to meet or exceed its MBE participation goal, worked within established task budgets, and provided timely deliverables. The contracts are believed to be a good value for the work performed based on the current pricing. Therefore, exercising the renewal options is deemed to be more financially advantageous to the State, as opposed to initiating a new procurement for these services.

As this is the only available renewal option for these contracts, during the next two years, the services being provided and services anticipated to be needed for the following five years, beginning in 2017, will be evaluated. This POS contract involves pharmacy claims processing (including necessary Prospective Drug Utilization Review edits), clinical prior authorization services and pharmacy drug rebate management services. The pharmacy claims are adjudicated in real time and recipients are able to start the needed drug therapy right away and any interruption in this service can have a significant impact to the recipient's health and well-being.

The current solution is essential to student enrollment, recruitment, and enrollment management services. The original software was acquired by means of a competitive sealed bidding process.

BCCC has within the past four months retained the services of an administrative assistant to monitor the contract database to prevent recurring procurement problems. Before that, BCCC did not have a way to manage the contract-expiration database to notify personnel when contracts are close to their expiration and has been advised to seek a solution to address this ongoing issue. There have been multiple changes in key staff leaving the college, however if there was a reliable method to manage their contracts, changes in staff would not continue to plague their procurements/contracts.

- 1. Although the start-up demonstrated a variety of technical and procedural flaws, BI management and technical support teams responded to each issue in a timely and professional manner. The monitoring services were the initial priority, providing reliable and accurate home detention and GPS tracking; BI representatives worked closely with the DPSCS Information Technology & Communication unit to correct and refine the technical issues, and to properly train community supervision agents and supervisors in use of the equipment and monitoring reports.
- 2. There have been two major contract matters during the first three years of this contract and several minor issues, all of which were resolved. These have included technical deficiencies with the equipment and server functionality (CY 2012), reporting deficiencies with the invoices and backup documentation (CY 2013), and most recently a technical solution for poor cellular coverage in the northern area of the state (CY 2014). In each case, BI representatives collaborated with DPSCS staff to seek and implement viable solutions. The result is improved services, fewer technical problems and a more verifiable invoicing procedure.
- 3. DPSCS has also benefitted from BI's manufacturing capability. As the manufacturer of its own electronic monitoring equipment, BI routinely replaces defective or damaged units at no additional cost and provides software upgrades to deliver the most current electronic monitoring capabilities as stipulated in the contract.
- 4. All BI monitoring services, technical solutions and other resolutions have been delivered within budget.

**Remarks:** A cell phone managed access system is critical to prohibit Baltimore City Detention Center inmates from using contraband cellphones. The cell phone managed access system is one of many tools to stop gang activity inside the facility. The managed access system contract at BCDC was awarded to Tecore Networks in May 2013 on an emergency basis.

The installed system uses Tecore's Networks iNAC II technologies, which automatically differentiates between authorized and unauthorized cellular devices within a target area, without staff involvement or jamming wireless signals. Tecore is the sole owner of the proprietary iNAC II system required to continue the success of the State-owned equipment and software at BCDC.

DPSCS discussions with DoIT led to a conclusion that competition does exist for servicing and maintaining the equipment but there is not currently enough time for DPSCS to seek a competitive solution. Together, DoIT and DPSCS recommend extending the current contract by ten months and then competitively procuring a longer-term maintenance and service contract for the Cell Phone Managed Access System at BCDC.

To date, contractor has not achieved its 3% MBE goal; it will look for opportunities to engage the MBE going forward to ensure the goal is met.

This Solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace on July 18, 2014, and reached 2907 firms, of which 481 were SBR vendors, 299 were certified MBE firms and 75 were SBR/MBE firms. Nine (9) responsive bids were received. Tech Contracting Company, Inc. is a certified Small Business.

The main purpose of the renovations is to move several divisions out of multiple buildings and to colocate into one headquarters building to create improved interoperability, communication, and efficiency between critical Divisions within the agency. The space to be renovated is currently vacant, and the consolidation will eliminate the need to lease space in the adjacent 2400 Building.

The critical Divisions to be relocated consist of: the Office of Finance and a portion of the Office of Information Technology, which currently lease space at 2400 Broening Highway; the remaining Office of Information Technology currently located at the MDTA owned, 2340 Broening Highway building; and the Office of Procurement currently located at the MDTA owned Francis Scott Key ("FSK") Bridge Administration building. Upon the completion of the renovations, the lease at the 2400 building will be terminated for Convenience and other MDTA Divisions will be relocated to the FSK facility and the Police Special Operations Division will be relocated to the 2340 Broening Highway building.

Therefore, the MAA did not open MPLP's financial bid. MPLP filed a letter styled as a protest on October 15, 2014. After MAA posted the three (3) financial bids on MAA's website, MPLP withdrew its protest on November 5, 2014.
