Project Description: The proposed project entails multi-phased funding for the planning, design and construction of ENR facilities at the existing 6 million gallons per day Marlay Taylor Water Reclamation Facility. The ENR upgrade will include the conversion of the Schreiber Process Reactor into 4-stage Bardenpho process, construction of BioMag equipment and other modifications required at the existing plant to achieve an effluent with Total Nitrogen goal of 3 mg/l and Total Phosphorous of 0.3 mg/l. The purpose of the project is to reduce nutrients to Pine Hill Run and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay.

Backe Accessible Boating Piers at Sandy Point State Park** in memory of Mr. Backe, who died on April 12, 2013 at the age of 77.

Background: Mr. Backe was a long-time, dedicated member of the Department of Natural Resources Disability Advisory Council. In addition, he was DNR's Americans with Disabilities Act coordinator in the 1990s. Mr. Backe was heralded for his expertise on a wide variety of disability, accessibility, boating and recreational issues, programs and services. He taught and provided others with the joy of accessible boating and recreation.

Mr. Backe was the founding Executive Director of the Chesapeake Region Accessible Boating (CRAB), a non-profit organization stationed at Sandy Point State Park which helps those with physical and developmental handicaps sail the Chesapeake Bay. In January of this year, Mr. Backe earned the U. S. Sailing Foundation's 2012 Old Pulteney Maritime Heroes Award for his work on behalf of CRAB and people with disabilities.

Sandy Point State Park is a fitting location for remembering Mr. Backe. The park, 786 acres situated along the northwestern shore of the Chesapeake Bay in Anne Arundel County, opened in June 1952 and provides swimming beaches, picnicking, fishing, crabbing, boating, hiking, youth group camping, areas of historical interest, and wildlife viewing to the public.

The symmetrical brick building with a five-bay center section is flanked by two-story end wings with polygonal bays. It is currently used as a historic house museum, and funding will assist in repairs to deteriorated front steps used by visitors. MHT holds a preservation easement on the property.

Background:

This tidal wetlands license application for the Four Seasons at Kent Island project returns to the Board of Public Works for review consistent with the Maryland Court of Appeals reversal and remand. The court concluded that the Board, when denying the application, "committed legal error by basing its decision on factors outside the scope of its authority and discretion." *Board of Public Works v. K Hovnanian's Four Seasons at Kent Island, LLC*, 425 Md. 482, 485 (2012).

The Court of Appeals ruled that the Board of Public Works' focus in determining whether to grant a tidal-wetlands license is limited to the "varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values presented in the application [with] reference [only] to the impact of the proposed dredging or filling on the affected wetlands." Specifically, the Board is not to rely on the "environmental impact of the entire project"; rather, the Board must look at "just the effect of the four elements on the 9,389 square feet of wetlands directly impacted by those elements." *Id.* at 518-519.

In its original review, the Board of Public Works considered applicant's request to make four types of tidal wetlands impacts. However, the applicant has reduced the scope of the impacts for which it seeks a license by deleting two of the four elements.

Tidal Wetlands Impacts of Applicant's Proposed Activities:

Horizontally Directional Drill: 179-foot Sewer Line

The 179 foot long, 14-inch outside-diameter sewer force main is proposed in the same crossing area of Cox Creek as before. Minimum depth below the bottom of Cox Creek is 20 feet, which will help prevent any sudden release of drilling muds into the creek. This sewer line will serve the proposed project and also act as a relief main to the existing sewer line which is at carrying capacity. No adverse effects on Cox Creek or its related tidal resources are anticipated by the placement of the sewer line. Of note, the Board of Public Works licensed Queen Anne's County Department of Public Works for a water line at a 20-foot depth where the Cross Island Trail crosses over Cox Creek. Sec. Agenda Item 3 (June 3, 2009) [Wetlands License 09-0501].

Marina Construction

The proposed ten-slip pier is in the same location, configuration, and dimensions as in the original application. Open pile structures are considered to have minimal to no impacts on the wetlands and tidal resources.

The Balancing Incentive Program, created by the Affordable Care Act, provides financial incentives to states to increase community-based Medicaid services as an alternative to institutional services such as nursing homes. Maryland was the second state to be approved to participate. Maryland will receive a temporary 2% increase - \$106 million - in the federal match. To receive this enhanced match, Maryland must implement three structural changes: a No Wrong Door/Single Entry Point System, a conflict-free case management system, and a core standardized assessment by September 30, 2015 when the funding authorization ends.

The Community First Choice Program, also created by the Affordable Care Act, affords states a new option to provide home and community-based services to Medicaid enrollees. This option provides a 6% increase in the match for expenditures related to this option which increase DHMH estimates will translate into \$24.7 per year. Maryland will be eligible for the enhanced funding once DHMH implements CFC in the tracking system (January 2014).

To implement the State's participation in these two programs, DHMH used an existing memorandum of agreement with the University of Maryland Baltimore Count through which UMBC contracted with FEi to perform this work. UMBC was an important component of the work as it:

- Developed the first-generation long-term supports and services tracking system that the new system replaces, and understood the data elements, functionality, and end-user needs; and
- Oversaw FEi project management.

As the scope of the underlying system functionality grew, the system met the State definition of a major information systems project. In FY 2014, the General Assembly required that project funding be moved into a dedicated fund overseen by DoIT. DHMH must now directly contract with FEi, effective July 1, 2013, to take over the contract held by UMBC.

Nature of Emergency. DHMH declared an emergency because of the necessity of completing the project within the required time frame. Beyond the funding implications, Medicaid participants will lose the opportunity to benefit from the new initiatives, avoid institutionalization, and remain in the community. Taken together, these consequences would have an adverse impact on the health, safety, and welfare of Maryland citizens.

Basis for Selection: No other vendor is capable of completing the project within the time needed to secure the enhanced federal match. FEi has already completed approximately 75% of the overall development and implementation work and has the background and technical expertise to successfully complete the project Procurement of a vendor to complete the work UMBC and FEi have begun through competitive sealed proposals would likely lose over a year. Procurement of a different vendor would delay LTSS implementation and could cost the State of Maryland as much as \$146 million in federal matching funds. If the work continues without interruption, FEi is expected to complete the development, testing, and implementation of the functionality by June 30, 2015.

REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace* and the DoIT website. DoIT also directly solicited 51 companies, who are known to provide project support services In addition, 544 MBE firms and the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs were directly notified of the solicitation.

A total of 32 proposals were received; 21 proposals were reasonably susceptible of award and were evaluated for both technical and financial. The RFP stated that up to six offerors would be recommended for award of a Master Contract.

DoIT is recommending the six offerors that provided the most advantageous offers to the State. Two are Maryland resident businesses; three are certified MBEs; and two are certified Small Businesses.

Under this multi-award contract, the State will be able to take advantage of market leaders in the Enterprise Resource Planning staffing services. Agencies will select which master contractor will provide required services through a competitive Task Order RFP process. The Task Order RFP will describe specific skill sets of resources for State Personnel System Project on an as-required basis. Each master contractor must respond to each Task Order RFP with a proposal or a written notification that it does not intend to submit a response and why. When submitting responses, master contractors are expected to provide offers that are less than the master contract not-to-exceed labor rates. This contracting vehicle is only available to support the SPS Project.

DoIT determined that no MBE subcontract goal was appropriate because this contract provides individual staffing resources, so neither the number of resources requested in any given Task Order RFP, nor the number of master contractors awarded under a Task Order RFP can be predicted in advance to establish MBE goals. REMARKS: DHMH administers the State Medicaid Program which provides medical services to eligible Medicaid recipients. Maryland reimburses providers for the medical services provided to Medicaid recipients through the State's MMIS. The services are provided through a combination of fee-for-service and prepaid arrangements with medical and managed care providers.

DHMH is replacing the legacy MMIS with a new MMIS system that will modernize existing system functions to ensure that eligible individuals receive the appropriate health care benefits and that providers are reimbursed promptly and efficiently. The Medicaid Enterprise Restructuring Project (MERP) comprises: (1) design, development and implementation of a replacement MMIS and Fiscal Agent operations services; and (2) ICD-10 remediation of Maryland's legacy MMIS system.

As MERP has progressed – placing competing demands on DHMH's own technical experts – DHMH is recognizing a need for additional project management resources beyond the initial estimate for this contract. Additional specialized personnel are required to meet DHMH's project management needs related to the MERP, the MERP MMIS implementation contract, and the performance of the MERP implementation contractor. Additional resources will allow DHMH to reorganize and augment staffing to improve project management and oversight of other MERP contractors. The Center for Medicaid Medicare Service, which is the MERP MMIS implementation project's federal oversight agency, has approved the additional staffing.

REMARKS: Request for retroactive approval of contract to provide RSAN software maintenance and support services to MEMA. This Item requests approval of the contract for services already provided (2,000 emergency-alert recipients) and to add 58,000 emergency-alert recipients going forward.

MEMA entered into a \$119,400 contract with Cooper to provide services that would notify 2,000 State employees of emergencies. MEMA based its selection of Cooper on the intergovernmental-cooperative-purchasing procurement method because Cooper has a contract with Fairfax County, Virginia. However, Fairfax's contract did not contain an intergovernmental purchasing clause and, without that clause, could not be used for those purposes.

When MEMA sought to modify its contract with Cooper to increase the number of alert to 60,000 for an additional \$60,000, DoIT and MEMA became aware of the procurement deficiencies.

Cooper has provided these services to MEMA since February 2009. The services enhance MEMA's ability to rapidly notify State workers on actions to be taken in specific emergencies.

REMARKS: This extension is necessary for the Program Management Services that include: supervision and management of project planning, environmental, design, procurement and construction for airside, building and utility projects in the D/E Connector Program.

The D/E Connector Program, that also is the subject of Board Action Agenda Item July 24, 2013, will provide additional gates and associated support facilities to meet existing and projected demand for international air service. The relocation of the existing passenger screening checkpoint at Concourses D and E to a consolidated screening checkpoint will also allow the egress width to be increased to meet current building codes.

The D/E Connector Program is necessary because International service opportunities at BWI Marshall have been increasing. In addition to continued daily service by British Airways, the Air Mobility Command, and Air Canada, the merger of Southwest/Air Tran Airlines has led to increased international destinations and frequencies, and Condor Airlines has initiated service to Germany and points beyond. As a result, international passenger growth has increased over 20% during the last 12 months. Currently there are times during the day that the six international gates are fully utilized and any additional increases in international arrivals needing Customs and Border Protection (CBP) services cannot be accommodated by the existing terminal configuration.

In addition, Southwest Airlines is pursuing a business plan to significantly increase international service by the third quarter of 2015. With the merged operation of Southwest/AirTran, a significant number of new international flights to and from BWI Marshall beginning in late 2015 is anticipated.

The D/E Connector project remedies the current and future shortfall in CBP access from existing gates by repositioning two domestic gates on Concourse D to a location on the D/E connector portion of the project and providing a "sterile corridor" to connect Gates D1 and D3 to the CBP facility.

In order to provide facilities by 2015 to handle the increased international traffic, and to address current building code egress requirements, the MAA will need to embark on a very aggressive schedule for delivery of the D/E Connector program. The schedule requires that design start by September 2013 and that initial construction start by May 2014. Therefore there is an urgent need to modify the existing contract by increasing funds in it to allow Program Management Services for the D/E Connector Program. The contractor will assist MAA in selection of the A/E design firm and the CMI contractor. The Program Manager will also perform necessary pre-design work.

In the past, JMT has successfully provided similar professional program management services in support of MAA Capital Program. Moreover, with over a decade of program management experience at BWI Marshall, JMT is uniquely qualified to manage the D/E Connector Program. JMT is very familiar with Transportation Security Administration rules and regulations, Customs and Border Patrol requirements, Federal Aviation Administration regulations and guidelines, airport security and operation (landside, airside and terminal), environmental procedures, and state procurement guidelines.

REMARKS: The scope of SHA's environmental design, engineering, compliance, inspection and remediation contracts is unique and allows SHA to perform specialized work that is critical to the safety of SHA facilities and operations in compliance with environmental laws and regulations. These contracts are also essential for SHA to meet the requirements of the Tank Compliance Consent Order and Consent Order to Remediate Trichloroethylene (TCE) Contamination with the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE), and the Third Party Audit Agreement with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The additional time and/or funds will allow SHA to continue to provide these existing critical services as well as provide for the anticipated increase of the Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) program and related design efforts as part of SHA's responsibility to the State's Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP) for the restoration of water quality in the Chesapeake Bay. Some of the work that will be included in the WIP is project development, contamination cleanup and industrial storm water management. All of these services will be significantly increased due to the revenue generated by the Transportation Infrastructure Investment Act of 2013.

The new contract for these services, BCS 2010-15, is in the final stages of procurement and it is anticipated that these contracts will be awarded by January of 2014.

EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES:

- 1. **Project development included inter-governmental coordination to limit adverse growth impacts.** Over ten years of project coordination between the State, Montgomery County, and the Town of Brookeville included specific focus on mitigating traffic impacts to the Town and potential adverse growth impacts.
- 2. No reasonable alternatives inside a Priority Funding Area exist. The environmental impact statement process included an extensive review of all options; the proposed alignment was selected to minimize environmental and land use issues.
- 3. The project alleviates increased traffic congestion and safety concerns. Poor horizontal and vertical geometries on MD 97 exacerbated by increasing traffic volume have created unsafe conditions for vehicles and pedestrians in the Town of Brookeville. These conditions are resulting in accident rates that are higher than the Statewide average.
- 4. The project helps preserve the Brookeville Historic District listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1979. The highway's current configuration leads to traffic volume, noise, and vibration that adversely affect historic buildings near the roadway.

The D/E Connector program consists of four main elements: a series of enabling projects to relocate existing terminal functions out of the way of construction; construction of the new D/E Connector with a "sterile corridor" to the International Arrivals area in Concourse E and repositioning of two existing gates to service either domestic or international flights; a new 10 lane passenger security screening checkpoint; and, the widening and renovation of the "throat" portion of Concourse D. Also included in the program is reconstruction of the United Airlines outbound baggage system; an expansion of concession opportunities; and, human safety code upgrades throughout Concourse D.

REASON FOR REQUEST: These improvements will provide additional gates and associated support facilities to meet existing and projected demand for international air service. The relocation of the existing passenger screening checkpoint at Concourses D and E to a consolidated screening checkpoint will also allow the egress width to be increased to meet current building codes.

International service opportunities at BWI Marshall have been increasing. In addition to continued daily service by British Airways, the Air Mobility Command, and Air Canada, the merger of Southwest/Air Tran Airlines has led to increased international destinations and frequencies, and Condor Airlines has initiated service to Germany and points beyond. As a result, international passenger growth has increased over 20% during the last 12 month. Currently, there are times during the day that the existing six international gates are fully utilized and any additional increases in international arrivals needing Customs and Border Protection (CBP) services cannot be accommodated by the existing terminal configuration.

In addition Southwest Airlines is pursuing a business plan to significantly increase international service. With the merged operation of Southwest/AirTran new international flights to BWI Marshall are anticipated.

The D/E Connector project remedies the current and future shortfall in CBP access from existing gates by repositioning two domestic gates on Concourse D to a location on the D/E connector portion of the project and providing a "sterile corridor" to connect Gates D1 and D3 to the CBP facility. Gates D1 and D3 are projected to be operational inWinter of 2015.

PROCUREMENT METHOD:

In order to provide facilities by 2015 to handle the increased international traffic, and to address current building code egress requirements, the MAA will need to embark on a very aggressive schedule for delivery of the D/E Connector program. The schedule requires that design start by September 2013 and that initial construction start by May 2014.

Pursuant to State Finance and Procurement Code Section 13-314(a)(4) and COMAR 21.12.02.14A(6) and B. MAA requests the Board of Public Works, based upon a recommendation of the Secretary of Transportation and a finding by the Governor that extraordinary circumstances exist, to determine that for the D/E Connector project, including design services and CMI services, urgent circumstances require selection of contractors on an expedited basis, that the expedited selection best services the public interest and the need outweighs the benefits of carrying out the requirements of Architectural and Engineering Services selection procedures.

REMARKS: Waiver of the Architectural and Engineering Service Selection Procedures and proceeding with the selection of the design and CMI contractors best serves the public interest. Thus, MAA recommends that the Board make a determination that waiver of the Architectural and Engineering Selection Program is necessary in accordance with State Finance & Procurement, Section 13-314(a)(4), and COMAR 21.12.02.14 A(6) and B.

Frederick County has since realized the financial burden on its taxpayers to subsidize the nursing home and assisted living facility is not sustainable and determined it to be in the best interest of the taxpayers to sell the property. The County solicited proposals and negotiated a \$30 million

sales contract with Aurora Holdings VII, LLC. The contract also provides that the County will pay Aurora \$10.7 million over four years for continued care for residents. The Department of General Services recommends approval of the sale of the grant-funded property and of Frederick County retaining the sale proceeds. This recommendation takes into account that the County's purchaser, Aurora, will continue to operate the facilities as skilled nursing and assisted living homes. Retaining the sales proceeds is conditioned on the County using those proceeds to pay down the outstanding construction debt or to subsidize purchaser's services on behalf of taxpayers.

In 1996, UMMS acquired Deaton Medical Center - which it later renamed University Specialty Hospital – for \$15 million. The facility served as a nursing home and chronic care hospital. In recent years, USH experienced unpredictable shifts in patient admission, decreases in capacity utilization, and unsustainable operating losses due to changes in the industry. UMMS determined it had to sell the property to maintain financial stability. The high acuity patient care programs remaining at USH were relocated to the Maryland General Hospital campus to continue those programs.

UMMS then entered into an agreement with Walter J. Skayhan III & Associates, Inc. to sell it the 601 South Charles Street property for \$5,300,000. However, the outstanding balance on the \$15 million UMMS had borrowed to purchase the property in 1996 is \$9,778,873. Applying the entire proceeds to the outstanding loan balance still leaves a debt to UMMS of \$4,478,873.

The Department of General Services recommends approval of the sale of the grant-funded property and of UMMS retaining the sale proceeds. This recommendation takes into account that UMMS continues to provide USH program services at Maryland General Hospital. Retaining the sales proceeds is conditioned on using those proceeds to pay down the outstanding USH acquisition debt.

Reason: The official State share for this project is 58.9% of all eligible costs in accordance with Section 11-105(j) of the Education Article and as referenced on previous (21-CGL 4/4/2012) and subsequent (23-CGL 5/28/2014 and 12-CGL 7/16/2015) BPW items associated with this project. The cost sharing had been "adjusted" with this item because anticipated additional costs exceeded total dollars available, and the college had agreed to pick up a larger share of those anticipated costs in order to also have access to \$312,000 available at that time from the MHEC contingency fund. However, when project was completed, those anticipated additional costs never materialized, and less State and local dollars were needed to complete the project. Because available funds were sufficient, the MHEC contingency was not used and therefore the State share should not have been adjusted. The State is obligated to pay 58.9% of all eligible costs in accordance with Section 11-105(j) of the Education Article.

Although the entire \$4,037,000 originally encumbered from MCCBL 2012, item 019 was spent due to the practice of spending oldest encumbered funds first, a total of \$312,000 in funds from MCCBL 2014, item 023 encumbered with item #12-CGL from the 7/16/2015 DGS BPW agenda that were not used will be unencumbered. A record correction to the related BPW item is being sent concurrent with this correction to make the appropriate change.
