Remarks: The monthly average of seasonally adjusted total employment from the Current Employment Statistics series as reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics* for the period April 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022 for Maryland was 2,724,800. For the immediately preceding six-month period of October 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022, the monthly average of seasonally adjusted total employment for Maryland was 2,689,800. This increase of 35,100 in average monthly employment supports a determination by the Board of Public Works that seasonally adjusted total employment for the most recent six-month period is positive as compared with the immediately preceding six-month period.

Remarks: Conviction. In 2005, the Baltimore City Circuit Court convicted Mr. David Morris of felony murder in the course of a robbery.

Release. Following an investigation, the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Conviction Integrity Unit determined that DNA evidence did not match Mr. Morris, and that neither an alternative suspect nor a statement by a potentially exonerating witness had been properly disclosed to his defense. Mr. Morris was released in November 2021 after the Circuit Court granted a Writ of Actual Innocence and ordered a new trial, and the State's Attorney subsequently entered a nolle prosequi as to all charges and issued a "Certification of Conviction in Error."

Actual Innocence. Upon reviewing the testimony of Mr. Morris and the documentary evidence he submitted, the Administrative Law Judge found "no evidence connected the Claimant to the underlying felony... The Claimant did not commit the felony and was not an accessory or accomplice."

Compensation. The Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Morris was confined for 5,936 days, (2) the current annual median household income figure to use is \$90,203, and (3) under the statutory formula Mr. Morris is entitled to \$1,466,936.68 in compensation.

Recommended Expedited Compensation Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, "Based on the interests of the Claimant, including his time wrongfully incarcerated, his current significant financial need, his age, and his overall health..." the decision In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of David Morris, Claimant v. Board of Public Works recommends an expedited payment schedule over two fiscal years (the statutorily required payment of \$90,203 within 60 days of the decision; \$90,203 by January 31, 2023; \$257,306.14 by March 31, 2023, \$257,306.14 by May 31, 2023; \$257,306.14 by July 31, 2023; \$257,306.13 by September 29, 2023; and final payment of \$257,306.13 by January 31, 2024).

The Department of Budget and Management has recommended the compensation schedule contained on Page 1 of this item.

Attorney's Fees. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1), orders for compensation and benefits shall include reasonable attorney's fees and expenses associated with the action brought under this section. The decision In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of David Morris, Claimant v. Board of Public Works ordered payment of attorney's fees in the amount of \$27,625.

The Department of Budget and Management has recommended the Board of Public Works pay ordered attorney's fees upon approval by the General Assembly of a deficiency appropriation into the FY 2023 Operating Budget.

Remarks: This project is to construct a 600 linear foot living shoreline with dune and headland breakwater features to address erosion and flooding along Honeysuckle Drive, enhance natural buffers surrounding transportation and residential infrastructure, and address sea level rise and coastal storm impacts while preserving access to Mayo Beach Park. DNR is seeking approval to award construction funds for this one living shoreline project. After construction, DNR will return to the Board for approval to award adaptive management funds, if warranted.

The Resiliency through Restoration Initiative (formerly Coastal Resiliency Program) was developed to address escalating risks to Maryland's coastal and inland communities and public resources from extreme weather and climate-related events. This program implements on-the-ground natural and nature-based projects in priority areas where nature can help communities become more resilient to impacts from water. Targeting models, such as the Coastal Resiliency Assessment, identify areas where restoration can provide the greatest protection benefits for infrastructure, communities, businesses, and habitats. Datasets, such as impervious cover, highlight urban and inland areas where green infrastructure is needed to address more intense rain events. Projects will protect both public and private investments, while demonstrating a suite of nature-based projects that will enhance the ability of communities to respond to or recover from extreme hazards like storms and more frequent and intense rain events, or chronic hazards like nuisance flooding and sea level rise.

Project Description: As provided for under the Bay Restoration Fund Act, up to 10% of the annual revenue generated from wastewater treatment plant users deposited with MDE may be allocated for operation and maintenance costs of a wastewater treatment plant operating at the enhanced nutrient removal level. MDE's grant recommendations are based on base-grant of \$30,000 per every million gallons per day of design capacity, with a minimum grant award of \$30,000 (unless prorated for partial year of operations), and maximum award of \$300,000 per year for any plant. In addition to the base-grants, additional grants are being recommended for plants achieving better than the enhanced nutrient removal level.

These plants have successfully achieved the goals of effluent levels at or below Total Nitrogen of 3 mg/l and Total Phosphorous of 0.3 mg/l, reducing nitrogen discharged to Chesapeake Bay by over 7,895,000 pounds per year, and phosphorus by over 928,000 pounds per year.

Permanent repairs will be required at these locations along the sewer interceptor in order to prevent the potential discharge of untreated sewage into the stream. 



Two proposals were rejected due to failure to submit required minority business enterprise (MBE) affidavits. The remaining three proposals were evaluated by a University evaluation committee. One offeror was deemed not susceptible of being selected for award. The remaining two offerors were found to be susceptible of the award and were invited to oral presentations/demonstrations. After oral presentations/demonstrations, both firms were invited to submit price proposals, and, subsequently, best and final price proposals.

Financial proposals were evaluated based on the hourly rate for the professional fees using an estimated number of hours for the initial base term of one year and six months and four one-year renewal options. Media buys and third-party billing is estimated at \$1,000,000 annually; however, it was not factored in the evaluated price as these costs are billed at cost with no markup. The professional fees include, but are not limited to, account management; branding, creation of integrated multi-channel marketing plans, creative asset and ad development, website design and development, search engine marketing (SEM), email marketing, print/direct mailing and owned channel support and signage.

Award is recommended to Mission Media as the best value to the University considering technical qualifications and pricing. This firm was ranked the top technically due to their extensive experience with other higher education clients, their proven ability to enhance brand awareness that leads to audience action through targeted messaging and their keen technical expertise and execution of data-driven digital communications, as well as their clear demonstration of compelling creative campaigns for prospective students.

The Officers are used to block access to the "hot spots," (runway/helipad/taxiway) the most frequent areas where individuals/vehicles enter an active movement area. MDOT MPA requests approval of an extension of the contract and an increase in the not-to-exceed value to allow for completion of additional work needed by MDOT MPA while a new contract is procured. This modification is required not due to poor contract administration or poor planning on the part of MDOT MPA, but because no proposals were received in response to the replacement contract Request for Proposals (RFP) and additional time was needed to solicit feedback and revise the RFP to encourage greater participation. MDOT MPA advertised a replacement contract, RFP No. 521068, Agency Wide Substructure Repairs VI, in September 2021, but no proposals were received. On December 15, 2021, MDOT MPA's Engineering Division hosted an Industry Day attended by representatives of the contracting and MBE community and MDOT MPA's Engineering and Procurement departments, to obtain feedback as to why no proposals were submitted for RFP No. 521068 and to identify changes to the RFP requirements that would attract proposals. Notice of that Industry Day was publicly advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage. During the Industry Day discussion MDOT MPA obtained valuable feedback, which the Engineering Division used to revise specifications, bonding requirements, and other aspects of the contract to make it more attractive to offerors.

The Engineering Division then decided it was in the best interest of MDOT MPA to combine the Agency Wide Substructure Repair VI contract, covering repairs below the waterline and below the concrete deck, with another replacement contract, Agency Wide Deck Repairs IV, covering only above-the-waterline deck repairs, into a single replacement contract, Agency Wide Waterfront Structure Repairs, Contract No. 522078, covering all waterfront structure repairs. The combination of those two previously separate contracts into a single contract will result in significantly greater efficiency in procurement and contract administration. That new combined contract will be advertised in the near future upon receipt of final bidding documents from the Engineering Division. Developing the revised, combined scope of work and obtaining approval to increase the not-to-exceed value of the new contract has taken additional time and involved the joint efforts of the MDOT MPA Engineering Division, its consultants, the MDOT MPA Procurement Department, and the Office of the Attorney General.

The MBE participation to date is 4.38%. Some of the assigned work orders have not required significant work or materials from the approved MBE subcontractors. In addition, the original MBE supplier graduated from the MBE program commodity code for supplying finished metal and reinforcing bars, resulting in the contractor being unable to count those materials toward its MBE compliance. Ballard Marine Construction, LLC has since added an additional MBE supplier to meet the goal throughout the remainder of the contract. Approval of this modification will increase the contract dollars available to MBEs.

The Maryland Port Commission approved this Modification on November 1, 2022.

Requesting Agency Remarks: MDOT MTA's Office of Local Transit Support (OLTS) provides a variety of technical assistance services to LOTS operating in the State of Maryland. This contract, awarded to four vendors, allows LOTS to order medium duty buses in a variety of models for transit services in their counties. After the inception of this contract, Alexander Dennis, stopped producing the vehicle they offered and is no longer an active vendor for selection.

For transit vehicles, the DBE goals are managed through the Federal Transit Administration's Transit Vehicle Manufacturer (FTA TVM) Program. Only eligible TVMs may bid on FTA-assisted transit vehicle procurements. MDOT MTA does not set, nor review the DBE goals.

Currently, the contract language allows for the vendors to request, and MDOT MTA to approve, an economic adjustment of up to 4% based on the Producer's Price Index (PPI) category 1413 Truck and Bus Bodies.

Due to unprecedented increases in the cost of the vehicle components, three vendors for this contract have requested a pricing adjustment that exceeds the amount MDOT MTA may approve under this contract. American Bus & Truck, Inc. requested an adjustment of 15.86% based on the PPI for the period of July 2021 to July 2022. Rohrer Enterprises, Inc. requested an adjustment of 12.18% based on the PPI for the period of December 2021 and July 2022. Sonny Merryman, Inc. requested a price adjustment of 33.5% for vehicle type 2a and 38% for vehicle type 3a as a result of actual costs rather than utilizing the PPI. Sonny Merryman, Inc. also requested an economic adjustment for all options utilizing the PPI from July 2020 to July 2022 which is 22.85%.

While this will add to the price of individual orders, additional contract authority is not requested. The original contract had a "not to exceed" budget requested based on estimated expected orders. MDOT MTA OLTS has received fewer orders than originally anticipated due to COVID restrictions and continuing supply chain issues.

MDOT MTA therefore has determined that it is in the best interest of the State to grant the requested price adjustments.

While this will add to the price of individual orders, additional contract authority is not requested. The original contract had a "not to exceed" budget requested based on estimated expected orders. MDOT MTA OLTS has received fewer orders than originally anticipated due to COVID restrictions and continuing supply chain issues.

MDOT MTA researched comparable current purchases other states are making and recognized that a new solicitation would definitively result in even higher pricing for the vehicles. Additionally, proceeding with a new solicitation would delay LOTS and MobilityLink bus orders at least two years, potentially putting them in the position of not being able to replace vehicles that are past their useful life and possibly not in good repair. MDOT MTA therefore has determined that it is in the best interest of the State to grant the requested price adjustments.

The second solicitation was advertised on eMMA September 22, 2022, notifying 539 vendors. After outreach to the vendor community indicated a potential poor bid response, the bid due date was extended and the SBR designation was removed to garner more competition. Two bids were received. After review of the bids, the low bidder failed to submit the affidavits, financial documents, and correct MBE forms, and their SDAT status was not in good standing. The Procurement Officer attempted to contact the low bidder to discuss the deficiencies and SDAT status, but did not receive a response. The second bidder's bid exceeded the approved funding amount.

Ultimately, MDOT decided that it is in the State's best interest to reject all bids for the lawn and landscaping contract in accordance with the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.06.02.02.C, "Rejection of all Bids or Proposals." Per COMAR 21.05.04.01 A (1), MDOT TSO decided to proceed with a Negotiated Award After Unsatisfactory Competitive Sealed Bidding.

On November 1, 2022, all parties agreed to a contract base term of three (3) years and 1 month at \$296,940. This contract provides all labor, supervision, materials, equipment, and skills necessary to provide comprehensive lawn care and landscaping services at 7201 Corporate Center Drive, Hanover MD. The MBE participation goal established for this contract is 21%, for which the contractor has committed. No VSBE participation goal was established for this contract.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This modification will add five Developmentally Disabled beds and a new location. The Department utilizes Residential Child Care (RCC) programs for children whose needs cannot be met in a family based foster care setting. RCC services in Maryland are provided through five program categories; Developmentally Disabled Programs; Diagnostic Evaluation and Treatment Programs, Group Homes, High Intensity Group Home, and Medically Fragile. The facilities are located throughout the State and serve foster care children under the care of the Department. It is in the best interest of the children and the State not to disrupt the current placement or change the existing provider for these youth. The services of each contractor will be used at the sole discretion of DHS. DHS makes no guarantee as to the number of children/youths to be placed with any contractor. These are purchase of care contracts paid on a fee for service basis for the actual children/youth placed in a contractor's care, and then only for the actual number of days each child is with the contractor.

The Department has resolved the discrepancy with the MBE compliance and determined that the provider did not submit its request for a MBE waiver. The provider assumed they had requested an MBE waiver and it was approved. A waiver would have voided the contract, so the agency wanted to resolve this issue before bringing this to the BPW. It is now understood that the provider will adhere to its 5% MBE compliance requirement. As a result, since August 2021, the vendor continues to submit MBE invoice reports to confirm the transition of contracted services to MBE certified vendors. Since that time, the provider continues to demonstrate its efforts to comply with the established 5% MBE goal and have adhered to their documented plans.

The proposed price for this contract is fair and reasonable because the price is set by the Interagency Rates Committee, using the same established methodology in price setting for all In-State providers.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The 24/7/365 Security Operations Center (SOC) within the Office of Security Management (OSM) currently monitors approximately 30,000 endpoints through disparate Endpoint Detection and Response (EDR) solutions and Antivirus products. The plan is to increase this to 100,000 endpoints over the next year. One of the thematic findings in the Statewide security assessments, which are now legislatively required to be performed by all units of State government at least every two years with results reported on, was a lack of consistently implemented, managed, and monitored endpoint protection tools, including EDR solutions. This lack of consistency across agencies creates a substantial risk for the State as a whole. At the time of approval, the property was in the process of being surveyed, and if the acreage of the property was determined to be greater than the approved acreage, then Board of Public Works (BPW) approval would be requested for the increase in acreage. The survey is now complete, and the total acreage to be conveyed is 485.0778, which is an increase of 26.0978 acres.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20211012-0822. It is recommended to declare the Crownsville Hospital Center Campus (+/- 544 acres with 69 buildings totaling 800,521 square feet) surplus to the needs of the State contingent upon consideration of the Maryland Department of the Environment's, the Maryland Department of Transportation's, the Maryland Department of Planning's, the Maryland Environmental Services', and the Maryland Environmental Trust's qualifying comments; the Maryland Historical Trust's requirements; and the Maryland Environmental Trust's, Maryland Public Television's, and Anne Arundel County's requests. Maryland Public Television expressed interest in acquiring a portion of the property; Anne Arundel County expressed interest in acquiring the entire property.

Also, in response to notifications to state legislators in whose district the property is located, a company, Bennett's Curse, expressed interest in acquiring the property.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department previously awarded contracts for In Home Aide Services (IHAS) as DGS 25-S, 12/01/2021. Unfortunately, the previous solicitation did not provide enough contractors to handle the caseload in five counties. This made it necessary to issue a new solicitation to fill a gap in services in the following five counties: Allegany, Cecil, Frederick, St. Mary's and Washington Counties.

A notice of the availability of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* and the DHS website on June 1, 2022. A copy of the solicitation was sent directly to 38 potential vendors and three were small businesses. Bidders were permitted to submit bids for one jurisdiction or all five jurisdictions.

A roster of successful bidders, from lowest to highest bid will be made available to each Local Department of Social Services (LDSS) for use. The bid amounts used to rank the bidders and determine their placement on the roster are derived from the composite weighted hourly rate, the hourly rate for each service type, weighted by the Department's estimated frequency of service-type provision. Bidders who submit the lowest bid in a jurisdiction will have the highest position on that jurisdiction's roster. All hourly rates/prices are fixed per year for the entire contract term.

The IFB was issued to provide IHAS services which include Personal Care, Chore Services, Respite Care, Nursing Supervision and Nursing Evaluations. In-Home Aide Services are provided in the homes of persons who are eligible for DHS's In-Home Aide Services Program and have functional disabilities as defined in COMAR 07.02.14.02 B (6) (i.e., cannot perform activities of daily living such as dressing, bathing, eating, toileting, transferring from bed to chair etc., without assistance). The services are to be provided to service 5 of 24 Maryland jurisdictions. Fifteen other jurisdictions have a sufficient number of providers to cover the current caseload, and four of the counties (Anne Arundel, Garrett, Kent and Montgomery counties) have local arrangements for service provision and did not participate in this solicitation.

No MBE goal was established for these Contracts since all subcontracting opportunities identified for these services were for ancillary services and not core services. No VSBE goal was established for these contracts also as the core services to the Scope of Work cannot be subcontracted out by the IHAS providers.
