Background: Pursuant to Section 10-622, Economic Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, the Stadium Authority is authorized to prepare studies for units of the State of Maryland, provided that the Stadium Authority must give written notice to the budget committees of the General Assembly of the proposed study and its estimated costs and funding sources, which committees shall have at least thirty days to review and comment before the Authority begins work thereon. For such studies, the Authority shall use funds that are provided by the unit of the State, a portion of the Authority's available nonbudgeted funds, or such other funds as may be appropriated therefor.

By letter dated April 20, 2022, the Department of Commerce requested that the Stadium Authority prepare a market, economic, and site fit analysis study for a new multi-use soccer stadium to be primarily operated by DC United for its MLS Next Pro Club team; fund up to \$25,000 of the cost of the study from the Stadium Authority's available nonbudgeted funds; and fund the remaining \$25,000 of the cost of the study from funds donated by DC United. At its meeting on May 3, 2022, the Stadium Authority agreed to undertake the study and fund up to \$25,000 of the costs thereof from its available nonbudgeted funds. The Stadium Authority provided written notice concerning the study to the budget committees of the General Assembly on June 2, 2022.

Pursuant to Section 10-614(4), Economic Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, "subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Authority may ... receive and accept from any public or private source contributions, gifts, or grants of money or property" At its meeting on September 6, 2022, the Authority agreed to accept, subject to approval by the Board of Public Works, the \$25,000 from DC United in accordance with the MOU.

The ten years beyond the 35-year Bond payment term represents a "tail" period for the ground lease standard in student housing public-private partnerships that provides bondholders additional payment assurance.
Rent:	The Maryland Economic Development Corporation ("MEDCO"), will pay ground rent to the University in an amount equal to the annual surplus generated from operations after paying debt service and operating expenses and funding reserves.

Remarks: The Ground Lease Amendment is required for the additional Tower to be added to the Thurgood Marshall Housing & Dining Services Project. The air rights and ground lease are part of a cross-collateralization structure with the MEDCO-Morgan View Project (completed in 2002) and the existing Thurgood Marshall Housing Facility, whereby the existing air rights and the ground lease will be amended and restated to include the new Tower for the Thurgood Marshall Housing and Dining Services facility. The collective projects will secure the existing Morgan View Bonds, the existing Thurgood Marshall Housing Bonds, and the new Thurgood Marshall Housing Bonds for the new Tower, with the properties and cash flow as collateral.

In the fiscal year 2021, Morgan State University, in conjunction with the Maryland Economic Development Corporation ("MEDCO"), began a development project for 670-beds of replacement housing to be owned by MEDCO (the "Student Housing Facility") and an approximately 30,000 square foot replacement dining and retail facility to be owned by the University (the "Dining Facility" and, collectively with the Student Housing Facility, the "Thurgood Marshall Project, "on the main campus of the University. This Student Housing Facility of this project was opened to students in August 2022; the Dining Facility is expected to open in October 2022.

MSU and MEDCO are collaborating on adding a tower to the Student Housing Facility, providing 604 beds to assist with the University's current housing demand and enrollment growth.

The additional tower to the Student Housing Facility will be financed through a privatized financing structure where the State of Maryland, on behalf of MSU, will enter into air rights and ground lease (the "Ground Lease") with MEDCO for a term extending beyond the duration of the financing. MEDCO will develop the additional tower to the current Student Housing Facility portion of the Thurgood Marshall Project. MEDCO will issue tax-exempt bonds (the "Bonds"), the proceeds of which will fund the costs of design, development and construction of the additional tower to the current Student Housing Facility. The revenues from the Student Housing Facility will be used for and pledged by MEDCO to secure the repayment of the Bonds.

Board of Public Works approval of the Ground Lease Amendment is required for closing. The MEDCO Loan closing is anticipated for November 3, 2022. The University seeks to enter into an amended ground lease with MEDCO. MEDCO will contract with underwriter's RBC Capital Markets, LLC, Rice Financial Products and Mesirow Financial for the issuance of bonds. The project is to be located on the MSU campus and is consistent with the strategic housing plan for the University.

Construction Manager: MEDCO engaged in a competitive process to procure the construction manager. MEDCO evaluated submitted proposals and selected Gilbane Building Company ("Gilbane") based in Providence, Rhode Island. The development costs are estimated at \$110 million (including construction costs, development costs, soft costs, and financing fees). Gilbane will provide 100% performance and payment bonds for the facility's construction, consistent with the ground lease terms.

Financing: The Student Housing Facility portion of the Thurgood Marshall Project will be substantially funded through tax-exempt bonds issued by MEDCO. The bonds will not constitute a debt to the State or Morgan State University for legal or accounting purposes. The term of the bond financing has a 35-year payment term plus ten years beyond the term of the bonds, for a total 45-year term to make the project financing possible. The financing is expected to close in November 2022.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: Maryland Department of Labor is reporting an emergency modification #1 to add the Instant ID Business (Employer Fraud) Subscription Services to the existing contract with LexisNexis Risk Solutions. The annual subscription fee for the Instant ID Business (Employer Fraud) is \$61,560 for a contract period of 6/1/2022 through 5/31/2023.

The additional fraud prevention subscription is very much needed as Maryland Unemployment Insurance Division has seen a significant increase in the number of people registering fictitious employers. Maryland staff need assistance to help identify which of these accounts being registered are legitimate employers and not fictitious. If fictitious employers are not identified they attempt to report wages on the account and then file claims against these wages for benefits payments. Lexis Nexis has a system to analyze the data provided during registration and identify which of these accounts are high risk of being a fictitious employer. Staff can then use this data to determine if the account should be reviewed further or canceled before the fraud can happen.

In an effort to serve Maryland citizens effectively and quickly, LABOR executed a contract modification with LexisNexis Risk Solutions under the Emergency Procurement process. Nevertheless, LABOR will issue a new RFP for Identity Verification Services in the near future, so as to ensure fair competition while providing Maryland citizens protection from potential fraud.

Reason for Late Report: This report was submitted late due to delays in receiving required documents and obtaining necessary signatures. As a result, LABOR was unable to prepare this report in a timely fashion.

Background: The Rural Legacy Program is designed to preserve large blocks of contiguous open space that are among the State's most valuable because of the existence of a multitude of agricultural, forestry, natural and cultural resources. To protect these resources, the Rural Legacy Program, acting through local government or private land trust sponsors, purchases conservation easements from willing property owners, based on Rural Legacy Plans that have been reviewed by the Rural Legacy Advisory Committee and approved by the Rural Legacy Board.

The Rural Legacy Program Fiscal Year 2023 grant awards total \$27,100,477. This total comprises the FY 2023 funding appropriation of \$26,387,542 and, in addition, \$712,935 in unused prior year funding that the Rural Legacy Advisory Committee and Rural Legacy Board voted to redirect to this year's grant awards.

DNR will submit individual contracts to purchase conservation easements to the Board of Public Works as the specific transactions arise.

Authority:Subtitle 9A - Rural Legacy Program, Natural Resources Article,
Annotated Code of Maryland.

1. Agricultural Security Corridor - Eastern Shore Heartland Rural Legacy Area: *Caroline, Dorchester, and Talbot Counties*

Grant: of \$1,634,912 to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in three counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.



2. Agricultural Security Corridor - Harvest Crescent Rural Legacy Area: *Cecil and Kent Counties*

Grant: of \$1,373,178 to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in two counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.

3. Agricultural Security Corridor - Tuckahoe Rural Legacy Area: Caroline and Talbot Counties

Grant: of \$183,845 to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in two counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.

4. Baltimore Coastal:

Baltimore County

Grant: of \$2,081,689 to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources, including forests, farmlands, water quality. Coastal resiliency benefits include riparian buffers and restrictions on structures in flood and surge zones to protect important ecosystem functions.

• **Boundary Adjustments:** for a net expansion of 862 acres such that the resulting area will be 14,831 acres. The adjustments to the boundary include expansion of 2,280 acres and reduction/removal of 1,418 acres. The boundary updates remove developed areas and/or areas slated for imminent development in order to maintain rural integrity of the RLA, accompanied by adding undeveloped areas identified by the community to expand opportunities for preservation.



5. Bear Creek Rural Legacy Area: Garrett County

Grant: of \$573,881 to acquire conservation easements to protect the County's most productive working farms, standing timber, scenic views from the Cove overlook, natural habitats, wetlands, and waterways in the Bear Creek drainage basin. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Youghiogheny River, the State's only designated Wild and Scenic River. The Board approved designation of the Bear Creek Rural Legacy Area in 2002.

6. Calvert Creeks Rural Legacy Area: Calvert County

Grant: of \$1,062,012 to acquire conservation easements on historic farmland, forests and significant natural areas in the Patuxent River and Chesapeake Bay watersheds. The Board approved the designation of the Calvert Creeks Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

• Expansion: of 15,817 acres to cover a significant portion of the Patuxent River shoreline as well as large parts of the Hunting Creek watershed, which is a conservation focus area for the County. Part of the expanded boundary creates a green corridor along the length of the County and nearly connects the North Calvert RLA and the Calvert Creeks RLA from Dunkirk to Solomons. Another expansion south of Prince Frederick further protects Parkers Creek watershed and lands owned & managed by American Chestnut Land Trust, as well as the Battle Creek watershed.

7. Coastal Bays Rural Legacy Area: Worcester County

Grant: of \$701,879 to acquire conservation easements to protect forest, agricultural, natural areas and shoreline in Worcester County's coastal bays. This Area includes important tidal marshland areas, forests, and farmland, which provides one of the most ecologically diverse and outstanding wildlife habitat in the State. The Board approved the designation of the Coastal Bays Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

8. Deer Creek Rural Legacy Area:

Harford County

Grant: of \$1,295,664 to acquire conservation easements within the watershed of Deer Creek River, a State-designated Scenic River, and adjacent to Rocks and Susquehanna State Park to protect historic farmland, forests, natural and cultural areas. This Area is located within the Lower Susquehanna Heritage Greenway, a certified Maryland Heritage Area. The Board approved the designation of the Lower Deer Creek Rural Legacy Area in 1999.



9. Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area: Somerset and Worcester Counties

Grant: of \$600,000 to acquire conservation easements to protect significant woodland, farmland and wetlands. The Area includes one of the most pristine and ecologically significant watershed basins on the mid-Atlantic. It includes exemplary plant and wildlife habitat, prime farmland and large blocks of working forests and over 10 miles of shoreline of Dividing Creek. The Board approved the designation of the Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area in 2008.

10. Fair Hill Rural Legacy Area:

Cecil County

Grant: of \$528,710 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas and historic sites in the northeast corner of Cecil County contiguous to Fair Hill Natural Resources Management Area. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including equestrian activities. The Board approved the designation of the Fair Hill Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

11. Foreman Branch/Lands End Rural Legacy Areas:

Queen Anne's County

Grant: of \$1,307,452 to acquire conservation easements to protect environmentally significant tributaries of the Chester and Corsica Rivers, including farmland, forest land, wetlands and wildlife habitat. The Board approved the designation of the Foreman Branch and Lands End Rural Legacy Areas in 1998.

12. Gunpowder Rural Legacy Area:

Baltimore County

Grant: of \$235,467 to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect historic farmland, forests and natural and cultural areas on both sides of the Gunpowder River and the Northern Central Railroad Trail in Baltimore County. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Prettyboy and Loch Raven Reservoirs. The Board approved the designation of the Gunpowder River Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

• **Expansion:** of 989 acres to extend the RLA from Quaker Bottom Road on the South to I-83 on the West and to a line just South of Ensor Mill Road on the North; and join the existing RLA on the West. The expansion will provide significant view-shed protection from I-83.



13. Harriet Tubman Rural Legacy Area:

Dorchester County

Grant: of \$481,598 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodland, natural and historic landscapes associated with the legacy of Harriet Tubman and the history of the Underground Railroad. The Board approved the designation of the Harriet Tubman Rural Legacy Area in 2018.

14. Huntersville Rural Legacy Area:

St. Mary's County

Grant: of \$852,262 for partnership with the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) funds to acquire conservation easements to protect forests, natural and archeological areas, farmland, and historic sites. Portions of the Area are designated by the Smithsonian Center for Natural Areas as critical wildlife habitat in need of protection. The Board approved the designation of the Huntersville Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

15. Little Pipe Creek /Upper Patapsco Rural Legacy Areas:

Carroll County

Grant: of \$320,720 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodland, natural and cultural land within the Little Pipe Creek and upper Monocacy River Watersheds. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits not only for the two watersheds, but also for the underground aquifers that supply many residents with drinking water. The Board approved the designation of the Little Pipe Creek Rural Legacy Area in 1998 and Upper Patapsco Rural Legacy Area in 2004.

16. Long Green Valley Rural Legacy Area:

Baltimore County

Grant: of \$994,001 to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect woodland, farmland and significant habitat and wildlife corridors, including lands within or directly contiguous to the Long Green Valley National Register Historic District. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits for the Little and Big Gunpowder Rivers and the Loch Raven Reservoir. The Board approved the designation of the Long Green Valley Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

• **Expansion:** of 126 acres that will add land to the northwestern portion of the RLA south of Sweet Air Road from a parcel line down to Manor Road that will increase contiguous areas of existing protected lands.



17. Manor Rural Legacy Area:

Baltimore and Harford Counties

Grant: of \$666,611 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodlands and significant natural and cultural resources in My Lady's Manor National Historic District and along the Little Gunpowder Falls, a Class Three Trout Stream. The Board approved the designation of the Manor Rural Legacy Area in 2000.

18. Mattapany Rural Legacy Area:

St. Mary's County

Grant: of \$493,984 to match the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) funds to acquire conservation easements to protect the Area's rich farmland, forests, wetlands, historic sites, and wildlife habitat. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Chesapeake Bay and the St. Mary's River watershed. The Board approved the designation of the Mattapany Rural Legacy Area in 2006.

• **Expansion:** of 17,065 acres that is designed to include environmentally significant land bordering the St. Mary's and Potomac Rivers, as well as around the Naval Air Station Patuxent River's Webster Outlying Field. The entire expansion area is eligible for Navy REPI funding.

19. Mid-Maryland Frederick/Carrollton Manor Rural Legacy Areas: *Frederick County*

Grant: of \$1,883,000 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forestland, Civil War historic sites and a greenbelt around the historic Town of Burkittsville. Conservation of property in the Area will protect the view surrounding the Appalachian Trail and South Mountain Battlefield State Park, which are nationally significant natural and cultural resources. The Board approved the designation of the Mid-Maryland Frederick Rural Legacy Area in 1998 and the Carrollton Manor Rural Legacy Area in 2004.



20. Mid-Maryland Washington Rural Legacy Area:

Washington County

Grant: of \$1,550,000 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests and Civil War sites within view of Washington Monument State Park, South Mountain Battlefield State Park, Antietam National Battlefield and its approaches. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Potomac River, a Maryland designated Scenic River. The Board approved the designation of the Mid-Maryland Washington Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

21. Mountain Ridge Rural Legacy Area:

Allegany County

Grant: of \$1,838,592 to acquire conservation easements of significant woodland, farmland and wetlands. Situated within the Ridge & Valley Physiographic Province where it meets the Allegheny Front, the Area includes large blocks of unbroken forest, pristine ecologically significant areas and historic sites. The Area includes an important migration corridor and the most significant golden eagle flyway in the State. The Board approved the designation of Mountain Ridge Rural Legacy Area in 2010.

22. Nanjemoy – Mattawoman Forest Rural Legacy Area: Charles County

Grant: of \$1,166,098 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas, and historic properties within the Nanjemoy and Mattawoman watersheds. The resources protected in this RLA include the fisheries of the Mattawoman Creek – one of the steadiest and busiest recreational fishing destinations in Maryland. This area includes properties on the Potomac River, Mallows Bay, Nanjemoy Creek, and Mattawoman Creek, and is within the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) preservation boundary. The Board approved the designation of Nanjemoy-Mattawoman Rural Legacy Area in 2021.



23. Mid-Maryland Montgomery/Upper Patuxent Rural Legacy Areas:

Montgomery County

Grant: of \$1,305,703 to acquire conservation easements and fee simple interests to protect farmland, open space, and natural areas. The Area protects farmland, open space and natural resources located within the heart of the County's Agricultural Reserve. The Area contains large contiguous tracts of rural lands, numerous agricultural operations, and forest resources rich in both aquatic and terrestrial wildlife. Conservation within the Area provides water quality benefits to the Potomac River, a Maryland designated Scenic River. The Board approved the designation of Mid-Maryland Montgomery Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

24. North Calvert Rural Legacy Area: *Calvert County*

Grant: of \$1,371,909 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland and forests, and provide habitat for resident and migrating species. The Area forms a greenway along the Patuxent River, a State Scenic River. Riparian buffers will protect the sensitive wetlands and forests of four watersheds. The Area is also historically significant, including the historic town of Lower Marlboro that was active in the War of 1812 and was also an important port town until the 1930's. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy. The Board approved the designation of the North Calvert Rural Legacy Area in 2004.

• **Expansion:** of 1,747 acres in three separate locations – one along the border with Anne Arundel County; another along Lower Marlboro Road (Rte. 262); and a third to the south of the existing RLA in Huntingtown. These expansions are intended to add greater protection for Hall Creek, and other smaller tributaries of the Patuxent River, and will increase the size of the green corridor in northern Calvert County and extend to almost connect to the Calvert Creeks RLA in the southern part of the County.

25. Piney Run Rural Legacy Area:

Baltimore County

Grant: of \$1,597,310 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas and historic properties within and near National Register Historic Districts. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Prettyboy and Loch Raven Reservoirs, two of the drinking supply reservoirs for the Baltimore Metropolitan Area. The Board approved the designation of the Piney Run Rural Legacy Area in 1998.



26. Quantico Creek Rural Legacy Area:

Wicomico County

Grant: of \$1,000,000 to acquire conservation easements to protect forests, farmland, and wintering waterfowl habitat and historic villages. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to Quantico Creek, part of the Nanticoke Watershed Greenway. The Board approved the designation of the Quantico Creek Rural Legacy Area in 2000.

One hundred and one agencies were directly solicited including sixty Minority Business Enterprises. Ten technical proposals were received. These proposals were evaluated by a University evaluation committee. Four proposers were found to be susceptible of the award and were invited to oral presentations. Three firms remained shortlisted after oral presentations and were invited to submit a concept for a specific project. Three firms remained shortlisted after the concept phase and were invited to submit price proposals. After discussions, all were invited to submit a best and final price proposal.

Price proposals were analyzed based on the current University budget of \$800,000. Estimated professional fees and estimated paid media were analyzed for the initial year of the 4-year base term based on quoted hourly rates, anticipated hours, and allowed markups for media buys and third parties. The mix of professional fees and media spend is subject to change from year to year as work becomes known. The anticipated spend over the initial four-year base contract is \$4,800,000, or approximately \$1.2M/year. This spend amount includes, but is not limited to, account management; branding, strategy and research; creative services including production; digital design and development; and media research, planning and buying as well as special marketing/advertising projects that may arise for specific schools within the University. As work is required, a scope of work will be developed and the price negotiated based on the level of effort, quoted hourly rates, and allowed markups for media buys and third parties. For the base contract term as well as any renewal year(s), quoted mark-ups for media buys and third party work will remain constant. Annual increases in labor rates, if any, may not exceed Consumer Price Index.

Award is recommended to BVK as the best value to the University considering technical qualifications and pricing. This firm was ranked the top technically due to their extensive experience with higher education institutions as well as their strong demonstration of creative abilities.

Requesting Institution Remarks: In February 2020, a Request for Proposal process was initiated by USM and facilitated by the University of Maryland College Park (UMCP) on behalf of the USM. As a result of rigorous proposal reviews, MetLife was recommended as the selected awardee. Final contract award was issued following Board of Regents review and approval on December 2, 2020; and approval by the Board of Public Works on January 6, 2021.

The USM Office (USMO) requests approval to modify the current contract with Metropolitan Life Insurance Company which includes Voluntary Life and Long-Term Disability Insurance benefits for USM Staff, Faculty, and eligible Contingent Category II Employees for the same initial term of five-years, with five additional one-year renewal options. The modification will incorporate the optional benefits to include: Group Accident, Critical Illness, Hospital Indemnity, Legal Plan, Pet Insurance and Group Auto/Home and these optional benefits were included in the original request to the BPW. Short-Term Disability is also added as it was accidentally omitted from the original agenda item (USM Item 3-S, 1/6/21).

There is a 12.7% savings to Staff, Faculty, and Contingent Category II Employees, as this is 100% employee paid. Savings for the base Contract period is \$1,582,264.42.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This solicitation included a Construction base bid and two construction alternates. Construction Alternate No. 1 provides a Customer Car Finding Application, Vehicle Behavior Alerts, and an Automated Parking Guidance System Mobile Application. Construction Alternate No. 2 provides surveillance streaming video. The solicitation also included a Maintenance Base Bid and one Maintenance alternate. Maintenance Alternate No. 1 provides a trained, factory certified on-site field technician.

The solicitation was previously advertised as MAA-CO-22-001 and MAA-MC-22-016 Hourly Garage Parking Guidance System Replacement at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport on August 12, 2021, with two proposals received on October 6, 2021. During the evaluation process the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Aviation Administration (MDOT MAA) discovered multiple ambiguities in the solicitation requirements.

The MDOT MAA determined that rejecting all proposals and cancelling the procurement was fiscally advantageous or otherwise in the State's best interest. Therefore, in accordance with COMAR 21.06.02.02 (C) Cancellation and Rejection of Request for Proposals, the procurement was cancelled, and all proposals rejected.

The amended solicitation was re-advertised as MAA-CO-22-010 and MAA-MC-23-015 Hourly Garage Parking Guidance System Replacement at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport on December 16, 2021, on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and the MDOT MAA's website. The amendments to the solicitation included improvements to the following evaluation criteria: Offeror/Contract Team; Overall Technical Solution; and the Maintenance Plan. The MDOT MAA directly solicited seven firms. Three proposals were received; one proposal was rejected.

A Technical Best and Final Offer (BAFO) was requested from the firms on April 1, 2022. Each Offeror submitted its BAFO response by the April 7, 2022, due date and time. Each Offeror participated in Oral Presentations and Interviews also on April 7, 2022. Based on one Offeror's BAFO response and Oral Presentation the MDOT MAA determined the proposal did not meet the minimum requirements set forth in the solicitation and therefore isn't reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Consequently, the proposal was rejected pursuant to COMAR 21.06.02.03B. No protest was filed.

After completing technical evaluations, the Panel ranked Parking Guidance System, LLC (PGS) the highest technically considering a combination of industry leading expertise, key staff, overall technical solution, statement of project goals, and maintenance plan. Overall, both of the Offerors could successfully complete the project. The Offerors do not have any significant weaknesses. Both Offerors have many successful installations at major airports. In addition, both Offerors clearly detail project goals and management approach. However, based on a combination of its technical and financial offer, the Panel has determined that PGS provides the most advantageous offer to the State.

Replacement of the parking guidance system at the Hourly Garage includes:

- removal of existing and provision of new individual space monitoring equipment for parking facilities inclusive to project;
- removal and replacement of drive aisle sensors as outlined in the general specifications and design drawings;
- installation of grounding, bonding and shielding at each location to meet manufacturer's requirements;
- removal and replacement of electronic signage indicating to patrons guidance to unused parking stalls; and
- provide all electronics necessary to establish a network on MDOT MAA owned fiber.

This contract includes a provision authorizing an extension for a total period no longer than onethird of the base term on the original contract to spend funds remaining on the contract as provided in Board Advisory 1995-1.

The Scorecard enables GOC to monitor the performance and outcomes achieved by programs funded by the Children's Cabinet and administered by the local management boards. Scorecard currently in use by governments in Australia, the United Kingdom, New Zealand and throughout the United States in numerous states and counties; including all local jurisdictions in Maryland.

Pricing proposed for this contract represents static costs for the program in both product and services. Clear Impact has proposed fully loaded fixed price consultation rates and license prices which are the same as the prior contracts for FY2022. The fully loaded rates were increased for the second through fifth years of the contract. This is the first increase in rates since the GOCPYVS began using the Scorecard. The rates were compared to fully loaded rates used as part of DoIT's CATS+ contract and were determined to be fair and reasonable.

There are several factors that contributed to the retroactivity of this item. There were communication delays with the vendor due to their staffing/organizational changes and a cyberattack SHI experienced in July.

Initially SHI International Corporation sent a quote for one year, and when the State asked for a two year quote the pricing was deemed unreasonable. Also the manufacturer had system updates that resulted in changes to their SKUs (stock keeping units, similar to part numbers) which caused delays in providing quotes. There were also term negotiations and product clarifications that contributed to the delay.
