Model Liquidated Damages Policy

"On or before January 1, 2024, the Board [of Public Works], in

consultation with the Procurement Improvement Council, shall publish a model policy concerning the inclusion and use of liquidated damages

provisions in procurement contracts."

Remarks: As passed in the Spring, Chapter 206 (Laws of Maryland 2023) requires certain procurement units to adopt policies concerning the inclusion and use of liquidated damages provisions in procurement contracts that are substantially similar to a model policy to be published by the Board. That model policy is in turn required to address certain elements. In early September, an initial draft model policy meeting those requirements was circulated to an interagency workgroup consisting of the Departments of Budget and Management, General Services, Health, Information Technology, and Transportation; as well as representatives of the Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs, the Office of the Attorney General, and the University System of Maryland. After several meetings and amendments, that group reached consensus on a draft model policy. In turn that workgroup draft was provided to DGS for circulation among members of the PIC for review and comment. No comments were received. Accordingly, this draft is the model policy that would be published upon approval of this item.

Mitigation: Constructing a kayak launch will result in impacts to 420 square feet of vegetated tidal wetlands. MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the 420 square feet of impact to vegetated tidal wetlands at a 2:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) in-kind by restoring 260 square feet of degraded low marsh with sand fill and *Spartina alterniflora* plantings and out of kind at a 4:1 ratio by removing 1,160 square feet of *Phragmites*.

130 square feet of impact x 2 (2:1 ratio) = 260 square feet of required mitigation 290 square feet of impact x 4 (4:1 ratio) = 1,160 square feet of required mitigation

Requesting Remarks: The College is requesting approval to award a sole source contract to the International Rescue Committee (IRC). The Maryland Department of Human Services' Office for Refugees and Asylees (MORA) awarded Baltimore City Community College both Refugee School Impact Grant (RSIG) and Services for Older Refugees (SOR) Grant funding to help support the College's Refugee Projects. Moreover, under these grant agreements with the Department of Human Services, the College can only award to companies that are specifically listed in the grant's appendix; since all consultants and their work plans had to be pre-approved to receive grant funding. The IRC, the refugee resettlement agency for Baltimore, is a pre-approved vendor under both grants listed. The vendor is uniquely equipped to offer resources, wraparound services, barrier removal, and support for both students and their families.

In accordance with the State's Finance and Procurement Article, Section 14-302, IRC is a non-profit organization; therefore, exempt from assigning an MBE goal to this contract.

This contract was approved by the College's Board of Trustees on November 15, 2023.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Section 34 of Chapter 101 of 2023 (Budget Bill for FY 2024) authorizes the Board of Public Works to create positions that are supported entirely by funds from federal or other non–State sources, provided that the positions are abolished if the funding source is eliminated. The following new positions supported with Pittman-Robertson Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration federal funds are requested to be created.

Chapter 543 of 2023 established a Wildlife Conservation, Education, and Outreach Program within the Department of Natural Resources. The purpose of the program is to foster appreciation for outdoor recreation and wildlife conservation including regulated hunting. The program will include special focus on veterans and communities that typically have not had access to wildlife conservation and hunting opportunities.



10. **DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES** (cont'd)

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

In order to staff the newly-created conservation program, Chapter 543 of 2023 also adjusted State hunting license fees and specified that if the adjustment resulted in an increase in federal funds for the department, that part of the funding shall be used to hire eight employees. As a result of the fee adjustment, the department will be eligible to receive a minimum increase of at least \$3 million in federal funds from the Pittman-Robertson Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act. This grant program provides \$3 in matching federal funds to every \$1 generated stateside by the sale of hunting licenses. This program has been in existence since the 1930s and has long been used by all state natural resource agencies, including Maryland, for wildlife conservation and management. These federal funds will be used for the eight new conservation program employees.

The department has allotted one Program Manager IV position, two Natural Resources Biologist II positions, and five Natural Resources Biologist I positions. These positions will be integrated with a small number of existing staff who do similar outreach work for the unit. It is expected that these employees will engage the public with a wide range of newly created information and education programs. These staff will also address the unfortunate trend of decreasing hunter numbers in Maryland through the department's R3 program. R3 (hunter recruitment, retention, and reactivation) is an important program found in most states and addresses declining hunter numbers. The national trend in the decline of hunters is a serious concern since these individuals largely fund wildlife conservation through the purchase of a hunting license and they are essential for the management of species like white-tailed deer. These eight positions will be essential to expanding this program.

DBM Remarks: The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management has certified that funds are available for the new positions for which approval is requested.

Remarks: The Perkins Homes Development is being developed in phases as part of the FY 2017 Choice Neighborhood Implementation Grant entered into between the Housing Authority of Baltimore City, the City of Baltimore, and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Community Development Administration, a unit of the Division of Development Finance of the Department of Housing and Community Development, a principal department of the State of Maryland ("CDA"), has provided financing to assist in the acquisition and construction of Perkins Homes Phase I, Perkins Homes Phase IIA, and Perkins Homes Phase IIB, which, when completed, will be affordable housing projects in Baltimore City. The CDA financing is secured by deed of trust liens on these properties. CDA intends to provide financing to assist in the acquisition and new construction of Perkins Homes Phase III, a 152-unit affordable housing project in Baltimore City. The remaining phases of the Perkins Homes Development -- Phase IV and Phase V -- have not yet begun development.

The owner of Perkins Homes Phase I will grant an easement for the use of and access to a management office and community space by the residents, guests, invitees, licensees and guests of the other phases of the Perkins Homes Development. The owner of Perkins Homes Phase IIA will grant an easement for the use of and access to community space by the residents, guests, invitees, licensees and guests of the other phases of the Perkins Homes Development. The management office space that will be subject to the use easement is approximately 3,187 square feet. The community space that will be subject to the use easement consists of approximately 2,704 square feet of multipurpose meeting rooms and storage and 1,166 square feet of gym facilities located on Perkins Homes Phase I and approximately 2,100 square feet of multipurpose meeting rooms and storage located on Perkins Homes Phase IIA. One of the uses of the

community space will be as a place for service providers to provide services to residents. The access easement will consist of a non-exclusive easement for pedestrian and vehicular ingress, egress, and passageway in, through, over, and across Perkins Homes Phase I and Perkins Homes Phase IIA to access the community management office and community space. The access easement will be located along and within common driveways, thoroughfares, corridors, roadways, sidewalks, and pathways constructed for pedestrian and vehicular use.

- 2. A state-recognized RESNEC consultant, Pando Alliance, will perform testing for the air sealing and insulation scope of work.
- 3. All windows will be Energy Star rated with double and triple panes of glass.
- 4. All faucets and bath fixtures will use 'Water Sense' labeled products.
- 5. All appliances, including refrigerators, ranges, and bath exhaust fans, will be Energy Star rated.
- 6. All floorings will be made of quality and durable materials.
- 7. All cabinetry will be made of durable hardwood.
- 8. Energy Star-rated lighting fixtures will be installed in all units and common areas.
- 9. The mechanical systems are designed to be highly rated efficiency 12.0 EER with programmable thermostats, as well as insulated plumbing pipes.

At JFK Apartments, there are no Recognized Environmental Conditions (RECs) requiring remediation on the project. However; ACM materials were observed during a comprehensive pre-renovation asbestos survey of the site structure. The developer agreed to allow OSHA-regulated methods to provide an O&M Program for the project.

This design capacity is a consolidation of the existing 0.38 MGD Hancock WWTP and the existing 0.15 MGD Lanco WWTP, which will eliminate the discharge point at the Lanco Facility. Upon completion of the upgrades, the plant will discharge effluent with an annual average Total Nitrogen goal of 3.0 mg/l and Total Phosphorus goal of 0.3 mg/l which will reduce nutrients to Tonoloway Creek and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay. This project will be constructed in accordance with coastal and non-coastal resiliency guidelines developed as part of the Coast Smart Program to reduce climate change risks to such projects.

Two technical proposals were received and evaluated by the evaluation committee. Both firms scored above the minimum technical score of 80%. After this evaluation, prices were opened. However, due to a lack of clarity, a scope review was deemed necessary to gain a better understanding of the submitted costs and confirm each contractor's understanding of the project scope. After the review, both firms submitted their best and final offers, with Pipeway providing the best price.

The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will manage the project with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

Starting on September 26, 2023, Gilbane advertised the project for trade contractor participation in the following publications/services: eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, Maryland Stadium Authority website, Maryland Washington Minorities Companies Association, and via direct solicitation. An MBE outreach event was previously conducted by Gilbane and a pre-bid site walkthrough was held at M&T Bank Stadium. Attendees were provided with summary project information.

Gilbane advertised for bids on construction packages for concrete, masonry, millwork, rough carpentry, fire proofing, roofing, drywall / acoustical ceilings, carpet and resilient flooring, tile, painting and wallcovering, conveying equipment, fire protection, electrical, tele/data and safety/security, micro piles, and earthwork/excavation. Competitive bids were received between October 20th and November 10th on various due dates by representatives from Gilbane.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on October 24, 2023 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and Gilbane and MSA representatives were in attendance.

Gilbane submitted GMP #3 Package on November 27, 2023.

Future GMP Package(s) will be presented to the Board of Public Works for approval.

The overall MBE participation goal for the construction phase of this project was set at 35% with sub-goals of 8% African American-owned and 11% Women-owned. The MBE goal for this project is a total goal inclusive of all GMPs. There are no GMP specific goals. This is the third of several anticipated GMPs. Gilbane has demonstrated the good faith effort required to satisfy the goals of the MBE program and remains committed to meeting the MBE participation goals established for the Project.

Remarks: Conviction & Release. On April 19, 1993, following a bench trial, Mr. Jones was convicted by the Wicomico County Circuit Court of assault with intent to rape, attempted rape, assault, and battery for a 1992 attack on a woman in an alleyway in Salisbury, Maryland. Mr. Jones was released on parole on December 11, 1996.

Reinvestigation. In 2022, during the reinvestigation of another case, the State of Maryland discovered evidence that led the State to the conclusion that neither that conviction nor Mr. Jones' conviction was supported by credible evidence. As a result, the State of Maryland moved to vacate Mr. Jones' conviction, and after that motion was granted by the Court on August 1, 2023, the State entered a *nolle prosequi* on the charges.

Actual Innocence. Considering the evidence uncovered by the reinvestigation, the affirmative evidence of the Claimant's innocence, and the absence of any credible evidence implicating him, the parties agreed before the Administrative Law Judge that the Claimant is actually innocent of the crimes; and further, agreed that Mr. Jones was eligible for relief under the Act.

Eligibility. Per SFP §10-501(c)(2), an individual who had been "released from confinement before July 1, 2021," is to file a request for compensation under the Act before June 30, 2023. While Mr. Jones was released on parole in 1996, his conviction was not vacated until 2023. Counsel for both the State's Attorney for Wicomico County and the Attorney General stipulated that Mr. Jones was eligible for relief; and the State's Attorney filed a memorandum supporting their position that Mr. Jones was eligible, and that barring him from relief based on his parole prior to exoneration was an absurd result inconsistent with the legislative intent of the Act.

Compensation. In its decision, the Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Jones was confined for 1,333 days, (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$ 94,991.00, and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$ 346,913.25 in compensation.

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, the decision In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Grant Jones, Claimant v. Board of Public Works recommends an expedited payment schedule of a single lump sum, in light of Mr. Jones' exceedingly frail health and poor prognosis. The Department of Budget & Management has reviewed this recommendation and indicated it can be met with the funding sources as noted above.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: The William Donald Schaefer Tower (WDST), located at 6 St. Paul Street in Baltimore, houses several state agencies, including the Office of the Governor, that provide services to the greater Baltimore region. The building has numerous critical deficiencies that include systemic mechanical issues, all of which are in the critical failure stage of life expectancy. Currently, the State has spent numerous resources to deliver maintenance solutions for the facility, which have only provided temporary relief of the outstanding mechanical issues.

Remarks (cont'd):

Specific critical failure includes the two (2) three-story-tall air coolers that are located on the 23rd floor of the building. The system is currently operating with repairs and patches holding the structured integrity together. Continuous repair of this system has culminated to the point where repair is no longer feasible and catastrophic failure is imminent. The air coolers are the heart of the mechanical HVAC of the building and are required to run year-round to maintain heating and cooling in the building. Once the coolers fail, the building can no longer be occupied and will need to close to complete replacement of the entire system.

Additionally, the structural integrity of the underground garage was found to be in dire need of repair design with serious potential for further decline of the structure causing potential occupant hazards. Due to the speed at which this project needs to be completed it is essential that the design team can start work immediately without any delay due to contracting or initial study of the building. Delays will be catastrophic to the operational needs of the building and would cause the building to have to close without occupation.

DGS has brought in consultants to look at the feasibility of providing emergency HVAC in the event of a failure and found that a solution would not be feasible due to how the HVAC system in the building is designed. The Department of General Services, with the support from Murphy & Dittenhafer Architects, conducted a Part I & II Program Study of the WDST. After careful review of both the building assessment and Part I & II Program Study, the Department of General Services along with The Department of Budget Management has determined that a full comprehensive mechanical renovation of the WDST building is the recommended solution.

Basis for Selection: There is currently only one design firm available that has the required knowledge and background of WDST: Murphy and Dittenhafer Architects. Murphy and Dittenhafer Architects concluded the Program Study of the WDST in February of 2023. As part of the published study, immediate critical repairs were recommended. Murphy and Dittenhafer has intimate working knowledge of the critical needs of the building and is the only design firm with the ability to immediately initiate design. Murphy and Dittenhafer Architects has worked directly with multiple stakeholders who are involved in the project and who have knowledge of the building's requirements. As part of the study, Murphy and Dittenhafer and their team spent nearly a year studying the building and its requirements. Utilizing any other firm will delay the timeframe of the repairs out for one year due to the procurement processes and requirement of the initial study of the building. Murphy & Dittenhafer Architects has agreed to exceed the 25% MBE participation goal by 4.67 percent, achieving 29.67% MBE participation.

This storm drain continues to the west following MD 935 until reaching a headwall and channel carrying flow to George's Creek. The proposed repair would replace 95 feet of this 60" HDPE, between two inlet structures. Replacing the pipe from structure to structure would eliminate the need for intermediate structures, which would be costly and time-consuming to pre-cast or cast in place. The six-month lead time to solicit, evaluate, and award a new contract under competitive sealed bidding would have further compromised public safety.

- Improved Indoor Air Quality: The selected HVAC air handling units not only help achieve energy savings, but also help to optimize Indoor Air Quality as well. High grade air filters are specified in all air handling units serving offices, classrooms, and conference rooms, with carbon dioxide sensors provided in high-occupancy areas. Each air handling unit is also provided with Ultraviolet Germicidal Irradiation (UVGI) devices that render microorganisms and virus cells no longer infectious.

Requesting Agency Remarks: In May 2023, MPA's Office of Information Security and Technology (OIT) planned to have the MPA Procurement department advertise an information technology Staff Augmentation contract to obtain 15 resources including the two resources provided under this contract. In late June of 2023, OIT decided instead that MPA should move forward with the reprocurement of this database management contract. MPA Procurement advertised RFP No. 224010-IT, Database Management and Support Services, on August 23, 2023, with proposals due September 22, 2023. The evaluation of proposals is still underway.

Database administrators with appropriate skills are generally in high demand because they play a pivotal role in managing, organizing, and protecting the vast amounts of information on which their organizations depend. MPA has had difficulty due to market conditions finding, hiring, and retaining qualified resources for these positions, adding a high-level of uncertainty to all information technology staffing and procurement efforts. In the past year, MPA management has invested significant time and effort hiring a Structured Query Language database management resource to provide competent support to several MPA critical systems. Unfortunately, two prior Structured Query Language database management resources provided under this contract quit for better opportunities elsewhere. MPA OIT was unable to hire a replacement resource for several months. A resource with excellent qualifications was finally hired for this position in September 2023. To complicate this situation, OIT had to consider adjustments to database administrator skills and changes to the technology plan which were not complete until June of 2023, leaving insufficient time for completion of the new procurement by January 2, 2024, the expiration date of this contract.

MPA OIT requires the services of at least two qualified database management resources to support essential business functions. RFP No. 224010-IT was initiated to satisfy this need, but a new contract cannot be awarded under normal procurement procedures by January 2, 2024. Losing experienced personnel with deep institutional knowledge, without having an opportunity for knowledge transfer, poses a very high risk of adverse impact to essential business functions, including MPA Terminal Security Operations and MPA Financial Support systems. MPA OIT considers it imperative to extend this contract for six months to ensure the uninterrupted support. The Maryland Port Commission approved this modification on December 5, 2023.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse received a request from the applicant to withdraw this project from intergovernmental review. It was determined that since the facility is an inactive railroad right of way (ROW), and since the easement to SHA will be for the purpose of paving and installing/maintaining future traffic signals or street lighting that will all serve the MTA ROW, that the easement is "for the specific purpose of serving the State-owned site or facility"; therefore, per the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR), Title 34, Department of Planning, 34.02.02.07, Clearinghouse review is not warranted for this project. Based on this request, the file is now closed, and the review process has been suspended.

Requesting Agency Remarks: In 1981, the Maryland State Railroad Administration (SRA), predecessor of MTA, acquired the site as part of the freight operating program and to preserve railroad right-of-way corridors. MTA is proposing to grant a perpetual easement to SHA for repaving Washington Street and having the right to install underground conduit to support any SHA signals or lights. A portion of the perpetual easement overlaps an area in which the MDOT Rail and Intermodal Freight Section is working with the City of Cambridge to railbank the idle rail corridor from Cedar Street, across Washington Street to Bucktown Road. This rail corridor is for recreational trail use as specified in the License Agreement between MTA and The Commissioners of Cambridge dated August 7, 2017.

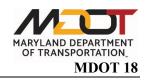

A protest was filed by the second bidder, Quiet Sweep, LTD, claiming that the apparent low bidder, Reilly Sweeping, LLC, was not eligible for award, due to being listed as ineligible on the Bid Express plan holders list. The protest also stated that the Reilly Sweeping, LLC's registered status to do business in the State of Maryland was unclear.

The plan holders list does not determine the eligibility of an entity to bid on SHA contracts, it only indicates whether a plan holder was listed when SHA downloaded certain files.

Quiet Sweep, LTD, fails to set forth any statutory, regulatory, or legal basis for its contention that Reilly Sweeping, LLC, a business in good standing with the State of Maryland, is somehow prohibited from bidding on or being awarded contracts under the state procurement law.

There is no such statutory, regulatory, or legal basis for Quiet Sweep, LTD's, assertion. As provided in Quiet Sweep, LTD's, Exhibit C to its protest, the Maryland State Department of Assessment and Taxation unequivocally provides that Reilly Sweeping, LLC, is a business in good standing and registered to do business in Maryland at the time of bid opening:

The apparent low bidder provided a tax identification number which corresponds to the domestic entity, Reilly Sweeping, LLC. There is no ambiguity in the identity of the low bidder, and it is in no way unclear whether Reilly Sweeping, LLC, is a bidder registered and in good standing with the State of Maryland. For the reasons above, the Quiet Sweep, LTD's, protest was denied.

Inflation and increased fuel and labor costs due to market instability, and maintenance and repair of equipment that is used for highway work due to wear and tear resulting from harsh conditions, are factors that contributed to higher bid cost for the second bidder.

State Highway Administration has confirmed Reilly Sweeping, LLC's bid price.

This project, for mechanical roadway cleaning and sweeping services, is utilized to ensure cleaner roadways and supports the Clean Water Act.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the SHA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goal, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. Due to the limited number of certified enterprises identified as capable of providing these services, it was determined that the sub-contracting opportunities available for this project were not feasible for goal setting. No VSBE participation goal was set due to no certified firms available to perform the work.

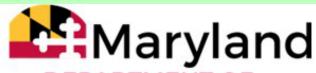

Requesting Agency Remarks: The modification enables the contractor to implement changes to its Veteran Owned Small Business Enterprise participation agreement, replacing the existing contractor that no longer wishes to participate with another subcontractor to meet the VSBE participation. Due to the COVID-19 state of emergency and the State suspending State Employee Benefit/Enrollment Fairs that the MBE subcontractors supported, there has been reduced MBE subcontractor activity starting in Calendar Year 2020 through present. However, Caremark PCS Health, LLC will have met the MBE participation goal by the end of the current open enrollment period.

This modification also adjusts the contract to allow the implementation of a drug review savings (DSR) plan at the cost of \$.30 per plan member or \$595,000 annually in Functional Area 1. The drug review savings plan implements clinical standards to identify member interventions leading to improved drug therapies. Caremark PCS Health, LLC guarantees that gross client savings realized from the DSR program over the first Clinical Program Year shall be 200% of the program fees and is projected to be \$3,650,000. Functional Area 2 of the contract already includes a drug savings review plan.

The guaranteed rebates for Functional Area 1 non-specialty drugs under the contract are also adjusted in response to lower pricing on some drugs such as insulin in the commercial market, following federally negotiated lower pricing on those drugs in the non-commercial market for Medicaid Part D recipients. Although guaranteed rebates under the plan will decrease by \$6,521,986, spending on drugs will also decrease due to the lower drug costs. The lower drug costs will result in an overall plan savings of an estimated \$244,774 compared to current utilization and rebates.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department's procurement priority remains the timely completion of legislatively mandated contract awards to fulfill the requirements of SPP §§2-502.1 and 2-502.2, which mandates the use of a novel procurement method to obtain the new Pharmacy Benefits Manager. The statute required two procurements. The law placed an administrative burden on DBM and DGS so significant, with such strict timeframes, that every other procurement action undertaken by DBM has been impacted. All available resources are committed to that effort, which has necessitated this modification to extend the current FSA contract.

The contractor provides account management services, HIPAA privacy and security, participant communications, website and online access for participants, and customer service. The contract includes reimbursement for allowable FSA healthcare expenses via a debit card. Requesting Agency Remarks: The program has experienced accelerated spending under the current contract primarily due to the added task of completing an economic study required by the Clean Energy Jobs Act (CEJA) of 2019 for an assessment of the cost and benefits of meeting both a 100% Renewable Portfolio Standard and a 100% Clean Energy Standard by 2040. SB516, Section 7-714, 2019, tasks the Power Plant Research Program (PPRP) to perform several comprehensive studies regarding renewable energy standards, with the last study due January 1, 2024. The costs for this study have escalated, resulting in significant additional costs. This study has been more time-intensive than expected and required hiring a subcontractor to complete modeling the various alternatives for achieving the standards.

To build a power plant or transmission line greater than 69kVs in Maryland, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) must be obtained from the Public Service Commission (PSC). As part of this licensing process, applicants must address a full range of environmental, engineering, socioeconomic, planning, and cost issues. The Power Plant Siting Act of 1971, augmented by the Electrical Utility Industry Restructuring Act of 1999, provides a consolidated State review of CPCN applications in Maryland. The Power Plant Assessment Division (PPAD) and the program that it administers, the PPRP, are responsible for managing an objective and comprehensive review and bringing to the PSC a consolidated set of licensing recommendations based on sound science. This is the only process within the State regulatory framework that allows a comprehensive review of all electric power issues, intending to balance the tradeoffs required to provide needed electrical power at a reasonable cost while protecting the State's valuable natural resources.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The majority of PPRP projects are performed by contracted scientists and engineers working on task-based assignments under long-term contracts with PPRP. PPRP has a small number of highly qualified State staff who are expected to utilize these contracts for a wide variety of expert technical assistance. This organization model has been successfully applied for over 30 years and provides the required flexibility and technical expertise the State needs to respond to diverse and evolving power plant-related issues.

The Economic Studies Integrator provides technical expertise in the siting, licensing, and operation of electric power plants and ancillary facilities, including solid waste disposal and transmission lines within or affecting Maryland; to update the Long-term Electricity Report for Maryland; and provides technical assistance in the area of energy economics for PPRP, including preparing reports on an as-needed basis. The future procurement plan for this contract is to conduct a five-year contract term through public solicitation. This extension is needed to ensure continuity of services while the solicitation process is being completed.

PPRD expects Exeter Associates, Inc. to continue MBE participation at the 20.5% rate as established in its MBE Corrective Action plan for the continuation of the fourth year of the contract. The contractor has exceeded the VSBE but fallen short of the overall MBE Goal of 15%. It should be noted that MBE participation has increased substantially over the term of the contract, totaling 17.7% in 2022 and 20.5% to date in 2023. PPAD expects this trend to continue for the remaining term of the contract and forecasts the MBE goal will be met in the end.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland General Assembly created the Management services for the Maryland Small Business Development Financing Authority Fund (MSBDFA) program in 1978. MSBDFA promotes the viability and expansion of all small businesses in Maryland with a focus on businesses owned by economically and socially disadvantaged entrepreneurs. Meridian Management Group is the management services vendor to administer the MSBDFA program on behalf of Commerce. There is no original BPW approval for this contract as it was a legislatively required contract until this legislation was repealed in the 2022 legislative session.

The current MSBDFA Contract with Meridian Management Group expires December 31, 2023. The MSBDFA RFP was issued on April 4, 2023. On June 7, 2023, three proposals were received. One proposal was determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because their technical proposal did not meet the evaluation criteria. The offeror submitted a protest which Commerce denied. The offeror filed an appeal with the Maryland Board of Contract Appeals. This extension is necessary to allow time for the Maryland Board of Contract Appeals to review and render a decision concerning the Protest. The hearing is scheduled for December 13, 2023.

The inability of qualified socially and economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs to access the MSBDFA program on even a temporary basis would pose a major setback to those striving to recover from the pandemic. MSBDFA is the recipient program of \$45 million in federal funds through the SSBCI program. Under the federal grant, the state is contractually obligated to disburse these funds within certain timeframes or risk the loss/reversion of these funds.

There is no MBE or VSBE participation on this contract. This program started in 1978 by the Maryland General Assembly and was governed by legislation and the incumbent is a certified MBE.

The current applications on the Mainframe supported by the Comptroller will be migrated in the next three to five years. It is anticipated the agency will no longer require this skill set after this time.

The pricing was found to be fair and reasonable based on the estimated cost of \$20,649,110. This amount was determined by taking the labor rates for the last year of the current contract and applying a 2% rate escalation for each anticipated contract year. This rate was based on the original contract which included a 2% escalation each year for the first four years of the five year contract and no rate escalation for the last year of the contract. The first year of the price estimate applied a 4% escalation as the agency anticipated the vendor would apply 4% as a reasonable escalation to year one of a new contract. These rates were then applied to the current level of staffing in each of the five labor categories. Pricing for these services is not on a GSA schedule for a meaningful comparison. Gantech, Inc.'s price of \$19,074,468 is 7.63% lower than the internal price estimate.

Although DoIT reported on the original CATS+ BPW agenda item (DOIT 3-IT, 04/03/2013) that it had set a 20% MBE participation goal for CATS+ it noted, "This MBE participation goal is only an overall goal for this contract. Each agency will be evaluating each individual TORP or RFR to maximize opportunities for MBE participation." Some task orders, depending on the subcontracting opportunities available, had an MBE goal greater than 20%, some less, and some that had no goal at all. Given that agencies set the MBE participation at the task order level, it is difficult to impossible to calculate an accurate or meaningful MBE participation statistic. In March 2023, the Office of State Procurement (OSP) surveyed all CATS+ using agencies and determined that 51% of task orders that had an MBE goal assigned, met or exceeded the goal, 23% did not meet the goal, 20% are still in progress of meeting the goal as the contract is still active, and 48% of all task orders had no MBE goal assigned. The labor rates of \$115.00 (Base year) & \$118 /per (option year) offered by iCube is considerably much lower than the current labor rate of \$140/hr. being paid by MCA under its current contract as well as the labor rates listed in the State-wide master contracts.

Therefore, the MCA has determined the pricing from iCube for a senior system engineer to be fair and reasonable under the existing master contract. No MBE or VSBE goals were established because there are no opportunities for subcontracting.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of availability of a Request for Proposals (RFP) was posted on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) July 23, 2021. Additionally, 35 firms were directly solicited. Four proposals were received in response to the solicitation and all were initially determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

During the technical evaluation, two proposals were determined to not be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award and eliminated from the competition due to failure to timely respond to the first request for cure.

Financial proposals were obtained from the two remaining offerors, which asked the offerors to provide the unit prices to the users for specified services. Since these services will be self-funded based on usage and therefore at no cost to the State, the contract amount is an estimate based on data from the current contract, not on the financial proposal. The prices proposed by the other offeror were determined to be extremely high and unreasonable to consider for possible award. The offeror was notified that their overall proposal was not acceptable for award and was determined to be not reasonably susceptible based on their total evaluated price.

The Total Evaluated Price and the Award Amount are different due to the nature of this procurement and how the total evaluated price was determined based on a sample of different categories of transactions. Since it is up to each agency to determine whether and how they will use these services, the financial proposal form provides historical transaction data for the offerors to price to allow the calculation of a total evaluated price and determine financial rankings. The award amount is estimated based on data from the current contract usage.

Reference: Approval is requested for the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, Department of Agriculture, to accept option contracts for the purchase of agricultural preservation easements on the following properties. All purchases outlined below have been reviewed and approved by the MALPF Board.

Special Conditions: Grantor relinquishes all rights to develop or subdivide the land for industrial, commercial, or residential use. Land shall be preserved solely for agricultural use in accordance with provisions of the Agricultural Article. No commercial signs or bill boards are permitted, and there shall be no dumping on land except as is necessary to normal farming operations. Grantor shall manage the property in accordance with sound agricultural practices. Grantee shall have the right to enter land for inspection. No public rights are granted. The term of these easements shall be in perpetuity pursuant to Agriculture Article Section 2-514.1.

- A) As to items 1 through 3, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve the right to apply for release of a lot to convey to himself or his children for the purpose of constructing a dwelling for personal use as follows: one lot of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 20 acres, but less than 70 acres, two lots of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 70 acres, but less than 120 acres, or three lots of one acre or less if the subject property is 120 acres or more.
- B) As to items 4 through 7, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve to himself, and his assigns, the right to apply for release of one unrestricted lot, that may be conveyed to himself or others. Note that as to Item 7, the unrestricted lot will be a building envelope that will not be subdivided from the farm.
- C) As to items 8 through 10, the Grantor is waiving the right to request any additional lots.

The number of parking spaces is also being increased by 100 spaces to account for the new FAMLI unit. Change orders are needed for low voltage work in the amount of \$727,600.00; additional sound management in the amount of \$118,300.00; a 15% overhead and profit fee to the landlord for procuring and managing these two projects in the amount of \$126,885.00; and relocating a CRAC unit in the amount of \$50,623.98, totaling \$1,023,408.98. DGS has also agreed to modify the six-month rent abatement by reducing the rent over the first two years of the lease and beginning rent upon space acceptance and occupancy by Labor and DOIT. The rental rate for year one will be \$16.05 per square foot and for year two will be \$16.53 per square foot. Finally, the termination for convenience provision has been modified to permit termination at the start of year 6 of the lease, with 365 days' notice. This modification was granted at the request of the landlord's lender in light of the large change orders being requested, significant space increase due to the new FMLI program, and rising interest rates.

The Department is working diligently to avoid retroactive activities by putting new tracking methods in place.
