Remarks: Conviction. After an initial hung jury, in late 1997, a second jury in the Wicomico County Circuit Court convicted Mr. David Veney of First-Degree Rape, and First-Degree Burglary for a 1996 attack on a woman in her home in Salisbury.

Release. In 2005, Mr. Veney filed a petition for postconviction relief alleging ineffective assistance of counsel. The State agreed with the merits of the petition and agreed to a new trial. In the course of developing his petition, Mr. Veney developed significant evidence of actual innocence, and after an additional investigation, the State declined to re-prosecute the matter.

Actual Innocence. Upon receipt of Mr. Veney's request for compensation, the Office of the State's Attorney for Wicomico County, through its Prosecution Integrity Unit (PIU), undertook a reinvestigation of the facts and circumstances surrounding the Claimant's conviction. Considering the evidence uncovered by the PIU investigation, the additional information provided by the Claimant, the affirmative evidence of the Claimant's innocence, and the absence of any credible evidence implicating him, the parties agreed before the Administrative Law Judge that the Claimant is actually innocent of the crimes for which he was convicted; and further, agreed that Mr. Veney was eligible for relief under the Act.

Compensation. In its decision, the Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Veney was confined for 2,853 days, (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$91,431.00, and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$714,676.50 in compensation. However, the formal order directs the State to pay compensation of \$714,676.60. The recommendation above adds the additional ten cents ordered to the payment amount.

Remarks (cont'd):

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, the decision In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of David Veney, Claimant v. Board of Public Works recommends an expedited payment schedule over approximately three years. The Department of Budget & Management has reviewed this recommendation and indicated it can be met with the funding sources as noted above.

Attorney's Fees. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1), orders for compensation and benefits shall include reasonable attorney's fees and expenses associated with the action brought under this section. The decision *In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of David Veney*, *Claimant v. Board of Public Works* ordered payment of attorney's fees in the amount of \$8,470.54.

The Department of Budget and Management has recommended the Board of Public Works pay ordered attorney's fees out of the recently approved deficiency appropriation into the Contingent Fund for the FY 2023 Operating Budget.

Remarks (cont'd):

The FAF Grant and STHFGP Grant were provided to Montgomery County, MD (the "Borrower") in 2009 to finance the costs of the construction of a shelter or transitional housing facility located at 600 E. Gude Drive, Rockville, MD 20850 and known as Chase Partnership House, containing 36 beds of housing and serving homeless men, women and children (the "Chase Partnership House Project"). As a condition of receiving the Department financing, and in accordance with the terms of the FAF Grant documents and STHFGP Grant documents, the Borrower was obligated to limit occupancy of the Chase Partnership House Project to "Very Low Income Households" and "homeless households" for a period of 15 years.

Pursuant to the terms of the FAF Grant and STHFGP Grant documents, the Borrower was entitled to forgiveness of the entire amount of financial assistance from the Department if the Borrower complied with the applicable terms for a period of 15 years.

The Borrower relocated the occupants of the Chase Partnership House Project and caused the Chase Partnership House Project to be permanently closed on or after May 1, 2019 without notifying or obtaining the Department's consent.

On September 6, 2022, as a result of the Borrower's actions, the Secretary issued a Secretary's Declaration of Default and Delegation. The Department declared the FAF Grant and STHFGP Grant to be in default and made demand for repayment of the amounts owed under the Financing Documents, including \$350,000 in outstanding principal on the FAF Note, together with additional amounts due under Section 7 of the FAF Note, and \$250,000 in outstanding principal on the STHFGP Note, together with additional amounts due under Section 7 of the PAF Note, and \$250,000 in outstanding principal on the STHFGP Note, together with additional amounts due under Section 7 of the Department's rights.

After negotiations, the Division of Credit Assurance has reached the terms of a Workout Agreement with Borrower (the "Workout Agreement") wherein the Borrower, among other things, granted the Department additional liens on a separate shelter and transitional housing facility operated by the Borrower and known as the Nebel Street Shelter, containing not less than 196 beds of housing and serving homeless men, women and/or children and located at 11600 Nebel Street, Rockville, MD 20852 (the "Nebel Street Property"). In return for the Borrower's obligations, and subject to the approval of the Secretary and the Board of Public Works, the Borrower's obligations to the Department under the FAF Grant and STHFGP Grant will again be eligible for forgiveness, provided that the Borrower complies with the terms and conditions of the Workout Agreement.

Remarks: The Original lease for 152 units and 50 parking spaces was approved as Secretary's Agenda, Item 23 at the June 8, 2022, Board of Public Works Meeting. This item is an amendment to add 216 units and 75 parking spaces for the remaining 1-year of the lease term.

MSU expects to continue its historic enrollment for the fall 2023 semester, exceeding 9,000 for the second time in history. This record enrollment includes a continuation of the record number of first-year students admitted in 2021 and 2022 and the anticipated yield numbers for Fall 2023.

MSU's current housing capacity of 2,571 is inadequate to accommodate this surge in enrollment and the high level of interest among students residing in University-owned or affiliated housing. MSU currently has a record number of applications and strong evidence that complete housing applications will exceed the current supply of on-campus and off-campus available beds for Fall 2023. Further, privatized housing facilities are expected to reach total capacity for the upcoming academic year.

Remarks (cont'd):

Morgan's Office of Residential Life has recommended that the University add additional housing beds in a location it can control in terms of a safe and healthy college environment. This facility has been identified as a potential location to house students at terms agreeable to the University.

Remarks: GMP 1A is for early trade packages allowing the contractor to mobilize within two weeks of completing the Spring Semester and for long-lead technology equipment. Work in GMP 1A includes Industrial Hygiene (removal of hazardous materials), Fencing, C-Containers, Site Preparation, Relocation of Campus Cable Head-End Equipment, Removal of Trash, Moving of Furniture, Generators, Transformers, Security Cameras, Card Access Devices and Partial Construction Costs for the Construction Manager and Architect. A total of 28 competitive and responsive bids were received for 5-bid categories.

Morgan State University is committed to modernizing student housing facilities to create healthy, safe, and energy-efficient environments marketable to the growing student population. The renovation of Legacy Buildings Baldwin Hall and Cummings House is the next phase of the housing plan. Both buildings, built in 1929 and 1952, respectively, are located in the center of campus and will require a comprehensive renovation to meet current codes and to bring them up to current market expectations for student housing. The renovations will include energy-efficient components like a new electrified mechanical system, controls, LED lighting with lighting control sensors, insulated windows to reduce heat loss, and other features to reduce energy and operational costs.

Each GMP will have its own separate MBE participation goal based on the availability of MDOTcertified firms. We have set a participation goal of 40.00% to back the project as a whole. The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company and their MBE Partner Mason Dixon Builders have paid MBE Firms 15.97% of the total billings. The Pre-Construction/Design is currently 40% complete. We expect the project's MBE participation to meet the established goal of 40% as per the contract. All bid packages included in GMP 1A are being awarded to MBE subcontractors.

This request is for the Board of Public Works to approve Morgan State University awarding GMP 1A for the total contract amount of \$4,821,637.

12. <u>MARYLAND STADIUM AUTHORITY</u> Football Stadium Bonds Series 2023

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the Maryland Stadium Authority issuing bonds in a principal aggregate amount not to exceed \$450 million (the "Series 2023 Bonds"). The proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds, will finance certain capital projects (the "Capital Projects") at M&T Bank Stadium (the "Football Stadium"), fund certain deposits into an emergency repair fund and capital works fund, and fund capitalized interest, facility fees and expenses, a contingency reserve, and pay the costs of issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds.

Authority: Section 10-628 Economic Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland

General Information: The Authority expects to issue the Series 2023 Bonds in two series to (i) maximize bond proceeds based on market rates and terms; (ii) provide necessary flexibility for spending bond proceeds; and (iii) comply with all applicable federal rules and regulations. The first series will be issued as tax exempt bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$250 million and designated as the Tax-Exempt Series 2023A (Football Stadium Issue) (the "Series 2023A Bonds"). The second series will be issued as taxable bonds, unrated, and directly placed with J.P. Morgan Chase Bank, N.A. (the "Bank") in a principal amount not to exceed \$200 million; and designated as Federally Taxable Series (Football Stadium) 2023B Bonds, which include the Series 2023B-1 and Series 2023B-2 Bonds (the "Series 2023B Bonds").

The terms and lower costs associated with the Series 2023B Bonds compared to a traditional taxable bond financing is advantageous for paying a portion of the 2023 Capital Projects costs that are or may not be eligible for tax-exempt financing. The Bank offers a financing structure which anticipates a draw-down bond facility that (i)offers a total four-year term for the 2023B-1 Bonds, and (ii) partial conversions of the 2023B-1 Bonds to a tax-exempt rate (such bond to be designated as the 2023B-2 Bond) on two pre-determined conversion dates in 2026 and 2027 at fixed rates. If any portion of the 2023B-1 Bonds are ineligible for conversion to tax-exempt bonds, the Bank will convert the 2023B-1 Bonds to long term taxable bonds for the ineligible amount.

Approval of this Item includes approval of the following:

- The Comprehensive Plan of Financing, which was approved by the Stadium Authority Board on March 7, 2023 and submitted to the fiscal committees of the General Assembly for review and comment on March 14, 2023;
- The Resolution of the Board of Public Works approving this bond issuance.

General Information (cont'd):

The approval of this Item will authorize the Stadium Authority to issue up to \$450 million of bonds as Series 2023A and Series 2023B (or such other designations as approved by the Authority's Executive Director or Chairman) with the proceeds to be used to:

- Pay costs related to the issuance of the bonds;
- Fund a capitalized interest account;
- Pay for the construction and renovation associated with capital improvement projects at the Football Stadium;
- Pay facility fees and expenses;
- Fund a contingency reserve; and
- Make deposits into an emergency repair fund and capital works fund required under the lease between the Authority and the Baltimore Ravens Limited Partnership, approved by the Board on January 4, 2023.

Background: Pursuant to sections 10-601 et seq. of the Economic Development Article ("ED") of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended (the "Act"), the Maryland Stadium Authority (the "Authority") is authorized to issue bonds at any time for any of its corporate purposes. Specifically, ED section 10-628(b) of the Act authorizes the Authority to issue and have outstanding up to \$1.2 billion face amount of bonds (whether taxable or tax exempt) to be divided equally between the Football Stadium and Oriole Park at Camden Yards (the "Baseball Stadium" and with the Football Stadium, the "Stadiums"). Bonds may be issued to finance construction, renovation, and related expenses for construction management, professional fees, and contingencies of the Stadiums, and sports facilities (as defined in the Act) related thereto.

Chapter 112 (HB 524 Session 2023) amends the Act by, among other things, creating separate funds for bonds issued for the Stadiums for the purpose of receiving lottery deposits pursuant to State Government Article Section 9-120, and managing debt obligations in connection with bonds issued for each Stadium. Section 10-629 of the Act requires the Authority's debt service payment obligations with respect to the Series 2023 Bonds be secured by, and payable from, the property or receipts of the Authority which may include taxes, fees, charges or other revenues payable to the Authority, or any combination thereof. The Authority expects the Series 2023 Bonds will be solely secured by, and payable from the Camden Yards Football Sports Facility Supplemental Financing Fund (see Ch 112). The Authority remains below its \$600 million debt limit for the Football Stadium with issuance of debt in the proposed amount of \$450 million.

The details of the proposed bond issuance are set forth in the Comprehensive Financing Plan. Bonds issued under the Act will not constitute a debt, liability, or pledge of the faith and credit or the taxing power of the State, the Authority, or any other governmental unit.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: This Contract was entered into to remove hazardous materials that had been illegally discarded in publicly accessible areas, such as sidewalks and parking lots. The Maryland Department of Environment (MDE) was made aware of illegally discarded hazardous materials at the first site on February 16, 2023, via a call from the Baltimore City Fire Department, and contacted Kalyani Environmental Solutions, LLC (KES) to perform the cleanup to mitigate health hazards.

Remarks (cont'd):

As crews from KES were completing the over-packing and transporting the materials recovered from the original site, a second site with the same / similar materials was discovered a few blocks away. Crews from KES were then directed to that location to perform the cleanup. A third site was found several days later after an investigation by the Environmental Crimes Unit (ECU) of the Office of the Attorney General and an interview of those suspected of doing the dumping. KES also cleaned up that location at the request of MDE.

Basis for Selection: There was no competitive solicitation issued due to the immediate need to mitigate and remove the illegally discarded hazardous materials from public locations. KES was chosen for this emergency cleanup based upon their proximity to the incident, capability to perform the job (characterization, over-packing, temporary storage, and disposal), and their availability to respond. MDE has used KES in the past and has found their services satisfactory. KES is a certified Minority Business Enterprise and a registered Small Business Reserve vendor.

Reason for Late Report: There was an oversight that led to this report not being reported timely. The Environmental Crimes Unit and the Office of Emergency Preparedness and Response were investigating the illegal dumping and speaking with the responsible party for some time in order to obtain reimbursement for the clean-up and disposal. KES reached back to MDE when the responsible party failed/refused to sign a contract for the service, as well as the waste generator manifests. MDE has taken steps to improve its reporting procedures in order to meet the Emergency Procurement reporting requirements.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: A prior contractor for these services failed to fulfill its contract requirements resulting in the remaining, secondary contractor struggling to meet the contract demands of servicing the entire state. MDH had properly and timely issued an IFB for these services with the objective of two vendors starting under new contracts on March 1, 2023. Multiple bids were received. After two vendors were selected for an award, one was not able to provide an adequate certificate of insurance. The combination of the first and third lowest bids was not affordable, and MDH canceled the solicitation for that reason and pursued a new solicitation.

The combination of these conditions made it imperative for MDH to seek emergency procurement contracts with multiple vendors to provide immediate coverage to provide adequate statewide service while MDH re-solicited in regular order for long-term contracts. MDH is reviewing the recent IFB and will make changes to the requirements & scope of work to encourage more affordable competition.

In accordance with COMAR 21.05.06.02, the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) requested an emergency procurement solicitation be issued to provide continuity of service for the transportation of bodies in Maryland to the State Anatomy Board (SAB) facility. The Department requested and received emergency procurement approval on March 17, 2023, from the Department of General Services' Office of State Procurement.

Reason for Late Report: The Department apologizes for the late report. Moving forward, the Department is putting in place new systems to begin emergency procurement requests as far in advance as possible, and to track the reporting status as soon as an emergency is declared. The Department is making the timely reporting of emergency procurements a priority in its rebuilding of internal processes and procedures.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: The current contract for management of the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home (CHVH) was terminated for default due to ongoing violations of the contract which seriously jeopardized the life, health, and safety of CHVH's residents. That contract termination will be effective June 5, 2023. A new vendor is needed to run the home as of that date to avoid or mitigate serious damage to the health, safety, or welfare of the residents at CHVH. The Home cannot remain open without management services.

Due to the limited and emergency timeline for this procurement, MBE and VSBE goals were not established.

Basis for Selection: An emergency solicitation for management services for CHVH was issued on March 8, 2023 to eight vendors who were identified based on online market research, including companies that rescue failing long term care facilities and companies that manage veterans homes, information received from the LifeSpan Network (largest senior care provider association in the Mid-Atlantic), and information received from the Maryland Department of Aging. The solicitation was amended on March 23, 2023, and two additional amendments were issued extending the due date. Four site visits of CHVH were held for potential offerors. The Department received no responses to the emergency solicitation.

All solicited vendors were contacted regarding why they did not respond to the solicitation. Reasons provided included: lack of financial/operational data, current structure not financially feasible due to all the restrictions and additional oversight, the short-term of the contract, and lack of time to prepare a response.

The Department then began direct negotiations with PruittHealth. PruitHealth was selected for direct negotiation because they already manage a number of Veterans Affairs (VA) nursing homes in other states and also have experience taking over low rated homes and revitalizing them.

Retroactive Approval of Waiver of COMAR.21.05.06.02(A): COMAR 21.05.06.02 limits the initial term of an emergency contract to 365 days. PruittHealth advised that one year was too short a period of time to get past the emergency for a contract of this size and magnitude, nor would it have provided enough time to conduct a new procurement or provide the Contractor the opportunity to make significant and measurable improvements at CHVH. It takes well over a year to get everything up and running. The Department therefore requests that the Board of Public Works (BPW) waive the one-year term limit for this emergency contract under the Waiver provision in COMAR 21.01.03.06. The Office of the Attorney General concurred with the Department's request and has approved the waiver for form and legal sufficiency in accordance with COMAR 21.01.03.06B. As the Department has already executed this contract

Requesting Agency Remarks: The solicitation was previously advertised as MAA-MC-21-008 Consolidated Mechanical Systems and Planemate Operation, Repair and Maintenance at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports on July 16, 2020, with four proposals received November 12, 2020. Subsequent to a non-selected Offeror's debriefing, a protest was filed on February 4, 2021. The protest was denied on June 25, 2021. An appeal was filed with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) on July 6, 2021. The MSBCA granted the firm a hearing on August 16, 2021. On February 9, 2022, the MSBCA dismissed the appeal in favor of the Maryland Aviation Administration (MAA).

During the appeal process, the recommended awardee agreed to hold its original price proposal from November 23, 2020, through February 28, 2022, pending the state appeal hearing. On February 1, 2022, MDOT MAA contacted the firm asking if it would continue to hold its price proposal for an additional 3-months in order to seek Board of Public Works approval. On February 11, 2022, the firm contacted MDOT MAA to inform that it would not be able to hold its price proposal beyond February 28, 2022.

MDOT MAA was left with a single proposal and decided not to bring the single non-advantageous proposal for consideration of award. Since there were changes that could be made to the solicitation, MDOT MAA determined that rejecting all proposals and cancelling the procurement was fiscally advantageous or otherwise in the State's best interest. The amendments to the specifications were of such magnitude that a new solicitation was desirable. Therefore, in accordance with COMAR 21.06.02.02 (C) Cancellation and Rejection of Request for Proposals, the procurement was cancelled, and all proposals rejected.

The amended solicitation was re-advertised as "MAA-MC-23-016 Consolidated Mechanical Systems Operations, Repair, and Maintenance at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports" on March 30, 2022, on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and MDOT MAA's website. The amendments to the solicitation included removal of the Planemate scope of work and revisions to the price proposal form. MDOT MAA directly solicited eight firms. Two proposals were received.

After completing technical evaluations, the Panel ranked Elite Line Services, Inc. (ELS) the highest overall considering a combination of industry leading expertise, management plan, maintenance program, quality control and comprehensive understanding of MDOT MAA project goals.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The Panel ranked ELS highest technically due to its superior technical proposal including the oral presentation and interview. ELS presented an extensive network of subject matter experts, operations in 10 of the top 20 busiest airports and maintaining 108 miles of conveyors and over 300 passenger boarding bridges daily. ELS provided a strong technical proposal that spoke from years of experience to the capabilities of the company. ELS discussed transition between the incumbent and a new contractor, understanding that there isn't a cookie cutter transition model, but it has performed 40 transitions in the last 10 years and demonstrated confidence in its ability to provide MAA with the tools necessary for a smooth transition. ELS' proactive suggested improvements, its ability and eagerness to perform predictive maintenance to reduce the risk of component failures and ultimately system downtime is a superior value to MAA. Therefore, considering a combination of its technical and financial offer, the Panel determined ELS provides the most advantageous offer to the State.

On August 30, 2022, MDOT MAA received a protest, and on September 9, 2022, a supplement to the protest. On November 21, 2022, MDOT MAA denied the protest and the supplement to the protest. An appeal was filed with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) on November 30, 2022. On December 22, 2022, the MSBCA granted the firm a hearing which took place on March 8, 2023. The MSBCA denied the appeal on April 21, 2023.

A 15% MBE participation goal was established for this contract; however, ELS has committed to 19.73%, exceeding the goal by 4.73%. No VSBE participation goal was established due to the lack of certified firms available to perform.

This contract includes a provision authorizing an extension for a reasonable, limited, and defined time to spend funds remaining on the contract as provided in Board Advisory 1995-1.

Requesting Agency Remarks: MDOT MTA's Office of Local Transit Support (OLTS) provides a variety of technical assistance services to LOTS operating in the State of Maryland. This contract, awarded to two vendors, allows LOTS and MDOT MTA's MobilityLink to order small buses in a variety of models for transit and paratransit services.

For transit vehicles, the DBE goals are managed through the Federal Transit Administration's Transit Vehicle Manufacturer (FTA TVM) Program. Only eligible TVMs may bid on FTA-assisted transit vehicle procurements. MDOT MTA does not set, nor review the DBE goals.

Currently, the contract language allows for the vendors to request, and MDOT MTA to approve, a pricing adjustment of up to 4% based on the Producer's Price Index (PPI) category 1413 Truck and Bus Bodies. Due to unprecedented increases in the cost of the vehicle components, Coach and Equipment Bus Sales, Inc. has requested an economic adjustment of 26% based on actual costs. Much of the price increase is attributed to the increase in cost of steel and raw materials for the bus bodies, which has risen more than 100%. Creative Bus Sales, Inc. was selected for their diesel bus option, and to date, no orders have been placed for this bus type.

While this will add to the price of individual orders, additional contract authority is not requested. The original contract had a "not to exceed" budget requested based on estimated expected orders. MDOT MTA OLTS has received fewer orders than originally anticipated due to COVID restrictions and continuing supply chain issues.

MDOT MTA researched other states currently making similar purchases and recognized that a new procurement would definitively result in higher pricing for the vehicles. Additionally, conducting a new procurement would delay LOTS and MobilityLink bus orders at least two years, potentially putting them in the position of not being able to replace vehicles that are past their useful life and possibly not in a state of good repair. Therefore, MDOT MTA has determined that it is in the best interest of the State to grant the requested price adjustments.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* (eMMA) on December 10, 2021. The Department directly solicited 21 vendors, including four MBE firms who perform this specialized service. Six proposals were received and three of those proposals were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for not meeting the minimum qualifications and two for not meeting the MBE requirements.

A protest was received on November 7, 2022 regarding one proposal being found not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award due to incurable errors on their MBE forms. DBM denied the protest on December 9, 2022 and an appeal was not filed.

The evaluation committee determined that Harris & Harris Ltd's proposal was the most advantageous to the State. They have a specialty in toll collections, which DBM will utilize when receiving the backlog of EZPass tolls and have additional benefits to the State by setting up a field office in Baltimore city with MBE contractors.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of availability of an Invitation for Bids (IFB) was posted on the DGS website and eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on December 22, 2022. Copies of the solicitation were sent directly to nine prospective vendors, all were Maryland firms. One bid was received in response to the solicitation. The price has been deemed fair and reasonable based on historic commission rates for other concession contracts within the same region of the State. The reason for receiving only one response is the location of the services is not close enough to the Baltimore/DC metro area to entice vendors to bid and the expected revenue of \$40,000 per year is not enough to entice anyone outside of the Frederick County area to bid. There are very limited small or local businesses available to provide the service required.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Getting vendors to do the work needed in these parks continues to prove difficult. Attempts to reach out to vendors to inquire why they chose not to participate were unsuccessful. Prior to 2019, the concession stand was operated by a private vendor. In 2019 it was decided, due to a large-scale Capital Improvement project that involved closing off large portions of the parking areas and renovating the concession stand, that the concession stand vendor contract would not be resolicited until it was complete. The capital improvement was delayed due to Covid-19 and supply chain issues. In February 2022, the concession contract went out for bid and DNR received no bids. Due to further delays in completing the concession stand renovations it was decided to wait until December 2022 to resolicit the contract.

This contract is an important source of revenue for DNR and provides an important service to the park patrons who visit Cunningham Falls State Park and its popular lake area. The Concession Program provides visitors with access to a food concession building for the purchase of snacks and deli type items from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend. The contract is revenue generating, the contractor receives the proceeds from these purchases, and DNR receives 20% commission of all gross revenues.

No MBE or VSBE participation goals were established for this contract based on the limited subcontracting opportunities available under this minimal scope of work. Also for the possible areas of work that could be subcontracted, there are few or no MDOT certified minority businesses or verified veteran-owned firms available for those services located in close proximity to the park.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The recommended contractor is the owner and exclusive licensor of the marks and logos of the Baltimore Ravens NFL football team. The contract includes the cost of the prizes to be awarded to winners of approximately six different second chance drawings. These prizes include Ravens season tickets for 20 years, Ravens 2023 and 2024 season tickets, pre-game access to the sidelines, opportunities to participate in an on-field activity during 2023 home games, and a trip with the team to attend a 2024 Baltimore Ravens regular season NFL away game.

The MLGCA anticipates producing one scratch-off ticket game using the Ravens' NFL marks and logos that will have a quantity of 3,120,000 tickets, a \$2.00 price point and a total retail face value of \$6,240,000 and a second game that will have a quantity of 4,320,000, a \$5.00 price point and a total retail face value of \$21,600,000. These games need to be submitted for production by early June 2023 in order to have the tickets produced and available for distribution mid-summer 2023. Production of the instant scratch-off ticket games, which will be accomplished and paid under the MLGCA's Instant Ticket Games and Related Services Contract #2019-05, is not included in the amount of this licensing contract.

The second chance prizes are also quite popular, as unique player entries into these contests are some of the highest seen.

By law instant game players have 182 days to claim winning tickets after a game is closed out and the MLGCA has to allow for that period to elapse before the contract expires.

MLGCA reviewed the overall prices and terms of other similar promotions that it has done which involved the licensing of proprietary properties and tickets or other exclusive prizes (e.g., Ravens, Powerball Power Cruise, Willie Wonka, Monopoly, Price is Right, MGM, Royal Caribbean). The amount of this license contract compares favorably with those similar projects and was determined to be fair and reasonable.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This contract develops content for assessments for grades 3-11 for the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) for Functional Area 1: English Language Arts and Mathematics and Functional Area 2: Science and Social Studies. Educational Testing Services (ETS) develops and administers multi-staged adaptive (MST) and mandatory computer adaptive testing (CAT) for summative assessments in English Language Arts and Mathematics, and a fixed form for Science and Social Studies assessments delivered online and paper-based to students in grades 3-8, as well as high school end of course assessments (EOC) for Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and English 10. These summative assessments comprise assessments in grades 3-8 and high school as part of the College and Career Readiness aligned to the Maryland State Standards across grades 3-8 and high school.

MSDE is satisfied with the performance of the contractor, and they play an important role in the success of MSDE's assessment programs meeting all of the United States Department of Education (USED)'s requirements for State assessment systems. In addition, ETS' services meet and remain consistent with all Federal, State, and local laws, regulations, and guidelines that pertain to the needs of the student population, including requirements for students needing accommodation. ETS and the DAAPR drafted these modifications to the current contract and the future option exercise in order to benefit the students in Maryland public schools. Maryland and MSDE have begun to move beyond the challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Several changes need to be put in place within the assessment creation process to accommodate the impact of different educational scenarios and have been provided below:

• Item Writer Training and Stipend Increase: The initial solution that ETS presented included the use of ETS-owned items, but it is important that 100% of the items used on the assessments are developed and owned by MSDE and written by Maryland educators. This revised strategy requires additional support from ETS to ensure maximum involvement from Maryland educators.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

- Accommodated Form Increases: MSDE provides accommodated forms, such as large print, braille, Spanish, and paper-based forms, for students during each testing administration. There are builds of new paper/accommodated forms and additional scope that are required to be added.
- Item Banking Changes: MSDE requested a switch to Pearson's item banking system (ABBI), which caused ETS to institute new processes and procedures. Although using ABBI has provided MSDE with a single system to utilize, it has increased the number of forms needed, reviews, and interactions for ETS in order to meet Pearson requirements, as well as causing the need for a new coding process and documentation.
- Field Test Set Creation: MSDE and ETS will need to continue the process of selecting field test items and assembling them into sets, and reviewing, revising, and approving the sets. This was not part of the original contract and requires additional support from ETS.
- Social Studies: This content area required a new item type, the Evidence Based Argument Sets (EBAS), to be developed to meet the requirements of Maryland legislation, to add a middle school social studies 8 assessment.
- ELA/Math: There is still a concern that this strategy may not mitigate the impact that the assessments are currently "participate only". In other words, students may not perform at their highest proficiency in a participation-only year. This requires additional support from ETS.
- New Scope: Attendance for ETS at meetings, such as range finding, has been included at MSDE's recommendation. An extra accommodated form was not part of the initial contract and plan, but has been, and will continue to be delivered annually.
- Educational Testing Services has developed a strong plan to fulfill their MBE participation goals over the next three years. The new extension planning and start of the extension contract has resulted in an increase of re-use of accommodated items. This means that for the extension option years, ETS will be using more items that already have both Spanish and American Sign Language videos created. The updated MBE plan was put in place to accommodate the time constraints to get materials created, as well as the reduction in the pool of items that had stats and were appropriate for use in the accommodated forms. This has affected the ELA and Math materials (FA1). ETS is committed to ensuring that they partner with their MBE providers. Our goal is always to maximize the contributions from our MBE providers as much as possible. If additional need arises for the use of external subcontractors/vendors, ETS will make a good faith effort to find MBE vendors to fulfill those needs.

Requesting Agency Remarks: NCS Pearson has continued to provide necessary services and MSDE is satisfied with NCS Pearson's performance. The company plays an important role in the success of MSDE's assessment programs meeting all of the United States Department of Education (USED)'s requirements for State assessment systems. In addition, NCS Pearson's services meet and remain consistent with all Federal, State, and local laws, regulations, and guidelines that pertain to the needs of the student population, including special student requirements.

NCS Pearson and the Division of Assessments, Accountability, and Performance Reporting (DAAPR) drafted these modifications to the current contract and the future option exercise in order to benefit the students of Maryland public schools. NCS Pearson and MSDE have begun to move beyond the challenges caused by the COVID-19 Pandemic, and several changes need to be put in place within the assessment creation process to accommodate the impact of different educational scenarios.

The following modifications are being requested:

• ELA - MSDE needs to increase the number of passage sets and constructed response items to build the bank in order to move from fixed form to computer adaptive/multi-stage adaptive in spring 2024. The purpose is to expand the available passage categories in the bank from a cognitive level of low-medium and medium-high to three distinct levels low, medium and high. Increasing the number of passages and constructed response items increases the number of field test items that need to be hand scored and then used to train the AI engine. These need to be sent through range finding and scoring before they can be operational. Field tested items will need to be hand scored prior to being used to train the AI engine. When the items become operational, they can be scored via AI.

• **Math** - MSDE needs to increase the number of mathematics items at a variety of cognitive abilities. Constructed response items including math plus text and the drawing interaction tool will need to be hand scored. These items cannot be scored via AI due to the text portion of the response. This increases the cost of scoring. The mathematics standards require students to reason or model as they explain their answers.

NCS Pearson has developed a strong plan to fulfill their MBE participation goals over the next three years. Pearson's MBE compliance goal was affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic when businesses were shut down, causing Pearson to outsource the work that was originally agreed upon.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Fraud prevention is still needed as Maryland Unemployment Insurance Division noticed last year a significant increase in the number of people registering fictitious employers and these services are still necessary to reduce the threat of fraudulent claims.

Unemployment Insurance (UI) staff still need assistance to help identify which accounts are being registered as legitimate employers and not fictitious. If fictitious employers are not identified they attempt to report wages on the account and then file claims against these wages for benefits payments. LexisNexis has a system to analyze the data provided during registration and identify which of these accounts are at high risk of being a fictitious employer. LexisNexis uses this data to determine if the account should be reviewed further or canceled before the fraud can happen.

It is imperative that the Maryland Department of Labor have continuity with the current vendor LexisNexis to protect against fraud while LABOR transitions from the current VoiP phone system to the new LABOR Omni-Channel Contact Center System (LOCCS). LOCCS will be the voice, email, chat and web form interaction repository.

The LOCCS award recommendation is expected to be presented at either the July or August BPW meeting. The estimated timeframe for LOCCS to be fully implemented is by mid November 2023. The contract extension is needed to protect against fraudulent activity on a new phone, email, chat and web form interaction repository.

Additionally, the scope of work for the new ID Verification RFP is tied to LOCCS and all security features that must be implemented during the testing period. It would be impossible to issue a new RFP without completing various testing phases of the new phone system for the Maryland Department of Labor. The Maryland Department of Labor is seeking to issue a new RFP for Identity Verification Services by December 2023.

The original emergency procurement did not have MBE participation since this contract is a software subscription contract with limited staff resources being used.

All purchases outlined below have been reviewed and approved by the MALPF Board.

Special Conditions: Grantor relinquishes all rights to develop or subdivide the land for industrial, commercial, or residential use. Land shall be preserved solely for agricultural use in accordance with provisions of the Agricultural Article. No commercial signs or billboards are permitted, and there shall be no dumping on land except as is necessary to normal farming operations. Grantor shall manage the property in accordance with sound agricultural practices. Grantee shall have the right to enter land for inspection. No public rights are granted. The term of these easements shall be in perpetuity pursuant to Agriculture Article Section 2-514.1.

A) As to items 1 through 4, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve the right to apply for release of a lot to convey to himself or his children for the purpose of constructing a dwelling for personal use as follows: one lot of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 20 acres, but less than 70 acres, two lots of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 70 acres, but less than 120 acres, or three lots of one acre or less if the subject property is 120 acres or more.

B) As to items 5 through 20, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve to himself, and assigns, the right to apply for release of one unrestricted lot, that may be conveyed to himself or others. Background: The Jefferson Patterson Park & Museum (JPPM) was established following a conveyance to the State in 1983 of 512 acres located along the Patuxent River in St. Leonard from Mary Marvin Breckinridge Patterson, subject to a Trust Agreement which provides that the 512-acre property shall "be administered by [MHT] for the benefit of the citizens of the State of Maryland and for the purpose of establishing the Jefferson Patterson Historic Park and Museum". The Trust Agreement further states that the property shall be used for the purpose of "maintaining, preserving, and promoting interest in historical, archaeological, agricultural, cultural, scenic and environmental significance," including "recreational use". Since 1983, JPPM's acreage has expanded to approximately 560 acres through five separate acquisitions of contiguous properties between 1986 – 2002.

The JPPM grounds contain six residential structures and other properties that MHT has been leasing. These include three residential properties, two storage facilities, and one agriculture property containing 125 acres of farmland.

All rental income received by MHT through the JPPM leases is dedicated to a special fund, the use of which supports JPPM's public mission as prescribed in the Trust Agreement. This includes for, among the things, the salaries of contractual employees who perform educational programming at the park, other costs related to providing educational programming, and facilities maintenance.

Remarks - Agricultural Lease: Due to recent capital projects at JJPM that reduced the acreage of land leased for agricultural use, the Annual Rent for the first year of the five-year term was reduced from \$6,100 to \$4,632 to account for Tenant's losses including (1) the cost per acre for the planting of soybeans within the boundaries of the leased area including fuel, seed, fertilizers, lime, and pesticides; and (2) the market value per bushel of soybeans when the crop was sold at market in 2022. This one time reduction applies to calendar year 2023 only and does not apply to the Annual Rent for the remaining term of this lease.

DGS OSP Remarks: RETROACTIVE approvals requested pursuant to § 11-204(c) State Finance & Procurement Article. DGS OSP has determined that these contracts should be treated as voidable rather than void because: (1) all parties have acted in good faith; (2) ratification for the procurement contracts would not undermine the purposes of the Procurement Law; and (3) the violation, or series of violations, was insignificant or otherwise did not prevent substantial compliance with the Procurement Law.

Remarks: This Sublease Agreement permits the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission (ATCC) to lease office space located at 1215 East Fort Avenue, Suite 300 in Baltimore from the Maryland Auto Insurance Fund (MAIF) to provide critical alcohol, tobacco, and cannabis enforcement duties. MAIF previously entered into a 15-year lease for this office space for the period 07/06/2015 - 07/05/2030. The new office space is urgently needed due to recent legislation which has authorized the separation of the alcohol and tobacco enforcement duties from the Comptroller's Office. The rental rate of \$30.64 includes base rent of \$28.62 plus operating expenses and real property taxes of \$1.84 per sf. The base rental rate escalates 2.25% per year.
