Remarks:

PCBs. PCBs are a class of man-made compounds manufactured in the United States by Monsanto from 1920 through 1979, when federal law barred their manufacture and sale. PCBs were ubiquitous in a range of industrial and commercial applications and products, including home appliances, lighting ballasts, paint, caulk, transformers, food cookers, thermostats, hydraulic fluids, coolants, inks, lubricants, and many others. PCBs have a marked tendency to

escape their intended applications through leaking, leaching, off-gassing or degradation of the base materials, whereupon they contaminate nearby surfaces, soil, air and water. PCBs are known to become concentrated in the tissues of fish that inhabit PCB-impaired waterways. As a result, the Maryland Department of the Environment ("MDE") has issued dozens of fish consumption advisories for water bodies across Maryland based on findings of high PCB concentrations in fish tissue. Humans may be exposed to PCBs through ingestion, inhalation or dermal contact. Such exposure is associated with numerous serious health effects, including malignant melanoma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma and breast cancer. Non-cancer health effects include damage to the immune system, reproductive system, nervous system and endocrine system.

Claims. It appears that Monsanto knew for decades that PCBs were highly toxic and that their use would result in widespread contamination. Monsanto was aware of scientific literature published as early as the 1930s that established that inhalation of PCBs in industrial settings resulted in toxic systemic effects. In 1966, a Swedish researcher reported the detection of PCBs in tissue of fish and wildlife and concluded that PCBs can "be presumed to be widespread throughout the world." In 1969, Monsanto created an "Ad hoc" committee to investigate the pollution caused by PCBs. The actual purpose of the committee was to assure continued profits from the sale of PCBs, despite Monsanto's knowledge that the compounds had become a global contaminant. To this end, Monsanto repeatedly misrepresented the facts, telling government entities in 1970 that PCBs were not particularly toxic and the company did not expect to find them widespread in the environment. In the United States, the sale of PCBs continued for approximately ten more years.

Maryland. PCB contamination is extensive in Maryland, and has been well documented by MDE. In its Final 2018 Integrated Report of Surface Water Quality, MDE reported 537 square miles of Maryland's estuarine waters to be impaired by PCB contamination. Those areas are currently under an EPA-approved Total Maximum Daily Load ("TMDL") restriction. An additional 430 square miles of estuarine waters are likewise impaired and in need of a TMDL. This contamination is widely distributed throughout the State and permeates Maryland's major waterways and waterbodies, including parts of the Potomac River, the Susquehanna River, and the Chesapeake Bay.

Counsel Selection. PCB litigation requires a significant investment of resources. Pursuant to SG § 6-105(b), the Attorney General elected to employ outside counsel for this litigation and received written approval from the Governor to do so. Nationally, only a small number of law firms has developed the expertise to pursue these cases successfully. The Attorney General issued a Request for Proposals for outside counsel. The Office of the Attorney General received proposals from six teams of law firms and appointed a committee to evaluate the proposals. The committee evaluated the technical proposals and then interviewed all six of the applicants. After deciding which team's technical proposal was best qualified on the basis of criteria set forth in the Request for Proposals, the committee then opened and considered sealed fee proposals.



2. <u>ATTORNEY GENERAL</u> (cont'd) Legal Representation with Contingency Fee

Remarks (cont'd):

The team which ranked highest on technical merit was found to be competitive on price. The low bidder was ranked near the bottom on technical merit.

The committee made a unanimous recommendation to the Attorney General that the best qualified team consists of Keller Rohrback L.L.P. and Stoll Stoll Berne Lokting & Shlachter P.C. These two firms have experience in PCB litigation and are currently representing the State of Oregon and the City of Seattle in similar litigation. The selected team has retained local Maryland counsel.

Fee Arrangement. The Attorney General seeks to compensate outside counsel with a percentage of recovery as shown in the 'Amount' field of this item. This arrangement compares favorably to fee schedules used by other states for similar litigation. If the State terminates outside counsel before there is a recovery, or if a court disallows a contingency fee, outside counsel would be entitled to receive reimbursement of costs expended plus a reasonable fee commensurate with the work performed. The only circumstance in which outside counsel would be entitled to compensation that would not be paid out of the State's recovery would be in the unlikely event that the State decides to voluntarily dismiss litigation before any recovery is achieved.

Pursuant to Maryland's commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, conserving water resources, and enhancing Maryland's environment, the Project includes the following:

Project Description: In support of the State's efforts to restore the health of the Chesapeake Bay, the Maryland General Assembly passed the Clean Water Commerce Act (ch367) during the 2017 Session. This Act expanded the uses of the Bay Restoration Fund to include the costs associated with the purchase of cost-effective nitrogen, phosphorus, or sediment load reductions, not to exceed \$4,000,000 in fiscal year 2018, \$6,000,000 in fiscal year 2019, and \$10,000,000 in fiscal years 2020 and 2021. The nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment load reductions purchased cannot come from the agriculture sector. MDE may enter into any contract until June 30, 2021 and may be funded for the expected life of the best management practice resulting from nutrient load reduction.

The project presented today for the Board's approval involves the development and implementation of advanced online instrumentation coupled with automated control and active management, along with expanded treatment regime to achieve treatment level and performance exceeding the enhanced nutrient removal (ENR) in order to provide additional nitrogen and phosphorus reductions from the original ENR goals. The Maryland Department of the Environment will provide annual payments for the purchase of verified annual reductions of nitrogen and phosphorus beyond ENR based on the agreed upon unit prices. Annual purchases are estimated to be between \$1,000,000 and \$2,000,000 depending on the actual verified reductions.

This project is part of the Department efforts to achieve additional nutrient and sediment reductions to offset the projected increase in nutrient and sediment loadings from runoff due to climate change.

number of cases, The Maryland Department of State Police–Forensic Sciences Division (MDSP-FSD) may need to consider technical over financial as turnaround time or additional factors may be of essence. MSP will consider the contracting lab's scope of accreditation for each Functional Area. Also, MSP will consider the capacity each lab has to analyze cases from each Functional Area, and the turnaround time offered. MSP will also need to consider the logistics for court testimony to ensure that a chemist will be available for court, if needed.

MSP-FSD is an accredited, full service forensic laboratory system that receives over 14,000 cases per year for analysis, approximately 80% require Controlled Dangerous Substance (CDS) or Toxicology (blood drug and/or blood alcohol) analysis. The CDS Units of the MDSP-FSD are responsible for performing analysis on submitted CDS evidence to identify the specific type of drug present. Although the MDSP-FSD operates under the administration of the Maryland Department of State Police, the laboratory is available to provide service to all 142 law enforcement agencies in Maryland. There are three CDS Units located in Pikesville, Hagerstown, and Berlin.

One proposal was received in response to the solicitation for functional area II. The proposal was thoroughly reviewed by the Evaluation Committee and was later determined that NMS is the only accredited vendor compliant with forensic laboratory licensing requirements (COMAR 10.51.03) licensed by the Maryland Department of Health who provides these services. Based on historical data, the price was determined to be fair and reasonable and within the Department's budget. There is a \$16 increase in cost per test from 2019 - 2021. After careful evaluation and the review of historical data it is determined that both vendors are determined to provide the best value for the State. MSP believes that the technical proposals submitted clearly demonstrate the capability to complete services requested. The prices submitted are fair based on the quality of the technical proposal submitted and offers the state the best value.

Requesting Agency Remarks: There are currently two youth at New Hope Carolinas. Prior to placement at New Hope, one youth experienced multiple hospitalizations due to high risk behaviors, auditory and visual hallucinations. The youth also had a history of suicidal and homicidal tendencies, sexual promiscuity, impulsive acting-out behaviors, and elopement.

The other youth had a history of Unspecified Depressive disorder, Unspecified ADHD, and multiple co-occurring substance abuse issues. This youth was also at high risk for worsening mental health problems, abuse, and suicide.

New Hope Carolinas is a Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility that provides comprehensive residential services for youth between the ages of 12 and 21. New Hope offers specialized services for young men and women who present with a variety of challenges, including mood disorders, substance abuse, behavioral disorders, autism spectrum disorder and problem sexual behavior. The programs at New Hope serve adolescents with normal cognitive functioning and those with intellectual and developmental disabilities are the most appropriate placement as they provide high quality, clinically relevant cost-effective brain injury rehabilitation. New Hope has been performing in compliance with the contract.

The Maryland State Department of Education is responsible for setting rates for facilities that serve Maryland youth which are located outside of the State of Maryland. The Division of Special Education/Early Intervention Services, Nonpublic Special Education Section provides oversight for this work. COMAR 14.31.01 sets forth the guidelines for Out-of-State placement of Maryland youth. Rates are set for facilities that provide private residential and nonpublic education services to youth aligned with the specific needs of the placed youth.

Maryland rates are set to ensure equal rates are paid for equal services regardless of the placing agency, placing State, or location of the facility. All rates issued by Maryland must comply with all cost approval guidelines and instructions. MSDE publishes the Cost Approval Process for Out-of-State Residential Providers and Individual Placements annually. These rates have been determined to be fair and reasonable.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The number of older Marylanders is increasing. In 2016, the Maryland Department of Aging issued a State Plan on Aging which projected that Marylanders aged 60 and older would increase by 25% by the year 2030. The report identified that the fastest growing segment of the population are individuals between the age of 80-84. The projection is that the growth in that age range will increase by 136% by 2040. As Marylanders age, often guardianship is sought to address competency issues, lack of self-care, abuse and neglect issues and financial exploitation. Many of the Marylanders subject to guardianship petitions are indigent (MLSP). As a result of the increase in older Marylanders subject to guardianship proceedings, MLSP has experienced an increase in legal services provided and an increase in the contract prices.

The Department is statutorily mandated to ensure the provision of quality legal representation to indigent adults involved in Adult Protective Services (APS) Guardianship Hearings and Adult Public Guardianship Review Board (APGRB) proceedings statewide and must compensate Contractor Attorneys for the representation of the alleged disabled individuals when the services are the responsibility of the Local Department of Social Services or Department of Aging. (See §13-705, and §13-709 Estates and Trusts Article, and §14-404, Family Law Article, Annotated Code of Maryland).

MLSP is satisfied that the contractors continue to provide quality legal representation and have determined it is in the best interest of the State to approve the modification. If this is not approved the costs to the State would significantly increase due to the attorneys' ability to bill the State a standard hourly rate under the Court Appointed Program for all services associated with each case.

Constellation NewEnergy, Inc. has been found responsible and its bid responsive. The bid pricing has been confirmed.

The bid was based on fixed prices for preventative maintenance and hourly rates for repairs. The IFB stated that DGS may award an additional amount for parts allowance for reimbursements atcost as described in the scope of work.

This solicitation covered over 5,400 pieces of HVAC equipment at various facilities, with the contractor responsible for the cost of minor repairs under \$1,000 per incident. Much of the equipment is old and vendors bid according to the risk they perceived. The \$76M bid was an outlier but was not a mistake. Constellation is the current contractor and viewed the contract as lower risk. Their bid was in line with what they are being paid for these services now.
