**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency (original emergency contract): On November 30, 2023, the Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center (CTPHC) experienced a severe heating failure affecting multiple units across the hospital. Diagnosis of the needed repairs was beyond MDH's capabilities. CTPHC is the State's only maximum security forensic psychiatric hospital which has a capacity of 289 patients and currently maintains a waitlist. The MDH Healthcare System adult psychiatric facilities operate 1,056 beds at or near full capacity - patients from CTPHC can only be transferred to other MDH facilities subject to availability of beds and clinical stability of patients of medium/minimum security environments. Hospital licensure and accreditation standards require that patient care units and medication storage be at appropriate ambient temperatures.

Due to the nature of the patient population, and to mitigate serious damage to the health, safety and welfare of the patients within the care of CTPHC, MDH could not wait the requisite 48 hours for DGS Chief Procurement Officer approval and moved forward on December 1, 2023, with the retention of a vendor to diagnose the situation and to recommend a temporary solution.

Currently the system is operating on one of the three boilers and the operational boiler may fail at any time. As such, the contractor has provided an on-site stationary engineer to monitor the system 24/7 as failure of the one operating boiler in the middle of heating season would be catastrophic to the facility. The costs above represent the incurred costs to date, which includes the initial diagnosis and stationary engineer.

The contractor has determined that the boiler equipment on site is past its usable life and needs to be replaced. MDH is currently working with the contractor to define the costs of bringing temporary equipment onsite to provide redundant support if the remaining boiler fails. The initial contract cost represented in this report includes the cost of the stationary engineer to monitor and operate the existing boiler on site until the temporary boiler is in place to provide the redundant support. MDH plans to modify this emergency procurement to include the temporary equipment costs until replacement of the system can be completed in coordination with the Department of General Services. MDH anticipates awarding the temporary equipment contract the week of December 18, 2023 and will provide necessary updates to the BPW once awarded.

#### Remarks (cont'd):

*Basis for Selection:* Single responsive bid from a responsible bidder. MDH selected a vendor that has experience with working with the State, including MDH facilities. Due to the urgent nature and the need to restore heat to the facility as soon as possible, MDH awarded this contract to the first responsive vendor. The selected vendor is also a certified MBE.

*Update: Emergency Modification:* In order to ensure redundancy and continued operation of the system until a full system replacement can be effectuated, MDH is leasing a temporary boiler to be installed. Additionally, due to the limited capacity in the MDH Healthcare System, the expedited installation of the boiler is required to ensure that MDH patients receive the care required.

The advertisement was for six contracts for \$6 million each not to exceed \$36 million for travel forecasting, traffic analysis & engineering services, statewide for SHA. A total of 861 firms were notified via eMMA and an additional 758 were directly solicited. SHA received 10 expressions of interest and invited 10 firms to submit technical proposals. SHA used a qualifications-based selection and found 6 consultants eligible for contract award. No protests were filed.

Services to be provided consist of travel forecasting, traffic engineering and analysis, and additional required traffic-related studies for the purposes of evaluating transportation projects during the various phases of MDOT SHA's project development process. These phases or types of projects/studies could include, but are not limited to: long range planning, feasibility studies, project planning/NEPA studies, planning, and environmental linkages (PEL) studies, corridor studies, preliminary/final design phases, practical design studies, value engineering, transportation alternatives program, economic analysis studies, traffic impact studies, congestion management studies, before and after studies, scenario planning and analysis, etc. The work could include developing areawide travel demand models or modifying an existing

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on February 17, 2023. A total of 94 potential contractors were solicited. This solicitation allowed for two Functional Areas to be awarded. Offerors could submit proposals for one or both Functional Areas. Functional Area 1 (FA1) consists of primary work categories number 1 and 2 detailed below, and Functional Area 2 (FA2) includes primary work category number 3 detailed below.

Three proposals were received for the two Functional areas. FA1 received one Proposal and FA2 received two Proposals on March 30, 2023. Of the two Proposals received for FA2, only one was deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because the vendor failed to submit all required documentation. One incumbent, NSF International, missed the submission due date and was not considered.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The contractor is responsible for providing technical forest management and forestry assistance related to the sale of forest products, implementation of silvicultural activities, and adherence to Forest Certification protocols on the lands of Chesapeake Forest and Pocomoke State Forest, located in Caroline, Dorchester, Wicomico, Worcester, and Somerset Counties. These State Forests, and the majority of the State Forest system, receive dual certification in sustainable forestry practices from the Sustainable Forestry Initiative and the Forest Stewardship Council. These certifications are subject to regular review and audit in order to maintain said certifications. The Maryland Forest Service has developed an annual work plan with input from the public, and the contractor will provide the field support and management required to complete the activities designated in the plan. There are three primary work categories:

- 1. Forest Management: The Contractor will provide forest management services for managing timber resources on 95,000 acres of state forest lands within Chesapeake and Pocomoke State Forests. (FA1)
- 2. Data Collection/Forest Inventory, Modeling, Mapping & Annual Work Plans: The Contractor will develop maps, collect and maintain all relevant data identified within the Forest Management Services under this RFP. (FA1)
- 3. Forest Certification: The Contractor will follow the most recent Sustainable Forest Initiative and Forest Stewardship Council certification protocols in conducting forest certification audits for the approximately 217,000 acres of State Forest lands under dual sustainable certification. (FA2)

A price comparison for FA1 and FA2 was conducted against the previous awards for similar services. For FA1, the price proposed was lower than what would be paid for the previous contract that expired on August 31, 2023, when adjusted for the Consumer Price Index. In 2017, the price for the previous contract of five years was \$1,000,000. When adjusted for inflation from August 2017 to September 2023, the amount is \$1,253,626, which represents a 25.36% increase. The pricing received from Parker Forestry for the same base term is \$1,178,000, which shows 6.02% savings of \$75,626. For FA 2, the 2017 contract with the same base term was \$113,504. The Consumer Price Index adjusted for inflation for the same service and number of years is \$142,292. Bureau Veritas' current price is \$121,485, which showed savings to the State of 14.62% at \$20,807. Considering these points, the prices for FA1 and FA2 have been determined to be fair and reasonable.



**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Everbridge is a software company that offers applications which provide information about critical events to help with personal safety and business continuity. As an authorized reseller, Carahsoft provides access to the Everbridge suite of products. The Department of Information Technology (DoIT) intends to use Everbridge's mass messaging systems, to send large scale notifications out to agencies, employees, contractors and/or the public before, during, and after outages, events, and other incidents to ensure the information provided is timely and informative. It is currently being used at the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT), Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM), the Maryland Courts, and 15 of the 24 jurisdictions across the state, covering 65% of Maryland's population with this alerting platform. Using a single, unified platform across all state agencies is critical in this type of communication to maintain a consistent messaging source.





#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

DoIT anticipates additional units of State government will use this platform and its related modules to create a unified solution across the state. The Everbridge services include the capabilities below:

- Mass Notification Pro Develop error-free communication workflows with form-driven templates to reach large and targeted audiences through multi-modal communication channels (SMS, phone, email, etc.)
- **Safety Connection** Improve the reach and effectiveness of notifications, enhance employee safety with "last known location" targeting, and mobile panic buttons.
- **SnapComms** Desktop communication, including full-screen emergency alerts, tickers, pop-ups, surveys, videos, screensavers, newsletters, etc.
- Crisis Management Provide a unified solution for crisis response plans, including Dynamic Task Management, Mobile Response Plans, Executive View and Reporting, Custom from Builder.
- **xmatters** Automate IT incident resolution through communication and workflow automation with out-of-the-box integrations and connectors to existing toolsets.
- Signal Open-Source Intelligence tools that monitor surface web, social media, deep web, and dark web for threats that may impact the State.
- **Resident Connection Data** Ability to alert approximately 70% of the adult population of the State to an imminent threat to life or property.
- **Professional Services/Technical Account Manager** Provide technical support to the State based on modules in use or needed.
- Additional Organizations Ability for segregated platforms.

DoIT intends to initially purchase Mass Notification Pro with unlimited messaging and the professional services of a Technical Account Manager. This will enable the State to achieve additional improvements in its critical communications on the Statewide Platform. DoIT's evaluation of mass communication solutions focused on systems the State is already using to ensure consistency across Maryland.

The purchase of the Mass Notification Pro will align with these requirements and provide added benefits with the procurement of additional modules for all state agencies in the future. The Everbridge Suite platform received Federal Risk and Authorization Management Program (FedRAMP) authorization. FedRAMP is a standardized approach to security assessment, authorization and continuous monitoring for cloud products and services. Everbridge is currently being used by all Federal Agencies including The Department of Homeland Security and The Environmental Protection Agency, as well as various State and Local Agencies and Municipalities including Connecticut, Vermont, New York, and Massachusetts.





#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

DoIT contacted resellers for this product and services. A quote was received from one vendor for \$529,395 per year. Additionally, Everbridge's list pricing for one year is \$530,889.50. The NASPO Cloud Services Master Contract price for the same product, services, and user numbers is estimated total per year is \$529,388 with a slight savings over Everbridge's list pricing. NASPO's contract has been in place since 2016, and the current contract price was established at that time. These prices have been maintained despite supply chain uncertainty, labor shortages, and a rising inflation rate across industries. For these reasons, the price is considered fair and reasonable.

The use of this procurement method will provide administrative efficiencies by reducing the time between need determination and delivery of the solution and reducing the administrative burden on DGS. It will provide cost benefits by reducing the time-to-value for the State of Maryland, and by providing a price that is locked in for the term of the contract. NASPO is the nation's largest and most experienced cooperative purchasing organization for the public sector. All contracts available through NASPO are competitively solicited and publicly awarded by a lead agency, using a competitive solicitation process consistent with applicable procurement laws and regulations. In accordance with COMAR 21.05.09.04, it is determined that this ICPA will provide cost benefits to the State, will promote administration efficiencies, and promote intergovernmental cooperation. The ICPA is in the best interest of the State and is not intended to evade the purpose of Division II of the State Finance Procurement Article.



**Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on December 12, 2022. A total of 71 potential contractors were solicited. Four proposals were received on January 5,2023 and three were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because the offeror did not submit a complete MBE Utilization and Fair Solicitation Affidavit & MBE Participation Schedule.

Gray, Kirk, VanSant Advertising (GKV) was selected by the evaluation committee and is one of Maryland's largest advertising firms with many clients from diverse sectors (government agencies, nonprofits/associations, financial services, health insurance etc.). GKV's technical proposal provided insights into the diverse Maryland media market and outlined different strategies that appeal to different audiences. They provided details on how they will implement their campaigns and collaborate with their various partners with different strengths and qualifications. They have previous understanding of tobacco control issues impacting Maryland audiences and the local media market and have fostered partnerships at the community level during their COVID 19 campaign across Maryland which will be beneficial for future tobacco control campaigns. They have extensive experience in developing targeted, culturally, and linguistically relevant media placements for different Maryland populations.

GKV detailed the items they considered while developing their budget including research activities, concepting, development and revision of creative materials, costs associated with royalty free photos and video footage, materials production. GKV took into consideration that newly developed campaigns require substantial investment in the initial stages to ensure development of quality products

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends mass-reach health communications as an essential evidence-based element of a statewide tobacco control program that also includes state and local level programming, cessation support, community-based programs, and other initiatives. Implementing these initiatives is a best practice comprehensive approach to reducing tobacco-related death and disease and eliminating health disparities.

A 10% MBE participation was established for this contract. GKV has committed to exceeding the goal to achieve 14% MBE participation.
