History: In 1994, DHCD's Rental Housing Production Program lent Henson Creek Manor Associates \$1 million that Henson Creek Manor secured with a second lien on its property. Henson Creek Manor comprises seven buildings with 105 affordable residential family housing units. In 2006, DHCD lent Henson Creek Manor II \$850,000 that was likewise secured by a second lien on its property. Henson Creek Manor II comprises twelve buildings with 105 affordable residential family housing units. Both projects are fully occupied with adequate cash reserves and both receive satisfactory/good evaluations annual inspections.


A Washington Gas & Light project to replace existing pipeline that crosses I-95/495 is necessary due to maintenance and corrosion concerns. WGL will construct a gas line on Henson Creek Manor II and WGL will be given permanent right-of-way easement. A temporary one-year easement (which may be extended for up to six months) will allow WGL to access both Henson Creek Manor & Henson Creek Manor II during construction.

WGL has offered to pay Henson Creek Manor \$1,430 for the temporary easement. 
8. **DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES** Naming of the William Offutt Johnson Visitor Center at Patapsco Valley State Park

Recommendation: The Secretary of Natural Resources recommends that the Board of Public Works approve naming the visitor center at Patapsco Valley State Park the William Offutt Johnson Visitor Center at Patapsco Valley State Park in memory of Mr. Johnson, who died July 30, 2013 at the age of 72.

Wm. Offutt Johnson - Mr. Johnson was a long-time, dedicated employee of the Department of Natural Resources. He began his career as a planner in the Forests and Parks Unit. Later he became the Assistant Director of Maryland's Program Open Space and then finished his career serving as a park naturalist at Patapsco Valley State Park. Mr. Johnson spent five years restoring the 150-year-old stone house formerly part of the Avalon Iron and Nail Works to be transformed as Patapsco Valley State Park's first full-time Visitor Center. Mr. Johnson, working along with the park manager, organized a not-for-profit Friends of Patapsco Valley State Park raising funds and donating services for the renovation work on the Visitor Center, and funding the new exhibits.

Offutt Johnson retired with 35 years of faithful state service on March 1, 2001. His passion and commitment to parks, open space, and recreation did not end when he retired; but continued through his volunteer efforts with the State forests and parks centennial celebration, and helping significantly to establish the Foundation for Maryland Conservation History. He researched and wrote many articles for the Committee for Maryland Conservation History and DNR about the Civilian Conservation Corps and DNR's role in establishing State forests, State parks, and outdoor recreation in Maryland.

Patapsco Valley State Park - Patapsco Valley State Park is one of Maryland's first state parks, dating back to 1907. The park encompasses over 16,000 acres and extends along 32 miles of the Patapsco River in Baltimore and Howard Counties. Recreational opportunities include hiking, fishing, camping, canoeing, picnicking, horseback and mountain bike trails. The Park's Visitor Center houses exhibits spanning 300 years of history along the Patapsco River. This 19th century stone dwelling includes a re-creation of a 1930's forest warden's office.

Project Description: The project entails the replacement of pipes, spring houses, pumping equipment, the lining of the basins and ancillary improvements to enhance the system performance. The City of Frostburg plans to conserve water and reduce energy consumption by rehabilitating the City's raw drinking water collection system in the Savage River basin located in Garrett County. Presently, the aging and deteriorating system experiences a substantial amount of leakage due to out-of-date equipment and deteriorating facilities.



Nature of Emergency: As part of the Commission's decision in the merger of Exelon Corporation and Constellation Energy Group, Inc., Exelon was directed to invest \$113.5 million into a Customer Investment Fund to provide both short and long-term economic benefits to BGE's residential and business customers and to pay for program administrative costs. The Commission awarded over \$112 million to 16 programs from six proposers. This Area is located within the Lower Susquehanna Heritage Greenway, a certified Maryland Heritage Area. The Board of Public Works approved the designation of the Lower Deer Creek Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

5. Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area

Somerset and Worcester Counties

Grant of **\$600,000** to acquire easements and fee simple interests to protect significant woodland, farmland, and wetlands. The Area includes one of the most pristine and ecologically significant watershed basins on the mid-Atlantic. St. Mary's County

Grant of **\$212,979** to match Navy Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration program funds to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect Area's rich farmland, forests, wetlands, historic sites, and wildlife habitat. Conservation within Area will provide water quality benefits to Chesapeake Bay and St. Mary's River watershed. The Board of Public Works approved the designation of the Mattapany Rural Legacy Area in 2006.

Situated within the Ridge & Valley Physiographic Province where it meets the Allegheny Front, the first rural legacy area in Allegany County includes large blocks of unbroken forest, pristine ecologically significant areas and historic sites. It includes exemplary plant and wildlife habitat, and is an important migration corridor and perhaps the most significant golden eagle flyway in the state. The Area is delineated around 10,163 acres of existing protected lands which may be further connected and consolidated, forming a greenway potentially linking ridgetops in West Virginia with Pennsylvania, as well as westward into the Allegheny Plateau. The Board of Public Works approved the designation of Mountain Ridge Rural Legacy Area in 2010.





11A. MARYLAND ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST

Recommendation: Maryland Environmental Trust recommends that the Board of Public Works approve amending a deed of conservation easement to allow the fee simple owner to permit Columbia Gas Transmission, LLC to widen its right-of-way on the eased property.

Reference: Deed of Conservation Easement, dated October 3, 2002 and recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County at Liber 17140, Folio 567.

Prior Approval: Reference is made to Secretary's Agenda Item 9(B) (Oct. 30, 2002) in which the Board of Public Works ratified the donation of a conservation easement on a 25.77-acre property located on **Carroll Road in Baltimore County** to the Trust from W. Robert Zinkham and Theresa A. McGeehan.

Project Description: Ms. McGeehan is now sole owner of the property encumbered by the easement. Columbia Gas Transmission, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, seeks to widen – by 54 feet – its existing 850-foot long right-of-way on that property. In the expanded right-of-way, Columbia proposes to excavate and install a 26-inch diameter gas pipeline parallel to its existing pipeline. The total permanent impact area is 1.06 acres. The property is primarily pasture to the west end and forested in the east. Planned forest clearing would be 0.40 acre.

Columbia has the power of eminent domain, as derived from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. See Natural Gas Act, 15 U.S.C.S. § 717f(h). This power vests Columbia with the authority to preempt the Trust's easement. This right-of-way expansion is part of a 21.1 mile project to construct Columbia MB, a liquefied natural gas pipeline parallel to and looping with the existing Columbia MA pipeline. The Columbia MB project is planned to cross numerous Trust-eased properties, most in the Caves Valley area of Baltimore County. The Trust and Columbia have negotiated to minimize impact on these conservation easements while still meeting FERC safety requirements.

McGeehan has agreed to the widening of the right-of-way on her property. The Trust, to avoid Columbia exercising its power of eminent domain on the easement, has agreed to amend the easement to allow the widening which the Trust finds will result in *de minimis* impact to the easement's conservation values. In turn, Columbia has agreed to provide mitigation, for stewardship costs, and water quality enhancement practices.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. Copies of the solicitation notice were sent directly to seven prospective vendors that are MBEs known to do this type of service. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Three proposals were received in response to the RFP, and all were deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. After the first Best and Final Offer was issued, one offeror requested to withdraw its proposal and was approved by MDOT to do so.

The recommended awardee, National Economic Research Associates, Inc. (NERA), proposed the offer that was deemed to be the more advantageous offer to the State. Ranked overall #1, it was determined that NERA's technical proposal was superior to the other offeror's technical proposal, and the technical benefits in NERA's proposal outweighed the lower price (approximately \$400K less or 21%) of the #2 ranked technical offeror. The RFP stated that technical factors would be given more weight than financial factors in the overall award determination.

NERA's proposal offered an approach that was judged to be much more likely to produce the best available evidence of the availability and utilization of minority- and woman-owned (M/WBE) firms in the relevant product and geographic markets in which the State participates. One of the essential elements of a disparity study is determining whether there are disparities between the availability of M/WBE businesses and their utilization in the State's relevant markets. If there are disparities evidencing the existence of discrimination, the State may constitutionally employ, as it has in the past, a program that aims to remedy the discrimination.

The contractor's findings and conclusions will be used to assess the existence, extent and impact of discrimination, if any, against M/WBE firms on contracting opportunities within the public and private sectors of the State's product and geographic markets. The contractor shall analyze the State's contracting and procurement practices, determine availability and utilization of M/WBE firms in the State's markets, and provide best practices to the State on procurement procedures, and/or MBE, Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Airport Concession DBE initiatives.



During the five-year base contract term, the activities to be accomplished include the completion of 18 tasks to be performed in accordance with the contractor's detailed work plan, resulting in recommendations presented in both draft and final reports to be submitted to MDOT. The renewal option is available based upon the potential need to require additional analyses of the study data, litigation support and/or other services in connection with DBE/MBE goal setting for subsequent years.

The *Award Amount* is a not-to-exceed (NTE) amount for the entire possible seven-year contract. The total firm fixed fee amount proposed by the awardee is \$1,342,985. The additional \$2,157,015 is a NTE amount for the time and materials portion of the work and any additional costs incurred for litigation, postage, presentations, travel, etc. during the base term and possible two-year renewal option period.

A 22% MBE participation goal was established for this contract, as well as a 1% VSBE participation goal, based upon the subcontracting opportunities available.

Of the 17 firms that received a copy of the solicitation, only three are known to possess the FAA certification requirements to perform inspections and repairs of the aircraft. MDA contacted all potential bidders to determine why they did not bid. Responses received included: "we lack experience in the services required" (not certified to inspect this type of aircraft); "doing business with government is simply too complicated"; and "other commitments preclude our participation at this time".

The *Award Amount* and the *Bid Amount* shown above are different. The *Bid Amount* was based upon a pricing model for an estimated 1,500 labor hours, plus materials, shipping and handling. The *Award Amount* is based upon a firm fixed hourly rate for the actual price of repairs. Actual prices are not known until the Aircraft is disassembled, inspected and a list of services, labor and replacement parts is finalized on the Series 90 Aircraft.

MDA is seeking retroactive approval of this inspection and repair contract because the FAA license status for the aircraft was about to expire due to a required maintenance event within one month of completing the procurement process, and MDA did not have time to bring the award recommendation to the BPW prior to awarding the contract. In order to fly the aircraft to the contractor's location, the aircraft needed to be in license; the volatile winter weather needed to be safe for the intended flight; and the contractor needed room in their schedule to perform the maintenance, as well as having available the secure storage for the aircraft required since 9/11. In addition, the Mosquito Control Section needed the aircraft available on or about March 20th for spring mosquito larviciding.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) is a consortium of states working together to develop a common set of assessments in English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics in response to the awarding of a Comprehensive Assessment Systems Grant funded in fiscal year 2010 under the auspices of the United States Department of Education's (USDE) 2010 Race to the Top Assessment Program (the RTTT Program). The RTTT Program, authorized under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), provided funding to the Consortium to develop assessment systems that provide valid, reliable, and fair performance results for individual and groups of students against a common set of college and career readiness standards. The RTTT Program further required that the Consortium develop a plan for sustainability of the common assessments upon expiration of the original grant in 2015.

The Consortium is composed of 12 member states and the District of Columbia. All current member states also comprise the PARCC Governing Board. In addition to being a member of the Governing Board, Maryland is the Fiscal Agent for the Consortium.

In 2013, the Consortium determined that the needs of its member states and the Consortium as a whole would be best served by choosing a single vendor authorized to develop and implement multiple components of the Consortium's assessment system. The Consortium further determined that the single authorized vendor needed to be procured and chosen through a competitive solicitation process. With the approval of the Consortium, in November 2013, New Mexico, a Governing Board member state, issued a Request for Proposals (New Mexico RFP). The New Mexico RFP sought a vendor to provide a complete assessment system, including: test development; assessment administration; psychometric services; reporting; standard setting; and program management. The New Mexico RFP specifically allowed the contract resulting from the New Mexico RFP to be available to entities both within and outside of the state of New Mexico. NCS Pearson, Inc. (Pearson) was the only offeror to submit a proposal in response to the New Mexico RFP.

As part of the New Mexico procurement process, representatives of other members of the Consortium participated in the evaluation of the Pearson proposal and the final price negotiations. Members of the New Mexico RFP technical evaluation committee included representatives from Arizona, Colorado, Maryland, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and Tennessee. Members of the New Mexico RFP price negotiation team included representatives from Illinois, Massachusetts, Mississippi, and New Mexico. New Mexico completed its procurement process and, in May 2014, entered into a contract with Pearson (New Mexico, Contract No. 14-924-P527-00304) for assessment system development and implementation (the New Mexico Price Agreement). The New Mexico Price Agreement has a term of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2018.

With the finalized New Mexico Price Agreement, Pearson is the only vendor authorized by the Consortium to provide assessment system development and implementation services to Consortium member states. The scope of work of the Pearson New Mexico Price Agreement and this sole source contract are not funded by the 2010 grant, which is limited to PARCC assessment development generally, whereas the sole source contract involves operational assessment implementation.

These K-12 assessments will build a pathway to college and career readiness by the end of high school, mark students' progress toward this goal from grade 3 through high school, and provide teachers with timely information to inform instruction and provide student support. The PARCC assessments were field-tested in Spring 2014 and the operational assessments will be implemented in the 2014-15 school year.

The assessment design presents PARCC member states with a strong and coherent set of assessment components that are sustainable both in terms of cost and time devoted to student assessment and that signal the kinds of instruction needed for all of our students to make progress towards college and career readiness by the end of high school. The design assures that:

- PARCC assessments will provide comparable results across member states.
- PARCC summative assessments are designed to report the extent to which students are "on track" or "ready" for college and careers.
- PARCC assessments will be performance-based and measure the full range of Maryland Career and College Ready Standards, including but not limited to areas not included in many state assessments such as writing, speaking and listening, and solving multi-step mathematical problems.
- PARCC assessments will use technology in all phases of the system including test development, administration, scoring, and reporting. As a result, it is anticipated that assessment tasks will be more authentic and engaging, students with disabilities will have more efficient and consistent access to needed accommodations, with the intent that results will be returned more quickly, and assessment costs will be reduced.
- PARCC assessments will allow for international comparisons. Not only will PARCC assessments provide comparable results across member states, but also steps will be taken to link PARCC results to international measures such as TIMSS-Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study and PISA Programme for International Student Assessment. The ability to make international comparisons will allow policy makers and business leaders to truly gauge the extent to which our public schools are preparing students to succeed in the increasingly competitive global economy.

The implementation of the PARCC Consortium testing in English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics for students in grades 3 through high school will replace the current Maryland School Assessment testing program in Maryland and replace Maryland High School Assessments in Algebra and English 10, only.

Neither the New Mexico RFP nor the New Mexico Price Agreement contained an MBE participation goal. MSDE has negotiated with Pearson to commit to a 3.75% MBE participation goal for this sole source contract.

MSDE originally anticipated bringing this contract award recommendation to the BPW for approval on July 2nd, 2014. However, on May 6, 2014, New Mexico received a bid protest. This protest was denied based upon New Mexico's determination that the protest was untimely. The denial was appealed to the New Mexico District Court, and on May 27, 2014, the New Mexico District Court found that the protest was timely filed and ordered New Mexico to issue a decision on the merits of the protest. On July 3, 2014, the protest was denied by the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent. The delay caused by the protest and appeal resulted in this request for approval being delayed and, in turn, this contract being retroactive in order to conform with the New Mexico price agreement, including the deliverable and payment schedules set forth therein.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. A copy of the solicitation was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

The services are divided into three areas to meet the USDA's minimum delivery requirements for its commodities.

Area 1 – Eastern: Worcester, Somerset, Wicomico, Dorchester, Caroline, Talbot, Queen Anne's and Kent Counties. This region must double-up on deliveries of certain commodities (bi-weekly instead of weekly) in order to meet the minimum delivery requirements.

Area 2 - Central: Baltimore City, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Calvert, Carroll, Cecil, Charles, Harford, Howard, and St. Mary's Counties.

Area 3 – Western: Garrett, Allegany, Washington, Frederick, and Prince George's Counties. This region includes Prince George's County to add volume to the western region to ensure that all the schools in the area could utilize the USDA Commodity program to its maximum potential with weekly deliveries.

The purpose of these multiple contracts is to engage commercial warehouses in three regional locations. Bidders could bid on one, two or all three areas. Four bids were received in response to the IFB. Two bids for Area 1, one bid each for Area 2 and 3. The second bidder for Area 1 requested to withdraw its bid, and MSDE allowed them to withdraw. Awards are recommended as follows:

Sysco E is responsible and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Also, Sysco E's price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation.

Area 2 – MTC Logistics (MTC) is recommended for award because it was the only bid received for storage and distribution of frozen foods for the central region. MTC is responsible and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Also, MTC's price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation.

Area 3 – Sysco Baltimore, LLC (Sysco B) is recommended for award because it was the only bid received for storage and distribution of frozen and dry foods for the western region. Sysco B is responsible and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Also, Sysco B's price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation.

The facilities of all three vendors recommended for award have been inspected and found to have all the required health inspection certification, equipment and processes in place for efficient storage and distribution of the foods.

MSDE is responsible for the administration of federally supported nutrition assistance programs that provide USDA Foods to help sponsors in schools, residential child care institutions, and adult day care programs to help meet the nutritional needs of their participants throughout the State. Under the programs, MSDE receives and distributes USDA Foods to the sponsors to help defray the cost of providing nutrition assistance program meals. The USDA Foods program is designed to defray 20% of a sponsor's food cost. Contracts with commercial warehouses are maintained to provide centralized points of receipt, storage, and distribution of USDA Foods. Sponsors work directly with the contracted warehouses to receive their USDA Foods. The recipient provides transportation for the pickup of its food from the warehouse in the central region for Area 2. The warehouse contractor is required to provide delivery services for the eastern and western regions for Areas 1 and 3.

The warehouse bills MSDE for the storage costs of the food quantities disbursed based on the rates contained in the contract. MSDE bills the recipients directly for the storage and/or distribution costs. This process allows the warehouses to maintain one centralized contact through MSDE for payments. MSDE is able to track and monitor food distribution and receive funds back from the recipients.

There was no MBE participation goal established for these contracts because a centralized point of storage is required. There are no components of the contract that could be subcontracted. The services provided are only for storage and distribution of the foods. Transportation for pick up of food from the central region warehouses is provided by the recipients. The vendors for the eastern and western regions would be at a competitive disadvantage to subcontract delivery services already on its delivery route and would subsequently drive up the prices charged to the State.



There were 15 bids received in response to the IFB; nine bids were from MBEs. Award is recommended to the three lowest priced responsive bids from responsible bidders.

The College has experienced a number of vacancies and needs temporary personnel services to ensure service continuity and workforce stabilization. Thus, allowing the College to fulfill its obligations to students, facility, and staff while recruiting permanent staff for the temporary personnel needs.

The *Award Amount* and the *Bid Prices* are different. The *Bid Prices* are the total hourly rates for all 32 positions used for comparison of the bids. The *Award Amount* is a not-to-exceed amount based upon the College's historical usage over the last four years and anticipated need for the next three years.

The positions will be filled by "right of first refusal". If the lowest priced bidder cannot fill the position, the second lowest priced bidder will be given the opportunity to fill the position. If the second lowest priced bidder cannot fill the position, the third lowest priced bidder will be given the opportunity to fill the position.

The College determined that in order to encourage the most MBE participation would be to have MBEs participate as prime contractors because it would be difficult to subcontract when there are multiple awards and no one is guaranteed any amount of work on the contracts. 

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The Vehicle Emission Inspection Program (VEIP) is a jointly managed program by the MVA and the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE). VEIP is a highly visible program that has a strong track record of environmental benefits, motorist convenience, and low motorist test fees. This Statewide comprehensive program has 18 facilities that have conducted over 8.3 million complex, high volume, on demand emissions test from August 2009 to June 2014.

The contract allows for a maximum 15 minute wait time, the average wait time has been consistent at six minutes. The Contractor, Envirotest Maryland, has transitioned the program from a chassis Dynamometer driven testing (the vehicle is driven on to rollers) process to a more efficient, less problematic On-Board Diagnostics II (OBDII) system. With this OBDII system, customers are able to get their vehicles tested with greater ease, less wait and achieving quality assurance standards. Envirotest Maryland's responsiveness to opportunities identified within the program, their ability to make software modification to effectively address changes in the program and their technological advances (now Kiosk testing of the program) have helped to put Maryland at the forefront of testing.

Furthermore, this contract has allowed MVA to maintain one of the lowest testing fees in the country at \$14. During the contract term through FY2013, \$117,223,449 has been generated in testing fees. After paying the contractor and other expenses, the VEIP surplus to the State was \$47,264,402 or approximately 40%. It is projected that this annual surplus will remain steady at approximately \$30M or 40%. The MVA is very satisfied with Envirotest Maryland's performance and believes that exercising the renewal option is in the best interest of the State.

The major divisions directly related to the detention, custody and supervision of persons who are detained, incarcerated or supervised in the community include the Division of Pretrial Detention and Services, the Division of Correction, Patuxent Institution and the Division of Parole and Probation. On a daily basis, the Division of Pretrial Detention and Services, the Division of Parole and Probation supervise approximately 100,000 individuals in 23 correctional facilities and 45 parole and probation supervision offices throughout the State. The DPSCS mission is to help make communities safe through effective oversight and supervision. Detecting, deterring and treating substance abusers are essential components to this process.

DPSCS has determined that the Contractor, Phamatech, Inc., is fulfilling all the contract requirements and that the price is reasonable based upon the renewal rates approved during the contract award. Exercising the renewal option is in the best interest of the State and it is crucial that drug tests or expert testimony appearances are performed and the chain of custody for drug testing be maintained for the accuracy of test results/analysis.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Under the Refugee Act of 1980, the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR), funds States to provide cash and medical assistance, employment and training programs, and support services to employable refugees to ensure their early employment and economic independence shortly after arrival in the United States. Employment services for refugees are intended to reduce or eliminate refugee public assistance dependency through job placement.

ORR funds Maryland's Refugee Resettlement Program through DHR's Office for Refugees and Asylees (MORA). ORR also administers the Division of Unaccompanied Children's Services charged with meeting the protection needs of undocumented children, often the victims of human trafficking. To ensure adequate funding for programs addressing the needs of children seeking refuge, ORR has reprogrammed funds obligated for refugee services into programs addressing the influx of children at the border. This budget realignment at the national level has required Maryland and other states to reconfigure services and restructure spending patterns. In addition to completing the procurement process, this modification will allow MORA time to assess the availability of funds for all refugee programs in FY 2015.

To date, Maryland's Refugee Employment Services program has met or exceeded outcome goals for placements, retentions, wages and benefits. These goals are comparable to those of mainstream employment programs. Accomplishments are notable given that refugee clients are newly arrived, lacking English, and unfamiliar with the American working world.

Based on reported data, the contractors, LSS and IRC, are on target to meet or exceed contract performance requirements. LSS registered an average of 288 clients per year for employment services, exceeding its goal of 280. IRC registered an average of 481 clients per year, exceeding its goal of 420. Job placements by both contractors exceeded the goal of 80% of the caseload. LSS placed an annual average of 250 clients or 87% of the caseload. And, IRC placed an annual average of 406 clients or 84% of the caseload.


REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Approval of this Item will increase the overall approved positions in the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems' General Administration by 0.9 positions.

A full-time Data, Informatics & Research staff position is needed to maintain the Maryland Trauma Registry. This employee analyzes the data for nine adult trauma centers, two out of state adult trauma centers, two pediatric trauma centers (one in State and one out of state), as well as the hand, eye and burn specialty trauma centers. A full time position will allow MIEMSS to continue to designate specialty programs throughout the State and work with EMS Operation Programs while maintaining participation requirements in National Registries. The entering and analyzing of the data into these registries is imperative in determining how Maryland is performing from a Statewide perspective and guides MIEMSS in how to provide care to the citizens of Maryland. An increase in this employee's current scheduled hours of work will accommodate the increase workload associated with participation in the required registries.

ITEM: 14-GM (Cont.)

A full-time Assistant Attorney General is needed to review, revise, and promulgate the agency's regulations which encompass 9 subtitles in COMAR Title 30. Additionally, the Assistant Attorney General is the prosecuting attorney for all disciplinary matters involving licensed and certified EMS providers. There are approximately 30-40 contested cases each year. The Assistant Attorney General is responsible for each step of the process for each case, including peer review, settlement conference, presenting the case to the EMS Board, and if necessary, trying the case before the Office of Administrative Hearings. A full time position will allow MIEMSS to complete a number of major projects on schedule which will continue to make increasing demands on the Assistant Attorney General's time. These anticipated projects include a major revision of the EMS Education Program regulations, updating the perinatal referral center standard regulations, developing memorandums of understanding with out of state perinatal referral centers, working with a taskforce to develop and promulgate new pediatric transport regulations for the State Office of Commercial Ambulance Licensing & Regulation and developing and working with a task force to look at due process issues in the jurisdictional medical review process.

DBM REMARKS: The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management and the Acting Executive Director of the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems have certified that funds are available for the new positions for which approval is requested within the Rule of 100. If the Board approves this request, 0.9 positions will have been approved within the Rule of 100 for FY2015.





Remarks: The State Police relies heavily on federal grants for many of its Information Technology development projects. Federal grants typically must be performed within 12-18 months after award. When additional technical resources are needed to perform grant-funded work, the State Police has two alternatives. It must use an available State personnel contract, entailing a Request for Resume which takes approximately 10-12 weeks from solicitation development to award but provides a resource for no more than 6 months or a task-order Request For Proposals which takes approximately 24-40 weeks from solicitation development to award but may provide a resource for more than a 6 month period. Or, in the alternative, the State Police have to use an intra-agency Memorandum of Understanding which is dependent upon resource availability at another agency and may not be cost-competitive.



Remarks (cont'd): Delaying the State Police's ability to quickly bring on technical staff causes immediate complications with grant awards, requiring the State Police to request multiple extensions on grant performance periods and, at times, causing a loss of credibility for the State Police with the federal grantors (*i.e.*, the Department of Justice, the Office of Justice Programs, the Bureau of Justice Statistics).

By putting this Staffing Resources contract in place, the State Police will be able to quickly staff contractual positions and reduce cost and risk to not only the agency, but to the State. While the staffing of grant projects is the impetus for requesting this contract, the State Police will also use the contract to staff technical positions that are not grant funded. For example, the State Police currently has four large-scale, ongoing software/system development projects (CAD/RMS, 700 MHz Radios, Licensing Automation, and E911) that could and would benefit from this contract.

Seventeen vendors attended the pre-proposal conference; 20 proposals were received. After reviewing the technical and financial responses, and requesting Best and Final Offers, the evaluation committee determined four of the vendors offered the best value to the State.


REMARKS: The purpose of this sole source contract is to provide a mechanism to compensate the Community Service Provider for work that was completed prior to the BPW approved expiration date. The original contract, Contract No. 5100HC11, was approved by BPW on 05/21/08 as DOT Agenda Item 26-M. Contract Modification No. 1 was reported via DCAR in June 2011 for a 3-month extension with no additional funds requested as the contract had sufficient funding balance to cover the modification term.

Late in 2013, The Arc Baltimore, Inc. notified SHA that an independent audit of the contract discovered nonpayment for three (3) outstanding invoices for monthly services rendered in 2010. SHA conducted a complete investigation of FMIS records and concluded that the outstanding invoices were never processed for payment. Absence of contract oversight occurred from poor communications within the SHA when contract management responsibilities were transferred from one department to another department. In addition, multiple contract management changes occurred within SHA and the vendor. SHA's Office of Maintenance has implemented new procedures to prevent such a similar occurrence and to monitor contract transaction compliance in the future.

The expired contract remaining balance has insufficient funds since the original value was allocated to the three (3) month extension period on Contract Modification No. 1. The Arc Baltimore, Inc. has performed the required tasks as specified under the terms and conditions of the contract.

Since the contract is now expired, this sole source contract is required in order to compensate the community service provider for work performed and accepted.

REMARKS: The procurement of a Level 6 Flight Training Device (Training Device) was listed in the original Request for Proposals, as amended (RFP) and was offered in AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation's response to the RFP. However, the parties were unable to reach a final resolution of the specifications for the Training Device (and consequently the Contract price of the Training Device) in time to include the Training Device as part of the Original Contract because various technical and operational specifications and fit-out decisions for the helicopter units took longer to resolve than was anticipated. Consequently, in order to move forward with the production and delivery of the helicopter units without further delay, the State decided to delete the procurement of the Training Device from the imminent procurement of the helicopter units and to defer action on the Training Device until such time as the State was about to begin taking delivery of the helicopters.

ITEM: 7-E-MOD (Continued)

During the period between the date of the Original Contract and the date the State started taking delivery of the first helicopter units, AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation and the State continued discussions and negotiations about the possibility of completing the overall procurement as described in the RFP, by taking action on the deferred Training Device.

Historically, pilots were initially trained directly in the MSPAC AS-365 Dauphin helicopters. The AW139 helicopters are significantly more complex in operation and capability and as such, initial pilot training requires a Federal Aviation Administration approved type-rating pilot training course to be conducted at a Federal Aviation Administration certified flight school. After the initial pilot training and certification (Type-Rating) has been accomplished, annual recurrent pilot training is required for all pilots to remain certified to fly the AW139 helicopters. The Helicopter Program Management Office at MDOT was directed by the Maryland General Assembly at the 2013 session to prepare a Cost Benefit Analysis to determine the most cost-effective and efficient approach to provide for the recurrent pilot training requirements for the MSPAC. The Cost Benefit Analysis was based on a number of assumptions made surrounding three possible recurrent pilot and co-pilot training delivery configurations. As delineated within the Cost Benefit Analysis, the three configurations analyzed possessed both positive and negative elements. Considering all of the pros, cons and projected 20-year costs to obtain the required recurrent pilot training, the Benefit/Savings Summary clearly supported the acquisition of a Training Device as being the most cost-effective and efficient approach and in the best interests of the State and MSPAC.

As to the other changes included in this Contract Modification No. 3, AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation was to provide the State with Night Vision Goggle Training, as per the terms and conditions of the Original Contract. However; the simulators utilized by AWPC were not certified for Night Vision Goggle Training. MSPAC therefore had some of its pilots trained as NVG instructors and they in turn train and certify the section pilots during their transition training to the AW 139 helicopters. In exchange for MSPAC performing and assuming the costs of the NVG training, AWPC agreed to provide to the State, five (5) additional initial pilot training slots, 65 recurrent training slots and Mass Vibration Absorber kits for each helicopter in MSPAC's fleet.

With respect to the medical interiors of the helicopters, after delivery of the helicopters, the Federal Aviation Administration required some minor changes to the medical interiors of the helicopters. At no cost to the State, AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation changed the secondary litter restraint system, modified the firewall to allow access between the cabin and storage areas and changed the weight requirements for the neo-natal isollette. AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation or its certified subcontractor will make these changes at MSPAC's facility at Martin State Airport at no cost to the State.


Additionally, after delivery of the first six (6) helicopters, AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation made certain modest improvements to the AW 139 helicopter units that were approved by the FAA. One of these improvements was changing the keyboard at the tactical station. Helicopters units 7 - 10 were installed with rubberized keyboards instead of the standard hard plastic keyboard associated with a computer. The rubberized keyboards are more suitable when in a medical environment. Although not required, AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation agreed, at no cost to the State, to provide the equipment and installation instructions to the MSPAC to retrofit the first six (6) helicopters. Any further AW 139 helicopter units ordered by the State will be similarly outfitted.

ITEM: 7-E-MOD (Continued)

Lastly, AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation has agreed to provide a laptop computer for each helicopter unit delivered to the State. AgustaWestland Philadelphia Corporation will install the software and set up each computer thus allowing MSPAC technicians to download any information stored in the avionics and other systems in the helicopter. There is no charge to the State for these computers or software.
