If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope.

List of Companies Engaged in Investment Activities in Iran

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works add Sinopec and Sasol to the list of companies engaged in investment activities in Iran. Inclusion on the *Investment Activities in Iran List* would make Sinopec and Sasol ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with a public body in Maryland for goods or services. Inclusion on the IAI List also bars financial institutions extending credit to these companies persons in certain situations from contracting with public bodies in the State. The IAI List is published on the Board of Public Works Web site.

Authority: Investment Activities in Iran Act, Chapter 447 (Laws of 2012), codified at §17-701, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

Background: This law requires the Board to use credible public information to create a list of persons who are engaged in investment activities in Iran. Engaging in investment activities in Iran is defined as:

- Providing goods or services of at least \$20 million in the energy sector of Iran; or
- For financial institutions, extending credit of at least \$20.0 million to another person for at least 45 days if the person is on the Board of Public Works list and will use the credit to provide goods or services in the energy of Iran.

Before publishing the list, the Board must provide 90 days' written notice that the Board intends to include the person on the list; and that inclusion on the list makes the person ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or renew a contract with a public body for goods or services.

Reference is made to Secretary's Agenda Item 2 (February 20, 2013), in which the Board approved the issuance of 90-day notices to Sinopec and Sasol. Each company was given 90 days to provide written documentation demonstrating that they do not engage in investment activities in Iran.

Final List: Sinopec and Sasol were proposed for the IAI List in February and each was issued a 90-notice on February 20, 2013. Sasol responded to the 90-day notice but failed to demonstrate that it is not engaged in investment activities in Iran. Sinopec did not offer a response. Accordingly, it is recommended that the Board add Sinopec and Sasol to the IAI List of persons* ineligible to contract with public bodies.

Background: MSDE's County Library Capital Project Grant Program makes capital grants to county public library systems to support projects that address the State's library needs. The grants must be matched according to a wealth-based cost sharing formula (implemented June 1, 2013) and must be at least \$20,000. Grant funds rescinded in prior years by Anne Arundel, Baltimore, and St. Mary's Counties totaling \$976,300 are included for redistribution in fiscal year 2014.

9. STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the Maryland State Department of Education granting general-obligation bond proceeds of \$1,705,000 to Baltimore City to design the renovation of the Central Branch of the Enoch Pratt Free Library System.

Background: The Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library System is the State Library Resource Center. See Section 23-201, Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland. This 290,000 gross sqft building has not been completely renovated since its opening in 1933.

This project includes improvements to the building's structural, mechanical, and heating/ventilation/air conditioning systems. In addition, communication, fire protection, life safety, and accessibility issues will be addressed. Once complete, the building will comply with all building codes and provide the public with access to information and materials, using specialized staff, indepth collections, and links to global information sources.

The State's FY 2014 capital budget includes funding to complete project design.

Freedom Wastewater Treatment Plant

REMARKS: The Freedom District Wastewater Treatment Plant is one of 67 major facilities to be upgraded to Enhanced Nutrient Removal level of treatment to meet the Chesapeake Bay total maximum daily load and Watershed Implementation Plan. The WWTP treats flows from Springfield Hospital and Carroll County. Contractor's proposal included all five phases of the project but only the first three phases (design development; design; and bidding) were awarded.

Contractor has completed the design development phase; the design phase is 70% complete. During the design development additional elements were identified that needed to be added to the project. These items will increase process reliability and efficiency and correct additional deficiencies.

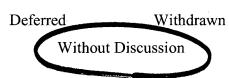

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace* (eMM), posted on the Comptroller's Procurement Website, and listed in the Comptroller of Maryland's contract brochure that is distributed at various procurement and MBE outreach events throughout the year. Quantria committed to additional hours as needed to prepare the database as well as additional training over the course of the contract should personnel change.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. The RFP was sent to 91 potential offerors, of which 68 are Maryland firms and 15 are MBEs. A copy of the RFP was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

The RFP defined four Functional Areas (FA) as shown below encompassing all required services:

- I. Creative Services
- II. Media Services
- III. Digital, Web and Social Engagement Design, Delivery and Hosting Services
- IV. Research Services

Offerors were allowed to submit proposals for one, some or all of the FAs and to receive a contract award for one or multiple FAs.

Seven offerors submitted proposals in response to the RFP, with a total of eight proposals for the individual FAs being received. Two of the proposals, one each for Functional Areas I and IV, were determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award and the financial proposals were returned unopened. Attachment 2 lists the proposals that were determined to be qualified and their ranking.

In FA I – Creative Services: Only one offer was deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror, Gray Kirk/VanSant Advertising, Inc. (GKV) was determined to be responsible, and the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable. GKV is therefore recommended for contract award.

In FA II – Media Services: The recommended contractor, Media Works, Ltd. (Media Works) was ranked first technically and first financially. Therefore, Media Works was determined to be the responsible Offeror offering the most advantageous offer to the State considering price and the evaluation factors set forth in the RFP and is recommended for contract award.

It was also was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation for this FA. GKV is therefore recommended for contract award.

In FA IV – Research: The recommended contractor, The Key Group, Inc. (Key) was ranked first technically and first financially. Therefore, Key was determined to be the responsible Offeror offering the most advantageous offer to the State considering price and the evaluation factors set forth in the RFP and is recommended for contract award.

The Contract for each FA establishes a fixed monthly fee amount that will be paid. The *Award Amounts* shown on Attachment 1 and the *Financial Offer* amounts shown on Attachment 2 are different.

The Award Amount (Attachment 1) is composed of two components as described below:

- <u>Contractor's Fee:</u> This component is the fixed monthly fee, based on the Financial Offers, to be paid to the Contractors for the services they provide in each Functional Area.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace*. Copies of the solicitation notice were sent directly to three prospective vendors, none of which are Maryland firms, and included no MBEs. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Two proposals were received in response to the RFP; however, only one was deemed to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. In addition, the Offeror was determined to be responsible, the financial offer was considered fair and reasonable, and it was determined that other potential offerors had a reasonable opportunity to respond to the solicitation. Therefore, award is recommended to Health Information Designs, LLC (HID). The second Offeror took exceptions to the provisions of the RFP and the standard contract.

The purpose of this Contract is to obtain a Contractor that has the technical and professional capabilities to continue the ongoing operation and management of the Maryland Drug Use Review (DUR) Program. The Maryland DUR Board was formed in November 1992 with the charge to assist the Department Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) with overseeing retrospective and prospective drug use review within the Maryland Medicaid Program and in conformity with the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990, §1927g(3). The DUR Board holds four meetings yearly. DHMH requires clinical expertise and the ability to perform claims data analysis, which is beyond the scope of the Department's in-house abilities.

A 10% MBE participation goal was established for this contract based upon the limited subcontracting opportunities: document preparation services and web page maintenance. The majority of the services are performed through the systems and, therefore, cannot be subcontracted. For this reason, no VSBE participation goal was established for this contract.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to simultaneously exercise the two one-year renewal options as contained in the original sole source contract with Dove Pointe Residential Services, Inc. (Dove Pointe). By exercising both renewal options simultaneously, developmentally disabled Residential Child Care (RCC) services will continue for three severely developmentally disabled youth currently placed at Dove Pointe. In addition to being severely developmentally disabled, two of the youth have medically fragile conditions (brain injury and shattered spine). Historically, once these types of vulnerable youth are placed in a residential facility, the youth usually do not change placements going into adulthood for continuity of care. During the second option period, two of the three youth will age out.

DHR negotiated the rates with Dove Pointe for the current contract and renewal option periods in order to maintain continuity of care for these three youth based upon the uniqueness of the facility to provide services for youth with these types of conditions and the close proximity to the youth's families. DHR believes that if it were to re-negotiate the daily rate for these youth for the next two years, there would be a rate increase for services. Therefore, it is believed to be in the State's best interest to simultaneously exercise the two one-year renewal options to maintain the established rates.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to continue existing project management and technical services by exercising the single one-year renewal option as contained in the original contract. This renewal option is needed to prevent an interruption in current work at existing sites with suspected releases and on-going remedial activities of hazardous substances.

Chesapeake Geo Sciences, Inc., (CGS) has performed the services under this contract in a satisfactory manner. CGS has been responsive to the needs of the Department.

As stated in the original agenda item, this contract has a \$10,000,000 Not-to-Exceed (NTE) finite cap. If all of the funds were expended during the base term of the contract, the renewal option would not be exercised. If the \$10M NTE had not been reached, the renewal option would be exercised at the established rates for the base term with no additional funding requested. At this time, there is approximately \$1,451,000 remaining on the contract. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the State to exercise this available renewal option.

Since this is the only renewal option for this contract the Department will re-solicit for these services during the renewal period. A new contract is expected to be in place prior to the expiration of this contract to continue work on the remediation of hazardous waste and petroleum disposal sites.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval of a modification to increase the available funding for the payment of commissions on additional reporting and remitting of unclaimed property. The Contractors' reporting and remitting efforts have greatly exceeded the estimates for the renewal option period. Based on the current monthly spend, the Comptroller estimates that the full amount of approved funding will be extinguished by September 2013.

At the time of the renewal option approval, not all of the Contractors had remittances since this was their first opportunity to work with the Comptroller's Office and had not acquired a "system" of identifying and remitting unclaimed property. However, since August 2012, several of the Contractors have had great successes, and the estimated number of gross receipts has increased by 61%. If the unclaimed property auditing firms continue to identify and remit property to the Comptroller's Office at the same rate as seen over the past six months, the Department could expect to receive an additional \$21.4M in revenue than the original estimate of \$13.9M for this renewal option period.

Therefore, it is in the best interest of the State to increase the available funding to continue providing these unclaimed property audit services.

Request for approval to modify the contract

to add additional drug tests that were not included in the contract.

The modification to the contract will add confirmation Gas Chromatography/Mass Spectrometry (GCMS) testing for benzodiazepines, opiates and PCP. This confirmation test is needed to ensure that the screened positive results for these substances were indeed positive results. Benzodiazepines, Opiates and PCP screens can show false positives. In order to maintain the integrity of the drug testing results, only true positives should be counted. In addition revocation requests are made to appointing authorities when the offender population tests positive for illegal substances. In order to maintain the Department's integrity and not to jeopardize an offender's liberty, drug tests results must be accurate.

The Department of Public Safety & Correctional Services (DPSCS) Community Supervision Division recognized that not running the confirmatory testing caused a high number of false positives, resulting in reliability problems and the need to run court-ordered second tests. DPSCS determined that the modification to the contract to include the confirmatory testing as a routine part of the screening process would increase reliability and decrease the need for required court-ordered confirmatory testing.

Community Supervision Division has revised the current drug testing policy based upon the determination that 80% of urine samples were negative and some offenders (supervisees) were being tested at higher rates and longer than required. The current urinalysis collection drug testing was reduced by 30%. Regular substance abuse screening is only conducted on the high risk offender population: violent offender, sex offenders and domestic violence offenders. The 30% decrease will not derogatorily impact the operations in any way.

The pricing for the confirmatory testing is valued at \$192,855 for the approximately 15 months remaining on the contract. However, the reduction in urinalysis drug testing will offset the pricing of the confirmatory testing. Therefore, no additional funding is being requested with this modification. For these reasons, this modification has been deemed to be in the best interest of the State.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Request for approval to extend the contract by one year inclusive of a 90-day transition period to the new contractor, if necessary, in order to allow sufficient time to develop and solicit a Request for Proposals (RFP) and award a new contract. If the full one-year extension is not needed, DHR has the ability to terminate the contract early for convenience.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was published on 12/9/2010. The proposed award to a new contractor was protested by the incumbent, The Active Network (TAN) on 7/20/2011; and subsequently appealed to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) on 8/19/2011. The appeal was upheld by the MSBCA on April 30, 2012. The decision by the MSBCA necessitated extending the contract with TAN for another year to allow time to draft a new RFP and conduct a new procurement for Call Center services (DBM BPW Agenda 7/11/2012, Item 11-S-MOD). DHR is currently re-drafting the RFP to include a number of enhancements to promote efficiencies in call center operations as compared to the previous RFP. As a result of the substantial re-write of the RFP, DHR is requesting an additional year to complete the procurement process and subsequent award of a new contract.

Call Center services are an inherent part of DHR operations alleviating staff from being inundated with and having to respond immediately to customer inquiries (verbal, paper and electronic), in order to devote essential time to casework, and to ensure that customer inquiries are responded to in a timely and efficient manner. The Call Center currently receives an estimated 93,000 customer inquiries per month with inbound calls averaging 89,000 per month. The requested amount of this extension takes into consideration the estimated monthly average of inbound calls with the unit price per call remaining unchanged.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Maxim Health Care Services, Inc., the Contractor, provides nursing services at ten DJS facilities for both full-time and back-up nursing coverage to supplement State employed nurses at the facilities. DJS is requesting approval to modify the Contract to allow for additional coverage at three of the DJS facilities.

There has been a dramatic increase in the frequency of female youth admitted with significant substance dependence disorders requiring monitoring, medication, and nursing intervention, especially in the first several days after admission due to withdraw from opiates, alcohol and/or benzodiazepines. In addition, there are the on-going admissions of youth who may need an infirmary setting or 24/7 nursing coverage due to recent trauma, surgery, illness or infection, complications related to pregnancy or a post gynecological procedure, and newly diagnosed or poorly controlled seizure disorders, asthma, diabetes, or hematological conditions.

DJS has 24/7 nursing coverage and infirmaries at the three large male facilities, but not at the facilities that house the female populations. At the J. DeWeese Carter Center, there has been an increase in the admission of pregnant girls. Having a nurse on site 24/7 will allow for immediate evaluation of pregnant youth by a health professional to provide prompt reassurance, treatment, further consultation, and/or emergency referral.

In order to <u>safely</u> meet the health needs of the female population, DJS also finds it necessary to have 24/7 routine nursing coverage at the Thomas J.S. Waxter Children's Center and the Alfred D. Noyes Children's Center. Females with critical health conditions currently must be managed with youth on regular housing units, without routine 24/7 nursing coverage and without infirmary beds, which could present a liability to the Department and a risk to the youth.

Currently, DJS attempts to arrange overnight nursing coverage when the need arises. However, unexpected 24/7 nursing coverage has been required much more frequently, in addition to nurses staying late or coming in early to monitor youth. When the State Nurses provide this coverage, it results in overtime and sometimes creates decreased routine scheduled coverage on the next shift, which also causes a hardship on the daily nursing routine. DJS also relies on the Contractor to provide nurses from time to time to stay late in order to cover hours when an unanticipated need for 24/7 nursing coverage arises.

This modification is in the best interest of the State based upon the reasons stated above.

By Maryland General Assembly legislative mandate per House Bill 1432 signed into law in May 2006, MSDE is authorized to contract with a qualified, private non-profit operator to develop, establish and operate a Public Residential Boarding Education Program School for disadvantaged at-risk youths in grades 6-12. Eligible students are recruited statewide and the program operates under the supervision of the MSDE. To be eligible to participate in the program, the student must be a Maryland resident disadvantaged at-risk youth currently enrolled in Grade 5 or 6. Programs offered include a rigorous curriculum with remedial component for middle school grades, college preparatory curriculum for high school grades, extracurricular activities such as athletics and cultural events, college admission counseling, health and mental health services, tutoring, community service opportunities and residential student life programs.

By statute, Annotated Code of Maryland Education Article §8-709-710, the SEED School of Maryland is funded as follows: the State pays up to 10 million dollars plus annual inflationary adjustment beginning in 2014 for up to maximum 400 grades 6-12 students enrolled in the program each fiscal year. In addition, the county boards of education will contribute 85% of the state and local cost per pupil for each student who participates in the program and domiciled in the county.

REQUESTING INSTITUTION REMARKS: To remain competitive in the online learning market, UMUC is making significant investments to refresh and replace outdated enterprise management tools and systems as part of its overall information technology strategic plan. UMUC has developed a technology roadmap that was recently initiated and is still evolving. Over the next several years, UMUC will require access to substantial human resources to accomplish these efforts. These resource demands are typically short-term in nature and often there must be staffing flexibility to respond to peak demands. The University has found that it is more efficient and cost effective to acquire the necessary expertise on a temporary basis. Further, these professional staffing contracts are useful for bridging transitions in the event of staff vacancies. Many of the skills and the levels of effort required to maintain service at acceptable levels often require almost immediate replacement.

Examples of programs for which professional staff services are needed include: (1) a multi-year program to replace UMUC's learning management system that is core to UMUC's mission to deliver on-line courses and programs; (2) customer relationship management system that records all communications with UMUC's students from prospect through alumni status; (3) improvement to UMUC's web presence, portal platform, and online student experience, and (4) cloud computing migration from legacy technology to establish efficiencies in course and program delivery.

REQUESTING INSTITUTION REMARKS (cont'd): UMUC has been successful in acquiring professional technical and project management staffing resources for these projects through these contracts. These vendors have done so well that most of UMUC's professional staffing needs can be found through these contracts and the hourly rates are more favorable with equal or better talent available through other similar contracts available to UMUC. As there are substantial investments yet to make for the extensive retooling of UMUC's technology enterprise platforms, UMUC requires additional spending authority to access the specialists needed to drive these projects.

UMUC terminated one of the originally awarded firms LanceSoft, Inc. as this firm did not responded to staffing requests and is out of compliance with the State Department of Taxation and Assessments.

The USM Board of Regents has approved UMUC's request to add funds.

REMARKS: iSecuretrac provides GPS equipment and services to DJS under an intergovernmental cooperative purchasing agreement negotiated using the federal GSA contract. GPS is critical to the DJS Violence Prevention Initiative because it allows DJS personnel to track the whereabouts of youth at high risk of committing violence or becoming a victim. The equipment provides DJS personnel with the location of the youth they are supervising.

DJS issued specification requirements for obtaining a near real-time GPS system to track juvenile offenders through intergovernmental purchasing agreements in March 2013. Several responses were received from various vendors. DJS began field testing the equipment supplied by the vendors in May 2013. It is anticipated that evaluations and a determination of the contract award will be made in late 2013. DJS requires additional time to switch out old equipment for the new equipment and orient staff with a new vendor. It is essential to not have a break in services during the orientation phase of the new contract.

REMARKS: Through this contract, the State is building a radio system that will be the primary operating radio system for all State agencies. The system will provide a communications platform for 16 State units and allow for seamless interoperability among State users.

When the Board of Public Works approved the award of this contract, it approved DoIT issuing a notice to proceed for only Phase 1-Region 1A. The approved Item expressly states: "As funding becomes available, DoIT will return to the Board for approval to award (*i.e.*, issue a notice to proceed) each successive phase.

DoIT now seeks approval to:

- (1) To issue a notice to proceed with Region 1, Central Maryland. Capital funds in FY 14 were appropriated for Region 1 activities. Region 1, Central Maryland includes Baltimore, Cecil, Harford, Howard, Carroll, Frederick and Anne Arundel Counties. This project is now being funded on a cash flow basis by fiscal year (rather than previous funding approach for a full Region at a time).
- (2) To deploy, test and accept the system on a county-by-county basis which provides more efficiency than previous model requiring acceptance on region-wide basis. Experience with the Eastern Shore roll-out has made it apparent that deploying, testing and acceptance of an entire Region is not the optimum approach. It is more efficient to deploy, test and accept the system county-by-county which is a more manageable area and set of sites to monitor and evaluate.

REMARKS (cont'd):

DoIT intends to use the contingency scope included in the contract originally approved. The contract has a line item that provides for contingency that allows the project team to address unknowns that could not have been reasonably identified during requirements definition. The sites were originally surveyed in 2008. As each site is reviewed during final engineering and design, each may require additional work, such as strengthening the towers, adding generators, electricity and even new shelters. Each site must also be connected by fiber optic cable or microwave and some links do not exist or must be expanded for the capacity needed for the 700 MHz system or both. This work could not reasonably be specifically scoped in the original requirements. The need to use the contingency scope may occur across any of the Phases/Regions. The funding for the contingency work anticipated in FY14 is included in the FY14 appropriation.

REMARKS: In 2008 the Maryland Transit Administration, together with the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (GCRTA), the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA), and the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Authority (Metro LA), developed and deployed breakthrough technology that warns track work crews, track inspectors and trespassers of approaching trains. MTA, GCRTA, MBTA, and Metro LA, working with ProTran Technology, developed and tested these devices which warn track work crews and train operators of track personnel ahead; train operators of dangers such as fires, chemical, biological releases in transit tunnels; trespassers on right of way; and, hi-rail vehicle operators to prevent collisions with other vehicles or personnel on the tracks.

REMARKS (cont'd): MTA's Metro and Light Rail systems use this equipment. MTA has started a training program with Baltimore City's first responders. There could be scenarios when first responders would arrive at a metro accident before MTA. Using MTA safety warning devices will provide additional protection.

The MTA has a total of 120 fixed advanced warning devices used in heavy rail and 100 fixed advanced warning devices used by light rail personnel. MTA recently expanded from fixed warning safety devices to mobile safety devices to keep personnel safe when working around the train tracks. The maintenance, update and replacement for both fixed and mobile units must be implemented to ensure the devices are operational at all times. MTA has tested this equipment for two years and found it to be an effective tool for employee safety.

The original supplier and manufacturer, ProTran Technology, is the only company that can provide this service. When the safety technology market expands, it may be possible to solicit proposals from other manufacturers. Currently, however, this sole source procurement is the only feasible option, being both cost effective by using existing equipment and gaining replacement and maintenance ensuring functioning safety equipment.

The proposal includes the cost for monthly inspections, replacement of existing devices as needed, and training on updated equipment as required.

General Professional Services Selection Board, the Chairman of the Qualification Committee reported that twelve (12) of the seventeen (17) firms which submitted technical proposals achieved the minimum qualifying score of 85% and were potentially eligible to provide the required services. The Committee asked the Board to authorize the request of price proposals from the top six (6) scoring firms.

The Request for Technical Proposals issued for this IQC stated a maximum of six (6) qualified firms would be selected for contract award. The price proposal submitted by each firm reflected billing rates for each discipline required for this contract. The billing rates were inclusive of direct salaries, fringe benefits, overhead, profit, materials, and all other costs, direct and indirect.

The fee for each project awarded under the proposed agreement shall be negotiated and the contract will be approved and executed by the State individually. Projects will normally be awarded on a rotating basis beginning with the number one ranked firm. Once the project award process has been initiated with a firm in the normal rotation, the next opportunity for project award will go to the next firm in the rotation unless the unit issuing the assignment finds that: the firm is unable to perform the assignment; the hours or fees proposed by the firm for services needed cannot successfully be negotiated to an amount the State considers fair and reasonable; another firm has special experience or qualifications, including geographic proximity to the site for which services are needed, that make it in the best interest of the State to give the assignment to another firm; or assignment to another firm would tend to balance to a greater extent, among firms on the IQC list being used, the fees paid or payable for work assignments previously issued.

At the May 23, 2013 public meeting of the General Professional Services Selection Board, the Chairman of the Negotiation Committee certified to the General Board that the negotiations were conducted in accordance with the regulations governing the Negotiation Committee and that the price proposals were determined to be fair, competitive, and reasonable. The price proposals and the scope of services represented by the price proposals were reviewed by the General Professional Services Selection Board. The price proposals were accepted by the General Board as fair, competitive, and reasonable as required by Title 13-308 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

The Negotiation Committee's recommendation was approved by the General Professional Services Selection Board on May 23, 2013 and is recommended to the Board of Public Works for approval.

Each project/task order to be assigned under the terms of this indefinite delivery contract will be reviewed to determine the MBE participation to be achieved on that project. Two of the recommended firms, M S Engineers, Inc, Cert. #01-068, and Min Engineering, Inc., Cert # 08-499, are MDOT certified MBE firms.

REQUEST

Request is being made of the Board of Public Works to approve the acceptance of a Deed of Easement on a 30 acre tract of farm land and a Deed of Restrictions on an adjacent 30.752 acre tract in exchange for modified final releases of the owner's lot and child's lot.

REFERENCE

Reference is made to Item 18-RP of the Board of Public Works Agenda of October 24, 2001, wherein approval was given to the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation (hereinafter, "MALPF") to acquire an Agricultural Preservation Easement on 150 acres of land, more or less, for \$475,510 from P. Michael and Nancy Larrick. Purchase of the Easement was completed on January 31, 2002.

HISTORY

As permitted by law and the terms of the Easement, MALPF approved for release three child's lots and one owner's lot on June 24, 2003. A final release for the owner's lot was recorded on October 20, 2003, and transferred to a third party on September 15, 2004, without the Foundation's knowledge or approval. A final release for a child's lot for Christopher Larrick was recorded on December 28, 2004, and transferred to a third party on July 28, 2005, without the Foundation's knowledge or approval. These transfers violated the terms of the releases and the applicable statutes and regulations, which required that lots be occupied by the person or persons for whom they are released for five years prior to transfer.

MALPF contacted the Larrick family in November 2006 about the illegal transfer of the two lots to ineligible third parties. MALPF also noted that right of way agreements had been executed in favor of Potomac Edison Company dated October 16, 2003; January 18, 2005; and March 8, 2005, without MALPF's approval. In addition, MALPF also noted that a Forest Conservation Overlay easement dated August 4, 2004, was entered into without MALPF's approval.

Negotiations ensued and MALPF reached an agreement in principle with the Larricks to resolve all of the violations in March 2010. The Larricks sold the farm encumbered by the MALPF easement in 2004, but acquired an adjacent tract of approximately 60 acres of farm land. In order to resolve the violations, the Larricks offered to encumber 30 acres of their 60- acre farm with an agricultural preservation easement in favor of MALPF, retiring all but one development right. They agreed to place deed restrictions on the remaining 30 acre tract to prohibit further

development and permanently tie the existing dwelling to the property. The Larricks also agreed to develop soil conservation and water quality plans for each 30 acre tract.

MALPF staff and the Attorney General's office worked with Department of General Services to appraise the property, assign values to each aspect of the settlement, and evaluate settlement terms. The Larricks had the property surveyed, designated a building envelope for the proposed 30 acre easement tract, and developed soil conservation and water quality plans for each 30 acre tract. MALPF performed a baseline monitoring inspection of the proposed 30 acre easement tract and determined that the property met soils criteria.

MALPF recommends this settlement because it reflects a satisfactory value to the program to resolve the pending violations. The MALPF Board of Trustees endorsed the settlement on May 28, 2013.

REMARKS

- 1. The Department of General Service's Office of Real Estate recommends the settlement.
- 2. The Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation recommends approval of this item. If approved, MALPF will encumber 30 acres of a 60-acre farm with an Easement containing one building envelope adjacent to the 142 acre original easement property, with all 60 acres restricted from further development.

No State funds will be disbursed until the grantee has presented suitable evidence to the Office Comptroller that it has expended the required matching funds for this project. After the grantee has met this requirement; all future invoices will be submitted to the Office of Comptroller, who will disburse the State portion in amounts equal to the invoices submitted.
