The total that will be offered for sale is up to \$500,000,000* of new money bonds, issued in one or more series, for the capital program.

Denomination: \$5,000 per bond, or integral multiples thereof

Maturities: To be determined by the Treasurer, not to exceed 15 years.

Title: State and Local Facilities Loan of 2023, First Series

Amount and Form: As determined by the Treasurer, to include:

<u>First Series A</u> – up to \$450,000,000* Tax-Exempt Bonds (Competitive in two bidding groups) for the Capital Program

(Series A Bonds").

<u>First Series B</u> – up to \$50,000,000* Taxable Bonds (Competitive) for the Capital Program ("Series B Bonds" and together with the

Series A Bonds, the "New Money Bonds").

Methods and Dates of Sale:

<u>2023 First Series A (Tax-Exempt)</u> – Public Competitive Sale of up to \$450,000,000*, in maturities and amounts to be determined by the Treasurer, on Wednesday, March 15, 2023 by electronic bid and subject to the approval of the Board. Provided, however, depending upon market conditions and at the discretion of the Treasurer, the sale of the Series B Bonds may instead be offered for sale at a date and time to be determined by the Treasurer, subject to approval by the Board at that time.

determined appropriate by the Treasurer.

Remarks: The date of sale of the New Money Bonds may be postponed at the discretion of the Treasurer in response to market conditions. The method of sale, the size and maturities of any of the Bonds may be adjusted by the Treasurer to respond to prevailing market conditions.

Remarks: Background. In 2017, the Circuit Court for Baltimore City granted Mr. Lamar Johnson a writ of actual innocence pursuant to § 8-301(h) of the Criminal Procedure Article and set aside his 2005 conviction for first-degree murder and use of a handgun in commission of a felony. The Baltimore City State's Attorney subsequently entered a *nolle prosequi* having determined Mr. Johnson is factually innocent of the charges. In 2019, Mr. Johnson was one of the initial five compensees granted relief under the expanded provisions of State Finance and Procurement Article § 10-501. The Board of Public Works granted Mr. Johnson total compensation of \$953,762, to be paid in eight installments. Three payments are still pending.

Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Act, MSA is authorized to acquire any site and to construct the Hagerstown Multi-Use Sports and Events Facility as defined in the Act or any segment thereof (the "Facility"). 100 Summit Avenue (the "Property") in Hagerstown, Washington County was one of four parcels MSA identified as necessary for the construction of the Facility. Specifically, the Facility requires the use of the existing parking lot on the southern portion of the Property. The Herald Mail Building (the "Building") on the northern portion of the Property is not required for the construction of the Facility. The former owner refused offers to establish an easement, right-of-way, or other means to ensure access to parking short of purchasing the entire Property which includes the Building. The Property was purchased for \$5,236,529.63 with funds appropriated in the State Budget for fiscal year 2022 (see Ch. 357, 2021 Regular Session, Secretary's Agenda, Item 11 [1/26/22], and Secretary's Agenda, Item 32 [6/8/22])

On December 2, 2022, in accordance with COMAR 34.02.02.04, MSA requested that the State Clearinghouse in the Department of Planning undertake the procedure for reporting and processing of excess State-owned property in connection with the Property.

Pending the Board of Public Works declaring the Property surplus, MSA intends to market the Property for sale subject to all necessary easements, rights-of-way or other legal requirements. Any sale of the Property will also include any conditions set forth in the State Clearinghouse Recommendation Letter dated January 24, 2023. MSA shall submit any contract it entertains for the sale of the Property to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee for disposition approval and the Board of Public Works for final approval of sale.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20221205-0932. It has recommended that the northern portion of the property be declared surplus to the needs of the State, upon consideration of the Maryland Department of the Environment's and the Maryland Department of Transportation's qualifying comments. The change in use for the southern portion of the property is consistent with qualifying comments.

The University has partnered through a Memorandum of Understanding with the Maryland Clean Energy Center (MCEC), an instrumentality of the State with the mission to advance the adoption of clean energy products, services, and technologies that create jobs and positive environmental benefits for Maryland. MCEC is tasked with assisting the University in engaging appropriate and qualified vendors and contractors to achieve the desired outcomes associated with this initiative.

At the request of MSU, MCEC developed and executed a Request for Qualifications process to identify and select a vendor with the appropriate experience to enter into a Master Services Agreement (MSA) with MCEC to provide services to MSU.

Only the nine vendors pre-qualified for the State of Maryland Indefinite Delivery Contract (IDC) were invited to respond to the RFQ process. All nine companies responded with written proposals. Those proposals were considered through a rigorous evaluation process to narrow the field to three vendors invited to give an oral presentation. Representatives from MSU and MCEC were included on the evaluation committee. This committee selected Siemens as the most qualified among the final three vendors.

MCEC is contracting with Siemens on behalf of MSU to perform various tasks, along with design and execution, to accomplish the campus-wide comprehensive energy and sustainability plan. It includes this Task Order to perform work at the Hurt Gymnasium. This task-order system enables the University to effectively address long overdue deferred maintenance to enhance reliability and minimize disruptive failures.

In addition, through its procurement process, MSU hired an engineering consulting firm to review and benchmark the project at the request of MSU. This firm, NV5, is also contracted with DGS. While commending the design and benefits of the project, NV5 has provided excellent advice and experience in ensuring that pricing is competitive and in line with the expectations of the MCEC and MSU.

Solely because of Mr. Seale's donations, the College was able to build the track and field infrastructure at the Jamie L Roberts Stadium that now is home to a new track and field athletic program.

Mr. Seale has lent considerable expertise to the College from his career experiences. He is a partner in the ProFunds Group, the parent of ProShare Advisors LLC and Profund Advisors LLC. Over his more than 10 years as chief investment officer, he developed the financial models and investment techniques that direct investments of over 200 ProShares and ProFunds, managed a portfolio of 35, and oversaw the funds' trading. He is a professor emeritus of finance at George Washington University, where, prior to the formation of ProFunds, he was chair of the department of finance and senior associate dean of the business school. He is a longtime member of the Washington government and business community, having served a five-year term as a commissioner on the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, among other experiences.

The procurement officer reached out to the prospective bidders to ascertain reasons for not bidding and found bidders could not supply the equipment needed.

No protests were filed.

The third attempted solicitation for this equipment resulted in a single bid that does meet all requirements set forth in the IFB. In comparing the price to the 2021 bids to the pricing in this procurement (3rd solicitation) Mallaghan (GA), Inc. increased it's pricing by 5%. Additionally, the second bidder's price from 2021 was \$275,000.00, which is higher than Mallaghan's price for this procurement. Therefore, MDOT MAA determined the price to be fair and reasonable.

The current Blowers have surpassed their serviceable life. Due to the age of the units, MDOT MAA has experienced extended downtime for mechanical breakdowns, failing electronics, and extreme difficulty procuring parts. Requesting Agency Remarks: This modification is necessary to complete full-depth pavement repairs and a site-wide asphalt overlay of a leased area, 2001 Broening Highway, that is currently not adequate to support the tenant's container operation. Five percent of existing asphalt paving in the 13-acre lot has deteriorated to the extent that it cannot currently be used safely for the tenant's container-handling operation. The remaining 95% of the lot requires an asphalt overlay to strengthen the current pavement section to prevent the area from deteriorating further. If the paving overlay improvements are not performed promptly, the leased area will be severely damaged or deteriorated within two years, making the area unsafe for the tenant's container-handling operation. Performing the asphalt overlay will extend the life of the lot's paving by approximately 20 years. The remaining contract value is insufficient for this work order. MDOT MPA is requesting permission to increase the contract value and extend the contract time to complete this work. MDOT MPA cannot complete the required paving within the time required by the tenant if the work must be procured under a new contract.

The MBE participation to date is 13.46%. Three of Flanigan's MBE subcontractors are utilized for hauling of millings and delivering asphalt when the tonnage is 500 tons or more. In 2021 and 2022, MDOT MPA assigned only five projects of over 500 tons, so that MBE participation in the hauling was not feasible. Flanigan utilizes another MBE firm for concrete work. That MBE firm is currently awaiting a payment from Flanigan, which will increase the overall MBE participation to 16.8%. MBE participation in this modification will be approximately \$200,000, increasing the overall MBE compliance to 17.32%. Flanigan's VSBE subcontractor is utilized for electrical work accessory to paving; however, work orders assigned by MDOT MPA to date have not required significant electrical work, nor will the work to be performed under this modification. Flanigan has engaged the VSBE subcontractor when appropriate and will continue to work towards a reportable and compliant participation.

The Maryland Port Commission approved this modification on February 7, 2023.

A single proposal was received and determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The Oyster Recovery Partnership opted not to submit a proposal due to other commitments. Due to the urgency of this project and the limited number of vendors capable of doing the work needed, the decision was made to move forward with the proposal received.

In verifying whether the price was fair and reasonable, DNR reviewed projected funds, and the projected estimated caseload for the vendors for these services, also taking into consideration the limited number of vendors available for this level of work. DNR's Oyster Reef Restoration Projects are funded by requesting capital funds from DBM. DBM provides funding to DNR after reviewing the project description and budgetary needs.

The single bid received provided a cost per unit of work at \$159.33 per acre survey and \$4,359.50 per million of oysters produced and planted. DBM has approved \$1 million in FY23 funding to conduct work in the base year thus work conducted in the base year will be capped at \$1 million. DNR has and will continue to request funding for the optional years and will come back to the board for approval.

DNR reviewed the other ongoing oyster projects to determine if the price provided in the proposal was fair and reasonable but would be locked into a specified amount of spending per year as stipulated by DBM. It was concluded that the proposal's financial bid was within the range of similar projects being funded by DNR at this time and is fair and reasonable.

Due to the technical survey work required for this project, a search of the MDOT MBE site yielded two vendors who were capable of providing biological science services but none capable of specifically providing the work needed for the Oyster Reef project. The Procurement Review Group (PRG) team at DGS agreed with the findings and approved the solicitation being advertised with 0% MBE Participation.

DNR initiated the Eastern Bay Project as a means of bringing together the three main partners in oyster restoration - sanctuaries, the public fishery, and aquaculture - and to enhance the oyster population in Eastern Bay. The project was presented to the Oyster Advisory Commission who included it as a priority commitment under their legislatively mandated consensus process. DNR is conducting restoration in the Eastern Bay region sanctuaries of the Chesapeake Bay. Restoration activities include bay bottom surveys to determine suitability for restoration, and planting hatchery-reared oyster spat-on-shell on those sites deemed suitable. This activity, in conjunction with increased replenishment oyster shell and spat-on-shell plantings on public fishery bottom and aquaculture activities, is aimed at increasing oyster populations and reproductions throughout the region. This project was legislatively mandated during the 2022 General Assembly session (SB830/HB1228).

Requesting Agency Remarks: For FY23, the Maryland General Assembly appropriated \$110 million as PAYGO funds to The Department of General Services. The funds are to be used specifically for the Facility Renewal Program to help reduce the backlog of facility related construction projects. As a result of the appropriation, DGS has identified 243 projects for FY23 from the back log and has assigned project managers to utilize those funds. As a point of reference, DGS typically receives an average of \$25,000,000 annually for the Facility Renewal Program to address the backlog which translates to approximately 60 projects. As a result of the additional funding, DGS is able to quadruple the number of projects it would normally assign. The funds are treated as operating funds, but they do not need to be encumbered by the end of this Fiscal year.

A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* (eMMA) on May 19, 2022. Two proposals were received in response, and both were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. A scoring system was used to rank the technical proposals. For this contract there is no MBE or VSBE goal as some parts of this is a proprietary work product in addition to being a single element of work.

A financial best and final offer was opened on August 4, 2022. After reviewing the final technical and financial rankings, the evaluation committee found The Gordian Group, Inc.'s proposal to be the most advantageous to the State. Gordian has successfully provided Job Order Contracting (JOC) services for over 32 years, and it continues to be their primary business. Gordian provides JOC services directly to more than 250 clients and over 900 additional agencies using cooperative contracts. Gordian's staff has decades of experience implementing and supporting successful JOC programs across North America.

The dollar amounts are an evaluated bid price. The amounts are based on a JOC Project Value of \$10,000,000. This was used for evaluation purposes only. The estimated contract value is based on an estimated value of projects in the amount of \$10,000,000 per year and assumes that the maximum level of performance is required. This is a not to exceed figure and DGS believes that the actual expense will be less than stated. The percentages are Consultant Commission Fees charged by the Offerors. The State will directly pay Gordian their percentage fee based on the level of service provided on JOC program work orders.

This award recommendation is the first of two parts of the JOC program. Once this part is awarded, the contractor will create the unit price book. This price book will then be incorporated into the solicitation for contractors to bid and subsequently perform the work of construction and capital maintenance services. The services provided by the JOC Consultant are crucial to efficiently and effectively leverage the PAYGO funding into the increased number of deferred maintenance projects the General Assembly intended to complete with this funding. DGS intends to use the JOC program to complete Facility Renewal Program construction projects.

Work orders are anticipated to be issued to the successful contractors on a rotational basis. DGS will have access to The Gordian Group, Inc. software, which can track work orders and determine exactly how much spend has been run through the JOC program. DGS also has the option to establish standard reports that can be delivered at any desired interval to track spend through the program. The award recommendation(s) for the construction and capital maintenance services will be brought back to the Board of Public Works for approval in 2023. The total estimated amount for the JOC program is \$100 million, from which the \$10 million NTE for the consultant will come. DGS intends to run JOC contracts through the Small Business Reserve Program which is in line with HB389 from 2022 which codified the requirement to set aside contracts between \$50 and \$500,000 for the SBR program. This will afford MBEs the opportunity to participate in the JOC program as both subcontractors and prime contractors. Furthermore, DGS intends to direct-solicit SBR and MBE firms. DGS will submit a report to the Board of Public Works on all JOC program work orders detailing MBE goals and compliance.

The Contractor identifies industry best practices related to real estate portfolio management that could be beneficial to ORE in the management of its real estate assets.

CBRE, Inc. has performed well and has provided additional services even beyond those outlined in the solicitation. They have worked diligently with DGS staff to upload lease documentation and code the Visual Lease software correctly with the lease information. They have nearly met the MBE goal and are on track to meet the full 35% goal by the end of the contract term. CBRE has provided significant expertise for the relocation and negotiation of the new lease relocation rates. CBRE, Inc. has provided expert guidance in moving the lease procurement process forward.

Based on the move of state agencies out of State-owned space at State Center into leased space it was anticipated that during the contract term, DGS Office of Real Estate (ORE) would require staffing beyond its internal resources. The contract included consultant services to be provided by the contractor upon the request of the State for additional staff positions at hourly rates for any services within the overall scope of work that are not provided elsewhere in the contract. Those positions include Project Executive, Program Manager, Project Manager and Assistant, Cost Estimator, Scheduler, Space Planner, and Transition Manager. ORE now anticipates utilizing consulting services for the State Center moves. These services include space program review and audit, facility condition assessment of proposed buildings, review and assistance with space planning, and review and assistance with project management as directed by DGS ORE and DGS Construction. These are move management consultant services for all of the agencies leaving State Center. The consultant services will also be used by agencies seeking to reduce their space needs in existing leases.
