#### 1. BONDS

**Recommendation:** The Treasurer recommends that the Board of Public Works adopt resolutions concerning the sale of State of Maryland General Obligation Bonds in book entry form for the purpose of funding the State's capital program; making certain determinations regarding the consolidation of loans, the methods of sale, and the structure of the Bonds; authorizing the publication of the required Summary Notices of Bond Sale; and obligating the State of Maryland to provide continuing disclosure as required under applicable securities regulations and to comply with applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. The total that will be offered for sale is up to \$615,000,000\* of new money bonds, issued in one or more series, for the capital program and up to \$300,000,000\* of refunding bonds, issued in one or more series.

**Denomination:** \$5,000 per bond, or integral multiples thereof

*Maturities:* To be determined by the Treasurer, not to exceed 15 years.

Title: State and Local Facilities Loan of 2021, Second Series

**Amount and Form:** As determined by the Treasurer, to include:

<u>Second Series A</u> – Up to \$540,000,000\* Tax-Exempt Bonds (Competitive in two bidding groups) for the Capital Program ("Series A Bonds").

Second Series B – Up to \$75,000,000\* Taxable Bonds (Competitive) for the Capital Program ("Series B Bonds" and together with the Series A Bonds, the "New Money Bonds").

<u>Second Series C</u> – Up to \$150,000,000\* Tax-Exempt Refunding Bonds (Negotiated) ("Series C Bonds").

Second Series D – Up to \$150,000,000\* Tax-Exempt Refunding Bonds (Negotiated) ("Series D Bonds" and together with the Series C Bonds, the "Refunding Bonds").

2021 Second Series B (Taxable) – Public Competitive Sale of up to \$75,000,000\*, in maturities and amounts to be determined by the Treasurer, on Wednesday, August 11, 2021 by electronic bid and subject to the approval of the Board. Provided, however, depending upon market conditions and at the discretion of the Treasurer, the sale of the Series B Bonds may instead be offered for sale at a date and time to be determined by the Treasurer, subject to approval by the Board at that time.

2021 Second Series C (Tax-Exempt Refunding) – Negotiated Sale of up to \$150,000,000\*, in maturities and amounts to be determined by the Treasurer, on Wednesday, August 11, 2021 and subject to the approval of the Board. Provided, however, depending upon market conditions and at the discretion of the Treasurer, the sale of the Series C Bonds may instead be offered for sale at a date and time to be determined by the Treasurer, subject to approval by the Board at that time.

2021 Second Series D (Tax-Exempt Refunding) – Negotiated Sale of up to \$150,000,000\*, in maturities and amounts to be determined by the Treasurer, on Wednesday, August 11, 2021 and subject to the approval of the Board. Provided, however, depending upon market conditions and at the discretion of the Treasurer, the sale of the Series D Bonds may instead be offered for sale at a date and time to be determined by the Treasurer, subject to approval by the Board at that time.



#### **BONDS** (cont'd):

**Settlement**: With respect to the New Money Bonds, on or about August 25,

2021. With respect to the Series C Bonds, March , 2022\*. With respect to the Series D Bonds, August , 2022\*.

Use of Proceeds: With respect to the New Money Bonds, various State loans and

installments, combined and consolidated. With respect to the Refunding Bonds, the refunding of outstanding State bonds for the public purpose of realizing for the State a savings in the total cost of debt service and prior to such refundings, the purchase of securities

for deposit in refunding escrow accounts.

**Notices of Bond Sale:** Summary notices of sale for bonds sold on a competitive basis shall

be published in the *Bond Buyer* on a date to be determined by the Treasurer not later than that required by Section 8-123 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, and in such other electronic and print media as

determined appropriate by the Treasurer.

**Remarks:** The date of sale of the Bonds may be postponed at the discretion of the Treasurer in response to market conditions. The method of sale, the size and maturities of any of the Bonds may be adjusted by the Treasurer to respond to prevailing market conditions and, with respect to the Refunding Bonds, to comply with benchmarks for debt service savings in the State's Debt Policy. Following receipt of bids, the size of the Refunding Bonds may be further adjusted by the Treasurer by up to 15% to account for premium bid, if any, and savings realized from the purchase of securities for deposit to the refunding escrow accounts.

#### August 2021 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase Financing

**Remarks**: The State Treasurer's Office issued an Invitation for Bids for financing on a consolidated basis of \$3,868,627.94 in capital equipment, that was published on *eMaryland Marketplace*, posted on the websites for the National Association of State Treasurers and the State Treasurer's Office, and emailed to firms known to be active in financing municipal leases. There are no subcontracting opportunities with this financing; however, MBEs were encouraged to respond. This Lease-Purchase financing is expected to close no later than August 11, 2021. Four bids were received in response to the IFB. One bidder did not agree to the State's requirements and therefore was rejected as non-responsive. The bids were evaluated and were weighted based on the actual amounts to be financed and the rates for the respective lease term of 3 years and 5 years.

Following the August 2021 Tax-Exempt Equipment Lease-Purchase financing, the remaining balance of the \$50.0 million approved by the Legislative Policy Committee for equipment lease-purchase financing will be approximately \$46.1 million.

#### 5. **BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS**

Wetlands License - #19-1160 - Maryland State Highway Administration Mitigation

**Recommendation:** The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board approve a wetlands license to replace a bridge, and additionally recommends compensatory mitigation in the amount of \$3,958 for construction impacts to 2,301 square feet of open water habitat.

**MDE**: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

**Authority:** The "Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents." Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland; see also COMAR 23.02.04.

*Mitigation:* The bridge replacement will result in new impacts to 2,301 square feet of open water habitat. Following the licensee's unsuccessful search for opportunities to offset the tidal open water habitat impacts with other types of mitigation, MDE recommends the Licensee mitigate for impacts by paying \$3,958 into the Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund (COMAR 23.02.04.11.A(2)).

2,301 square feet x \$1.72 (\$75,000/acre  $\div$  43,560 square feet per acre) = \$3,958

#### 6. **BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS**

Wetlands License - #19-1223 – Somerset County Sanitary District Mitigation

**Recommendation:** The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board approve a wetlands license to construct a 5,225 linear foot wastewater line through State tidal wetlands on Smith Island, and additionally recommends compensatory mitigation for impacts to submerged aquatic vegetation (SAV) and vegetated tidal wetlands by eradicating *Phragmites* and planting native tidal marsh. The wastewater line installation will include both horizontal directional drilling and jet plowing.

**MDE**: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

Application received December 2, 2019
 Public comment period ended October 15, 2020
 MDE Report and Recommendation received June 23, 2021

**Authority:** The "Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents." **Section 16-202**, **Environment Article**, **Annotated Code of Maryland**; see also COMAR 23.02.04.

*Mitigation:* Construction of the project wastewater line will result in new impacts to 34,848 square feet of SAV and 10 square feet of vegetated tidal wetlands. After exploring several options, the licensee, MDE tidal wetlands staff, and the project agent agreed on mitigation (classified as "out of kind") to include eradicating *Phragmites* and planting native marsh plantings in 4.8 acres of adjacent tidal marsh. Out of kind mitigation for SAV requires a 6:1 ratio and vegetated tidal wetlands a 4:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B).

34,848 square feet x 6= 209,088 square feet

209,088 square feet (SAV) + 40 square feet (vegetated wetlands) = 209,128 square feet (4.8 acres)

**Recommendation:** The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends the Board approving the modification of Tidal Wetlands License No. 19-0894 to change the marina expansion license to include replacing three piers and their associated structures, replacing a bulkhead, installing piles, and adjusting the mitigation resulting from increased impacts.

As a result of their suspension, a letter was sent to the incumbent on April 12, 2021 to inform them to return all of the unopened test samples to the Maryland Racing Commission by April 15, 2021. Consequently, the procurement officer along with the evaluation committee moved swiftly to complete the technical evaluation process and opened the financial proposals. On April 12, 2021, after a thorough evaluation process, the evaluation committee recommended the contract award to the Industrial Laboratories Company, Inc. since they ranked #1 in both technical and financial.

The emergency 90-day contract was awarded to the Industrial Laboratories Company, Inc. to prevent any interruption in laboratory testing. However, LABOR wanted to make certain that the Board of Public Works has an opportunity to review the award recommendation for a five-year Laboratory Testing contract with the Industrial Laboratories Company Inc.

A Pre-proposal meeting was conducted with twelve firms in attendance. Two technical proposals were received. These proposals were evaluated by a University Evaluation Committee. Both proposers were shortlisted and were invited to interview sessions. Following the interviews, the Committee conducted a second phase technical evaluation resulting in both firms remaining shortlisted and invited to submit a price proposal. Award is recommended to Whiting Turner, the firm with the highest technical ranking and lowest price proposal.

Sustainability: This project consists of the following four major components: (1) stream restoration, storm water management improvements, walkway & pedestrian bridge; (2) utility tunnel upgrades; (3) water main refurbishment; and (4) site lighting upgrades. These types of projects do not have any LEED or Green Building Programs governing the energy savings. However, the design has strived to incorporate energy efficient and sustainable practices whenever possible. The stream and storm water outfalls will be restored and stabilized to reduce erosion of the channel bed and banks while providing ecological uplift, flow attenuation, and nutrient processing. The riparian zone will be restored by invasive species management and revegetation with native shrubs and trees. This will increase biodiversity, help regulate temperatures, and improve carbon sequestration capacity within this floodplain zone. A new ADA Walkway will extend from Hilltop Circle connecting to a new 120-foot long Pedestrian Bridge to provide access to the Stadium Complex. The pathway will promote walking to the stadium.

The sustainable approaches for the site lighting aspect of the project include the utilization of new LED lighting with limited up-lighting spill for affected portions of the campus. Throughout the portions of campus impacted by the project, existing HID fixtures, which are less energy efficient, will be replaced with the new LED fixtures. The new fixtures not only provide higher lighting levels for the campus but do so at a fraction of the energy usage of the existing fixtures. New lighting circuits will be installed using horizontal directional drilling, which minimizes surface disruption, reduces impact to campus life, and minimizes the damaging effects of erosion and sedimentation. The domestic water main improvements will be performed by a cured-in-place-pipe lining system, reusing the existing pathway. This approach limits material waste, reduces land disturbance, lessens impacts to campus life, and shortens construction duration. Less excavation results in fewer emissions from earthmoving equipment.

MDOT MPA attempted to determine why other companies did not submit bids. MDOT MPA tried to contact by phone all 42 Small Business vendors listed on eMMA to inquire why they did not bid. The following responses were received: twenty-one do not provide the services required; three do not have enough manpower to perform this contract; one chose not to bid, and one missed seeing the solicitation on eMMA. Three vendors had no contact information listed on eMMA, and so were not contacted. For the remaining vendors, MDOT MPA left voice mail messages but received no return calls.

Even though non-Small Businesses were not eligible for award due to the SBR designation, MDOT MPA also attempted to contact by phone 55 of the 489 non-Small Business vendors listed on eMMA to inquire if they would have bid had the procurement not been designated a Small Businesses Reserve. MDOT MPA received the following responses: one provides fire engineering consultation and design, but not maintenance; three provide only physical security, private investigation, and executive protection; one provides only business management training; two provide only consulting services of some sort; seven missed seeing the eMMA email advising of the solicitation; one chose not to bid based on business restructuring; one provides only life coaching services; one chose not to bid based on location; three provide only electrical services; one provides only security software maintenance; one provides only management manufacturing; one provides only staffing solutions; one provides only engineering services; one provides only IT services; one provides only electrical life safety services; two are construction general contractors; one provides only surveillance equipment; one provides only surveying for roads and bridges; one provides only security software; one provides only project management consulting; one did not understand the scope so chose not to bid; two provides alarm monitoring but not maintenance; and one provides both monitoring and maintenance but chose not to bid due to limited manpower. No vendors complained to MDOT MPA about the specifications or other provisions of the IFB.

The MBE goal established for this contract is 3%. Techmark Corporation is a certified MBE; therefore, the MBE participation is 100%. As the MBE prime contractor, Techmark Corporation, will self-perform 1.5% of the MBE goal and AC Power as the MBE subcontractor will perform 1.5% of the MBE goal. Techmark Corporation is also a certified Small Business.

Techmark Corporation is the incumbent contractor and has provided excellent performance. Prices have been determined to be fair and reasonable, approximately 5% over those offered in 2015 for the initial three-year term of the current contract. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department utilizes Residential Child Care (RCC) Programs for children whose needs cannot be met in a family based foster care setting. The RCC services in Maryland are provided through five Program categories, Developmentally Disabled Programs, Diagnostic Evaluation and Treatment Programs, Group Homes, High Intensity Group Home, and Medically Fragile. The facilities are located in Baltimore City and serve foster care children under the care of the Department. It is in the best interest of the children and the State not to disrupt the current placement or change the existing provider for these youth. This item is retroactive as a result of the delay in processing the RCC/RFP.





### **28-S. SERVICES CONTRACT** (cont'd)

### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Also, recreation of the retro agreements due to the delay with processing the RCC/RFP issued on November 4, 2019 and subsequent withdrawal of the RCC/RFP in September 2020. Revisions to previous retro contracts due to the withdrawal of the RCC/RFP.

The services of the Contractor will be used at the sole discretion of DHS. DHS makes no guarantee as to the number of children/youth to be placed with any Contractor. This is a Purchase of Care contract paid on a fee for service basis for the actual children/youth placed in the Contractor's care, and then only for the actual number of days each child is with the Contractor. This is a not-to-exceed per diem contract where the provider is paid solely per child, per day. DHS will not be charged for any unused capacity.

The proposed price for this contract is fair and reasonable because the prices are set by Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), Interagency Rates Committee (IRC), using the same established methodology in price setting for all In-State providers.

Residential Child Care programs are defined in COMAR 14.31.02.03B(13) as "a program of care provided in a residential setting by a provider on a 24-hour basis for longer than 24 hours to a child or children unless otherwise provided by State law." COMAR 14.31.06.01 articulates the standards that must be met and maintained by Residential Child Care programs for children and youth. These requirements are designed to protect the health, safety, and well being of children placed in Residential Child Care programs.

According to the State Finance and Procurement Article Section 13-107 and COMAR 21.05.05.02A (Sole Source Contracts), in order to provide continuity of human or social services care to current clients, the procurement officer shall, before the contract with the current provider expires, attempt to negotiate a sole source contract with the current provider. Based on an assessment by a licensed or certified health practitioner, the head of a funding unit determines that a change in the human or social services provider would have a detrimental impact on those clients currently being served by the provider. The licensed or certified health practitioner shall be a psychologist, social worker, physician, nurse, or qualified developmental disabilities professional, as defined in COMAR 10.22.02.11A.
