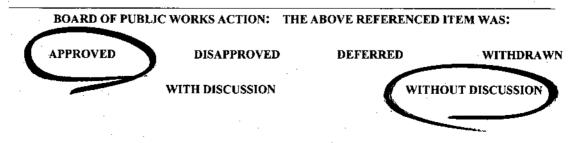

Neighborhood BusinessWorks Program - Fiscal Year 2011

Recommendation: The Department of Housing and Community Development recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the use of general obligation bond proceeds to fund four loans totaling \$750,000 for Fiscal Year 2011.

The 2010 General Assembly amended the Neighborhood Business Works statute to authorize DHCD to make loans to local microenterprise lenders that in turn make loans to local emerging or expanding micro enterprises. A microenterprise is a small business with five employees or fewer. With this legislative change, the Neighborhood Business Works program can expand its reach to microenterprises without expanding staff, but instead, by forming partnerships with experienced local micro-lenders.

The four borrowers are Maryland non-profit micro-lenders that will serve as DHCD's intermediary in the origination and funding of microenterprise loans. DHCD's portion of the microenterprise loans will not exceed \$35,000 per project.

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the use of general-bond proceeds to fund a loan under the Maryland Historical Trust Loan Program to restore or selectively and appropriately replace windows, install storm windows, and make other general repairs to Franklin Hall.

Franklin Hall is a late nineteenth-century brick commercial building originally housing the town's Masonic Lodge but now the site of three tenant spaces, two commercial spaces, and one residential space. The Chesapeake City District Civic Association, a nonprofit organization, undertook a general rehabilitation of the property in the 1970s. The Association has successfully completed past projects funded by MHT capital grants to repair the building structure and roof and repair masonry in the basement. MHT holds a perpetual preservation easement on the exterior of the building and on the 0.365-acre property.

The Association seeks this Historic Preservation Loan to further repair the structure. Total project costs are estimated at \$156,660. The loan will be secured by a first mortgage. A promissory note will outline repayment conditions. MHT will require the borrower to deposit \$10,500 with the mortgage servicer, as additional security, an amount equivalent to one year's payments on the loan, for the first 18 months after settlement. Based on the sales comparison approach, the property has an appraised as-is value of \$775,000 which, while high in the opinion of DHCD's financial advisor, indicates that the value of the property is more than adequate to secure the proposed loan. Chesapeake City District Civic Association has publicly advertised a request for proposals and is awaiting the due date for proposals.

Background: The Qualified Zone Academy Bond (QZAB) Program, administered by the Interagency Committee, funds capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance of existing school buildings. The program was extended as part of the federal American Reinvestment and Recovery Act of 2009.

In previous years, QZAB allocations were based on each school district's proportion of pre-1970 building area that had not been renovated and the district's percentage of students eligible for free or reduced price meals. The formulaic approach resulted in over-allocation of funds to certain LEAs that did not have the administrative capacity to manage the difficult QZAB requirements as well as under-allocation to LEAs that had projects requiring funds larger than the formula permitted, all of which contributed to delays in expending the QZAB funds.

To address these issues, the General Assembly revised the allocation method to be based on two factors Chapter 96 (2011 Laws of Maryland). The law directs allocations "for the renovation, repair, and capital improvements of qualified zone academies, as defined in § 54E(d)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code . . . as follows:

- "(a) for competitively awarded grants by IAC to eligible school systems for qualified academies, including public charter schools; and
- "(b) for targeted grants awarded by MSDE to eligible school systems for qualified academies, including public charter schools, under the Breakthrough Center Program."

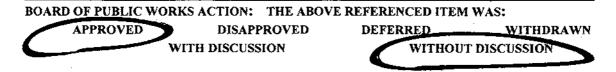
Background: (cont'd) Breakthrough Center Program schools are low-performing schools that receive a concentrated focus of State assistance in order to avoid restructuring under the federal No Child Left Behind law. In some cases, facility improvements are needed to support the technology and other programs that are implemented through the MSDE Breakthrough Center. As the 2011 Law directs, the IAC assessed the QZAB projects requested for these schools on a targeted, non-competitive basis; all were found to be eligible. Grants for the balance of FY 2012 QZAB funds were assessed on a competitive basis, by evaluating project priority, scope, and eligibility analogous to that conducted for projects in the annual Capital Improvement Program, but using the QZAB project criteria.

This revised approach to allocation allows a more equitable distribution of funds based on real need and the LEAs' requests, and will permit the funds to be fully expended within the timelines established by the federal government. Following withdrawal of certain projects by LEAs, the recommended FY 2012 QZAB allocations will allow most of the requested projects to be fully-funded and a small number to be partially funded, with the balance to be provided through the FY 2013 QZAB authorization.

Proposed Regulatory Amendments:

- COMAR 23.03.02: Regulation 05. Revisions to requirements and procedures for calculating the State-local cost share percentages for school construction projects funded in the State Capital Improvement Program.
 - The Public School Facilities Act of 2004 requires the IAC to recalculate State cost share percentages every three years using criteria defined in Section C. of this regulation. When the first re-calculation occurred in 2007, the Board of Public Works delayed the implementation of the changes by a year to provide time for county boards and local governments to adjust their capital improvement programs. The Board also limited the one-year reduction of the State percentage to a maximum of 5%. This regulatory proposal will make these procedures permanent.
 - * In addition, the regulatory proposal deletes the table that shows the State cost share percentage. This action will avoid amending the regulations each time the three year re calculations are conducted.
- COMAR 23.03.02: Regulations .03, .13, .28. Require that new schools and replacement schools in which capacity increases be built within Priority Funding Areas (PFAs), establish procedures for IAC review of school sites and State funding for construction projects when such schools are proposed outside of PFAs; and establish criteria for granting waivers. The IAC review will be similar to State reviews of other categories of capital projects. The proposed amendments and new regulation will further good community planning practices by encouraging the construction of new schools and enlarged school capacity in existing communities and by discouraging such school projects in areas outside of PFAs.

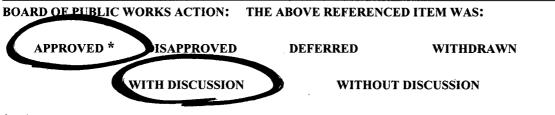

The Treasurer recommends that the Board of Public Works adopt resolutions revising the resolutions previously approved on June 15, 2011 (Secretary's Agenda, Items 8 and 9) regarding the sale of State of Maryland General Obligation Bonds for the purpose of funding the State's capital program and for refunding certain bonds, to consolidate the sale of the refunding bonds and the new money bonds, to adjust the times of sale of the Bonds, and to modify the Board's procedures for approving the sale of the Bonds. The distribution of the Game to Retailers and purchase of the prizes will be contingent upon the resolution of the strike by a date that allows the Lottery adequate time to both distribute and sell the Game. If the NFL season does not begin in a timeframe that is acceptable to the Lottery and consistent with its sales goals, this Game would be held in the Lottery's warehouse and distributed to Retailers for the start of the 2012 NFL season. If this happened, the purchase of prizes would also be deferred until the 2012 season. The Contractor is paid for the ticket printing based upon a percent of sales, so it would not get paid until the Instant Ticket Game is launched and sells.

If by chance there would be no football played during the 2012 season, the Lottery would delete the Raven's merchandise (signed jerseys, etc.) and experiential prizes (season tickets, trips to games, etc.) and launch the Instant Ticket Game as just a regular \$5.00 ticket with normal scratch off money prizes.

The prior licensing contract with the Ravens, approved on the 6/9/2010 DBM BPW Agenda, Item 3-S, was for a License to produce one Instant Ticket game (and Ravens prizes) that launched with the pre-season game on 8/12/2010 and was sold thru the 2010 season, although tickets can continue to be sold until sold-out into 2011. Copies of the solicitation notice were mailed directly to 93 prospective vendors, 14 of which are Maryland firms, and included three MBEs. Two proposals were received in response to the RFP; both were deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Award is recommended to New Teacher Center (NTC). NTC's proposal not only demonstrated a thorough understanding of The Teacher Induction Academies(TIA), but also presented innovative models for Teacher Induction Programs that include: mentor identification and selection models; a formative assessment system to chart teacher growth and guide mentor work; an overall model guiding a quality induction program; and models for induction programs that span the range of budgets from rich budgets to meager ones.

The federal Race to the Top (RTTT) grant awarded to Maryland includes funding for the establishment of statewide TIA. The TIA will provide new teachers with the tools to successfully transition to the classroom and learn to be effective. It also ensures that teachers new to Maryland are fully supported in their efforts to access the curriculum and assessments so that they are equipped with the instructional tools needed to deliver effective instruction to Maryland students and be successful. Maryland will provide a comprehensive, high-quality induction program for new teachers in every school district.

- Preparing an annual report on the activities of the first Academy (held in the summer) and follow-up training for the other Academies each year.

Through eMM 472 vendors received the solicitation notice. Of these potential offerors, 228 were small businesses. This procurement was designated as a Small Business Reserve. The Total Award Amount is composed of two components that are further described below - the Contractor's Fees and the DBED Marketing Budget.

- 2. <u>DBED's Marketing Budget</u>: This component is the portion of DBED's marketing budget as estimated in the Request for Proposals. - Star-Spangled 200: The Bicentennial of the War of 1812. Maryland and its role in the Second War of Independence and the penning of the National Anthem in Baltimore's Harbor;
- The Sesquicentennial of the Civil War. Maryland is one of the several states that markets its Civil War heritage under the brand of Civil War Trails. Antietam is almost universally recognized as a major battle in the Civil War;
- The Centennial of Harriet Tubman. The most famous of the Underground Railroad's conductors was born in Maryland. The State is commemorating the 100th Anniversary of her death with the opening of a new State park and a higher elevation of the Underground Railroad National Byway.

It is anticipated with this contract that the Maryland Office of Tourism will have a higher propensity of reaching people within its target market due to its hiring of the technically best public relations services agency. This should result in increased interest in its marketing message as measured by inquiries requesting further Maryland travel information. The public relations firm will ensure that communications are targeted to the proper media outlets and contributors so that Maryland will receive positive travel editorial coverage in local, regional and national media outlets.

In FY2010 the State invested \$6.77 million in general funds for the Office of Tourism Development and the Maryland Tourism Development Board. The Comptroller reported that the Tourism Promotion Act formula generated close to \$329 million in State sales revenue for FY2010. That represents a powerful return on investment of \$48 in State sales tax for every dollar invested in tourism funding.

Only one bid was received in response to this solicitation. The recommended contractor is deemed responsible, and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Moreover, the price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, Psychology Consultants Associated, P.A. is recommended for award.

All candidates for mandated positions are subject to the jurisdiction of the Maryland Correctional Training Commission (MCTC) and must meet selection standards established by the MCTC. This is a fixed unit price, indefinite quantity contract that provides for up to 703 mental health evaluations per year for DJS employees and job applicants in accordance with the MCTC's enabling authority and implementing regulations.

Psychology Consultants Associated, P.A. has provided these services for five years, and DJS is satisfied with the quality of the mental health evaluations provided by the Contractor. The Contractor reduced its rates from \$123.60 per evaluation to \$115 and it is not charging for administrative hearings (when testimony is needed regarding the written recommendations provided from the evaluations is needed), whereas in the prior contract, it charged \$25.75. In addition, the prices bid are the same for all three years of the base contract term. The contract states that the renewal options, if exercised, will provide for up to a 4% increase, if any, based upon the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the District of Columbia/ Maryland/ Virginia/ West Virginia Region.

The Lottery reviewed the contract, surveyed the market and evaluated whether it would be more

advantageous to exercise the renewal option or solicit a new contract. The market survey indicated that comparable services would cost more if a new procurement was done at this time and the Contractors have provided satisfactory service during the base Contract term. The Lottery determined that it is in the best interest of the State to exercise the renewal option.

This is the only renewal option available and the Lottery anticipates that it will have a continuing need for these services. An RFP for a replacement contract will be issued in the first quarter of 2013.

There are no guaranteed Marketing Budget amounts or guaranteed earnings to the Contractor. External budget modifications, internal budget management decisions and/or contract modifications may impact the Contractor's earnings. Since the level of effort required by the Contractor is dependent to some degree upon the amount of Lottery funds it will be required to manage, the Contract provides for a price adjustment based on Marketing Budget changes. Reductions to the Lottery's budget over the past 2 to 3 years have resulted in the actual payments to the Contractors being reduced approximately 22% to 40% from the NTE amounts approved at the time of Contract award as shown on Attachment 1.

Currently, the Fee for Service (FFS) Preferred Drug List (PDL) and the HealthChoice Managed Care Organizations (MCO) formularies are maintained by the vendor on the EpocratesTM Formulary Listing Service software. This inclusion provides the prescribers with a comprehensive and accurate resource of all covered medications under the Maryland Managed Care and FFS programs and reduces unnecessary denials and delays for the recipients in obtaining their much needed medication. In addition, it will continue to improve medication compliance with the MCO and FFS formularies, hence allowing for long term savings on effective, yet less expensive medications.

Health Information Design (HID) provides technical and administrative support and acts as the executive secretariat to the Drug Utilization Review (DUR) Board as required in the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (OBRA) of 1990. The objectives of this Contract are for HID to: (1) Perform retrospective DUR analyses; (2) Manage the State DUR Board; (3) Provide advice and recommendations to DHMH for DUR related educational and administrative interventions; and (4) Provide oversight and evaluation of the DUR programs in the Medicaid fee-for-service, managed care, and mental health programs.

It is in the best interest of the State to exercise this two-year renewal option with the current vendor to enable continued administration of pharmaceutical services provided to the Maryland Medicaid recipients and the providers that serve them, and also to keep in compliance with Federal regulations. In addition, continuity of the current vendor's services ensures that ongoing cost containment efforts remain in place for prescribers to have comprehensive and accurate information provided through the EpocratesTM Formulary Listing Service software that is maintained by HID.

Health Information Designs (HID) did provide a voluntary price reduction for the second option period of the Retrospective Drug Utilization Review Services contract. However, due to the recent exponential increase of lives covered by the Medicaid Managed Care program (approximately 50% increase in the last 2 years), the fees that HID pays to EpocratesTM, the online formulary hosting service that the Department implemented in 2008, also increased. The increase in the fees for EpocratesTM is larger than the voluntary price reduction provided by the vendor and therefore, the overall contract amount does increase.

HID's performance on this contract has met and exceeded all of the contractual requirements. The tools that the vendor employs to perform the Drug Utilization review and the subsequent provider interventions to providers that service the Maryland FFS, HealthChoice MCO and Primary Adult Care MCO members, have allowed the agency to achieve significant savings due to the reduction in inappropriate drug utilization by members, and inappropriate prescribing habits by providers. The total amount saved each year is approximately \$425,000.

The new procurement will contain additional requirements and considerations and allow time for a transition period to a new manager, if needed.

After proposals were reviewed and a consultant's evaluation of proposals was received, the MSRP Board was unable to determine a suitable award. The MSRP Board decided it was necessary to prepare more extensive requirements in order to better meet the needs of the State, and that this should be done through a revised Request for Proposals. The MSRP Board believes that expenses under the contract extension would not cause a negative financial impact for participants. The \$380,150 amount for nine month extension is based upon the original contract investment management fee formula.

This contract provides investment management services for the MSRP Stable Value Fund. The contractor is a Plan fiduciary and manages this pool of assets as one of the investment options for the participants of the Maryland 457 Plan, 401(k) Plan, and 401(a) Match Plan. The Stable Value Fund, also referred to as the Investment Contract Pool, is currently valued at about \$747 million.

As is customary in many investment manager agreements, the fees for this stable value arrangement are paid out of earnings or assets of the Stable Value Fund. These charges are invoiced and monitored through the Board of Trustees' staff and payment initiated through the third-party administrator (currently Nationwide Retirement Solutions, Inc. of Columbus, Ohio.)

The process of opening and closing streets often takes years to complete. The Department of Public Works begins the process with the review of site plans while the Law Department reviews the title report. The City then drafts ordinances for a street opening or closing. These ordinances must be approved by the City's Planning Department, the Planning Commission, the Board of Estimates and the City Council. The process culminates with the Director of the Department of Public Works holding public hearings and will then declare the streets or alleys to be officially opened or closed.

The process in doing so can be considerable. The University would run the risk of significant construction delays and higher construction costs if it were not to retain a title company experienced in working with Baltimore City and the various City departments for this process. In addition to ARRA projects, MTA has been actively engaged in expanding and modernizing its rolling stock to meet increased demand for service and to enhance the reliability of existing service. Additional contract authority is required to cover several on-going rolling stock and equipment tasks under this contract.

The MTA does not have the necessary 'in-house' resources available to provide the technical expertise required for these services. The current Consultant, Booz Allen Hamilton and its team of subconsultants, has provided excellent technical support services to the MTA's Office of Engineering on various rolling stock projects tasks. The additional funding will provide for the continuation of these services at the level of expertise still required by this Consultant on the following three (3) very important on-going project development tasks:

The fifteen year term of the contract includes an implementation period of up to eighteen months and energy savings guaranteed by Pepco over 13.5 years.

The Phase II project will include heating, cooling, and associated control system upgrades, solar photovoltaic energy system installations, chiller replacement, lighting system upgrades, water conservation measures, and building envelope sealant and insulation. Buildings and terminals included in the program are: the World Trade Center; Buildings 90A, 91A, 91B, 96D, 97A and 97B and high mast lighting at Dundalk Marine Terminal; the Cruise Terminal Building, Shed 10, and terminal high mast lighting at South Locust Point Marine Terminal; and the office, lab, records and maintenance facilities at the Cox Creek Dredged Material Containment Facility.

Phase II will also include the following components:

Water Conservation - Repair, replacement and retrofit of faucets, water closets, urinals, and showerheads in various MPA facilities. These projects will provide significant capital improvements to address facility needs while providing long term energy and water usage cost savings. This equipment replacement will result in more efficient operation of buildings systems and achieve mandated reductions in water usage.

Measurement and Verification (M&V) Services - A support services program to verify that guaranteed savings are being achieved. Documentation will be provided annually to verify energy savings.

Maintenance Support Services - A full service preventive and predictive maintenance program for 13.5 years on the chillers and condenser water system for the World Trade Center and other components of heating, ventilating, cooling, temperature control, air handling, hot water, and steam boilers at various MPA facilities.

Energy Savings Guarantee – If annual measurement and verification show that MPA has not achieved the annual energy savings guaranteed by Pepco, Pepco will reimburse MPA for the additional energy costs incurred.

The MBE goal established by DGS Contract No. DGS-06-EPC-IDC-5.0 was 25%. Pepco will exceed that goal by 9%.

Project costs will be funded in part through the State Treasurer's Energy Performance Contract Lease-Purchase Program at an assumed rate of 4.0% for the tax-exempt and 5.5% for the taxable portion, annually, and repaid through reduced energy and water usage which are guaranteed by Pepco. The annual guaranteed savings are more than the projected annual debt service on the lease using conservative estimated rates. The annual guaranteed energy, water and maintenance savings is \$1,908,368 in year one and escalates over 13.5 years to a total savings of \$28,689,290. Additional funding is provided through a Sunburst Block Grant from MEA, the State Agency Loan Program (SALP), and rebates from BGE. The cost carried by MPA will be paid from savings with a net positive cash flow. REMARKS: The current Contractor provides small paratransit and non-paratransit configured buses to locally operated transit systems and non-profit entities. The pricing for the contract renewal term is based on the Producer Price Index (PPI) for bus bodies as published by the U.S. Department of Labor with a 5% cap on cost increases. The PPI applicable to the 2010 option year actually decreased, which resulted in a cost reduction of \$118.83 per vehicle when the 2010 chassis change over and price adjustments were factored into the total cost of each unit. The current PPI comparisons revealed a static adjustment for the 2011 renewal year. This actual realized savings in 2010 is therefore extended through the 2011 renewal option year.

Both the negative 2010 price adjustment (with the resulting cost savings) and the administrative cost associated with contract solicitation provides the basis for the decision to renew this contract rather than preparing a new solicitation. Additional research was initiated in 2010 comparing the savings under this contract with those in several other jurisdictions whereby it was determined that similarly outfitted units on a North Carolina contract averaged 4% higher than the current MTA price schedules and bid prices received in Minnesota in 2009 revealed a pricing structure that averaged 1.5% to 3.5% higher than the current MTA unit pricing. Overall pricing was one additional factor driving the decision to renew the contract for an additional year along with the ability to provide replacement vehicles for the period required to prepare revised solicitation specifications for the 2012 model year.

At the time of the contract award, the vendor was conducting business under the name "Bus Parts and Sales." Structurally, Bus Parts & Sales was a division of Coach and Equipment Bus Sales, and both entities used the same federal tax ID number. Approximately five months after the contract was awarded, the management of Coach and Equipment Bus Sales decided to use the name of the parent entity as the trade name under which it would conduct its bus manufacturing business. MTA consented to the name change by letter dated September 2, 2008.

The current vendor's performance has enabled the contract orders to be handled expeditiously with equipment inspections and unit deliveries completed on time or ahead of the contracted timelines. The attached spreadsheet outlines the previous change orders that were approved for this contract since its inception in 2008.

REMARKS: The MDTA is a member of the E-Z Pass Interagency Group (E-Z Pass Group), which consists of fourteen states and twenty four agencies that operate the E-Z Pass system. In June of 2011, the E-Z Pass Group put forth an Irrevocable Offer (IO) to its members for provision of transponders and toll lane equipment to support E-Z Pass operations. The current contract of the Irrevocable Offer (IO), signed by all twenty-four members of the E-Z Pass Group is scheduled to expire on August 16, 2011.

The lead agency conducting the new solicitation, New York State Metropolitan Transportation Authority Bridges and Tunnels, follows a procurement process similar to Maryland's.

The E-Z Pass Group is in the evaluation process of reviewing the proposals from a new solicitation. The process was significantly delayed because the E-Z Pass Group added members and by doing so, brought about questions/concerns regarding the governance of these new members. Specifically, whether they would be allowed to participate or be precluded from the procurement process. There were also patent infringement lawsuits between two of the vendors. This document had to incorporate individual requirements for the various agencies within fourteen states.

It is the opinion of the MDTA that the procurement process, including the contract negotiations involving all twenty-four members will take even more considerable time and that one year is the appropriate length of time for this additional procurement activity. The MDTA issues approximately 160,000 transponders per year and this will increase with the opening of the Inter County Connector (ICC).

REMARKS

The award price is based on historic estimated usage. A notice of availability of a Invitation for Bids (IFB) was posted on DGS's Web Site, Bid Board and eMaryland Marketplace.com. Email notification of the solicitation were mailed or emailed directly to 68 prospective bidders, 32 of which were MBEs and 27 were Small Business Reserve vendors. Additionally, 9 Refuse Removal firms within the Western Maryland region were contacted.

This procurement was originally solicited in January of 2011 however only one bid for each county (Garrett, Allegany and Washington) was received. Calls were made to refuse removal companies within the Western Maryland region and found that an additional three (3) firms were unaware of the solicitation and therefore did not submit bids for that procurement.

At that time, DGS determined it was in the State's best interest to re-solicit the procurement to obtain the best possible pricing for the State with Region A. On May 19, 2011, bids were opened for this solicitation and despite its best efforts DGS only received three bids; one for each County.

The Contractors who had indicated that they were unaware of the previous solicitation were contacted and some of the reasons given for why they had not submitted a bid included; 1) it was not a good business decision at this time, 2) recently bid on a job that took most of our equipment budget and 3) the specifications would not allow for the disposal of refuse in the State of Pennsylvania.
