Remarks: Conviction. In 1975 the Baltimore City Circuit Court convicted Mr. Leslie Vass of use of handgun in a crime of violence (armed robbery) for which he was sentenced to twenty years in prison.

Release & Initial Compensation. In 1984, Mr. Vass was released on parole. In 1986, the sole-identifying witness recanted, the Court granted a joint motion to set aside judgement, and the charges were dismissed. Mr. Vass received a pardon from Governor Hughes later that year, and, in 1987, the Board of Public Works granted Mr. Vass two initial awards of \$1,000 each in emergency compensation treated as advances out of an eventual final award of \$250,000.

Supplemental Compensation. Upon passage of the Walter Lomax Act (Chapter 76, Laws of Maryland 2021), the statute for these grants was amended to adopt the formula used by this Board in determining compensation for grantees, specifically compensation in the amount of the daily rate of the State's most recent annual median household income as published in the American Community Survey of the U.S. Census Bureau in the year the order of eligibility is issued and divided by 365 days to the nearest whole cent. Furthermore, the statute provides that "An individual who was awarded compensation under this section on or before July 1, 2005, may request an order for supplemental compensation in the amount authorized by this section on or before July 12, 2023."

Following a hearing at the Office of Administrative Hearings, an Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Vass was confined for 3,395 days, (2) the current annual median household income is \$86,738, (3) Mr. Vass is eligible for \$806,787.80 in compensation, and (4) this amount should be offset by the \$250,000 previously received. The total amount of compensation ordered for Mr. Vass is \$556,787.80.

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines that an expedited payment schedule is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommended, expedited schedule in their order. The order *In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Leslie Vass, Claimant v. Board of Public Works* included a recommended expedited payment schedule of: \$86,738.00 paid within sixty days of the final decision; \$13,262.00 paid by December 31, 2021; \$228,393.90 paid by April 30, 2022; and the final payment of \$228,393.90 paid by July 31, 2022. The Department of Budget and Management recommends the Board of Public Works pay the third compensation installment upon approval by the General Assembly of a deficiency appropriation into the FY 2022 Operating Budget.

Established in 1995, the *Neighborhood Business Development Program*, now operating as *Neighborhood Business Works*,

is a Smart Growth tool for revitalization through business creation

or expansion in designated revitalization areas.

Description: In 2013, the Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW) program provided gap financing in the amount of \$500,000 (Secretary's Agenda, Item 10, 1/2/13) for the completion of renovations to a vacant garage referred to as The Tire Shop. The total project costs were \$3.3 million. Upon completion, it became a thriving anchor for a significant corner of Baltimore City (Howard and 26th Streets) in the Remington neighborhood. The area has been transformed and has become a community hub for Baltimore City.

The initial anchor tenant, Parts and Labor restaurant and butcher, closed after five years of operation. In 2019, Seawall Development vetted a number of possible businesses to replace Parts and Labor. A few candidates were identified to be appropriate for the space. Before any formal lease negotiation could take place, evidence of the widespread Covid-19 virus became apparent

and resulted in mandated closures of non-essential businesses. The property and tenants have struggled financially since.

Earlier this year, the principal lender on the project (United Bank) agreed to write off \$500,000 of the borrower's \$1.6 million indebtedness and forgave accrued interest. The principals of Seawall Development collectively put up \$1,100,000 to pay off the balance owed to United Bank in an effort to move toward the re-stabilization of the property. The property is once again fully leased but in order to allow for the continued stabilization of the project and to allow Seawall to continue its revitalization efforts in Baltimore City, it is critical to replace their expended capital with permanent financing on the project. The borrower is currently seeking financial assistance to refinance the existing debt of approximately \$1,100,000 and to provide funds for related stabilization costs of approximately \$215,910. We will also modify the original NBW loan on the project with similar terms to match the newly proposed 30 year term.

Though many tools and resources have been made available to small businesses to assist with the devastating blow dealt by the pandemic, there is still a significant need for support that encourages continued revitalization in communities throughout Maryland. The proposed NBW permanent financing will further support such revitalization by replacing capital that is critical to Seawall Development Company's future redevelopment plans in Baltimore City. The subject property is now fully occupied as mentioned above, and the current tenants include ArtCentric, John Brown General and Butchery (JBGB) and Seawall Development. Seawall has moved its corporate offices from another location in Baltimore City into the Tire Shop building.

The NBW loan will serve to re-stabilize the property after the departure of Parts and Labor Restaurant in 2018 and state mandated closures in 2020 and early 2021. The proposed permanent NBW loan and re-stabilization will have a significant economic impact in the Remington community of Baltimore City. The fully leased and occupied project will fuel further economic impact and revitalization in the area while creating local employment opportunities. Without NBW's support, the re-stabilization would not occur.

Recommendation: The Adjutant General for the Maryland National Guard / Secretary of the Maryland Military Department recommends that the Board of Public Works approve re-naming the Freedom Readiness Center (located at 6525 Sykesville Road, Eldersburg) the **Major General Linda L. Singh Readiness Center** in honor of Linda L. Singh.

Freedom Readiness Center: The 75,021 square foot building's 30 month timeline for construction was completed in June 2021 at a cost of \$29M. The facility will open for Maryland Army National Guard use in late 2021. The facility will be occupied by a cumulative total of 310 Soldiers from the 200th Military Police Company and the 729th Quartermaster Company. The building is equipped with a large multi-tiered classroom, maintenance bays for automotive maintenance, and classrooms equipped with IT capabilities to provide modern virtual based training scenarios.

Background: Major General (MG) Linda L. Singh served Maryland and the United States of America for over 38 years as a Citizen-Soldier. Throughout her career, she served as dynamic groundbreaker for women and minorities alike, shattering glass ceilings nearly every step of the way. Her example and legacy will have a lasting positive impact for decades to come. Enlisting as a Private in the Maryland Army National Guard in 1981, she set her sights on having a larger impact on the organization. By 1991, she had completed Officer Candidate School and began a stellar career as an officer that culminated with completion of an assignment as The Adjutant General for the Maryland National Guard. In this capacity, MG Singh was responsible for the daily operations of the Maryland Military Department which included the Maryland Army National Guard, Maryland Emergency Management Agency and Maryland Defense Force. The position of the Adjutant General also serves as the senior advisor to the Governor for those state agencies and is responsible for the readiness, administration, and training of more than 6,700 DMIL members.

Concurrently the Adjutant General serves as the official channel of communication between the Governor and the National Guard Bureau and serves as a member of the Governor's cabinet. Internal to the Maryland National Guard, MG Singh was responsible for reorganizing it into a powerhouse focused on cyber and intelligence operations. She was also responsible for directing such successful domestic operations as the responses to Super Storm Sandy and the Baltimore unrest. At the national level, she played a prominent role in crafting policy regarding use of reserve forces and sexual assault prevention. In addition to working at the State and national levels, MG Singh worked extensively with senior officials at ministerial and ambassador levels in Estonia and Bosnia-Herzegovina, developing and implementing country strategies that strengthened US posture in global affairs. She deployed twice, once to Kosovo and once to Afghanistan, playing prominent roles during each deployment. In the tradition of the true Citizen-Soldier, MG Singh also progressed apace in her civilian career, emerging as a senior

She was also inducted into the Maryland Women's Hall of Fame in March 2015.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Nature of Emergency – COVID-19: On March 5, 2020, Governor Hogan declared a State of Emergency in the State of Maryland due to COVID-19 posing an immediate danger to public safety. As a result of that declaration, the Maryland Department of Labor had to close its facilities to the public. As the State of Maryland begins to relax stay-at-home orders and government offices and businesses reopen, the Department must have plans in place for the safe reopening of Department of Labor offices to the public and for greater staff as they return to the workplace. The Department must be proactive in providing a safe environment for re-entry of its employees and its customers to the Department's various facilities.

For COVID-19 Mitigation, Category B, Emergency Protective Measures is an effort to safely reopen Department of Labor offices for greater employees' return to the offices and to the public. In view of this, Maryland Department of Labor has conducted an emergency procurement for the Emergency LABOR Building Re-Entry Security Guards Services.

This is the second emergency contract award for these services. The first contract with Tactical Security Solutions, Inc (TSS), accepted by the Board of Public Works on August 11, 2021, Secretary's Agenda Appendix A4 (Emergency LABOR Building Re-Entry Security Guards Service; ADPICS NO. P00B2600003) was terminated on September 10, 2021, for cause. The Maryland Department of Labor (LABOR) terminated the contract pursuant to the "Termination for Default" clause in the contract. TSS Security Guards consistently failed to report to work (no call, no show), and TSS did not provide replacement guards. LABOR provided TSS an opportunity to remedy the situation. TSS failed to comply with LABOR's request. The safety of the Department's employees, visitors and customers are of paramount importance. LABOR cannot, under any circumstances, leave its buildings and employees vulnerable. For this reason, the contract with TSS was terminated, a new emergency procurement was conducted, and a new contract was awarded to Watkins Security Agency, Inc.

The continuous need for a safe and secure environment for the re-entry of Department of Labor employees, visitors, and customers cannot be overemphasized. The unarmed uniform security guards will provide security guard services at thirteen Maryland Department of Labor locations. Each location will require one uniformed unarmed security guard, for a period of six months, Monday through Friday except for Federal/State Holidays, and dates of the emergency closure of State Offices. These resources shall be responsible for the safety and security of the office personnel, visitors, and customers to these offices, as well as the security of the office premises and equipment.

Pursuant to the transaction, the Department and the seller entered into a Land Use Agreement in order to regulate the use of the seller's retained acreage for the purpose of controlling the impacts of stormwater drainage coming from the seller's upland land onto the Department's land. The anticipated use of the seller's retained land was residential development, and the Land Use Agreement therefore limited the use of that land to residential development only. The Agreement was very specific as to conditions and restrictions applicable to the seller's land with regard to stormwater impacts on the Department's land resulting from such residential development.

The approximately 320 acres retained by the seller has been conveyed to a new owner, who seeks to use the land for purposes of developing a commercial solar energy facility. The Maryland Public Service Commission has granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to the solar facility, which includes conditions and restrictions related to stormwater management which satisfactorily address all of the Department's concerns regarding stormwater impacts to the Department's land. However, because the current Land Use Agreement does not allow such a use of that property, the Land Use Agreement must be amended to allow such an alternate use of the property.

Although not parties to the original Land Use Agreement, the City of Cambridge and another, private party are each signing the Amendment because they each now own interests in the land which is subject to the Land Use Agreement.

In an effort to significantly expand the State of Maryland's dredged material reuse efforts and long-term containment facility capacity, MDOT MPA solicited sealed proposals for applied research and development projects to explore feasible means for reuse of material dredged from Baltimore Harbor channels and placed in MDOT MPA's DMCFs. The RFP defines "reuse" as the recycling of dredged material for use in another product or application, including residential, recreational, commercial, and industrial uses. Contracts issued under this procurement will support MDOT MPA's research and development of dredged material applications to further the State's efforts to recover capacity and/or extend the lifespan of the DMCFs. Successful results of this research and development effort could lead to MPA developing a separate longer-term contract or contracts for reuse of significant volumes of dredged material. These efforts will give MDOT MPA an opportunity to understand better the potential for large-scale, long-term cost-effective capacity recovery in the DMCFs. As a result of contracts resulting from this RFP, MDOT MPA will be evaluating lessons learned, adaptive management approaches, and scalability with an eye on future opportunities to recover capacity in DMCFs.

The RFP provides that there is no fixed deadline for submission of proposals until MDOT MPA establishes a deadline by published amendment to the solicitation. Instead, proposals may be submitted at any time and may be considered for award at any time, even while other proposals may be under consideration. Proposals are not in direct competition with each other. No award may exceed \$300,000 in price. MDOT MPA currently has a budget of \$2 million for all contracts awarded under the RFP, which will allow for a minimum of six contracts to be awarded under this solicitation.

CSI Environmental, LLC, a Maryland firm, submitted a proposal to demonstrate the feasibility of using dredged material from the Masonville DMCF to produce vegetated upland and shoreline berms using geotextile tubes. The contractor will procure a small quantity of dredged material generated from the Masonville DMCF, pump the material into geotextile tubes to allow for dewatering, place the tubes in designated off-site locations in the Middle Branch of the Patapsco River, and conduct vegetation planting and monitoring, under controlled and documented circumstances to demonstrate engineering and environmental suitability, and will provide the results to MDOT MPA. It is anticipated that the upland and shoreline berms will enhance the subject site's coastal resiliency to storms and sea-level encroachment while adding value to the ecological habitat and improving aesthetics. If successful, the reuse of dredged sediments in upland and shoreline berm construction could be expanded to additional locations to promote coastal resiliency.

MDOT MPA has received thirteen proposals to date. The Board previously approved awards to the following contractors under this RFP:

Requesting Agency Remarks: An Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on January 31, 2020, initially and sent out to 33 vendors with a due date of March 19, 2020 for bids. Even after three (3) bid due date extensions, no bids were received upon the final deadline on May 29, 2020. Vendors indicated that they had other commitments that precluded their participation at the time. Some vendors also mentioned that due to COVID-19 related delays, they were unable to submit a bid in time.

While revisions were made to the project by the project team, the Office of Procurement did additional research, including contacting Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) of the same equipment or similar types of equipment for leads on other possible vendors and servicing companies.

For example, BBM Railway Equipment, LLC (BBM) owns the proprietary rights for the replacement parts described in the specifications. Through the research conducted by MDOT MTA, another vendor was identified that could provide similar types of replacement parts, only to learn that this vendor had recently been purchased by BBM. As a result, all potential bidders need to purchase replacement parts exclusively through BBM.

A second attempt to advertise the contract was done by advertising an IFB on April 13, 2021, with a due date of June 1, 2021. In addition to the scope changes, the Office of Procurement attempted to notify more vendors by increasing the number of commodity codes used on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). During the second attempt, 282 vendors were notified by eMMA and all the known OEM and servicing companies for this type of work were notified and direct solicited. Four (4) bid due date extensions resulted in MDOT MTA receiving only one (1) bid from Permadur Industries Inc. dba (Sissco) being received on June 29, 2021.

Research was completed with all known OEMs and servicing companies to determine why these vendors did not bid on the contract. Reasons cited were staffing, age of MDOT MTA's equipment, too much or too little hydraulic work, and timelines. Of the 282 vendors that were notified by eMMA, a majority of the vendors did not bid because they do not perform this type of work and only received the notification because of the commodity codes, which are far too general for this type of work.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of availability of an Invitation for Bids (IFB) was posted on the DGS Web Site and *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage.com* on April 28, 2021 to replace various emergency testing vendor contracts initiated at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. These contracts reflect both updated market rates and service specifications. The solicitation was cancelled on June 2, 2017. DDA revised the scope of work, and after extensive revisions and internal review; the second RFP was issued on July 15, 2019. Upon the DDA evaluation committee's review, there was one Offeror that was found acceptable to perform services within one of the four regions and a memo of Award was drafted for that one region. The Eastern region was awarded to Somerset Community Service, BPW 11/28/2020 15-S Sole Source. A new RFP would have to be issued for the remaining three regions (Western, Central and Southern) as there were no acceptable Offerors. At this time, the Deputy Secretary has requested that the RFP be revised to split the services into two contracts, one focusing on Behavioral Respite only and the other contract focusing on Mobile Crisis services and getting this out the door as soon as possible.
