5. BONDS

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works:

- (1) Authorize for publication in the *Maryland Register* the automatic terminations of State debt authorizations listed in Sections A and B; and
- (2) Grant a 1-year temporary exception to the automatic termination for the authorization listed in Section C.

The Office of the Comptroller, the State Treasurer's Office, the Department of Budget and Management (Office of Capital Budgeting), and the Department of General Services have reviewed this request and concur.

Background: The terminations in Sections A and B reduce the State's authority to issue general obligation bonds in the amount of \$2,962,923.36 and, at the same time, reduce the State's spending authority for the capital projects shown. The Comptroller's Office notified State agencies on a quarterly basis in fiscal year 2012 and grantees in June 2011 and January 2012 that the authorizations were terminating.

Authority: Section 8-128, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland provides, "Except to the extent that money authorized by an enabling act for a State project or program has been encumbered by the Board, an authorization of State debt shall automatically terminate 7 years after the date of the authorization, unless: . . . in an emergency, the Board unanimously grants a temporary exception for 1 year."

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6. MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve a **new grant** up to \$72,000 to the Chesapeake Bay Trust for the **Camp Letts Stormwater Restoration** project in Anne Arundel County. Multiple sources of funding including General Obligation bond proceeds make up the required 20% State match of federal funds. (Legislative District 30)

Project Description: The project will convert marsh area to a functional treatment wetland. The marsh bottom will be excavated and an outlet designed to provide a permanent shallow pool and adequate runoff storage for rainfall. A forebay will be constructed and a grass buffer or sediment trap added before the constructed wetland to minimize sedimentation in the wetland. Camp Letts is owned and managed by the YMCA of Metropolitan Washington.

7. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Public Works approve releasing the deeds of trust on three properties that received loans from DHCD's Down Payment and Settlement Expense Loan Program. The deeds of trust are second mortgages; the borrowers are selling their property in lieu of foreclosure to pay off the first mortgage owed to DHCD, and the borrowers have requested a release of the deed of trust securing the second mortgage on the basis of a hardship (e.g., loss of income due to unemployment or illness). Scope of Services. Contractor's deliverables includes: (1) analyzing State procurement laws and policies and agency business processes; (2) designing improved business processes; and (3) providing a plan the State can use to implement the change process.

Contractor. Treya Partners successfully completed procurement reform projects in Oklahoma, Colorado, and Oregon. Colorado has a decentralized procurement system similar to Maryland's. Treya proposed a project team that includes Maryland procurement expertise. Although Treya's financial proposal was ranked second, the quality of its technical proposal resulted in its overall number one ranking.

MBE/V-OSBE. Because of the specialized nature of the consulting services and the overall size of the contract, subcontracting opportunities are limited. Thorough review of the MBE and veteran small business directories led to the conclusion that a 5% veterans small business subcontracting goal is appropriate. Importantly, the Board of Public Works office conducted direct outreach to MBEs and veteran small businesses to respond as prime contractors to the solicitation. This approach led to offers from two certified MBEs and one verified service-disabled, veteran-owned small business. The recommended awardee has provided meaningful opportunity to a veteran-owned small business subcontractor for 5% of the contract amount.

Contingent Fund. Annually, the General Assembly appropriates money to the "Board of Public Works to be used by the Board in its judgment" for supplementing appropriations when regular appropriations are insufficient for operating expenses or for any other contingency that might arise within the State. In FY 2013, the Contingent Fund was appropriated \$500,000 of which only \$100,000 has been committed this year. Approval of this Item would leave \$250,000 in the FY 2013 Contingent Fund.

The database created during the current contract is used to support the following:

- 1) Measurement & Verification of energy savings from 25 Energy Performance Contracts in various stages throughout 17 State Agencies, representing more than \$200 million in capital improvements, financed through \$21 million in annual guaranteed cost avoidance;
- 2) Tracking, Assessment and Monitoring of EmPower Maryland's 20% State Energy Reduction Goal by 2020; and,
- 3) Assessment of Renewable Energy project opportunities and sizing considerations.

Bithgroup has maintained this comprehensive utility database for nearly five years. During that time, the firm has acquired intimate knowledge of State's actual work processes for government structures and operations. To date, the database is populated by more than 834,000 records for nearly 22,000 accounts.

This contract fulfills the requirements of Health – General, Title 13, Subtitle 10, for the DHMH Tobacco Program to conduct biennial county-level surveys of tobacco-use behaviors.

Three proposals were received in response to the RFP; however, only two were deemed to be reasonable susceptible of being selected for award. ICF Macro International (ICF Macro) was ranked overall #1 with the higher technical proposal and the lower price. ICF Macro had the better skill set, experience, and expertise required to administer the surveys, and it has had the Youth Tobacco Survey (YTS) contract since 2000 and the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) contract for the last survey in 2011. Therefore, award is recommended to ICF Macro having the more advantageous offer for the State.

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey and Youth Tobacco Survey (YRBS/YTS) is administered to approximately 100,000 eligible youth attending grades 6 through 12 in an average of 350 public schools in Maryland, with analysis and reporting for each of Maryland's 23 counties and Baltimore City, as well as Maryland Statewide. Separate survey instruments will be administered to middle and high school students. By combining the YRBS/YTS, DHMH has reduced the burden on schools and students with respect to the monitoring of youth risk behaviors, and now supports analysis that examines the extent to which youth engage in concurrent risk behaviors for Maryland as a whole and in each local jurisdiction. The YRBS/YTS is the only data source for a number of Managing for Results, StateStat, State Health Improvement Plan, and Local Health Improvement Plan indicators.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace* and DHMH's website. DHMH Behavioral Health & Disabilities, issued this RFP to provide the CSRRC with technical and advisory support related to reimbursement of community-based mental health and developmental disability service providers that will enable it to fulfill its statutory mandate as set forth in Maryland Code Ann. Health-Gen. Article, Title §13-801 et seq.

Three proposals were received in response to the RFP, all of which were deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The proposal from Behavioral Health Industry News dba Open Minds was ranked #1 overall with the second highest technical ranking and the lowest price. The slight technical differences between Open Minds and the highest ranked technical Offeror did not off-set the 36% higher price (by \$225,300). Therefore, award is recommended to Open Minds as having the most advantageous offer for the State.

Open Minds has extensive experience with community-based providers and the ability to help them navigate changing payment systems by creating efficiencies in services delivery. The proposed staff and the company's background in development and implementation of survey instruments to assess the financial viability of providers showed evidence of a deep understanding of the way that providers operate and interact with the public mental health and developmental disability systems.

Before the current CSRRC was seated (as of October 2011, the CSRRC is entirely new), DHMH had entered into a MOU with Hilltop. The MOU was based upon the statutory mandate prior to its being significantly modified in 2010. Efforts to modify the MOU subsequently were not satisfactory. Therefore, pursuing an RFP enabled CSRRC to solicit the technical competence it deems necessary given the composition of the CSRRC and its mandated responsibilities, and to define the terms of its relationship with its technical consultant. In addition, the pricing of the MOU with Hilltop was more expensive than the recommended awardee with less in terms of deliverables. Moreover, roughly 40% of Hilltop's invoices are for employee benefits and indirect costs.

Copies of the solicitation notice were email directly to 14 prospective certified small business vendors in the appraisal field, all of which are Maryland firms and three are also minority businesses. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Only one bid was received in response to this solicitation. The recommended contractor, Page Appraisal Company, Inc., is the incumbent and is deemed to be responsible. Its bid meets the technical requirements set forth in the IFB. Moreover, the price has been deemed fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other prospective bidders had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Two vendors did submit a response of not bidding due to the project being too large. Therefore, award is recommended to Page Appraisal Company, Inc.

Under this contract, the recommended work to be performed will be:

- Perform commercial appraisal services to determine the appraised values of the building, land and equipment of the nursing homes/providers that participate in the Maryland Medicaid Program;
- Give an appraised value to the facility's building, building improvements, building renovations, and non-moveable equipment. According to COMAR 10.09.10.10(G1&2) appraisal of nursing homes are required every four years; and,
- The appraised value will be included in the facility's fiscal year cost settlement report in the "Net Capital Value Rental section". The cost settlement reports are prepared by a contracted external audit firm.

This contract is needed in order to provide accurate and defensible commercial appraisals of nursing homes that participate in the Maryland Medicaid Program. The Medicaid Program requires that appraised values of nursing homes must be as accurate as possible to avoid reductions in Federal reimbursement payments. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The purpose of the modification is to provide additional analyses and reports using the Medical Care Data Base (MCDB). These reports were required/ requested by the Legislature, the Maryland Insurance Administration (MIA), the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange (HBE), and the Secretary of DHMH mid-way through the contract. Also included in the modification are analytic activities conducted on the MCDB data that are required for both the operation and the evaluation of the Maryland Multi-Payer Patient Centered Medical Home (MMPP) pilot, which was assigned to MHCC by the Legislature in 2010. The modification will also extend the contract by six months to ensure there is no disruption to the MMPP program prior to:

- completion of the pilot in December 2014;
- completion of a comprehensive legislative report by the December 2014 deadline; and,

- 3) An Interim (baseline) Report and a Final (two years later) Report on the benefits and costs associated with the Assignment of Benefits and Reimbursement of Nonpreferred Providers (AOB) Act, which was assigned to the MHCC when the act was passed in 2010. The Final AOB Report is due in December 2014.

It is in the best interest of the State to approve this modification because these additional annual reports are within the scope of work of the original Request for Proposals (RFP). In RFP Section 4.5 "Special Policy and Data Quality Studies", it states "At the direction of the MHCC, the contractor shall examine a policy or data issue in greater detail. Up to five of these studies will be generated over the course of the five year contract. These investigations will be aimed at resolving data quality questions affecting a payer or a class of payers, expanding the current approaches for disseminating information, or addressing a specific policy question not considered in the annual reports."

This modification allows for accurate trend comparisons, which is especially important due to the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The underlying analyses will be identical to the prior reports, which would not happen if a new procurement were conducted to produce these reports. Also, additional time and money would be required for a new vendor to become familiar with the strengths and weaknesses of the MCDB. For this reason, it is also not practical to competitively bid the AOB reports or the analytic activities associated with the MMPP program and evaluation, which require an expert understanding of the MCDB data, and how the data differs by payer, in a very limited timeframe.

Additionally, because the MMPP required activities include the calculation of payments due to the participating practices from the participating carriers based on the MCDB data, it is especially important that the carriers have confidence that the vendor conducting these analyses activities is expert in analyzing the MCDB data. Social & Scientific Systems, Inc., the Contractor, has demonstrated to these payers over the past several years an expert understanding of each payer's data, has developed payer-specific remedies to make the data comparable across the payers, and has excellent relationships with the payers in the MMPP.

Additional time is needed to allow the Contractor to accept requests pending the new contract award with a definitive end date once the new contract award recommendations have been approved by the BPW. A minimum of one month is needed to place the new contract award recommendations on a BPW agenda for approval. With so many variables unknown at the time of this agenda item submission, it is in the best interest of the State to allow for a five and one-half-month extension period to ensure the new contracts are in place, and there is ample transition time to ensure no lapse in services.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. Direct solicitation was conducted via eMM to 44 prospective vendors, four of which are MBEs, and 21 are small businesses. Additional direct solicitation was conducted to nine vendors that were not registered in eMM. A copy of the RFP was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Four proposals were received in response to the RFP, all of which were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Ranked first technically and financially was Davenport & Company, LLC (Davenport). Ranked second technically and financially was First Southwest. Both firms demonstrated superiority in the technical components of Experience of Subcontractors, Financial Capacity, and Transportation Expertise. Therefore, it was determined that both Davenport (as overall #1) and First Southwest's (as overall #2) Offers were the most advantageous to the State. These contracts have received approval by the Members of the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA).

The RFP provided for the award of up to two contracts for these services. Each award would be for an identical Scope of Services and each of the successful contractors must be able to perform all of the elements in the Scope of Services. The most advantageous Offeror will be given the first opportunity to provide services under this contract. In the event this firm cannot provide the requested services, the second firm will be given the opportunity to accept the order. Both contracts would have a combined total value of \$2,500,000 NTE during the six years of the contracts, if the two-year renewal option is exercised.

Two proposals were received in response to the RFP, however, one proposal was deemed not to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award due to MBE issues. The remaining Offer from Alere Wellbeing, Inc. was deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror was determined to be responsible, the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to Alere Wellbeing, Inc., the incumbent.

Tobacco use remains Maryland's leading cause of preventable death, killing an estimated 6,800 people each year with almost 150,000 additional adults suffering daily from one or more diseases caused by cigarette smoking alone. The annual cost of treating cancers and diseases caused by cigarette smoking alone was estimated to be \$2.2 billion in Maryland in 2004 and will likely increase to between \$3.5 and \$5.0 billion annually by 2015. The human and economic toll that smoking and tobacco use has on Maryland residents, the Maryland economy, and the Maryland budget, can be reduced through a long-term sustained effort to reduce the use of tobacco products in this State. The cost of treating disease caused by cigarette smoking inflates the tax burden on the average Maryland household by an estimated \$622 every year. Over 600,000 adult Marylanders are current smokers. The vast majority of these smokers want to completely quit smoking.

The US Public Health Service's (USPHS) *Treating Tobacco Use and Dependence: Clinical Practice Guideline 2008 Update* recommends both clinicians and health care delivery systems should ensure patient access to quitlines and promote use. Research shows that quitlines are highly effective in helping tobacco users quit. Due to their ability to reach and serve tobacco users, regardless of location, quitlines have quickly spread across North America and residents in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, each U.S. territory, and all Canadian provinces can access public quitline services.

The Maryland Tobacco Quitline (QL), 1-800-QUIT-NOW, has been in existence since 2006 and is managed by the DHMH Prevention and Health Promotion Administration's (PHPA) Center for Tobacco Use Prevention and Control.

The HSA tests are end-of-course assessments in algebra/data analysis, English, and biology that are administered to students in grades 6-12 Statewide. Students are required to take and pass the assessments or obtain a combined score on all three assessments of 1208 in order to receive a high school diploma. The three assessments are also used to fulfill the ESEA waiver application accountability requirements to meet Federal reporting rules.

The term of the tests overlap because test development for each test edition year must begin in the current year for administration in the following year. Approval of this request will allow time to develop the test items, test forms, and be ready for administration next year.

The original contract, awarded through a competitive procurement process in 2007 for the development, administration, scoring, analysis and reporting of the HSA included the Government assessments. However, the Government High School Assessment (HAS) was eliminated from the FY12 budget due to fiscal constraints. During the 2012 General Assembly session, legislation was introduced to reinstate the Government HSA to support the teaching and engagement of students in the area of government and civics. Both the House and the Senate unanimously passed their respective bills and on May 22, 2012, Governor Martin O'Malley signed Senate Bill 293 and House Bill 1227 into Maryland law (Chapters 476 and 477) resulting in the reinstatement of the Government HSA. Funds were placed in the FY13 budget for the Government HSA. On April 24, 2012, the Maryland State Board of Education approved the reinstatement of the Government HSA as a graduation requirement for students entering ninth grade in the 2013-2014 school year. Therefore, this renewal option also includes the modification of the contract to add the Government HSA for the 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 test edition years.

ALCO Pharmacy provides pharmacy services (fills medication scripts and provides medication) for the former Rosewood Center residents now part of the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) Secure Evaluation and Therapeutic Treatment (SETT) Program units. These units are operated fully by DDA and are located in Jessup on the grounds of the Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center (CTPHC) that serves as an evaluation unit (where individuals stay up to 90 days) and in Sykesville on the grounds of the Springfield Hospital Center (SHC) that serves as a long-term therapeutic treatment unit for individuals with intellectual disability (where individuals have disposition within 18-24 months), but operated fully by DDA. ALCO Pharmacy also provides quality assurance activities regarding the delivery and handling of medications.

This extension is being requested in order to complete solicitation process currently underway. In an attempt to reduce costs, the psychiatrists at the SETT facilities have been strongly encouraged to order generic drugs whenever possible. This encouragement has been successful resulting in steadily declining monthly costs. There has been a savings of approximately \$3,000 per month with the use of generic medications for individuals as appropriate. It is projected that approximately \$110,000 will be paid to the vendor over the five month extension period. Therefore, no additional funding is requested for this modification. In addition, DDA will continue to attempt to find other potentially less expensive alternatives.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Senate Bill 1 expanded the regulatory duties of the Agency as it authorizes a sixth casino, table games and 24 hour-a-day/7-day-a-week casino operations. Furthermore, this legislation charges the Agency with establishing regulations to govern table games; conducting studies of lottery and gaming activities in the state and region; and issuing licenses to qualified veterans organizations to operate up to five instant ticket lottery machines. This legislation also requires the appointment of a new commission, which is compensated for its service.

As a result of these additional and new regulatory duties the agency requires additional staff to fulfill its mandated responsibilities. Seven positions are needed for the newly formed commission. Management level positions are needed to provide oversight of table game operations and to conduct studies on gaming activity. Additional licensing and financial investigators are needed to conduct the required background investigations for the additional staffing needed at all casinos to support 24-7 operations and to staff table games and also to assuage the current licensing backlog. Furthermore, additional compliance officers are needed at each casino to support the 24-7 operation as the law requires the presence of agency employees at the casino to handle complaints and to ensure compliance with regulations. Auditing inspectors and a supervisor also are needed to oversee and account for the collection of table game revenue. Clerical assistance will be used to support the operations.

Further positions are needed to support the provisions in Senate Bill 1, which allows for qualified veterans organizations to obtain a license for up to five instant ticket lottery machines, and Senate Bill 864, which requires the agency to oversee electronic gaming devices in specified counties. In order to carry out its regulatory responsibilities under these provisions, audit inspectors, compliance officers, financial investigators and a VLT specialist are needed.

The Secretary of DBM has certified that funds are available for the new position for which approval is requested within the Rule of 100. If the Board approves this request, 77.4 positions will have been approved within the Rule of 100 for FY2013.

REQUESTING INSTITUTION REMARKS: The University used the DGS Statewide energy performance contract (DGS Item 1-EP [7/28/10]) to solicit preliminary proposals from all pre-qualified contractors. Pepco Energy Services was selected to complete a Phase I Engineering Feasibility Study in accordance with procedures established under the DGS indefinite delivery contract. The Phase II proposal is subject to BPW approval.

Under Phase I, Pepco Energy Services developed a comprehensive energy efficiency and guaranteed savings program to assist intercollegiate athletics at the University of Maryland, College Park to reduce energy consumption through installing capital equipment. A detailed engineering study was completed, including specific recommendations, equipment and system layouts, preliminary specifications, construction cost, yearly maintenance costs, and guaranteed energy and energy related savings. The study is the basis for the Phase II proposal.

Pepco Energy Services exceeded the 25% MBE goal by achieving 35% MBE participation. The 10% sub-goal for woman-owned businesses was substantially exceeded, with the contractor delivering 28%. The 7% sub-goal for African-American owned businesses was met.

REQUESTING INSTITUTION REMARKS: Towson University owns an FCC license to operate University television station WMJF. Because the University's focus now is on delivering higher educational programs and courses via multimedia platforms, the license and analog broadcast equipment are no longer needed to deliver academic programs and courses.

The license has been for sale since 2004, at which time the appraised value was between \$1.8 million and \$2 million. The equipment is valued at approximately \$55,000. LocusPoint's offer is the first serious inquiry the University has received despite having hired an agent to find a buyer. (The University received an offer of \$50,000 in February 2012.)

FCC regulations require that all TV stations convert from analog to digital within approximately the next two years. The University does not plan to allocate the funds necessary for the conversion. Doing so would not be fiscally prudent nor would it be consistent with program and course delivery.

LocusPoint Networks, LLC, a wireless communications company, is purchasing the license and associated television broadcasting equipment so that it can convert the station to a digital station and use its broadcast bandwidth (the frequency can be used to support many mobile devices). No real property is included in the transaction.

REQUESTING INSTITUTION REMARKS: The contemplated student housing was built on two development parcels (Parcel One and Parcel Two). Upon construction completion, Erickson subleased the land and improvements back to UMBC and both facilities became part of the UMBC residential life program under UMBC management. In connection with developing Parcel One, UMBC and Erickson also entered into an easement agreement giving both parties access to (including installation of utilities) the University lands and Parcel One leased to Erickson.

The Maryland Economic Development Corporation (MEDCO) issued tax-exempt, fixed rate bonds in the amount of \$40,000,000 to finance the development of the residential facilities on Parcel One and Parcel Two. The 40-year term of the Ground Leases exceeded the life of MEDCO issued tax-exempt bonds. Once Erickson's investment was returned, UMBC no longer owed rent to Erickson, and Erickson's rights under the Ground Leases was automatically assigned to the University of Maryland Foundation, Inc. in accordance with the Deeds of Assignment for the two parcels until such time as the MEDCO bond were retired.

The Earned Compliance Credit and Reinvestment Act of 2012 (Md Laws, Chapters 564-565) requires DPSCS to establish a program to implement earned compliance credits, which will create a specified reduction over the course of active supervision for specific individuals. Moreover, Chapter 505 allows an individual to file an application for a statement of charges with a District Court commissioner, who can then issue a summons or arrest warrant under specified circumstances.

The budget was formulated by estimating the aggregate costs of the software and labor costs of expertise to customize the software to provide the expected service.

On August 24, 2010 Maryland was awarded one of the federal government's Race to the Top (RTTT) grants awarded by the U.S. Department of Education. One of the goals for Maryland's reform agenda is to ensure that all students are fully prepared for college and a career in the 21st Century. The Maryland RTTT application included a proposal to translate the Maryland Common Core State Standards into challenging and engaging curricula that will include unit plans, lesson plans, classroom projects, and homework assignments to help students toward achieving that goal.

The contractor will develop online high school STEM courses for the MVLO that include Cybersecurity and Environmental Science. This Solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace on May 15, 2012, and reached 378 firms, of which 48 were SBR vendors, and 45 were certified MBE firms. Thirteen (13) responsive bids were received.

The main purpose of the renovations is to move several divisions out of multiple buildings and to co-locate into one headquarters building to create improved interoperability, communication, and efficiency between critical Divisions within the agency. The space to be renovated is currently vacant, and the consolidation will eliminate the need to lease space in the adjacent 2400 Building. It should also be noted that repairs to the second floor would need to be completed even if the Authority decided to not utilize the area and to sell or rent the floor to a third party.

The critical Divisions to be relocated consist of: the Office of Finance and a portion of the Office of Information Technology, which currently lease space at 2400 Broening Highway; the remaining Office of Information Technology currently located at the MDTA owned, 2340 Broening Highway building; and the Office of Procurement currently located at the MDTA owned Francis Scott Key ("FSK") Bridge Administration building. Upon the completion of the renovations, the lease at the 2400 building will be terminated for Convenience and other MDTA Divisions will be relocated to the FSK facility and the Police Special Operations Division will be relocated to the 2340 Broening Highway building.

The scope of work consists of providing labor, equipment, materials, etc., necessary to perform the complete renovation of the existing second floor, and partial renovations of the first floor at select locations at the Maryland Transportation Authority Headquarters facility, located at 2310 Broening

This contract was originally approved on November 28, 2007, Item 4-AE, in the amount of \$4,000,000 to two (2) contractors. This property is being disposed of as required by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). In 1985 the MAA began acquiring properties that were deemed incompatible due to aircraft noise through BWI-Marshall's 14 Code of Federal Regulations Part 150 Program. MAA purchased this property with contributions from FAA Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants and from the State of Maryland. MAA also signed and agreed to the FAA AIP grant assurances tied to these funds including Grant Assurance #31, which is "to assure that optimal use is made of the federal share of the proceeds from the disposal of noise land." This requires the MAA to dispose of acquired noise land when the land is no longer needed for noise compatibility reasons. The MAA is also required by Federal Law and its Federal grant assurances to reserve an aviation easement and height restrictions over the property.

In February 2008, the FAA provided formal Program Guidance Letter (PGL) 08-02 requiring an inventory, associated maps, and a strategic reuse plan for all acquired noise land parcels.

The MAA obtained FAA approval of the Reuse Plan in June 2010 and will dispose of 190 properties in four phases over the next five years. The property will be sold subject to an aviation easement, reserved to the MAA, for the right of flight in the airspace above the surface of the premises and in accordance with Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 77, which restricts the maximum height of any improvements.

After the MAA disposes of the land for its appraised fair market value (FMV), the federal share of the FMV of the land is declared as disposal proceeds. The disposal proceeds are placed in an escrow account and are eligible for use for other airport noise compatibility projects, use by another airport for noise compatibility projects, or returned to the AIP Trust Fund. The MAA plans to utilize the escrow funds to complete the sound insulation of homes previously approved in the Part 150 Noise Compatibility Program.

The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20090707-0946 and has recommended to declare the property located at 1776 Dorsey Road, consisting of +/- 0.42 acres, surplus and for the MAA to sell the property to Anne Arundel County in accordance with their expressed interest. The MAA and Anne Arundel County have agreed on the sale of the property.

A request to dispose of the +/- 0.42 acres and to sell it to Anne Arundel County will be sent to the Board of Public Works in the near future.

In light of the economic downturn, the maritime business remains highly competitive. That competition has heightened to a new level particularly during this economic downturn. Competing ports of Norfolk, Delaware and Philadelphia are pursuing Baltimore's niche commodities. Philadelphia has been very aggressive in its pricing; and as an example, Norfolk is actively pursuing forest products, a long-time staple of the Port of Baltimore. These ports are responding with very aggressive rates including discounts to the customer for vessel dockage, wharfage, crane rentals, land, shed and buildings. Recently, the MPA lost a major paper account to the Port of Philadelphia due to below-market pricing.

The MPA must continue to be proactive in its dealings with shipping companies and other customers. The MPA needs to be able to respond to a customer or potential customer's needs immediately or run the risk of losing the business to a more competitive port.

REMARKS: The Maryland Broadband Cooperative (MDBC) is a non-profit cooperative telecommunication service provider that currently provides fiber optic infrastructure and services in underserved rural areas of the State of Maryland. MDBC was created by the Maryland General Assembly under Senate Bill 753 (SB753) in the 2006 Legislative Session, and subsequently signed into law.

MDBC places fiber optic infrastructure within various segments of MDOT/SHA/MDTA rights-of-way without imposition of any charge for the use of the rights-of-way, as provided by law.

On November 20, 2007, the Maryland Department of Transportation/State Highway Administration entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with MDBC (the "2007 MOU") as a partnership to, among other things, construct 10 fiber optic laterals at State- designated locations. MDBC properly completed this work in late 2008 and the work was accepted by the State shortly thereafter. Although payment in the amount of \$281,719.11 was processed and paid, as an MOU, it was not presented to the Maryland Board of Public Works. In good faith, both DoIT and SHA thought that the State could authorize MDBC to perform work for the State under the 2007 MOU without taking the matter to the BPW for approval. However, it was determined later that: (i) MDBC was a non-profit and not a governmental entity; (ii) agreements with MDBC were therefore not exempt from the requirement that they be presented to the Board of Public Works for approval; and (iii) the 2007 MOU was the incorrect form of agreement to use for this work. Consequently, MDOT, DoIT and SHA are now requesting that the BPW provide retroactive approval of this sole source Contract as the proper form of agreement between the parties for the work that was completed by MDBC and accepted by the State in late 2008 and paid for by the State in early 2009; retroactive approval of the payment in the amount of \$281,719.11 is also requested.

This is the last of a series of 4 retroactive items that the BPW has approved with the Maryland Broadband Cooperative. The three prior items approved by the Board of Public Works are as follows:

- Retroactive Contract (Item 13-CT) approved 10/20/2010 for work performed on Rtes. 50 and 450;
- Retroactive agreement approved as Item 1-GM on 3/21/2012 for conversion of MOU between MDBC and SHA into a Resource Sharing Agreement; and
- Retroactive agreement approved as Item 2-GM on 3/21/2012 for ingress and egress in the existing State-owned conduit areas of the Bay Bridge and the Nice Bridge, for the placement of fiber optic cables.

Retroactive approval of the Contract and payment is requested and required because the work on the 10 laterals was not included as part of any of these 3 preceding retroactive approvals by the BPW.

SHA, with input from the Maryland Department of Information Technology, agreed that MDBC design and install fiber for State use at the 10 locations that were shown on Exhibit 4 of the 2007 MOU (now shown as Exhibit A to the Contract). MDBC contracted with their then existing fiber optics contractor who was already doing the other MDBC fiber installation work in these locations to do the installation work on the 10 laterals. Therefore, there was no MBE Goal for the work performed for the State on the 10 laterals.

Office of Materials and Technology (OMT) utilizes many lab and field technicians to conduct testing and inspection services. These functions are critical to not only the mission of OMT, but the support mission of material Quality Assurance /Quality Control (QA / QC) for the Office of Construction (OOC) and delivery of SHA projects.

ITEM: 31-CS-OPT (Continued)**BPW – 11/14/12**

A significant key to the success of centralizing OMT's operations to Hanover now requires the use of an outsourced lab contract. This outsourced lab contract removed SHA from direct supervision and moved approximately 50% of the material testing itself to a private lab.

Private labs have been performing concrete, soils and aggregate testing for years with success. Historically, asphalt testing had only been done with in-house forces at OMT and there were no private firms capable of handling the volume, procedures, details, and schedule of this material type. OMT has now begun creating an industry demand for this service that will continue to take time to develop and mature. The turn around time for test results and level of accuracy needed for asphalt material pay factors from the outsourced lab contract has been a significant challenge. OMT and the asphalt industry have developed these capabilities and the outsourced lab has now been able to see similar performance as the former SHA regional labs did in the past to reduce the risk in our pay factors and partnership with industry.

No additional funds are being requested as there are sufficient funds remaining due to decreased early contract expenditures in FY10 and decreased workload. The first 8 months of the contract only spent \$150,000-\$200,000. The last two fiscal years (FY11 & FY 12) have spent approximately \$900,000 each year. FY13 is on track to spend approximately the same amount. SHA anticipates spending the remaining \$1.9 million over the next two years based on the last two years expenditures and a slight increase in anticipated testing workload.

Current peak periods are 6:00 AM to 11:00 AM and 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM, with the highest morning peak hours from 7:00 AM to 9:00 AM and the highest afternoon peak hours from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM.

The MTA requires three awardees to provide services under this contract MTA-1359A/ MV Contract Transportation, Inc., MTA-1359B/ Veolia Transportation Services, Inc., and MTA-1359C/ First Transit, Inc. Each contract will provide up to 30,000 – 39,999 hours of revenue service per month. Four proposals were submitted in response to the RFP; one proposer was found to be not reasonably susceptible for award. The evaluation process occupied approximately nine months; oral presentations were held in December 2011 and the financial and technical review groups then engaged in multiple rounds of written questions and discussion with the proposers. A request for BAFOs was issued on June 8, 2012 and BAFOs were submitted by all three proposers on July 5, 2012. MTA made its recommendation for award to the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) in September, 2012. A listing of the technical, financial, and overall rankings are set forth in the Attachment.

The minority business enterprise (MBE) participation goal for this contract was set at 17% of the contract value.



REFERENCE

Reference is made to Item 21-RP of this Department's Agenda of March 6, 1991, for the meeting of the Board of Public Works wherein approval was given to the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation (MALPF) to acquire an agricultural preservation easement over 86.5 +/- acres of land for \$586,800.00. Purchase of the easement was completed on August 13, 1991.

As permitted by law and the terms of the easement by Release dated May 10, 1999, MALPF released a 2.0 acre lot surrounding a pre-existing dwelling from the restrictions of the easement. The lot was configured in a manner to accommodate the existing dwelling and septic reserve areas. After the release was recorded, the lot was sold to Henry and Joanne Cole. Unbeknownst to MALPF and without MALPF approval, Mr. & Mrs. Cole were granted a scenic easement over the existing MALPF easement. The scenic easement in part restricted agricultural use of the land in violation of MALPF regulations. Board of Public Works approval is requested to reconfigure the released lot by releasing 0.5523 acre from the easement, in exchange for re-encumbering 0.5523 acre under the easement, provided the current owner of the released lot and the current owner of the land encumbered by the Easement agree to terminate the unapproved scenic easement.

The MALPF Board of Trustees has approved the transaction by determining that the exchange will have a positive effect on the agricultural operation of the farm since (1) the soils are of identical quality, (2) the re-configuration will eliminate one of the septic reserve areas of the lot and add it back to the farm, and (3) MALPF will avoid litigating the violation of the easement and its regulations.

Currently, HUI has a three-year waiting list of 250-300 low-income adults with mental illness who are in need of permanent, affordable housing. The tenants who will reside in this home will pay 35% of their net income for rent and utilities.

The income for the majority of HUI tenants is Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and the maximum SSI payment for an individual is currently \$674.00 a month. In addition to these funds, Montgomery County provides \$200.00 a month for each client through the Montgomery County Rental Assistance Program.

In accordance with Subtitle 6 of the Health-General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board's approval is further contingent upon the State's right of recovery being included in the Deed(s) or otherwise recorded among the Land Records of Montgomery County.
