Before spending any funds secured under these Acts, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope.

6. <u>DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES</u> (cont'd) Ocean Beach Maintenance Fund

Monitoring: The monitoring program was developed in the General Design Memorandum to determine the project's performance and periodic renourishment and maintenance needs. Instrument surveys of the beach are completed in October and May to determine the condition of the project in relation to the design template. Bi-annual monitoring includes visual and instrument surveys of the beach, berm and dune, aerial photography, sediment sampling and wave data collection and analysis. Under the Local Cooperation Agreement, monitoring is cost-shared at the level of 53% federal and 47% non-federal. The non-federal portion is further cost-shared at the rate of 50% State, 25% County, and 25% Town of Ocean City. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will take the lead in conducting monitoring activities.

Maintenance: According to the Local Cooperation Agreement, upon completion of the initial construction phase, the local sponsor must maintain all project elements. Annual maintenance includes repairs to dune fencing, incidental dune repair, access ramps and cross-overs, bulkhead gates, coating and ramps, and planting. This Item is for that portion of the work completed by the Ocean City Department. of Public Works and emergency work needed to repair damage caused by some coastal storms. Maintenance costs are cost-shared at the rate of 50% State, 25% Worcester County, and 25% Town of Ocean City.



8. <u>BONDS</u> Taxable Qualified Zone Academy Bonds of 2010

Submission of a recommendation by the State Treasurer to adopt the resolutions concerning the sale of State of Maryland General Obligation Taxable Qualified Zone Academy Bonds of 2010 (QZABs), dated as of December 8, 2010, in the amount of \$4,543,000 (Bonds).

- Ratifying and approving:
 - (i) The resolutions authorizing the QZAB Sale adopted July 28, 2010.
 - (ii) The QZAB Request for Proposals (Term Sheet) dated November 9, 2010.
 - (iii) The award of the Bonds by the Treasurer to JPMorgan Chase Bank, N. A. on November 29, 2010.
- Ordering the issuance of the Bonds in the principal amount of \$4,543,000, to mature on December 1, 2025, and paying interest at the rate of 5.02%.
- The State of Maryland has elected to receive a subsidy payment from the United States Treasury Department for the Taxable Qualified Zone Academy Bonds of 2010 in an amount equal to the lesser of (i) 100% of the amount of interest payable on the 2010 QZABs, which is equal to 5.02%; or (ii) 100% of the amount of interest payable if interest was determined at the applicable Qualified Tax Credit Bond rate of 5.41% published by the United States Treasury Department on the sale date of November 29, 2010. Therefore the State shall receive a subsidy payment from the United States Treasury of 5.02%, which is equal to 100% of the interest payable on the Bonds.
- Directing the Interagency Committee on School Construction to monitor the administration of the Bonds and the Qualified Zone Academy Bonds Program.

December 2010 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase Financing

The State Treasurer recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the award of the December 2010 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement for financing, on a consolidated basis under a lease-purchase financing arrangement, the acquisition of capital equipment by certain State agencies. This December 2010 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase Financing will provide financing for \$954,503.65 in capital equipment.

REMARKS: The State Treasurer's Office issued an Invitation for Bids for financing on a consolidated basis \$954,503.65 in capital equipment; published it on *eMarylandMarketplace;* posted on the websites for the National Association of State Treasurers and the State Treasurer's Office; and emailed to 30 firms known to be active in financing municipal leases. This Lease-Purchase financing is expected to close no later than December 10, 2010. The bids were evaluated and were weighted based on the actual amounts to be financed and the rates for the respective lease terms of 3 years and 5 years.



REMARKS: (cont'd)

As described in Secretary's Agenda Item 14 (10/21/09), because of market volatility, the State Treasurer's Office determined to solicit new equipment lease financing bids every two months based on actual equipment lease financing needs, rather than utilize a long-term Master Lease. This Agenda Item represents the eighth such financing.

Following the December 2010 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase financing, the remaining balance of the \$100 million originally approved by the Legislative Policy Committee and the Board for equipment lease financing will be approximately \$75.7 million.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com* (eMM), posted on the Comptroller's Procurement Website, sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs, and listed in the Comptroller of Maryland's contract brochure that was distributed at various procurement and MBE outreach events throughout the year. Via eMM, 82 prospective bidders received the solicitation notice. The Comptroller of Maryland directly emailed the IFB to 43 prospective bidders. Of them, 37 are MBE certified and 28 are Maryland firms.

Only one bid was received in response to this solicitation, from the incumbent, ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc., (ACS). The recommended vendor is responsible, and its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Moreover, the price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation.

Vendors that replied to the Notice to Contractors form stated their reasons for not submitting a bid were as follows: other commitments precluded participation at this time; the subject of the contract is not something the contractor normally provides; bid/proposal requirements, other than specifications, are unreasonable or too risky; and inexperienced in the work/commodities required.

The Unclaimed Property Unit of the Comptroller of Maryland, Compliance Division, is responsible for the administration of the Maryland Uniform Disposition of Abandoned Property Act. The law is custodial in nature and requires that the Comptroller's office take possession of the property and attempt to locate the rightful owners. When all attempts fail in locating the owner of stock certificates, the Comptroller's Office moves forward with the sale of the unclaimed stocks.

ACS is the incumbent vendor so there is no transition period. ACS has the necessary licenses and resources to perform the contract. Services provided by ACS during the previous contract have been satisfactory to the program with courteous service being provided in a timely manner.

The Award Amount reflects the total estimated commission that ACS could receive, based upon the \$0.19 commission rate per share with an estimated 2,500,000 shares being sold for a total of \$475,000. This commission rate is 14% lower than the current rate of \$0.22 per share.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A Notice of the Availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com* (eMM) and *www.mta.maryland.gov*. The notice was sent to 330 prospective vendors via eMM and an additional 123 prospective vendors were sent the notice via a direct mail distribution. Of the 453 total prospective vendors notified, 84 are Maryland firms and 123 are certified minority and/or small businesses. A copy of the solicitation was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Three proposals were received in response to the RFP, however only two were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The proposal from KFH Group, Inc. (KFH) was deemed to be technically superior, and its financial proposal was the lower priced. KFH demonstrated an exceptional understanding of the unique needs and characteristics of non-profit organizations and rural and small urban transit providers. The KFH team is a strong transit oriented team with a background in research and best practices within this area of need. In addition, the offeror was determined to be responsible, and the financial offer was the lower offer received and considered fair and reasonable. Therefore, award is recommended to KFH with the overall ranking of #1. In addition, KFH is a MDOT certified MBE.

The rural areas have a population under 50,000 and the small urban areas have a population between 50,000 - 200,000. Some jurisdictions have an extensive fixed route service that operates on a regular route, while others offer demand response service that provides door-to-door transportation.

A task order will be issued to the consultant to establish and define the specific work products required for the task. The Consultant will be asked to submit technical and price responses for the given task (Transportation Development Planning, Transit Studies, State and Federal compliance, etc.). Based upon an evaluation of the consultant's response a task order may be issued to perform the specified work. The types of services and tasks to be provided under this contract will include transit development plans, triennial and compliance reviews, rural transit database reporting and staffing assistance.

In the event a task order(s) is issued but not completed prior to the expiration date of the contract, the contractor will continue with completion of the task order at no additional cost to the State. All terms, conditions and pricing shall remain the same and in full effect. The extension period may not exceed six months past the expiration date of the contract.

A 25.1% MBE participation goal was established for this contract, which is also part of the Federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) program. As part of DBE, a MBE prime contractor can include itself as a MBE subcontractor. Since KFH is a MDOT certified MBE, it has proposed to use itself for 75% of the MBE subcontracting goal and an additional 5% with other MBEs for a total of 80%.







REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplace.com* and posted on the DHMH websites. Notice of the solicitation was sent to 16 prospective vendors, three of which are Maryland firms, two are MBEs and Maryland firms, eight went to Quality Improvement Organizations in neighboring states and three to interested parties who previously requested information. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

A total of five proposals were received in response to the RFP. (This was three more responses than the last time these services were solicited.) Three of the responses were eliminated as not being reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Delmarva Foundation for Medical Care (Delmarva) was ranked higher technically and had a lower price than the other offeror. Therefore, Delmarva is recommended for award as having the more advantageous offer to the State with the overall ranking of #1.

This contract requires vendors to be a federally designated Quality Improvement Organization (QIO) or QIO-like entity, independent from the State Medicaid Agency and any provider that is potentially subject to audit. Additionally, this contract requires vendors to have a minimum of three years of experience in level of care determinations for long term care services and utilization control for both acute and long term care services.

This contract provides essential utilization control of selected hospital, long-term care and community services reimbursed by the Maryland Medicaid Program. The selected Utilization Control Agent (UCA) shall successfully deliver and be charged with the responsibility of conducting utilization control to ensure that: medical services are authorized only when medically necessary; medical services provided in a hospital on an inpatient basis are authorized only when such services cannot be effectively provided on an outpatient basis or more effectively and efficiently in a facility of a different type; medical services provided in a nursing facility, chronic hospital or in a community-based program are authorized only when an individual is appropriately determined to be medically eligible for those services; medical services provided to Medicaid recipients meet professionally recognized standards of quality; all


The Office of Health Services (OHS), a unit of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene of the State of Maryland, is charged with the task of meeting the statutory and regulatory requirements of the Federal Government for the performance of utilization control of selected hospital, long term care and community services reimbursed by the Maryland Medicaid Program.

A protest was received from the incumbent, KePRO, on 8/20/2010. DHMH denied the protest on 11/1/2010. The protest denial was not appealed before the 11/10/2010 appeal deadline, so the time for an appeal has now passed. Accordingly, DHMH requests approval for the award of the new contract.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryandMarketplace.com* (eMM) and the DHR web site. Via eMM, 1,644 potential Offerors were notified of the procurement opportunity, of which 338 are MBEs. Copies of the solicitation notice were directly mailed to five potential Offerors, of which two are Maryland firms and one is a MBE. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Three proposals were received in response to the RFP. As indicated in the Attachment, all of the proposals were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Award is being recommended to Policy Studies, Inc. (PSI), the incumbent. PSI was ranked overall #1 with the highest technical offer and the lowest price. A Request for Debriefing was received from the two unsuccessful offerors. Both debriefings were held on 10/22/2010, and no protests were received.

The purpose of this contract is to manage and operate the Baltimore City Office of Child Support Enforcement (BCOCSE) program. These services include locating parents, establishing paternity and support orders, enforcing support orders, and case reviews for possible modification of support orders.

This work includes operating a child support enforcement program in a large urban setting. As of September 30, 2009, a total of 89,531 cases being handled by BCOCSE, of which 68,766 were Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) customers and 20,765 were Non-TCA. This project is the largest of its kind in the nation and includes:

- Intake: Collecting information necessary to proceed with the provision of requested child support services (i.e., name, address, social security number and employment information);
- 2. Location:
 - Determining the physical whereabouts of the noncustodial parent for the purpose of establishing paternity and/or a support order, or enforcing a child support court order; and

 Determining the whereabouts of the custodial parent for disbursement of child support payments;

3. Establishment:

- a. Determining the legal parent of the child(ren) for whom child support is being requested; and
- Determining the monthly child support obligation amount due based on the child support guidelines;
- Enforcement: Compelling the noncustodial parent to comply with the child support order through the use of various enforcement measures (i.e. Driver's License Suspension, Profession License Suspension, Consumer Reporting, Tax Intercept, Lottery Intercept, Administrative Garnishment);
- Medical Support: Health insurance coverage for the child that is accessible and is at a reasonable cost, or cash medical support for the child's medical expenses when health insurance is not available;
- 6. Decentralized Collections: Baltimore City is responsible for submitting all payments received either through their office or during court proceedings to the Maryland State Disbursement Unit. All payment processing procedures and transmittal procedures are to be performed by staff at the Baltimore City Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE). This includes collections, receipting for customers, verification of payment amounts, deposit and transmittal preparation, and daily accounting tasks;
- 7. Review and Adjustment: Determining whether a child support order is appropriate when considering the current material circumstances of the parties involved and, when appropriate, adjusting the order. Adjustments made to child support orders include: an increase or decrease to the support order amount; and/or adding a health insurance, cash medical support or wage withholding clause; and
- 8. Case Maintenance: Updating the case information in the Child Support Enforcement System (CSES) to reflect any changes made over time to the court order, accounts or demographic information, and updating/correcting the coding of a child support case in the CSES, so that the court order of support is properly reflected in the accounts and demographic information.

This contract includes a 90-day transition period. The current contract expires on 2/28/2011. The State will need time to assume certain functions from the Contractor, namely the duties to be carried out by the Court Unit, the Undisbursed Collections Unit and the Investigation Unit. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to exercise the first of two one-year renewal options as contained in the original contract. MTA has been extremely pleased with the overall performance of the Contractor, Integrated Designs, Inc. (Integrated). Integrated is a woman-owned minority business that provides a quality service at fixed hourly rates and is responsive to the needs of the MTA. MTA is confident that Integrated will continue to perform the services provided by this contract with a continued high degree of professionalism.

Integrated has consistently exemplified a high level of professionalism and flexibility when executing and completing all work products and assignments issued by the MTA. This was especially true when the MTA Office of Marketing had limited personnel and resource options. For example, many of the initial tasks that were defined in the original scope of work required the use of MBE subcontractors who could perform writing, research, web design and meeting facilitation. However, in early 2008, the marketing and communications offices were combined into one department. This reorganization provided the marketing office with in-house personnel who had skill sets which then precluded the need for many of the services originally planned for assignment to the existing MBE subcontractors. At the same time, the agency began to focus on areas of communications and marketing, such as media production and purchasing (i.e. media buys), which had previously been underutilized.

The use of "media buys" is a distinct area of service that should not have been included in the original MBE subcontracting goal because there were no certified minority subcontractors to consider. In addition, since the award of this contract, media buys have been determined to be a "pass-through" expense and have not been part of the MBE goal determination of newer advertising and marketing contracts. However, Integrated still actively sought the services of additional MBE subcontractors to supplement the work which could not be assigned to the original MBE subcontractors due to the nature of the specific tasks.

ITEM: 5-S-OPTION (Cont.)

Integrated has continually recognized and responded to the evolving scope of media related marketing initiatives on behalf of the MTA. Recognizing Integrated's capabilities, the MTA has planned and reserved specific work assignments for the remainder of the base contract term and the renewal option year, if approved, which include developing new multimedia campaigns designed to educate, interest and garner support for public transit. The MTA also plans to redesign its website, launch additional public outreach events and host community forums which should more fully utilize the advertising and marketing services of the current MBE subcontractors.

MTA believes exercising the renewal is in the best interest of the State because, as stated above, Integrated's overall performance has been more than satisfactory to MTA. In addition, Integrated has agreed to a 5% reduction (approximately \$7,000) in the labor hour rates for this renewal option #1 by maintaining the current labor hour rates that were agreed upon for Year 3 of the base contract term.

The DHMH Office of Health Services (OHS) is charged with the task of contracting for medical case management services provided to medically fragile children and adults in the Rare and Expensive (REM) Case Management Program. The REM Program is part of Maryland's "HealthChoice" program, a comprehensive Medicaid managed care program operated by DHMH under the authority of Maryland Medicaid Section 1115 Health Care Reform Demonstration (No. 11–W–00099/3). 

The Maryland Pharmacy Program must comply with several of the provisions. To implement these provisions, a contract modification must be executed to enable the Maryland Pharmacy Point of Sale contractor to execute the necessary system and staffing changes. In addition, a second item is included in this modification that provides for an audit of the Maryland AIDS Drug Assistance Program as required by Maryland Legislative Auditors.

This Contract is to: (1) design, implement, administer, manage and maintain a Point of Sale (POS) electronic claims capturing, management and adjudication network in conjunction with administering a drug utilization review system to continue the State of Maryland's compliance with Federal requirements (Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act - OBRA 90); and (2) design and administer a recipient eligibility determination system for the Primary Adult Care Program.

As a result of Health Care Reform legislation, specifically the Affordable Care Act enacted on March 23, 2010, changes to the administration of the pharmacy point of sale contract are required. These changes relate primarily to the collection and reporting of drug manufacturer rebates. The legislation provides for extending rebates to covered outpatient drugs dispensed to Managed Care Organization (MCO)/HealthChoice enrollees; increased rebate percentages for covered outpatient drugs dispensed to Medicaid patients and the rebate offset associated with the increase in the rebate percentages.



ITEM: 7-S-MOD (Cont.)

Due to the intermittent release of implementation guidelines from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the above-referenced changes will be implemented in two phases. Phase I includes the invoicing and collecting of rebates from drug manufacturers for covered outpatient drugs dispensed to MCO/HealthChoice enrollees and is covered by this modification. Phase II will include the increase in rebate percentages and the rebate offset associated with the increase in the rebate percentages and will result in a future modification.

It is in the State's interest to proceed with this modification in lieu of a new procurement for these services. The contractor currently performs the tasks referenced in this modification. The current modification simply extends the coverage to all HealthChoice enrollees, whereas previously, collection of drug manufacturer rebates was applied to a limited number of HealthChoice enrollees.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to extend the current contract for eight months to continue to provide day care services at the Annapolis Child Care Center, Tawes Complex and the Community Place Child Care Center in Crownsville in order to allow time for DGS to complete the procurement for a new contract. DGS anticipates having a new contract award recommendation to the BPW by 7/27/2011.

Play and Learn Centers, Inc. has provided day care services as required under the contract for the State since 1991 in Crownsville and 2002 in Annapolis. DGS has not received a complaint or concern regarding any aspect of their performance. The vendor has provided several letters of compliments from parents expressing the love and care their children have received from Play and Learn. In several cases, the children were enrolled for several years and graduated to Kindergarten. The State Department of Education – Office of Child Care, which currently is responsible for Child Care Services, and the Department of Human Resources – Child Care Administration, which previously was responsible for Child Care Services, have performed yearly Child Care Center Inspections. The inspection reports for the last four years have shown the Centers to be in compliance with all operating requirements.

The Centers offer safe, high quality services that are affordable and convenient to State employees as well as to the general public. Children of State employees are given first priority to receive services under this contract. The Annapolis Center has space and equipment to accommodate 102 children and the Crownsville Center has space and equipment to accommodate 90 to 100 children from infant to school age.







REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:

Request for approval to increase the not-toexceed amounts to cover the inmate health care services contracts until the end of the contract terms, 12/31/2010. The new Request for Proposals (RFP) were issued in January 2010 with proposals received on 4/9/2010. The anticipated start date for the new contracts is 1/1/2011. In order to continue services until the new contracts are awarded, the not-to-exceed amounts for the current contracts need to be adjusted. The funding for the contracts has already been budgeted; however, the contracts contain not-to-exceed amounts and the BPW approval is needed to increase the authorized spending amounts.

Three of the new contracts were withdrawn from the 11/3/2010 DBM BPW Agenda (Items 3-S, 4-S and 5-S) to allow time for DPSCS to respond to protests on the Mental Health Services Contract (Item 3-S) and the Medical Health Services Contract (Item 4-S). DPSCS received three protests on these two contracts and anticipates having the responses completed and the new contract awards back on the 12/15/2010 DBM BPW Agenda.

It is important to note these contracts were designed to improve the level of care over the prior contracts in response to the U.S. Department of Justice standards and decrees to reach generally accepted community standards and to provide for continuity and consistency of care in all DPSCS facilities. The level of care has consistently progressed to community standards and is meeting the requirements of the contract.

- A. Comprehensive primary and infirmary medical services
- B. Primary psychiatric care and mental health infirmary care services
- C. Dental services
- D. Pharmacy Services
- E. Utilization management services for inpatient hospital and infirmary care
- F. Electronic patient health record and tele-medical system to support and track health care services for inmates.

REMARKS: Public Safety's Division of Parole and Probation first assigned offenders to GPS monitoring in January 2009. Monitoring is defined as a method for sending and receiving status information between a remote monitoring center and an individual. The service includes tracking the electronic monitoring by satellite.

GPS tracking is used to supervise high-risk violent and sexual offenders to monitor their movements and activities in the community and restrict access to victims. GPS is an important tool in the risk reduction and containment strategy for the supervision of high-risk offenders. The majority of sexual and violent offenders are assigned to caseloads – usually with a lower offender-to-agent ratio than a general caseload – supervised by specially trained agents. Agents may coordinate with treatment providers and law enforcement to develop and implement appropriate case management plans of which GPS tracking is a part.

Since the agreement was implemented, Pro Tech Monitoring, Inc. has: provided training for agents and management staff, including refresher training as needed; provided user-friendly software and timely management reports; responded to technical questions and issues that are a part of any new initiative; and worked with the Division to address operational concerns as they arise. The pricing provided through the Western State Contracting Alliance cooperative purchasing agreements provides competitive pricing to participants in the agreements. Pro Tech Monitoring, Inc. has experience tracking over 100,000 offenders and has continually improved and stabilized its system in order to meet the constantly evolving demands of specialized and focused supervision. The company has consistently provided excellent service throughout the contract and DPSCS/ITCS recommends that the contract be renewed for another six month term.

REMARKS: DoIT and other State agencies use a variety of Information Builders, Inc. products as an integral part of the operations of FMIS (eight software products). IBI provides FOCUS, the primary enterprise software used by DBM and other State agencies. FOCUS is a proprietary programming language and has been the standard IBI software used to create ad-hoc reports against FMIS accounting and procurement data for the past eight years. This contract includes maintenance, training, and support for internal operations on FMIS or other agency financials.

The FOCUS proprietary software is a major source of information used by agencies Statewide to provide information for StateStat. This software provides data and reports on performancemeasurement and management tools to make the government more accountable and more efficient. Based on the continuing demand and forecasted usage by state agencies, DoIT is requesting this increase.

Reference is made to the Board's approval of an option year in the amount of \$700,000 to begin May 19, 2010. (DoIT Item 5-IT-Opt.) DoIT's recommendation of that amount – though based on annual spending history – underestimated the amount needed by approximately \$3,000,000. DOIT has been reviewing master contracts to ensure that ADPICS controls are set to avoid purchase orders against master contracts from exceeding the contract ceiling. Review of the IBI contract revealed that the ADPIC controls were not set appropriately which had allowed \$1,900.000 in purchase orders to be processed over the contract ceiling. Once this error was discovered, DoIT halted all new purchase orders submitted against this contract. DoIT further found that for the past several years, agencies have spent roughly \$1,500,000 to \$2,000,000 per year on this contract. Therefore, in addition to the \$1,900,000 needed to cover purchase orders processed in error, an additional \$1,1000,00 is needed to allow purchase orders on hold to be processed and provides enough of a ceiling for additional spending planned for the remainder of FY 2011. Agency funds are used to pay for these requirements and are included in annual agency budgets.

REMARKS: The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) Police Monitoring Facility (PMF) is being relocated to 4601 Mount Hope Drive, Baltimore, Maryland because the MTA is required to vacate the current PMF at 1600 Wabash Avenue so a new Federal office complex can be constructed. The Board of Public Works has previously approved the lease of the new facility to house the MTA Transit Police Northern District and the PMF (Approved August 11, 2010, Item 16-LT).

As part of its efforts ensure safe and secure transit system for MTA customers and the general public, the MTA has installed cameras at key Metro, Light Rail, and MARC stations as well as other transit facilities using federal funding. The PMF requires significant wiring, temperature control, and access limits because of its highly technical and specialized capabilities. The PMF is staffed by trained operators and supervisors, under the control of the MTA Transit Police.

Due to safety and security nature and functions of the PMF, the relocation will require operating parallel systems during the move to ensure no down-time in monitoring the security of MTA transit facilities and to minimize any issues with connectivity that may arise at the new facility. ARINC installed the original proprietary software and it is the only entity that can move and install the system at the new facility.

Twenty-three (23) IFB specifications were sold with only one (1) sealed bid received.

One firm specifically stated the reasons for not bidding were: 1) bonding requirements were extremely high; 2) the DBE/Community Service Provider (Maintenance) Component; 3) the Agreement and IFB response requirements; 4) the financial structure created undo risk. A second firm stated the financial guarantee requirement was unreasonable. A third firm's reason was the future snowfall difficult to estimate and price job.


The Awardee is a Maryland limited partnership organized under the laws of the State of Maryland in 1996.

Tyroc Parking Management, LLC, formerly Tyroc Construction, LLC (Tyroc) is a District of Columbia corporation and an Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) certified by MDOT. Tyroc will participate by generating at least twenty-five percent (25%) in the concession gross revenues by having sole and complete responsibility to operate the Daily Garage at BWI Marshall.

THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE

DESCRIPTION: In accordance with provisions of the Transportation Article, Section 2-103(h), Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board of Public Works approval is requested for:

1. A Lease of a 928-space parking garage between the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) and the Maryland Economic Development Corporation (MEDCO);

2. A Shared Parking Agreement between MDOT and State Center LLC that governs the use of the garage. The parking garage that MEDCO will develop and then lease to MDOT is essential for both meeting Phase 1 parking requirements, and freeing up other parcels in State Center so that they can be redeveloped in future phases; and

3. An Insurance Agreement that requires MDOT to fund appropriate insurance coverage carried by MEDCO on the State Center Phase I Parking Garage beginning after the completion of the garage construction. MDOT may elect to use the self-insurance coverage available to it under State law and fund only those coverages not provided for by self-insurance.

PROPERTY LOCATION: 900 North Eutaw Street Baltimore, MD 21201

BACKGROUND: The Board of Public Works, (BPW) on June 3, 2009, BPW Item 6-RP, approved a Master Development Agreement ("MDA") on behalf of the Department of General Services ("DGS") with acknowledgement by the Maryland Department of Transportation ("MDOT"), Department of the Military ("MD") and Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation ("DLLR"), to grant development rights over the 21.8 ± acre parcel in the City of Baltimore known as State Center to State Center, LCC, a limited liability corporation ("Developer").

The MDA was fully executed by all parties, and the BPW, and became effective June 15, 2009. Following approval of the MDA, and the development of the Preliminary Development Plan ("PDP") of the Approved Concept Plan, the parties determined that the demand for parking at and in the vicinity of the first phase of the redevelopment project – the contemplated complex of governmental and private office, residential, and retail buildings on Parcel G, Parcel I and future phases at State Center require the construction of a parking garage for governmental and private use.

To facilitate the parking garage DGS and MDOT entered into a Garage Ground Lease approved by the BPW on July 28, 2010 to provide for the development and construction of a 900-1,000 spaces garage and all appurtenant garage and project improvement for its operation for the use of employees and officials of the State and the general public by MDOT.

BACKGROUND: (cont'd) MEDCO will on behalf of the State and the Project, finance, construct, operate, repair and maintain the Garage, or to secure some or all of the foregoing services from one or more third parties, for the term of this Garage Ground Lease. The Garage and the First Phase will remain contingent upon the Developer obtaining financing for the First Phase of redevelopment. The State will have no liability to Developer for failure to start or complete the Garage. If Developer fails to commence construction of improvements after the Garage is complete, the State may remove Developer from the Project and find a replacement Developer. MDOT and Developer will negotiate a shared use operating agreement for the completed Garage that shall include State access to no less than 550 spaces.

NATURE OF REQUEST: This Lease from MEDCO grants to MDOT a leasehold interest in an underground parking garage in Baltimore City, Maryland. The Shared Parking Use Agreement governs the use of the garage.

The granting of this leasehold interest is in connection with MEDCO's issuance of its Lease Revenue Bonds Series 2010 (MDOT State Center Garage) in an amount not to exceed \$35 million. The Bonds will finance the construction of a garage under Parcel G office use of the State Center project.

The garage, when completed, will consist of three levels of underground parking with at least 928 spaces.

AMOUNT: MDOT is required to pay base rentals semi-annually equal to the amount of principal of and interest on MEDCO's bonds as the same become due. The lease payments are not determined until the bonds are sold. Bonds of approximately \$33 million are expected to be sold. MDOT will pay all taxes, fees or charges, if any, which may be imposed upon the leasehold premises. In addition, MDOT is required to pay subsidies for operating expenses of the garage.

TERM: The term is twenty-two years commencing on the date of closing for the MEDCO bonds. MDOT will become the owner of the garage at the termination of the lease.

USE OF THE FACILITY: As long as the State is a tenant in the "Parcel G" first office tower, it will be guaranteed the lease of 550 parking spaces. The balance of the garage will be used for other public purposes such as office and retail parking. State Center LLC reserves the right to dedicate parking spaces to Parcel G residential units out of the balance of spaces.

The State will have 24-hour access to 50 spaces to accommodate State vehicles. The State will share its use of the 500 remaining spaces with the general public after core working hours (i.e., 7:00 PM). Should the State ever permanently vacate the Parcel G office tower, the State would continue to have rights to 250-spaces unless State Center LLC elects to supply convenient replacement parking or purchases the spaces for Fair Market Value.



REMARKS

This contract is for the purchase only of roofing shingles for the Hessian Barracks which serves as the Maryland School for the Deaf Museum on the Frederick Campus. Since the Barracks is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Maryland Historical Trust has determined that it is of paramount importance that the shingles be replaced with historically accurate replicas of the original material. Therefore, the shingles must be hand split and hand finished red oak. The contractor is an historic preservation specialist capable of producing the required shingles. Agreement of Sale on behalf of Program Open Space to purchase a 322.582± acre parcel located in the southwestern corner of Wicomico County, near the mouth of the Wicomico River, and contiguous with Ellis Bay Wildlife Management Area. The property consists of 15 parcels of land that include a mosaic of maturing upland and wetland forest. The forested bottomlands of the Wicomico River support numerous species including the Delmarva fox squirrel, and bald eagle and serve as important stopover and nesting habitats for neotropical migrants, waterfowl and shorebirds,

The property lies in close proximity and provides buffer to Tangier Sound. Tangier Sound supports a large variety of waterfowl and is especially important to the American Black Duck, one of the few waterfowl species that nest in Maryland. This area also supports some of the largest concentrations of Heron, Egret and Ibis in Maryland, with very high numbers of these nesters in the area. The large expanses of tidal emergent wetlands from the mouth of the Wicomico to Tangier Sound also support American Oyster Catcher, Black Skimmer, and Black Rail, uncommon residents of the Maryland portion of the Chesapeake Bay.

Acquisition of this property will provide buffer to these wetland complexes, as well as providing and expand hunting and outdoor recreational opportunities to Ellis Bay Wildlife Management Area. 

The State Animal Health Laboratory was part of a group of laboratories run by University of Maryland throughout the State (Oakland, Hagerstown, Bel Air, College Park, Frederick, Centreville, Baltimore City and Salisbury). All but 5 of the labs were closed. The Frederick lab is centrally located. Clients come from the surrounding counties (Montgomery, Washington, Carroll and Howard). The State of Maryland participated in the cost of construction of the Frederick laboratory by contributing 50 % of the A/E and construction cost of \$1,298,097.50. The State of Maryland paid for its contribution through this lease by paying \$3,200.00 per month over 15 years of the lease term. The payments continue based on cost of Operation and Maintenance of the building. The amounts to be paid will be credited against actual O&M costs.







BACKGROUND

The State Center Master Development Agreement ("MDA"), as amended, called for the phased redevelopment of the State Center complex which consists of approximate 21.8 +/- acres of property located in the City of Baltimore, Maryland ("State Center").

Following approval of the MDA, the parties commenced preparation and negotiation of the first phase of redevelopment of the Project ("First Phase") which was determined to be Parcel G and Parcel I-2 as those parcels are identified in Approved Concept Plan of the MDA. On July 28, 2010 the BPW approved the First Phase of redevelopment and ground leased Parcel G and I-2 to the Developer ("Ground Leases"). The Ground Leases could be split into several separate Ground Leases in order to allow for the various development activities and uses planned for the site ("Components"). The BPW also approved the ground lease of the subsurface area of Parcel G from DGS to MDOT ("Garage Ground Lease") in order for MDOT to finance and cause the construction of a State garage ("Garage"). The BPW also approved leased space in Developer's to-be-completed buildings on both Parcel G and I-2 for the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene ("DHMH"), Department of Planning ("MDP"), and Maryland Transit Authority ("MTA")(collectively "Occupancy Leases").

The Ground Leases called for the granting of cross easements for ingress, egress, and operations of the contemplated improvements on each Component (and the Garage on Parcel G), to be granted by and amongst the various entities with an interest in those to-be-completed improvements ("Reciprocal Easement and Operating Agreement", and, "REOA".)

2. The REOA grants the parties easements for traffic, pedestrian access to common areas, construction and support, utility and service lines, the right to perform restoration, maintenance and management of common areas, and site construction activities.

3. The easements shall benefit and burden each Component and parcel G and I-2 until all Component (or Garage) leases have terminated on the respective parcel. The easements will automatically terminated when all appurtenant leases are terminated.

4. The REOA calls for the establishment of a Common Area Maintenance ("CAM") Agreement to set forth the common area expense allocations for the private owners. 5. The REOA sets out certain minimum maintenance and operation, insurance, and damage/destruction repair for parcels that are subject to the easements.

6. The REOA anticipates amendment to its terms as future phases of development occur and additional uses are added.

7. The State is indemnified for activities exercised by the Developer or its affiliates under any easement granted by the REOA.

The lease is a triple net lease with a base rental rate of \$25.85 per net usable square foot. The annual rent is subject to an increase equal to 15% every five years resulting in the average annual base rent of \$322,725 over the 20 year term.

History

On July 28, 2010, as Item 12-LT on the Department of General Services Action Agenda, the Board of Public Works approved three (3) leases for two (2) buildings to be constructed in the State Center Redevelopment Project.

In addition to technical clarifications within the lease, the Board of Public Works is now requested to approve the following modifications to this lease:

1. The Department of General Services General Performance Standards and Specifications for the State of Maryland Leased Facilities over 5,000 net usable square feet have been modified to be the equivalent to rentable square feet as defined, calculated, measured, and/or verified in accordance with ANSI/BOMA Z65.1-1996 Standard Method for Measuring Floor Areas in Office Buildings. In addition, the sections on building design, mechanical systems, energy management, heating, cooling and ventilation and lighting have been modified to reflect the desire for LEED rating system certification and to achieve compliance with energy goals.


The demised premises have been increased from 375,000 net usable square feet to 2. 380,000 net usable square footage to accommodate a 5,000 square foot conference facility increasing the annual rent by \$129,250 for the first five (5) years; subject to 15% increase every 5 years. The estimated annual expenses payment and management fee will also increase proportionately to the square foot increase.

3. The commencement date has been modified from January 1, 2014 to October 1, 2013.

4. Exhibit 6, Section 16 – Lessee's Expenses is modified to reflect that the Tenant shall share in any and all credits, offsets and deductions, including but not limited to Payments in Lieu of Taxes Agreements, Enterprise Zone Tax Credits, Brownfield Property Tax Credits and any other similar or related credits, offsets or deductions.
