Description: The Project involves the acquisition and rehabilitation of 182-unit age-restricted apartment communities at two sites in Glen Burnie and Odenton, Anne Arundel County. This Project will offer a mix of affordable efficiencies, one- and two-bedroom floorplans targeting low-income households earning up to 60 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI). The Project is sponsored by Housing Commission of Anne Arundel County.

The project demonstrates compliance with the latest version of the Building and Energy Code and the accessibility code adopted by the Maryland Codes Administration into the Maryland Building Performance Standards (MBPS).

The "Heritage Homes" Project fully integrated/meets all standard Community Development Administration "Green" and "Sustainable" features:

- The project follows Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) 2011 Standards for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control during construction.
- Landscaping of the project will utilize at least 50% native plantings. Existing and new trees will be protected during construction.
- The project will implement the construction waste recycling plan.
- The project uses all the following Interior Air Quality criteria: Green Label carpeting and low toxic, low volatile organic compound (VOC) paint, primer, sealers, and adhesives.
- New HVAC is Energy Star-certified. Also, there will be no use of CFC (chlorofluorocarbons) refrigerant.
- The post-construction of the project includes Recycling Plan for tenants.
- All the project water fixtures and faucets are to conserve water.
- The project has a non-smoking policy for all interior spaces.
- All appliances will be Energy Star qualified.
- All windows will be Energy Star qualified.
- The project will use 20% less energy than before the renovation.

Remarks: Between 1997 and 2003, DHCD provided loans to separate affiliates of Bon Secours Hospital, which provided a total of 117 units of affordable rental housing in a distressed neighborhood in west Baltimore City. The development of all four projects was spearheaded by Unity Properties, Inc., a non-profit affiliate of Bon Secours Hospital dedicated to producing quality affordable rental housing in close proximity to the hospital. The four projects resulted from the rehab of spacious rowhomes, and their conversion into multiple dwelling units. All four RHPP loans bear an interest rate of 4 percent or below, have terms of 40 years, and are payable from surplus cash available after the projects have paid their operating expenses and superior debt service.

As you can see from the current principal balances of the loans, and the considerable amount of interest that has accrued on all four, the projects have struggled to meet their debt service requirements. This failure is largely attributable to the fact that the projects were serving a very low income population without a rental subsidy. As a result, the projects were generating only enough income to meet their operating expenses. While the Department was able to modify the income restrictions in order to stabilize the projects, they are still in need of additional capital in order to finance rehabilitation and improvements to provide safe and decent housing for the low-income residents of Baltimore City residing in the projects.

As the projects approach and enter the second decade of their post-rehab lives, they are in need of another extensive rehab. In order to accomplish these rehabs, they will require another allocation of Low Income Housing Tax Credits ("LIHTCs"). However, under the Internal Revenue Service guidelines governing LIHTCs, it is impossible to provide the projects these LIHTCs given the size of their current debt service loads. This is the reason that the recommendation is being made for the release of their obligation to pay the accrued interest.

If the recommendation is approved, it will not affect the borrowers' obligation to fully repay the original principal balances of their Rental Housing Production Program loans. In addition, the release of the accrued interest is contingent upon the City of Baltimore agreeing to release the borrowers from their obligations to repay a similar amount of interest that have accrued on the HOME Investment Partnerships Program ("HOME") loans that they made to the borrowers.

The release of this interest payment obligation is essential to the completion of the desperately needed rehabilitation of the properties, and the preservation of 117 units of affordable housing in a neighborhood that badly needs them. It is anticipated that the rehab of the projects will result in reduced operating costs, thereby improving their ability to service their remaining debt.

Remarks (cont'd):

The Board of Public Works approved a forgiveness of accrued interest in the amount of \$2,100,236 on the Rental Housing Production Program loans in 2020 (Secretary's Agenda, Item 10 [12/2/2020]) with the expectation that closing on the consolidation, refinance and resyndication of the projects was imminent. However, closing delays for the Bon Secours project included financing gaps, staff changes with the development team, and getting the 117 leasehold townhouse units to fee simple status. Because the refinance has not closed, the Department has not yet forgiven any of the interest previously approved for forgiveness by the BPW.

The Department is seeking additional forgiveness of \$268,188.94 beyond the \$2,100,236.00 that was approved in December 2020 – for a total of \$2,368,424.94 in forgiven interest (including \$1,139,611.22 in interest that was capitalized to principal on the Bon Secours Apartments III loan), through March 10, 2023. The Department further requests that future interest accruing through closing on the consolidation, refinance and resyndication, which is expected to take place in the coming months, be forgiven.

The RHPP loans finance rental housing occupied by households with incomes between 30% and 60% of the Area Median Income.

Description: This Project currently operates as a group home for individuals with mental disabilities who are aging in place. The Project is located at: 502 Evesham Avenue, which has seven beds, 512 Harwood Avenue, which has seven beds, and 424 Winston Avenue, which has six beds, for a total twenty beds for special needs housing in Baltimore City. This Project has been operating as a group home since 1988.

This project includes twenty beds, three kitchens, and staff offices. In the community, these houses are located within a two-mile radius of one another. Modifications to the sites and buildings include compliance with 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design, incorporating prescriptive energy measures, updating kitchens and bathrooms, and updating general finishes throughout.

Description (cont'd):

Below is a list of upgrades and the new scope of work planned for the three buildings: The sites' scope of work includes razing entire porch structures, including enclosed spaces; reframing porches; securing foundation systems; installing all new ductwork, plumbing supply and waste/vent lines, new sprinkler lines, rebuilding, reframing, and insulation, drywall; rewiring of electric; sprinkler and plumbing modifications; replacing exterior concrete work; and improving water systems. Upon completion of rehabilitation, the Project will be in code compliance with the City of Baltimore.

The Maryland Department of Planning reviewed and approved the Project for consistency with Economic Growth, Resource Protection, and Planning on March 23, 2023.

Pursuant to Maryland's commitment to reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions, energy saving, conserving water resources, and enhancing Maryland's environment, the Project includes the following:

- 1. Mechanical systems will be high efficiency units with programmable thermostats.
- 2. All appliances will be Energy Star qualified.
- 3. All windows will be Energy Star qualified.
- 4. All faucets and bath fixtures will use water sense labeled products.

There are no Recognized Environmental Concerns requiring remediation on this project.

Over the past few years, numerous repairs had to be made on both the steam and the condensate lines, causing un-timely and lengthy interruptions with the heat supply to the entire Academic Quad and North Campus.

As design progressed and design information became available, the contractor sequentially and competitively bid this construction package. This is the first of three bid packages. This bid package is for the site mobilization and early purchase of long lead items which minimizes the escalation risk to the budget and mitigates supply chain/delivery risks to the schedule. Equipment purchased will be reassigned to mechanical and electrical contractors as part of the base building bid package for the receipt and handling, installation, start-up and testing and warranty coverage. This bid package has an MBE participation of 5.7%. The MBE Compliance is 0% since only pre-construction services has been awarded and is performed by the CM firm to date. The procurement of this project was originally delegated to UMBC but with the vacancy of key procurement position, the contracts for this project will return to the UMB Service Center.

Sustainability: In accordance with the Maryland High Performance Building Standards, UMBC maintains U.S. Green Building Council LEED Silver Certification as a minimum target for new building construction.

The new mechanical and electrical equipment, included in this early release package, contributes to an overall high performance building design that will exceed current energy efficiency codes, provide a healthier/safer building for occupants, provide systems reliability, and reduce operating costs. Efficiencies in building envelope, mechanical systems, and lighting design will contribute to the goal of reducing the building's energy use intensity (EUI). Efficient mechanical and lighting systems will also contribute to an anticipated energy savings of 30% over the LEED baseline. Upon completion of the project, the commissioning of this equipment and associated systems, along with energy metering, will help ensure operational efficiencies are maintained throughout the lifetime of the building.

The selected HVAC air handling units not only help achieve LEED credits for energy savings, but also help to optimize LEED credits for Indoor Air Quality as well. High grade air filters are specified in all air handling units serving offices, classrooms, and conference rooms, with carbon dioxide sensors provided in high-occupancy areas. Each air handling unit is also provided with Ultraviolet Germicidal Irradiation (UVGI) devices that render microorganisms and virus cells no longer infectious.

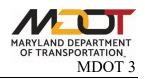

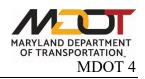

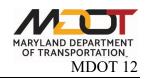

As a result, the previously allocated funding has been depleted ahead of the contract expiration.

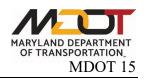

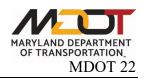

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) and the Commission's website. on November 9, 2022. A total of 56 potential contractors were solicited beforehand, 16 expressed interest in the solicitation. Seven were solicited via eMMA, and nine were directly solicited. Two vendors were MBEs, and one vendor was an SBE. Two offers were received, and both were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The recommended offeror The Brattle Group, Inc was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and was lowest in price.

The analysis of the current gas and electric system and the understanding of the challenges of a transition to an energy system with a much higher electrification, central to this study, requires significant background work and research in order to develop a meaningful planning study. The Brattle Group, Inc. possesses specialized expertise needed and its proposed key personnel possess the necessary academic credentials and experience as expert researchers.

SB528 requires Maryland to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas levels (GHG) by 2045, versus the prior standard which called for the state to reduce GHG emissions by 90% versus 2006 levels by 2050. The State is to reduce GHG emissions by 60% from 2006 levels by 2031; the law had previously called for a 40% reduction from 2006 levels by 2030. Regarding energy conservation, in per capita peak demand of electricity consumed in each utility's respective service territory using 2016 as the base year, SB528 calls for incremental reductions of 2% for the years 2022 through 2024; 2.25% for 2025 and 2026; and 2.5% in 2027 and each year thereafter. Additionally Senate Bill 65 passed in 2021 expands Maryland's target to require 52.5% of electricity sold in the State by 2030 and after to come from renewable resources, including 14.5% solar required from in State resources.

SocialServe now hosts proprietary data on landlords offering affordable housing, and the system combines an interdependent, online database and referral center, disallowing for the segmentation of services. Additionally, SocialServe fulfills the Department's requirement to encourage participation by owners of suitable units located outside areas of low income or minority concentration. Local housing agencies in the Baltimore region have engaged with DHCD to make www.MdHousingSearch.org an effective clearinghouse and affirmative fair housing marketing tool, including accessible housing. The State of Maryland has a compelling interest in creating fair and open access to affordable housing and promoting compliance with the State and Federal civil rights obligations. Fair housing requirements apply to the full spectrum of housing activities. Emphasys Computer Solutions, Inc. is the sole vendor capable of providing necessary services without interruption and re-creation of another system.

The Department has reviewed the proposal from Emphasys. The contract includes an option to continue the contract for an additional two years over the previous contract term, at an additional cost of \$315.326. The costs for the first three years of the contract will increase over the previous three year contract by approximately 21%. Much of this price difference is attributable to the nationwide inflation experienced in the period of 2021, 2022 and potentially 2023. Emphasys continually iterates and improves upon its technology to provide ease and customer support. Therefore, the Department determined the pricing from Emphasys for affordable rental housing online information and telephone referral services to be fair and reasonable.

Requesting Agency Remarks: In December 2021, DHCD launched the ARPA-funded Homeownership Assistance Fund to provide financial assistance to Maryland homeowners at risk of displacement due to the pandemic. The program specifically provides assistance with delinquent mortgage payments, as well as other housing-related costs (property taxes, water bills, HOA fees, etc.). It also provides funding for home repairs that could otherwise displace the homeowner.

In light of the emergency nature of the original procurement, DHCD did not set an MBE participation for this contract.

The decision to conduct an emergency procurement was done so that the State of Maryland could have a program launched in time to respond to foreclosure filings that would begin because of the moratorium and subsequent policy changes at Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. It was predicted that most servicers would begin foreclosure proceedings in January 2022. To date, DHCD has successfully helped over 5,300 homeowners who were at risk of displacement and have another 5,000 in various stages. DHCD works closely with housing counseling agencies, legal services, and the MD Dept. of Labor and Dept. of Assessments and Taxation (the State Tax Sale Ombudsman) to do outreach efforts to anyone in Maryland facing foreclosure.

DHCD launched the program amid continuing changes from the US Treasury. In addition, there have been dramatic shifts in the interest rate environment and the mortgage servicing industry, requiring DHCD to shift ways to help homeowners, creating new assistance methods and accompanying operating procedures. Due to these external factors, DHCD works daily with the vendor on application processing and management, but the workload is dramatically different than what either party anticipated. The costs to process and finalize applications are significantly higher due to the number of hours it takes to complete an application review, and the amount of time spent working with mortgage servicers.

To ensure continuation of the program without interruption, the modification to the contract must be implemented immediately.

Requesting Agency Remarks: In seeking guidance from the Office of the Attorney General to exercise the two, one year renewal options it was determined by legal counsel that the existing ICPA with SHI International Corporation was not valid as neither the State nor SHI International Corporation are able to locate a Participating Addendum (PA) signed by all parties (DGS-OSP, SHI International Corporation, and the City of Mesa). Unfortunately, the PA contained language that was crucial to the parties' agreement. Neither party is able to confirm whether a copy of the BPO which the parties incorporated by reference into the agreement was issued to SHI International Corporation. Given these issues and the language contained in the PA, the Office of the Attorney General does not believe the parties hold a valid agreement for the licenses.

DGS-OSP has also identified an issue in ADPICS where releases issued against this Statewide contract were not routed to OSP for approval. This issue caused the BPO to become overspent without OSP's approval or awareness. OSP has made changes to ensure that future releases from this BPO will route for the correct approvals. Moving forward, OSP will approve and track releases against the BPO to ensure this does not reoccur.

As a result, DGS-OSP has created a new agreement that will allow DGS to leverage the OMNIA Master Contract which has also been presented on the April 19, 2023 agenda for BPW consideration of approval. The term of the State's new ICPA agreement with SHI International Corporation will run from April 20, 2023 through February 28, 2025. This new ICPA will replace DGS's existing ICPA for Microsoft Licensing Packages (which expired on February 28, 2023). Microsoft licensing is currently being used by State agencies; therefore, it is crucial that DGS-OSP put in place a contract to avoid any uninterrupted flow of services to the using agencies.

An MBE participation was not established for this contract because this contract is for the purchase of software licenses and software license renewals. There are no services provided under this contract, therefore no subcontracting opportunities exist.

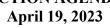

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Department of General Services (DGS) is requesting approval for the State's participation in an Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement (ICPA) competitively procured by the State of Arizona. DGS OSP intends to use OMNIA Partner's Master Contract, awarded to SHI International Corporation (SHI), as Master Contractor via a competitively bid/proposal process to purchase Microsoft Licensing Packages on behalf of the State of Maryland. This ICPA will replace DGS's existing agreement with SHI under the same Master Contract. Microsoft licensing is currently being used by State agencies; therefore, it is crucial that DGS put in place a contract to avoid any uninterrupted flow of services to the using agencies.

DGS intends to continue leveraging the nation's largest and most experienced cooperative purchasing organization for the public sector. DGS will be responsible for managing the contract on behalf of all State agencies and it shall be administered via a Work Order process which will allow each agency to tailor a specific Statement of Work (SOW) for each task or product.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

OMNIA Partners is the nation's largest and most experienced cooperative purchasing organization for the public sector. Additionally, all contracts available through OMNIA Partners are competitively solicited and publicly awarded by a lead agency, using a competitive solicitation process consistent with applicable procurement laws and regulations.

The resulting services from this ICPA would allow the State to continue to easily purchase Microsoft Licensing Packages. It will also reduce the procurement process cycle time and maximize cost avoidance to the using state agencies. Other key benefits resulting from this competitively, and successfully negotiated, contract by the City of Mesa includes a wide variety of technology solutions broken down by category, including but not limited to systems, input/output devices, memory, storage devices, network equipment, software, media supplies, collaboration & IP telephony, and other related products and services. Through the City of Mesa, with overall project oversight from OMNIA Partners, 11 proposals were received and evaluated by an evaluation committee, using the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFP. SHI International Corporation was awarded the contract upon successful completion of negotiations.

The pricing had been determined to be fair and reasonable. DGS compared multiple line items of SHI International Corporation's price list for the current ICPA against their pricing available on the General Services Administration's (GSA), multiple award schedule price list. Two line items for the same requested software offered under both contracts were compared and it was determined the prices were lower in both instances.

An MBE participation was not established for this contract because this contract is for the purchase of software licenses and software license renewals. There are no services provided under this contract, therefore no subcontracting opportunities exist.

SHI's contract with Microsoft is an Azure consumption-based contract. SHI receives its invoices from Microsoft based upon the calculated consumption of agency users, and subsequently submits invoices to those agency users for its consumption-based amounts as identified by Microsoft. The retroactive amount of \$411,548.90, deemed necessary to avoid an interruption in services to state agencies, represents the Azure consumption-based spend for the first 3 months of 2023 (approximately \$300,000) and a single agency expenditure (\$111,548.90).
