Established in 1995, the *Neighborhood Business Development Program*, now operating as *Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW)*, is a Smart Growth tool for revitalization through business creation or expansion in designated revitalization areas.

- *Borrower:* Rollins Investment Holdings LLC
- *Project Property:* 330 Catoctin Avenue, Frederick 21701 Frederick County

Loan Amount: \$545,000

Fund Source: MCCBL of 2020: *Provide funds for grants and loans to fund community-based economic development activities in revitalization areas designed by local governments.* Item SA24(B).

Collateral: Second lien position Deed of Trust on project property.

Project Description: Rollins Life Celebration Center, formerly known as Gary L. Rollins Funeral Home, will relocate the funeral home to Catoctin Avenue in Frederick County. Rollins Investment Holdings, LLC is the real estate holding company for the Rollins Life Celebration Center. Upon completion, the Rollins Life Celebration Center will include approximately 9,200 square feet of state of the art newly constructed commercial space. The new facility will allow for business expansion and expansion of the services offered.

The loan request of \$545,000 is to assist with the construction costs associated with the relocation. The funeral home currently operates from 110 West South Street, Frederick, MD. The existing property consists of a 27,500 sq. ft. lot and a two-story commercial building that was built in 1850. The property was sold to Frederick County to develop needed affordable housing in the area.





Project Description (cont'd):

The subject property is in the Carrollton neighborhood of Frederick County. The Carrollton neighborhood is a demographically diverse neighborhood consisting of mostly older homes that date back to the 1960's. The mature neighborhood continues to see a small annual population growth with several newer neighborhoods developed in recent years nearby.

In addition to the NBW - Classic funds of \$545,000, the project is also receiving funding from The Harbor Bank of Maryland in the amount of \$2,000,000. Harbor Bank will hold a first lien position loan on the project property. With total project costs exceeding \$3.3 million, the project represents a strong example of the public – private financial partnership needed to complete the project. Upon completion, the Rollins Life Celebration Center will include over 9,200 square feet of newly constructed commercial space. The building will be state of the art and will feature energy efficient systems that include HVAC, electrical including lighting, windows and doors, plumbing and mechanical, along with thermal and moisture protection. The work will be completed by Morgan-Keller Specialty Contractors of Frederick, MD.

The Rollins Life Celebration Center will contribute to the revitalization of Frederick County by completing the acquisition of a vacant commercial property in the Carrollton neighborhood and constructing a new commercial building that will provide valuable funeral and cremation services to the community. The proposed project will allow the long time business an opportunity to transform, relocate, and build a new modern facility that will be constructed to the specific needs of the business. The proposed project will also allow NBW to increase its footprint into Frederick County, one of the underserved western counties by the NBW program. Many local construction jobs will be created and upon completion, several new mortuary positions will be needed. The Rollins Life Celebration Center is the only African American owned funeral business in Frederick and NBW's support is needed to complete the project.



10. <u>DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES</u> Coastal Resiliency Program

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve DNR granting \$1,174,291.39 in general obligation bond proceeds to construct a restoration project in Somerset County.

Authority: § 8-301, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland

Program: The Coastal Resiliency Program was developed to address escalating risks to Maryland communities and public resources from extreme weather and climate-related events. Recognizing that coastal habitats buffer communities from weather-related events such as hurricanes and flooding, DNR developed a Coastal Resiliency Assessment. This targeting model identifies areas where restoration can provide the greatest protection benefits for infrastructure, communities, businesses, and habitats. The Coastal Resiliency Program will implement on-the-ground natural and nature-based projects in priority areas where nature can help communities become more resilient to flooding and erosion. Projects will protect both public and private investments, while demonstrating a suite of nature-based projects that will enhance the ability of communities to respond to or recover from storms, flooding and other coastal hazards.

DNR will provide technical assistance and grant funds to entities to construct living shoreline, marsh enhancement, green infrastructure and nature-based projects. These projects will restore eroding shorelines at vulnerable locations along the State's coast and reduce the impacts of flooding on vulnerable communities. Design for these projects were previously approved. Final design plans and permits are in hand, and DNR is seeking approval to award construction funds. After construction, DNR will return to the Board for approval to award adaptive management funds if warranted.

REVISED

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the Department of Natural Resources disbursing \$9,843,400 from the Ocean Beach Maintenance Fund for costs related to beach nourishment.

Project: Ocean City Beach Replenishment Project: Local Cooperation Agreement for Performance: Monitoring, Maintenance, and Periodic Nourishment between the State of Maryland, the Local Sponsor, and the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers (March 30, 1990).

Authority: § 8-1103, Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland

Periodic Beach Nourishment: The Army Corps of Engineers estimates in the General Design Memorandum that periodic nourishment activities will be undertaken every four years to compensate for the natural movement of sand along the shoreline. The last periodic nourishment effort took place in winter 2017. That effort also included repair of damages caused by Tropical Storm Jonas, and the project was paid for with a combination of state and federal funds.

Monitoring surveys conducted indicate that portions of the beach do not provide the design level of protection set forth in the Memorandum. Approximately 895,000 cubic yards of sand are needed to restore the beach to the full design level, including advanced nourishment.

Under the Local Cooperation Agreement, periodic nourishment is cost-shared at the rate of 53% federal and 47% non-federal. The non-federal portion of the cost is further shared at the rate of 50% State, 25% Worcester County, and 25% Town of Ocean City.



Requesting Agency Remarks: This revenue generating transaction results from a resource sharing agreement between Maryland Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, Maryland transportation Authority, the Department of Information Technology and Level 3 Communications LLC. This agreement contemplates a non-exclusive use of 330 miles of the State right of way for Level 3 to install and maintain a multiple-conduit, fiber-optic network.

In exchange for the non-exclusive use of the State rights or way, Level 3 will provide the State with high-speed, high-capacity 24-strand fiber optic cable bundles and related duct conduit systems along each of the following highway segments:

- Baltimore to Delaware State line (I-95)
- Baltimore to Washington, DC (I-97 to US 50 to MD 704)
- Washington, DC to Frederick (I-495 to I-270)
- Frederick to Maryland/West Virginia State Line (I-70 to I-68)
- From Nice Bridge to Washington, DC (US-301 to MD 227)

This first modification is the result of a settlement agreement between the parties which modifies and sets a guaranteed annual revenue for a 14.5-mile portion referred to as conduit 3 along US-301. Original contract terms required a self-reporting of conduit 3 usage whereby Level 3 has long contended that only 14.5 miles is in use. MDOT audit of the fiber usage confirms that assertion, and this modification clarifies the payment terms for that segment of fiber. This amendment does not change the estimated minimum or maximum anticipated revenues.




Remarks (cont'd):

MSA and the CM conducted pre-bid and site visit meetings at the project site, and all attendees were provided with summary project information and afforded the opportunity to tour the project site. Additionally, the project was presented at multiple outreach events which were attended by numerous trade contractors as well as Mayor's Office of Employment Development, MSA, and other representatives and agencies regarding contracting, MBE participation, and local hiring opportunities.

On January 28th and February 17th, 2021 competitive, sealed trade contractor bids were received and opened at the CM's offices in Timonium, Maryland. Post-bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and all bid openings and scope reviews were attended by MSA. The CM received 121 bids for the 31 bid packages advertised.

Efforts to maximize Maryland's commitment to protecting the environment and incorporating green building standards to reduce the effects on climate change resulted in the project attaining 30% water use reduction, 27% site storm water runoff reduction, and 32% energy savings by using efficient MEP systems, fixtures, and equipment. Additionally, overall construction waste is being reduced 75% through adaptive reuse and waste diversion.



Certification That Conviction in Error. Baltimore City State's Attorney correspondence documents that, in 2020, the Circuit Court, in setting aside the verdict, granted Mr. Thomas a Writ of Actual Innocence pursuant to § 8-301(h) of the Criminal Procedure Article. The State's Attorney then entered a *nolle prosequi* having determined Mr. Thomas is factually innocent of the charges.

Compensation. In compensating an individual under § 10-501, the Board may grant "an amount commensurate with the actual damages sustained [and] a reasonable amount for any financial or other appropriate counseling."

- Actual Damages. It is recommended that the State compensate Mr. Thomas \$ 1,614,531 as an amount commensurate with his actual damages. This amount was derived applying
 US Census Bureau, American Community Survey, 5-year estimate of the Maryland Median Household Income (in 2019 dollars), 2015-2019 of \$ 84,805 per year of Mr. Thomas' confinement.
- *Counseling*. It is recommended additionally that the State provide Mr. Thomas \$ 10,616, for mental health and financial counseling.

Release. Mr. Thomas shall sign a release form prior to payment.



Requesting Agency Remarks: Nature of Emergency -COVID-19: On March 5, 2020, Governor Larry Hogan issued a Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of Catastrophic Health Emergency due to the outbreak of a severe respiratory disease resulting in illness or death that is caused by the person-to-person spread of the novel coronavirus. The anticipated surge of patients seeking urgent medical attention, as presented by the Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) and Maryland Department of Health (MDH), required immediate, innovative solutions to expeditiously detect and identify areas of increased viral activity. The Maryland Department of the Environment deployed the sewer sentinel project to detect COVID in wastewater.

On January 12, 2021, Governor Larry Hogan announced that the first variant of the coronavirus was detected in Maryland. Subsequently, two additional strains were detected in Maryland. The variants are presumed to be more contagious than the original COVID-19 virus.

This modification involves a more detailed analysis of samples already being analyzed by CosmosID, Inc. The detection of the variant strains in Maryland, including the recent death of a citizen linked to a variant strain created an urgent health emergency that needed immediate attention. Bidding this portion of the project out would have taken time away from the analysis, further risking the health and welfare of Marylanders. CosmosID, Inc. has the capability to further analyze the variant strains. Further, having the same firm analyzing the samples collected is more advantageous to Maryland scientifically.




Requesting Agency Remarks: Nature of Emergency: Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, the MDTA had solely relied on Contract SV-3009-0000 to secure enhanced cleaning services in response to positive COVID-19 cases within various MDTA facilities. However, the day-to-day operational functions under this contract were also needed in order to maintain facility operations and support environmental regulatory compliance efforts. It is critical that the MDTA is able to continue the cleaning services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Loss of providing the enhanced services would result either in shutting the MDTA facilities down or disrupting the operations and putting the safety and security of the traveling public at risk, and ultimately, putting the employees' lives at risk who work at these facilities.

Early in the pandemic, in April of 2020, there were sufficient funds remaining in this contract to plan for a no-cost extension in 2021; however, these funds were quickly depleted due to the unexpected COVID-19 pandemic cleaning needs. There was no way to anticipate the erratic requirements of COVID-19 on this contract, which has necessitated this Emergency modification. To maintain support of these critical MDTA services, MDTA declared an emergency for awarding a one-year extension to Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc.

Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc., with their current contract in place, is the best option to continue to provide the critical hazard removal services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) engaged the assistance of a land trust partner, the Trust for Public Land (TPL), to acquire the property, complete all required work, and convey the property to DNR.

The Agreement of Sale contained a condition of closing whereby the State would be included as a reliance party in any seller affidavit in connection with the sale of the property from the Candlands to TPL. However, the State was not included as a reliance party.

TPL acquired the Candland property on February 14, 2020 and completed all work, though experienced significant COVID-related delays in the completion of that work. These delays resulted in cost differences within the reimbursements approved to TPL, though the total approved reimbursement amount is not changed. The Board of Public Works approved an amount not to exceed \$259,045 in reimbursements to the TPL on January 29, 2020.

Proposed Action: In order to redress the issues identified with the Agreement of Sale, an amendment is being proposed to 1) address an outstanding condition of closing, and 2) revise the allocation of reimbursements to the Trust for Public Land.

The Amendment to the Agreement of Sale addresses the omission of the condition to include the State as a reliance party by including a provision that protects the State's interests in the event a loss is sustained. The Agreement of Sale and the Amendment have been approved by the Office of the Attorney General.

In order to address cost differences within the reimbursements, a reallocation of the reimbursements among the identified categories, without exceeding the total approved reimbursements cost of \$259,045, is proposed. The original and updated reimbursement amounts are below.

A Pre-proposal meeting was conducted with representatives from 14 firms in attendance. Twelve technical proposals were received. These proposals were evaluated by a University Evaluation Committee. Seven proposers were shortlisted and were invited to interview sessions; however, one firm withdrew from the process. Following the interviews, the Committee conducted a second phase technical evaluation resulting in all six firms remaining shortlisted and invited to submit a price proposal. All six firms demonstrated appropriate technical capability. After the price proposals were received and evaluated, the University and AE held scope review meetings with the recommended firm due to the significant price differential. Based on these sessions, there was no evidence to indicate that the recommended firm's price was not responsive. Award is recommended to Plano-Coudon, the lowest-priced, technically-qualified firm.

Sustainability. The sustainable approaches for the project include: utilizing and renovating existing facilities to extend their lifespan and minimizing the use of additional embodied resources; connecting with existing campus bike and pedestrian path network; and providing no increase to the overall parking footprint.

The building systems are designed to be energy efficient and low maintenance. High efficiency heat pumps, occupancy sensors, time scheduling controls, and low flow plumbing fixtures will reduce energy and resource consumption in this irregularly occupied facility to only be consumed when required. LED lighting, occupancy sensor, and photocell controls will provide interior energy savings of 31% over the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code compliance baseline.







Ventilation will be increased throughout the buildings and although small in quantity, any interior finishes will be selected for their low-emitting properties. The updated glazing will also promote greater natural daylight and views to the outdoors.

This Item is for award of pre-construction and professional design services through bidding. Barton Malow's design team is led by Design Collective of Baltimore, MD. The agreement includes professional design and preconstruction services, construction and post construction services fees, and general conditions for a total negotiated amount of \$3.9 million. If the University and contractor agree to construction costs following the solicitation of trade contracts, the University will return to the Board with a recommendation to modify the contract to include the actual construction costs in the form of Bid Packages, general conditions, and the construction services fee.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Child Support Administration (CSA) is currently nearing completion and deployment of a new Child Support Management System (CSMS) as part of the Maryland Total Human-services Integrated network (MD THINK) endeavor. CSMS will replace the badly outdated legacy mainframe child support system and will include a direct interface to the State Disbursement Unit (SDU) data system. This new CSMS application is scheduled for deployment in pilot this summer, with full statewide implementation by the end of the year. Transition to a new SDU vendor during this critical period of final development and deployment would create a significant risk for development delays or disruption of service. SMI has agreed to upgrade their system to accommodate the rollout of the CSMS. Extending the current Contract by one year allows CSA additional time to accommodate the anticipated system transition and incorporate the new requirements of CSMS into a competitive Request for Proposal for the future provision of these services.

CSA is also requesting to increase the funding for this contract for unanticipated costs incurred to assist customers and child support workers during the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic. This included additional Local Office Mail (LOM) Program costs to forward mail to the SDU for scanning so child support workers on telework could receive mail remotely. Increased costs also resulted from CSA's decision to pay credit card fees on behalf of child support customers to alleviate hardships while cash payments could not be accepted due to office and court closures. As a result, CSA requests the additional funding for continued support of the services planned and unplanned over the past year to lead us through the end of the Contract in 2022.

SMI has successfully processed 100% of all identifiable payments received daily, responded to all customer service inquiries within 24 hours of receipt with excellent feedback, and reimbursed CSA for any misapplied payments daily which occur at a rate of less than 1%. Discontinuing this contract would cause an interruption to federal required services for Maryland's families and children. A new request for proposals to replace the current contract is in process with an anticipated release date in late May 2021. 





Background: The Baltimore County Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability is proposing to reactivate the Bird River Dredge Material Placement site (BRDMP), which is a previously used site partly located within Gunpowder Falls State Park in Baltimore County, and partly on land owned by Baltimore County. The project will allow excavation and dredging of a portion of the Bird River, with dredged material transferred to a Dredge Material Placement site. The Dredge Material Placement site was constructed in 2002 adjacent to an existing Baltimore County site and was then expanded onto State property. There are no currently authorized sites on State property, nor for existing wetlands mitigation on State property. Therefore, Easements are necessary to allow for placement of the dredged material on the area within the Gunpowder Falls State Park, and for the continuation of the existing wetlands mitigation. No dredging will commence until the Easements are approved by the BPW. The permanent easement will require that Baltimore County assume all liability for the BRDMP site with regard to management and maintenance, including the wetlands mitigation area. The Easement will also require that Baltimore County provide dredge material space for DNR and permit future access for State use. Baltimore County has submitted a Joint Permit Application to the Maryland Department of the Environment for the project.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Request approval to increase grant funding in the amount of \$10,000,000 from the Relief Act Funds to the eight (8) incumbent Fund Managers. For fiscal years' 2018, 2019, and 2020, no appropriation was approved for the program as funding was reallocated. In fiscal year 2021, an appropriation of \$17.1 million was approved. As such, the Department invited all eight existing fund managers to reapply for additional funds, and prepared a Request for Proposal (RFP) to invite new fund managers to apply for SMWOBA funds. All eight existing fund managers reapplied and were awarded funds by the Board of Public Works on December 2, 2020. The total recommendation of awarded funds by the committee and subsequently approved by the BPW was \$11 million.

A Request for Proposal #**T00R1600131** for additional fund managers was cancelled and the \$6.0 million made available to the existing fund managers and BPW approved March 24,2021.

The purpose of the additional grant funding is to provide monies to the Fund to be used and administered, managed, and accounted for by the Fund Manager on behalf of the Fund and for the benefit of the State of Maryland to make loans to or investments in Eligible Targeted Businesses located in the State of Maryland.

BPW retained the right to approve additional grant funding to the Fund Managers and the BPW approved contracts were constructed to allow disbursement of additional funds without modifying the contract.






