Remarks: *Conviction*. In 1991, the Baltimore City Circuit Court convicted Mr. Paul Madison of second degree murder, and use of a handgun in the death of a retail clerk in Baltimore's Cherry Hill neighborhood.

Release. Following an investigation, the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Conviction Integrity Unit found both new evidence that undercut the credibility of the sole witness against Mr. Madison, as well as that other such evidence known at the time was not properly disclosed to his defense. Mr. Madison was released in December 2021 after the Circuit Court granted the State's Attorney's Motion to Vacate his conviction.

Actual Innocence. In the hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings, the Petitioner and State's Attorney stipulated that "the parties agree that the Claimant is actually innocent of the murder," and the Attorney General took no position. In light of the corroborating evidence and testimony presented by the Petitioner, the Administrative Law Judge found the stipulations to be facts proven by clear and convincing evidence.

Compensation. The Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Madison was confined for 11,058 days, but that this should be offset by a separate, yet concurrent confinement for an unrelated conviction of 1,122 days, making for a compensable 9,936 days, (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$ 87,063, and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$2,370,034.08 in compensation.

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, "Based on the interests of the Claimant, including his time wrongfully incarcerated, his current significant financial need, his age, and his overall health..." the decision *In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Paul Madison, Claimant v. Board of Public Works* recommends an expedited payment schedule over approximately three years (the statutorily required payment of \$87,063 within 60 days of the decision; \$12,937.00 by December 31, 2022; \$567,508.52 by April 30, 2023, \$567,508.52 by July 31, 2023, \$567,508.52 by July 31, 2025).

Remarks (cont'd):

Attorney's Fees. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1), orders for compensation and benefits shall include reasonable attorney's fees and expenses associated with the action brought under this section. The decision *In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Paul Madison, Claimant v. Board of Public Works* ordered payment of attorney's fees in the amount of \$68,000.

The Department of Budget and Management has recommended the Board of Public Works pay ordered attorney's fees upon approval of the General Assembly of a deficiency appropriation into the FY 2023 Operating Budget.

As mitigation for the SAV impacts, MDE recommends that the licensee plant SAV seed in an approximately 36,378 square foot area. The SAV seeding is considered "in-kind" mitigation (i.e., creating new SAV to offset the impacted SAV) and is stipulated by regulation to occur at a ratio of 3:1 (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B). The proposed 36,378 square feet of SAV bed creation meets the mitigation requirement.

Mitigation: The replenishment and expansion of a stone revetment will result in permanent impacts to 16,515 square feet of shallow water habitat. MDE recommends mitigation by enhancement to nearby tidal wetlands by eradicating 46,850 square feet of *Phragmites* and wetland seeding (in the area of the eradicated *Phragmites*) of approximately 37,300 square feet. This mitigation is considered "out of kind" mitigation since the *Phragmites* eradication and wetland seeding will mitigate for loss of open water wetlands. BPW tidal wetlands regulations stipulate this occur at a ratio of 2:1 (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B). The 37,300 square foot wetland seeding exceeds the required mitigation amount of 33,030 square feet.

Remarks: This project is to design green infrastructure practices for a church-owned alley and courtyard to reduce strain on a community alley stormwater drain in the Remington neighborhood in Baltimore City. As well as to develop concept designs for reducing impervious surface behind row houses on the community alley and demonstrate how nature-based practices can enhance community resilience to urban flooding.

The Resiliency through Restoration Initiative (formerly Coastal Resiliency Program) was developed to address escalating risks to Maryland's coastal and inland communities and public resources from extreme weather and climate-related events. This Program implements on-theground natural and nature-based projects in priority areas where nature can help communities become more resilient to impacts from water. Targeting models, such as the Coastal Resiliency Assessment, identify areas where restoration can provide the greatest protection benefits for infrastructure, communities, businesses, and habitats. Datasets, such as impervious cover, highlight urban and inland areas where green infrastructure is needed to address more intense rain events. Projects will protect both public and private investments, while demonstrating a suite of nature-based projects that will enhance the ability of communities to respond to or recover from extreme hazards like storms and more frequent and intense rain events, or chronic hazards like nuisance flooding and sea level rise.

Remarks (cont'd):

DNR will provide technical assistance and grant funds to entities to design and construct living shoreline, marsh enhancement, green infrastructure, and nature-based projects. These projects will reduce the impacts of flooding on vulnerable communities across the state. DNR is seeking approval to award design funds for one green infrastructure project. After design, DNR will return to the Board for approval to award construction funds if warranted.

Remarks: The property, 307 Washington Avenue, is located north of the University's campus, immediately across the street from 401 Washington, which has been owned by the University since 2019. The property is also located within the Towson Row development in the heart of downtown Towson.

Towson University currently occupies certain space in the property pursuant to a lease agreement dated March 26, 2019. The 15-year lease term commenced on September 7, 2021. After execution of the lease, GGCAL Towson Row, as landlord, renovated the University's leased portion of the property to University's specifications, and the StarTUp, a Towson University Business and Economic Development Center, was opened in Fall 2021. They have not been updated and are supplied here for informational purposes because they do not account for the costs to address the environmental conditions at the property that MDOT MPA is agreeing to cost share with the Grantor as consideration under the Purchase and Sale Agreement.

Requesting Agency Remarks: MDOT MPA's primary objective in acquiring this property is to fortify the State of Maryland's Dredged Material Management Program (DMMP) by owning property upon which it can conduct large-scale innovative reuse of dredged material. Portions of the property not used for innovative reuse may be developed for other maritime or cargo-related uses. Innovative reuse of dredged material is a key component in securing the long-term success and sustainability of the Port of Baltimore. Currently under State law, dredged material removed from the Baltimore Harbor channels serving the Port of Baltimore may only be redeposited in contained areas known as dredged material containment facilities (DMCFs) approved by the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE). Innovative reuse seeks to utilize dredged material as a resource by incorporating the material in the development or manufacturing of

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commercial, industrial, horticultural, agricultural, or other products, thereby freeing up capacity for the placement of other dredged material generated by maintenance and new work dredging projects conducted by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the State of Maryland, and the private sector.

For the last several years, MDOT MPA has worked closely with MDE, and the Executive Committee created by the General Assembly to oversee the State's Dredged Material Management Program, to explore ways to develop innovative reuse of dredged material in Maryland. MDE considers dredged material a resource with a variety of potential applications, including fill, that can be used safely and, in a manner, protective of human health and the environment. In 2019, MDE published a Technical Guidance Document that describes the policies and procedures for reviewing proposed innovative reuse projects utilizing dredged material.

In November 2019, shortly after publication of MDE's Technical Guidance Document, MDOT MPA issued a Request for Proposals for Research and Development (R&D) of novel innovative reuse products and methods that meet the MDE's health and environmental screening criteria. Since then, six R&D contracts have been approved by the BPW and awarded for a variety of marketable end uses including such uses as permeable brick pavers, shoreline protection structures, engineered soil, and general concrete products. MDOT MPA is extremely encouraged by the private sector's strong interest in dredged material as a no-or-low-cost feedstock in already-established manufacturing processes and technologies, and in utilizing large volumes of dredged material to support safe, marketable products. To date, the results of these R&D contracts demonstrate dredged material can be innovatively reused in a variety of ways, and the next step to bringing these innovative reuses to the market is to competitively solicit innovative reuse contracts, site operations, and potential private-public partnerships. To do this MDOT MPA needs property to conduct these activities.

The property MDOT MPA seeks to acquire consists of 136.5 acres, of which 120 are developable for innovative reuse of dredged material and other maritime activities. The property is also located directly adjacent to MDOT MPA's Cox Creek Dredged Material Containment Facility representing a truly extraordinary opportunity for MDOT MPA. It is difficult to imagine a more logistically convenient and cost-effective location for development of innovative reuse. Currently, there are no other similar properties or alternative options with the same scale, location, and proximity to a dredged material containment facility to support development of innovative reuse.

Historically, the property MDOT MPA seeks to acquire was part of a larger parcel of land known as the Hawkins Point Plant Site that was used for the manufacturing and packaging of titanium dioxide. In 2009, the owner of the HP Plant Site ceased manufacturing operations, and today all the HP Plant Site buildings and manufacturing structures located on the property have been demolished. Nevertheless, this manufacturing process generated regulated hazardous waste and other environmental conditions at the property that are currently the subject of regulatory oversight and enforcement by MDE. Although MDOT MPA has not contributed to the environmental conditions at the property and is not a "responsible person" under Maryland law, as part of the purchase of the property, MDOT MPA has agreed, along with the Grantor, to address the environmental conditions at the property under a newly negotiated Administrative Consent Order among MDE, MPA, and Tronox Holdings, plc, Hawkins Point LLC's parent company (the "Remediation ACO").

MPA and Tronox Holdings, plc will perform the work required under the Remediation ACO pursuant to the terms of the Purchase and Sale Agreement that incorporates a Payment Agreement which establishes a cost allocation for remediation of 62% Tronox, 38% MPA. The estimated cost for remediation of the property is approximately \$75 million and would be performed over a 10-year period. The Payment Agreement also includes a Remediation Fund to budget for, receive, disperse, and account for funding of the remediation. Under the Payment Agreement, Tronox is obligated make annual payments to MPA that align with the remediation schedule set forth in the Remediation ACO. MDOT MPA's payment obligations are funded in the Consolidated Transportation Program, and that funding is currently programed into MDOT's 6-year Consolidated Transportation Plan. The Purchase and Sale Agreement also requires Tronox to provide MDOT MPA with an irrevocable standby Letter of Credit issued by a third-party bank that guarantees Tronox's 62% share of the remediation costs. The Letter of Credit will automatically be extended annually without amendment for the duration of the remediation.

Over time, the value of dredge material capacity created by acquiring this property for innovative reuse will far outweigh MDOT MPA's share of the cost to remediate the property which at 38% is approximately \$28.5 million over a 10-year period of remediation. Today, it costs MDOT MPA between \$20-\$25 per cubic yard of dredged material to manage the dredged material placed in MDOT MPA's dredged material containment facilities. Once the property is fully developed, MDOT MPA expects to recapture annually a minimum of 500,000 cubic yards of capacity from the Cox Creek DMCF which based on today's cost per cubic yard to manage would result in over a \$200 million savings to the State over a 20-year planning horizon. Moreover, large scale capacity

recovery will have the added benefits of 1) enhancing both public and private sector Port growth by providing additional capacity to accommodate *new work* material; and 2) ensuring there is adequate capacity for maintenance dredging moving beyond the current long-range 20-year plan.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This contract is for the construction of a maintenance building at MARC's Riverside railyard/maintenance facility located in Baltimore, Maryland, for MDOT MTA to perform heavy maintenance on MARC's locomotives and coaches.

The contractor provided preconstruction services for the design of MDOT MTA's RHMB, that mitigated risks, improved the construction schedule, streamlined the design process, improved the decision-making process, and developed a project that adheres to MDOT MTA's budget. This contract was later amended to cover the construction and construction management portion of the project once a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) was determined and agreed upon.

This modification to the Bid Package/GMP is for the reallocation of funding within the original contract authority to address unforeseen circumstances. The GMP items for the Construction Management at Risk (CMAR) and the Owner's Contingencies & Owner's Allowance were generated from the risk assessment at the time the GMP building contract amendment was developed. The project has progressed to the point where significant probable risk has been mitigated. It is in the best interest of the State to utilize the savings from the mitigated risk dollars in the CMAR Contingency for Beneficial use now, in lieu of the specified "at final completion", currently scheduled for early 2023.

Beneficial uses may include bridge crane spare parts, drop table spare parts, wheel truing machine spare parts, shop equipment (forklifts, scissor lifts, shop tools like drill presses), etc.

In addition, the Owners Allowance contains six items of work. Three of those items had substantial variances when compared to their estimated costs that resulted in an anticipated shortfall of \$866,515.76.

The CMAR Contingency was set at \$3,534,811.00. Upon final completion any savings in the CMAR Contingency is to be split with 60% to MDOT MTA and 40% to the Contractor. To provide an equitable accounting of the monies needed from the CMAR Contingency to cover the shortfall, the CMAR Contingency will be reduced by \$1.5 million with 60% coming back to MDOT MTA as \$900,000 and 40% being released to the Contractor as \$600,000. The remaining CMAR Contingency is \$2,034,811 to cover the remaining risks in the project, with any remaining at final completion to be shared 60/40. Total GMP dollar value is unchanged by this change order.

The modification includes the addition of GPS tracking from the I-ETMS Onboard equipment which will provide more accurate real-time and higher frequency data on the positioning of MARC trains. This will allow for more accurate mileage calculations, real-time monitoring of trains for operations, and will enhance the customer experience in tracking MARC service through mobile applications.

As a part of the overhaul, while the vehicle is disassembled, each vehicle is inspected to identify any hidden damage or issues that can be repaired during the overhaul process. To date, there has been a significantly larger number of hidden repairs than projected at the time of contract solicitation. Additional contract authority is necessary to complete these repairs. To date, the contractor has exceeded the DBE participation goal set with the original terms of the contract.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) contracts with InfoTech on behalf of MDOT TBUs to provide electronic bidding services at no cost to the MDOT but at a monthly subscription fee to the potential bidders on MDOT construction contracts, including roads, highways, and bridges; wetlands mitigation; and facilities maintenance contracts. COMAR 21.03.05.04 requires any State agency—or private contractor working for the State—charging fees for electronic procurement transactions to seek BPW approval to charge said fees. On December 21, 2016 (DOT Item 13-GM), the Board approved Infotech to assess electronic bidding fees for use of the BidX subscription service for a period not-to-exceed five years, beginning on January 1, 2017. Subsequently, the MDOT entered into a Service Agreement with Infotech, beginning on February 21, 2017, and ending on February 21, 2022. The agreement allowed for five additional, one-year renewals, the first of which was approved by the Department on February 18, 2022.

However, MDOT did not begin using BidX until July 1, 2017, and did not receive Board approval to assess fees after December 31, 2021. In addition, Infotech did not notify MDOT that they planned to increase fees on October 1, 2021; consequently, MDOT SHA did not present those increases to the Board before December 31, 2021.

Infotech and MDOT SHA have identified 167 bidding users who hold only MDOT-approved requests to bid and who have no requests to bid approved by other agencies. These 167 affected bidders used the Bid Express service to bid exclusively on MDOT projects. Infotech is issuing a communication to the affected users and will subsequently refund an amount equal to the impact of its fee increases to Basic Service and Internet Bidding Service on the affected bidders for a 12-month period (October 2021 through September 2022). Infotech is further proactively crediting an amount equal to the impact of its fee increases for a one-month period (October 2022) to address the impact on affected bidders while approval of the fee increase is pending before the Board. Total increased fees for the 167 BidX users for this 13-month period amount to \$21,710.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

BidX requires a fee for potential bidders only. Subcontractors (MBE, DBE, SBE), suppliers and vendors who do not plan on bidding on contracts have limited access to BidX, free of charge, to search contract lettings, contract numbers, and descriptions. All projects solicited through BidX are posted on eMaryland Marketplace (eMMA). MDOT SHA has received construction bids exclusively online since July 2017, and MDOT MdTA since January 2020.

BidX does include two additional services that are not be needed by Maryland bidders: the Online Plan Sheet service, not needed since plans are available for free on BidX without a subscription; and the Bid Express Analysis Suite, not needed because MDOT TBU's using BidX publish their bid tabs and historic bid item prices on their web sites.

Below is a snapshot of the BidX user community:

- Total # of Basic Account holders (nationally): 9,200
- Total # of proposals received by MDOT: 952
- Total # of bids received by MDOT: 4,416
- Total # of unique vendors (as of 06/27/22): 302

The benefits of continued use of BidX for electronic bidding include:

- BidX used in 39 states, five of which use it across multiple agencies.
- BidX is fully integrated with AASHTOWare, a suite of software modules, developed by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) and designed to support state construction programs. MDOT uses AASHTOWare to produce files that get uploaded to BidX to advertise the bid.
- During the advertisement phase, MDOT can download plan holders into AASHTOWare. After the bid is opened, the Department downloads each bid to the lineitem level and imports that data into AASHTOWare, where it forms the basis of the bid justification. Switching construction bid letting to eMMA would require entering all data manually, since eMMA does not interface with AASHTOWare.
- Bid packages are validated for affirmations and identifies the missing documentation. It notifies bidders prior to submitting the bid about errors and incomplete elements, reducing mistakes. This will reduce SHA efforts to manually check for missing affirmations and missing addenda, decreasing the post bid-opening processing time.

Small businesses have a dedicated region in which to interact online with prime contractors, providing a greater opportunity for them to be included in bids, developing more resources for MDOT contracts, increasing competition.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has a program that allows Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) to submit for full reimbursements for the fees they may incur in using online bidding resources.

A notice of availability of an Invitation for Bids (IFB) was posted on eMaryland Marketplace on June 1, 2022, and 16 responses were received, 14 bids were rejected. Three bids were rejected because the bidders did not provide any MBE documentation. Five bids were rejected because bidders failed to provide good faith evidence to meet the MBE goal. Six bids were rejected because the bidders did not provide Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendment Certification or provide the required references for experience in providing COVID testing, treatment, and vaccinations. MDH did not determine which region bids were submitted for until after they were evaluated. Two bids were deemed reasonably susceptible for being selected for award, one for region 3 and region 5.

MDH has determined the prices to be fair and reasonable based on an analysis completed by the Berkeley Research Group (BRG), a healthcare consulting firm retained by MDH to provide advisory services related to COVID patient surge in hospitals. BRG estimated the incremental operating expenses (labor, supplies, and overhead) related to an increased number of patients seeking vaccination, testing and/or therapeutic treatment. The estimated incremental operating expenses were done based on the two COVID wave scenarios ("Moderate" and "Heightened)." The IFB modified the not to exceed amount (NTE) for each of the two waves to \$300,000 for the Moderate Wave and \$450,000 for the Heightened Wave.

MDH intends to return to the BPW for approval to award regions 1 (Allegany and Garrett Counties), 2 (Washington and Frederick Counties), and 4 (Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot Counties) later this year.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland State Employees and Retirees Benefits Program is responsible for administering health care and other related benefits programs for State employees and retirees, satellite agencies, Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) continuation of coverage participants and contractual employees. Agency Remarks (cont'd):

DHCD had originally attempted to provide a device subsidy by working with Internet Service Providers participating in the federal Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) device subsidy program. That program provides a \$150 device subsidy for eligible households and DHCD would have provided an additional \$50 to allow the purchase of a better device. DHCD found that no internet service providers serving Maryland were participating in this federal program. DHCD determined that leveraging the State's buying power by purchasing devices directly from a qualifying vendor, and then partnering with local governments and community institutions for distribution would be the simplest and most cost-effective method of meeting its goal.

Eligibility will be extended to individuals or households with income less than or equal to 200% of federal poverty level or verified participation in certain government assistance programs such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit.

DHCD sent direct notification of the solicitation to six prospective bidders and advertised it on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage April 4, 2022. Six bids were received and opened on May 19, 2022. One bid was rejected because on closer review, the product they offered did not meet minimum requirements, and they didn't provide any alternative.

One bidder filed a protest on June 8, 2022, challenging the proposed products by the recommended awardee didn't meet the minimum requirements and they would not be able to provide qualified products as claimed. On July 11, 2022, DHCD issued a determination sustaining the protest because the product it was offering to fulfill the contract was unacceptable due to a lack of Google support and Electronic Product Environment Assessment Tool (EPEAT) certification, an ecolabel managed by the Green Electronics Council.

On July 15, 2022, the former recommended awardee filed a protest requesting a reversal of the July 11,2022 determination. The bidder contended that it had secured a deal with a different computer manufacturer to provide a different product that met the solicitation's specifications. On July 26, 2022, DHCD issued a determination sustaining its July 11, 20222 determination because the contractor had provided no letter of authorization from the new manufacturer at the time of its bid, as required by the solicitation minimum qualifications, and granting further opportunity for the contractor to materially alter its bid months after bid opening would have been a violation of COMAR and unfair to other bidders. No appeal has been filed with the Board of State Contract Appeals. This contract will potentially provide or improve meaningful internet access to an estimated 150,000 Maryland households.
