Requesting Remarks: The College is requesting approval to award the above referenced contract to the Dade Star Group, LLC. The solicitation was advertised via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on April 10, 2023 and bids were due on April 28, 2023. A total of 195 vendors were notified via eMMA; three vendors attended the pre-bid meeting and site visit. Ample time was given for vendors to request additional information and to submit a bid. The recommended awardee, Dade Star Group, LLC, is not only an SBR vendor but also a certified MBE firm; therefore, achieving a 100% MBE participation on this project. It is to be noted that the MBE goal for this project is 20%; however, Dade Star subcontracted 23.8% of the work to performed by three certified MBE firms not including themselves (MBE Prime) workforce to meeting the goal.

Originally the replacement of the Guard Booth was included in the Loop Road project with an estimated value of \$300,000. The College determined that it would be in its best interest to solicit the project separately under its procurement authority. The price is deemed to be fair and reasonable as the pricing is below the original engineer's estimate and the square footage cost is consistent with the market pricing.

This Program implements on-the-ground natural and nature-based projects in priority areas where nature can help communities become more resilient to impacts from water. Targeting models, such as the Coastal Resiliency Assessment, identify areas where restoration can provide the greatest protection benefits for infrastructure, communities, businesses, and habitats. Datasets, such as impervious cover, highlight urban and inland areas where green infrastructure is needed to address more intense rain events. Projects will protect both public and private investments, while demonstrating a suite of nature-based projects that will enhance the ability of communities to respond to or recover from extreme hazards like storms and more frequent and intense rain events, or chronic hazards like nuisance flooding and sea level rise.

DNR will provide technical assistance and grant funds to entities to design and construct living shoreline, marsh enhancement, green infrastructure, and nature-based projects. These projects will reduce the impacts of flooding on vulnerable communities across the state.

The renovation of Legacy Buildings Baldwin Hall and Cummings House is the next phase of the housing plan. Both buildings, built in 1929 and 1952, respectively, are located in the center of campus and will require a comprehensive renovation to meet current codes and to bring them up to current market expectations for student housing.

The renovations will include energy-efficient components like a new electrified mechanical system, controls, LED lighting with lighting control sensors, insulated windows to reduce heat loss, and other features to reduce energy and operational costs.

Each GMP will have its own separate MBE participation goal based on the availability of MDOTcertified firms. We have set a participation goal of 40.00% for the project as a whole. GMP 3A includes MBE Firm participation of 45.65% with a cumulative current project total of 41.50%. The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company and their MBE Partner Mason Dixon Builders have paid MBE Firms 17.07% of the total contracted billings to date.

The Design is currently complete and construction work commenced in May 2023. We expect the project's MBE participation to meet the established goal of 40.00% per contract. All bid packages included in GMP 3A are awarded based on best value as the procurement process.

This request is for the Board of Public Works to approve Morgan State University awarding GMP 3A for the total contract amount of \$4,116,540.

The estimated total project cost is \$33,500,000.

The Department of Labor faces an aggressive statutory timeline for implementing the Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) program. Formal regulations are to be published in January 2024. Receipt of tax contributions will begin on January 1, 2025. Claims processing and benefits payments will begin on January 1, 2026. It is estimated that, by 2027 to 2028, FAMLI will annually receive approximately \$2 billion in tax revenue, process over 200,000 claims, and pay out \$1.5 billion in benefits. The Department of Labor anticipates hiring over 500 FTEs in FY 2024 – 2026 to staff the FAMLI Division.

FAMLI's primary staffing goals for FY 2024 are to (1) hire the Division's leadership tier that will design and build the organization; (2) bring onboard the core technical team needed to kickstart and oversee development of FAMLI's digital platform; and (3) staff up the Employer Services Directorate, in order to process employer plan elections in the summer of 2024, and to be ready to start receiving tax contributions on January 1, 2025.

The Department of Labor received an initial allotment of 16 new positions for use in FY 2023 and FY 2024. FAMLI's implementation plan requires 67 additional new positions for FY 2024. The 24 new positions requested will allow FAMLI to meet its staffing goals for the first and second quarters of FY 2024.

DBM REMARKS: The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management has certified that funds have been allocated for the new positions for which approval is requested. If the Board approves this request, 38 positions will have been approved within the Rule of 100 for FY 2024.

The recovery site mimics MDOT's Data Center. This location provides a highly secured state of the art building, containing replication of hardware and functional/compatible equivalent-like equipment and network connectivity. The activation allowed MDOT to keep its operations running through tape storage backups at the recovery site beginning June 1, 2023, through June 30, 2023, at which time the IBM Mainframe at the Data Center in Glen Burnie became functional, and the activation officially ended. The contract was officially awarded on 8/14/2023, following receipt and review of the invoice.

The Disaster Recovery Services for the emergency were activated through a contract with DK Consulting, LLC, TORFP J01B3400036, which expired on June 30, 2023. Four bids were received on April 25, 2023; however, two bids were rejected for failing to conform to all material respects. One bidder did not submit a bid bond as required and the other bidder did not meet the MBE participation goal. Therefore, the bids were deemed non-responsive and rejected pursuant to COMAR 21.06.02.03(b). No protests were filed.

The low bidder, Vino Construction, LLC, (Vino) bid contained a mistake. Specifically, Vino's Bid Proposal contained a bidding error in which Vino's price was less than the three percent (3%) minimum total price for the construction quality control plan by \$2.67. The \$2.67 is trivial and insignificant when contrasted with the total cost of the contract, \$652,838.68. Therefore, in accordance with COMAR 21.06.02.04, Minor Irregularities in Bids or Proposals, the Procurement Officer waived the error as a minor irregularity. Waiving the error by Vino is not prejudicial to other bidders because under any reasonable interpretation of bids submitted, Vino's bid is still the lowest bid and there is no displacement of any other bidders.

Because Vino's bid was much lower than the other bidder, MAA met with Vino to verify that Vino understood the entire scope of work to be performed and to confirm that the work could be performed at the quoted price. At the meeting, Vino demonstrated that they understood all requirements and confirmed the job would be completed at the quoted price.

The variation in the bid pricing is due to the Vino self-performing the maintenance of traffic and the hourly rates for laborers.

Although Matos Builders LLC was ranked highest for technical merit, its total evaluated price is 30.20% over the engineer's estimate. Control Sources, L.L.C. was ranked lowest on technical merit. While its total evaluated price was the lowest, it is 24.11% under the engineer's estimate and some of the prices seem unreasonably low, raising the possibility of future claims and performance issues.

Offerors submitted firm unit prices for estimated quantities of various components of the facility improvement work required by this contract. The sum of those unit prices multiplied by the proposal-form quantities resulted in the evaluated price. MPA will pay at the unit prices offered by Baltimore Contractors, Inc. for the services provided for each work-order, approved by MPA, within the not-to-exceed value of \$10,000,000.

The contract contains a provision authorizing an extension of the term of the contract, but no increase in the value, for a period not exceeding one-third of the original three-year term, to spend contract funds unspent at the end of the original three-year term.

Initially, the bid due date was scheduled for March 15, 2023. However, the bid due date was extended until March 22, 2023 to direct solicit for additional bids. Five vendors were directly notified of the solicitation via email. On March 22, 2023, a single bid was received. As a result, the three potential vendors who attended the pre-bid conference on February 24, 2023 were contacted.

One of those potential vendors disclosed that "Cancellation for Convenience" clause outlined in the Invitation for Bids (IFB) ultimately led to their decision not to bid. Another potential vendor claimed that the bus routes described in the IFB were outside of their service area. The last potential vendor expressed that they opted not to bid on this contract because (1) they felt that the scope of work was beyond their capacity and (2) that they believed the fuel reimbursement was insufficient. Consequently, it was determined that accepting the awardee's bid was in the best interest of the State to prevent a disruption of this vital services. Additionally, the awardee's bid price was deemed fair and reasonable, pursuant to the Market Price Analysis method outlined in BPW Advisory 2016-1. The MTA conducted market research by comparing similarly situated contracts to this award.

Commuter Bus Route 201 operates weekdays and weekends between Montgomery County and Baltimore City. This route operates 26 daily trips on weekdays and 24 daily trips on weekends and holidays.

The contract amounts include the prospective awardees' bid value, plus built-in reimbursement costs.

The 5% MBE goal is for the total Contract amount, including the built-in fuel reimbursement costs. No VSBE goal was assigned due to a limited number of certified vendors available to perform this service.

SHA's POFD stated that the vendor's disagreement with the evaluation is not a basis for reevaluation or overturning the reasonable scoring of the evaluation committee. In addition, SHA acknowledged a typographical error in the manually created scoring sheet presented during the debriefing. The debriefing sheet was completely separate from the equations used by SHA during the rating and ranking process and the error did not alter the selection of contract awardees. SHA provided the vendor with a corrected sheet as an attachment to the POFD response. The vendor was notified of their ability to file an appeal with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) within 10 days from the date of receipt. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Aviation Administration (MAA) is requesting to replace a 2013 Pierce Fire Engine with the current mileage of 101,945. The 2013 fire engine has experience repeated repairs over the past nine calendar years. Every year, the equipment continues to become more unreliable to respond to emergency Fire Rescue calls.

To provide uninterrupted emergency services, the equipment must be maintained in superior operating condition and should be promptly replaced when adequate performance levels can no longer be assured. The replacement of the equipment is essential to the safe and efficient operations for the BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport Fire Rescue Department. Not replacing the unit may cause inefficiencies in responding to the public needs.

The contract provides the Pierce Enforcer, 4 Door, Full-Tilt, Aluminum Cab, Aluminum Body, Single Axle, 1250 GPM Pump, Mid Mounted Pumper Fire Engine at a base price of \$683,552.00, processing cost of \$2,000.00, and equipment options at a cost of \$709,433.00. The total configured price is \$1,394,985.00 with a lead time of 24 - 30 months after receipt of order.

Through market research the MAA was able to compare the price of the 2025 Pierce Fire Engine off the HGAC Buy contract to a proposal from Atlantic Emergency Solutions for the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority Fire & Rescue Department (MWAA FRD) dated February 14, 2023. MWAA FRD base price for a Piece Enforcer was \$683,552.00, which is the same base price MAA is paying off the HGACBuy contract. Therefore, MAA considers the price from the HGACBuy contract to be fair and reasonable.

The contract with Atlantic Emergency Solutions, Inc. has been negotiated per COMAR 21.05.09, Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing. Utilizing this procurement method will allow MAA to realize savings in time and money (administrative cost) in obtaining the Fire Engine.

This intergovernmental cooperative purchase contract did not lend itself to the inclusion of MBE or VSBE participation goals.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Peer Outreach and Support is an approved rebalancing activity by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for its ability to make a personal connection between people with disabilities who have experience with institutional settings and nursing facility residents to educate them about their community living options.

MDH has determined that it will continue to fund Peer Outreach and Support Services under the MFP Demonstration Grant. The project requires a significant amount of start-up activities prior to the vendor being able to maintain ongoing peer outreach and support. These include recruiting peers to perform peer roles, training peers, providing outreach materials and, among other activities, learning how to use the Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) Maryland Tracking System. Finally, the vendor has successfully performed these services since 2012 developing the capacity to continue to perform and track peer outreach and support services and has well established relationships with administrative and direct care staff.

Given the significant amount of expertise required to perform peer outreach and support, it is unlikely MDOD could identify another vendor with the capacity to successfully perform these services without significant disruption and a significant increase in the contract price. The value of the contract has increased modestly over the years in an attempt to offset escalating operating costs but has essentially remained flat. The sole source procurement method provides MDOD with the best opportunity to secure a proposal that is most advantageous to the state and to avoid any disruption in service.

MBE participation was not established because there are no MBEs that provide these services.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The higher the quantity produced by a single vendor, the lower the per unit cost, utilizing one vendor (with one print set up) is advantageous in terms of cost to the State. This is not an ongoing services contract with subcontracting opportunities beyond the specific printing orders that are placed prior to the elections. The contract is an indefinite quantity with a firm fixed unit price contract.

The Provisional Ballot Application is a complex print job that includes carbon copy, perforated pages, a double-sided envelope, and adhesive material for affixing documents and closing the envelope to ensure the secrecy of the ballot. RR Donnelley offers a unique skill set in that they are able to provide all of these functionalities in one document. They are also able to provide services to revise the document to adjust to any legal or policy changes that may occur during the duration of the contract. RR Donnelley has proven experience with the production of provisional ballot applications and similar deliverables over the past five election cycles and experience with other Maryland agencies. RR Donnelley & Sons Company has four manufacturing facilities in Maryland and 1,500 employees in Maryland.

Taking into consideration the additional sheet of paper with this application version, the unit costs reflect a very minimal increase compared to the costs of the previous contract in 2017. The additional sheet of paper (five sheets instead of four sheets) means that the per sheet cost of the 2017 contract and this contract are comparable for all increments except the 1-50,000 increment in which case the new contract is slightly higher. SBE has determined the price to be fair and reasonable.

The contract base term covers the 2024 Presidential Elections. The 2 two-year renewal options, if exercised, would extend the contract term through June 30, 2029.

DHCD conducted a review of eight recent proposals received for various information management systems related to housing finance agency functions. Most annual increases ranged from 0-10% per year with a few higher outliers. DHCD reviewed the annual price increases of this contract, approximately 12% for the first 15-month period, 10% for the second year, and 10% for the third year. DHCD determined the pricing to be fair and reasonable.

DHCD had attempted to do a short-term bridge contract to maintain services while conducting contract negotiations with HDS to settle pricing terms of the new contract, however this became unnecessarily complicated and DHCD determined that a retroactive contract would be the best option at the time. DHCD also encountered difficulties due to staff turnover around the time of contract renewal, this put the Department behind on several procurement projects. DHCD was unable to execute a contract in due time to present to the Board, and as a result, we are submitting this contract to the Board for retroactive approval. The department apologizes for this matter and is working hard to ensure that this type of unauthorized contract action does not occur in the future.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Chapters 639 and 640 of the 2022 Laws of Maryland (House Bill 1030) require MHEC to design and implement a unified scholarship application and financial aid processing system to replace the current MDCAPS, with the intent of the General Assembly that the new system be in place by September 1, 2025.

The passing of House Bill 1030 significantly impacts several of the State's financial aid programs and added new financial aid programs to the point that the cost of enhancements to the current MDCAPS exceeded the projected amounts for the time and materials portion of Contract years 1 and 3 and are projected to exceed the time and materials portion of Contract year 4.

The contract provides software support (maintenance and enhancement) for the Maryland College Aid Processing System (MDCAPS). MHEC's Office of Student Financial Assistance has a comprehensive and complex customized web-based system to administer more than 27 State-funded student financial aid programs such as the Howard P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award Program, Maryland Community College Promise scholarship, and Charles W. Riley Firefighter, Ambulance, and Rescue Squad Member scholarships.

Annually, MHEC processes approximately 260,000 applications and forms, fields an estimated 40,000 incoming calls, and responds to more than 20,000 emails from students, families, postsecondary institutions and legislators. MHEC's role is critical in that it supports both the Governor's education goal to increase higher education degree completion and a key MHEC goal to "Achieve a system of post-secondary education that advances the educational goals of all by promoting and supporting access, affordability, and completion."

No MBE subcontracting opportunities were available when procuring the base contract, however it is anticipated that MBE subcontracting opportunities will be available as part of procuring the new MDCAPS system.

The reason for retroactivity is due to unforeseen enhancements to MDCAPS necessitated by legislation passed by the General Assembly (as Chapter 639, House Bill 1030) which significantly impacted several of the State's financial aid programs and added new financial aid programs, which the cost of these additional enhancements to MDCAPS exceeded the projected amounts for the time and materials portion of the Contract in years 1 and 3 and are projected to exceed the time and materials portion of the Contract in the current year 4. MHEC overspent the allocated \$604,271.99 amount by the end of the third year which left MHEC at a deficit of funds for the contract's fourth year. As a result, it is deemed necessary to increase the NTE amount to cover the retroactive costs of enhancements to MDCAPS required in years 1 and 3 of the Contract, and projected in the current year 4, and to modify the contract to increase the NTE amount for year 5 and 6, and allow for option years 7 and 8 of the contract to account for any potential delays in the development of the unified scholarship application and new financial aid processing system prior to final implementation.

Agency Remarks: On February 22, 2022, a protest was filed, alleging various flaws in MSDE's evaluation. MSDE agreed with elements of the protest and initiated fair and reasonable corrective actions in collaboration with the Office of The Attorney General. The corrective technical evaluation showed that only four vendors would be reasonably susceptible to award due to the complexity of the technical solution. The remaining six vendors were notified of this action and offered a second debriefing. After corrective action was taken, one of the four was also deemed non-susceptible after being non-responsive to critical document requests pertaining to key personnel.

Summary: This report lists each property that DNR had leased under its delegated authority from the Board of Public Works for Fiscal Year 2023. The next report will be submitted to the Board of Public Works within 90 days following June 30, 2024.

The 430 leased properties are located throughout the state and include 11,553.48 acres of crop and grazing land, and 37,408 acres for Chesapeake Forest Lands hunt club leases, producing annual revenues of \$2,859,382.13*.

The various types of leased properties under delegated authority consist of 76 cropland; 13 grazing land; 19 dwellings; 23 outbuildings; 86 operational employees' dwellings; and 213 Chesapeake Forest Lands hunt club leases.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department of Information Technology (DoIT), through the Department of General Services ("DGS"), seeks to execute a third Participating Addendum for a dedicated Tier 3 Google GSuite Premium Support ("Participating Addendum") from Carahsoft Technology Corporation ("Carahsoft") under the National Association of State Procurement Officials Cloud Solutions 2016-2026 ("NASPO Contract"). The Premium Support provides a Technical Account Manager (TAM) who is the liaison between the State of Maryland and Google product engineers insuring proper implementation, support, and service disruption resolution. There have been two (2) prior one-year Participating Addendums: terms July 7, 2021 to July 6, 2022 and October 8, 2022 to October 7, 2023.

The Premiere Support Contract was initiated in response to several issues DoIT had with Google changes to the Google Enterprise Workspace Platform. In the past several years Google changes have caused service disruptions impacting the Workspace Platform performance and end users.

Some of the Google changes cause security issues. DoIT's contract required the data region to be changed to the United States. The data migration took several weeks due to the data size. The migration encountered problems requiring the TAM to escalate the issues to Google product engineers to resolve Security alert issues. The resolution for the phishing alert center notifications is still ongoing.

Premium support continues to be integral to DoIT ongoing and future Google Enterprise Workspace projects. Without Premiere Support DoIT will not have the expertise necessary to assist with the management and implementation of new and ongoing Enterprise Workspace projects.

MBE participation was not established for this contract because there are no subcontracting opportunities available.

DoIT apologizes for the lateness of this submission for the September 20, 2023 Board of Public Works agenda.
