Board of Public Works Procurement Advisory Hiring Agreements - Eligible Contracts

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works issue an Advisory restating the Board's designations of primary procurement units to cooperate with the Department of Human Resources to implement the hiring agreement program and further implementing the requirement of annual reports.

Background: State Procurement Law requires the Board of Public Works to "designate the types of procurement contracts that are eligible" for hiring agreements. Hiring agreements are secondary arrangements between the Department of Human Resources and a State procurement contractor to cooperatively identify and hire Family Investment Program recipients to fill job openings on State procurement projects. This DHR Program provides temporary cash assistance, welfare avoidance grants, and services to families while preparing recipients for independence. Many recipients must engage in work activities in order to maintain their eligibility.

When the hiring agreement law was first enacted, the Board directed the Departments of Budget and Management, General Services, and Transportation, and the University System of Maryland to select eligible contracts for hiring agreements (Sec. Item 18, Jan. 13, 1999). The Board also required DHR to submit an annual report. Later, the pool of those FIP recipients who may seek employment through the hiring agreement preference was expanded to include former FIP recipients, children of current or former recipients, foster youth, and obligors required to pay child support. (See Sec. Item 9, Oct. 4, 2000).



Board of Public Works Procurement Advisory

Hiring Agreements - Eligible Contracts

Advisory: Specifically, the Advisory:

- ➤ Directs DBM, DGS, and MDOT (designated procurement units) to select certain procurement contracts as contracts eligible for hiring agreements. Although the University System of Maryland is generally exempt from State Procurement Law, the Board encourages USM to voluntarily participate as a designated procurement unit;
- > Emphasizes that designated units should review all procurements for hiring agreement status, including construction, maintenance, and services procurements;
- ➤ Directs the DHR to provide information about the Program to bidders and offerors on eligible contracts. DHR must also provide an account representative to the contractor to assist in training and placing the participants in jobs;
- Requires DHR to provide an annual report to the Board that summarizes the previous fiscal year's hiring agreement data including the agency awarding the contract, the type of contract, and the number of persons offered employment through each hiring agreement;
- ➤ Requires the designated procurement units to provide an annual report to the Board that summarizes the review undertaken by the unit in designating contracts as eligible for hiring agreement status.

Background: The Neighborhood Business Development Program, operating as Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW), was established in 1995 to provide flexible gap financing for small businesses starting up or expanding in locally designated neighborhood revitalization areas throughout Maryland. Loans are made to Maryland-based local development corporations, microenterprises, nonprofit organizations, or small businesses. Loans and grants are made to these organizations whose activities contribute to the broader revitalization of the designated neighborhood (e.g., reuse of vacant/underutilized buildings or providing needed goods or services to area residents). Financing ranges from \$1,000 up to the lesser of (i) \$500,000 or (ii) 50 % of total project costs. Loan applicants must provide a capital cash contribution of at least 5% of the total project cost. Microenterprise loans have a maximum loan amount of \$35,000.

REMARKS: The need for this modification became apparent during construction. For example, the expansion boards for the alarms were needed for them to communicate, and new cables were needed for the chart recorder because the old panel was to be demolished. Heat tracing was needed to keep an exposed temporary pipeline from freezing. The modification of the scale inhibitor water system was recommended by the manufacturer as a way to protect and extend the life of the membranes. 

Compensation: State Wetlands regulations provide that the Board of Public Works may assess compensation for these types of projects in an amount "equivalent to the fair market value of the wetlands affected or upland created." COMAR 23.02.04, 15A-B. The Wetlands Administrator and the Department recommend that the applicant pay compensation for creating upland for commercial purposes in the amount of 3,342 square feet. In these type of cases, COMAR requires the applicant to submit two real estate appraisals for review by the Wetlands Administrator and the Department of General Services, Office of Real Estate. The applicant is still in the process of obtaining these appraisals. However, the applicant requests the license now so it can proceed with construction during the building season and in time to open for the prime tourist season. The Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board grant the license with the condition that once the appraisals are received and reviewed, the matter returns to the Board for setting the compensation amount.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com*, posted on the Comptroller's Procurement website and listed in the Comptroller of Maryland's contract brochure that was distributed at various procurement and MBE outreach events throughout the year. The Comptroller of Maryland directly emailed the IFB to 50 prospective bidders, of which 33 are Maryland firms and 42 are MBEs. The Notice was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Two bids were received in response to the IFB. Both technical offers were reviewed and deemed to be acceptable, and the Bidders were deemed responsible. The financial bids were opened at a public bid opening on February 23, 2011. Gryphon Asset Management, LLC submitted the lower Total Estimated Commission and, as required by under a Competitive Sealed Bidding procurement, is being recommended for award.

Some statements received from potential bidders as to why they did not submit a bid included: the specifications are either unclear or too restrictive and the scope of work is beyond the vendor's current capacity; cannot accommodate the volume and complexity of these transactions; and cannot accommodate the legal transfer and delivery of securities to a third party.

The Comptroller of Maryland, Compliance Division Unclaimed Property Unit is responsible for the administration of the Maryland Uniform Disposition of Abandoned Property Act. The law is custodial in nature and requires that the Comptroller's office take possession of the property and attempt to locate the rightful owners. When all attempts fail in locating the owner of stock certificates, the Comptroller's Office moves forward with the sale of the unclaimed stocks.

When corporations, stock brokerage firms, mutual fund companies and banks are holding shares of stock for individuals and this stock has been determined to be abandoned due to inactivity on the account or the inability to find a valid address for the individual, the stock must be turned over to the State and the State must sell it within one year of receipt. These corporations, stock brokerage firms, mutual fund companies and banks are required to deposit these shares of abandoned stock into an account with the Depository Trust Company (DTC) in the name of the state of Maryland. The DTC is the national clearing house for stocks in the same way the Federal Reserve Bank is the monetary clearing house.

From this point, the vendor performing this contract researches the shares of stock being held for Maryland by the DTC, determines if the stock can still be marketed, and if so, the current share price. Once the vendor has completed the necessary research and determined that the stock is still being traded, it is directed to sell the stock, generally within 21 days, and remit the proceeds from the sale to the Comptroller's Office. If the stock is no longer marketable, then the stock certificates are returned to the Comptroller's Office, where they are kept on file.

A MBE participation goal of 5% was established for this contract. Services needed for this contract would require a firm to be licensed as securities broker/dealers or securities custodians. The nature of this contract creates a large number of individual transactions; however, the quantity of shares in each transaction tends to be small. While COMP does believe that some of the services could be subcontracted, the number of certified MBE firms licensed as securities broker/dealers are minimal. Gryphon Asset Management, LLC is a MDOT certified MBE; therefore, 100% MBE participation will be achieved with this contract.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A Notice of the Availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com* (eMM) and *www.mta.maryland.gov*. The notice was sent via direct mail distribution to 14 prospective vendors, in addition to the 149 prospective vendors that received the notice via eMM. Of the 163 total prospective vendors notified, nine are Maryland firms.

Six proposals were received in response to the RFP, all of which were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. However, one firm requested and was allowed to withdraw its proposal from consideration during the request for best and final offers. Johns Eastern Company, Inc. is recommended for award with the overall #1 ranking.

Johns Eastern Company, Inc. had the highest ranked technical proposal and the second lowest price. It was determined that the technical superiority of Johns Eastern Company, Inc. greatly outweighed the 17% (\$960,075) price difference of the lowest priced Offeror, which was ranked technically #4. Johns Eastern Company, Inc.'s proposal demonstrated an exceptional understanding of the unique needs of these services. Johns Eastern Company, Inc. proposed a strong insurance team with a background in claims handling.

In the day-to-day operations of the MTA's bus and rail operations, incidents arise that create automobile, bodily injury, general liability and property damage claims against the MTA. The purpose of this contract is to obtain the services of a Contractor to act as a Professional Independent Claim Adjuster (PICA) of transit liability claims. The current contract with this provider will expire on April 20, 2011. At this time, Maple Shade Youth & Family Services, Inc. is the only high intensity services provider in Wicomico County. It is, therefore, in the best interest of the children and the State not to disrupt the current placement or change the existing provider. The procurement method used for this contract is Sole Source and COMAR 21.14.01.06.C(1)(b) supports the decision of Sole Source for continuity of care.

High Intensity Group Homes serve children and youth presenting emotional and/or behavioral conditions requiring a higher level of structure, supervision, behavior management/modification, and clinical intervention. Behaviors may include, but are not limited to: physical aggression; poor impulse control; substance abuse; inappropriate sexual behavior; mental illness and aggression, or affective disorders, such as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and/or depression. The youth require awake 24-hour supervision.

COMAR 14.31.06.01 articulates the standards that must be met and maintained by residential child care programs for children and youth. These requirements are designed to protect the health, safety, and well being of children placed in residential child care programs.

RCC programs are defined in COMAR 01.04.03B(17)(a) as "an entity that provides for children 24 hour-per day care within a structured set of services and activities.."

The total award amount of \$1,058,985 assumes that the six slots purchased will be occupied for the entire two-year period. This is a reimbursement contract. The Teen Parent Program prepares pregnant and parenting teens for transition to an independent living program, college/vocational training program, or to independence. The desired permanency objective for all children and youth regardless of age is to transition into a family-based setting, if the appropriate placement is found. Otherwise, the youth may stay in the Teen Parent Program as long as they like until they age out on their 21st birthday. The Teen Parent Program shall serve no more than six pregnant teens and six parenting teens with their infants at a time.

Pregnant and parenting teen programs ensure teen parents learn good parenting skills and maintain their children in a safe and nurturing manner and prepare teen parents for independence. Services vary in intensity depending on the maturity level and clinical needs of the clients, but typically include pre-natal care when necessary, independent living skills and parenting skills.

COMAR 14.31.06.01 articulates the standards that must be met and maintained by residential child care programs for children and youth. These requirements are designed to protect the health, safety, and well being of children placed in residential child care programs.

DHR had anticipated that the new Request for Proposals (RFP) would be published by November 2010 and a new five-year contract would be awarded by 4/1/2011. However, final changes to the RFP for Call Center Services were not completed by DHR and DBM until 12/8/2010. The completion of the RFP took longer than anticipated due to the extensive number of changes made from the original statewide contract to incorporate new service components and to only have the components needed for DHR. In addition, the due date for the receipt of proposals was extended three times due to some unforeseen circumstances and the timing around the holidays. The RFP was published on 12/9/2011 with proposals finally due on 2/7/2011. DHR is currently evaluating the proposals and anticipates presenting the award recommendation to the Board of Public Works (BPW) in July for a new contract award beginning on 8/1/2011.

Originally inbound calls were estimated to be 65,000 calls per month; going forward with the three-month extension and the three one-month renewal options, the estimated monthly average of inbound calls has been increased to 128,643.

The purpose of the Call Center is to alleviate Department staff from being inundated with, and having to respond immediately to, customer inquiries (verbal, paper, and electronic) so that staff time can be devoted to casework and to ensure that customer inquiries are responded to in a timely and efficient manner.

Call Center services allow DHR to enhance services to Maryland citizens by dialing a toll-free number with access to live operators between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Voice mail access to the Call Center is available after hours Monday through Friday, on weekends and holidays. The Call Center staff also issue applications and other literature; provide service or product information; provide telecommunication services for the deaf, as well as multi-lingual services (to include Spanish and English); handle electronic mail, surveys and questionnaires; and send and receive fax verifications, etc. Call Center services have become an essential partner to DHR, especially for the Child Support Enforcement Administration.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: As a result of Health Care Reform legislation, specifically the Affordable Care Act enacted on March 23, 2010, changes to the administration of the pharmacy point of sale contract are required. These changes relate primarily to the collection and reporting of drug manufacturer rebates. The legislation provides for extending rebates to covered outpatient drugs dispensed to Managed Care Organization (MCO) /HealthChoice enrollees; increased rebate percentages for covered outpatient drugs dispensed to Medicaid patients and the rebate offset associated with the increase in the rebate

percentages.

Due to the intermittent release of implementation guidelines from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the above-referenced changes are being implemented in two phases. Phase I includes the invoicing and collecting of rebates from drug manufacturers for covered outpatient drugs dispensed to MCO/HealthChoice enrollees. Phase II will include the increase in rebate percentages and is covered in this modification, as referenced in the previous modification for Phase I approved as Item 7-S-MOD on the 12/1/2010 DBM BPW Agenda.

In order to improve customer service to our clients, Primary Adult Care Program (PAC) is requesting approval to modify the contract to provide an enhancement to automated eligibility processing system (EVS) notices to include the first initial and full last name of the case worker and to add the case worker's direct phone number. This will eliminate an extra step for the customer and provide them with direct access to the case worker on the first call, rather than going through the call center.

The PAC EVS currently generates notices with the case worker's EVS user id. The user id is not the case worker's name, but rather a partial name or a derivative of the name. In addition, the notice includes PAC's toll free call center number, not the actual phone extension of the case worker who is processing the case. The volume of PAC cases has increased dramatically over the last two years. Simultaneously with the program expansion, the call center has been downsized. The lack of direct access is frustrating and confusing to PAC applicants and recipients and increases not only the number of calls to the call center, but the level of urgency. The combination of a high volume of incoming calls and lack of direct access means that many callers are irritated and even angry by the time they reach the case worker.

With this enhancement, the PAC customers will not experience the frustration of being transferred and having to relate their issues multiple times. This will also alleviate the PAC call center from performing as a middle man for calls it currently redirects to the case workers. PAC will be able to reduce the number of dropped calls to the call center and provide better service to all callers.

It is in the State's interest to proceed with this modification in lieu of a new procurement for these services. The contractor currently performs the tasks referenced in this modification.



RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Public Works approve an agreement that settles an affirmative claim made by the State Board of Elections against Premier Elections Solution f/k/a Global Elections Systems, Inc. and Diebold Elections Systems, Inc. (Premier), whereby Premier waives certain software license fees and agrees that the Board of Elections may refrain from paying outstanding Premier invoices in the amount of \$696,870.53. The Board of Elections and the Office of the Attorney General recommend this action.

In 2008, the Board of Elections, through the Office of the Attorney General, claimed nearly \$8.5 million from Premier for certain costs incurred from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2008. The State incurred these costs to assure that security concerns associated with the voting system that Premier provided to the Board of Elections were corrected. To offset to this claim, the Board of Elections refused to pay Premier for approximately \$3.6 million in invoices for services and materials that Premier had provided.

The Board of Elections and Premier, seeking to resolve the claim before litigation, have reached a proposed settlement:

- 1. Premier waives all license fees for five years for the EZ Roster software and the EPIC software that the Board of Elections uses. Beginning July 1, 2011.
- 2. Premier waives all license fees for three years for the GEMS software and the Ballot Station software that the Board of Elections uses. Beginning July 1, 2011.
- 3. Premier waives all fees for three years for software and maintenance support services for the EZ Roster and EPIC software, in an amount not to exceed 500 hours per year. Beginning July 1, 2011.
- 4. Premier will provide at no cost to the State (except for shipping and storage costs) 300 of its TSX voting machines which the Board of Elections intends to use to upload files from the direct recording electronic voting system. These machines upload at a much faster rate than the machines that the Board of Elections currently uses for this process.
- 5. The Board of Elections will release \$2.9 million of the approximately \$3.6 million that the Board of Elections has retained, with the \$696,870.53 remainder being retained by the State.

REMARKS: In 2003, the Department of Aging received a federal grant to establish aging and disability resource centers (ADRC) known as Maryland Access Point or MAP. MAP seeks to create a "single-point-of-entry" at the local level for information and assistance requests related to long-term supports for adults such as requests about personal care/assistance, community access, health and medical, legal and financial, and eligibility for public programs. Subsequently, Aging received additional grants to expand MAP at the State and local levels and to implement ADRC programs that support the State's rebalancing efforts including Money Follows the Person, Person Centered Hospital Discharge Planning, Options Counseling and Evidence Based Care Transitions. Aging's partners in MAP include the State Departments of Health and Mental Hygiene, Human Resources, and Disabilities.

MAP provides a comprehensive system for information and assistance to identify and access appropriate services (public and private) for individuals who need long-term supports. It provides a Statewide searchable data base for information and services; in-person assistance is provided at local physical sites. The program is built largely upon local Area Agencies on Aging which in turn are required to develop formal partnerships with local health departments, departments of social services, and Centers for Independent Living.

Aging recommends extending the current contract term to complete the procurement for a replacement contract and to provide for transition to the next contractor. The development of the Website and searchable data base was delayed due to staff shortages for coordinating the data collection from multiple sources. Additional delays in preparing the next RFP are due to staff shortages, staff changeover, and a change in the RFP model from a start-up deliverable to an ongoing maintenance and performance enhancement RFP.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: NextGen Healthcare Information Systems provides the software for the DPSCS electronic patient health record (EPHR) system. EPHR is used to track offender information that is critical in providing healthcare to the offender, and for documenting medical encounters with the offender. (A medical encounter can be an examination, treatment, prescriptions, or dental visit.) Because historical information is required for continuity of care, an offender's information is retained for each incarceration event, as well as each medical encounter during each incarceration event.

DPSCS has used NextGen's electronic patient health record software since 2005. Currently there are 127,000 offender and 3.5 million encounter records on file. The EPHR system is accessed by 1,200 users. This contract with NextGen Healthcare Information Systems is to continue providing software licenses, software support, and customization development.

ITEM: 4-IT (Cont.)

NextGen's two major deliverables are:

- License usage and maintenance (\$830,000/yr).
- Customization development/support for existing customizations (not-to-exceed \$500,000/yr).

DPSCS originally purchased the software as part of the Correctional Medical Systems inmate-healthcare contract in 2005 and continued to use this software via a direct contract with NextGen approved in 2010 (DoIT Item 1-IT [5/5/10]). The purchase price of the software was \$6.5 million; maintenance fees were listed as 11% of the purchase price. NextGen's practice – typical in the software industry – is to regularly increase support/maintenance fees. NextGen's track record indicates an average 4% increase annually. Costs for customization development typically increase annually as well. By agreeing to a five-year term, the State has locked in the maintenance fee rate and the costs for customization development at a significant savings.

This procurement is appropriate for sole-source. The market price for NextGen software for a state comparable to Maryland is \$10 million and annual maintenance would be 22% of the purchase price. While the features and cost of competitive software may vary slightly from the DPSCS's current application, the cost of implementation, conversion and re-training associated with a new system would be cost prohibitive and not provide tangible benefits. The NextGen EPH is a proprietary system. The purchase of the license fee permits DPSCS to use, but not own, the software. Custom development will be procured on-demand and will be performed by NextGen at its facility. The scope of this procurement, the acquisition of software licenses, and the on-demand customization of the proprietary software does not lend itself to subcontracting opportunities for MBE participation.

The request recommended that DNR consider exchanging land owned by the John Murphy Trust that borders Chesapeake Forest lands, for a comparable equal valued amount of Chesapeake Forest lands abutting the Holly Grove Christian School. The Department has conducted an interdepartmental review of this proposal and concluded that the trade would serve to facilitate expansion of the Holly Grove School in an exchange in which DNR would be giving up a monoculture pine woodlot for a more diverse forested wetland ecosystem along Marumsco Creek.

The House Appropriations Committee and Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, as well as an MDP interdepartmental review concluded the proposal was acceptable. A smaller portion of State POS funds will still be used to acquire priority recreational, cultural, and historic sites, and state park in-holdings. The Landon acquisition is being considered for inclusion to Janes Island State Park for public access, expanded recreational opportunities, and buffer to park. This project qualifies to be considered for acquisition as a parks recreational project outside of the ecological targeting protocol as outlined above.
