# 1. <u>DEPARTMENT OF AGING</u> Senior Center Capital Improvement Grant

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Public Works: 1) approve waiving the State's right of recovery against parties other than Talbot County and the Young Men's Christian Association of the Chesapeake, Inc., and so render moot the requirement to record a notice of that right in local land records, and 2) approve the substitution of the general-obligation bond source on the original Item.

*Authority:* Human Services Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, § 10-509(g)

*Prior Approval:* Secretary's Agenda, Item 1 (11/20/19)

**Remarks:** In 2017, Talbot County applied for an \$800,000 grant under the Senior Citizen Activities Centers Capital Improvement Grants Program, authorized by Sections 10-501 through 10-510 of the Human Services Article. The grant was requested to help finance the construction of the St. Michaels Family YMCA and Senior Center, a multi-use facility with a senior citizen activities center.

The Young Men's Christian Association of the Chesapeake, Inc., ("YMCAC"), was specified in the grant application as the sub-grantee of the entire \$800,000. YMCAC constructed the project on a 20,000 square foot piece of property that it leased for 99 years from the Board of Education of Talbot County ("Board of Education"). On June 10, 2019, the project was completed, and on November 20, 2019, the Board of Public Works approved the award of the \$800,000 grant.

HSA § 10-506(a) provides that before State funds are paid under the Senior Citizen Activities Centers Capital Improvement Grants Program, a grantee shall record in the local land records a notice of the State's statutory right to recover a pro-rata portion of the grant funds if certain conditions of HSA § 10-507 are not met. Although the application for the grant provided that a notice of the right of recovery would be recorded, Talbot County has been unable to file the notice because: (i) HSA § 501(h)(3) requires that any lessor of the property consent to the recordation, and (ii) the Board of Education will not consent. The Board of Education is concerned that agreeing to the right of recovery may conflict with laws regulating the transfer of school property.

# Remarks (cont'd):

HSA § 10-509(g) authorizes the Board of Public Works to waive the State's right of recovery if the Board determines that there is good cause for releasing the transferor, transferee, or owner from this obligation.

In order to resolve the dilemma described above, Talbot County has agreed to enter into a grant agreement that expressly preserves the State's right to recover the grant funds from Talbot County in the event of a default, if the Board of Public Works finds that good cause exists to waive the recording of the notice of the State's right of recovery in the land records.

The Office of the Attorney General has reviewed the grant agreement and approved it for legal sufficiency.

**Description:** The Project consists of the substantial rehabilitation of 67 garden-style apartment units for families in Chestertown, Kent County, Maryland. The Project will offer a mix of affordable one- and two-bedroom units, and will serve households with incomes at or below 50% and 60% of the Area Median Income (AMI). The Project is sponsored by TM Associates Development, Inc. and Green Street Housing, LLC.

- 6. Units will receive new 15-SEER minimum heat pumps and AHUs.
- 7. Solar panels will be installed on the community building roof to provide supplemental power to the management office and community areas.
- 8. Building's exterior siding, roofing and cladding material will be replaced, and R-49 blown-in insulation will be implemented in all attic spaces.
- 9. Air sealing and weatherization will be provided in accordance with the Department of Energy Air Leakage Guide and the 2018 IECC for typical areas.

# Disclosure:

The SARC is a grant recipient of a Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) grant from the U.S. Department of Justice. The Violence Against Women Act and the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act award grants assist to support the establishment, maintenance, and expansion of programs and projects to, among other things, provide immediate shelter for the family, domestic or dating violence victims and their dependents. Both acts prohibit grant recipients from disclosing the address or location of any shelter that maintains a confidential location unless the person responsible for operating the shelter gives written authorization. Failure to follow the Acts' universal grant conditions regarding victim confidentiality and privacy could result in a loss of funding (42 USCA §§ 10401, 10406). Accordingly, the Department is not disclosing the location of this project.

*Authority:* Housing and Community Development Article, §2-102(a)(7), Annotated Code of Maryland; Ch. 22, Acts of 2017; Ch. 9, Acts of 2018; Ch. 14, Acts of 2019; and Ch. 537, Acts of 2020, as amended.

*Shelter and Transitional Housing Facilities Grant Program* shall provide capital financing, in the amount of \$1,500,000, for local governments and nonprofit organizations to develop shelter, transitional, and other housing facilities for homeless individuals and families.

**Description:** The proposed project consists of a two-story addition of 7,200 square feet and renovation of 9,203 existing square feet for a total of 16,403 square feet which includes an improvement to the administration space.

Communal areas include an exercise room, children's play areas, laundry facilities, TV room, quiet room, teen room, and two kitchens. The design will ensure adequate storage space for personal items in each room. The new design focuses on the promotion of well-being and healing. The newly constructed project will provide 10 shelter units which will house four beds per shelter unit, each unit serving 40 people per month, for a total of 480 people per year.

Major components for this project include replacement of the building's heating and cooling systems, installation of a natural gas back-up generator, new utility service, LED lighting upgrades, reconfiguration of interior space, and relocation of building entry points.

*Remarks:* This project is to construct an approximately 885 linear foot living shoreline with regenerative stormwater conveyance system and climate-resilient natural features to protect infrastructure, improve water quality, and replace a hardened shoreline.

The Coastal Resiliency Program was developed to address escalating risks to Maryland communities and public resources from extreme weather and climate-related events. Recognizing that coastal habitats buffer communities from weather-related events such as hurricanes and flooding, DNR developed a Coastal Resiliency Assessment. This targeting model identifies areas where restoration can provide the greatest protection benefits for infrastructure, communities, businesses, and habitats. The Coastal Resiliency Program will implement on-the-ground natural and nature-based projects in priority areas where nature can help communities become more resilient to flooding and erosion. Projects will protect both public and private investments, while demonstrating a suite of nature-based projects that will enhance the ability of communities to respond to or recover from storms, flooding, and other coastal hazards.

DNR will provide technical assistance and grant funds to entities to construct living shoreline, marsh enhancement, green infrastructure, and nature-based projects. These projects will restore eroding shorelines at vulnerable locations along the State's coast and reduce the impacts of flooding on vulnerable communities. Design for these projects were previously approved. Final design plans and permits are in hand, and DNR is seeking approval to award construction funds. After construction, DNR will return to the Board for approval to award adaptive management funds if warranted.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Approval of this non- revenue generating transaction results from a resource sharing agreement between Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration, the Department of Information Technology and Fiberlight LLC. The original agreement contemplated a non-exclusive use of the State right of way to construct a multiple-conduit, fiber-optic system to benefit the State as well as the private industry partner. Approving this renewal option allow the parties to continue their mutually beneficial, non-compulsory agreement whereby the State continues its use of forty strands of Company dark fiber and the Company continues its use of the State right of way in Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Howard Counties for the additional terms provided.

Because the value of the modification exceeds \$100,000, this transaction was submitted to the Legislative Policy Committee for review and comment and was posted on eMaryland Marketplace.

**Remarks:** The Maryland Correctional Institution – Hagerstown (MCI-H) boiler plant was built in 1963. The existing electrical distribution system has been in operation over 50 years with components that have reached the end of their life and are obsolete. The motor control centers (MCC), an integral part of the system, are an assembly of enclosed breakers to control electric motors; these breakers have no replacement if they fail. The transformer, which converts the medium voltage supplied from the utility to low voltage for use in the distribution system, is old and needs to be replaced. The emergency diesel generator (EDG) and automatic transfer switch (ATS) are over 40 years old. The EDG supplies electric power as necessary when normal power is unavailable. The ATS unreliably switches power supply from the main electrical service to the EDG during a power outage. In the past the ATS failed to operate automatically. Staff has had to adjust settings and monitored and routinely test the ATS monthly to check operation. Failure of any these electrical components jeopardize the boiler plant's mission to safely provide steam for heating, cooking, and laundry services at the MCI-H prison complex. For this contract, the A/E will design and specify new boiler plant electrical distribution system components and provide installation support.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency - COVID-19: The Department of Commerce continues to have a pressing need for reliable staff to process payments for the Department's COVID-19 Relief Emergency Small Business Grant and Loan Programs. The Department has an Accounts Payable staff of two who would not have been able to process such a high volume of disbursements.

Commerce relied on volunteers from other State agencies to assist with the emergency grant and loan programs; however, the Department was unable to identify enough volunteers who could provide assistance on the regular basis to process grant and loan payments. Compounding this was the additional funding the Governor allocated to this COVID-19 emergency relief effort to assist more small businesses.

To meet the urgent need and the Governor's aggressive timeline for processing supplemental emergency grant and loan payments, Commerce modified the existing emergency contract for the temporary Accounts Payable staff to process these payments. The Department would not be able to timely process the emergency COVID-19 Emergency Relief grant and loan payments without the additional temporary staff. As COMAR 21.01.02.01 defines an emergency as a sudden and unexpected occurrence or condition which agency management reasonably could not foresee that requires an action to avoid or to mitigate serious damage to public health, safety, or welfare, this contract modification meets the definition of an emergency.

Standard procurement procedures would have taken Commerce a significant amount of time to complete the modification and obtain the required approval from the Office of State Procurement.

Protiviti continues to perform exceptionally and within scope during the contract period. Therefore, Commerce determined that it was necessary to issue an emergency contract modification to Protiviti Government Services for the temporary staffing that is processing the COVID-19 Emergency Relief grant and loan payments.

A price analysis was conducted comparing the cost of each ICU trailer to the cost of installing an external structure. The cost for the ICU trailers was determined to be the most advantageous option for the State.

*DGS OSP Remarks:* This emergency procurement was originally submitted for consideration with a compiled emergency report (*May 21, 35 days post award*); however, it was determined that all non-commodity emergency reports related to the COVID-19 pandemic would be reported individually. Due to the unique and emergent needs, it was determined by the Local Department of Social Services that Youth For Tomorrow New Life Center, Inc. was the most appropriate placement for these youth as Youth For Tomorrow New Life Center, Inc. is a Residential Treatment Center specializing in a continuum of services which include: Treatment Group Homes – for boys and girls including services to pregnant teens and girls sexually exploited or trafficked, Crisis Intervention Counseling Services, Diagnostic and Assessment Services, Outpatient Services, Therapeutic Day Treatment, Intensive In-Home Services, and Therapeutic Mentoring.

This is a reimbursement not-to-exceed per diem contract where the provider is paid solely for the actual number of children placed with the provider during the year and then only for the actual number of days the children are with the provider. As such, DHS will not be charged for any unused capacity. The award amount for this contract is based upon the current youths in the program and the dates in which they age-out of the program. The contract also provides a small buffer to cover the potential for other youth to enter the program during the term.

In January 2021, the Maryland Department of Information Technology ("DOIT") on behalf of the Maryland Department of Health ("MDH") issued an Emergency Request for a COVID-19 Vaccination Call Center. Two responses from DMI and Maximus were received. A review committee consisting of DoIT and MDH personnel met and discussed the proposals received and determined that the proposal submitted by Digital Management, LLC ("DMI") would be the most advantageous for the State from both a technical and financial standpoint.

DMI developed a comprehensive framework for the rapid development and deployment of a large-scale call center to handle questions and scheduling for COVID-19 vaccines at state-run mass vaccination sites. This emergency procurement is from February 1, 2021 - November 30, 2021 for \$25M with one seven month renewal option (\$9.6M) through June 30, 2022 using federal COVID-19 relief funds. We anticipate that higher costs may be at the beginning as part of the initial set-up, with lower costs throughout the duration of the contract, and a projected \$1.37M /month steady rate in operational costs.

Beginning February 17, 2021, shortly after the opening of the first state-run mass vaccination sites including the Six Flags America location in Prince George's County, the State launched a telephone-based support line:

COVID-19 Vaccination Support Center 1-855-MDGOVAX (1-855-634-6829) 7AM - 10PM EST | 7 days a week

As Marylanders contact the support center, they are able to find:

- Information on Maryland's vaccination efforts;
- Scheduling of appointments at the state-run mass-vaccination centers;
- COVID-19 vaccine providers for callers (closest to them geographically);
- English and Spanish call tree constituents that go through the Spanish side are connected with Spanish-speaking call center advocates;
- Live agents through text messaging or by engaging online via chatbot and instantmessaging;
- Staffing up to more than 500 U.S.-based advocates initially, with additional expansion capabilities.

Since launch, and as of February 28, 2021, the COVID-19 Support Center has received over 306,000 calls:

- Total appointments for Six Flags the week of March 1, 2021: 17,391
- Total cumulative appointments to date (as of February 28, 2021)set via <u>massvax.maryland.gov</u> website and the call center: 26,714
- Initially, we tested this support center with outbound calls to more than 5,000 Prince George's County residents.

DMI has the infrastructure to ramp up or ramp down as the actual call volumes are realized. The approach to the Call Center will come in two Phases: Phase 1 to implement the call center to directly support Maryland citizens in answering their inquiries regarding the COVID-19 Vaccine. Phase 2 will be to implement a scheduling system for utilization by Marylanders to schedule COVID-19 vaccine appointments. The Contractor is able to accommodate upwards of 75,000 calls per day.

The unsuccessful vendor, Maximus US Service, Inc, was notified of the results of the procurement on February 11, 2021. A request for a debriefing was received on February 12, 2021. Prior to the debriefing being scheduled a letter of protest was received from the unsuccessful vendor on February 16, 2021. The debriefing was held on February 26, 2021. On Tuesday, March 1, 2021 Maximus sent a letter withdrawing the bid protest.

The delays resulted in a loss of 129 calendar days and without action would have prevented opening the building for classes in the Spring 2021 semester.

In the effort to keep the building opening on time, the University requested that Whiting-Turner implement a schedule recovery plan to meet the completion dates necessary to open for the Spring. The goal during this time was to normalize operations in anticipation of returning to full operations. Five milestones were established within the schedule to accomplish temporary Certificates of Occupancy for different sections of the building. Each building section would be turned over to the University in a phased/staggered occupation of the building to prepare for classes. The effort to recover schedule was accompanied by a large increase in on-site staff and general conditions. Additional personnel were allocated to the project and the staff as a whole were reorganized and assigned to smaller areas and floors in lieu of large sections as outlined in the original schedule. This effort was to keep a labor force of approximately 300 people safe via COVID protocols while working in the building and putting into place between \$3 million and

\$4.5 million of work monthly. The building sections were all turned over to the University ahead of the revised recovery schedule and substantial completion was achieved on November 16, 2020.

The University and Construction Manager focused on the schedule recovery plan to ensure the building opening while negotiating the associated costs accordingly. The University originally anticipated this cost to be under \$1 million. Whiting-Turner carried a placeholder unsubstantiated amount over \$1 million. The University, therefore hired a scheduling consultant to review the impacted schedule for compensable time.

Final costs were dependent upon the substantial completion date. The costs were for a 129calendar day schedule delay and a value of \$2.8 million. Given the complexity of this situation and the multiple factors involved, the University and the Construction Manager had extensive negotiations and at the end of January had finalized on the associated costs. The final negotiated effort to mitigate loss is 95 calendar days and \$2,099,379.

**Requesting Institution Remarks (Modification):** The initial design for the science labs in this project were based on the program documents which are dated in 2012. This project had a one-year delay during the design phase, and it has now been 9 years since the program was approved. Since the completion of the new science building program, the departments in the Jess and Mildred Fisher College of Science and Mathematics have gone through changes in research, shifting pedagogies and innovative teaching methods. Existing equipment which was originally scheduled to move into this new facility is now obsolete and insufficient for the teaching and research activities.

COVID-19 has impacted the availability of lab equipment which led to the selection of available/alternative equipment which impacted teaching and research lab configurations and the associated infrastructure. The work is scheduled to be completed in six (6) months. The cost for lab modifications to accommodate the new equipment is \$5,989,652.

*Sustainability:* The project design complies with the Maryland State High Performance Green Building Program. The project includes the following sustainable features: Energy efficient LED lighting and low mercury lighting, water-saving plumbing fixtures, low VOC emitting materials, reflective roofing, building envelope, fume hood, mechanical and electrical system commissioning.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** This solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) and the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Aviation Administration's (MDOT MAA) webpage on September 15, 2020. The MDOT MAA directly solicited 13 prospective bidders, including the three (3) bidders who bid on the existing contract. To encourage bidding, prior to the bid due date, MDOT MAA contacted each directly solicited firm to advise of the pre-bid meeting minutes posting via addendum to eMMA. The Procurement Officer

also requested each firm to provide no bid feedback should they choose not to bid. No responses were received. Bids were due October 29, 2020, three (3) bids were received.

A review of the bid packages revealed that two (2) of the bidder's bids were non-responsive because it did not conform in all materials aspects to the requirements contained in the solicitation. Therefore, bidder no. 1 was rejected December 23, 2020 and bidder no. 3 was rejected January 8, 2021. No protests were filed.

The MDOT MAA considered cancelling this procurement and rebidding the services due to the single responsive bid received. However, since bid prices were exposed at the public bid opening, and MDOT MAA does not have any amendments to the solicitation, it would not be fiscally advantageous to MDOT MAA to re-procure these services. Historically, MDOT MAA only receive three (3) bids, primarily due to the 24/7 on-call emergency commitment and requirement of the MD tree expert license issued by the Department of Natural Resources.

In making the decision to award to RJO, the Procurement Officer compared pricing of the nonresponsive bidders to RJO's pricing and determined RJO's price is only 1% higher than bidder number one and 60% lower than bidder no. 3. Additionally, the Procurement Officer compared RJOs bid prices to the existing 2016 contract pricing and discovered RJO's bid price is only 9% higher than prices received six (6) years ago.

RJO has demonstrated through past performance the ability to meet MDOT MAA's needs and is capable of meeting all required specifications. For the reasons stated, MDOT MAA considers RJO cost fair and reasonable.

MD Works granted a waiver on June 23, 2021.

and capital improvements. That allowance of \$500,000 was established by MDOT MPA in the original solicitation and was the same for all bidders.

The rate of expenditure for repairs and improvements has been greater than originally anticipated due to the age of buildings. Several structures range in age from 30-50 years and the associated fire protections systems were installed when the structures were built. Under the fire code, the scope of maintenance and inspections increases as the age of the system increases. Individual components, such as the sprinkler heads, must be tested more frequently to verify they still operate as designed or they must be replaced. Internal inspections of the piping must be performed, and if large amounts of debris or obstructions are found these systems must be flushed in their entirety.

Increased inspections lead to discovery of the need for additional repairs and improvements. Leaks cannot be detected until a hole develops in the wall of the pipe and the system is pressurized, which can potentially damage cargo. For example, MDOT MPA has experienced numerous leaks in the sprinkler systems in several sheds utilized for paper cargo. Inspections have revealed internal corrosion in the piping of these systems. Numerous leaks developed as a result of required system testing that required systems to be pressurized with water. Once pressurized, leaks developed which damaged the cargo. To minimize damage to cargo, MDOT MPA has worked with the contractor to develop a pretest strategy under which systems are pressurized with air and inspected for leaks before flooding the systems with water. MDOT MPA has also utilized this contract to assist the MDOT MPA Engineering Division with several projects that involved disassembly and assembly of major sprinkler system components. These additional needs have caused MDOT MPA to spend the \$500,000 allowance for system repairs and capital improvements faster than originally anticipated. At this time MDOT MPA has not overspent the allowance. The \$600,000 added to the contract value by this modification is expected to be sufficient for the remainder of the original contract term.

The Maryland Port Commission approved this modification on March 2, 2021.

and disposal of chrome-contaminated soil at Dundalk Marine Terminal that is required under a Consent Decree entered into in 2006 among MDOT MPA, Honeywell International, Inc. (Honeywell), and the Maryland Department of the Environment that requires MDOT MPA and Honeywell to address the presence of chromium ore processing residue at the Dundalk Marine Terminal. The contract provides that MDOT MPA has two (2) options to renew the contract for two (2) years each, and the MDOT MPA Office of Safety, Environment, and Risk Management has requested that the option be exercised in order to assure MDOT MPA compliance with the Consent Decree.

In addition to Consent Decree, MDOT MPA and Honeywell also executed a Settlement Agreement under which MPA and Honeywell: (1) settled all claims between the parties for response costs related to chromium ore processing residue at Dundalk Marine Terminal; and (2) allocated the costs associated with response actions to be performed at Dundalk Marine Terminal, the allocation being 77% to Honeywell and 23% to MDOT MPA. Both the Settlement Agreement and the Consent Order were approved by the Board of Public Works on April 5, 2006, Item 15-GM, on the Department of Budget and Management agenda.

To date, MDOT MPA and Honeywell are on schedule to complete the implementation of remedial measures on April 5, 2023 as required under the Consent Decree provided that remedial measures can continue without delay. Therefore, it is critical that the first renewal option of this contract be exercised to provide for continued removal and disposal of chromium ore processing residue as well as management of chromium impacted liquids and hauling to the onsite treatment plant. The contractor has performed the contract well and MDOT MPA wishes to continue its services. The contractor is entitled to a Consumer Price Index increase of 1.4% in rates during the renewal term. MDOT MPA has budgeted \$1,500,000 for the contract during the renewal term.

ACV's MBE compliance to date is only .42% toward an MBE commitment of 10%. However, MDOT MPA's Office of Fair Practices has advised that ACV was not at fault for that failure to achieve the committed MBE participation on MDOT MPA payments to date. ACV offered and MDOT MPA approved two MBE subcontractors, one for hauling petroleum impacted soil, universal waste, and other nonhazardous materials. To date, MDOT MPA has not needed removal of any of those materials. The second MBE subcontractor is to haul hazardous waste. In 2019, that MBE subcontractor allowed its controlled hazardous substance waste hauler's permit to expire, preventing the contractor from using that MBE subcontractor until its permit was renewed in January 2021. In addition, the MBE compliance rate of .42% is based on only 18% of the contract value having been paid by MDOT MPA. Therefore, a substantial percentage of the contract value remains available for MBE participation, and ACV has committed to fulfilling its MBE commitment during the remaining contract term and the renewal term.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) sent direct notification of the solicitation to ten prospective offerors and placed an advertisement in eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and proposals were received from all ten. One proposal was deemed not susceptible for award due to deficiencies with its financial proposal.

The media buying services provided under this contract include campaigns encompassing a period of approximately three months with occasionally overlapping implementation schedules. Each campaign will be focused on a particular program area (e.g. Foreclosure Prevention) or targeted service population (e.g. Military Veterans). The contractor will conduct media planning and placement of advertising.

Compensation for media buying will be provided as a pass-through cost for media placements. These pass-through costs are estimated at \$1,020,000 and do not vary between proposals.

Red House indicated in their proposal that they operated a satellite office in Baltimore. Due to COVID related budget cuts amongst Maryland clients, the company was forced to recall staff from the Baltimore office. The Offeror also indicated if awarded the contract they anticipate expanding staffing at the Baltimore office again. Red House estimates the budgeted amounts provided in the RFP will support approximately five jobs at their Baltimore office.

DHCD broke down the scope of work from the previous solicitation/contract into a more focused, single element type scope of work. This was done to focus on firms that excelled specifically at only media buying. Because of the narrower scope of work, only a single vendor is required. The solicitation was also designated as a Small Business Reserve (SBR).

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** A Request for Expressions of Interest was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage.com on August 12, 2019 and copies of the solicitation were sent directly to 33 Maryland providers. All 33 of those providers responded, including one new provider, PC Stride. Awards were made to all the 33 known Maryland providers. PCC Stride, the new provider who did not have a previous contract with DHS/SSA was not recommended to be awarded a contract at that time because they did not possess an Interagency Rate Committee rate letter.

Once the rate letter was received, the Department intended to recommend them for award of a contract for Child Placement (CPA) services.

CPA Programs are defined in COMAR 07.02.21.03B (17) as a 24-hour substitute care program, operated by a licensed child placement agency or local department of social services, for children with a serious emotional, behavioral, medical, or psychological condition.

The total award amount assumes that each bed purchased will be occupied by a child for the full year of the contracts. Based on history, this is unlikely to occur. These are reimbursements contracts. The providers are paid solely for the actual number of children placed with them during each year, and then only for the actual number of days each child is with the provider. The Providers have rates that were approved by the Interagency Rates Committee.

State Finance and Procurement Article Section 13-106 and COMAR 21.05.12.04(B) (Non-Competitive Negotiated Procurement of Human, Social or Educational Services) provides for procuring certain human, social and educational services. CPA service providers in this request were obtained through a non-competitive negotiation process.

DHS has chosen to remove all MBE/VSBE goals from the Child Place Agency contracts because the subcontracting opportunities originally identified were for ancillary services, rather than core services. Subcontractors would be unable to meet the 16 categories of work such as, printing, office supplies, paper, janitorial, janitorial equipment and supplies, auditing, tax preparation, catering, food wholesaler, telecommunication, shredding, temporary staffing, training, document storage or warehousing services.

The procurement of these service providers has complied with the Law's requirement for Non-Competitive Negotiated Procurement of Human, Social or Educational Services, because currently the number of children in need of placement exceeds the number of available beds. **Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of a Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* and on the Department's website on July 27, 2020. The solicitation was sent directly to 106 prospective vendors including 13 certified MBEs and one VSBE.

Three proposals were received in response to the RFP; however, one was determined not to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Hope Health Systems, Inc. (Hope Health) was ranked number one overall with the highest ranked technical proposal and the second lowest price. It was determined that the overall magnitude of the strengths of Hope Health's technical proposal and the differences between the lower priced offeror outweighed the differences in prices. Therefore, it is recommended that Hope Health be awarded the contract due to providing the offer that is the most advantageous to the State.

Hope Health's proposal described in detail how their staff's experience and qualifications would relate to their specific responsibilities under the Contract and how each requirement of the RFP will be achieved. Additionally, Hope Health has over 20 years of experience in providing direct mental health, substance abuse, and community support services to adults, children, and adolescent clients in institutional and outpatient settings in Maryland, along with specific experience in providing services to youth in juvenile justice settings.

CrownHills Enterprises, Inc. submitted a proposal that met the minimum requirements of the RFP. However, the proposed work plan was not detailed, signifying a narrow understanding of the range of services required. Although CrownHills has experience providing medical personnel, their proposal indicates limited experience providing behavioral health services to youth in juvenile justice settings.

Hope Health's pricing is considered to be fair and reasonable compared to prior contracts, taking into consideration the applicable Consumer Price Index and additional agency requirements. Requirements that were added by the Department when procuring this contract include: 1) an increase of the monthly onsite service hours per facility and 2) additional evaluation reports (for each facility).

Based on these factors, the evaluation committee concluded and the Procurement Officer agreed it is in the best interest of the state to award the contracts for all three DJS facilities to Hope Health.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, notifying approximately 270 registered vendors and the solicitation was also posted on MHCC's website. Direct solicitation was sent to 869 prospective vendors, 633 are DoIT Master Contractors, 236 accumulated contacts. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs.

MHCC is required by law to analyze and report on health care utilization and spending in Maryland to the State legislature. To meet this statutory requirement, MHCC developed a database, the Maryland Medical Care Data Base (MCDB), Maryland's All Payer Claims Data Base (APCD). The MCDB contains information on privately-insured health care services provided to Maryland residents and to non-Maryland residents insured under a Maryland contract. Under COMAR 10.25.06, MHCC collects these privately-insured claims and membership data quarterly from life and health insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations (HMOs), third party administrators (TPAs), and pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs) who are licensed to do business in Maryland.

The MCDB supports estimates of cost and utilization, policy analyses, and evaluations of demonstration programs. It is a decision support tool for State partners such as the Maryland Insurance Administration (MIA), the Health Services Cost Review Commission (HSCRC), and the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange (MHBE). MHCC is continually enhancing the MCDB by expanding and streamlining the collection, processing, and reporting of MCDB data.

**Remarks:** The Baltimore Convention Center (BCC) space was originally procured in accordance with the March 5, 2020 Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of Catastrophic Health Emergency due to the COVID-19. The Department of General Services (DGS) procured this space on behalf of the Maryland Department of Health (MDH). MDH has continued to manage the onsite field hospital, warehouse, testing and vaccination operations at this location.

The prior rental rate of \$5 per sf or \$77,083.33 has increased to \$270,000 per month for this three month extension. This increase is justified for the following reasons. First, while the State has been using 185,000 sf of space for the field hospital, BCC has only invoiced the State for 123,000 sf for the last 12 months. This represents \$310,000 in cost avoidance for the State (62,000 x \$5 per sf = \$310,000 annual rent). Second, the \$5 per sf rental rate was significantly below market. The new rate being requested of \$270,000 per month equates to \$17.51 per sf. Since the new rate includes heating and cooling for 24/7 operations, \$5.00 of this rate would be considered utility charges with the balance of \$12.51 being considered rent. This rental rate is considered a market rate. Third, BCC advised that a standard 24-hour rental rate for the space being used by the State would cost \$21,000 per day. The new rate proposed of \$9,000 per day is less than half what would normally be charged. Finally, it is anticipated that BCC will be permitted to reopen in coming months as vaccines become available. With the State's continued occupancy through July 18, 2021, the center will have lost opportunity costs of \$2,112,587 for the period March 1, 2021 through July 18, 2021.

Approval of this license agreement extension includes services procured from existing BCC vendor contracts already in place to support the Convention Center including: food, internet, telecommunications, electrical needs and audiovisual equipment. The license agreement requires the State to use these existing vendors.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Request approval to increase grant funding in the amount of \$6,000,000 from video terminal proceeds to the eight (8) incumbent Fund Managers. Under the SMWOBA contracts, existing fund managers may reapply for additional funds to make loans. For fiscal years' 2018, 2019, and 2020, no appropriation was approved for the program as funding was reallocated. In fiscal year 2021, an appropriation of \$17.1 million was approved. As such, the Department invited all eight existing fund managers to reapply for additional funds and prepared a Request for Proposal (RFP) to invite new fund managers to apply for SMWOBA funds. All eight existing fund managers reapplied and were awarded funds by the Board of Public Works on December 2, 2020. The total recommendation of awarded funds by the committee and subsequently approved by the BPW was \$11 million.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The remaining \$6 million was earmarked for three (3) new fund managers with a maximum allocation of \$2 million each. The Department issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) #**T00R1600131** for additional fund managers. Only one proposal was submitted for evaluation. This vendor failed to meet the minimum requirement stipulated in the RFP. Therefore, the fund manager was removed from further consideration and the procurement cancelled.

The \$6.0 million in available SMWOBA funds will be reallocated to the existing fund managers.

The purpose of the additional grant funding is to provide monies to the Fund to be used and administered, managed, and accounted for by the Fund Manager on behalf of the Fund and for the benefit of the State of Maryland to make loans to or investments in Eligible Targeted Businesses located in the State of Maryland.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 9-1A-27(a)(6) and 9-1A-35 [Small, Minority and Women-Owned Businesses Account] of the State Government Article of the Maryland Code Annotated (the "Act"), an eligible fund manager may apply for, and the Board may approve a grant of funds from the Small, Minority and Women-Owned Businesses Account (the "Account"). On August 22, 2012, Item #22, BPW designated Commerce formerly known as DBED to manage the Small, Minority and Women-Owned Businesses Account funded by video-lottery terminal proceeds and delegated Commerce to procure the financial services of eligible fund managers for the program. BPW retained the right to approve additional grant funding to the Fund Managers and the BPW approved contracts were constructed to allow disbursement of additional funds without modifying the contract.
