Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve:

- (1) The Maryland State Department of Education and the Western Maryland regional resource center entering into a Memorandum of Understanding that provides for MSDE to fund, and the Western Maryland regional resource center to supervise, Washington County's renovation of the Western Maryland Regional Library in Hagerstown; and
- (2) Encumbering general obligation bond proceeds (MCCBL 2010) in the amount of \$2,500,000 for this project.

Background: The State library network comprises 24 public library systems, the State Library Resource Center, and three regional resource centers (one of the latter three being the Western Maryland Regional Library). Regional resource centers furnish books, information, and other material and service resources that individual member libraries cannot adequately provide. The Western Maryland Regional Library – serving the Allegany, Garrett, and Washington county libraries – shares a facility with the Washington County Free Library in Hagerstown.

The Western Maryland Regional Library, built over 40 years ago, is unable to meet the burgeoning population's demands and needs major repairs to address code-related programmatic and physical deficiencies. Through the Maryland Capital Consolidated Loan Acts, the State has agreed to fund a project to renovate and expand this regional resource center from 2,908 to 5,946 gross square feet. The total project cost is \$10,000,000. Reference is made to Secretary's Agenda Item 6 (6/17/09) in which the Board encumbered \$5,000,000 of MCCBL 2009 funds for this project. The 2010 MCCBL appropriates another \$2,500,000 (this Item); the remaining \$2,500,000 will be requested in the 2011 MCCBL.

The Department of General Services has determined that it cannot serve as the construction manager for this project. Because the Western Maryland Regional Library is located in the Central Library of Washington County Free Library, MSDE, the Western Maryland Regional Library, and Washington County are combining the State work with other projects for the Central Library. Washington County will competitively bid and award the combined project. Washington County will manage the contract to ensure

This is consistent with the enabling statute for regional resource centers that authorizes counties, in coalitions of three or more, to request MSDE to establish a regional resource center that one county will be designated to administer. See Section 23-202, Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

Project Description: The project involves planning, design and construction of the Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) facilities at the existing 8.0 million gallons per day (mgd) Cambridge Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to achieve effluent concentration goals of 3 mg/l for Total Nitrogen (TN) and 0.3 mg/l for Total Phosphorous (TP).



13. STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM:

Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program - Fiscal Year 2011

Recommendation: The Interagency Committee on School Construction recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the State School Construction Program for the Fiscal Year 2011. The Interagency Committee is recommending a total Statewide program in the amount of \$263.7 million.

The proposed \$263.7 million program comprises:

- Approximately \$187.5 million previously approved by the Board of Public Works (Secretary's Agenda Item 1, Jan. 20. 2010); and
- Additional recommendations for specific projects in the approximate amount of \$76.2 million.

The recommended FY 2011 Capital Improvement Program will be funded by \$250 million from a proposed new bond authorization and \$13.7 million in reverted funds from the Statewide Contingency Account.

Background: The Interagency Committee has considered each local school system's capital improvement school construction program request submitted for Fiscal Year 2011. After evaluation including discussion among local representatives and Interagency Committee staff, the Interagency Committee recommends the Fiscal Year 2011 Program to the Board of Public Works. The program reflects local priorities, while recognizing projects that address the mandates of the Bridge to Excellence in Education Act, urgent major projects that require a high level of State commitment to move forward, the high school science classroom initiative, and the highest priority systemic renovation projects. The program also includes planning approval for a number of major projects and for projects that will address Bridge to Excellence requirements for full-day kindergarten and for pre-kindergarten for disadvantaged four-year olds. Planning approvals have been recommended in accordance with the *Regulations for the Administration of the Public School Construction Program*.

14. <u>STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM</u> Aging Schools Program

Recommendation: The Interagency Committee on School Construction recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the following allocations for each school system for the Aging School Program for Fiscal Year 2011. FY 2011 funding for the Program is \$6,065,327.

Background: The Aging Schools Program, administered by the Interagency Committee, funds capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance of existing school buildings. The allocations are based on the school district's proportion of pre-1970s building area that has not been renovated. For FY 2011, each LEA's funding level is equal to the LEA's proportional share of the FY 2010 funding level of \$6,108,986.

The recommended allocations for each school system are consistent with the allocations approved in the FY 2011 budget with two exceptions. For FY 2011, the General Assembly stipulated that \$1,000,000 of the total FY 2011 allocation of Qualified Zone Academy Bond program funds is to be applied to the Aging Schools Program. The QZAB funds were initially apportioned according to the standard methodology for QZAB distributions, which takes into account both the school district's proportion of pre-1970s building area that has not been renovated and the district's proportion of students in the Free and Reduced Price Meal program. Four school districts in Maryland have no schools that qualify for QZAB funds.

Based on past history showing that not all systems that are eligible for QZAB funds have submitted applications, the school systems eligible for FY 2011 QZABs were asked if they intended to use the QZAB portion of their total Aging Schools Program allocation. Because Harford County Public Schools and Somerset County Public Schools indicated that they will not participate in the QZAB portion of the funding, this portion has been deducted from the total statutory amount allocated to each of these LEAs. This results in a reduction of \$43,673 in the total allocation of the ASP/QZAB funds. These funds have been re-distributed within the separate QZAB program (Companion Item 15 on today's Agenda.)

Background: The Qualified Zone Academy Bond Program, administered by the Interagency Committee, funds capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance of existing school buildings. The program has been extended as part of the federal Tax Extenders and Alternative Minimum Tax Relief Act of 2008 (Public Law 110-343).



17. <u>STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM</u> Amendment to the FY 2010 Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program Kent County

Recommendation: The Interagency Committee on School Construction recommends that the Board of Public Works approve an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2010 Capital Improvement Program. The amendment will: (1) rescind funding in the amount of \$388,000 for two systemic renovation projects in Kent County; and (2) transfer the funds to the Statewide Contingency Account for use in the FY 2011 Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program.

Funds for a project approved in the FY 2010 CIP revert to the Statewide contingency account if the project is not encumbered, that is, if it is not approved for contract award by a local board by May 31, 2011. See also COMAR 23.03.02.03E (After Board "approval of the final State capital improvement program, the program may be revised only upon . . . approval by the Board of Public Works").

Specific Request: In the FY 2010 CIP, the Board of Public Works approved funding for Kent County Public Schools in the amount of \$191,000 for the Garnett Elementary School PSC #14.006.10C and \$197,000 for the Chestertown Middle School PSC #14.003.10C systemic renovation elevator projects. The Kent County Commissioners have stated in writing that local funding support for these projects will not be provided in the FY 2010 or FY 2011 capital budgets. Without local funding support, these projects cannot be under contract by May 31, 2011. Rather than wait for the automatic cancellation of the FY 2010 funding on May 31, 2011, the Interagency Committee recommends that these funds be put to current use in the FY 2011 CIP by transferring them to the Statewide Contingency Account.

REMARKS: The State of Maryland transferred ownership of the Lillie Carroll Jackson Museum to Morgan State University in 1996. The Museum is located in Baltimore's Bolton Hill at 1320 Eutaw Place. Lillie Carroll Jackson, a Baltimore native and Baltimore-branch NAACP president, was known as the "Mother of Freedom" because of her legal actions opening classrooms to those who had been denied admittance on the basis of race. The building was constructed in the 1890's and is on the National Register of Historic Places. The University intends to create a functional, maintainable, safe and historically restored museum to serve the public for decades.

Seven firms were pre-qualified and were invited to submit bids. Only five firms submitted bids. Commercial Interiors provided the lowest bid. No alternates were selected and no allowances were identified in the contract amount.

The MBE goal for this project is 30% and the contractor plans to meet the MBE goal. Commercial Interiors, Inc. is also a MBE firm. The value of the MBE subcontracts is \$418,245. Commercial intends on hiring approximately 10-15 trade contractors with all but 1 or 2 from Maryland. Commercial Interiors anticipates an average of 10-15 persons on site throughout the project, with the majority of them from Maryland.

The Morgan State University Department of Design and Construction Management will manage this contract with procurement support provided by the University's Department of Procurement and Property Control.

Reference is made to DGS Item 1-EP (4/18/07) in which the Board of Public Works approved the award of Indefinite Delivery Contracts to Energy Service Companies to provide energy audit, engineering, construction, financing, and maintenance services to develop and implement comprehensive energy efficiency and guaranteed savings programs at State facilities on an asneeded basis. These agreements are available for use by all State agencies.

Using the process DGS set forth, DPSCS awarded a Phase I task order to NORESCO, one of the IDC contractors. NORESCO developed a comprehensive energy efficiency and guaranteed savings program to assist DPSCS to reduce energy consumption through installing capital equipment and implementing maintenance services. A detailed engineering study was completed, including specific recommendations, equipment layouts, preliminary specifications, construction cost, yearly maintenance costs, and guaranteed energy and energy related savings.

DPSCS found NORESCO's plan acceptable; therefore, DPSCS is recommending awarding the Phase II work to implement the Phase I plan to NORESCO. Phase II requires the vendor to furnish detailed engineering, design, construction, start-up, training, maintenance services, measurement and verification of energy consumption and guaranteed energy savings for the approved program.

DPSCS, in coordination with DGS, negotiated final capital and maintenance costs which costs represent fair market value for these services. Project costs will be funded through guaranteed energy-related-costs and DPSCS Funds.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The Sole Source procurement was deemed appropriate for these services under COMAR 21.14.01.06C in order to provide continuity of care. The Program, which was established by the General Assembly in 1976, provides support to services to seniors who, as a result of chronic health conditions or age-related disabilities, depend on others for daily help with routine activities. The Maryland Department of Aging (MDOA) contracts with private management companies, housing authorities, and non-profit organizations to provide Congregate Housing Services (CHS) to eligible elderly residents of senior housing apartment buildings certified by the Department to provide such services. Standard services are traditional fixed services that are provided to all eligible elderly residents regardless of the specific need; whereas, Individualized services are customized and tailored to the specific needs of the eligible elderly resident.

MDOA's Congregate Housing Services Program (CHSP) promotes independent living in senior housing by providing a package of services consisting of meals, housekeeping, personal assistance and service management to residents who are 62 years of age and older and who require temporary or periodic assistance with daily living activities.

CHSP provides a State subsidy to low-income seniors who lack sufficient resources to pay for the full cost of the service. The amount of the subsidy depends upon the actual income of each client in the congregate housing program. Under a sliding scale arrangement, clients pay a specified portion of their monthly income directly to the congregate housing Contractors. The Department then pays the Contractors the difference between the amount each client pays and the maximum contract amount.

Due to the nature and scope of services provided by the CHSP, the availability of services must be ensured for recipients who, without these services, may be at risk of relocating to a nursing home or other health-related institution in order to receive needed services.

Because these contracts are for State subsidies, there are no subcontracting opportunities; thus there is no MBE participation goal.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: On 3/4/2010, the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace.com*. The Department sent the notification directly to 87 vendors, of which 76 are Maryland firms, 52 are MBE firms and five are small businesses. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs (GOMA).

There were four responses to the RFP. Two of the responses were eliminated, due to not being technically capable of providing the required services. Of the remaining two offerors, Administrative Services, Inc. (ASI) is recommended for award as providing the best value to the State with its overall higher ranking. ASI was ranked number one technically and had a lower price.

This contract provides essential fiscal intermediary services for two classes of healthcare providers through multiple programs operated by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in the Office of Health Services (OHS). These programs provide personal care services to vulnerable, disabled adults in Maryland. Ultimately, the provision of these services decreases ongoing Medicaid costs by reducing or preventing institutional care. The first class of healthcare providers is the Living At Home (LAH) Waiver non-agency attendant care providers. LAH Waiver consumer attendant care providers are considered to be employees of the participant they service. They require full W-2 federal and state income tax service, including employee and employer withholding taxes, Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA) and State Unemployment Tax Act (SUTA) payment, as well as Workers' Compensation insurance coverage and related remittances and reporting.

The second class of health care providers is the independent contractor, hereinafter called the "self-employed" independent personal care providers of the Medical Assistance Personal Care Services Program (MAPCSP) and the Home- and Community-Based Services Waiver for Older Adults (WOA) Program. MAPCSP and WOA providers are self-employed independent contractors and, by the authority of Health-General, Article, §15-132.1, Ann. Code of Md., the Department is required to "...provide voluntary withholding of federal income taxes under the

Internal Revenue Code and State Income Taxes under Title 10 of the Tax – General Article for Self-Employed Providers" (including state income tax withholding in accordance with interstate income tax reciprocity agreements with MD/DC/PA/VA/WV). The terms independent contractor and self-employed are interchangeable in meeting Federal income and State income taxpayer standards, as well as DHMH programmatic standards. The MAPCSP and WOA providers, therefore, require federal and state voluntary estimated tax withholdings.

The third function of the fiscal intermediary contractor will be to complete voluntary withholding and payment of organizational dues on behalf of the non-agency healthcare providers in the Living at Home Waiver Program and the independent, self-employed providers working through the Medical Assistance Personal Care Services Program and the Waiver for Older Adults.

A 10% MBE Participation goal was established for this contract based upon the limited ability to subcontract core services; therefore ancillary services, such as production of the customer satisfaction survey and outreach or office supply purchases, will be subcontracted.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A Request for Proposals (RFP) was published on *eMarylandMarketplace.com*. This notice reached 2,451 vendors. Of these, 1,593 are Maryland businesses, and 515 are Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs). In addition, the notice was published on the MDE website, and a copy was provided to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

The solicitation was divided into eleven Functional Areas. Offerors were permitted to submit proposals in one or more Functional Area. The Functional Areas (FA) are as follows:

Eighteen Offerors submitted responses to the RFP. One offeror was rejected for not submitting proper documentation, leaving 17 Offerors representing 29 offers to the 11 Functional Areas. Of these 17, five Offerors (representing nine offers) were determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Offerors submitted proposals for one or more Functional Area. Awards are recommended to all remaining technically qualified offerors, according to Functional Area (See Attachment 2) as follows:

For Functional Area 1, three Offerors submitted proposals to four different tasks with no overlap. (No proposals were received for two of the tasks.) All technical offers were acceptable, and the Offerors were determined to be responsible. The financial offers were considered fair and reasonable; therefore, award is recommended to all three Offerors: BAE Urban Economics, Inc., Liberty Environmental, Inc. and Meszler Engineering Services.

For Functional Areas 3, one offer was received for one of the tasks – Instrumentation Audit, and two offers received for a second task – Economic Modeling and Forecasting. (No proposals were received for the remaining task – AQI Forecasting.) For task one, the single technical offer was deemed to be acceptable, and the Offeror was determined to be responsible. The financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential Offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Award is therefore recommended to Liberty Environmental, Inc. For the second task, award is recommended to both Offerors. The second ranked technical Offeror had the lower price by \$15.00/hour. Based upon the RFP, the right of first refusal will be given to the Offeror with the lowest price, so even though BAE Urban Economics, Inc. is #2 technically, its overall ranking is #1 with the lower price. Meszler Engineering Services will be given work after the #1 overall ranked Offeror.

For Functional Areas 4, only one offer was received. The single technical offer was deemed to be acceptable, and the Offeror was determined to be responsible. The financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential Offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Award is therefore recommended to Chesapeake Environmental Management, Inc.

For Functional Areas 6 and 7, three proposals were received for Accounting Services (FA 6), and four proposals were received for Financial Accounting Services (FA 7). However, for FA 7 one Offeror was rejected on technical grounds, leaving three Offerors for Financial Accounting Services. The qualified Offerors were ranked technically and financially for each Functional Area. Award is recommended to all four Offerors (CLM Consultants, Daniel Eke & Associates, PC, W.P. Tax & Accounting Group and Rufus Ingram) representing the six separate offers. The highest ranked technical Offerors for each FA also had the lowest price for each FA and are therefore given the right of first refusal for accepting work under this contract for each Functional Area. The second ranked technical Offerors had the second lowest prices and will be given the opportunity for work under this contract if the #1 Offerors turn down an assignment. The third ranked technical Offeror with the highest price will be given the last opportunity to receive work under this contract after Offerors #1 and #2 for each Functional Area.

For Functional Areas 8 and 9, only one acceptable offer was received for each area. Functional Area 8 received seven offers, and six Offerors were rejected on technical grounds. Functional Area 9 received two offers, and one Offeror was rejected on technical grounds. Each of these single technically qualified Offerors was determined to be responsible; and the financial offers were considered fair and reasonable. Award is therefore recommended to each of these Offerors: PRM Consulting Group and Daniel Eke & Associates, PC.

For Functional Area 10, two proposals were received and evaluated. Award is recommended to both Offerors. The higher ranked technical Offeror, Kogan, LLC, was also lower in price and was ranked #1 overall. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The contract establishes a firm-fixed percentage of total net sales that is paid to the contractor for operation of the Gaming System, and a firm fixed unit price per retailer location that is paid to the contractor for operation of the satellite telecommunications network.

The Lottery reviewed the contract, surveyed the market and met with the Contractor to assess whether it would be more advantageous to exercise the renewal option or solicit a new contract. The Lottery determined that it is in the best interest of the State to exercise the renewal option. A survey of the market indicates that comparable services would most likely cost more if a new procurement was done at this time. The Renewal Option is being exercised now to allow time for technical enhancements to be accomplished and be fully operational prior to the start of the renewal period, as required in the contract.

The Contract base rate for operation of the system, which is among the lowest rates in the country for similar lottery operations, will continue during the renewal period. The fee for operation of the satellite network is also very favorable. The Contractor shall upgrade the entire inventory of Lottery Retailer terminals to the latest technology.

In addition to the favorable price structure contained in the Renewal Option, the Contractor will provide the following three value-added technical enhancements:

- The Lottery In Motion™ Point-of-Sale Digital Advertising system at Retailer locations;
- (2) A Retailer Sales Improvement Program; and
- (3) Replacement of existing tablet-type laptop computers with new computers for the Cole Systems' OrderPad EnterpriseTM system, which is an essential part of Retailer Management for all of the Lottery Sales Representatives and sales management staff. This system provides mobile capability for the automated tracking of sales, inventory, and management functions at each location, as well as the capability to print reports and point-of-sale advertising material, as needed.

Plus, the Contractor will provide as an available option the Lottery In-Site™ on demand business reporting software, which is an executive information system that provides a real-time portal into the transaction engines and data warehouse of the Lottery's On-Line Gaming central computer system and provides tools in a graphical screen environment. If Lottery utilizes this option, the Contractor would be compensated based on a percentage of sales.

The Lottery will reduce the required total number of Player Activated Terminals (PATs) that were to be provided under the Contract from 2,000 to 500. PATs look similar to the Instant Ticket Vending Machines (ITVMs), but have a video screen display terminal that is operated by a player with no need for assistance from a Retailer. Players have to use the video touch screen to search for the tickets they want to purchase. PATs sell both on-line games (pick-3, pick-4, etc.) and Instant Tickets. These are different from the ITVMs that sell only Instant Tickets from windows that display the actual tickets, like a soda or candy machine. The Lottery has about 450 PATs in the field. Players don't seem to use the PATs; they either use the ITVMs or just go to the Retail counter and buy tickets from the Retailer in the store.

If the Lottery were to purchase the three value-added technical enhancements separately, it would cost approximately \$12.9 million for the five-year period. With the off-set savings of the elimination of 1,500 PATs, which is approximately \$9.2 million, the net value of these three enhancements is approximately \$3.7 million for the five-year renewal option period. Above and beyond the cost savings to the Lottery, it is anticipated that these enhancements will contribute significantly to increase sales and revenue, which are estimated to be approximately \$45.5 million for the five-year period.

The Contractor has provided satisfactory service during the base Contract term and the quality of services provided is believed to be a significant contributor to the increase in both on-line and instant ticket sales and revenue.

This is the only Renewal Option available on this Contract and the Lottery anticipates that it will have a continuing need for these services. A solicitation for a replacement On-Line Gaming System contract will be issued in the first quarter of 2015 in order to allow sufficient time for the necessary conversion period of approximately nine months.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to exercise the third and final one-year renewal option as contained in the original contract. This renewal option is recommended because Policy Studies, Inc. (PSI) has successfully maintained and exceeded their contractual obligation with the State of Maryland. The enrollment broker, PSI, has consistently provided superior customer service to the over 690,000 citizens of Maryland who currently receive health care services through their Medicaid coverage.

This HealthChoice enrollment services contract continues to be the centerpiece of the HealthChoice program in terms of recipient outreach, education, enrollment, primary care provider selection, transfers in and out of managed care organizations, and annual right to change opportunities. The Enrollment Broker will continue to provide excellent customer service to recipients by contacting and educating enrollees about their managed care opportunities, assisting HealthChoice beneficiaries in choosing and enrolling (Voluntary Enrollment – VE) into a managed care organization (MCO), assisting enrollees in selecting a Primary Care Provider (PCP), and assisting enrollees and members in accessing and effectively using their MCO and PCP in order to ensure the availability of and access to appropriate health by nature of this contract.

The enrollment broker, PSI, continues to utilize a sophisticated enrollment information system and a highly efficient telephone system and telephone call center to meet the needs of Maryland Medicaid recipients.

In addition to performing services for HealthChoice, the Maryland Children's Health Program and the Primary Adult Care (PAC) Program, PSI will continue to perform Enrollment Broker/Benefit Consultant Services, as well as allowing recipients moving between HealthChoice and PAC to remain with the same MCO with an opt-out provision that was mandated by House Bill 367, Acts of 2007 that provides continuity of care for Medicaid recipients.

The PAC population continues to be very transient, and it is difficult to provide any outreach as they move or have incorrect contact information in the system. Nevertheless, PSI consistently manages to achieve above a 90% "Voluntary Enrollment Rate" (VER) for both PAC and HealthChoice, instead of the 80% required by the contract. Recipients that do not voluntarily choose a MCO within 28 days of eligibility will be auto-assigned by the Enrollment Broker. However, voluntary enrollment is desirable since it has been determined that recipients who voluntarily enroll into a MCO are more likely to access health care from the PCP they choose. Accordingly, the 90% VER is a very positive outcome. The phone call abandonment rate continues to remain steady at less than 4% with both programs, which is exceptional compared to the contractually permitted abandonment rate of up to 7%. This low abandonment rate indicates prompt answering of calls, which presumably translates into good customer service.

PSI has provided consistent service to the Health Choice program since the inception of the contract. There have been no outstanding complaints about the service of this vendor. PSI is accurate and meets all deadlines in a timely manner. As verified by contract monitoring, the enrollment broker has continued to display satisfactory customer service for the recipient of the Maryland Medicaid program. This enables members to effectively use their MCO and PCP in order to ensure the availability of and access to appropriate health care services.

Failure to exercise this option renewal would interrupt satisfactory service and will take a significant amount of time for re-competing, reviewing of responses and awarding the winning contract.

After extensive litigation, in 2009, the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit affirmed a district court's ruling against the State, and the plaintiff filed a petition seeking to recover attorney's fees of approximately \$830,000. Under the terms of the settlement, the State agreed not file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the Supreme Court and to pay \$200,000 to resolve all claims for attorneys fees, and in exchange the plaintiff agreed to accept the payment and to make a \$200,000 donation to a State program engaged in efforts to combat the effects of alcohol abuse. The Attorney General concludes that the proposed settlement is in the State's best interest.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMarylandmarketplace.com* (eMM). Copies of the solicitation notice were mailed directly to 12 prospective vendors, all of which are Maryland firms, and included one MBE. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Four bids were received in response to the IFB, the 2nd IFB issued for this service. (See below for information on the 1st IFB). All bids were deemed to be responsive. The lowest bid was received from Woodlawn Motor Coach. It was determined that Woodlawn Motor Coach was responsible and is therefore recommended for award.

Initially, an IFB was issued 3/15/2010 for 16 buses and drivers and a longer contract duration, with a bid due date of 4/5/2010. Three bids were received in response to this IFB by the due date. However, one of the three bids was deemed to be non-responsive due to errors in the completion of the bid form. A second bidder also had an error in completing the bid form, but it was determined that the intended bid price could be discerned from the bid form, so this price was corrected by the Department. The third bidder completed the bid form correctly.

However, in reviewing the acceptability of the bids, as described above, it was determined that aspects of the bid form construction and instructions contributed to two bidders completing the form incorrectly, one fatally so. Because of this circumstance, the fact that it had now been determined that only 8 buses were needed/affordable and the duration of need was reduced, and due to the desire to clarify other aspects of the IFB, with the approval of DBM the bids from the first IFB were rejected and the IFB was cancelled. Thereafter, changes were made to the IFB in terms of contract duration, bus quantities, the bid form, and the wording of various sections, and the IFB was re-issued. The results of the 2nd IFB are described in this Item.

This program is part of the Governor's initiative to use conservation service as a means to engage at-risk and court-involved youth in meaningful experiences in nature to reduce recidivism rates, provide opportunities for skills training, empowerment and employment and restore natural and recreational resources in State Parks and the Chesapeake Bay. The Civic Justice Corps program was established in 2008 offering 200 Baltimore City youth the opportunity to work in Maryland State Parks. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMarylandmarketplace.com* (eMM). Copies of the solicitation notice were mailed directly to fourteen prospective vendors, nine of which are Maryland firms and included one MBE. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Three bids were received in response to the IFB, which was the 2nd IFB issued to lease the required vehicles (see information about the 1st IFB, below). All bids were deemed to be responsive. The lowest bid for 70 full-size Passenger Vans was Hertz Equipment Rental Corporation of Baltimore, MD the lowest bid for 20 mini-vans was received from Enterprise Leasing Company of Baltimore; and while the lowest bid for 1 full-size sedan was received from Nextcar Leasing of Laurel, Maryland, the specifications said this single vehicle would not be awarded by itself. Instead it was stated that the award would be made to the bidder with the lowest sedan lease price that received an award for one of the other vehicle types (full-size or mini vans). Since Nextcar Leasing did not receive any other award, the sedan award is being made to Hertz, which quoted a lower sedan price than Enterprise. (See more information on the sedan award below.)

By the requirements of the IFB, vendors could offer to provide either or both full-size and mini vans in increments of 10 vans. In other words, bidders could offer from 10 to 70 full-size vans, in increments of quantities of 10 (10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 or all 70), and either 10 or 20 mini vans. Any bidder offering either van type in any increment amount was also required to quote a price for the single sedan needed. The IFB said that the award would be made to a single bidder, or multiple bidders, as follows.

If a single bidder proposed to provide all vehicles needed, and was the lowest bidder for all vehicles, this bidder would receive the award to provide all vehicles. But if one bidder was lowest in price for one type of van, but not the other type (e.g., full-size but not mini), or the lowest priced bidder did not offer to provide all the vehicles needed of either van type, award would be made to the lowest priced vendor for all the vans it offered to provide (in increments of 10 vans), and one or more other bidders would receive awards in the order of their bid price until the number of vehicles required was satisfied. i.e., if the lowest priced bidder for full-size vans only offered 20 vans, it would receive the award for the lease of 20 full-size vans. If the 2nd lowest bidder also offered only 20 full-size vans, it also would receive an award for the lease of 20 full-size vans. Then the 3rd lowest priced bidder would receive the award for the remaining 30 full-size vans needed if it offered at least this number of full-size vans. However, the

specifications also stated that although all bidders were required to offer to provide the single sedan needed, an award would not be made for the sedan only. Instead, award would be made to the bidder receiving an award to provide some number of vans of either type that offered the sedan at the lowest price among the bidders receiving some award for vans. This requirement was made both to encourage bidders to offer lower prices for the sedan and to avoid making an award to a vendor for only one vehicle.

The above award procedure was specified in this solicitation because of the unsatisfactory results from the first IFB to obtain these vehicles. The initial IFB was issued March 15, 2010, with a bid due date of April 5, 2010. The initial IFB was for quantities of up to 150 full-size vans, 20 mini vans and a single sedan, and anticipated a single award to one bidder to provide all vehicles. Only one vendor responded to this IFB, but for only 40 full-size vans, plus the 20 mini vans and the sedan. But, because the IFB required a response for the total vehicle quantity required, this single bid was deemed non-responsive, and no award was made. Thereafter, the IFB was revised to permit bidders to offer fewer than all required vehicles, in increments of 10 vans, as described above. Moreover, by this time it was determined that the Department did not need/could not afford 150 full-size vans. Accordingly, in addition to allowing bids for 10 or more vans, in increments of 10 vans, the overall required number of full-size vans was reduced to 70. The quantities of 20 mini vans and the single sedan remained the same as in the 3/15/2010 IFB.

This program is part of the Governor's initiative to use conservation service as a means to engage at-risk and court-involved youth in meaningful experiences in nature to reduce recidivism rates, provide opportunities for skills training, empowerment and employment and restore natural and recreational resources in State Parks and the Chesapeake Bay. The Civic Justice Corps program was established in 2008 offering 200 Baltimore City youth the opportunity to work in Maryland State Parks. In 2009 the program expanded including Harford, Prince Georges, and Worcester counties.

The purpose of this contract is to have the 70 full-size Passenger Vans, 20 Mini Vans and one Full-Size Sedan available to transport the youth within various State parks to the specific project site where each crew will work. The vans are driven by the project leaders and will also be used to transport supplies before and after the six week program for the youth. All vehicles will be operated by Department employees, or by non-Department employees, who are responsible adults 21 or older.

The only deliverable under the contracts included in this Item, is the lease of the vehicles themselves. The selected vendors will provide no other goods or services than the provision of the vehicles by the required date, with the vehicles being returned when they are no longer required. Between these dates, the only requirement of the vendor is to repair or replace a vehicle that isn't operating properly, which hopefully will not be needed. In addition, there is only one MBE available to provide this service, which was sent the IFB, and a very limited time period (no more than 54 days) during which the vehicles will be leased. For all these reasons no MBE goal was established.

Accenture LLP filed two protests which were both denied by DHR. The first protest was filed on December 15, 2008 and the second on April 30, 2009. At the time design funds were initially authorized in 2003, the project completion schedule was consistent with the time line anticipated for a major capital budget initiative, approximately 4-5 years, from program approval through design start and construction completion which also included purchasing capital equipment.

The capital facility program was approved July 28, 2003 and the A/E services design contract was approved by the Board January 7, 2004, for phases 1-6 design, in the amount of \$605,065.00. The design was completed in July 2006. However, due to budget constraints, funding for construction was not authorized until FY 2010.

Bids were scheduled for April 2010. Because of the delay between the completion of design and the construction funding authorization, additional fees modifications must be considered for an extension of the phase 5-6 services for both the primary A/E and the contracted commissioning agent. This was due to escalation costs beyond their originally negotiated contract agreement.

Background

The District Court has a severe need for additional storage space for eight (8) of its 12 districts due to its need to maintain custody of all adjudicated court records. All court post judgment records for criminal and traffic cases must be kept for a minimum of three (3) years from its closing date before they can be stripped of all personal contents and properly disposed. Civil cases must be kept a minimum of 12 years with many of these cases mandated to be kept in perpetuity. District Court have been struggling with keeping ahead of this mandate due to the increasing number of cases being heard annually; consequently the demand for space has exceeded District Court's current storage ability to hold and store the records as mandated by law in the various district locations. The problem has resulted in the need for the local District Court offices to maintain the records on site in spaces that are already inadequate.
