Regular Positions to be Created

This position, being created in the Department of Information Technology (DoIT), will lead and coordinate special IT projects for Charlotte Hall Veterans Home (CHVH). This position involves providing specialized support directly to CHVH and their staff in the areas of end user support and services. This position provides advanced technical expertise, support, and guidance on CHVH IT initiatives. The role may be involved in lifecycle activities such as agency-specific assigned technical work on project coordination, project prioritization, collection and research of relevant technical data, regression testing of IT hardware and software, computer security tools, and potential endpoint management solutions. This position is responsible for supporting all DoIT-approved Windows and non-Windows OS systems, network printers, and copiers. This position ensures that appropriate processes and procedures are maintained, consistent with published State policies and guidelines in the areas of end user device technologies and management, systems administration, device security, disaster recovery, and relevant technical architecture.





Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

This position is responsible for supporting standard productivity software as determined and approved by DoIT, including but not limited to Microsoft Office suite, Google Suite, and Adobe products. While Google Chrome is the State's preferred browser, familiarity with other browsers is expected. This position is also expected to support video conference tools such as Google Meet, Zoom, WebEx, and GoToMeeting. This position encompasses providing support to agency Executive staff members, VIP customers and visitors. It entails supporting their technology needs and user support requirements, adapting to fast-paced and dynamic environments with the ability to multitask efficiently and effectively, and is responsible for coordination of all efforts towards resolution of the support request.

CHVH does not have a dedicated full-time IT support position and the State is expending double the resources for contractual assistance than this position would require. Having this as a permanent position will not only conserve State funds but also ensure there is a dedicated full-time resource at CHVH.

DBM REMARKS: The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management has certified that funds are available in the Department of Veterans Affairs budget for the new position for which approval is requested. If the Board approves this request, 39 positions will have been approved within the Rule of 100 for FY 2024.







Project Description: This multi-phase project entails the planning, design, and construction of a new Biological and Enhanced Nutrient Removal (BNR/ENR) wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) at a design capacity of 40,000 gallons per day (gpd) to replace the existing Ewell WWTP, which is over 40 years old and in a very deteriorated condition. The project also includes the upgrade of the wastewater collection and conveyance system. Upon completion of the BNR and ENR facilities, the new WWTP, located in Ewell, will be capable of achieving an effluent concentration goal of 3.0 mg/L for Total Nitrogen and 0.3 mg/L for Total Phosphorus. This will allow 83% reduction in nitrogen and 90% reduction in phosphorus, reducing nutrients to the Frances Gut and ultimately to the Chesapeake Bay. In addition, the project includes decommissioning of the existing Tylerton WWTP, an overhaul of three existing pumping stations, and the construction of a new sanitary force main for the conveyance of wastewater from Tylerton to the new Ewell WWTP. This particular action pertains to the construction of the replaced Ewell WWTP. This project will be constructed in accordance with coastal and non-coastal resiliency guidelines developed as part of the Coast Smart Program to reduce climate change risks to such projects.



Gilbane advertised for bids on construction packages for demolition, concrete, glass & glazing, food service equipment, HVAC/plumbing, electrical, and A/V in the publications/services identified above. Competitive bids were received on September 22, 2023 for demolition, concrete, and A/V, on September 27, 2023 for HVAC / plumbing and electrical, and on October 11, 2023 for glass & glazing, and food service equipment by representatives from Gilbane.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on September 27, 2023 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and Gilbane and MSA representatives were in attendance.

Gilbane submitted GMP #2 Package on October 23, 2023.

Future GMP Package(s) will be presented to the Board of Public Works for approval.

The overall MBE participation goal for the construction phase of this project was set at 35% with sub-goals of 8% African American-owned and 11% Women-owned. 

These boiler failures now constitute a potential threat/hazard to institutional/general safety, security and health. The Department needs to provide temporary boilers to supply steam in the interim. Two rental boilers will be required for the duration of the repair.

Basis for Selection: This work is time sensitive in that a lack of hot water and heat represents a health and safety hazard. Additionally, not addressing the matter could leave the Department and State open to litigation from the incarcerated peoples. These repairs are vital to continue providing a safe and healthy environment for the incarcerated peoples' population and staff.

Due to the massive boiler system failure, M&M Welding and Fabricators Inc. (M&M) was selected, after also looking into the DGS Statewide contract for rentals, due to its availability and familiarity with PATX to furnish and install temporary boilers to restore heat and hot water to the building expeditiously.

Remarks: On February 22, 2023, the Maryland Department of Planning, through the State Clearinghouse process, approved the recommendation to demolish the Patapsco Building, subject to Board of Public Works approval.

This building previously housed administrative and warehouse space for the University, but as of early 2023, the building is vacant. A Facility Condition Assessment commissioned in 2021 found that nearly \$2 million in immediate repairs and replacement work are needed, and ongoing maintenance costs are unsustainable. This area of campus is part of the University's Discovery District and has long been slated for future economic development projects due to its proximity to the WMATA College Park-U of MD Metrorail Station and a future Purple Line station. The site is also proximate to the Aviation Landing redevelopment project in which UMD is a key participant.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20230111-0022. It is recommended to approve the demolition of the three-story, 53,964-square-foot building known as the Patapsco Building (#805) with office space, conference rooms, and warehouse space, upon consideration of the Maryland Department of the Environment's qualifying comments.


Requesting Agency Remarks: At the onset of the project, P. Flanigan & Sons, Inc. notified the MAA of a 400-day lead time for the charging infrastructure main electrical switchboard. The long lead time severely impacted the baseline schedule. Since Construction Notice to Proceed, the lead time has increased from 400 days to 501 days. All civil work will be completed by the current contract end date of December 16, 2023.

In accordance with the Contract Special Provisions, Project Schedule Revisions, the schedule was adjusted from 210 calendar days to 273 calendar days due to the project delays. Temporary bus charging services were required due to the supply chain issues delaying the delivery of the main electrical switchboard. These supply chain issues are beyond the contractor's control and would have delayed the implementation of the new bus fleet by up to ten months. MAA developed a two-phase approach to allow for temporary bus charging services to serve the electric vehicle bus fleet upon arrival. The electrical work for a temporary (rental) switchboard will complete approximately December 16, 2023, which will be considered substantial completion of the project. As a result of the long lead time of the permanent switchboard, expected in April 2024, the anticipated project completion date has been extended to May 31, 2024.

The additional funds and time will allow for removal of the temporary bus charging services and two additional BGE mobilizations for outages. The first outage is required to energize the temporary charging service. The second is required to switch services from the second phase of temporary services to the final condition.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing a DBE goal, as well as a Small Business Enterprise designation. P. Flanigan & amp; Sons, Inc. has committed to the established goal of 24.03% and is currently achieving DBE participation of 21.39%. The remaining DBE subcontract work includes sweeping services, manufacturing and delivery of Ready-Mix Concrete, concrete work, and trucking.




Requesting Agency Remarks: Lighting Maintenance, Inc. (Lighting Maintenance) has satisfactorily provided all labor, equipment, and expertise to perform interior/exterior lighting maintenance and light pole inspection repair and maintenance services at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports. Lighting Maintenance maintains a high level of customer service at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN airports while providing high quality, reliable and responsive on-call maintenance, and repairs to our lighting systems.

The contract allows for a Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase for the renewal period. When the original contract was approved in 2019, a 2% CPI was estimated for the option period. The current CPI is 4.9%. With the 4.9% CPI increase, the renewal cost for the renewal is considerably less than the original contract bid price submitted by the only other bidder, therefore the price is considerate fair and reasonable.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and/or VSBE goals, as well as a Small Business Enterprise designation. An 18% MBE participation goal was committed to by the awardee. Lighting Maintenance is currently not meeting its MBE goal due to an MBE firm not being responsive to request. Lighting Maintenance requested a modification to its MBE plan to remove the MBE firm and replace them with another MBE firm. MAA, after reviewing the request and verifying the details, approved the modification to the plan. Lighting Maintenance is confident the revised plan will allow them to meet the 18% goal before the contract expires. 

Additionally, four vendors were directly solicited. After an extension to foster greater competition, the due date for all bids was May 23, 2023. Despite this extension, only one bid was received on the bid due date, which was deemed responsive and responsible.

Other potential bidders were contacted to determine why they opted out of the bidding process for this award, and two responded. One vendor stated that they did not have access to the chemical supplies outlined in the statement of work. The second vendor claimed that their workload would preclude a timely submission. Therefore, that vendor decided to forgo the bid all together.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

This contract is intended to provide comprehensive energy supply procurement management services. These services include conducting real-time online reverse energy auctions, providing energy procurement expertise, and providing advisory services for acquiring green energy attributes and achieving carbon reduction mandates.

The overall pricing is projected to be lower than that offered to other states. Maryland's pricing approach, a one-time tiered fixed fee based on the number of accounts, is unique compared to how other public sector customers pay for services, which typically have a retail adder. A retail adder is a firm fixed price added to the supply cost for each kilowatt hour (kWh) and paid to the offeror by the energy supplier for the term of use of the rate. Under these terms, payment of the retail adder could extend beyond the contract life between the offeror, supplier, and DGS, which is why DGS elected to use a different pricing approach. Enel X explained that if the State of Maryland used a retail adder, based on their scope, it would be approximately 5/10th of a penny (0.0005) specifically because the State of Maryland has supplemental services broken out from the auction. Compared to similar government entities, DGS benefits from fixed pricing over retail adder for auction services as other entities with similar kWH usage are 33.33% to 51.85% higher per auction. Additionally, DGS will not pay adder fees ranging from \$180,000 to \$255,000 per year for services that may not be rendered, or auction services not provided. Supplemental consulting services are separated out and will be provided at fixed prices.

The proposed annual hourly price increases by 2.96% per year, which is less than the current CPI index of 3.7% and is an average cost escalation for a multi-year contract. The pricing was compared to the supplemental service labor rates in the 2022 DGS Energy Risk Management Services Contract. Enel X's pricing was 24% lower on average and the price was determined to be fair and reasonable.

MBE and VSBE participation was not included because historically very few companies have been capable of consulting and performing a reverse auction. The last solicitation for these services, in 2011, only received two offers, and neither company was an MBE. Research regarding potential MBEs for this procurement through eMMA, the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) Directory of Certified Firms, and a review of NAICS codes for Energy Consulting Services, LEED Consulting for Environmental Engineering, and Energy Efficiency Inspection Services resulted in zero MBE firms.









Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of availability of a Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on March 9, 2022, and 28 potential vendors were notified directly. Four proposals were received, and all but one were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The proposal deemed not reasonably susceptible was due to the offeror submitting an underdeveloped proposal, which did not meet the minimum passing score. The Evaluation Committee met to review and score the technical proposals. Actuarial Research Corporation presented the most favorable offer. Although Actuarial Research did not have the highest technical ranking, its proposal demonstrated thorough knowledge of, the capacity to manage the complex subject matter, and capability to perform the required services. Actuarial Research scored slightly lower than the highest ranked technical proposal. Combined with its lowest priced offer, Actuarial Research's proposal provides the State with the best value.

The Maryland Health Services Cost Review Commission (HSCRC) is responsible for regulating Maryland's \$20 billion hospital industry. Under the all-payer hospital rate-setting system, the Health Services Cost Review Commission has developed methodologies to increase hospital efficiency and promote cost containment for both inpatient and outpatient hospital services. Under the Total Cost of Care (TCOC) model, the State is accountable to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for achieving certain cost and quality targets for the State's Medicare population. The HSCRC is responsible for tracking and analyzing the State's performance against these goals. Requesting Agency Remarks: Maryland Primary Care Plan (MDPCP) currently has over 530 practices across the State. Since 2019, the MDPCP has engaged the Mosaic Group to address the opioid epidemic at the primary care level. Mosaic Group has successfully implemented the SBIRT model into 373 practices, with over 200 reporting Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) data monthly.

Mosaic Group introduced the SBIRT model in Baltimore City in 2011. The SBIRT model is an evidence-based approach to addressing substance use disorder. In 2013, the Behavioral Health Administration partnered with Mosaic to establish an initiative to provide SBIRT services across Maryland using federal funding. Since the Mosaic Group is the only vendor that has been found, with a proprietary suite of tools, unique experience, neighboring jurisdictions, District of Columbia and West Virginia, awarded similar federal grant funding to the Mosaic Group. Inc. as their SBIRT vendor.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The MOUD Access to Care plan addresses a critical component of Maryland's State Opioid Response Plan to expand access to life saving medications for treating opioid use disorder. With a strong foundation of over 530 Maryland MDPCP practices now implementing SBIRT, the MDPCP program has a unique opportunity to support these practitioners in their ability to treat patients using FDA-approved medications that can be prescribed in office-based settings. Additionally, Mosaic Group's proprietary suite of tools was utilized to implement substance use disorder (SUD) response interventions in all Maryland SBIRT care settings. To maintain consistency across sites in the statewide response to opioids and SUD, MDPCP practices should continue the use of these tools, which include specific interventions for SBIRT and MOUD, provider training, electronic health record (EHR) modification, and implementation of medical treatment order sets, all of which are provided by Mosaic Group. The potential impact of a delayed start could subsequently result in underutilized federal funding of the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant. Additionally, delaying MOUD prescriber training further delays patients' access to life-saving medications for opioid use disorder.

MDH has concluded that the price submitted is fair and reasonable based on market research between several entities that include similar services provided by the same vendor, Mosaic Group, with the highest entity for CDC/National Association being \$1,700,017.40, which is 75% higher than MDH's current base contract amount of \$635,000. The corresponding hours for the CDC/National Association are 8,008 hours compared to 4,264 hours for MDH. This includes personnel, operating expenses, travel, program-related materials, and overhead costs.

The focus areas for implementation are counties with the highest increase in overdose deaths, compared to other counties across the state: Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Baltimore City, Harford, Montgomery, Prince George's, and Washington counties.




A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* (eMMA) on December 6, 2022 and 15 potential contractors were directly notified of the solicitation. Three proposals were received, and all were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The recommended offeror Witt O'Brien's LLC was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and overall.

Witt O'Brien's LLC's proposal demonstrated significant experience with federal funding compliance in state and local programs including helping with compliance procedures for Kansas' broadband program, which uses many of the same funding sources. Genfare, LLC received the highest overall technical ranking, and their price proposal was nearly \$7 million less than the other offeror's second ranked technical proposal. Given the higher ranked technical proposal and lower cost price proposal, GenFare, LLC's proposal was determined to be the most advantageous to the State.

This contract provides for the replacement of 727 current fare boxes on transit buses and is a component of the overall new Electronic Fare Collection System. The new bus fare boxes will interface with central software, assist operators with fare identification, and be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The contractor will be responsible for:

- removing (and disposing of) existing fare boxes and equipment;
- furnishing and installing new transit fare boxes and related equipment; and
- implementing system software for the new fare boxes.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MTA Procurement Review Group (PRG) reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and/or VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Enterprise designation. Although a 10% DBE goal was established for this contract, Genfare, LLC has committed to exceeding the goal by .8% (10.8%). No VSBE participation goal was established due to the limited number of firms available to perform. Additionally, no Small Business Enterprise designation was established after considering the contract value and breadth of the scope of work. However, the DBE subcontractor will assist with device installation.

This contract includes a provision authorizing an extension for a total period no longer than onethird of the base term to spend funds remaining on the contract as provided in the Board of Public Works (BPW) Advisory 1995-1.







Background: Approval is requested to declare +/- 21.09 acres of the Deer's Head Hospital property surplus to the needs of the State of Maryland for sale to Hudson Health Services, Inc. so that they can expand and make capital improvements to their behavioral health services facilities. Hudson Health Services, Inc. has leased this property from the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) since 1994, with the property being used to provide behavioral health services including addiction treatment, detoxification care and supportive housing services. The property is excess to the needs of MDH.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20221130-0914. It is recommended to declare the +/- 21.09-acre parcel of the Deer's Head Hospital Center property surplus to the needs of the State, upon consideration of the Maryland Department of the Environment's qualifying comments. None of the local or state agencies that provided review comments expressed an interest in acquiring the properties.
