1. BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS

Advisory 2016-1 Fair and Reasonable Contract Price

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works issue BPW Advisory 2016-1 to provide guidance to State agencies on how to ensure that procurement contract pricing is fair and reasonable. This Advisory applies when procurement agencies are determining to award, or recommending to award, contracts on a sole-source or single bid/offer basis.

Authority: The Board controls procurement by procurement units and sets policy.

STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, §12-101(b)

The Procurement Advisor to the Board shall effect and enhance communication between State units on procurement matters, disseminate information on current developments, and make recommendations to the Board as to the appropriateness of each procurement subject to review by the Board.

STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, §12-102(a)(2)

Background: When a procurement agency seeks to award a procurement contract on a sole source basis or based on a single bid or offer received, the agency must, in the absence of competition, determine that the proposed contract price is fair and reasonable. Proposed BPW Advisory 2016-1 provides uniform guidance to State agencies on how to perform a "fair and reasonable" price analysis or cost analysis, as well as instructs agencies on what to include on Action Agenda Items for recommendations of sole source contract awards and competitive procurement awards in which a single bid or offer was received.

Wetlands License/Extraordinary Case

Recommendation: Approval is requested of the following application for a wetlands license for a project involving dredging in the navigable waters of Maryland. This case is classified as an extraordinary case because of the recommendation that mitigation be conditionally required. The Board of Public Works' Wetlands Administrator recommends that a license be granted as indicated. The Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

Authority: Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland: "The Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents." See also COMAR 23.02.04.

Mitigation: COMAR 23.02.04.14D: "The Board may require mitigation for unavoidable adverse environmental effects or loss of State wetlands caused by a licensed structure or activity." Monetary mitigation is deposited in the Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund. This proposal to maintenance dredge a channel will impact a small submerged aquatic vegetation bed (408 square feet). Licensee is required to monitor the dredged channel to determine if the submerged aquatic vegetation is at least 85% regrown after three years. If the SAV has not regrown at the end of the three-year monitoring period, Licensee shall mitigate for the impact on a 3:1 ratio (wetlands to be mitigated to lost wetlands). See COMAR 26.24.05.01C(1)(e) & (2). Mitigation is calculated based on \$75,000 per acre.

Proposed mitigation is \$4,230: 408 sq ft impacted/43,560 sq ft in an acre = 0.0094 acre x 75,000 at a 3 to 1 ratio = \$2,115 x 2 (out of kind multiplier) = \$4,230.

History: In May 1998, DHCD loaned the Housing Authority of Baltimore City \$2,405,000 to assist in the development of Uptown Apartments, a 38-unit affordable housing project located at scattered sites in Baltimore City. Payments on Partnership Rental Housing Program loans are deferred in perpetuity if the project complies with the requirements of the loan program. DHCD holds a first lien position on 25 properties securing this loan.

The Department and Housing Authority of City of Baltimore now requests that two of the properties collateralizing the loan, 1707 and 1710 Mosher Street, both vacant, be released so they can be razed as part of Project Creating Opportunities for Renewal and Enterprise (CORE). Razing these buildings will facilitate the refurbishing of the Baltimore City Police Department's Western District Police Station and the redevelopment of the surrounding neighborhood.

Although the release of these two properties may temporarily slightly diminish the value of the collateral for the Partnership Rental Housing Program loan, the redevelopment of the neighborhood will increase the value of the remaining properties in the project, thereby increasing the value of the collateral for the Partnership Rental Housing Program loan.

Authority: The Maryland Water Quality Financing "Administration is authorized, subject to the prior approval of the Board [of Public Works] and the Secretary [of the Environment], to provide for the issuance of its bonds for the purpose of refunding any bonds of the Administration then outstanding . . ." Background: The Maryland Water Quality Financing Administration periodically issues revenue bonds to supplement other revenue sources for the Revolving Loan Funds. The funds are used to make loans for water quality and drinking water capital improvements. The revenue bonds are not a debt or a liability or a security pledge of the State of Maryland. The payment of debt service is from the principal and interest repayments on certain pledged loans.

8. MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve further funding up to \$200,000 to Town of Secretary for the **Twin Cities Wastewater Treatment Plant Biological Nutrient Removal and Enhanced Nutrient Removal Upgrades** project in Dorchester County. Funding may involve multiple sources which may include general obligation bond proceeds. (Legislative District 37B)

Project Description: Planning, design, and construction of biological nutrient removal and enhanced nutrient removal upgrades at the Twin Cities WWTP at an approved design capacity of 0.281 million gallons per day. Upon completion of the improvements, the Twin Cities WWTP will be capable of achieving an annual effluent total nitrogen goal of 3 mg/l and total phosphorous goal of 0.3 mg/l. The purpose of this project is to reduce nutrients to the Choptank River and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay. This action is for the design phase; the planning phase is complete.

12. STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

Baltimore City Public Schools Amendments to Sales and Use Tax – Alcoholic Beverages Supplementary Appropriation FY 2012

Recommendation: Baltimore City Public Schools requests that the Board of Public Works approve amendments to the FY 2012 Alcoholic Beverage Supplementary Appropriation grant funds designated for Baltimore City Public Schools by reallocating \$932,000 of that grant.

Previous Approval: Secretary's Agenda Item 3 (1/25/2012)

Background: The Board of Public Works previously approved Baltimore City's request for allocation of the \$9 million FY 2012 supplementary appropriation authorized by the General Assembly. The purpose of the grant is to fund individual public school improvement projects that meet a school or community need. Of the \$9 million Baltimore City grant, BCPS seeks to reallocate \$932,000. That total comprises \$271,000 from four rescinded projects and \$661,000 in funds remaining from projects originally approved.

Baltimore City Public Schools requests to apply the unexpended funds to three new projects and also to 32 grease trap projects required by the City's Department of Public Works Pollution Controls section. The City DPW investigates site conditions at school kitchens to determine whether wastewater generated by routine operations is contributing to excessive accumulation of fats, oils and grease in public sanitary lines downstream from school facilities. Baltimore City Public Schools is in violation of the conditions set by its wastewater discharge permit, which prohibits discharge to the sanitary sewer of oils and grease.

Authority: Sales and Use Tax – Alcoholic Beverages – Supplementary Appropriation: Chapter 572 (2011 Laws of Maryland) [House Bill 1213 (2011)].

Fund Source: D06E0202

Public School Construction Program: The Public School Construction Program has reviewed Baltimore City's request and concludes that the projects would be eligible under the Aging Schools Program. The Public School Construction Program will administer the grant.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. Copies of the solicitation notice were sent directly to 16 prospective vendors, ten of which are Maryland firms, and included three MBEs. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Five offerors submitted proposals to the different Service Categories in response to the RFP as follows:

- Service Category 1- Medical Plans: Five proposals received;
- Service Category 2- Dental plans: Three proposals received;
- Service Category 3- Prescription Drug Benefits Plans: Four proposals received; and
- Service Category 4- Flexible Spending Accounts; Three proposals received.

The proposals received from one offeror in Service Categories 1 and 3 were determined not to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for awards due to MBE issues and were eliminated from further consideration. The proposals from the remaining four offerors were evaluated and ranked accordingly, as shown in the Proposal tables below. Technical and financial factors had equal weight in the overall award determination.

Awards are recommended to Myers and Stauffer, LC for Categories 1 and 3 and TMDG, LLC for Categories 2 and 4 as having the most advantageous offers for the State based upon the following determinations:

- <u>Service Category 1 Medical Plans</u>: Myers and Stauffer LC (M&S) was ranked #1 overall with the second highest ranked technical offer and the third lowest price. The highest ranked technical offeror also had the highest price. The technical differences between M&S and the #1 ranked technical offeror did not offset the 19% price difference. The lowest priced offeror was ranked lowest technically. The technical differences between M&S and the #4 ranked technical offeror were deemed to be worth the 18% difference in price. And the second lowest priced offeror was ranked third technically. The technical differences between M&S and this offeror also were deemed to be worth the 11% difference in price.
- <u>Service Category 2 Dental Plans</u>: TMDG, LLC was ranked overall #1 with the highest ranked technical offer and the second lowest price. The lowest priced offeror was ranked third technically. The differences between these two offerors' technical proposals were deemed to offset the 4% difference in prices.

- <u>Service Category 3 Prescription Drug Benefits Plans</u>: M&S was ranked overall #1 with the highest ranked technical offer and the second lowest price. The lowest priced offeror was ranked third technically. The differences between these two offerors' technical proposals were deemed to offset the 15% difference in prices.
- <u>Service Category 4 Flexible Spending Account</u>: TMDG, LLC was ranked overall #1 with the highest ranked technical offer and the lowest price.

The financial offers were based upon fixed prices for milestones as stated in the RFP. The *Award Amount* includes funding for optional audit services as stated in the RFP: \$100,000 each for Service Categories 1 and 3 and \$40,000 each for Service Categories 2 and 4.

This contract provides for audit services of the State's Employee and Retiree Health Benefits Program from a clinical, administrative and operational perspective. Audits are performed in each of the four program Service Categories. Each Third Party Administrator (TPA) is subject to one yearly audit. The purpose of the audit is to:

- Ensure that the State receives the benefit of the contractual pricing arrangements with all TPA contractors:
- Ensure TPA contractor accountability for compliance with contractual requirements, including performance guarantees;
- Verify appropriate administrative procedures and control measures are in place:

- Ensure that State funds in connection with the program are used correctly.

Workpro was determined to have the most advantageous offer to the State and is, therefore, recommended for award.

WorkPro is a Delaware corporation; however, it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Pivot Physical Therapy (Pivot), a Maryland corporation with its headquarters in Towson, Maryland. Pivot owns several corporate-owned sites in Maryland, and Workpro will be providing services under this contract out of Pivot-owned locations. In addition, Pivot, is building new corporate sites and expanding its corporate presence in Maryland.

The purpose of this contract is to provide a State Medical Director and occupational medical services for employees in State agencies for up to 22 separate medical services. All services are available during normal working hours and on a limited basis on weekends and evenings. Certain services are also available on a 24-hour-a-day, 7-day-a-week basis. The services range from pre-employment physicals to drug and alcohol tests for commercial drivers governed by US Department of Transportation regulations.

Agencies are under no obligation to use the services under this contract. They can elect to use one, all or none of the services, as their respective needs dictate. As agencies use the services under the contract, they are billed directly by the contractor. This contract is also available for use by county, municipal and other non-State of Maryland governments and non-profit organizations within Maryland and agencies of governments in states adjoining Maryland, including Washington, DC.

The requested approval amount for this contract is based on fixed unit prices for each service multiplied by an estimated (but not guaranteed) number of services to be performed, as per a pricing model contained in the RFP. Under this contract, the recommended contractor is not guaranteed any amount of business. Agencies will determine not only which employees will be referred for service(s), but also whether this contract is the most appropriate means of obtaining the needed medical services.

On June 30, 2016, the incumbent, Concentra, filed a protest against the award to PTN WorkPro Holdings LLC. DBM denied the protest on August 19, 2016.

In addition, the offeror was determined to be responsible; the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Since Element is the incumbent for the Fleet Services Contract, no transition period will be necessary.

Whereas vehicle maintenance and repair services are common, the vehicle maintenance and accident repair management services required through this contract are unique and highly specialized to provide the State with a management contractor to oversee all conventional maintenance, repairs, glass replacement through a standardized pricing agreement with a national glass replacement vendor, preventative maintenance through a monitoring system for all original equipment manufacturer recalls, provide maintenance experts through a centralized technical support center to review and approve maintenance and repair services 24/7/365 (including a toll-free number), and provide emergency road services 24/7/365 for vehicle towing and transportation for State personnel from the accident or breakdown to a safe and appropriate location. These centralized services ensure the State's Fleet is safe and operational and costs for maintenance and repair services are reasonable and appropriate.

The State owns approximately 8,700 vehicles; of this number, approximately 6,200 currently participate in the maintenance program. The approximately 2,500 remaining vehicles are maintained using State-owned repair facilities.

Two proposals were received in response to the RFP. Both proposals were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Both offerors had knowledge and expertise for the project; however, the technical differences between Cambridge Systematics, Inc. and Momentum, Inc. were deemed to outweigh the difference in prices. Therefore, Cambridge Systematics, Inc. (Cambridge) is recommended for award as having the more advantageous offer to the State and is recommended for award.

The financial impact to the State of Maryland is important to the MVA; however, Office of Planning and Capital Programs (OPCP) recognizes that the higher price from Cambridge is comparable to the level of technical expertise by the firm. The difference in price over the other offeror was adjudicated by MVA's comparison of the proposed prices from the recommended awardee to a similar master planning contract for the Secretary's office that was issued in 2011. MVA found that the rates proposed by Cambridge were comparable to the Year 3 rates (2013-14) of two offerors that proposed for that project.

One proposal was received in response to the RFP, and it was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror was determined to be responsible; the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. The price was determined to be fair and reasonable based upon the financial proposal was within the expectations for the contract and the proposed cost increases are less than the previous data collection contract. Therefore, award is recommended to ICF Macro, Inc., the sole Offeror, and incumbent.

Approval of this contract is in the best interest of the State to fulfill the requirements of Health – General, Title 13, Subtitle 10, for the DHMH Tobacco Program to conduct biennial county-level surveys of tobacco-use behaviors.

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey and Youth Tobacco Survey (YRBS/YTS) is administered to approximately 100,000 eligible youth attending grades 6 through 12 in an average of 350 public schools in Maryland, with analysis and reporting for each of Maryland's 23 counties and Baltimore City, as well as Maryland Statewide. Separate survey instruments will be administered to middle and high school students. By combining the risk behavior and tobacco surveys, DHMH has reduced the burden on schools and students with respect to the monitoring of youth risk behaviors, and now supports analysis that examines the extent to which youth engage in concurrent risk behaviors for Maryland as a whole and in each local jurisdiction. The YRBS/YTS is the only data source for a number of Managing for Results, Performance Improvements, State Health Improvement Plan, and Local Health Improvement Plan indicators.

Possible reasons for potential vendors not responding to the solicitation were speculated as follows:

- 1. The statutory limitation on indirect costs of the project. Section 13-1014(e) of the Health General Article requires bids on this project to separately identify direct and indirect (administrative costs) in their proposals. The latter are limited to 7% of the bid, ensuring project value. However, this statutory limitation does not exist outside of Maryland projects funded by the Cigarette Restitution Fund (CRF) and may be an economic disincentive for bidding on large-scale and complicated wholly CRF funded projects such as the present one. For comparative purposes, DHMH may receive administrative/indirect costs of 30% in connection with federal grants.
- 2. The scope of services on the tobacco control surveys has narrowed over the years perhaps restricting the number of firms interested in such work. Originally, the project included large scale youth and adult surveys. However, those surveys have now been merged into the separate Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) sponsored Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), providing savings to DHMH. Additionally, in connection with the youth surveys, the CDC now scans answer sheets, creates the resultant database, cleans the data, conducts logic edits, and creates primary analysis and data products to DHMH at no charge; whereas in the past, those services were provided by the DHMH survey contractor under this project. What remains is a large-scale complicated survey administration activity that is likely less attractive to firms accustomed to conducting data analysis.

A 25% MBE participation goal and a 1% VSBE participation goal were established for this contract based upon the available subcontracting opportunities.

DHR contacted each vendor directly solicited to determine why they did not submit a bid; ten vendors responded. Comments from the vendors were consistent in stating the reason bids were not submitted was due to the requirement for board certified physicians and licensure in Maryland was too restrictive. In response, the Department further examined this requirement by contacting the Director of Maryland Disability Determination Services (DDS), who confirmed the federal requirement is that DDS physicians are board certified in their specialty and all physicians must be licensed in the State.

Additional consideration as to why only one bid was received may be that the need for these services has reduced significantly as a result of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) that took effect in January 2013. The number of customers applying for Medical Assistance that require a disability determination reduced drastically with the ACA, and since the contractor is paid a fixed price per disability determination, the total price for these services has significantly decreased. (Note: The previous four year contract had an \$11M not-to-exceed price.)

Under this contract, MAXIMUS will make disability and blindness determinations on behalf of the Local Departments of Social Services for persons applying for Medical Assistance as a disabled person living in the State. These services are federally mandated per 42 CFR 416.919 and 42 CFR 416.920. DHR makes these disability and blindness determinations pursuant to regulations containing performance standards and other administrative requirements. Federal law defines "disability" as the inability to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason of any medically determinable physical or mental impairment which can be expected to result in death or which has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months (20.C.F.R § 416.905). To meet this definition, an individual must have a severe impairment(s) that makes him or her unable to perform their past relevant work or any other substantial gainful work that exist in the national economy.

As the incumbent contractor for the past five years, MAXIMUS has performed more than 14,500 disability reviews and has more than 40 years-experience in Social Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Administration policy, processing applications, and providing administrative law services to SSI recipients and disabled individuals.

No MBE participation goal was established for this contract based upon the determination that no MBEs are available to perform the services required to make disability determinations according to the SSA's Five-Step Disability Determination process.

Originally, there were 23 contracts awarded; however, since the contracts began, seven contractors have either gone out of business or declined to agree to the contract extension period. Additionally, two contracts were previously terminated. Therefore, only 14 contracts are being requested to be extended at this time.

Use of these temporary help services contracts has been greater than originally anticipated. Retaining these contracts is critical to allow the TBUs and TSO to augment staffing needs where hiring a permanent employee is impractical. The requested extension will provide for uninterrupted services until the new contract is in place. TSO is currently finalizing the new solicitations and anticipates having the new contract award recommendation presented to the BPW for approval prior to the end of March 2017. The new contract will be monitored by TSO to assure proper tracking of contract usage and funding.

The need for this request for retroactive approval directly results from a lack of contract management oversight on this contract following the retirement of the original contract manager.

Remarks: The State's current budgeting system, HOBO, has since 1988 been the system for all State agencies to prepare and analyze annual budgets. In 2005, DBM's Information Technology division commissioned a Statewide Application Risks Assessment that determined the HOBO system was a high risk due to its use of outdated and unsupported technologies.

Remarks: (cont'd) This contract's objectives are to:

- (1) Provide state-of-the-art commercially available software packages to support the creation, analysis, publication and maintenance of operating budgets for all State agencies as coordinated and led by DBM;
- (2) Manage change to enterprise budgeting processes in concert with adoption of the Enterprise Budget System Solution; and
- (3) Ensure the user community is educated and prepared to use the solution effectively when made available.

DoIT, on behalf of DBM, released a Request for Proposals. DoIT advertised the RFP on *eMarylandMarketplace*. In addition, DoIT directly solicited 873 Minority Business Enterprise firms and 476 Veteran Small Business Enterprise firms. Further, DoIT sent the RFP directly to 64 businesses known to provide the type of software and services sought.

Six proposals were received in response to the RFP. Of those, one was found to not meet the minimum qualifications and the other five were reviewed by the technical evaluation committee. After further discussions and demonstrations of each of the proposed systems, four proposals were found reasonably susceptible for award; the fifth offeror was not willing to accept the State's non-visual access requirements. The procurement officer issued a best and final offer request to the four remaining offerors and received three proposals; one vendor opted not to proceed. One of the vendors who submitted a best and final offer refused to accept the State's contract terms. This left two remaining offerors, Performa Software USA and Deloitte Consulting, LLP.

Performa was ranked higher of the two by both the technical and financial evaluation teams. Performa's product is in use by other states as well as internationally. The Performa solution and team are able to deliver all of the State's required features by the required dates with limited customization, while providing a substantially lower total cost of ownership than its competition. Specific strengths of its presented solution include an easy-to-learn, user-friendly product; visualization capabilities such as charts and graphs; the ability to automatically generate the majority of the budget books; the expected level of involvement of State staff; and the quality and experience of their proposed staff.

The recommended awardee has committed to exceed the established subcontact goals and will provide 10.2% MBE and 1.1% VSBE participation.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The MTA is requesting additional contract authority in the amount of \$90,000,000 and to extend the expiration date through June 30, 2023.

The contracts supporting MTA's New Starts projects were originally awarded in 2010 for a period of eight years. At the rate of spending required to adequately protect the state's interests, while the General Engineering Consultant (GEC) contract assigned Purple Line duties (1265B) appears to be adequately funded, the Program Management Consultant responsible for the Purple Line contracts will be out of Contract Authority (CA) during the first half of fiscal year 2017.

The New Starts Purple Line project is supported by two A/E contracts (MTA 1264A and MTA 1265B). The original request for consultant services was prepared in 2008, and the contracts were awarded in March and September, 2010. Using SHA and MDTA management methods for large projects as a model, MTA elected to utilize a two-tier structure in which a PMC would perform management and quality assurance functions as an extension of MTA staff and oversee the work of a General Engineering Consultant. The PMC would be responsible for supplementing the MTA staff providing management and oversight of the construction activities and the construction contractors in order that the state's interests are protected.

The value of the contracts established in 2008 did not contemplate full, timely funding of the New Starts projects; however, by the time the contracts were awarded in 2010, MTA had selected Locally Preferred Alternatives for the Purple Line and had begun Advanced Conceptual Design in preparation for federal approval of preliminary engineering (PE).

By 2010, it was clear that the value of the contracts would not be enough to complete design, and MTA expected to return to the Board of Public Works (BPW) for additional contract authority. (Both the ICC and I-95 Express Toll Lane projects followed this same path with the agencies requesting contract amendments in excess of the original contract value.)

Additional funding requested from the Board of Public Works was approved on July 3, 2013; however, the funding level approved was not expected to be adequate to provide for construction management services. The BPW was advised that it was the intent of the MTA to return to the BPW with a request for construction phase funding.

Remarks (cont'd):

With this background, we are submitting requests for contract amendments rather than procure new contracts. This recommendation is based on the following rationale:

- The current expiration date for the PMC and GEC contracts is February 28, 2018 and October 22, 2018 respectively. The Final Design being performed by the Concessionaire is currently underway with construction expected to begin prior to the end of this calendar year. The Concessionaire is not expected complete construction until several months after reaching the Revenue Service Availability milestone currently anticipated for March, 2022. The MTA does not have adequate staff to monitor the design and construction activities and therefore the services of a PMC and GEC are necessary for the success of the project.
- Staff continuity through the design and construction process is critical. The Purple Line project is highly complex in terms of design elements, including stakeholder, railroad, and utility coordination, as well as scheduling and construction phasing, means and methods. The project teams are well established with substantial investments in staff assignments, project orientation, training, and the establishment of document control and other construction management procedures. The project would incur significant costs, potential schedule days and additional risk if the MTA were to transition to new teams.
- The current contract value assigned to the PMC is nearly expended although this was expected. The BPW submission noted that the total funding requested (\$125M) was intended to provide for activities through the completion of final design (note that, at the time, the decision to pursue a P3 procurement had not been finalized). In the case of a P3 procurement, the "final design" milestone from the design-bid-build process equates to the development of technical provisions and the completion of the procurement process. That milestone was achieved when the Purple Line P3 Concession Agreement that was awarded on April 6, 2016 and reached Financial Close on June 17, 2016.
- FTA oversight of the projects includes an evaluation of the technical capability and experience of the project team. Prior to PE approval, MTA submitted detailed resumes for the key consultant staff and FTA followed up with interviews. With new contracts, this process would have to be repeated. In addition, the replacement of the GEC contract mid-construction effort would dramatically increase the risk to the state given the loss the institutional, historical and technical knowledge possessed by the existing team.

Remarks (cont'd):

- If MTA was to begin a new procurement now, new contracts would not be available in time to avoid a significant risk to the project. Based on an 18-month procurement schedule (midpoint between ideal schedule of 12 months and typical schedule of 24 months, the new PMC contract would not be available until January of 2018 leaving only a short time for a major transition between the new PMC and the existing PMC. While this would not delay the work of the Concessionaire, it would expose the state to significant risk while the construction work proceeded with less than sufficient oversight.
- Because of the PMC/GEC structure, the current PMC firm would be precluded from proposing for the project to which they are already assigned. This would limit the pool of capable firms, particularly DBEs.

The purpose of this BPW submission is to request an amendment to the PMC contract (1264A) to increase the CA value for the PMC and to extend the time allotted from February 28, 2018, the current end date, through June 30, 2023.

It should also be noted that, when the MTA requested the additional funding intended to provide for services through award of the P3 concession (2013), the estimated value of work for the PMC through the end of construction was estimated at \$229 million. This current request reduces that previous estimate by \$14 million to a revised total of \$215 million.

- The current expiration date for the PMC and GEC contracts is February 28, 2018 and October 22, 2018 respectively. The Final Design being performed by the Concessionaire is currently underway with construction expected to begin prior to the end of this calendar year. The Concessionaire is not expected complete construction until several months after reaching the Revenue Service Availability milestone currently anticipated for March, 2022. The MTA does not have adequate staff to monitor the design and construction activities and therefore the services of a PMC and GEC are necessary for the success of the project.
- Staff continuity through the design and construction process is critical. The Purple Line project is highly complex in terms of design elements, including stakeholder, railroad, and utility coordination, as well as scheduling and construction phasing, means and methods. The project teams are well established with substantial investments in staff assignments, project orientation, training, and the establishment of document control and other construction management procedures. The project would incur significant costs, potential schedule days and additional risk if the MTA were to transition to new teams.
- The current contract value assigned to the PMC is nearly expended although this was expected. The BPW submission noted that the total funding requested (\$125M) was intended to provide for activities through the completion of final design (note that, at the time, the decision to pursue a P3 procurement had not been finalized). In the case of a P3 procurement, the "final design" milestone from the design-bid-build process equates to the development of technical provisions and the completion of the procurement process. That milestone was achieved when the Purple Line P3 Concession Agreement was awarded on April 6, 2016 and reached Financial Close on June 17, 2016.
- FTA oversight of the projects includes an evaluation of the technical capability and experience of the project team. Prior to PE approval, MTA submitted detailed resumes for the key consultant staff and FTA followed up with interviews. With new contracts, this process would have to be repeated. In addition, the replacement of the GEC contract mid-construction effort would dramatically increase the risk to the state given the loss the institutional, historical and technical knowledge possessed by the existing team.





4-AE-MOD. MARYLAND TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION (cont'd)

• If MTA was to begin a new procurement now, new contracts would not be available in time to avoid a significant risk to the project. Based on an 18-month procurement schedule (midpoint between ideal schedule of 12 months and typical schedule of 24 months, the new PMC contract would not be available until January of 2018 leaving only a short time for a major transition between the new PMC and the existing PMC.

While this would not delay the work of the Concessionaire, it would expose the state to significant risk while the construction work proceeded with less than sufficient oversight.

• Because of the PMC/GEC structure, the current PMC firm would be precluded from proposing for the project to which they are already assigned. This would limit the pool of capable firms, particularly DBEs.

The purpose of this BPW submission is to request an amendment to the GEC contract (1265B) to extend the time allotted from September 23, 2018, the current end date, through June 30, 2023.

Agency Remarks: SHA is responsible for all Maryland numbered highways, with the exception of those within Baltimore city. This modification request is for a total of 97 contracts, 38 requesting additional contract funding authority only and 59 requesting additional contract funding authority and time extensions. These 97 contract modifications are needed in order to continue delivering critical services until replacement contracts can be awarded. The original contracts were awarded with a term of four to six years and have expiration dates ranging from 10/01/2016 through 02/18/2021 and require 0 to 24 month time extensions and additional contract funding authority in order to complete the new procurements as well as to provide sufficient overlap in the contracts to properly transition assignments. The replacement contracts for the contracts listed in this modification request are in various stages of the procurement process ranging from Pre-Advertisement through Negotiations. The replacement contracts anticipated dates of award and other contract details are indicated in Attachment #1.

In June 2015, Governor Hogan announced an additional \$2 billion to be invested in Maryland's Roads, Bridges and Highways. Additionally, in December 2015, the Federal FAST (Fixing America's Surface Transportation) Act was approved providing funding for even more new projects. The increase from both of these programs was not anticipated in the original requests for these contracts. Therefore, additional contact funding authority is needed to support the increased volume of new projects.

DBE compliance is very important to SHA. The DBE participation on these 97 contracts is as follows: 30 contracts are exceeding the established DBE goal, 35 contracts are within 5% of achieving the established DBE goal and 32 contracts are more than 5% outside of currently achieving the DBE goal. The Office of Equal Opportunity is addressing the compliance issues on the 32 contracts greater than 5% out of compliance.

There are 45 firms performing the work on these 97 contracts. The consultants are providing A&E services that include, but are not limited to: Construction Management and Inspection Services, A&E Services for new and Existing SHA facilities, Traffic Control Engineering and Design Services, Hydrology and Hydraulics Analysis and Bridges and Small Structures, Highway Structures Engineering Services for State and Local Governments, Environmental Design and Permitting Services, Structure Condition Inspection and Evaluations, Design, Construction and Program Support Services, Survey and Engineering Services, Remedial Structures Condition Inspection Services, Environmental Permit Compliance Services, and Travel Forecasting, Traffic Analysis and Engineering Services.

This Solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace and MAA website. eMaryland Marketplace notified 2,158 firms, of which 336 were small business firms and 322 were MBE firms. The MAA directly solicited 14 prospective bidders, which included three MBE firms. The solicitation was sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and five minority business associations on July 13, 2016. Nine sets of specifications were obtained; six bids were received.

The contractor was American Infrastructure –MD, Inc D/B/A American Infrastructure. American Infrastructure-MD changed its' name to Allan Myers, MD Inc. MAA has an executed Name Novation on file.

This modification consist of two components 1) request for additional funding and 2) transfer of funding

1) Field Revisions 1/1B and 3 – Additional Funding

MAA bid and awarded the Airfield Standards and Pavement Rehabilitation Project (ASAP project) in July 2014, while the Runway 15R-33L Runway Safety Project ("15R-33L RSA Project") and the Runway 15R-33L NAVAIDS Project ("15R-33L NAVAIDS \Project") were underway. In particular, the 15R-33L RSA Project encompassed the complete reconstruction of Runway 15R-33L, and the 15R-33L NAVAIDS Project encompassed the complete reconstruction of Runway 15R-33L NAVAIDS. These two projects required a full closure of Runway 15R-33L for 90 days, and partial and full closures of Runway 15R-33L, as well as numerous extended weekend and nightly closures, throughout the second half of 2014. Runway 15R-33L is one of two commercial air carrier runways at BWI Marshall Airport, the other being Runway 10-28.

At the time of bid MAA anticipated issuance of Notice to Proceed (NTP) to the ASAP project in September 2014. By September 2014 it became apparent that the 15R-33L RSA Project was falling behind schedule and the closure duration of Runway 15R-33L would likely last longer than the contract anticipated or allowed. Ultimately, the runway was not opened on time. This follow on ASAP Project required numerous closures of Runway 10-28 starting in approximately October 2014, and a 60 day closure of Runway 10-28 beginning in July 2015. Therefore, with the actual opening date of Runway 15R-33L in question, MAA decided the most

prudent course of action was to delay NTP on the ASAP Project to avoid significant impacts

caused by concurrent runway closures or reduced operational capabilities to both main commercial air carrier runways.

MAA issued NTP for the ASAP Project on February 26, 2015, approximately 5 months later than originally anticipated. For the ASAP Project, the scheduled July 2015 start of the 60-day full closure of Runway 10-28 had been coordinated with the airport's commercial air carriers and the FAA nearly 2 years in advance, and could not be readily changed. Additionally, the entire RSA Program made extensive use of Federal funding and a requirement of that funding was completion of all RSA and Standards Compliance issues by the December 31, 2015 deadline. The runway closure and subsequent phase contained the last compliance items that needed to be addressed. Therefore, MAA instructed the design team to re-sequence or re-phase the project to accommodate the delayed NTP shift while retaining the Runway 10-28 closure dates, and associated incentive and milestone dates.

Remarks: (cont'd)

To that end the contract phasing was modified to accelerate utility relocation and lighting preparatory work required prior to the runway closure (Phase 1) while deferring initial taxiway paving (Phase 4) to after the runway closure (Phase 3) was completed. These changes were issued in Field Revision 1. After receipt and briefing of the changes, the contractor made several suggestions and modifications to support the intent of the changes that were acceptable to MAA. The modified plan was issued as Field Revision 1B.

The combined effect of the two related field revisions was to accelerate the Phase 1 utility work and to reduce the preparatory and investigative time available to the contractor for follow on phase work. Additionally, the remaining phases 2, 3 and 4, which involved the taxiway and runway work, were compressed and the scope of work increased during the same duration as compared to the original bid plans. Finally, the concurrent and accelerated work resulted in smaller less efficient work areas and less progress than had been originally anticipated by the contractor in the bid documents.

Therefore, MAA entered into detailed negotiations with Myers for the cost impact resulting from the Field Revisions 1/1B. Myers and its two prime subcontractors submitted cost estimates. The MAA has agreed to an equitable adjustment with Myers and its prime concrete pavement subcontractor in the amount of \$1,161,788. MAA is still in negotiations on Myer's electrical subcontractor's claim. MAA has included a contingent amount of \$1,464,000 for the electrical subcontractor claim. Field revision 1/1B will add \$2,625,788 to the contract amount.

During performance of the accelerated work discussed above, several changed field conditions were encountered that were not included in the original design. These included additional utilities and FAA utilities encountered within the project limits. The additional FAA utilities were not featured in any as-built data provided by FAA or known to MAA. These critical utilities were required to remain in service at all times and needed to be relocated before Phases 2 and 3 (runway closure) could be completed.

The design team issued Field Revision 3 to address this additional work. Concurrent with the impacts caused by Field Revisions 1/1B, these utilities further impacted the time and efficiency of the work to be performed. As the relocations preceded any excavation and pavement work, the contractor and paving subcontractor had to subdivide areas available for work and complete the work in a "batch" type sequence rather than the continuous areas of work assumed at the time of bid. This segmentation of the available work areas also complicated movement and access in a very constrained work area surrounded on all sides by aircraft operational areas. Field Revision 3 will add \$702,750.00 to the Contract.

The total amount of funds added to the Contract by Change Order No. 1 for Field Revision 1/1B and 3 is \$3,328,538.00. There will be no additional contract performance time as a result of this Contract Modification.

2) Transfer of Funds between contract fund line items

The contract has an allowance of \$454,000 to provide Asphalt Binder Price Adjustments based on fluctuations in the Asphalt Index. Due to the decrease in the costs for oil, and oil based products between the time of bid in 2014, there has been no increase in the Asphalt Index, therefore the \$454,000 is unused. Additionally, due to the decrease in the Asphalt Index, a credit is due to the MAA in the amount of \$185,827.64 (as of May 31, 2016) resulting in a total unused contract amount of \$639,827.64.

Also included in the contract is add alternate #3 in the amount of \$23,000 to lower the Runway 10 ALSF-2 light bars below the Part 77 Approach Surface. In the course of performing this Add Alternate work, the FAA required additional modifications to the ALSF-2 system to bring it up to current standards before it would accept the system and place it back into service. This resulted in a series of changes totaling \$479,017.30.

This contract modification will transfer \$479,017.30 of the \$639,827.64 unused funds from the Asphalt Binder Price Adjustment allowance to the Add Alternate #3 allowance. The remaining balance in the amount of \$160,810.34 will be transferred into the extra work allowance item in order to address any future issues that arise as this project will continue into CY 2017.

Additionally, this contract has three (3) Incentive Allowances for early completion of designated portions of the project, by specified dates. These incentives were not earned by the General Contractor, resulting in unused amounts of \$2,050,000. MAA is requesting to transfer the unused funds in the amount of \$2,050,000 to the Miscellaneous Construction Allowance.

The Miscellaneous Work Allowance currently in contract is in the amount of \$3,882,000.00 (Line Item Z-1-5.1) and is to cover necessary changes not anticipated at the time of bid.

Subsequent to bid and award of the Contract, but prior to the start of construction activities for the project, the FAA and Airport Operations Center mandated that more stringent safety requirements be put in place to prevent Runway Incursions and Surface Incidents related to construction. As of May 31, 2015, these added safety requirements have resulted in \$1,502,653.78. The project has 10 months remaining, and these costs will continue to increase.

This contract modification will move the \$2,050,000.00 of unused funds from the Incentive Allowances for Early Completion to the Miscellaneous Construction Allowance.

The contractor is on track to meet the DBE Goal by the end of the contract term.

Recommendation

Approval is requested for a new / retroactive 5 year and seven month lease, effective March 1, 2016. For the period 3/1/16 - 6/30/16, the agency leased 1,869 sf of space, in accordance with the previous rate (\$14.50 per sf). For the period 7/1/16 - 9/30/16, the agency's space was reduced at the request of the Landlord to 998 sf at the previous lease rate (\$14.50 per sf). For the period 10/1/16 - 9/30/21 the agency will lease 998 sf at a rate of \$17.50 per sf, for a total annual rent of \$17,465. The new lease contains a 5 year renewal option to be negotiated, which will require future Board of Public Works approval. Reference is made to item 20-LT-MOD approved by the Board of Public Works on 07/24/13, wherein approval was given for a 2 year lease extension for the period 09/01/13 - 08/30/15. Item 20-LT-MOD listed the rental rate as \$14 sf for the first year and \$15 thereafter, however the using agency has been paying \$14.50 per sf as referenced above. Following the expiration of the lease term on 08/30/15, the State exercised the 6 month hold-over provision, which terminated on 02/29/16.

Retroactive approval is respectfully requested for the seven (7) month period from March 1, 2016 to September 30, 2016, pursuant to the State Finance and Procurement Article 11-204(c)(1). The total funds for the retroactive period are Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Fifty-One Dollars and Twenty-Five Cents (\$12,651.25).

The delay in submitting this lease to the Board, stems from a lack of response from the Landlord. It should be noted that this Landlord is a non-profit entity, and as such was not experienced in the lease negotiation process. DGS recommended relocating the office to another location due to the lack of response and inability to negotiate a new lease. The Office of the Public Defender strongly preferred to remain at this location due to the need to serve the disadvantaged community. Ultimately the Landlord hired a real estate broker and DGS was able to complete the negotiations for this lease.

Remarks

- 1. The agency has used this space since 2008 as the District Office of the Public Defender; the Public Defender's mission is to provide legal defense services to those who cannot personally afford an attorney.
- 2. The DGS and the Landlord negotiated an 871 net usable square foot reduction of space which provided a savings to the State of \$3,157.38 during the retroactive period and \$76,212.50 savings over the new term period.
- 3. The lease contains escalations clause for utilities and custodial services.
- 4. This lease contains a termination for convenience clause and the standard 6 month holdover period.
- 5. The lease provides 5 use-in common parking spaces free of charge.
- 6. This space was acquired by sole source in accordance with the DGS Space Management Manual, Paragraph 6-605 E., as authorized by COMAR 21.02.05.05. The Department of General Services, in conjunction with the using Agency, recommends the approval of this item.

HOCMC has utilized the CHFGP funding in order to acquire the following four properties to provide housing for individuals with developmental disabilities. The first three properties were also renovated with a portion of these grant funds. The funds to renovate the fourth property were encumbered; however, HOCMC was unable to acquire the matching funds necessary to complete the renovation.

- 1. 2305 Hermitage Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland 20902
- 2. 2408 Falling Creek Rd., Silver Spring, Maryland 20904

Currently, HOCMC is unable to sustain operations at the first three properties. HOCMC is also unable to secure the required matching funds and cannot move forward with the renovation of the fourth property. HOCMC is also unable to secure the required matching funds to acquire and renovate additional properties for occupancy with the remaining FY 2014 grant funding. HOCMC has requested for the above four properties and the balance of the FY 2014 grant funds to be transferred to RCI.

HOCMC is a not-for-profit organization providing rehabilitation and support services to individuals with developmental disabilities. HOCMC was appropriated grant funding under CHFGP in fiscal years 2008, 2010, and 2014. Grant funding from these appropriations were used for the acquisition and renovation of properties to provide housing for individuals with developmental disabilities. As required under § 24-606 of the Health General Article of the Code of Maryland, HOCMC recorded a "Right of Recovery" on each of the properties among the Land Records of Montgomery County.

RCI is a not-for-profit organization providing rehabilitation and support services to individuals with developmental disabilities. The sole mission of RCI is to facilitate the acquisition, renovation, and construction of housing in Maryland to create independent living opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities.

The CHFGP is codified in Health-General Articles § 24-601 through § 24-607 of the Annotated Code of Maryland. These statutes provide for the allocation of grant funding to acquire, design, construct, renovate, and equip mental health, addiction, and developmental disabilities facilities. The program is administered by the Office of Capital Planning, Budgeting, and Engineering Services (OCPBES) under the DHMH.

For any acquisition and or renovation of a property acquired with grant funding, DHMH is required to ensure a notice of the "State's Right of Recovery" is recorded in the land records of the jurisdiction in which the property is located before the State makes any funds available. Recordation of the notice does not create a lien against the property; it constitutes notice to any potential transferee, potential creditor or other interested person that the State may obtain a lien under the above Health-General Articles.

Due to HOCMC's inability to secure the required matching funds, they have requested permission for the four properties as well as the balance of the FY 2014 funds to be transferred to a qualified not-for-profit provider.

RCI has the financial ability to assume the ownership of the four properties and complete the renovation project on 10 Horizon Court to provide housing for individuals with developmental disabilities. RCI is a qualified not-for profit applicant with the financial ability to provide the matching funds needed to move forward with additional acquisitions and renovations of properties to provide housing for persons with developmental disabilities.

(SCI) that the Board of Public Works (BPW) approve a "Waiver and Release of the State's Right of Recovery" for the property located at 1010 Grandin Avenue, Rockville, Maryland 20851, conditioned upon the transfer and recording of the "State's Right of Recovery" to the property owned by Easter Seals Serving (ES) DC, MD, VA located at 1420 Spring Street, Silver Spring, MD 20910.
- 2. Submission of a request by ES to the BPW for approval of a "Waiver of Priority of Declaration and Subordination Agreement". ES has a financing agreement with the Manufacturers and Traders Bank (M&T Bank) with the condition that the State agrees to subordinate its "Right of Recovery" to the M&T Bank first deed of trust in the amount of \$5,935,000.00 (the "Bank Loan").

SCI is a not-for-profit organization providing support services for the elderly, medically-handicapped adults, and victims of Alzheimer's Disease and related disorders. The Adult Day Care Facilities Grant Program is administered by the Office of Capital Planning, Budgeting, and Engineering Services (OCPBES) at the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH).PAST BPW ITEMS

- 1. SCI was awarded grant funding under the Adult Day Care Facilities Grant Program in FY 2000 (\$58,875) and FY 2001 (\$675,000).
- 2. 3/8/00 The BPW approved \$58,875 to SCI for the purpose of designing and renovating approximately 11,500 square feet of space in a building located at 1010 Grandin Avenue, Rockville, Maryland 20851 (DGS 34-CGL).
- 3. 7/3/02- The BPW subsequently approved \$675,000 for the same purpose. In combination the grants total \$733,875. However, only \$731,875 of the total grant amount was expended for the renovation project (DGS 30-CGL).

As required under § 24-706(b) of the Health General Article of the Code of Maryland, SCI recorded a Right of Recovery on the Property. The Property is owned by the Montgomery County Government, who consented to the recordation of the "State's Right of Recovery". This "Right of Recovery" was dated January 16, 2006 and recorded among the land records of Montgomery County, Maryland in Liber 31926, Folio 527. The "State's Right of Recovery" expires on June 19, 2032.

SCI recently merged with Family Services, Inc. (FSI). FSI is a not-for-profit organization primarily providing support services for mental health and substance abuse related disorders. An Articles of Merger Agreement between SCI and FSI dated July 24, 2012 stipulates that SCI will merge with FSI, and FSI will be the sole surviving corporation.

On June 23, 2016 OCPBES received a letter from FSI indicating they would like to cease operations at the Property. FSI also indicated that they are in negotiations with ES to takeover providing medical adult day care services to clients currently receiving these services at the Property.

On June 23, 2016, OCPBES received a letter from ES indicating that they have agreed to takeover providing medical adult day care services to clients currently receiving these services at the Property. ES is a not-for-profit organization primarily providing support services for individuals with disabilities. ES would like to move the clients currently receiving services at the Property to its Intergenerational Center located at 1420 Spring Street, Silver Spring, MD 20910 (the Intergenerational Center). ES has agreed to record a new "Right of Recovery" on the Intergenerational Center in the amount of \$731,875 which will expire on June 19, 2032.

The Intergenerational Center was funded in part by a FY 2002 grant of \$1,000,000 to ES from the Adult Day Care Facilities Grant Program. On May 9, 2007 (Item 19-CGL), the BPW approved \$1,000,000 for the purpose of constructing a portion of the Intergenerational Center. As required under § 24-706(b) of the Health General Article of the Code of Maryland, ES recorded a "Right of Recovery" on the Intergenerational Center. This "Right of Recovery", dated January 9, 2008, was recorded among the land records of Montgomery County, Maryland in Liber 35259, Folio 726. The "State's Right of Recovery" expires on January 17, 2038.

On May 9, 2007 (Item 19-CGL), the State of Maryland BPW approved a grant of \$1,000,000, to ES for the use and purpose of construction of only 10,183 gross square feet of a 46,000 square foot three story building located at 1420 Spring Street, Silver Spring, MD 20910. The property has been subject to the legal operation and effect of a "Notice of Right of Recovery", dated January 9, 2008 and recorded among the Land Records of Montgomery County, Maryland in Liber 35259, Folio 726 ("Notice of Right of Recovery").

In order to facilitate the release of FSI's "Right of Recovery" on the Property, DHMH must seek approval from the BPW in accordance with Health-General Article § 24-706(e)(2) of the Annotated Code of Maryland. In addition, DHMH must also seek approval from the BPW to record a new "Right of Recovery" on the Intergenerational Center on behalf of ES in accordance with § 24-706(b) of the Health-General Article of the Code of Maryland. DHMH also seeks approval from the BPW for a "Waiver of Priority of Declaration and Subordination Agreement" where the State agrees to subordinate its right of recovery to the M&T Bank first deed of trust in the amount of \$5,935,000.

Submission of a request by Chase Brexton Health Services, Inc. (CBHS) that the Board of Public Works approve a "Waiver and Release of the State's Right of Recovery" for the property located at 1111 North Charles Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21201, conditioned upon the transfer and recording of the "State's Right of Recovery" to the 1111 Condominium Unit located at 1111 North Charles Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21201.

PAST BPW ITEM

- 1. CBHS was awarded funding under the Federally Qualified Health Centers Grant Program (FQHCGP) in order to renovate a portion of the building located at 1111 North Charles Street, Baltimore, MD 21201 ("the Property"). Under the FQHCGP, CBHS was awarded a total of \$1,500,000 (\$500,000 for FY 2012 and \$1,000,000 for FY 2013) for this renovation project.
- 2. 1/8/14 The BPW approved the encumbrance of the total \$1,500,000 (DGS 17-CGL) to assist CBHS in the cost of renovations of approximately 102,000 gross square feet at the Property.

The Property is owned by Chase Brexton Realty, Inc. (CBR), which is a subsidiary of CBHS. By agreement of lease dated December 10, 2012, CBR leased the Property to CBHS for a thirty year period. In accordance with the § 24-1306(b)(1) of the Health-General Article of the Code of Maryland, CBHS recorded a "Right of Recovery" on behalf of the State in the land records of Baltimore City in Liber 14328, folio 0089 to ensure that the renovated portion of the Property was used for the purposes of the FQHCGP grant for 30 years.

The FQHCGP is codified in Health-General Articles § 24-1301 through § 24-1306 of the Annotated Code of Maryland. These statutes provide for the allocation of grant funding to acquire, design, construct, renovate, and equip federally qualified health centers. The program is administered by the Office of Capital Planning, Budgeting, and Engineering Services (OCPBES) under the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH).

For any acquisition and or renovation of a property acquired with grant funding, DHMH is required to ensure a notice of the "State's Right of Recovery" is recorded in the land records of the jurisdiction in which the property is located before the State makes any funds available. Recordation of the notice does not create a lien against the property; it constitutes notice to any potential transferee, potential creditor or other interested person that the State may obtain a lien under the above Health-General Articles.

CBR has reconfigured and divided the property into two condominium units, which are described as the "1111 Condominium Unit" and the "1125 Condominium Unit." This reconfiguration was memorialized in a Declaration of Condominium for Charles at Chase Condominium, dated April 15, 2016, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City, Maryland, at Liber 18046, folio 241 (the "Condominium Declaration"). In addition, the Condominium Bylaws with respect thereto, which are appended to the Condominium Declaration are also recorded among the land records of Baltimore City, Maryland, beginning at Liber 18046, folio 378. Moreover, the Condominium Plat entitled "Condominium Plat, Charles at Chase Condominium" is also recorded among the land records of Baltimore City, Maryland, in Condominium Plat Book LGA No. 808.

The 1111 Condominium Unit and the 1125 Condominium Unit are also described as Parcel the First and Parcel the Second, respectively, in a Confirmatory Deed of Condominium Units from Chase Brexton Realty, Inc., as Grantor, to Chase Brexton Realty, Inc., as Grantee, dated May 25, 2016, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City, Maryland, at Liber 18187, folio 339.

CBR will retain ownership of the 1111 Condominium Unit, where CBHS will continue to lease this unit and operate as a federally qualified health center. All of the renovations and improvements completed with grant funding under the FQHCGP were made only to the 1111 Condominium Unit.

Pursuant to a lease agreement dated June 1, 2016, CBHS will continue to lease the premises now explicitly defined as the 1111 Condominium Unit together with all its appurtenant rights and easements under the Condominium Declaration. This lease agreement will expire on December 31, 2044.

In order to facilitate the release of CBHS's "Right of Recovery" on the Property, DHMH must seek approval from the BPW in accordance with Health-General Article § 24-1306(f)(2) of the Annotated Code of Maryland. In addition, DHMH must also seek approval from the BPW to record a new "Right of Recovery" on the newly reconfigured 1111 Condominium Unit on behalf of CBHS in accordance with § 24-1306(b)(1) of the Health-General Article of the Code of Maryland.
