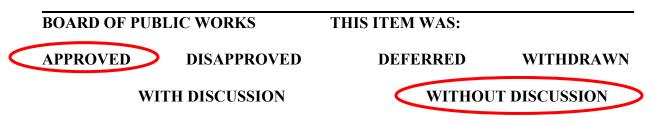

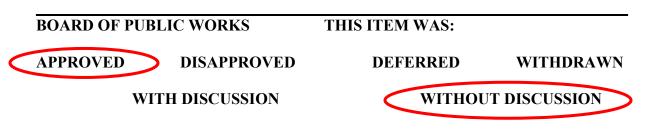

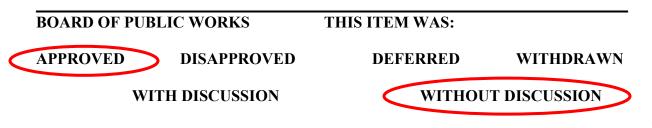

Special conditions: Requirements for a General Pesticide Permit, design and construction of stone revetment, vents in the sills, protection of existing wetland vegetation, planting schedule, marsh establishment, photographic monitoring, and adherence to the marsh maintenance plan.

### 4. <u>BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS</u>

Wetlands License - #20-1020 – Baltimore Gas and Electric Company (BG&E) Compensation & Mitigation

**Recommendation:** The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends the Board: (1) grant a wetlands license for a project involving filling over State tidal wetlands, (2) assess annual compensation of \$74,300 to be deposited into the MDE Wetlands and Waterways Program Fund, and (3) accept mitigation for 185 square feet of wetland fill by enhancing 740 square feet of existing wetlands.

MDE: The Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

*Authority*: The "Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents." *Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland;* see also COMAR 23.02.04.

*Compensation:* BG&E seeks to install six 115kV overhead electric cables and two static wires above State tidal wetlands. Cables and wires will be suspended from existing monopoles in the uplands on each side of the Bush River and attach to a new monopole structure in the river. The Board of Public Works shall assess annual compensation for the placement of cables over State tidal wetlands.<sup>\*</sup> The Wetlands Administrator recommends annual compensation of \$74,300 calculated as follows:

3,715 linear feet x 2.50/linear foot x  $\frac{8}{5}$  cables =  $\frac{74,300}{5}$ 

*Mitigation:* "The Board may require mitigation for unavoidable adverse environmental effects or loss of State wetlands caused by a licensed structure or activity." *COMAR 23.02.04.14D*. The licensee will impact 900 square feet of open water with a new monopole concrete base, and they will remove 715 square feet of an existing concrete base. MDE recommends that the applicant mitigate for the 185 square foot difference by enhancing 740 square feet of an existing semi-vegetated wetland by planting wetland vegetation to increase the vegetated area to 100%. Since the proposed mitigation is "out of kind" mitigation, out-of-kind creation and enhancement ratios are increased by a factor of 2. (COMAR 26.24.05.01.C.(2)).

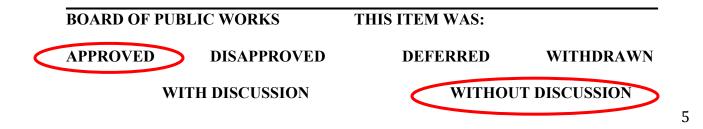

### HARFORD COUNTY

20-1020 *BALTIMORE GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY.* – To rebuild a portion of an existing transmission line across the Bush River by installing a monopole structure with six electric cables and two static wires connecting to existing monopoles.

Special conditions: Time-of-Year restriction. Requirements for turbidity curtain, project compliance with mitigation plans, mitigation site maintenance, compliance with Water Quality Certification, and payment of annual compensation.

### 5. <u>BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS</u> Wetlands License - #20-0559 – Virginia Tippie Mitigation

**Recommendation:** The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board approve a wetlands license to dredge at a private dock, and additionally recommends compensatory mitigation in the amount of \$1,811 for new dredging impacts to 1,053 square feet of shallow water habitat.

**MDE**: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

*Mitigation:* The project dredging will result in new impacts to 1,053 square feet of shallow water habitat. MDE recommends that the Licensee mitigate at a 1:1 ratio for impacts to shallow water habitat (COMAR 26.24.05.01.C.(1)(a)) and pay \$1,811 into the Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund.

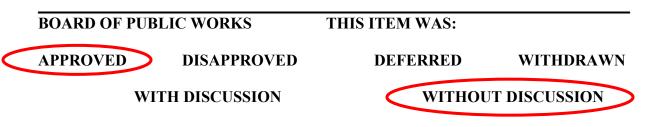

**Background**: The Bay Restoration Fund statute, amended during the 2014 session of the General Assembly, allows up to 10% of the fee from septic users deposited annually with the Department to be awarded to local governments to administer certain tasks to implement the OSDS regulations under COMAR 26.04.02.07. The grant award amounts are based on a formula and tasks undertaken by the local government. This agreement is for two fiscal years. The annual amounts are listed below.

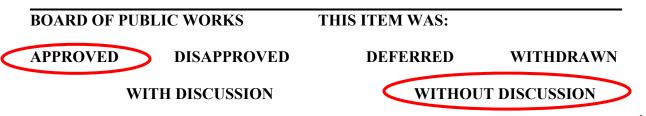

**Project Description**: The proposed project entails the planning, design and construction of a Biological and Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) facility for an existing design capacity of 50,000 gpd at the Victor Cullen WWTP. Upon completion of the upgrades, the plant will discharge effluent with an annual average Total Nitrogen goal of 3.0 mg/I and Total Phosphorus goal of 0.3 mg/I which will reduce nutrients to the Upper Monocacy River and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay This project will be constructed in accordance with coastal and non-coastal resiliency guidelines developed as part of the Coast Smart Program to reduce climate change risks to such projects.

**Remarks:** The existing coating system has deteriorated, and corrosion is widespread. The foundation is exhibiting cracks that need to be patched; anchor bolts and nuts are badly corroded. The exterior ladder needs a safety ladder guard and a safety climb unit, as required by OSHA. The existing handrail is only 36" high and OSHA requires 42". The overflow pipe needs modification; OSHA requires ground-level discharge. This work will make the tank OSHA-compliant and extend the useful life by 15-20 years.

**Remarks:** The existing facility was constructed several decades ago and has exceeded its useful life expectancy. The treatment process technology is outdated and not capable of meeting Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) NPDES permit limits. The collection system allows infiltration/inflow during storms, which overwhelms the treatment plant.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Modification No. 1 provides for additional pre-construction services due to changes in the scope of the program brought on by impacts to the available funding due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. As a result of the pandemic, all design and CMAR activities related to the program were suspended on May 1, 2020. Uncertainty related to the impacts of the pandemic on short, intermediate, and long-term airline operations, and impacts to funding, necessitated the stop work. At the time of stop work, the overall program design was at 60%, Package 1 had completed bidding and was being prepared for Board of Public Works approval, Package 2 had completed the bidding process and Package 3 was being scheduled for advertisement. Upon restart of the program on March 24, 2021, it was apparent that the initial program cost could not be supported by available funding and that the proposed design solution would need to be completely revised. Subsequent project scope changes have resulted in a reduction in the estimated total program cost from \$523M to \$425M. The reduction is made possible by a significant re-design of the proposed program and deletion/elimination of scope elements including the baggage system level and significant square footage.

This modification will allow Clark to provide pre-construction services to utilize their skills and knowledge of construction to develop schedules, prepare construction cost models/estimates, conduct value engineering studies, study labor conditions, identify and address constructability issues and advise of the packaging of the revised program into (a) Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) package(s). In addition, the CMAR shall advertise the bid packages, open the bids in conjunction with the owner and evaluate the submitted bids.

The CMAR has achieved 9.1% of its 18% DBE goal to date and is on track to meet the entire DBE goal by the end of the contract duration.

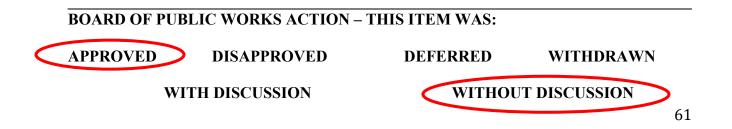

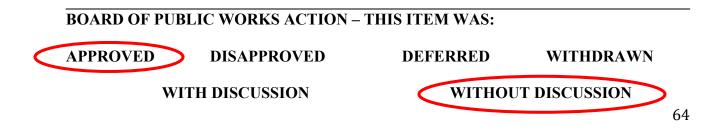

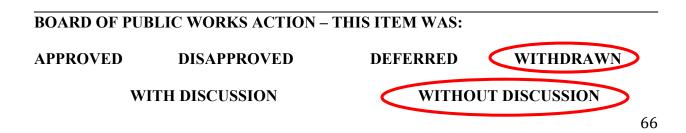
SP Plus Corporation's (SP Plus) proposal demonstrated a comprehensive understanding of contract requirements and offered a superior contract team with extensive qualifications and experience in parking management and operations. SP Plus provides parking and other related services at more than 70 airports. SP Plus presented an organized training program, COVID-19 guidelines, and customer service compliant procedures. SP Plus pricing is the lowest of all offerors. The major contributors to the price variances were in snow removal, facility repair, armored car service, uniforms, recruiting, and training.

SP Plus is exceeding the 25% MBE goal established for this contract by 7.08%.

The current bus purchasing plan from which the MAA is working includes the twenty (20) CNG buses (2018) for the Rental Car shuttle, forty (40) Clean Diesels (2019) for parking shuttles, and eight (8) electric buses that will be ordered this year - also used on the parking shuttles. MAA anticipate the charging infrastructure and electric buses to be in service by the second quarter of FY23, and those buses will be used interchangeably with the clean diesel coaches. With such a modern fleet, and a life span that is 12-15 years, it is unlikely that MAA will replace the current buses for some time. However, any expanded services requiring new buses will be electric.

Additionally, if it is determined that MAA will reestablish the express parking service, that fleet of approximately twelve (12) smaller cutaway buses will require the purchase of electric buses either by the State or our Bus contractor.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and on the MDOT MAA's website. eMaryland Marketplace Advantage notified 87 firms. The solicitation was sent to the Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs and five (5) minority business associations.

After completing the evaluations, the panel determined that First Transit, Inc. based on a combination of its technical and financial offer, provides the best value to the State and recommended contract award to the firm to maintain MDOT MAA's fleet of 15, 60-feet articulated coach buses. First Transit's technical proposal was well organized and showed years of experience speaking to the capabilities of the company. First Transit proposed strong leadership and quality staffing that have met all the proposal requirements. First Transit's experience and qualifications with maintaining an airport shuttle fleet was unmatched by the other offerors. Additionally, First Transit Safety Manager has a master safety certification and is a member of the World Safety Organization. The Safety Manager is vital to the performance of this contract as they are responsible for overseeing all aspects of operator training.

Although, First Transit is ranked third financially, the difference in the hourly rate as compared to the lowest ranked technical and highest rank financial offeror is approximately \$2.00 per hour for year one (1), \$2.50 per hour for year two (2), and \$5.50 per hour for years three (3) through five (5). Although, the non-selected offerors have experience with shuttle bus operations, majority of the experience is with private car and charter services. As outlined in the Request for Proposal, technical expertise is deemed more important than financials; therefore, First Transit was ranked number one overall.

- (2) The Lease Agreement No. MAA-LC-21-005, which provides for the lease of land for shuttle bus office and operations area in support of the shuttle bus/van services operation (MDOT Item 4-GM of this agenda); and
- (3) The License Contract No. MAA-LC-21-006, which provides licenses for 40 clean diesel Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Aviation Administration (MDOT MAA) – owned buses (MDOT Item 6-GM of this agenda).

MDOT MAA is committed to proactive environmental risk management, pollution control, continuous improvement in environmental performance, and strong partnerships with our internal and external stakeholders. **Requesting Agency Remarks:** The New Starts Purple Line project is supported by two A&E contracts - MTA-1264A and MTA-1265B. MDOT MTA elected to utilize a two-tier structure in which a Program Management Consultant (PMC) would perform management and quality assurance functions as an extension of MDOT MTA staff (MTA-1264A) and oversee the work of a General Engineering Consultant (MTA-1265B). Additionally, the PMC would be responsible for supplementing MDOT MTA staff providing management and oversight of the construction activities and the construction contractors in order that the State's interests are protected. A contract modification for Contract No. MTA-1265B for additional contract authority and time will be presented to BPW for approval at a later date.

The value of the contracts established in 2008 did not contemplate full, timely funding of the New Starts projects nor the advancement of the Purple Line under the P3 method. However, by the time the contracts were awarded in 2010, MDOT MTA had selected Locally Preferred Alternatives for the Purple Line and had begun Advanced Conceptual Design in preparation for federal approval of Preliminary Engineering (PE). By 2010, it was clear at that time that the value of the contracts would not be enough to complete design, and MDOT MTA expected to return to BPW for additional contract authority.

Additional funding primarily for design oversight was requested from BPW and approved on July 3, 2013; however, the funding level approved was not expected to be adequate to provide for construction management services. BPW was advised that it was the intent of MDOT MTA to return to BPW with a request for construction phase funding.

Additional funding primarily for construction management and quality assurance oversight was approved by BPW on September 7, 2016. At the time of the 2016 BPW request, the Purple Line Concessionaire had achieved Financial Close. The contractual Revenue Service Availability (RSA) date was established as March 11, 2022 with a contractual long stop date a maximum of 12 months later and the PMC contract expiration was extended to June 30, 2023.

MDOT MTA is now requesting additional contract authority and to extend the contract for four (4) years for multiple reasons. Due to the contractual issues, eventual departure of the Design-Build contractor, and the time required to compete and award to the next Design-Build contractor, this PMC contract has taken on an extremely high workload and needs this infusion of spending authority. The additional time is required to maintain the continuity which is absolutely necessary to ensure the State's interests. The following provides some detail regarding the issue:

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The Final Design is largely complete for the civil portion of the works and the systems design is progressing. Construction is still underway. However, the contractual issues with the Concessionaire and the Design-Build Contractor ultimately leading to the departure of the Design-Build Contractor has resulted in a delay to the original RSA date. MDOT MTA does not have adequate staff to monitor the design and construction activities and therefore the services of a PMC are necessary for the success of the project.

The funding level established in 2016 assumed the Concessionaire's Design-Build contractor would prosecute the work efficiently and effectively and that the Quality Assurance Oversight functions provided by the PMC, in order to ensure the project was designed and constructed in compliance with the technical provisions and to protect other interests of the state, would be minimal. This proved not to be the case and, while still attempting to constrain staff, the available funding was being utilized at a faster pace as the contractual disputes between the State, the Concessionaire and the Design-Builder escalated.

The situation changed dramatically when, in May of 2020, the Design-Build contractor submitted to the Concessionaire a Notice of Unconditional Election to Terminate the Design-Build contract. That action was followed by a similar notification from the Concessionaire to the **State** in June of 2020; the State responded with a Notice of Concessionaire Default immediately thereafter. The court actions resulting from these competing notifications were ultimately decided against the State on September 10, 2020.

The State entered into an Assignment and Assumption Agreement, dated as of September 28, 2020 for the purpose of conveying to the state the Key Contracts, the majority of the Design-Builder's Subcontracts, and various purchase agreements. Following the assumption, the State, acting as the general contractor and assisted by the PMC, began to actively prosecute the works scheduling contractors, negotiating change orders and contracts to provide for construction activity gaps (e.g., construction survey), following through on the manufacture and purchase of long lead items, and working to complete the design. This dramatically increased the number of PMC staff required to coordinate and administer those contracts, progress the design, and schedule and monitor the ongoing field work.

With the execution of a Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release between the State and the Concessionaire on December 17, 2020 the State, again assisted by the PMC, began providing advice and assistance to the Concessionaire for the ongoing design build contract re-solicitation. This effort includes negotiation of revisions to the P3 and Design-Build Agreements as well as the technical provisions as well as accumulating information on the construction materials now owned by the State with the intent to provide them to the new design-build contractor. The PMC staff time required for this significant administrative effort simultaneous with progressing the project has resulted in a rough doubling of effort.





#### 9-AE- MOD. MARYLAND TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION (cont'd)

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

These significant changes to the project have resulted in the current assigned PMC's contract value being nearly expended.

Staff continuity through the re-solicitation, design and construction processes is critical. The Purple Line project is highly complex in terms of design elements, including stakeholder, railroad, and utility coordination, as well as scheduling and construction phasing, means and methods. The project teams are well established with substantial investments in staff assignments, project orientation, training, and the establishment of document control and other construction management procedures. The project would incur significant costs, potential schedule days and additional risk if MDOT MTA were to transition to new teams.

These significant changes to the project have resulted in the current assigned PMC's contract value being nearly expended.

FTA oversight of the projects includes an evaluation of the technical capability and experience of the project team. Prior to PE approval, MDOT MTA submitted detailed resumes for the key consultant staff and FTA followed up with interviews. With new contracts, this process would have to be repeated. In addition, the replacement of the PMC contract mid-construction effort would dramatically increase the risk to the State given the loss of the institutional, historical, and technical knowledge possessed by the existing team.

If MDOT MTA was to begin a new procurement now, new contracts would not be available in time to avoid a significant risk to the project. Based on an 18-month procurement schedule (midpoint between ideal schedule of 12 months and typical schedule of 24 months), the new PMC contract would not be available until the end of calendar 2022 and would result in no time for the major transition required between the new PMC and the existing PMC. This would expose the State to significant risk while the construction work proceeded with less than sufficient oversight.

As the result of the PMC structure, the current PMC firm would be precluded from proposing for the project to which they are already assigned. This would limit the pool of capable firms, particularly DBEs.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** There are no other adoption agencies that can provide these specific adoption competent services (in-person/on-line) to all Maryland's twenty-four counties. Most of the in-state adoption agencies are very small and cannot commit to the services being requested.

The Center for Adoption Support and Education (C.A.S.E.) has maintained a post-adoption services contract since 2005 with the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services. In 15 years, none of the 350 families who received services experienced an adoption dissolution during their time in treatment. Prior to C.A.S.E.'s contract, the department was struggling with high rates of dissolution and children re-entering the system. C.A.S.E has successfully delivered telehealth services through the pandemic.

C.A.S.E.'s current office locations in Baltimore, Montgomery and Prince George's counties are well positioned to serve more than 63.3% of the target population. Through this program, C.A.S.E. plans to open two additional office locations to better serve Frederick and Carroll counties and Baltimore City, increasing ease of access for face-to-face therapy to approximately 71.8% of the target population.

C.A.S.E. is the only provider able to provide the following services to families within Maryland:

• Caregiver Support Groups: C.A.S.E. will offer 11support groups during the contract term. Each support group will include six, 75-90-minute sessions with eight families per group, no more than two caregivers per family.

• Kids' Adoption Network (KAN) Conference: 100 families will participate in an adoption conference.

• Adoption Workshops: Offering one workshop per quarter for 30 families and children for a total of 120 participants. These workshops help youth tell their adoption story.

• Educational Product / Book Bundle: After completion of their initial intake assessment or registration for the caregiver support group, 150 families per year will receive a voucher valued at \$80 to be used in the C.A.S.E. store for purchase of C.A.S.E. webinars, books or other products that best meet their children's age and the families' needs.

• In-Demand Webinars: Offer six in-demand webinars available to 230 caregivers per webinar for a total of 1,380 registrations per year. C.A.S.E. will provide certificates of participation for any families who need them for foster parent licensing. For parents who are also professionals, we can offer National Association of Social Work-approved Continuing Education Units for live webinars.

The proposed price for this Contract has been determined to be fair and reasonable as pricing for peer advocacy, group facilitation, therapeutic services, crisis intervention and case management has been similar to rates historically accepted and approved by local jurisdictions across the State of Maryland.

According to the State Finance and Procurement Article Section 13-107 and COMAR 21.05.05.02A (Sole Source Contracts); in order to provide continuity of human or social services care to current clients, the procurement officer shall, before the contract with the current provider expires, attempt to negotiate a sole source contract with the current provider. Based on an assessment by a licensed or certified health practitioner, the head of a funding unit determines that a change in the human or social services provider would have a detrimental impact on those clients currently being served by the provider. The licensed or certified health practitioner shall be a psychologist, social worker, physician, nurse, or qualified developmental disabilities professional, as defined in COMAR 10.22.02.11A.





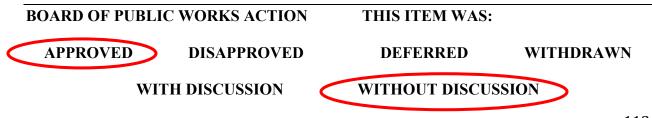

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of a Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* on November 16, 2020. The solicitation was sent directly to 41 prospective vendors including eight certified MBEs. Two proposals were received for each functional area.

The Biological Sciences Contractor provides Tidewater Ecosystem Assessment with technical expertise in collection of benthic samples from the Maryland portion of Chesapeake Bay, its tidal tributaries, and Maryland's Coastal Bays. This includes ample processing for species identification and statistical analyses and interpretations of results in relation to benthic population health, and assessment of the status and long-term trends of the overall health of Chesapeake and Coastal Bays. Contractor assists Tidewater Ecosystem Assessment with the identification of important policy and management issues, design of studies to address these issues, and evaluation of study conclusions.

Long-term comprehensive benthic assessments are required to track the progress in meeting Maryland's State and Federal commitments to de-list Maryland's impaired tidal water and restore the State's portion at the Chesapeake Bay in order to fulfill the federal mandate under the Environmental Protection Agency Clean Water Act for assessing all the State's waters.

Although EA Engineering had a slight edge in field monitoring and laboratory analysis technical review scores, they had the highest financial proposals for those Functional Areas. Versar, Inc., scored higher on the technical proposal for the Data Analysis and Interpretation Functional Area. The technical and financial evaluations were given equal weight. The evaluation team found Versar, Inc. to be the best choice overall in knowledge, skills, abilities, and cost; and to be the most advantageous to the State.

*Requesting Agency Remarks:* On December 22, 2020, a Request for Proposal (RFP) with Small Business Reserve designation was issued on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage.com and sent to 141 companies. The solicitation notice was sent directly to eight prospective vendors. A virtual pre-proposal conference was held on January 6, 2021.

A single proposal was received in response to the solicitation. The proposal was evaluated and rated by the evaluation committee for technical merit, including an oral presentation. Two vendors submitted the Feedback Forms.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Both stated concerns over the requirements in the scope of work related to the interpreting assignment cancellation policy requirements. The requirement as stated is that an untimely cancellation and the ability to bill for a service cancellation only occurs when there is less than 24-hour notice given to the contractor.

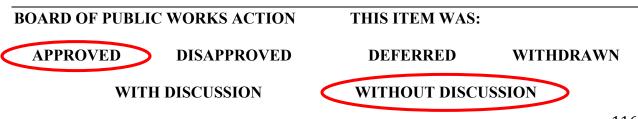
During the Pre-bid conference and in follow up questions and answers, it was stated by a prospective bidder that, "The industry standard is any cancellation with less than 2 full business days' notice is billed and paid to the interpreter for the full, originally assigned time." Both companies checked the feedback selection statement that says, "Proposal requirements other than specifications are unreasonable or too risky."

It was explained in the question-and-answer response that due to the nature of the services provided at Workforce and Technology Center (WTC), the majority of cancellations occur either within the 24-hour period due to consumer illness, no-shows, or inclement weather or are made well in advance of the assignment. The contract also allows being able to reassign an interpreter on short notice and avoid this issue. Additionally, the overwhelming majority of assignments are long term, lasting for weeks or months for training programs or other services. Adhering to a two full business day cancellation time frame does not fit the setting at WTC. The 24-hour cancellation policy has worked effectively for the last five years.

The standards in the scope of work were the same as the previous solicitation in 2016. DORS/WTC understands that less than two full business days' notice is standard to bill for cancellations in other settings, but the agency decided to maintain the current practice of only allowing billing for cancellations with less than 24-hour notice.

This contractor has performed well, and their financial proposal has only a minimal increase over the current contract and the hourly rates are lower than those of other vendors in the market.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** MDE is conducting an IFB to establish prices for FY22 and FY23 and due to conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic negotiations have been delayed. This extension will allow BAT Installers to continue to install septic systems as required by the state. All vendors have agreed to maintain FY 2020 pricing. The new contract has been advertised and MDE is currently reviewing bids. MDE anticipates bringing the new contract to BPW for approval in July or August.

The BRF Septic System Upgrade Program (SSUP) provides grants to local governments for homeowners and businesses to upgrade their conventional septic systems with nitrogen reducing BAT systems as part of the Chesapeake Bay cleanup. MDE has field-verified and approved eleven nitrogen reducing BAT septic system technologies with at least 50% nitrogen reduction capability. Administration of the BRF SSUP is delegated by MDE to each of the 23 counties.

The revenue source for this grant program is a \$60 per year fee charged to most households/businesses on septic systems for wastewater treatment. MDE conducts one statewide BAT services IFB instead of 23 individual county procurements and approved bid prices are used to administer the grant program.

When a failing septic system is identified, the counties engage the contractors to provide installation and undertake a final inspection. After acceptance of the BAT installation by the counties, the contractor will invoice the county for the price approved by the State under the contract for that technology. Counties will then seek reimbursement from MDE.

In December 2010, the Environmental Protection Agency established a "pollution diet" known as the Chesapeake Bay Total Maximum Daily Load. This "diet" sets limits on the amount of nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment that will be allowed to flow into the Chesapeake Bay each year. The use of BAT technology septic systems is State mandated for residents within the Chesapeake Bay Critical Areas in order to protect our waterways and reduce the amount of Nitrogen run-off into the Chesapeake Bay. The advanced technology used in these systems results in greater costs to homeowners and businesses. This grant helps to minimize these costs and restore the Chesapeake.

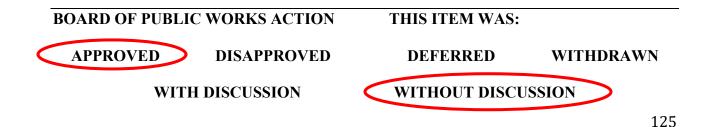

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** This vendor developed and has been providing support and maintenance for the Electronic Claims Management System (eCMS). It has been used by Breast and Cervical Cancer Diagnosis and Treatment (BCCDT) Program and Kidney Disease Program (KDP) to process and pay medical and pharmacy claims since September 2005.

The extension is necessary for continuity of operations while development is underway for a new, modern Salesforce based system. This option provides a stable system environment which will facilitate and leverage efforts to migrate these programs to the future system.

Prevention and Health Promotion Administration has been working with the Department of Health's Office of Enterprise Technology (MDH OET) on the plan for the new system. MDH OET recruited the services of an outside vendor, using a DoIT statewide contract to perform a system modernization to replace the current system. 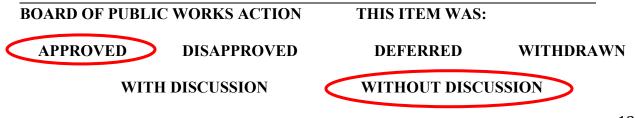

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** This contract is retroactive due to the initial month-to-month small purchase turning into a larger, longer term agreement as the Office of the Public Defender (OPD) identified more and more concerns with the information technology (IT) support in OPD, followed by the departure of the then-Director of IT and other IT staff in rapid succession. A contract was put in place on November 18, 2020.

The senior management services have ended, and the network and database management support will continue until June 30, 2021 as OPD completes the competitive bidding process for a replacement contract.

Historically, OPD had concerns about the stability, age and security of its IT systems and strength of its IT management and staff. OPD engaged in a short-term agreement for acting CIO services to assist senior management in the reorganization of the IT group. OPD's CIO was hired in October 2019 and the acting CIO services ended. However, the contract continued for services required to support database management and network engineering. This was previously covered under a separate, cancelled contract.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The Office of the Public Defender has determined these rates to be fair and reasonable. There is great variability in rates for these services, depending on the size and complexity of the system network, software applications, staff, and Agency operations. OPD has over 1,000 users with servers at over 50 locations across the State. Similar CIO services at comparable contractors were \$425 per hour and OPD paid \$400 per hour.

Senior Network Engineer rates charged by former consultants was \$128.71 per hour in the final year of the contract. New rates from bidders for the subsequent award range from \$56.62 to \$136.66 with an average and median of \$99.80 and \$99.46, respectively.

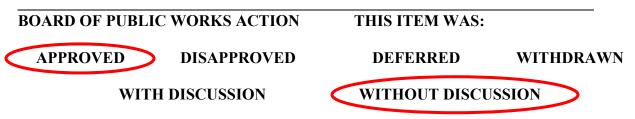
Database Administrator rate charged by the former consultants was \$145.87 per hour in the final year of the contract and new rates from bidders for the subsequent award range from \$45.07 to \$125.00 with an average and median of \$97.55 and \$100, respectively.

Senior Project Manager hourly rate of \$275 was reasonable considering OPD's old case management system was over twelve years old and was not maintained. State contractor services for project management start at \$250 per hour.

The extension further provides for termination dates for the various areas as follows: Halls E, Swing, F, and G shall terminate on 09/12/21; Hall C shall terminate on 08/15/2021; and Halls B, A and the Charles Street VIP area shall terminate on 10/01/2021.

**Remarks:** The Baltimore Convention Center (BCC) space was originally procured in accordance with the March 5, 2020 Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of Catastrophic Health Emergency due to the COVID-19. The Department of General Services (DGS) procured this space on behalf of the Maryland Department of Health (MDH). MDH has continued to manage the onsite field hospital, warehouse, testing and vaccination operations at this location.

Approval of this license agreement extension includes services procured from existing BCC vendor contracts already in place to support the Convention Center including food, internet, telecommunications, electrical needs, and audiovisual equipment. The license agreement requires the State to use these existing vendors.

**Background: RETROACTIVE** request of this action to approve second amendment to update Research Work Plan and extend Agreement from January 11, 2021 through July 11, 2021. The parties encountered delays in enrollments in research studies originally outlined in the Agreement attributed to unforeseen logistic considerations in updating the work plan and delays in completion of training on advanced functionality for the equipment loaned under the terms of the Agreement. The parties will continue to collaborate on the research project on cardiovascular disease processes and the role of dual energy imagining in characterizing details of post-mortem tissues. The project will explore the use and role of material discrimination capabilities. The findings will be disseminated through peer-reviewed publications and engagement at scientific meetings. Any inventions conceived solely by OCME will be OCME inventions and any inventions conceived solely by GE will be GE inventions. Any inventions conceived jointly will be joint inventions. At the end of the term, GE will remove its equipment at GE's expense and cooperate in the reinstallation of OCME's CT scanner.

*Intellectual Property Assignment and License Agreement:* MDH will transfer the clinical data to GE. GE will:

- Make the Dual energy CT technology available to OCME at no charge;
- Maintain the Dual energy CT equipment at no charge;
- Grant OCME a non-exclusive, paid-up, royalty-free, irrevocable, world-wide license to GE inventions for internal research and educational purposes; and
- Remove the GE equipment and cooperate to reinstall OCME's CT scanner at the end of the term.

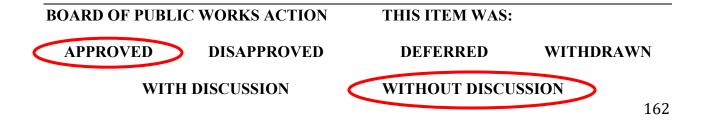

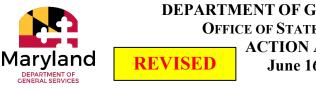

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** eMaint CMMS is Software as a Service (SaaS) specifically designed for building management and maintenance needs. On October 9, 2017, DGS began using CMMS software provided by eMaint, a Fluke Company. This selection was based on input from eleven State agencies that sought a single standardized Statewide maintenance management system. The advantages of standardization between agencies are significant. These advantages include ease of training and implementation, cost savings gained via leveraged purchasing power, the creation and maintenance of a single shared database, interagency management and reporting for work requests, and the compatibility of diagnostic tools between all agency systems. DGS has received requests from State agencies that want to use the eMaint CMMS product beyond the 11 agencies that initially sought to use a single standardized system, which necessitates the creation of a Statewide contract.

Since the time that the eMaint CMMS product was initially selected via an Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement (ICPA) in 2017, this software has become the standard CMMS system within the State. At the time of the issuance of that ICPA, DGS chose eMaint due to features contained within its software that were unavailable from competing CMMS providers. eMaint does not operate any kind of reseller relationship for CMMS, nor is it listed under any of the contract vehicles for NASPO ValuePoint, Sourcewell, or Omnia Partners. The compatibility of any new CMMS system with the existing State databases, which are provided by eMaint, is of paramount importance to prevent service disruptions.

### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The eMaint CMMS provides advanced data analytics and reporting which includes a relational database that organizes work orders and helps prevent critical breakdowns of equipment. This helps State agencies track maintenance expenditures over the life cycle of an asset as well as conduct predictive analytics that create cost savings. The system features the following critically needed features required by State facilities maintenance teams:

- Work Orders: allows work order generation online, then tracks them to completion
- Asset Management: creates asset hierarchies, tracks maintenance history, and prioritizes \_ work
- Mobile Maintenance: lets technicians use mobile tools to access the system remotely, see repair histories and technical drawings, and report work order completion status
- Preventive Maintenance: generates tasks, develops usage schedules, and tracks inspections
- Parts and Inventory: manages and tracks spare parts, suppliers, and purchase orders
- Condition Monitoring: sets minimum and maximum operating parameters for equipment, records readings, and analyzes results
- Reports and Dashboards: analyzes trends and facilitates data-driven decision making through sophisticated analytical tools.

Fair and Reasonable Pricing Determination: A review of the quoted pricing provided to the State demonstrates that the State is receiving a 20% discount below the manufacturer's standard retail price (MSRP) for subscription licenses, consulting fees, and implementation fees. The State is also receiving a 15% discount below MSRP for end user training fees. As this product is only available from the manufacturer, any discount below standard retail pricing represents favorable pricing and therefore DGS has determined the quoted prices to be fair and reasonable.

Each of the five 1-year renewal options serve as time-only extensions and will only be exercised if funding remains from the base period of the contract. The renewal options will require no additional funding.

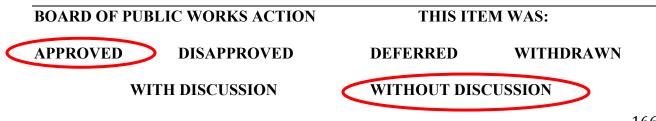
