

#### 5. <u>BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS</u> *Wetlands Licenses*

- **Recommendation:** The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board grant licenses for projects involving dredging and filling in the navigable waters of Maryland.
- *MDE*: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.
- *Authority:* Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland: "*The Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents.*" See also COMAR 23.02.04.

#### ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY

21-0020 *JOHN SCHWIETERS*— To reduce erosion by replacing in-kind a revetment and a pier (including walkways and mooring piles), widening a sill, and constructing a stone revetment.

Special conditions: Time of year restriction. Requirements for constructing stone sill and design/construction of stone revetment.

21-1015(R1) *HELEN TEMPLETON* – To provide a major modification to the original license. To improve navigable access and reconfigure an existing commercial marina by constructing piers and platforms, removing a platform, mechanically dredging new areas, and depositing dredged material at an approved dredge material placement facility.





*Borrower:* Young Women's Christian Association of Annapolis & Arundel County

*Project:* YWCA trafficking Safe House for Minors and Young Adults Anne Arundel County

The YWCA is a grant recipient of a Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) grant from the U.S. Department of Justice. The Violence Against Women Act and the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act award grants assist to support the establishment, maintenance, and expansion of programs and projects to, among other things, provide immediate shelter for the family, domestic or dating violence victims and their dependents. Both acts prohibit grant recipients from disclosing the address or location of any shelter that maintains a confidential location unless the person responsible for operating the shelter gives written authorization. Failure to follow the Acts' universal grant conditions regarding victim confidentiality and privacy could result in a loss of funding (42 USCA §§ 10401, 10406). Accordingly, the Department is not disclosing the location of this project.

*Authority:* Housing and Community Development Article, §2-102(a)(7), Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended; Ch. 9, Laws of 2018; Ch. 14, Laws of 2019; Ch. 537, Laws of 2020; Ch. 63, Laws of 2021.

*Shelter and Transitional Housing Facilities Grant Program* (STHFGP) shall provide capital grant financing, in the amount of \$1,900,000 for local governments and nonprofit organizations to develop shelter, transitional, and other housing facilities for homeless individuals and families.

Repayment of the capital assistance is not required and is forgiven as long as the project is used as a shelter, transitional housing, or other housing facility for homeless households for 15 years.

**Description:** The newly constructed facility is a 7,800 sf commercial grade residential facility comprising eight bedrooms, common rooms, study space, kitchen, staff offices, meeting rooms, a call center, and dedicated outdoor space. The eight bedrooms will accommodate eight youth and young adults between the ages 13-24. This expansion will join the existing structure- a 32-person domestic violence safe house and dedicated education and wellness center-completed in 2019- to create one campus.

**Remarks:** This project is to construct a permitted 1,100 linear foot living shoreline with headland, sill, and marsh features to help protect residential infrastructure and reduce road flooding while demonstrating beneficial use of dredged material. DNR is seeking approval to award construction funds for this one living shoreline project. After construction, DNR will return to the Board for approval to award adaptive management funds, if warranted.

The Resiliency through Restoration Initiative (formerly Coastal Resiliency Program) was developed to address escalating risks to Maryland's coastal and inland communities and public resources from extreme weather and climate-related events. This Program implements on-theground natural and nature-based projects in priority areas where nature can help communities become more resilient to impacts from water. Targeting models, such as the Coastal Resiliency Assessment, identify areas where restoration can provide the greatest protection benefits for infrastructure, communities, businesses, and habitats.



#### Remarks (cont'd):

Datasets, such as impervious cover, highlight urban and inland areas where green infrastructure is needed to address more intense rain events. Projects will protect both public and private investments, while demonstrating a suite of nature-based projects that will enhance the ability of communities to respond to or recover from extreme hazards like storms and more frequent and intense rain events, or chronic hazards like nuisance flooding and sea level rise.

DNR will provide technical assistance and grant funds to entities to design and construct living shoreline, marsh enhancement, green infrastructure, and nature-based projects. These projects will reduce the impacts of flooding on vulnerable communities across the state.

Residential OSDS owners are eligible for a minimum 50% and maximum 100% grant for the Best Available Technology cost, based on household income; business owners are eligible for 50% of the Best Available Technology cost as a grant; small business owners are eligible for 75% of the Best Available Technology cost as a grant.









**Remarks:** The Maryland Department of the Environment has prioritized investigation of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) to identify sources of these emerging contaminants that have been identified in public drinking water supply wells and surface water natural resources across the State. Due to the potential for impacts to human health and the environment, the Environmental Protection Agency has lowered the health advisory levels for certain PFAS compounds by orders of magnitude, putting many public water supplies and natural resources at risk of adverse public health impacts.

The MOU with the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) Laboratory would allow for increased turnaround time and decreased costs for PFAS sampling to identify and remediate sources of PFAS impacts to the environment. In addition, the MDH Laboratory has more capabilities for PFAS analysis than any other lab in the State after successful completion of a rigorous EPA multi-lab validation process and purchases of state-of-the-art laboratory equipment.





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

**Remarks:** In November 2018, Morgan State University entered into a contract with Triumvirate Environmental to complete lab clean-up services at Morgan State University. The initial contract value was \$460,000. Services utilized under the contract included: consulting services, training staff/faculty, providing a Chemist on site, inspection of waste collection, transport of chemicals, chemical segregation, chemical packaging, lab cleanouts, air sampling, mold response, etc. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Triumvirate Environmental played a critical team member on campus – assisting in COVID-19 consulting, indoor air quality concerns, and decontamination efforts.

Throughout the contract, Morgan State University issued several change orders to Triumvirate Environmental. The March 2021 change order brought the purchase order total over \$1 million. Due to personnel changes, Morgan State University recently became aware that the contract did not receive BPW approval once the total exceeded \$1 million. Since Triumvirate Environmental provides hazardous waste disposal services, which are required for compliance with Maryland Department of the Environment regulations, the University continued to use its services.




The security services referenced above were procured through an intergovernmental cooperative agreement which the University believed it had the authority to utilize. The contract utilized was with DC Water, which was contracted with the security services firm already providing services to the University through 2018. The contract was subsequently extended to 2023, and the University continued to utilize this arrangement for the security services firm to maintain continuity of service.

The University contracted security guard services from November 2016 through the current fiscal year, which exceeded the procurement authority of the University. The matters occurred by executing contracts beyond its Procurement threshold or applying change orders to purchase orders that exceeded the University's procurement authority.

While various incidents occurred on and around campus that required additional security, the University did not have adequate controls to ensure compliance with its procurement authority. Action is being taken to ensure compliance with the University's procurement authority.

Further, the University is actively engaged in a solicitation for security services specifically intended to bring these contracted services into compliance. The procurement results are expected to be presented to the Board of Public Works in late January or February 2023.

The University recognizes that retroactive contracts are not desirable and is working diligently to avoid retroactive activities going forward. This is expected to be accomplished through enhanced staffing, training, and the implementation of additional controls.

# A. Mount Auburn Cemetery 2630 Waterview Avenue, Baltimore City

**Description:** Cemetery conservation including fence repair / replacement / installation;, site work; paving; vegetation removal; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services [Total project costs \$100,000.00 estimated.]

**Remarks**: Mount Auburn Cemetery (NR, MIHP B-5060) was dedicated in 1872 and originally known as "The City of the Dead for Colored People". It was one of the first and now the only remaining cemetery owned and operated by African Americans in Baltimore. It uniquely represents the values and burial traditions of the community from the late 19th century to the present. Mount Auburn continues to be an active historic cemetery with a modest number of burials per year, consisting of new burials in existing family plots.

B. Hoppy Adams House \$100,000 35 Old Solomons Island Road, Annapolis, Anne Arundel County

Grantee: Charles W. "Hoppy" Adams Jr. Foundation, Inc.

**Description:** Exterior and interior rehabilitation including hazardous material mitigation; selective demolition; drainage improvements; window repair / replacement / installation; moisture barrier installation; gutter and downspout repair / replacement; carpentry repair / replacement; site work; vegetation removal; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services [Total project costs \$100,000.00 estimated.]

**Remarks:** The Charles "Hoppy" Adams Jr. House (MIHP AA-2529) is an expansive brick ranch style house built by celebrated African American radio broadcaster on WANN Annapolis. Known for spreading soul and R&B music to black and white audiences, Adams hosted popular concerts at Carr's Beach, an important venue on the Chitlin Circuit during segregation. Adams built his home in 1964 within the tight knit black community of Parole. The land has been passed down by his family since 1880. Adams lived in the house until his death in 2005.

# C. Mt. Calvary United Methodist Church – Arnold \$86,000 1236 Jones Station Road, Arnold, Anne Arundel County

*Description:* Exterior rehabilitation including roof repair / replacement; accessibility improvements; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services [Total project costs \$86,000.00 estimated.]

**Remarks:** Mt. Calvary United Methodist Church (MIHP AA-1010) was constructed in 1896. A large addition which engulfed the original structure was added in 1970. The Church began gathering on this site between 1832-1842 making it the oldest African American church in Arnold. This project seeks to fund replacement of the 40+ year roof and accessibility improvements.

# D. Eastport Elementary School, 3rd Street \$100,000 301 Chester Avenue, Annapolis, Anne Arundel County

Grantee: The Seafarers Yacht Club, Inc.

**Description**: Exterior and interior rehabilitation including roof and window repair / replacement / installation; foundation repair / replacement; fencing and carpentry repair / replacement / installation; interior finishes repair / replacement; painting; hazardous material mitigation; sitework; security and surveillance system installation; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000.00 estimated.]

**Remarks:** From 1918 until 1963, Eastport Elementary School, 3rd Street (MIHP AA-253) served as Eastport's school for African American children. Nearly a decade after the U.S. Supreme Court's 1954 decision in Brown vs. the Board of Education, the Anne Arundel County finally integrated the all-white 5th Street school, and the 3rd Street School was closed. In 1967 the Seafarers Yacht Club Inc. purchased the vacant building. The club was formed in 1959 by a group of black men with a shared interest in boating. They were inspired to form their own club in response to marinas that routinely refused black boaters to dock at their piers, and yacht clubs that denied membership to black captains.

# E. Old Wallville School 1450 Dares Beach Road, Prince Frederick, Calvert County

**Remarks:** The Old Wallville School is a one-room wooden schoolhouse which educated African American students in the unincorporated village of Wallville from 1880-1934. This building illustrates the segregated educational facilities of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. In 2006 the building was moved and placed adjacent to Calvert Elementary School. The school has been restored to its appearance in the early 1930s based on extensive interviews with Elizabeth Brown, the last teacher at the school before its closure, and through extensive archival research.

# F. Parren J Mitchell House and Cultural Center 828 North Carrollton Avenue, Baltimore City

**Remarks:** This property is best known as the long-time home of Parren J. Mitchell (Old West Baltimore NRHD, MIHP B-1373) a renowned professor, scholar, and Maryland's first African American U.S. Congressman, serving from 1971-1987. Mitchell was also a founding member of the Congressional Black Caucus and was a WWII veteran and Purple Heart recipient. In 1950 he won a landmark legal case against the segregated University of Maryland to allow him admission into their graduate school. He became the first African American to graduate with a master's degree from the University, and his case is considered instrumental in desegregation of higher education in Maryland

# G. Boyds Negro School 19510 White Ground Road, Boyds, Montgomery County

**Remarks:** In 1895 the Boyds Negro School (MHIP M:18-11-1) was built as a school for African American children in grades 1-8. At the end of that period, the students had completed their formal education until Montgomery County's first black high school opened in 1936. This same year Boyds School closed, and the pupils and their teacher, Miss Lillian Giles, were bussed to the Clarksburg Negro School. It is Montgomery County's only remaining one-room schoolhouse for African American children that is regularly open to the public.

H. Richard Potter House 9 N. 4th Street, Denton, Caroline County

Grantee: Fiber Arts Center of the Eastern Shore Inc.

**Description:** Exterior and interior rehabilitation including stabilization; masonry and carpentry repair / replacement; window and door repair / replacement; roofing repair / replacement; accessibility improvements; selective demolition; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$100,000.00 estimated.]

**Remarks:** Built in 1810, the Richard Potter House is a contributing structure to the Denton Historic District (MIHP CAR-284). Richard Potter occupied this pre-Civil War Home Site in 1855, when he recorded his experience being kidnapped in Greensboro, Maryland and sold into slavery in Delaware in the first book ever published in Caroline County. The site is included as part of the National Park Service's Network to Freedom. This project will restore the first floor of the home to its 1855 interior as a museum with classroom space.

Zion will no longer be used to hold regular church services, it does reflect the lasting influence of the Methodist Church on the African American community in Somerset County.

J. New Bethel Methodist Episcopal Church 10203 Trappe Road, Berlin, Worcester County Grantee: New Bethel United Methodist Church, Inc.

**Description:** Exterior rehabilitation including carpentry, roof, and gutter and downspout repair / replacement / installation; signage; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$86,365.00 estimated.]

**Remarks:** The present New Bethel Methodist Episcopal Church (MIHP WO-181) was built in 1905 in the Gothic Revival Style. Founded in 1855, New Bethel is the oldest African American Methodist congregation in Worcester County. Rev. Charles Albert Tindley, known as the Godfather of gospel music, was a member of the church in boyhood, and attended when he would visit from Philadelphia in adulthood



Competitive bids were received on September 7, 2022 via an electronic mail box accessible only by representatives from Turner.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on September 12, 2022 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually and in-person at Turner's office in Baltimore, Maryland.


Based on additional due diligence activities performed (and corresponding revisions to Construction Documents) by the design team and the associated sub consultants, site work and utilities packages were re-bid with competitive bids received on November 29, 2022 via an electronic mail box accessible only by representatives from Turner. Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on November 29, 2022 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete.

Turner submitted a GMP proposal on November 30, 2022. The cumulative GMP amount includes total MBE participation of 20.3% with 11.2% African American and 4.5% Women-Owned. The proposal has been reviewed by MSA staff for compliance. Based on the information provided, MSA concludes that Turner has demonstrated the good faith effort required to satisfy the goals of the MBE program. Future GMP Package(s) will exceed \$25,000,000. The Contractor remains committed to meeting the MBE participation goals established for the project.


The original apparent low bidder was rejected in accordance with COMAR 21.06.02.03B(3) because an analysis of their bid on items 4001, 4002, and 4003 (Unskilled Labor) is not sufficient to meet the Maryland Minimum Wage and Overtime Law average minimum over the next 3 years, furthermore they were unable to satisfactorily explain how it would meet the contract requirements with its bid prices. There were no protests filed for this contract.

The minimum wage and living wage requirement which should reflect the cost of hiring specialized workers were all factors that accounted for the disparity in bid price for the six highest bidders. Since Flagging Operators are specialized workers that require training, undivided attention, concentration, and long hours of standing, they cannot be paid just the minimum wage as the unskilled laborers. Therefore, in order to successfully meet all the COMAR requirements for the duration of the contract, the bid price must reflect all the known and anticipated expenses. The disparity in bid price for the ninth and highest bidder was due to a mathematical error when preparing in their bid.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The Maryland General Assembly created the MSBDFA program in 1978. MSBDFA promotes the viability and expansion of all small businesses in Maryland, with a focus on businesses owned by economically and socially disadvantaged entrepreneurs. Meridian Management Group is the management services vendor to administer the MSBDFA program on behalf of Commerce. The current contract expires at the end of CY2022.

As a result of the recent expiration of a provision in the Economic Development Article it has been determined that this contract cannot be considered for sole source and must be put out through a competitive RFP process. Commerce is working diligently with OSP to develop and advertise the RFP, however, this cannot be completed before the expiration of the current contract with MMG on December 31, 2022.

The Department of Commerce is working with OSP to ensure a continuation of services for our MSBDFA financing program by initiating a bridge contract that covers January 1st through January 5th, 2023. In addition, Commerce seeks to modify and extend the current contract for one year, from January 6th, 2023, to December 31, 2023. This will enable the services under the MSBDFA program to continue uninterrupted while the RFP process is completed. Many recipients of the Program's services rely on the financial support provided, to sustain operations.

Commerce believes for continuity of services, a contract extension with MMG is the best course of action while the Department undertakes a full competitive RFP process. This action would also include an increase of the base contract amount from \$1,307,026.76 to \$1,864,637.48 in support of additional transaction volume related to the federal State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) program. This new contract would expire December 31, 2023.

The economic harm of a halt in services to Maryland small businesses, specifically, disadvantaged and minority constituents, will be severe. The MSBDFA portfolio currently has 124 transactions, with outstanding balances of \$25.2 million. The inability of qualified socially or economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs to access the MSBDFA program on even a temporary basis would pose a major setback to those striving to recover from the pandemic. Furthermore, MSBDFA is the recipient program of \$45 million in federal funds through the SSBCI program. Under the federal grant, the state is contractually obligated to disburse these funds within certain timeframes or risk the loss/reversion of these funds.

Commerce expects to submit the draft RFP to OSP by December 19, 2022. The bridge and modification make continuity of services possible until the RFP process can be completed.







**Requesting Agency Remarks:** As the enforcement arm of the Department of Natural Resources, the mission of the Natural Resources Police (NRP) is to protect Maryland's residents and visitors on public lands and waterways. Natural resources enforcement activities utilizing the agency helicopter include surveillance for illegal fishing activities in oyster sanctuaries and prohibited fishing areas and illegal baiting and closed season hunting of deer, bear, turkey, waterfowl and other species. Many of these activities occur at night and having aerial surveillance with night vision capabilities is a necessity.



This purchase was made under General Services Administration Master Agreement GS-07F-328AA. The proposed contract pricing meets the requirements of the ICPA under COMAR 21.05.09.01B (2)(a). The process to directly solicit such a contract would take a significantly longer period of time than participating in the completed ICPA. Additionally, the amount of time in the award process is reduced and this method promotes administrative efficiencies and provides cost savings to the State.

GSA Schedule contracts are issued following full and open competition by the largest buyer of goods and services in the world, the United States Government, thus ensuring the best value for that item. Because prices are "locked in" between the federal government and the vendor for a specified period of time, the State realizes cost benefits in many ways, to include protection from rising labor and material costs. Accelerating the procurement process by using the intergovernmental cooperative purchasing agreement to purchase this aircraft will ensure the procurement will be approved in time for the new aircraft to be placed on the 2023 production schedule. The GSA vendor, Davenport Aviation, has expressed concern that their production schedule is filling for 2023, and that failing to make the 2023 production schedule will not only result in delayed delivery of 12 months, but also an increase in cost of at least 10% (over \$600,000). Davenport Aviation, Inc. was determined to be qualified based on its ability to supply scientific equipment and services. The vendor fully met and complied with all specifications and requirements of the solicitation in accordance with the evaluation criteria of the RFP.






