In 1981, the Caroline County Circuit Court convicted Mr. John Huffington of two counts of first-degree felony murder for a double murder in Harford County; following an appeal and retrial in Frederick County Circuit County, he was again convicted of two counts of first-degree felony murder.

Release. On May 1, 2013, the Frederick County Circuit Court issued a Writ of Actual Innocence, vacated his convictions, and ordered a new trial. On November 9, 2017 Mr. Huffington entered an *Alford* plea to the two counts of first-degree felony murder, where he maintained his innocence but accepted a conviction. Subsequently he was sentenced to time served, and probation through the end of 2017.

Prosecutorial Misconduct & Actual Innocence. On October 22, 2021, the now Supreme Court of Maryland unanimously disbarred retired Harford County State's Attorney Joseph Cassilly, who had represented the State in prosecuting Mr. Huffington throughout the entirety of the case, for prosecutorial misconduct during his prosecution of Mr. Huffington. On January 13, 2023, Governor Larry Hogan granted Mr. Huffington a full pardon stating that his conviction had been shown conclusively to have been in error.

Compensation. The Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Huffington was confined for 11,575 days as a result of the erroneous conviction; (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$91,431; and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$2,899,537.50 in compensation.

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, "Based on the interests of the Claimant, including his time of wrongful incarcerations, his current financial need, his current age, his efforts to exonerate himself, and his overall financial need..." the decision In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of John Huffington, Claimant v. Board of Public Works recommends an expedited payment schedule over approximately one year (the statutorily required payment of \$91,431.00 within 60 days of the June 2023 order; and then repeated payments of \$468,017.75 by September 29, 2023, November 30, 2023, January 31, 2024, March 29, 2024, May 31, 2024, and July 31, 2024). The Department of Budget and Management has reviewed this recommended schedule and reports it can be accommodated within budgeted accounts.

*History:* In 1992, DHCD provided the Borrower with a PRHP loan in the original principal amount of \$971,118 to assist in the acquisition and development of a total of 18 units of affordable housing contained within 17 scattered site properties (the "Properties") in Allegany County, known as the Allegany County Scattered Sites Dwelling Units (the "Project"). Payments on PRHP loans are deferred in perpetuity if the Project complies with the requirements of the loan program.

The Borrower, through its Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD), provided notice to DHCD in October 2013 that the costs of operating and maintaining the Properties, together with the low-income limit PRHP program requirements and its inability to implement rent increases because of the financial constraints of the population they served, made its continued operation of the Project economically infeasible.

#### History (cont'd):

Despite its efforts to make the program successful, and to find other entities to take over the Properties, the County continued to suffer budget deficits and notified DHCD in 2019 that it intended to divest its interest in the Properties.

The Borrower began efforts to divest itself of the Properties in 2020 by marketing and selling the Properties and delivering the net proceeds from each of the sales to DHCD. Currently all but 2 of the Properties have been sold and DHCD has received a total of \$896,052.09 from the sales of the Properties.

DHCD and the Borrower reached the terms of an agreement whereby, among other things, the Borrower would repay a total of \$971,118.00 (the principal on the Loan) - the \$896,052.09 in payments already delivered and an additional \$75,065.91 - and provide tenant protections to the tenants in the remaining units. In return, and subject to Board of Public Works approval, DHCD will forgive all accrued and continuing interest through consummation of the terms of the agreement. Upon repayment. DHCD's liens on the Properties would be released.

The Loan is non-recourse, meaning that DHCD's recourse for recovery of the outstanding balance of the debt is the foreclosure and sale of the Properties. DHCD's alternative to this proposal is to foreclose on the remaining units and/or the units that were already sold by the Borrower without DHCD's approval. DHCD does not believe this course of action will have a materially beneficial result on the amount of funds received by DHCD and could negatively impact both the tenants in the remaining units (foreclosure would terminate any remaining affordability restrictions) and the purchasers of the previously sold Properties.

In summary, the forgiveness of interest, and repayment of principal and disposition of DHCD's lien on the Properties, will not have a material fiscal impact on DHCD and will benefit DHCD, the Borrower, the tenants of the remaining units, and the purchasers of the units that have already been sold.

Board of Public Works approval is required prior to DHCD forgiving the accrued interest on the PRHP loan to facilitate the repayment of principal and subsequent disposition of the collateral properties. DHCD's agreement to forgive the interest and allow repayment the PRHP loan, resulting in the release of DHCD's lien on the Properties, is further subject to the Borrower's compliance with the terms of the Agreement.

The renovations to the existing Science Complex were poorly done and created substandard spaces that do not meet modern-day building codes. The buildings' mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems are obsolete and need to be replaced. There is insufficient space in the Science Complex to appropriately serve the Biology and Chemistry departments due to growth in the science disciplines. In addition, the configuration of the building does not lend itself to the type of instructional and research spaces required to support the University's science programs.

The MBE participation for the CMAR Project Services is 40%. No payments have been paid to the CMAR; thus, no payments have been paid to the MBE firms. The percentages paid to the MBE firms will fluctuate as the project progresses.

The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will manage the construction manager's work with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

The existing Science Complex comprises four buildings: Carnegie, Calloway, Spencer, and Key Halls. The oldest of these buildings (Carnegie Hall) was constructed in 1919, and the newest. (Key Hall) in 1964. Spencer Hall was removed in 1989, and the three other buildings were last renovated in 1992.

The renovations to the existing Science Complex were poorly done and created substandard spaces that do not meet modern-day building codes. The buildings' mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems are obsolete and need to be replaced. There is insufficient space in the Science Complex to appropriately serve the Biology and Chemistry departments due to growth in the science disciplines. In addition, the configuration of the building does not lend itself to the type of instructional and research spaces required to support the University's science programs.

The design is approximately 15% complete. The MBE participation for the project's AE services is 40%. AE MBE payments to date equate to 88.06%. The percentages paid to the MBE firms will fluctuate as the project progresses.

The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will manage the AE team's work with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: The perimeter fence is being held in place by temporary supports over a third of its length. A high wind event could cause a total failure. The perimeter fence is the last security barrier to contain the incarcerated population. Without a perimeter fence the facility cannot function as a medium/maximum security correctional institution. Additionally, multiple active underground leaks plague the high temperature hot water system. Loss of this system impacts both the ability to provide heat and domestic hot water for use by the staff and the incarcerated population. Patching/repairing of this system has been an ongoing process for 8 years and it has reached the point where the original piping can no longer be patched. The leaks and loss of service will continue until the system is replaced.

Basis for Selection: The solicitation for this project was sent to three vendors on April 10, 2023 and three bids were received on May 2, 2023. The vendor that provided the lowest bid has been deemed responsive and their bid has been determined responsible. The State's estimate for providing all work associated with this emergency is \$62,429,786. The vendor has committed to MBE participation of 30.07% and VSBE participation of 1%.

Retroactive Approval of Waiver of COMAR.21.05.06.02(A): COMAR 21.05.06.02 limits the initial term of an emergency contract to 365 days. This is a highly complex project located in a maximum-security institutional facility that involves replacement of 12,000 feet of perimeter security fence, 12,000 feet of high temperature hot water loop system, and 96 pole lights. The work must be phased to ensure continuity of security within the facility and operation of critical systems; the need for phasing greatly impacts the duration of this project. Given the complex nature of the work, type of facility where the work is to be performed, and logistics surrounding the phasing necessary to maintain maximum-security status of the institution, the project is expected to take 720 calendar days to complete.

The Department therefore requests that the Board of Public Works waive the one-year term limit for this emergency contract under the Waiver provision in COMAR 21.01.03.06. The Office of the Attorney General concurred with the Department's request and has approved the waiver for form and legal sufficiency in accordance with COMAR 21.01.03.06B. As the Department has already executed this contract with an initial term exceeding 365 days, the Department is seeking retroactive approval of the waiver of the 365 days duration limitation in COMAR 21.05.06.02(A).

The Department is requesting approval for the entire project, which exceeds currently available funding. Once the 2024 MCCBL pre-authorized funds become available, the Department will return to the Board of Public Works to authorize funding pursuant to such authorizations. Until then, the Department will only authorize work that does not exceed currently available funds.

Requesting Institution Remarks: This Construction Management at Risk contract was initially awarded for pre-construction services. As design progressed and design information became available, the contractor sequentially and competitively bid this construction package. This is the second of four bid packages; the University decided to add a fourth bid package in order to secure long lead time materials and maintain the project schedule. This bid package is for the abatement, demolition and early purchase of long lead items which minimizes the escalation risk to the budget and mitigates supply chain/delivery risks to the schedule. Equipment purchased will be reassigned to mechanical and electrical contractors as part of the base building bid package for the receipt and handling, installation, start-up and testing and warranty coverage. This bid package has an MBE participation of 17.6%. The MBE Compliance is 9.5% since only pre-construction services, long lead time materials and a small portion of construction have been awarded to the CM firm to date.

**Sustainability:** In accordance with the Maryland High Performance Building Standards, UMBC maintains U.S. Green Building Council LEED Silver Certification as a minimum target for new building construction.

The new mechanical and electrical equipment, included in this early release package, contributes to an overall high performance building design that will exceed current energy efficiency codes, provide a healthier/safer building for occupants, provide systems reliability, and reduce operating costs. Efficiencies in building envelope, mechanical systems, and lighting design will contribute to the goal of reducing the building's energy use intensity (EUI). Efficient mechanical and lighting systems will also contribute to an anticipated energy savings of 30% over the LEED baseline. Upon completion of the project, the commissioning of this equipment and associated systems, along with energy metering, will help ensure operational efficiencies are maintained throughout the lifetime of the building.

The selected HVAC air handling units not only help achieve LEED credits for energy savings, but also help to optimize LEED credits for Indoor Air Quality as well. High grade air filters are specified in all air handling units serving offices, classrooms, and conference rooms, with carbon dioxide sensors provided in high-occupancy areas. Each air handling unit is also provided with Ultraviolet Germicidal Irradiation (UVGI) devices that render microorganisms and virus cells no longer infectious.

**Remarks:** The Property comprises three parcels totaling approximately 22.23 acres. The Property is improved with a 5-story, 107,274 square foot office building in good condition. The Property is located in the easternmost portion north of the University's Discovery District in the center of 120 acres of land already owned by the University east of the WMATA/CSX railroad tracks. This is an area where the University has implemented its economic development mission through a series of public-private partnerships. The Property proposed for purchase is close to the following buildings located on University property:

• The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Weather Center for Environmental Prediction. The "NOAA Center" houses dedicated scientists who provide the United States with expert weather, water, and climate forecasts.

The University's joint venture with Corporate Office Properties Trust (COPT) that primed the development of four Class A office buildings located at 5825 University Research Court, 5850 University Research Court, 5801 University Research Court and, most recently, 4600 River Road. Important tenants in those buildings include the Intelligence Advanced Research Projects Activity ("IARPA") which sponsors cuttingedge research on a broad range of subjects to benefit and support the Nation's intelligence community, the University's Earth System Science Interdisciplinary Center

#### Remarks (cont'd):

(ESSIC), co-located next to NOAA, the University's Department of Geographical Sciences, and the University's Division of Information Technology.

• The University's joint venture with St. John Properties ("SJP"). That land serves two key uses. First, SJP built the College Park Academy School, a Prince George's County public charter founded jointly by the University and the City of College Park. Second, SJP built approximately 110,000 square feet of "Flex R&D" buildings.

The University views the Property and the surrounding area as a logical future growth area, both for creative public-private partnerships such as those described above and—aided greatly by the connectivity to be added by the Purple Line—for the growth of the University's academic and research mission.

ACP will lease back approximately 22,521 square feet of office and library space plus an additional 3,753 square feet of vault and storage space. The term of the lease back is ten years. After five years, each party will have conditional lease termination rights. The University's termination right is conditioned upon providing suitable comparable alternative space and its right to terminate the lease of the library and vault space can only be exercised if the University elects to demolish the building. The rent for the office and library space is as follows: Year 1: \$10/sf; Year 2: \$20/sf; Year 3: \$26/sf. The rent for the vault and storage space is as follows: Year 1: \$10/sf; Year 2: \$12.50/sf; Year 3: \$18/sf. From year 4 forward, rent increases annually by 2.5%. The University considers the rent (from year 3 forward) to be at market rate. ACP will pay its share of any increases in building operating expenses after the first lease year. Although no other occupants of the building have yet been identified, the building can be used to accommodate University and private users in the University's rapidly growing research strengths including quantum computing, climate science and artificial intelligence.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The solicitation was advertised on May 19, 2022, via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, the MDOT MAA's website, and by way of direct solicitation to 9 firms. To encourage participation, prior to the proposal due date the Procurement Officer contacted each directly solicited firm to advise of the pre-proposal meeting minutes posting via addendum to eMMA. The Procurement Officer also extended the proposal due date and time three times via Addenda to allow perspective Offerors time to propose on the solicitation. Lastly, the Procurement Officer requested each directly solicited firm to provide No Proposal feedback should they choose not to propose. Three responses were received. The MDOT MAA contacted the non-proposing firms to ascertain reasons for not submitting a proposal and found:

- one firm stated bonding and/or insurance requirements are prohibitive;
- one firm stated the specifications are either unclear, or too restrictive; and
- one firm stated prior experience with State of Maryland contracts was unprofitable or otherwise unsatisfactory.

During the solicitation process, in addition to extending the proposal time, the Procurement Officer invited Offerors to submit questions. In accordance with COMAR 21.05.03, the Procurement Officer determined that all Offerors had a fair opportunity to respond. On July 14, 2022, a single proposal was received.

After completing technical evaluations, the Procurement Officer recommended award of the contract to Jan Ferguson, Inc. (Jan Ferguson) considering a combination of its qualifications and key staff proposed. Jan Ferguson, an established interior plant scaping and holiday decorating company, performs holiday decorative services for large and medium sized shopping malls, hotels, hospitals, office buildings, commercial rooftops, and airports, many of which are comparable in size to BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports. Jan Ferguson is the incumbent Contractor for the existing Winter Holiday Decorative Services contract.

The budget for this project is not to exceed \$1,180,686.00. The financial offer costs were for evaluation purposes only and are based upon the administrative/management fee, installation of winter holiday decorations, and take down/disassembly of winter holiday decorations at fixed rates for each line item. The above-mentioned guaranteed line items are firm for the duration of the contract. The Offeror's guaranteed minimum amount is \$830,686.71. The remaining amount of \$350,000.00 is an extra work allowance to perform design services as needed at the request of MDOT MAA. The Offeror does not have a guaranteed maximum amount except for the overall budget limitation.

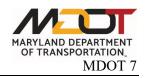

The procurement officer also reached out to 150 of the potential vendors to provide a second notice of the RFP. Offers were due December 19, 2022, and four proposals were received.

The scope of work calls for the Contractor to provide all labor, materials, equipment, supervision, supplies, equipment, consumables, permits, insurance, bonding, vehicles, and services necessary for and reasonably incidental to provide Preventive Maintenance Services, Security services, and snow, ice, sleet removal services to the facility known as Maryland Department of Transportation, The Secretary's Office; located in Hanover, Maryland. Maryland Works, Inc. provided a waiver to the contract on June 11, 2021.

A total of four responses were received; however, only three were determined to be susceptible for award. One Offeror's proposal was determined to be non-responsive to the solicitation's MBE and VSBE requirements and therefore not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award per COMAR 21.06.01.01. A waiver for the full amount of both goals had been submitted; however, when the Good Faith Effort Documentation was requested, the firm did not provide it and instead attempted to submit an MBE and VSBE Offer after the RFP due date.

AAA CBS earned the most available raw points capturing 94.7% of the available points. AAA CBS provided the strongest Annual Maintenance and Preventative Maintenance Work Plan over all Offerors. AAA CBS demonstrated the highest Offeror qualifications and capabilities of all Offerors. AAA CBS offered the strongest economic benefit to the State of Maryland of all Offerors.

It is the Procurement Officer's determination that AAA CBS provided the Proposal most advantageous to the state. The Procurement Officer has determined the AAA CBS price to be fair and reasonable.

The MBE participation goal established for this solicitation was 38% with subgoals of 9 % African American-owned, 3% Hispanic-owned, and 2% Asian-owned firms. Three proposals were received on October 12, 2022 and two were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because the submitted digital file containing their financial proposal was unreadable.

On March 31, 2023, DHCD received a protest from one offeror relating to the disqualification of its proposal. The offeror primarily requested the opportunity to submit a late financial proposal in place of the unreadable document received. DHCD determined permitting the offeror to submit a late financial proposal would depend on which party was responsible for submission of the unreadable proposal. Because the RFP required offerors to submit proposals via eMMA, the State's online procurement portal, the cause demonstrably did not lie with any system under DHCD's control. DHCD denied the protest on April 26, 2023 and the protester did not file an appeal.

DHCD did not include MBE participation because the only portion of the contract that could be subcontracted is technical assistance and training and that is best performed by the underwriters themselves. DHCD's previous attempts to solicit these services have also resulted in limited response. DHCD had previously solicited this RFP as an SBR solicitation in 2021. That earlier RFP resulted in only a single response, likely due to the technically demanding and niche nature of the underwriting services sought. In the current solicitation, DHCD removed the SBR requirement, in an attempt to attract proposals from larger firms with underwriting expertise.

Sex offense treatment services are important to youth under the agency's supervision allowing them to receive court-ordered therapy sessions while enabling the therapist to understand the specific problems of the youth and develop an individualized approach to helping them.

### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The services include intake sessions for youth and parent/families referred for treatment; Family sessions for youth in need of clarification sessions in order to assist them in potential family reunification following the completion of sex offense treatment; Individual sessions; Crisis intervention sessions; Court appearances; and Written plans and reports.

Sex offense treatment services are critical as they help reduce the risk of recidivism in the community involved while allowing the Department to remain compliant with court orders. In addition, the absence of this specialized treatment, which concentrates on effective behavior management to ensure safety for the individual and for the community, will put the youth at risk to re-offend.

Historically, the Department has received relatively low competition due to the locations. In order to increase the competition, the Department focused on reaching out to the providers and expanded the pool of vendors in these regions through the direct distribution list.

No MBE or VSBE participation goals were established for the solicitation based on the limited subcontracting opportunities in the scope of work and the reduced number of qualified professionals.

The Evaluation Committee found the prices to be fair and reasonable based on historical data. On average, DJS will be paying \$195 for a parent session, \$200 for crisis intervention and \$375 for an intake session with a five-year contract compared to \$167; \$177 and \$750 respectively that DJS is currently paying for the same services in the same region with a three-year contract which constitutes an average saving of \$324. It is in the State's best interest to approve this contract in order to lessen the risk of recidivism in our youth.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The residential boarding education program operates on a 25-acre site in southwest Baltimore City and serves 400 students from eleven Maryland counties and Baltimore City.

The previous MBE goal was set at 2.5% and The SEED School exceeded it in 2018 at 4.7%. The SEED School fulfilled their obligation to one subcontractor, another subcontractor went out of business in 2021 and the third subcontractor under the contract was unable to be reached by either email or telephone to verify performance but possibly closed their office according to State Department of Taxation records. Non-compliance with paperwork was identified and resolved. New subcontractors were identified to fulfill the continued 2.5% goal for the next option period.

The SEED School serves 400 students from 11 Maryland counties and Baltimore City. A change in vendor would disrupt the education of students in grades 6 through 12. If there was a change in vendor that did not include uninterrupted use of the current campus, the students would return to their home counties. The campus is a 25-acre site in southwest Baltimore City. The property is leased, and the facilities were renovated with private funds. There is no guarantee that the MSDE could assume the operational costs of the property, in addition to program costs.

In addition to establishing the school program, MSDE required that the operator develop and equip an appropriate campus. The SEED Foundation and The SEED School completed a capital campaign by raising over \$27 million privately and securing \$25 million in bonds to renovate the former Southwestern High School in Baltimore City and to construct two dormitories. The campus was developed with private funds to serve a public purpose. The provision of the original contract that ensures extension of the contract, as long as the program is meeting its contractual obligations, is a key component of the financing.

The contractor is exceeding all obligations with enrollment between 397 to 404 students maintained each year. In addition, the school participates in the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP). The school utilizes several interim measures to track student progress and growth using nationally normed assessments in academics and youth development. A Student Support Team works with families on identification of students with special needs and with implementation of Individualized Education Programs (IEPs).

Funding for The SEED School of Maryland is determined by statute, Annotated Code of Maryland Education Article §8-709-710. The SEED School of Maryland is funded by the State paying up to \$10 million plus annual inflationary adjustment beginning in 2014 for up to 400 students in grades 6 through 12 enrolled in the program each fiscal year. In addition, the county Boards of Education will contribute 85% of the state and local cost for each student who participates in the program and domiciled in the county.

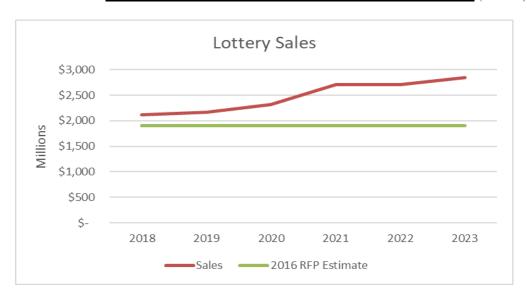

The restrictive covenant language in the final deed required the property to "be used solely for governmental and/or education purposes, said governmental and/or educational purposes hereby being defined as (a) government businesses and/or office and/or (b) college and/or university uses", per deed dated December 13, 2012, and recorded at Liber 750, folio 083. The Town subsequently conveyed the property to Washington College, per deed dated May 3, 2013, and recorded at Liber 758, folio 066.

Due to frequent flooding, mold problems, and deterioration of the building, Washington College has submitted a plan to demolish the armory and construct a hotel / conference center on the property to support college operations. The College has asked for clarification of the original restrictive covenant to ensure the new proposed use of the property is consistent with the covenant in the land records.

The Confirmatory Deed has not been fully executed but will include the aforementioned restrictive covenant clarification language.
