7. <u>BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS</u> Wetlands Licenses

REVISED

Remarks: The Maryland Military Department (MMD) is currently planning an expansion of the Upper Campus within the boundaries of the Camp Fretterd Military Reservation to include a new Marine Corps Reserve Center (MCRC), and Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM) building expansion. The existing wastewater treatment plant cannot accommodate the proposed new facilities at Camp Fretterd and need to be upgraded. Proposed upgrades include the construction of a new equalization tank, expansion of the existing treatment building, process controls and upgrades to the electrical service.

The project underwent a new bidding process due to the initial bids being invalidated. On June 8, 2023, the original bids were rejected since all bids were either non-responsive to the published requirements or substantially exceeded budgeted funds.

Upon re-advertisement of the project, three bids were received on August 2, 2023. The apparent lowest bidder was HRI Construction LLC A/K/A M2 Construction LLC ("M2"). MES received a protest on this procurement by Lee Foundation on August 17, 2023. That protest was reviewed by the MES Procurement Officer, who dismissed it as untimely submitted in a response dated August 24, 2023. MES received the Board of Directors approval at the August 24, 2023 meeting to award the contract to HRI Construction LLC A/K/A M2 Construction LLC.


Remarks (cont'd):

On August 30, 2023, Lee Foundation appealed the dismissal to the MES Executive Director. The designee of the MES Executive Director, as the "MES Reviewing Authority" concluded, on September 15, 2023, that Lee Foundation's bid protest was timely filed and remanded to the MES Procurement Officer the issues raised by Lee Foundation in its initial bid protest. MES put its procurement process on hold until the bid protest and appeals were resolved. On September 26, 2023, the MES Procurement Officer denied Lee Foundation's bid protest. On October 5, 2023, Lee Foundation appealed the denial to the MES Reviewing Authority. On November 3, 2023, the MES Reviewing Authority sustained Lee Foundation's bid protest and concluded that the protest was improperly denied by the MES Procurement Officer. The MES Reviewing Authority stated that the implied MBE partial waiver granted to M2 was improper and was revoked. The MES Reviewing Authority directed the MES Procurement Officer to find M2's bid unresponsive due to its failure to meet the MBE participation goal of this project and directed the MES Procurement Officer to award the project to the next lowest responsive bidder, which is Lee Foundation Company, Inc.


The original solicitation included both programming services with a possible option for architectural and engineering services. All firms proposed pricing for all of the services and the financial proposals were evaluated based on the cost of all potential services. The original contract to Quinn Evans, awarded on July 19, 2022, was for the programming services only, which was funded using St. Mary's College of Maryland general funds. The Part I/II Facility Program was reviewed and approved by The Department of Budget Management on November 8, 2023. St. Mary's College of Maryland seeks Board of Public Works approval for a contract modification to add the architectural and engineering services, which will be funded by general obligation bond proceeds.

The College proposes renovating portions of the Hilda C. Landers Library to convert underutilized space in a manner that would support new functions devoted to student success services, academic research, and career support. Condensing many library functions onto the second floor will provide space on the first and third floors necessary for the Center for Career and Professional Development, Office of International Education, Media Services, Quantitative Center, and the Center for Inclusive Teaching and Learning. Reorganizing the library and co-locating affiliated departments will create a collaborative space for mentoring, media services instruction and training, student exploration of research, internships and professional development, and study abroad opportunities. Like many libraries, the physical collections have been reduced as bound volumes and reference materials are replaced with online resources. This reorganization will improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the library by keeping pace with developing practices and providing holistic support to learning and research for the faculty and students.

Requesting Institution Remarks: The solicitation was advertised in *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage*, the University's eBid Board, and distributed to the Governor's Office of Small, Minority and Women Business Affairs and MBE Trade Associations. Seven firms responded to the solicitation. The qualification committee shortlisted three firms as those most qualified to provide the services based upon their initial technical proposals. Oral presentations were conducted with the three firms and the committee recommended Ziger/Snead Architects as the most qualified firm based upon their presentation and technical proposals. The fee was the result of a negotiated agreement. The A/E selection process inclusive of the fee negotiations, was approved by the University's Executive Review Group, which includes a public member.

The contract will be awarded for the concept/program verification phase of design. After initially negotiating for complete design services, the University made the decision that more effort was needed to define the scope of work and align it with the \$22M construction project budget. The existing conditions of the building, such as the building envelope and code issues with stairs and elevators, require further investigation and subsequent guidance/recommendations from the AE to solidify the project scope of work and move forward with the design. The University may elect to negotiate with Ziger/Snead Architects for the remainder of design services at the conclusion of the concept/program verification phase or solicit for these services through another RFP process.

The MBE goal for the project is 5% and Ziger/Snead Architects has committed to 10.1% MBE participation, exceeding the goal by 5.1%. If the University elects to negotiate the remainder of design services with Ziger/Snead Architects, it will submit a contract amendment for full design services compliant with the 5% goal.

Sustainability: In accordance with the Maryland High Performance Building Standards, project designs will achieve a USGBC LEED for New Construction Silver certification rating as a minimum target. 

Requesting Institution Remarks (Modification): The lead time for electrical distribution switchgear and controls has increased substantially from the start of design in March 2017. Lead time for the South Switching Station electrical equipment is estimated to be approximately 14 to 18 months. This modification is for the early purchase of the long lead time electrical equipment at the South Switching Station, which will minimize the risk of cost escalation to the budget and mitigate supply chain/delivery risks to the schedule. The University anticipates saving a year in the overall schedule of the UMB Campus Electrical Infrastructure Upgrade project because of early procurement. This electrical equipment will be reassigned to the contractor selected for the fifth phase, or the construction of the South Switching Station. This modification also includes the replacement of existing electrical ductbank and making associated repairs to the existing infrastructure on Greene and Baltimore Streets. The University's current electrical infrastructure had a catastrophic underground fire in August 2023. Electrical power was knocked out to critical research buildings and facilities on the campus for several days. Fortunately, enough electrical infrastructure from this project was in place to reroute power from the new North Switching Station to the campus. The new ductbank and repairs are necessary to redirect power to the older infrastructure to remove the electrical load from this project and continue the construction and commissioning of the new electrical system. Inspection of the older infrastructure after the fire revealed that multiple manholes in Greene and Baltimore Streets were beyond their life expectancy and are becoming structurally unsound, so this contract modification will address the necessary repairs and replacement of those manholes and ductbank.

Sustainability: This phase of the campus electrical upgrades project consists of the installation and implementation of a state-of-the-art switchgear and generator control system which will be capable of reducing the campus electrical demand on the local utility during high usage periods. The new generation equipment is equipped with Tier 4 emissions control equipment to reduce environmental impacts to within permitting standards. The replacement main electrical equipment in Howard Hall will utilize transformers that meet the latest efficiency standards to reduce electrical losses, ultimately resulting in less electrical energy wasted. The new equipment spaces in Howard Hall will also be equipped high efficiency HVAC equipment and LED lighting.



Requesting Institution Remarks: This Construction Management at Risk contract was initially awarded for pre-construction services. As design progresses and design information becomes available, the contractor sequentially and competitively bids construction packages. This is the first of three bid packages. This bid package has an MBE participation of 15%. The MBE Compliance is 14% since only a small portion of the construction trade work has been awarded and most of the cost to date includes CM pre-construction services, allowances, CM general conditions, CM contingency, and CM fee. The next two bid packages will include a higher MBE percentage of subcontractor trade work to meet the overall MBE participation goal of the project.

Sustainability: Smith Hall will undergo a major renovation/addition to transition from use as a science facility to future use for departments of media arts within the college of fine arts. A major emphasis of the project is to provide a healthy and sustainable environment that supports the university's mission. A renovation project is often inherently more sustainable given the approach reduces the amount of building that is demolished and rebuilt. The building has been a notoriously heavy user of energy – the factors that lead to this are being addressed as part of the renovation process – an uninsulated masonry exterior will be replaced with a highly efficient modern rainscreen that will significantly reduce energy consumption. New Smith Hall will be an all-electric building to allow a "net-zero ready" strategy that is forward looking in its decoupling from fossil fuel energy production. The building will utilize a heat-pump based HVAC system that will operate more efficiently while allowing the future addition of ground-source heat transfer. The project will target LEED gold certification – and maximize potential efforts inherent in the LEED scoring system within the project's available budget. The re-visioned







Requesting Agency Remarks: This solicitation was published on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, which notified 72 firms. MPA also directly solicited the Maryland Minority Contractors Association and the Md. Washington Minority Companies Association. Five vendors attended the preproposal meeting, one of which was the incumbent, Media Two, LLC, dba Today Media Custom Communications (Today Media) and two of which were Minority Business Enterprises interested in participation as subcontractors. MPA received one proposal, from Today Media. One of the MBE companies that attended the preproposal meeting was submitted as an MBE subcontractor by Today Media.

Prior to the due date of proposals, the Procurement Officer received 'no-bid' responses from three vendors who provided these reasons for not submitting a proposal: one vendor is an MBE subcontractor who was unsuccessful in teaming up with a qualified prime contractor; one vendor publishes and distributes publications but does not provide content as required by this contract; and the third vendor chose not devote time and money to respond to the solicitation. The Procurement Officer determined that other prospective offerors had a reasonable opportunity to submit a proposal.

The *Port of Baltimore* magazine is a bimonthly publication used as a key marketing and sales tool by the MPA. The magazine focuses on shipping and maritime businesses that help to make the Port of Baltimore one of Maryland's leading economic generators. Readers of the magazine include top decision-makers of international shipping companies.

Today Media has demonstrated a complete understanding of MPA's requirements and has extensive experience producing and distributing high quality publications and digital magazines, including the *Port of Baltimore* magazine. Today Media has been providing the MPA with a successful publication championing the Port of Baltimore. Today Media is a Maryland business that understands the priorities and core business of MPA and the tremendous benefit of the Port of Baltimore to Maryland. Under the current contract, Today Media's January/February 2020 issue of the *Port of Baltimore* won a prestigious MarCom Gold Medal. MarCom awards honor excellence in marketing and communication while recognizing the creativity and hard work of industry professionals.

Today Media submitted unit pricing for the bimonthly production and mailing of 1,300 copies of a 32-page magazine, for an estimated total over the three-year initial contract term of \$335,322, and an estimated total of \$231,407 over the two-year renewal term. Today Media also submitted pricing in accordance with the solicitation for additional pages in 4-page increments and the cost of additional copies per issue if needed by MPA. Today Media's price proposal permits an award within the MPA budget. The difference between the not-to-exceed award value of \$350,000 and the proposal estimated value of \$335,322 for the initial term (and the corresponding values of not to exceed \$250,000 and \$231,407 estimated for the renewal term) will provide MPA with

additional contract capacity to increase the page numbers and numbers of copies of each issue, as necessary during the term of the contract and the renewal term, within MPA's budget. The contractor's pricing appears to be fair and reasonable. The contractor's 2023 per-copy price for production and mailing of 1,300 copies of a 32-page magazine issued six times per year is approximately 28% higher than the 2018 per-copy price. Since 2018 the industry has undergone COVID disruptions, inflation, U.S. Postal Service rate increases, and a reduction by MPA of the number of copies from 3,000 to 1,300, increasing the per-copy cost to the contractor.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MPA Office of Fair Practices and Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. The Procurement Review Group was set a 25% participation goal with subgoals of 12% for Woman- owned and 7% African American-owned firms. Today Media has committed to exceeding the goal by 2.96%, for an MBE commitment of 27.96%. A VSBE goal was not set for this contract due to an insufficient number of certified firms to perform a significant portion of the work identified as subcontractable.

The current contract with Today Media has an MBE commitment of 30.56%. Today Media's MBE achievement under that contract is currently 23.54%. This is attributable to the fact that MPA, as part of its aggressive effort to reduce spending during the COVID-19 emergency, reduced the number of issues of the magazine and the page count of several issues. That reduction in scope reduced the work available to the MBE subcontractors.

The contract contains a provision authorizing an extension of the term of the contract, but no increase in the value, for a period not exceeding one-third of the original three-year term, to spend contract funds unspent at the end of the original three-year term.

The Maryland Port Commission approved this award on November 7, 2023.

The first apparent low bidder was rejected because an analysis of the submitted bid for labor hours was found to be insufficient to account for the required hourly wage rate, insurance, and the anticipated yearly increase in Tier 1 Living Wage Rate. Also, during the analysis of the first apparent low bidder's Equipment and Experience Statement (EES), the bid did not identify that bidder had successfully completed contracts of similar size and scope.

The second apparent low bidder was found non-responsive due to not meeting the minimum amount allowed for the tractor loader backhoe (17 feet and over) biddable item.

The fifth apparent low bidder was found non-responsive due to not meeting the minimum amount allowed for the box container (minimum 20 ft) biddable item.



Requesting Agency Remarks: On January 7, 2015, under 27-RP, the BPW approved SHA disposing the subject property to Montgomery County, Maryland. The conveyance included reversionary language maintaining public use, as well as the approval of a Purchase and Sale Agreement between SHA and Montgomery County. The intent was for the County to construct a fire station and senior housing within the same building footprint. The conveyance deed also included language requiring the County to construct the senior housing within ten years.

Montgomery County will develop the site as previously agreed, but they would like to contract a third party, Victory Housing Inc (VHI) that will operate and maintain the senior housing. VHI will lease the land from the County at a nominal rate. VHI is a non-profit entity but will be permitted to collect rent from the tenants. In addition, the County is requesting a two-year extension of time to allow VHI to complete construction of the senior housing by 2027.

SHA is requesting BPW approval to modify the previously approved Conveyance Deed and the Purchase and Sale Agreement. It is recommended that the transaction be completed at no monetary cost as the public purpose of the project has not substantially changed, and only the delivery method and time frame will be modified.

Gordon LLC provided a well-organized and thorough proposal and submitted a detailed work plan, which outlined company policies and procedures, a disaster recovery plan, an information security plan, and problem escalation procedures. Both the lead investigator and the account manager were former WIC participants, which is helpful in understanding the program and how compliance buys should work. The two bids varied greatly in unit price. MDH is confident that the selected vendor will perform the work that is required. The vendor that was not selected did not provide sufficient evidence of a successful financial track record along with evidence of working capital. This caused the evaluation committee to be concerned about the financial forecast and an appearance that their financial proposal was overinflated.

Compliance buy investigations are covert, onsite visits, in which a representative poses as a participant in order to transact one or more WIC purchases. Investigators posing as participants provide the vendor with the opportunity to commit suspected or reported violations to determine compliance with their Vendor Agreement and applicable Federal and State Regulations. No attempt is made to entrap or otherwise coerce the vendor to violate program regulations. Details of every investigation are carefully documented.

The Women, Infants and Children Program (WIC) is a federally funded program through the United States Department of Agriculture that provides healthy supplemental foods for pregnant women, new mothers, infants, and children. It has approximately 547 authorized vendors who redeem electronic WIC benefits (eWIC). Pursuant to federal regulations, the State must conduct compliance investigations of a minimum of 5% of the number of vendors authorized each fiscal year.





Requesting Agency Remarks: Global Tel*Link d/b/a ViaPath (GTL) is also currently contracted with Prince William County Virginia for a telephone system and has been providing services satisfactorily. The system requirements in the Prince William County's Contract are consistent with DPSCS phone system requirements.

The contract with GLT through Prince William County Virginia has provided the ability to access other technology services, such as electronic mailing, video conferences, kiosks, and tablets. This will allow DPSCS the option, if desired, to provide expanded services with respect to education, communications, and safety.

The DPSCS negotiated the domestic-call rate to 3.2ϕ with no additional costs charged. This is one of the lowest rates in the country. The cost benefits the State by offering a low domestic perminute rate, thereby reducing the amounts incarcerated people and their families are charged to communicate with their loved ones. Incarcerated people pay directly for the services from their accounts. DPSCS has negotiated flat rates for each service provided. The contractor is not allowed to impose any additional charges and DPSCS does not receive any revenue from this contract. Although other states receive revenue from the vendor, DPSCS chose to forego that opportunity to obtain the lowest rates possible to better serve incarcerated persons and families.







The Center for Comprehensive Services, dba Neurorestorative, Florida continues to be the most appropriate placement for these four youth as they provide 24-hour residential treatment services to youth ages 8 - 17. These youth come from Baltimore City and County, Dorchester County, and Montgomery County.

As of October 16, 2023, all four youth continue to require this level of care from this provider. The provider can clinically address the specialized needs of the youth and when clinically appropriate the youth will be stepped down to a less restrictive placement. The provider specializes in treating youth experiencing Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or neurological impairments.

The provider's performance and compliance is reviewed by the State of Florida, Agency for Healthcare Administration, Division of Health Quality Assurance. inclusive of representatives from other state agencies such as MDH, OLM, and SSA Contract and Placement Units.

There is a high demand for the services and the Department knows at this time the option will need to be exercised. The decision was made to make one appearance for both actions.

No MBE or VSBE participation goals were established for this contract since the specialized core services (psychiatric services/evaluations, case management, therapy, recreational therapeutic programs, educational services etc.) are available within the facility and require specialized training, certification, and clearances.





Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on November 1, 2021. A total of 48 potential offerors were directly solicited. Four proposals were received in response to the solicitation and all were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The recommended offeror ProLink Solution, Inc was determined to be most advantageous to the State.

The difference in price between ProLink Solution, Inc.'s proposal and the competing proposals was not large enough to outweigh the difference in the evaluated strength of their technical qualifications due to the integral nature that the impact Multi-Family Asset Management System Software (MAMS) will have on operations. DHCD determined that the increased functionalities of the solution would be of greater benefit to the State, despite the increased cost. ProLink Solution, Inc.'s system is a proven and tested solution that presents the greatest upside with the least amount of risk, as it relates to ensuring that DHCD staff and constituents, management companies, and borrowers. It is a reliable and easy to use interface that is robust enough to handle the myriad of programs, funding sources and subsidies that overlap in affordable, multi-family lending.

The Department's existing software is outdated and limited in the functionality it provides. The new system will be capable of providing greater and more accurate reporting and data analysis for a greater number and type of loan and subsidy programs. The vendor will also provide a webbased, integrated managing and monitoring database system that will provide support to meet the needs of multifamily housing loans and programs.

DHCD learned through the previous solicitation that companies offering software products of this nature tend to be somewhat larger, and that their products are proprietary and unsuited to subcontracting opportunities. Due to these circumstances, DHCD advertised this procurement with no MBE or VSBE participation and no SBR designation in an effort to increase competition.







Requesting Agency Remarks: The Comptroller of Maryland (COM) is implementing a COTS Integrated Tax System (ITS) Solution. The ITS Solution will replace the State of Maryland's existing tax administration, tax processing, imaging, accounting, collections, and Abandoned Property (AP) systems, and all necessary hardware, software, and services required for implementation of the Solution. The solution shall be implemented in a hosting environment provided and managed by the contractor and also integrate with the COM's existing Teradata DW. The ITS will allow the COM to efficiently administer all taxes, licenses, permits, and fees required by law. This includes the processing and collection of personal income tax and sales and use tax, the State's largest sources of revenue, and the administration of Abandoned Property.

The ITS solution implementation is a multi-phased deployment. The first of three releases has been successfully implemented and the second is in the implementation phase. This modification will re-baseline as the result of several factors, most notably:

- 1. A schedule, that is impacted due to covid, increased scope, increased complexity of the project, and hence not attainable as originally planned; a now known throughput capacity for the vendor and the State.
- 2. The disruptive impact brought on by COVID; adjust to the Compass project impacts that were incurred between January 2021 and June 2021 from legislative changes around the COVID RELIEF Act.
- 3. Scope increases due to legalized recreational cannabis passed by Maryland voters, as well as adding a Modernized eFile (MeF) solution for Fiduciary tax to reduce the amount of paper processing to streamline day to day operational needs.
- 4. A constraint of functional and technical expertise in the State to manage the project delivery while also meeting the day-to-day operational needs of the Comptroller's office.
- 5. Realignment of tax type deployment releases, notably, Portal Deployment brought in early in the release plan, combining the tax types and functionality planned for Release 3 and Release 4 into a single release, referred to as Release 3.
- 6. Extending the schedule to allow more opportunity to test on converted data and provide for a period of production stabilization with each release.

With the addition of Cannabis Tax and modifications of the Release 2 schedule, Release 2 and Cannabis Tax Release will run concurrently. There is no overlap with Release 2 and Release 3 and a five month production stabilization period between Release 2 and Release 3 to focus on quality over speed. In addition, this change allows for a revision of the Release 3 launch date, permitting the Individual Income Tax to go live in Revenue Premier (RPE) outside of the peak annual filing season. This modification reduces the strain on COM resources and mitigates potential risks during the peak tax filing season.

Given the various considerations, the updated plan provides the least risky course for the Compass Program. It ensures quality service to the MD taxpayers while the project is in progress and high emphasis on quality product implementation. The re-baseline will: (1) set a realistic date for Release 2 (in-line with Independent Verification and Validation Reports); (2) eliminate the Release 2 and Release 3 concurrency; (3) bolster testing for Release 2 to improve quality; (4) enable additional time and resources for the taxpayer portal (important as this the only customer front facing impact of this project); (5) build a timeline for Release 3 that is based on trend capabilities; and (6) build in space for a cannabis tax type.

By creating a new baseline, the project will result in a system that safeguards the State's ability to collect all taxes and therefore fund key services while also enabling Maryland taxpayers to interact with up-to-date functionality and secure applications.

The costs associated with this Modification account for a new scope with two additional tax types and Portal Pilot, earlier implementation of Portal, and modifications to coded functionality in production. It is critical that the Integrated Tax Solution be provided by the current vendor in a single holistic COTS product. For this reason and due to the contract being a firm fixed-price, the Price Analysis was completed as a historical-based analysis and determined to be fair and reasonable.

The modification amount includes a 10% contingency added to the proposed amount for the base term to cover unforeseen circumstances that may be encountered during implementation. Circumstances may include temporary staff, additional hardware/software, legislative changes requiring new scope, or project delays caused by shifting State priorities.







Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of availability of a Request for Proposals (RFP) was posted on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) July 23, 2021. Additionally, 35 firms were directly solicited. Four proposals were received in response to the solicitation and all were initially determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

During the technical evaluation, two proposals were determined to not be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award and eliminated from the competition due to failure to timely respond to the first request for cure.

Financial proposals were obtained from the two remaining offerors, which asked the offerors to provide the unit prices to the users for specified services. Since these services will be self-funded based on usage and therefore at no cost to the State, the contract amount is an estimate based on data from the current contract, not on the financial proposal. The prices proposed by the other offeror were determined to be extremely high and unreasonable to consider for possible award. The offeror was notified that their overall proposal was not acceptable for award and was determined to be not reasonably susceptible based on their total evaluated price.

The Total Evaluated Price and the Award Amount are different due to the nature of this procurement and how the total evaluated price was determined based on a sample of different categories of transactions. Since it is up to each agency to determine whether and how they will use these services, the financial proposal form provides historical transaction data for the offerors to price to allow the calculation of a total evaluated price and determine financial rankings. The award amount is estimated based on data from the current contract usage.

NICUSA has extensive experience providing these services to many states, including the State of Maryland. Based on its experience, NICUSA was able to structure its approach in a manner that would provide lower fees to the users. Therefore, the award is recommended to NICUSA with the single remaining proposal that was determined to be the most advantageous to the State.
