Wetlands License -- #21-0640(R1) – Maryland Port Administration Modification

Recommendation:

The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board approve a modification to Tidal Wetlands License No. 21-0640(R1) that authorized dredging an area to protect and restore Dorchester County's Barren Island. The purpose of this modification is to access sediments from the Chesapeake Bay floor to be used in the construction of the northeastern breakwater foundation of Barren Island, providing containment with the wetland restoration areas, and providing material for bird habitat islands.

MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the 505 square feet of impact to open water at a 1:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by paying \$1,045.35 into the MDE Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund.

Also, the likelihood of spongy moths spreading from untreated infested areas to surrounding vulnerable forests is high. If approved, funds will be transferred from the Contingent Fund to the Maryland Department of Agriculture. The spongy moth suppression program is a cooperative program between federal, state, and local county governments, so approval of this funding will leverage an additional \$400,000 for Spongy moth suppression work.

**DBM Remarks:** The Secretary of Budget and Management has certified that funds are available from the FY 2024 Contingent Fund. After accounting for this request, the remaining balance in the Contingent Fund is \$2,200,000.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: On December 21, 2023, one of the two boilers at the Keyser's Ridge SHA Maintenance Shop permanently failed. Upon inspection, SHA found the second boiler functional but was concerned that there would be no redundancy if the second boiler failed. The next morning, the second boiler, in fact, failed. It was repaired to moderate functionality but not full capacity. SHA determined that one boiler could not adequately sustain heat for the Keyser's Ridge Shop during the cold-weather months.

Garrett County has Maryland's highest snowfall and lowest temperatures. The Keyser's Ridge Shop serves as the headquarters for winter road maintenance, plowing, and snow/ice logistics for Garrett County. These services are crucial to protect the traveling public, and this shop must have reliable and consistent heat. With one boiler down and the second at risk of another failure, SHA's Chief Operating Officer declared an emergency to procure the installation and rental of a temporary boiler to sustain winter operations.

Basis for Selection: Negotiated Costs and Terms with a Responsible and Responsive Bidder. Competition was sought out to the extent possible of this Emergency Procurement. On December 28, 2023, six vendors (including three MBEs) were directly solicited. Only one bid was received, and that was from Aggreko, LLC. Aggreko's bid was declared non-responsive because the bid form was not completed in its entirety; the bid form was altered, and the vendor submitted additional price information and terms on their own letterhead. SHA researched why other vendors did not bid and found it was a combination of vendors being unable to locate/secure temporary boilers, and/or vendors being unwilling to travel the distance to the Keyser Ridge site because it was too far from vendor service areas. Because Aggreko LLC was the only vendor willing and able to complete this emergency project, SHA negotiated terms and prices with this vendor.

**Background:** The University requests approval for a surplus declaration for three properties to allow for their sale. The properties constitute the Fayette Square student housing complex located on UMB's campus in downtown Baltimore.

Fayette Square was developed in 2002 through a Public Private Partnership (P3) utilizing a ground lease in which UMB, as the lessor, entered into an agreement with Maryland Economic Development Corporation (MEDCO), and a private development entity named Fayette Street Housing, LLC. Under the ground lease, the developer was engaged to design and construct the student housing complex, with MEDCO issuing bonds to finance the development. Those initial bonds were refinanced by MEDCO in 2015 to take advantage of reduced interest rates. To market the 2015 Bonds, UMB was required to enter into a contingency agreement with MEDCO. Pursuant to the Contingency Agreement, if Fayette Square was unable to achieve certain financial results in any year, UMB was required to lease enough unoccupied units to achieve the required financial performance to service the 2015 Bonds.

Due to its obligations under this contingency agreement, UMB has incurred annual losses averaging \$1.2 million over the past four academic years. It is anticipated that these losses will persist into the foreseeable future, posing an unsustainable burden on UMB's operations. Given the age of the project, UMB estimates that an additional capital investment of \$5-\$10 million will be required for short-term maintenance and modernization to enhance the project's competitiveness with newer developments within the submarket. However, due to the property's underwhelming financial performance, there is no accumulated fund balance to cover these expenses. This presents a significant challenge for UMB, as such a substantial investment would directly conflict with its goals of addressing the campus' substantial backlog of deferred maintenance and allocating resources towards the development of new laboratories dedicated to sponsored research.

#### Remarks (cont'd):

For all of these reasons, the University requests Board of Public Works approval to declare the property surplus. The University will return to the Board for a recommendation for disposition after the requisite notification to the budget committees of the Maryland General Assembly.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20220609-0452. It is recommended to declare the +/- .335 acres with adjoining buildings for student housing at 500 West Fayette Street, the +/- .440 acres with a sixteen-story apartment tower for student housing at 518 West Fayette Street, and the +/- 0.73-acre Fayette Square Alley surplus to the needs of the State, upon consideration of the Maryland Department of the Environment's qualifying comments and contingent upon meeting the following Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) requirements: (1) The University of Maryland will need to continue consultation with the MHT and consider the effects of the proposed transfer on these historic properties, pursuant to the Maryland Historical Trust Act of 1985; (2) MHT will need to determine whether or not the transfer must include provisions for a historic preservation easement held by the Trust, as discussed in MHT's forthcoming response letter to UMD. None of the local or state agencies that provided review comments expressed an interest in acquiring the properties.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** SHA seeks approval of a retroactive modification as COMAR 21.03.05.04 requires any State agency—or private contractor working for the State—charging fees for electronic procurement transactions to seek BPW approval to charge said fees.

**RETROACTIVE** approval is requested pursuant to § 11-204(c) State Finance & Procurement Article. MDOT has determined that this should be treated as voidable rather than void because: (1) all parties have acted in good faith; (2) ratification for the procurement contract would not undermine the purposes of the Procurement Law; and (3) the violation, or series of violations, was insignificant or otherwise did not prevent substantial compliance with the Procurement Law.

The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) contracts with Infotech on behalf of MDOT modes to provide electronic bidding services on the BidX platform. Infotech provides BidX at no cost to the MDOT but at a monthly subscription fee to the potential bidders on MDOT construction contracts, including roads, highways, and bridges; wetlands mitigation; and facilities maintenance. COMAR 21.03.05.04 requires any State agency—or private contractor working for the State—charging fees for electronic procurement transactions to seek BPW approval to charge said fees.

BidX requires a subscription fee for potential bidders only. Before January 1, 2024, in order to bid, vendors needed the Basic Service plus Internet Bidding service, for a total of \$70 per month. On January 1, 2024, Infotech changed their fee structure to add a new tier of service, Pro Service, for \$75 per month, which combines the Basic and Internet Bidding services and includes one Info Tech digital ID. This change resulted in a net increase of \$5 each month for Maryland bidders on MDOT projects. However, the Board did not approve this fee increase before Infotech began charging it.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Subcontractors (MBE, DBE, SBE), suppliers and vendors who do not plan on bidding on contracts have limited access to BidX, free of charge, to search contract lettings, contract numbers, and descriptions. Advertisement notices for all projects solicited through BidX are posted on eMaryland Marketplace (eMMA), as required in COMAR. SHA has received construction bids exclusively online since July 2017, and MdTA since January 2020.

BidX does include two additional services that are not necessary for Maryland bidders: the Online Plan Sheet service, which is not needed since plans are available for free on BidX without a subscription; and the Bid Express Analysis Suite, which is not needed because MDOT modes using BidX publish their bid tabs and historic bid item prices on their web sites.

Below is a snapshot of the BidX user community (as of November 27, 2023):

•	Total # of Basic Account holders (nationally):	8,903
•	Total # of proposals received by MDOT:	1,354
•	Total # of bids received by MDOT:	5,524
•	Total # of unique vendors:	282

The benefits of continued use of BidX for electronic bidding include the following:

- BidX is used in 39 states, four of which use it across multiple agencies.
- BidX is fully integrated with AASHTOWare, a suite of software modules, developed by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) and designed to support state construction programs. MDOT uses AASHTOWare to produce files that get uploaded to BidX to advertise the bid.
- During the advertisement phase, MDOT can download plan holders into AASHTOWare. After the bid is opened, the Department downloads each bid to the line-item level and imports that data into AASHTOWare, where it forms the basis of the bid justification. Switching construction bid letting to eMMA would require entering all data manually, since eMMA does not interface with AASHTOWare.
- Bid packages are validated for affirmations and identifies the missing documentation. It
  notifies bidders prior to submitting the bid about errors and incomplete elements, reducing
  mistakes. This will reduce SHA efforts to manually check for missing affirmations and
  missing addenda, decreasing the post bid-opening processing time.
- Small businesses have a dedicated region in which to interact online with prime contractors, providing a greater opportunity for them to be included in bids, developing more resources for MDOT contracts, increasing competition.

In the Summer of 2023, the MTA experienced many destructive events to bus shelters including the shattering of the glass enclosures. The MTA investigated the cause of the property damage and learned that a series of events was in response to a social media challenge that encouraged the public to partake in destructive behavior. The frequency of the events caused MTA to exhaust the contract authority at a much higher rate than anticipated. Contract management could not get a modification approved in time to prevent the contract being used beyond its contract authority.

J. Ziemski, Inc., continued to provide these crucial services; and therefore, MTA is submitting this request to approve this contract with both retroactive and proactive terms.

MTA has addressed this issue with the Contract Management Team, provided guidance on the importance of close monitoring of the spend rate, and coordination with the Office of Procurement if any unforeseen events, such as social media challenges, arise that may lead to exhausting MTA's contract authority prematurely.

It is crucial that MTA be able to continue to utilize this service contract to maintain and repair bus shelters, which protect passengers from changing weather conditions as they await their commute. As well as having available contract authority to direct repairs as damage to bus shelters often result in a public safety hazard.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Airport parking shuttle service provides no-charge transportation to Airport patrons and their luggage between the Airport Terminal Building and the Airport operated surface parking lots, the daily garage, and Amtrak BWI Rail Station. The Airport parking shuttle service operates seven days a week, 24-hours per day, every day of the year. MAA procured eight battery electric buses to assist with these operations. This change in the propulsion system from Diesel to Electric brings the need for electric charging stations. SICHARGE UC is a newly developed, third generation, DC charger which is specifically designed and built for eBus and eTruck charging. MAA procured four SICHARGE UC200 output power control cabinets and eight electric charging dispensers in June 2022. MAA is now in need of 3 additional cabinets and 6 additional dispensers.

During the final stages of bus charger commissioning on February 20, 2024, the charger manufacturer, Siemens Industry, Inc. (Siemens) discovered internal damage to three (3) chargers and six (6) dispensers caused by moisture intrusion. Per Siemens, these units are not serviceable nor repairable, and need to be replaced. The damage to the units is not covered under warranty.

**Agency Remarks (cont'd):** Lengthy delays by the utility provider (October 2023 through January 2024) prohibited supplying power to the units after being installed at the bus charging site. This resulted in the inability to energize the dryers and fans required to keep out moisture.

Contract No. 042221 between Minnesota State and Siemens, effective August 5, 2021, through July 20, 2025, provides the electric bus charging stations consisting of three power control cabinets for \$150,000.00, six dispensers for \$72,000.00, 1st and 2nd mobilization for \$26,748.00, five-year SaaS - depot connect software for eight chargers for \$15,632.00, and commissioning for \$8,360.00 for a total price of \$272,740.00.

MAA conducted a cost analysis to determine if the cost was fair and reasonable, MAA compared the new replacement charger price of \$50,000 each and \$12,000 each for the dispensers to the price \$65,419 per charger and \$18,889.59 per dispenser MAA paid in June 2022. The replacement cost is \$15,419.00 and \$6,889.59 less respectively, for an overall decrease in equipment cost of 28.3%. Therefore, MAA deems Siemens Industry, Inc., price fair and reasonable. It is imperative that MAA purchase the identical chargers and dispensers from Siemens to prevent significant infrastructure changes at the permanent site and to match the non-damaged equipment.

The contract with Siemens Industry, Inc. has been negotiated per COMAR 21.05.09, Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing. Utilizing this procurement method will allow MDOT MAA to realize savings in time and money and is not intended to evade requirements set forth in COMAR 21.01.03.

This intergovernmental cooperative purchase contract did not lend itself to the inclusion of MBE or VSBE participation goals.

People's Community Health Center, Inc., recorded a State's Right of Recovery for the grant (1st Right of Recovery) in Liber 14086, Folio 469.

On April 21, 2015, THC replaced Peoples Community Health Center, Inc., and entered into a lease agreement with the landlord, Paul's Place, Inc. THC recorded a new ROR (2<sup>nd</sup> Right of Recovery) with their leasehold interest with the State of Maryland for the remainder of the term of the 1<sup>st</sup> Right of Recovery in Liber 17163, Folio 269. THC continues to provide the services and operates the facility as a Federally Qualified Health Care Center.

On February 14, 2024, THC entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement with Paul's Place, Inc., to acquire the above-referenced property. To close on the property the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2nd State's Rights of Recovery must be released. The releases are contingent upon THC recording a new Right of Recovery in the Land Records of Baltimore City at the time of settlement. The new Right of Recovery will expire on February 21, 2042, the balance of the remaining ROR period.

The Vital Statistics Administration (VSA) regrets this retroactive contract. Please be assured that VSA recognizes that retroactive contracts are not desirable. MDH is working diligently to avoid retroactive activities by putting new tracking methods in place.

Without these core services the MDH would have to revert to less efficient and highly manual processes. This would result in slower processing times, higher staffing and as a result substantially higher costs.

VitalChek is the only company that provides this service for vital records agencies in all 47 States. They have provided these services globally and to the State of Maryland for many years. They provide customer service for individuals placing orders remotely 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and 365 days a year. Offering this convenience increases the ability to meet customer needs.

VSA accepts and processes authenticated vital record orders from a number of different end points. VitalChek's platform provides all current services channels (e.g. point of sale, kiosks, funeral home portal, online portal, and shipping) at no cost to MDH. VSA receives revenue from all service channels. For requests processed using a VitalChek supported service channel there is a surcharge in addition to the VSA fee. VitalChek collects payment from the requestor and retains the surcharge and deposits the VSA fees into an agreed upon account. The VitalChek surcharge covers the cost of all equipment and supplies needed for accepting and processing vital record requests.

MDH is requesting approval of the new sole source procurement for a one-year contract with (1) one-year renewal option. Unfortunately, a new solicitation was not completed prior to the previous contract expiration date due to internal administrative challenges with significant reductions in staff, the COVID pandemic, MDH security breach and implementation of the Division's new birth registration system.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on November 20, 2020. A total of 101 potential contractors were notified of the solicitation. Fifteen offers were received on March 23, 2020. The need for interpreters has increased from the initial contract in 2021, until contract expiration in 2023. MSD compared the hourly rates from other State agencies and MSD PINSs, Frederick County Public Schools \$33.80 per hour for a non-certified interpreter with a High School Diploma, Prince George's Community College \$35 per hour, and MSD PINS \$23 - \$36 per hour. MSD utilizes interpreters to facilitate communication in educational, legal, many other meetings, sports events, etc. In addition, many parents of Deaf children are not necessarily fluent enough to carry-out conversations with teachers and administration in sign language. In order to bridge the communication barrier between the Deaf community and those that are hearing, MSD required interpreters to facilitate communication between the two communities. MSD hires interpreters to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. MSD is required to hold at least one Individual Education Program (IEP) meeting for each student per year as required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), a federal law that mandates educational programming and services for students with disabilities. These IEP meetings are legal meetings, and often the parents/guardians or an outside participating agency, such as a county school system employee that is not fluent in ASL.

Before this contract, MSD hired interpreters on an as-needed basis through multiple smaller competitive bids. These competitive bids were mainly awarded to freelance interpreters. Due to the ongoing needs of these services, the contract served to retain services of interpreting agencies and vetted freelancers.

Additionally, getting vendors to service young people in our facilities in the western region of Maryland has proven difficult each year. Region 4, Western Maryland Children's Center was not included in the current contract originally and was only added in the last modification of that contract.

The Department provides individualized care and treatment to youth who are alleged or adjudicated offenders and are supervised in the community. Many of the youth entering the residential facilities have a common background of family dysfunction and a lack of adequate health care. They often enter with poor health and neglected medical, dental, and mental health problems. The focus of this solicitation is to provide high quality, comprehensive dental services.

Due to the large population of youth to be serviced across the entire State and with the facilities varying in size, there are multiple contract avenues through which these services are provided. Based on an average year's oyster larvae production, which roughly averages 800 million oysters, and considering variables including weather and vendor output, DNR planned to complete a ground-truthing survey and first-round planting of oyster spat by the end of the base term.

The base term was awarded for 22-months; however, last year, the Chesapeake Bay experienced a record-breaking season for hatcheries. Bay-wide, 1.9 billion oysters were planted. Due to the WRF Group, LLC's efforts and ability to exceed anticipated results for the season, the funds awarded within the 'base term' of this contract have been depleted. To ensure work can continue at the current pace when weather and other environmental factors allow, and to avoid a gap in these efforts; DNR is seeking to exercise the first renewal option valued at \$1,000,000 upon BPW approval.

Additionally, DNR will plan to return for BPW approval of a contract modification during Summer 2024 in anticipation of additional funds contained in the State's final approved Capital Budget (MCCBL of 2024) to grant DNR access to the funding for Renewal Option #2.

In consultation with DoIT, MDH determined that its expanded need for licenses is greater than what the current DoIT NASPO contract could support.

SHI International Corp is the exclusive reseller of WorkOtter in the Maryland region.

MDH saved cost per unit for WorkOtter Team licenses when the contract was switched from a NASPO ICPA contract to a Sole Source Contract. The upgrade from 50-Team to 200-Team licenses decreased the per unit cost by 16%. This is a savings of \$9,800 per year for Team licenses, \$39,200.

By executing this modification to start on January 31, 2024, the contractor provided significant savings of \$6,547,089 to the State of Maryland for the PATT module. Requesting Agency Remarks: Services provided through this contract are unique and highly specialized to deliver the State a management contractor to oversee all conventional maintenance, repairs, glass replacement, and preventative maintenance. Additionally, the contractor monitors all original equipment manufacturer recalls, provides maintenance experts through a centralized technical support center to review, and approves maintenance and repair services 24/7/365, including a toll-free number. The contract also includes emergency road services 24/7/365 for vehicle towing and transportation for the State personnel from the accident or breakdown site to a safe and appropriate location. These centralized services ensure that the State's fleet is safe, operational, and that costs for maintenance and repair services are reasonable and applicable. Continuing these services while the State conducts the new procurement and awards a contract is essential.

The Department of General Services (DGS) released a Request for Proposal in late 2022, and submissions have been received. DGS is currently finalizing the contract with the potential awardee and anticipates an award by May 2024. The delay on this procurement was due to the pandemic and the ability to engage with vendors and due to staffing changes, corrective actions taken during the procurement process, and contract negotiations.

At the time of the original award, secondary service was unavailable, and MBE and VSBE participation was not established. The new solicitation includes 10% MBE participation.

DBM received approval to use an ICPA through GSA Contract: # GS-35F-0247V. This GSA contract is for IT training and services and was awarded to Cornerstone OnDemand; Cornerstone Learning is a cloud-based Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) learning management system. This

service provides a number of different solutions, such as IT technology training, software licenses, and software maintenance.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable based on market research. An estimate from an online third-party vendor showed the average cost, per user, for a cloud-based system for 46,000 users, is approximately \$3.00 to \$18.00 more than the GSA pricing. Also historical prices showed this contract is only approximately 3% higher than the previous contract.

The ICPA process was used because it will provide time and cost savings through significant reduction in the level of effort required for the procurement process and the amount of time to configure and onboard the system without interrupting critical services for Maryland citizens.

MBE and VSBE participation was not established for this contract because there are no subcontracting opportunities available.

### 99-EX. EXPEDITED PROCUREMENT REQUEST

Department of Education

**Recommendation:** The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) is requesting

approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per the Code of

Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.06.03.

**Description:** Under the Blueprint for Maryland's Future and Education Code § 7-210, the Maryland State Department of Education is tasked with administering a Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) to all incoming kindergarten students that is racially and culturally unbiased. MSDE contracted with John's Hopkins Center for Technology in Education (CTE) to fulfill a requirement in the Blueprint Comprehensive Plan to study the current KRA for any racial, cultural, or linguistic biases. John's Hopkins CTE, in collaboration with WestEd, completed a study and provided a report to MSDE which has been shared with the Accountability Implementation Board (AIB) at their request. John's Hopkins CTE and Wested also collaborated on the original design of the current KRA instrument administered to all Maryland kindergarten students.

The study looked across groups of Maryland kindergarten students, including gender, race/ethnicity, English language proficiency, socioeconomic status, and special education status. The findings from the study, using differential item functioning (DIF), indicated instances of moderate to significant differential performance across student groups. DIF results can identify potential concerns about fairness and validity, as they provide an indication of items that might be biased toward specific student groups. DIF results should be substantiated with a qualitative review by subject matter experts to determine if items are genuinely biased. The study indicated that nearly all student group comparisons as part of the study had moderate to significant differentials indicating an unacceptable risk of biases. By their own admission, the evaluators acknowledge test bias in the instrument their organizations originally helped to design.

MSDE has reviewed the report carefully to weigh options. The report provided recommendations to mitigate the study findings. The timeline to implement and complete the recommendations would involve staff time and additional expenses with partial implementation in 2025-2026. Full implementation of resolving the study findings would not be expected until 2026-2027. In addition to the study findings, MSDE has engaged with LEA personnel who have expressed dissatisfaction with the current KRA, including both the administration and the usability of the assessment results. Put simply, LEA leaders question the results KRA yields, and the current external evaluation further casts doubt on its objectiveness.

### Description (cont'd):

Governor Wes Moore's strategic plan and the Blueprint for Maryland's Future are dependent on a valid and reliable Kindergarten Readiness Assessment. This assessment should produce actionable data that will assist teachers in preparing our youngest learners, which the current assessment cannot do. School Superintendents and their staff must have confidence in the diagnostic instruments they are asked to administer because it directly impacts their response to the learning needs of all students. The National Center for Educational Statistics Early Childhood Longitudinal Study is quite clear – "from an equity perspective, monitoring kindergarten readiness is important because large between-group disparities become apparent well before children enter kindergarten and can have lasting effects." Our measurement of these skills must, therefore, be as accurate as possible.

Given that the study revealed moderate to significant biases, the time and effort needed to rectify the numerous flaws in the current assessment, and the current dissatisfaction expressed by the field, MSDE has determined that a new KRA system needs to be implemented urgently and declared a need for an expedited procurement to ensure that a KRA assessment without biases is available at the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year.

There are concerns with the current KRA contract with JHU CTE that have required MSDE to need an expedited procurement to ensure ongoing services for the State. It is also in the State's best interest to conduct an expedited procurement to maintain a valid KRA assessment in place for the next school year, and it could potentially impact new students entering the school system in the upcoming school year. Therefore, MSDE respectfully requests your approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per COMAR 21.05.06.03, as it is imperative to Maryland students.

Pursuant to Maryland State Finance & Procurement Article (SFP) § 13-108 (d)(1), MSDE's Procurement Officer, with approval of the Agency Head, has determined that this procurement should be expedited because: (1) urgent circumstances require prompt action; (2) an expedited procurement best serves the public interest; and (3) the need for the expedited procurement outweighs the benefits of making the procurement on the basis of competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals. However, the procurement officer shall attempt to obtain as much competition as reasonably possible per SFP § 13-108 (d)(2).

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on April 4, 2023. A total of 11 potential contractors were notified of the solicitation. Three proposals were received on June 7, 2023, and two were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because it did not meet the minimum qualifications. The recommended offeror Meridian Management Group, Inc. [...] was determined to be the most advantageous to the State.

One contractor submitted a protest on July 20, 2023, which was denied on September 7, 2023. The protest asserted that their proposal showed significant experience in direct lending. The protest decision was appealed, and that appeal was denied by the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) on February 15, 2024.



Meridian Management Group, Inc. met the technical requirements. The company is an established and stable small business service provider with more than 20 years specializing in loan, investment, and technical assistance services to underserved entrepreneurs. Also, the company possesses a mastery of the program components.

The contract will manage the existing MSBDFA portfolio and use funds appropriated to make loans, investments, loan guarantees, and surety bonds to Eligible Businesses. The current portfolio size as of June 30, 2022, consists of 128 transactions, totaling \$23.7 million guaranteed for \$3.5 million with a Maximum Exposure of \$21.2 million.

The cost for FA III was determined to be a fair and reasonable based on historical data. The cost for this service remains the same as the current contract.
