Remarks: Nature of Emergency – COVID-19: The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommend that K-12 schools consider implementing a screening testing program during the school year. CDC awarded a grant to Maryland to facilitate these programs. Maryland currently has an eMMA posting on a request for applications (RFA) (eMMA #BPM025083) on this topic. As part of this effort, five (5) vendors have been awarded emergency contracts in two functional areas to ensure a sufficient number of vendors to accommodate the Maryland public and private school entities enrolling in the screening program

and a variety of screening approaches to support the varied testing needs of the participating school entities. In addition, these awards will ensure that the quality of testing services and fast turnaround times for test processing will not be hampered by the volume of requested services.

The difference between the Functional Areas 1 and 2 is the method in which the test samples are run. In pooled testing (Functional Area 1) samples are collected and then run in a large batch instead of individual, non-pooled testing (Functional Area 2). The base period includes the provision of pooled and non-pooled testing and an initial development assessment with the local school system/non-public school. Awards were made with no minimum guarantee of assessments or tests to be performed; awardees will be compensated based on tests actually performed under the contracts.

In April 2021, the CDC awarded a population-based grant through their Enhancing Laboratory Capabilities grant program to directly fund COVID-19 testing within schools as authorized by the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The Maryland Department of Health received this award as the Single State Authority for CDC and is now making funded contracts or reimbursement available to public and non-public schools as permitted through State Finance and Procurement Article §7-402, Annotated Code of Maryland, via a request for applications that was posted to eMMA on July 19, 2021.

Public school systems and non-public schools were offered two options under the Request For Applications (RFA):

Option A offers schools the opportunity to participate in the state procured K-12 COVID-19 Screening Testing Program to provide comprehensive COVID-19 screening testing services. This program is open to all K-12 schools throughout Maryland during the 2021-2022 school year. Through the RFA, public school systems and non-public schools will formally express interest in the COVID-19 screening testing program and then work through a memorandum of understanding with MDH to select a vendor to create and implement their screening testing program. As of August 3, 2021, the Department has received applications from 14 public school systems and 51 nonpublic schools with interest in Option A of the RFA, with more expected. This covers testing for over 615,000 students in the state.

Option B offers a reimbursement of comprehensive COVID-19 screening testing services with the understanding that some public-school systems and non-public entities would like to utilize already previously-established relationships with COVID-19 testing vendors. School entities seeking reimbursement will work directly with their identified contractor(s) to plan, implement, manage, and report on screening testing programs. The contractor's COVID-19 screening testing program must meet all necessary clinical protocols and public health standards of school-based COVID-19 screening testing.

Remarks (cont'd):

Basis for Selection: To implement Option A, a Request for Proposals Solicitation #: OPASS 22-19258 was issued on May 26, 2021 to solicit bids to provide full-service, end-to-end screening testing of the K-12 school populations across Maryland. Successful contractors must be able to plan, implement, manage, and report on screening testing programs in one of two functional areas at the request of the State's local school systems and non-public schools. The functional areas are distinguished by how the tests are processed. The contracts are indefinite quantity contracts with no minimum guarantee of assessments or tests to be performed as schools will choose from the identified contracts and work with their choice to develop the specifics of their screening testing programs within CDC clinical guidance.

The Department competitively issued the emergency solicitation in accordance with COMAR 21.05.06.02's directive to obtain as much competition as is possible and practicable. The Department posted the RFP on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) for 17 days in addition to sending it directly to 13 potential offerors identified through market research and unsolicited expressions of interest in providing testing services for K-12 schools. Offerors asked 178 questions related to the RFP and received answers and four related amendments in response before submitting proposals on June 11. Proposals were received from 35 offerors; 13 proposals were evaluated. No MBE goal was set for the procurement; however, use of an MDOT-certified MBE subcontractor or Small Business Enterprises to provide services under the contract was included as an evaluation factor. Capital Diagnostic's proposal received additional consideration under this evaluation factor because of its status as a Maryland Small Business Enterprise. Additionally, CIAN Dx and 20/20 GeneSystems are both local, Maryland-based companies.

Proposals were evaluated under the emergency method consistent with the Department's obligation under COMAR 21.05.06.02C to assure services were procured in time to respond to the emergency. Each proposal was reviewed in light of the evaluation criteria, allowing the Evaluation Committee to select recommended awardees that can support the integrity of Maryland's K-12 schools screening program, which must be offered to both public and private schools as a condition of the federal funds involved. The committee sought technical proposal clarifications as well as best and final offers from that group of offerors. The Evaluation Committee consisted of individuals with significant expertise in COVID-19 testing to ensure the offerors sufficiently met all MDH and CDC clinical protocols as well as significant experience working in COVID-19 school testing and fundamental knowledge and practical experience to ensure proposals were programmatically sound. The RFP provided for up to five awards to be made in each functional area. Offerors could propose for one or both functional areas. Recommended awardees are the same in both functional areas, except for Gingko Bioworks, Inc., who only proposed for Functional Area 1. The number of recommended awards will ensure the program has enough vendors to accommodate the potential school entity participants in the optional program and to ensure the variety of testing approaches to meet the needs of the participating schools.

Remarks (cont'd):

The difference in price between the financial proposal amounts and the award amounts is due to an updated estimate of tests to be administered under the program with further assumptions made on the estimated number of tests provided based on previous relationships between labs and local school systems and non-public schools. The initial price proposal was based on 100,000 tests to establish a baseline across the testing vendors. However, with an estimated student population of 1 million and popularity of the program, the test usage estimates were increased to reflect the current testing environment. Given the familiarity with three of the labs (CIAN, Mako, and Gingko Bioworks), we anticipate these contractors will be a popular choice by the schools and the funding awards are based on 400,000 tests per functional area plus the price for doing the assessment/development work with schools. 20/20 Genesystems and Capital Diagnostics' awards are based on 200,000 tests per functional area plus the price for doing the assessment/development work with schools. 20/20 Genesystems and Capital Diagnostics' awards are based on 200,000 tests per functional area plus the price for doing the assessment/development work with the school.

Based on CDC guidance, a screening testing program should test about 10% of the school's population or more based on community positivity rate. Under this award, we estimate 3.2 million tests could be provided statewide, or about 65,000 tests a week for the contract period. However, these five vendors collectively possess the capacity to provide testing coverage for all students and staff, equating to about 1,000,000 individuals, if needed.

Maximum daily testing capacity across the five vendors is approximately 185,000 tests, which can be scaled up as necessary. This would equate to 925,000 weekly tests, permitting each student in the state to receive a weekly test if needed.

With the unknown potential impacts the Delta variant will have on students and staff, especially those who are unvaccinated, selecting five vendors ensures there is enough testing capacity in the event of another surge.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency – COVID-19: With certain populations of COVID-19 vaccinated individuals proving vulnerable to COVID-19 and its variants, including the delta variant, assessing the level of COVID-19 antibodies in vaccinated individuals in skilled nursing facilities is necessary to ensure the COVID-19 pandemic does not expose this population and other possible populations to continued risk of contracting a potentially deadly virus. The unforeseen ability of the virus and its variants in particular to infect certain vaccinated individuals requires the State to institute this antibody surveillance program in mitigating a continuing public health emergency.

Remarks (cont'd):

In response to this need, the Department contracted with Laboratory Corporation of America Holdings ("LabCorp") which conducts ongoing surveillance tests for COVID-19 antibodies nationally and has the capacity to collect samples, process antibody tests, and report on results for Maryland's nursing home surveillance program, which aims to test a certain percentage of Maryland's nursing home population in three rounds of testing over the next year.

LabCorp will collect blood samples from vaccinated individuals and transport them for antibody test processing at its facilities, reporting on the outcome to the individuals tested and on deidentified aggregate results to the State in order to assess the level of COVID-19 antibodies in these tested populations. The initial testing period in late August 2021 will cover approximately two weeks and 500 tests and will be subsequently expanded to three rounds of testing for a maximum of 20,000 tests administered under the program to assess antibody levels in other skilled nursing facilities and other congregate care type settings for potentially vulnerable populations.

Basis for Selection: No competitive solicitation was made. A competitive solicitation for this specialized type of lab services would have jeopardized and reduced the time for determining the vulnerability of vaccinated individuals to COVID-19 in skilled nursing facilities and other vulnerable populations. As such LabCorp was awarded the contract without competition.

This procurement was developed to minimize critical response time needed for determining immunity levels in skilled nursing facility residents amid the summer 2021 circulation of COVID-19 variants, including the Delta variant. In keeping with its obligation under COMAR 21.05.06.02C to procure in time to meet the emergency, the Department contracted with LabCorp to leverage its existing relationships with Maryland skilled nursing facilities where it conducts routine blood work, providing immediate access to the most vulnerable Marylanders to determine the potential risk of infection and illness among this population. Furthermore, LabCorp's ability to perform COVID-19 antibody tests, which require specialized platforms to perform and are, therefore, not widely available; its experience performing similar testing operations; its ability to scale the operation quickly as needed to address the evolving pandemic and variants and to support ongoing vaccine operations, including boosters; and its previous pandemic experience for the Department also factored into the Department's selection of LabCorp as its source for COVID-19 antibody testing services.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The new MBE Disparity Study is expected to be completed and submitted to the Maryland General Assembly (MGA) in the fall of 2023. However, the current MBE Disparity Study will remain in effect until the new study is officially accepted by the MGA through legislative action during the 2024 Legislative Session. All current MBE Program related activity, policy, legislation, and goal setting will continue to be supported by the current Disparity Study and its underlying data.

The current Disparity Study contract is with NERA Consulting, Inc., with Dr. Jon Wainwright performing as the principal statistician and econometric expert. Dr. Wainwright completed the State's most recent MBE Disparity Study in 2017, the Federal DBE and ACDBE Program Disparity Studies in 2018, and several industry disparity study analyses. Dr. Wainwright oversaw the collection, analyses, and final reports of the Disparity Study and any subsequent analyses required by the MGA or Governor. He retired from NERA in 2019, but due to the requirements of NERA's contract with MDOT, NERA was required to retain Dr. Wainwright as the principal on the contract. NERA is keeping him on only until September 4, 2021, the day the current contract expires.

Then he will be a consultant or independent contractor who will be entering into this sole source contract with MDOT. He is the only staff member at NERA with the required expertise to act in this capacity.

A direct contract with Dr. Wainwright would ensure access to the only individual with the subject matter expertise regarding the underlying data and data analysis required to continue to implement the State's MBE Program and all MBE related activity such as the following:

- MBE Program Goal and Subgoal development

Requesting Agency Remarks: Fees associated with the College Investment Plan are not appropriated by the State. The program administration and oversight costs are paid by account holders as a percentage of the assets they hold in each of the underlying investments. Account holders in the Maryland College Investment Plan currently pay fees:

i) on the underlying investments,

ii) for an administrative fee (.05% that is remitted to Maryland 529 to offset the cost of running the agency and providing program oversight), and

Requesting Agency Remarks: DHCD administers numerous federal and state funded grant and tax credit programs, such as the Community Development Block Grant, Community Services Block Grant, Community Legacy, Baltimore Regional Neighborhoods Initiative, Homeless Solutions Program, and Community Investment Tax Credit. To facilitate management of these programs the agency uses a commercial grant management software product called Intelligrants. This software allows program-specific workflows to be developed for the full cycle of award management, including: the intake of grant applications, review of grant applications, awarding of funds, fund disbursement, and program management and reporting.

DHCD's Division of Neighborhood Revitalization currently manages 27 different programs using IntelliGrants, including six new COVID-19 relief programs. There are 1,155 registered organizations and 1,845 registered individual users that have been trained and are using the system. External awardees submit approximately 600 requests for payment and 1,200 tax credit certifications annually through the system.

DHCD reviewed the price proposal from Agate for work to be performed and the estimate of hours for customization was reasonable for the requested scope of work. Staff compared their labor rate with current GSA labor rates and found the proposed hourly rates to be within the expected price range for these services.

If a new system were to be purchased, the Department would have to again pay significant new onboarding costs above base cost to customize a new system to the Department's many programs already administered on the existing platform, pay to migrate substantial data from one platform to another, and use significant staff resources to retrain more than 1,800 internal and external users.

DHCD will continue to use this system until the Governor's Grants Office implements a new Statewide system and it is fully operational.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department of Human Services conducted a Request for Quotations (RFQ) utilizing the General Services Administration (GSA) Schedule 70, for this Software-As-A-Service (SaaS) product. The RFQ was released to 40 potential vendors on March 5, 2021 and closed on March 12, 2021 and five quotes were received. All Offerors were found to be responsible and responsive. The CDW Government was recommended for the award because they provided the lowest price to the State. The contract is retroactive because DHS was required to restart the renewal process due to an unexpected increase in server storage. The increased server capacity was necessary because remote employees are saving more data on the servers and because DHS migrated from Win 7 to Win 10 via Druva features.

The GSA Schedule Contract is a government wide, indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity (ID/IQ) Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contract. Requesting Agency Remarks: Due to phased deliverable approach, Financial & Operations accounting module went live on June 30, 2020. Insurance claims citizen portal was implemented in December 2019, along with the rollout of the new citizen portal to search for unpaid checks in the Undeliverable and Unpresented funds. The insurance module and bank reconciliation modules have been continuing to rollout various components since December, with the agency portal scheduled during the next implementation.

Despite the recent challenges due to COVID-19 and the implementation of remote work for all State Treasurer's Office (STO) staff and project members work has continued for this project. Banking and IT divisions have been impacted significantly as a result of the increased volume and amount of transactions flowing through STO to support agencies and citizens of Maryland in obtaining financial relief. In addition, there are other critical statewide IT projects underway that require interface with our agency, such as EMMA, Compass, and MDTHINK that are putting a strain on our limited IT resources during this critical time. Now that STO has migrated to Office 365 and have moved applications into the Azure environment, this support is critical to ensuring continuity of operations. STO's master depository contract conversion is now complete, and we are still developing new automated reconciliation processes to merge the two concurrent depository accounts into SQL and Azure environments as the office closes out the old account. This support is needed in order to prevent potential disruption in operations that could have a devastating impact to statewide disbursement and depository functions, daily reconciliations, and our ability to process insurance claims.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Exercising this renewal option will provide specialized programming and development support services for Microsoft Dynamics 365 (D365) Finance & Operations (F&O), D365 Customer Service (CRM), and databases created in SQL and Azure to manage daily file transmissions and bank reconciliation processes within the cloud based Azure environment.

The department seeks to increase funds based on labor categories for current contract staff. Labor categories included in the original RFP were based on projected staffing needs. These labor categories were updated during the hiring process in order to obtain the required skill sets needed to successfully meet the needs of the project. Additionally, STO seeks to extend services provided by existing contractors whose labor categories were included in the original RFP but were not included in the contract budget beyond year 1 of the contract.

- 1. Resource 1 Azure ASP and SSIS programming support to manage ongoing development of file transfer programs.
- 2. Resource 2 Senior network engineer support to assist the IT division with ongoing monitoring, troubleshooting, and environment setups of the new Azure environment.
- 3. Resources 3 and 4 Application programmers to continue to assist with file migrations from legacy system, development of new file interfaces with D365, Azure and SQL, and provide operations support to IT division to supplement staffing shortage.
- 4. Resource 5 Project Manager to oversee contract staff, prepare project management reports for DoIT oversight, and to manage overall project plan.

Finally, STO seeks to add funding for two additional positions the office may need to hire in the next contract year. The rates for these positions were negotiated and deemed fair and reasonable based on the rates that were originally competed in the contract.

The contractor provides satisfactory support to STO. These modifications have been determined to be in the best interest of the State as this is an on-going project and re-procuring of these services for this project would create significant complications, would not be cost effective and would create lapses in security and operating functions operations creating unmitigated risks.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The HRST was designed to integrate into person-centered planning and to factor in the nurse delegation model that is used in the Community Pathways Waiver, Community Support Waiver and Family Support Waiver programs. Part of the system's functionality identifies the health risk level used by the delegating nurse to recommend staffing needs, training for the person's staff which ensures provision of safe care in the community setting. Other screening tools are designed to fit with medical environments and would have to be retrofitted to meet the needs of the developmental disability population.

The HRST is nationally recognized and has proven validity and reliability in the developmental disabilities population which makes it a one-of-a-kind solution. The clinical support and training offered through HRST is unique in both the developmentally disabled populations and the marketplace.

In the developmentally disabled populations, the Fatal Five represents the top five (5) disorders that are associated with the deterioration of the person's health or preventable deaths. These disorders are aspiration, seizures, dehydration, bowel obstruction, and gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD). The Fatal Five disorders continue to be the top causes for DDA's incidents and mortality. Remarks: On May 5, 2021, the Board of Public Works approved an emergency report for a short-term Warehouse Service's Agreement for storage space. The leased space continues to be needed for the storage of palletized personal protective equipment and medical equipment. There is a shortage of warehouse space in the Baltimore Metropolitan area. This space is offered at below market rates. In addition to use of the warehouse space, this agreement provides for reimbursement to Under Armour for warehouse labor services on a per hour basis as indicated.

This procurement qualified for the sole source procurement method for the following reasons: there is a very limited supply of warehouse space on the market with landlord's willing to lease to the State of Maryland for one year or less; the charges outlined for this space are below market rates; this is the only source available to house MDH's existing inventory for the term needed; and this procurement is in the best interest of the State of Maryland.
