Recommendation: The Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE), in coordination with the Maryland Environmental Service (MES), recommends approval of funding up to \$1,666,000 for the following scrap tire project costs:

A. Agricultural Scrap Tire Collection Event

Because of the very popular response to the past MDE and MES sponsored Citizen and Agricultural Drop-Off Day projects, and requests from the public, MDE along with partners from the Maryland Farm Bureau, County representatives, and MES plan to conduct an Agricultural Scrap Tire Collection Event. The project is designed to assist Maryland farmers by providing an opportunity for responsible disposal of accumulated scrap tires. The project will encourage the collection and proper management of scrap tires from farms, avoiding hazards from scrap tire fires and mosquito and other vector harborage associated with scrap tire dumping.

B. Citizen Scrap Tire Collection Event

Because of the very popular response to the prior Citizen and Agricultural Drop-Off Day projects and requests from the public and County representatives, MDE and MES plan to conduct a Citizen Scrap Tire Collection Event. The project is designed to assist Maryland citizens by providing a responsible disposal alternative for accumulated scrap tires. The project will encourage the collection and proper management of scrap tires from citizens' properties, avoiding hazards from scrap tire fires and mosquito and other vector harborage associated with scrap tire dumping. MDE, in conjunction with MES, has conducted similar events in previous years.

C. Small Scrap Tire Stockpile Cleanups

MDE, in conjunction with MES, will clean up small scrap tire stockpiles (1,000 scrap tires or fewer) from sites where the property owners were not responsible for placing the scrap tires on site. These sites (approximately 25 sites in 14 counties and Baltimore City) represent approximately 74% of the remaining illegal scrap tire stockpiles identified in Maryland. MDE has worked for years on many of these sites to encourage property owners to voluntarily clean up the illegally stockpiled scrap tires, without success. Due to the size of these stockpiles, obtaining court orders for the property owners to clean up the scrap tires would be more costly than performing a State funded cleanup. Also, court orders would not guarantee that the sites would actually get cleaned up if the property owners do not have sufficient funds to remove the scrap tires. MDE will abate the threat posed by the illegal stockpiles in the least expensive manner available by using the Fund to remove the scrap tires from the sites.

A. Banneker-Douglass Museum/former Mount Moriah AME Church \$100,000 84 Franklin Street, Annapolis, Anne Arundel County

Grantee: Banneker-Douglass Museum Foundation, Inc.

Description: Interior rehabilitation including repair / replacement / refinishing of flooring; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000 estimated.]

Remarks: Mt. Moriah African Episcopal Church was built in 1874 by a congregation of free Blacks whose roots go back to 1799, and as such is one of Maryland's earliest African American churches. Over its history, Mt. Moriah served as a house of worship, an educational facility, and a meeting place for social and cultural events; it is currently not used for worship but is the home of the Banneker-Douglass Museum, a state-owned museum of African American history and culture.

B.Sphinx Club\$100,0002101-2111 Pennsylvania Ave, Baltimore City\$100,000Grantee: Druid Heights Community Development Corporation

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including structural stabilization; masonry and carpentry repairs; mechanical, electrical, and plumbing system installation / repairs; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000 estimated.]

Remarks: The Sphinx Club opened in this building in 1946 in an era of segregated public venues; this was one of the nation's first minority-owned membership night clubs. The Sphinx Club became the center of social life along Pennsylvania Avenue, where African Americans could enjoy some of America's most famous musicians and entertainers. The building has recently been stabilized.



C. Bethel AME Church (Bethel Center) 413 G Street, Mountain Lake Park, Garrett County

\$100,000

Grantee: Engage Mountain Maryland, Inc.

Description: Relocation and interior and exterior rehabilitation including stabilization; framing and carpentry repairs / replacement; construction of foundation; repair / replacement of windows, doors, siding, trim, and roof; installation of utilities and security system; site work; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000 estimated.]

Remarks: Built on a lot in Oakland purchased by trustees in 1895, Bethel AME Church served as a house of worship for a small Black community that lived in Garrett County around the turn of the twentieth century. The property was foreclosed on in the 1930s and a local farmer purchased the structure, disassembled it into large pieces, and reassembled it on a nearby farm for use as a carriage house and blacksmith shop. The sale of Bethel AME Church coincided with an exodus of African Americans from Garrett County caused by racial terror and economic conditions. The small, gable-roofed, frame building is proposed to be relocated to the town of Mountain Lake Park for use as a community gathering space.

D. Franklin Cemetery (Tanyard Cemetery) north side of Deale Beach Road, Deale, Anne Arundel County Grantee: Franklin United Methodist Church

Description: Conservation of cemetery including installation of fencing, and architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$18,000 estimated.]

Remarks: Located in the small community of Deale, the Tanyard-Franklin Cemetery is associated with one of the African American Methodist gathering places in southern Anne Arundel County. Local residents as well as congregants of Franklin United Methodist Church are interred in the cemetery. The oldest grave marker dates to 1842.

E.Mt. Nebo AME Church\$67,00017304 Queen Anne Road, Upper Marlboro, Prince George's CountyGrantee: Friends of Historic Mt. Nebo Preservation Corporation

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including repair / replacement of doors; site work; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$67,000 estimated.]

Remarks: Mt. Nebo African Methodist Episcopal Church is a rare survival of a rural AME church in Prince George's County. The church was constructed in 1925, replacing an earlier building from 1877. The current project will rehabilitate the building for use as a community center.



F. Havre de Grace Colored School Museum and Cultural Center \$100,000 555 Alliance Street, Havre de Grace, Harford County

Grantee: The Havre de Grace Colored School Museum and Cultural Center, Incorporated

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including site work; repair and waterproofing of foundation; repair / replacement of walls, ceilings, floors, woodwork, and trim; carpentry repairs; painting; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000 estimated.]

Remarks: The original Havre de Grace Colored School is a two-room building constructed in 1910 by Harford County Public Schools to educate primary-school-age Black children. In 1930, a four-room brick addition was constructed to serve as the first public high school for African American students in Harford County. Prior to the construction of the high school, Harford County's African American students had to travel to Baltimore City, Cecil County, or Pennsylvania to receive a high school education. The property is used as a museum and cultural center.

G. Elk Landing - Hollingsworth House 590 Landing Lane, Elkton, Cecil County

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including ceiling, wall, door, floor, masonry, carpentry, and plaster repair; painting and finishes; electrical upgrades; and architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$48,000 estimated.]

Remarks: The Hollingsworth House is part of Elk Landing and was built sometime after Zebulon Hollingsworth acquired the property in 1735. An 1848 fire gutted the house, which was then remodeled to include an east wing and a front porch. The kitchen and slave quarters above it were likely a separate building until the remodel. The house will continue to be used as a living history museum with an opportunity to interpret the African American experience.

H. Bellevue Passage Museum

Remarks: The building proposed to house the Bellevue Passage Museum was built circa 1900 on a lot on Dawson Street in the historically African American community of Bellevue. It is a small, single story, rectangular frame store building with a hipped roof. It was occupied in the

early twentieth century by John U. Greene; its use as a privately run business was unusual in the company-oriented town created through the designs and financing of the local canning and packing business owner. The small structure has been moved several times throughout its history, and the project proposes to relocate the structure to a lot on East Poplar Street within Bellevue for use as a museum.

Grant funds would be used for pre-development of this project intended to support Black artists, entertainers, and entrepreneurs.

J.Scotland African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church\$100,00010902 Seven Locks Road, Potomac, Montgomery County\$100,000

Grantee: Scotland A.M.E. Zion Church

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including stabilization; lifting building; structural repairs; repair / replacement of foundation, roof, and siding; installation of waterproofing; masonry and carpentry repair / replacement; site work; mechanical, electrical, and plumbing upgrades; painting; signage; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000 estimated.]

Remarks: After the Civil War, freed men and women established a settlement known as "Snakes Den" along Seven Locks Road. In 1924, community members constructed the Scotland A.M.E. Zion Church. Throughout the 1960s, discriminatory financing practices left many in the community unable to comply with new utility requirements, leaving the community vulnerable to development pressure and condemnation. The church served as the hub for community resistance. The community succeeded in saving their property, with the church being the only historic structure remaining.

Grantee: The St. James A.M.E. Church of Gravel Hill Road, Inc.

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including masonry, siding, gutter and downspout, window, and door repair / replacement; mechanical, electrical, security and plumbing system upgrades / installation; bathroom upgrades; permanent signage repair / replacement; selective demolition; site work; cemetery preservation assessments; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$55,000 estimated.]

Remarks: One of the oldest African American churches in Harford County, St. James A.M.E. Church traces its roots to 1849 when one congregation encompassed a wide swath of Harford County. In 1864, members of the Gravel Hill community constructed their own church building, which also served as a school and social hall. Adjacent to the church is St. James A.M.E. Cemetery, where several Civil War veterans are buried. Extensive renovations and additions to the gable-front, frame church was completed in the 1970s and 1980s.

L. St. Paul Church

26086 Beauchamp Branch Road, Denton, Caroline County

Grantee: St. Paul Church Historical, Revitalization, and Maintenance, Inc.

Description: Interior and exterior rehabilitation including repair / replacement of siding, flooring, windows, doors, and roof; electrical system installation; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000 estimated.]

Remarks: The St. Paul Church is one of the earliest African American churches in Caroline County. The associated cemetery has burials dating back to at least the 1840s. The church will be used to promote community education and awareness of African American culture in the 19th and 20th centuries.

M. Carroll Family Farm

8765 Special Place, Nanjemoy, Charles County Grantee: Working Out Wonders Foundation, Inc.

Description: Exterior rehabilitation including structural repairs; repair / replacement of roof, windows, doors, floors, siding, and trim; masonry and carpentry repairs; painting; accessibility improvements; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$56,000 estimated.]

Remarks: The Carroll Family Farm and Cemetery includes a vernacular frame farmhouse that was largely constructed in the late nineteenth century by Lelita (Lottie) Diggs. Diggs was formerly enslaved; she later became the matriarch of the influential Carroll family, who were amongst the founders of Mt. Hope Baptist Church, the site of the oldest Baptist African American congregation in Charles County. Carroll family members are interred in the cemetery.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency – COVID-19: In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the MDH Laboratory must greatly expand its capacity to test specimens accurately and promptly for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus by leveraging the use of existing laboratory equipment and staff. Thermo Fisher is the sole manufacturer of the FDA EUA approved TaqPath RT PCR Multiplex COVID19 PCR test's (TaqPath Assay) reagents and associated proprietary interpretive software, which is compatible with the ABI 7500 Fast Dx PCR instruments that are widely used by the MDH Laboratory. The TaqPath RT PCR test has been successfully used by other public health labs in the United States and FEMA provided an initial supply of 10,000 TaqPath RT PCR Multiplex PCR tests to the MDH Laboratory free of charge.

The MDH Laboratory has already performed extensive PCR verification and extraction platform bridging studies of the TaqPath assay as required by regulatory authorities (CMS/FDA) before the test can be utilized to analyze patient specimens. These studies established better sensitivity than the standard CDC 2019 nCoV PCR assay by detecting slightly lower levels of SARS-CoV-2 virus in spiked samples. The MDH Laboratory also verified equivalent performance of the TaqPath assay to CDC assay by testing remnant, previously-tested clinical specimens.

The primary advantage of the Thermofisher assay is that only one real-time PCR reaction is needed to produce a reportable result compared to three PCR reactions needed for the CDC assay (2019 nCoV PCR assay). The use of the requisitioned Thermo Fisher assay will result in increased throughput of the component- based COVID-19 PCR assays performed in the MDH Laboratory by threefold using existing PCR instruments and will allow the MDH Lab to expand its existing COVID-19 testing capacity using the existing instruments and staff. Additionally, Thermo Fisher provides proprietary COVID-19 Interpretive Software that analyzes the PCR data, generates reportable results, and interfaces the ABI PCR instruments to the MDH Laboratory's Information Management System (StarLIMS) which automates the reporting of COVID-19 test results. This feature greatly reduces the time spent by senior MDH Lab Scientists to manually interpret testing data, transcribe results, and generate final COVID-19 test reports.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency – COVID-19: On March 5, 2020, Governor Larry Hogan issued a Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of Catastrophic Health Emergency (COVID-19) due to the outbreak of a severe respiratory disease, resulting in illness or death that is caused by the person-to-person spread of the novel coronavirus. The Maryland Department of Health has been leading the State's preparedness and response for this public health emergency.

The Department issued an invitation for bids (IFB) for the provision of temporary staffing support of the COVID-19 vaccination plan. The Department requires both lead and support roles for temporary, non-clinical staffing services at various locations, including remote staff, throughout the State that are engaged in COVID-19 pandemic related activities. The contractors will be responsible for providing non-clinical staffing at various locations and demobilization and warehousing positions located in Central Maryland. Staffing list and associated duties will be a non-exhaustive list and additional positions and duties will be identified as needs arise. The majority of these staff will be made available to school systems to assist with their testing programs, and a multiple award approach was selected to ensure availability of staff. Assignments will be offered based on a right of first refusal starting with the lowest-priced bidder followed by the second bidder, third bidder, and so on as appropriate.

The Department notes that the \$39,706,600 is an estimated not-to-exceed (NTE) total amount for all of the awardees, combined. This total amount will be focused, as noted above, in three principal categories:

- Testing and vaccination site staffing
- Administrative support staffing
- Warehousing and Demobilizing

As of Fall 2021, we anticipate and project that testing and vaccination site staffing will comprise the bulk of the contracted funds and will be for staff in order to support Maryland's K-12 screening program in participant schools with tasks related to administering the program. Included in this estimate is also nonclinical staff to support school vaccination clinics. These staff are essential to ensure that there is equitable access to vaccinations for all school aged children. The remainder of this amount will be allocated as necessary to administrative support staffing and warehousing and demobilizing efforts, as necessary.

These are projections and are illustrative only at this point of the Department's anticipated priorities.

Basis for Selection: The solicitation was for a multi-award contract based on first right of refusal (lowest bid) of all responsive/responsible bidders based on the needs of local jurisdictions. All bidders received contract awards.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency – By December 1, 2022, the Maryland Health Care Commission (MHCC) must provide a report on the impact of providing telehealth services to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee per *Chapter 70 (House Bill 123) and Chapter 71 (Senate Bill 3) Preserve Telehealth Access Act of 2021*. The law, enacted July 1, 2021, explicitly states that MHCC uses the data collected from utilization and coverage of telehealth during fiscal years 2022 and 2023. MHCC determined that an emergency procurement was necessary, as the amount of time to complete a full procurement for a mandatory study of that magnitude could jeopardize the efforts of the State to expand, improve and fund critical health care services to Maryland constituents beyond the June 1, 2023 expiration of particular provisions within the bill.

The report required by the law is very ambitious. Over the next twelve months, the contractor must complete the following:

A. Conduct an analysis of:

i. The impact of telehealth on disparities in access to health care services, including primary care and behavioral health services;

ii. Whether different communities and patient populations have differences in take-up rates of telehealth services; and

iii. The comparative effectiveness of telehealth services and in-person visits on the total costs of care and patient outcomes of care.

B. Study the alignment of telehealth services with new models of care that addresses:

i. Opportunities for using telehealth to improve patient-centered care;

ii. Health care services for which telehealth can substitute for in-person care while maintaining the standard of care, including the use of remote patient monitoring for somatic and behavioral health care services; and

iii. The impact of alternative care delivery models on telehealth utilization, coverage, and reimbursement.

C. Assess the efficiency and effectiveness of telehealth services and in-person visits that includes:

i. A review of peer-reviewed research on the impact of different communication technologies on patient health, including patient retention rates and reduced barriers to care;

Targeting for CREP was a multiagency and conservation partnership organization effort that utilized nine high priority, science based, data sets and areas of special consideration developed from the past 10 years of research and study of water quality and natural resource conditions in the State's 134 watersheds. Frederick County is a Target Level 1 county.

14A. <u>RURAL LEGACY PROGRAM GRANTS</u> *Fiscal Year 2022*

Recommendation: The Department of Natural Resources recommends that the Board of Public Works approve:

- 2) Two Rural Legacy Area Boundary Changes (Subitems D & I); and
- 3) One New Rural Legacy Area (Subitem S).

Background: The Rural Legacy Program is designed to preserve large blocks of contiguous open space that are among the State's most valuable because of the existence of a multitude of agricultural, forestry, natural and cultural resources. To protect these resources, the Rural Legacy Program, acting through local government or private land trust sponsors, purchases conservation easements from willing property owners, based on Rural Legacy Plans that have been reviewed by the Rural Legacy Advisory Committee and approved by the Rural Legacy Board.

The Rural Legacy Program Fiscal Year 2022 grant awards total \$26,259,387.36. This total comprises the FY 2022 funding appropriation of \$20,037,061 and, in addition, \$6,222,326.36 in unused prior year funding that the Rural Legacy Advisory Committee and Rural Legacy Board voted to redirect to this year's grant awards.

DNR will submit individual contracts to purchase conservation easements to the Board of Public Works as the specific transactions arise.

Authority: Subtitle 9A - Rural Legacy Program, Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

A. Agricultural Security Corridor - Eastern Shore Heartland Rural Legacy Area: *Caroline, Dorchester, and Talbot Counties*

Grant: of **\$750,056** to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in three counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.



B. Agricultural Security Corridor - Harvest Crescent Rural Legacy Area: *Cecil and Kent Counties*

Grant: of **\$1,897,634** to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in two counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.

C. Agricultural Security Corridor - Tuckahoe Rural Legacy Area: Caroline and Talbot Counties

Grant: of **\$1,316,321** to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in two counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.

D. Baltimore Coastal Rural Legacy Area: *Baltimore County*

Grant: of **\$498,311** to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources, including forests, farmlands, water quality. Coastal resiliency benefits include riparian buffers and restrictions on structures in flood and surge zones to protect important ecosystem functions.

Reduction: of **139.75 acres** such that the resulting area will be 13,969 acres. The area to be removed from the RLA is currently being developed and is located within the county's growth boundary.

E. Calvert Creeks Rural Legacy Area: Calvert County

Grant: of **\$352,529** to acquire conservation easements on historic farmland, forests and significant natural areas in the Patuxent River and Chesapeake Bay watersheds. The Board approved the designation of the Calvert Creeks Rural Legacy Area in 1998.



F. Coastal Bays Rural Legacy Area: Worcester County

Grant: of **\$760,000** to acquire conservation easements to protect forest, agricultural, natural areas and shoreline in Worcester County's coastal bays. This Area includes important tidal marshland areas, forests, and farmland, which provides one of the most ecologically diverse and outstanding wildlife habitat in the State. The Board approved the designation of the Coastal Bays Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

G. Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area: Somerset and Worcester Counties

Grant: of **\$1,005,000** to acquire conservation easements to protect significant woodland, farmland and wetlands. The Area includes one of the most pristine and ecologically significant watershed basins on the mid-Atlantic. It includes exemplary plant and wildlife habitat, prime farmland and large blocks of working forests and over 10 miles of shoreline of Dividing Creek. The Board approved the designation of the Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area in 2008.

H. Fair Hill Rural Legacy Area: Cecil County

Grant: of **\$1,296,850** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas and historic sites in the northeast corner of Cecil County contiguous to Fair Hill Natural Resources Management Area. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including equestrian activities. The Board approved the designation of the Fair Hill Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

I. Foreman Branch/Lands End Rural Legacy Areas: Queen Anne's County

Grant: of **\$1,650,321** to acquire conservation easements to protect environmentally significant tributaries of the Chester and Corsica Rivers, including farmland, forest land, wetlands and wildlife habitat. The Board approved the designation of the Foreman Branch and Lands End Rural Legacy Areas in 1998.

Expansion: of **308 acres** to increase connectivity to existing protected lands, and contribute to the creation of a greenbelt in proximity to the Town of Church Hill in Queen Anne's County.



J. Gunpowder Rural Legacy Area: Baltimore County

Grant: of **\$1,062,000** to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect historic farmland, forests and natural and cultural areas on both sides of the Gunpowder River and the Northern Central Railroad Trail in Baltimore County. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Prettyboy and Loch Raven Reservoirs. The Board approved the designation of the Gunpowder River Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

K. Harriet Tubman Rural Legacy Area: Dorchester County

Grant: of **\$925,152** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodland, natural and historic landscapes associated with the legacy of Harriet Tubman and the history of the Underground Railroad. The Board approved the designation of the Harriet Tubman Rural Legacy Area in 2018.

L. Huntersville Rural Legacy Area: St. Mary's County

Grant: of **\$2,217,053** for partnership with the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) funds to acquire conservation easements to protect forests, natural and archeological areas, farmland, and historic sites. Portions of the Area are designated by the Smithsonian Center for Natural Areas as critical wildlife habitat in need of protection. The Board approved the designation of the Huntersville Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

M. Little Pipe Creek /Upper Patapsco Rural Legacy Areas: Carroll County

Grant: of **\$872,754** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodland, natural and cultural land within the Little Pipe Creek and upper Monocacy River Watersheds. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits not only for the two watersheds, but also for the underground aquifers that supply many residents with drinking water. The Board approved the designation of the Little Pipe Creek Rural Legacy Area in 1998 and Upper Patapsco Rural Legacy Area in 2004.



N. Long Green Valley Rural Legacy Area: Baltimore County

Grant: of **\$1,271,000** to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect woodland, farmland and significant habitat and wildlife corridors, including lands within or directly contiguous to the Long Green Valley National Register Historic District. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits for the Little and Big Gunpowder Rivers and the Loch Raven Reservoir. The Board approved the designation of the Long Green Valley Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

O. Mattapany Rural Legacy Area: St. Mary's County

Grant: of **\$570,201** to match the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) funds to acquire conservation easements to protect the Area's rich farmland, forests, wetlands, historic sites, and wildlife habitat. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Chesapeake Bay and the St. Mary's River watershed. The Board approved the designation of the Mattapany Rural Legacy Area in 2006.

P. Mid-Maryland Frederick/Carrollton Manor Rural Legacy Areas: *Frederick County*

Grant: of **\$1,501,994** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forestland, Civil War historic sites and a greenbelt around the historic Town of Burkittsville. Conservation of property in the Area will protect the view surrounding the Appalachian Trail and South Mountain Battlefield State Park, which are nationally significant natural and cultural resources. The Board approved the designation of the Mid-Maryland Frederick Rural Legacy Area in 1998 and the Carrollton Manor Rural Legacy Area in 2004.

Q. Mid-Maryland Montgomery Rural Legacy Area: Montgomery County

Grant: of **\$2,772,761** to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect farmland, open space, and natural areas. The Area protects farmland, open space and natural resources located within the heart of the County's Agricultural Reserve. The Area contains large contiguous tracts of rural lands, numerous agricultural operations, and forest resources rich in both aquatic and terrestrial wildlife. Conservation within the Area provides water quality benefits to the Potomac River, a Maryland designated Scenic River. The Board approved the designation of Mid-Maryland Montgomery Rural Legacy Area in 1998.



R. Mid-Maryland Washington Rural Legacy Area: Washington County

Grant: of **\$1,554,300** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests and Civil War sites within view of Washington Monument State Park, South Mountain Battlefield State Park, Antietam National Battlefield and its approaches. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Potomac River, a Maryland designated Scenic River. The Board approved the designation of the Mid-Maryland Washington Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

S. Nanjemoy – Mattawoman Forest Rural Legacy Area: Charles County

Designation of **64,000 acre** Nanjemoy-Mattawoman Forest Rural Legacy Area in Charles County. A RLA on the west side of Charles County will complement the existing Zekiah RLA on the east side, buffering the County's agricultural and natural resources from development pressure extending south from Washington DC. Combined with the existing set of protection and preservation mechanisms utilized by Charles County, this RLA proposal will yield a high degree of success in achieving the goals and objectives of the County's Comprehensive Plan. The resources to be protected include the fisheries of the Mattawoman Creek – one of the steadiest and busiest recreational fishing destinations in Maryland. The proposed RLA includes diverse forest habitats, thousands of acres of Ecologically Significant Areas, and 28 species of plants and animals considered rare, threatened, or endangered in the Mattawoman Watershed alone. The citizens of Charles County recognize the value and significance of these resources and have continually supported the County's land preservation successes and robust preservation goals. Charles County expects that this historical legacy of preservation success will continue with the designation of the Nanjemoy-Mattawoman Forest RLA.

Grant: of **\$1,111,942** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas, and historic properties within the Nanjemoy and Mattawoman watersheds. This area includes properties on the Potomac River, Mallows Bay, Nanjemoy Creek, and Mattawoman Creek, and is within the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) preservation boundary.

T. Piney Run Rural Legacy Area: *Baltimore County*

Grant: of **\$1,013,208** to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas and historic properties within and near National Register Historic Districts. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Prettyboy and Loch Raven Reservoirs, two of the drinking supply reservoirs for the Baltimore Metropolitan Area. The Board approved the designation of the Piney Run Rural Legacy Area in 1998.



U. **Quantico Creek Rural Legacy Area:** Wicomico County

Grant: of \$630,000 to acquire conservation easements to protect forests, farmland, and wintering waterfowl habitat and historic villages. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to Quantico Creek, part of the Nanticoke Watershed Greenway. The Board approved the designation of the Quantico Creek Rural Legacy Area in 2000.

V. Zekiah Rural Legacy Area: Charles County

Grant: of \$1,280,000 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests and natural and historic properties contiguous to Zekiah Run. This Area contains the largest natural hardwood swamp in the State and is considered by the Smithsonian Institute to be one of the most important ecological areas on the East Coast. The Board approved the designation of the Zekiah Watershed Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

15A. <u>DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES</u> Amendment to Land Use Agreement – Egypt Road, Dorchester County

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve and execute an amendment to a 2007 Land Use Agreement for the purpose of allowing a commercial solar power facility on land adjacent to land owned by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) in Dorchester County.

Prior Approval: DGS Items 8- and 9-RP, April 18, 2007

Background: In June 2007, the Department acquired ~728.313 acres of land in Dorchester County on Egypt Road from Thomas Land Group, LLC, which retained ~320 acres of land upland of the land sold to the Department. Pursuant to the transaction, the Department and the Thomas Land Group, LLC entered into a Land Use Agreement in order to regulate the use of the Thomas Land Group, LLC's retained acreage for the purpose of controlling the impacts of stormwater drainage coming from the Thomas Land Group, LLC's upland land onto the Department's land. The anticipated use of the Thomas Land Group, LLC's retained land was residential development, and the Land Use Agreement therefore limited the use of that land to residential development only. The Agreement was specific as to conditions and restrictions applicable to the Thomas Land Group, LLC's land with regard to stormwater impacts on the Department's land resulting from such residential development.

The ~320 acres retained by the Thomas Land Group, LLC has been conveyed to a new owner, Egypt Road Land, LLC, who seeks to use the land for purposes of developing a commercial solar energy facility. The Maryland Public Service Commission (PSC) has granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to the solar facility, PSC case #9434, which includes conditions and restrictions related to stormwater and other environmental management which satisfactorily address all of the Department's concerns regarding such impacts to the Department's land. However, because the current Land Use Agreement does not allow such a use of that property, the Land Use Agreement must be amended to allow such an alternate use of the property.

Although not parties to the original Land Use Agreement, the City of Cambridge and another, private, party are each signing the Amendment because they each now own interests in the land which is subject to the Land Use Agreement.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This solicitation was advertised as a Small Business Preference Procurement on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Aviation Administration's (MDOT MAA) website on January 21, 2021. The MDOT MAA directly solicited seven (7) prospective bidders. Two (2) bids were received on March 4, 2021.

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The Procurement Officer contacted the non-bidding firms to ascertain reasons for not submitting a bid and found one firm did not meet the minimum experience requirements and one firm bid as a sub-contractor.

At the bid opening, Home Paramount Pest Control Company (Home Paramount) was announced as the apparent low bidder. A review of the bid packages revealed Home Paramount is not a certified small business, and Regional Pest Management is a certified small business. Therefore, in accordance with the specifications, 5% was added to Home Paramount's total bid, the most favorable responsive bid received from a responsible bidder who is not a small business. The 5% increase caused the bid opening resultant order to change. On March 9, 2021, a Notification of Bid Results letter advising of the bid opening resultant order change was sent to Regional Pest Management (Regional Pest) and Home Paramount.

On March 15, 2021, the MDOT MAA received a protest from Home Paramount. On April 23, 2021, the MDOT MAA denied Home Paramount's protest. On April 29, 2021, Home Paramount filed a Notice of Appeal with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA), appealing MDOT MAA's decision to deny Home Paramount's protest. On July 13, 2021, the MSBCA granted the motion to dismiss. No appeal was filed with the circuit court.

On July 13, 2021, MDOT MAA sent a Notice of Recommended Award (NORA) letter to Regional Pest requesting award documentation. On July 19, 2021, Regional Pest returned the NORA documents, but instead of being in the name of Regional Pest, the paperwork had been changed in the name of "Orkin, LLC, DBA Regional Pest Management" ("Orkin"). The document also included a Letter of Assignment, assigning the contract to Orkin. Because Orkin is not a certified small business, the small business preference does not apply to Orkin making Home Paramount the responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive bid. Consequently, on July 28, 2021, MDOT MAA sent a Rescission of NORA letter to Regional Pest. On July 29, 2021, the MDOT MAA received a protest to the Rescission of NORA from Regional Pest. On August 30, 2021, the MDOT MAA Procurement Officer denied the Bid Protest. No appeal was filed.

The MDOT MAA directly solicited 11 bidders. Eight (8) proposals were received. The non-selected firms were debriefed; no protests were filed.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of a Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* and on December 9, 2020 and sent directly to over 200 prospective vendors. DHCD issued this RFP to obtain multiple contracts to provide weatherization services for eligible single-family households throughout Maryland. Under the terms of the RFP, DHCD could award multiple contracts for services.

In response to the RFP, 12 proposals were received but only eight proposals were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Three proposals were not reasonably susceptible because they failed to provide substantial portions of information required in the RFP and one proposal was determined not to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award due to MBE concerns.

Under this contract, the Contractors shall provide HVAC work for each housing unit, which may include the replacement or repair of heating, cooling, or water heating equipment to restore functioning service for the household. Commonly installed measures include removing and properly disposing of inefficient HVAC, domestic water heating, and installing high efficiency equipment, or cleaning and tuning existing HVAC equipment, installing such items as thermostats, and carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. Minor electrical, plumbing, or general repairs may be required to facilitate the installation.

Previously these services were included in the State Weatherization Contractor Services (SWCS) contract, but DHCD decided to break them out to attract more HVAC companies.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage.com on May 11, 2021. A copy of the solicitation was sent directly to 66 prospective vendors, all were Maryland firms. Three Proposals were received in response and all were deemed to be reasonably susceptible for award.

The Law Office of Braden, Thompson, Poltrack, Mundy and McQueeney, LLP was determined to be the best value to the State considering both technical factors and price. While they submitted the highest ranked Financial Proposal, their experience in child welfare cases, child in need of assistance (CINA) cases and Family Law as a whole is more extensive than the other proposals received. Additionally, the offeror has represented The Department of Human Services' Local DSS for over fifteen years in Kent, Queen Anne's, Caroline, Anne Arundel, and Talbots Counties. The offeror would not require a long transition period considering they are very familiar with all services relating to family law, have strong community ties and a current working relationship with DHS.

The previous long-term agreement was with Michael J. Scibinico, II. DHS requested a modification to continue services while the procurement process was completed for the new contract and Mr. Scibinico stated he was retiring. A small procurement was used to continue these services while procuring the new long-term contract.

CEDSS is authorized by law to administer programs in the areas of adult and child protective services, foster care, income maintenance, and child support enforcement, among others, to citizens of Cecil County. Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* and the DHS website. A copy of the solicitation notice was sent directly to 30 potential vendors, three of which were certified Small Business Enterprises.

A collective total of 234 bids were submitted across the jurisdiction pool by 51 bidders in response to the IFB. Bidders were permitted to submit separate bids for any number of or including all 20 jurisdictions. Multiple bids were received for all jurisdictions with the exception of single bids received for Caroline, Cecil, and Saint Mary's Counties. Of the 51 total bidders, 46 were determined to be responsible bidders that submitted 149 responsive bids and are recommended for awards.

A roster of successful Bidders, from lowest to highest bid will be made available to each LDSS for use. The Bid amounts used to rank the Bidders and determine their placement on the roster are derived from each bidder's composite weighted hourly rate, the Bidder's hourly rate for each service type, weighted by the Department's estimated frequency of service-type provision. Therefore, the Bidder who submits the lowest bid in a jurisdiction will have the highest position on that jurisdiction's roster. All hourly rates/bid prices are fixed per year for the entire 5-year contract term.

The IFB was issued to provide IHAS services which include Personal Care, Chore Services, Respite Care, Nursing Supervision and Nursing Evaluations. In-Home Aide Services are provided in the homes of persons who are eligible for DHS's In-Home Aide Services Program and have functional disabilities as defined in COMAR 07.02.14.02 B (6) (i.e., cannot perform activities of

daily living such as dressing, bathing, eating, toileting, transferring from bed to chair etc., without assistance). The services are to be provided to service 20 of 24 Maryland jurisdictions. The other four jurisdictions (Anne Arundel, Garrett, Kent and Montgomery counties) have local arrangements for service provision and did not participate in this solicitation.

Three Jurisdictions were left with single bids: Caroline County, Cecil County, and Saint Mary's County. To determine whether the bids were fair and reasonable, Procurement used price competition by comparing the average price of acceptable bids received from counties in the Solicitation that are contiguous to those with single Bids:

- Caroline County single Bid is \$35.00. Average Bids of contiguous counties to Caroline are Queen Anne's \$33.84, Talbot \$40.10, Dorchester \$35.08. The average of all three is \$36.34. The single Bid for Caroline County is \$1.34 less.
- Cecil County single Bid is \$32.68. Average Bid of the contiguous county to Cecil is Harford \$38.35. (Kent County is not part of this Solicitation.) The single Bid for Cecil County is \$5.67 less.
- Saint Mary's County single Bid is \$22.40. Average Bids in the contiguous counties to Saint Mary's are Charles \$41.23, Calvert \$28.54. The average of both is \$34.89. The single Bid for Saint Mary's County is \$12.49 less.

For precedent, current Bidders who bid on the same jurisdictions in the previous solicitation had their rates compared. This provided limited information, as Cecil County was not in the previous solicitation, and Charles County Nursing and Rehabilitation was not previously awarded Saint Mary's County. However, for Caroline County, Howe Administrative Services bid \$38.10. Their current Bid of \$22.40 is \$15.70 less.

Based on this information, Procurement concluded that the single Bids for these jurisdictions were fair and reasonable.

On October 20, 2021, JES Right Care dba Right at Home, submitted a protest alleging that a B-1 Form for Washington County was submitted with their original Bid and the Bid should not have been removed from further consideration. The protest was denied as it was not timely and therefore not considered by the Procurement Officer. No appeal has been filed at this time.

These Contracts are indefinite quantity Contracts paid on an hourly basis for services rendered. Contractors will only be paid for work actually performed. The total budgeted amount for the five-year term of the Contracts for all twenty (20) jurisdictions is \$17,365,206.

Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Task Order Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on June 9, 2021, notifying 18 master contractors. Four master contractors attended the pre-proposal conference and expressed an interest in submitting proposals. Two proposals were received in response to the TORFP on September 3, 2021. The second bid amount was \$101,079.05. Both master contractors submitted labor rates that were a few dollars different. But the master contractor with the higher price allotted more labor hours to complete the work than the master contractor with the lower price.

The RFP was issued by the Department of General Services on behalf of DBM. It solicited task order proposals to provide audit services to verify the total amount the State of Maryland paid NICUSA, Inc. during the contract period (08/20/2011 - 08/10/2019). The Maryland Self-Funded eGovernment Services contract was awarded to NICUSA, Inc. in August 2011. The contract contained a 5-year base and three 1-year renewal options.

1.0 Master Contract: Audit Services Master Contract 2020 - 2025

The Contract was awarded as a work-order based, single-award indefinite-quantity master contract to provide eGovernment services and support for the State of Maryland. DoIT managed the Contract which was available for use by all State agencies via a work order process.

This Contract provided for the design, development, hosting, operation, and maintenance of eGov products and services. Under the Contract, services were provided to many State agencies, enabling them to provide services more efficiently to the public. In addition, agencies used the Contract to accept electronic payment for records and services. The Contract provided five business models: (1) Transaction Cost Service; (2) Consulting Service; (3) Convenience Fee Service; (4) Premium Cost Service; and (5) Free Service.

This TOA will verify the fees the State paid to NICUSA through work orders that used the Transaction Cost Service Model. Through this business model, NICUSA provides services with no fee to the State's customers, but instead charges the agency requesting the service a transaction fee, enabling NICUSA to pay for development and maintenance costs over time. An agency selects this model, for example, when it determines that it is more cost-effective to pay the transaction fee for the online service provided in lieu of the slower, often paper-based and more labor-intensive process existing at the agency. Additionally, in this context, an agency determines that it prefers to pay the transaction fee rather than passing it on to its customer.

NICUSA utilized two mechanisms to recover transaction fees. The first is for NICUSA to invoice agencies monthly for the transaction fees. The second – "netting fees" – involved NICUSA withholding transaction fees before remitting the net amount of the fees, chargebacks, and returns to the State. Effective July 1, 2018, the practice of "netting fees" was discontinued; since then, the Contractor has remitted all fees to the State and then submitted invoices for the transaction fees owed to the company.

DBM's goals for this audit are to verify the total amount the State of Maryland paid NICUSA, Inc. during the contract; identify amounts paid by the State - by agency and fiscal year, by fees netted and fees billed to each agency and by work order.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Governor's Grant Office (GGO) is one of the few centralized grants offices in the United States. The GGO provides training and technical assistance to State agencies, local governments, nonprofit organizations, and constituents regarding grants management, grant opportunities, training opportunities and other grant-related matters. The GGO has established a grants' Point of Contact (POC) in each State agency. POCs are the primary conduit for conducting grant research and training within the respective State agency.

POCs participate in regular State grants team meetings, conference calls, work groups, and serve as the informational "grants hub" within the State agency.

Currently, no statewide grants management system exists in Maryland. Some State agencies use a variety of commercial off the shelf software, custom, or manual systems. The GGO's interactions with State agencies, local governments and the public reveal a need for a single, statewide, centralized grants management system to manage the full lifecycle of all grants within the State. State agencies, local governments, nonprofits, and constituents require a single, streamlined grant management system for identification, application, award management, grant monitoring and reporting. Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of a Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* on Oct 18, 2019. The solicitation was sent directly to six vendors, two were Maryland businesses. Six proposals were received in response to the RFP and all were deemed reasonably susceptible of being awarded. During the review process the incumbent, IBM Watson Health chose to withdraw their proposal due to the company not being prepared to perform all required deliverables as outlined in the requirements of the RFP. The Evaluation Committee reviewed the proposals against the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFP in the areas of technical expertise as well as financial considerations. The Evaluation Committee conducted a cost benefit analysis to determine which proposal is most advantageous to the State and unanimously recommended that the contract resulting from MDH-OPASS# 19-18325 Surveillance and Utilization Review Subsystem(SURS) be awarded to SAS, based on their exceptional technical proficiency and over best value considering both the technical and financial proposals and giving equal weight to each of those components of the overall evaluation as required by the terms of the RFP.

Beginning on September 10, 2020, Qlarant Integrity Solutions, Inc. (Qlarant) filed a series of five interrelated protests that were all denied by the Department. Qlarant appealed the denials to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA). MSBCA conducted a merits hearing Consolidated Appeals on June 23, 2021 and denied the appeals by Opinion and Order on September 24, 2021 upholding MDH recommendation for award. There was no subsequent appeal and the time for appeal has expired.

By federal law, Maryland operates a fraud, waste, and abuse (FWA) prevention and detection program. Currently, these functions are operated through the MDH Office of Medicaid Program Integrity Unit in the Office of the Inspector General (OIG). The purpose of SURS is to produce claim reports data for use by the Medicaid Program Integrity Unit. SURS is mandated by Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to receive federal matching funds for Medicaid services.

The Evaluation Committee reviewed the proposals against the evaluation criteria of overall technical expertise first then financial considerations. After responses were reviewed, the highest ranked technical proposal was for SAS Institute Inc. This Offeror received a ranking of exceptional for their work plan and demonstrated their comprehensive understanding of the critical functions of the SURS project. SAS Institute Inc. is determined to be the best overall value to the State.
