#### 8. <u>MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION</u> State Highway Administration

*Recommendation:* That the Board of Public Works create 20 positions.

*Authority:* Section 7-236, State Finance and Procurement Article, and Section 34 of Chapter 716 of 2024 (Budget Bill for FY 2025)

**Requesting Agency Remarks**: Section 34 of Chapter 716 of 2024 (Budget Bill for FY 2025) authorizes the Board of Public Works to create additional positions beyond the Rule of 100 provided that 1.25 full-time equivalent (FTE) contractual positions are abolished for each regular position added and there is no increase in agency funding in the current budget or the next two budgets.

The Maryland Department of Transportation requests 20 new positions via contractual conversions to support the critical work required to maintain State Highway Administration (SHA). These positions are 100% funded by available special funds within MDOT's Transportation Trust Fund. The 20 positions created are within the following State Highway Administration units based on the priorities as outlined:

- 1. Three Office of Finance (OOF) PINs for management of the Local Public Agency (LPA) program, Transportation Alternatives Programs (TAP), and the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP)/PROTECT program.
- 2. Twelve District Construction Inspectors to reduce reliance on consultants and implement the Governor's Work Zone Safety Work Group recommendations.
- 3. One Multi-Modal Safety Coordinator to manage the Pedestrian Safety Action Plan (PSAP) and the Vulnerable Road User (VRU) assessment plus the anticipated new Complete Streets policy requirements.
- 4. One Program Manager Senior in the Chief Engineer's Office to manage SHA's project portfolio, provide training and oversight, identify process improvements, manage project quality and risk, and maintain a lessons-learned register.
- 5. One Procurement Review Group and MBE/DBE Participation Plan Role in the Office of Equal Opportunity (OEO). In 2022 SHA transferred the Procurement Review Group (PRG) and Minority and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (MBE/DBE) functions from the Office of Construction (OOC) to OEO. OEO requires an additional PRG support position.



#### Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

6. Two Highway Operations Technicians (HOTs) in the Office of Transportation Mobility and Operations to meet the 30 permanent positions needed to maintain current operations. In 2021, the Office of Transportation Mobility and Operations (OTMO) abolished 40 contractual HOT positions but only received 28 permanent positions. The remaining 2 PINs are intended for the I-695 Part-Time Shoulder Use project in 2026.

The Department identified 25 contractual FTE to be abolished to create the 20 regular positions listed above. This is a ratio of 1.25 contractual FTE abolished to 1.0 regular positions created.

**DBM Remarks:** The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management has certified that the FY 2025 budget includes the contractual positions to be abolished and that funds are available for the new positions for which approval is requested.

**Requesting Agency Remarks**: Section 34 of Chapter 716 of 2024 (Budget Bill for FY 2025) authorizes the Board of Public Works to create additional positions beyond the Rule of 100 provided that 1.25 full-time equivalent (FTE) contractual positions are abolished for each regular position added and if there is no increase in agency funding in the current budget or the next two budgets.

Under state law, a contractual employee is considered a temporary employee. In several cases, however, contractual employees have been employed by MPT for many years. They remain loyal to MPT but are awaiting the opportunity to be assigned a regular, permanent PIN position. The requested positions can be fully covered with special funds from the Viewer Support fund source (R15.307). The following new positions are requested to be created:

- 1. One MPT Associate Producer I position for a current employee of over 2.5 years. This position plays a key part in producing local and national programs for on-air fundraising.
- 2. One MPT Manager for digital fundraising, given that MPT raised \$2.3 million in FY 2023. The current employee has been on contract for almost 2 years and there are no other staff members to assist with these duties.
- 3. One MPT Specialist III position for a current contractual employee who has been on contract for over 6 years. This position fulfills MPT donor obligations that allow us to grow MPT's membership base and raise funds for MPT.
- 4. One MPT Editor to edit weekly episodes of MotorWeek. This PIN has traditionally been designated as a permanent PIN but MPT could only assign a contractual position due to growth. An additional MotorWeek Editor position is a permanent PIN, creating an internal equity issue due to both positions reporting to the same executive producer. This position is notoriously difficult to recruit and maintain employees in due to marketplace competition.

#### Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The Department identified 1.15 additional contractual FTE to be abolished, along with the four conversions, to create the four regular positions listed above. This is a ratio of more than 1.25 contractual FTEs abolished for every 1.0 regular PIN created.

**DBM Remarks:** The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management has certified that the FY 2025 budget includes the contractual positions to be abolished and that funds are available for the new positions for which approval is requested.

This lease is required to maintain MSU's current housing capacity plan of 5,200 for on and offcampus sponsored housing to accommodate enrollment, and the high level of interest among students for residing in university owned or affiliated housing. Continued strong housing demand is expected to exceed current capacity planning of on-campus and off-campus beds of 5,200 for the fall 2025. Further, privatized housing facilities are expected to reach full capacity for the upcoming academic year.

Morgan's Office of Residential Life has recommended that the University add additional housing beds in a location it can control in terms of a safe and healthy college environment and this facility has been identified as a potential location to house students at terms agreeable to the University.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: The DPP experienced the horrific loss of Agent Davis Martinez on May 31, 2024, while in the line of duty. In response to his death, the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) requested security measures for all DPP field offices, and the Department met with the Governor's Office to discuss increased security measures to implement at DPP field offices. As a result of these discussions, the Department determined that it is necessary and essential to obtain armed guard services to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the Department's DPP agents at field offices. This decision not only strengthens the physical security of the premises, but also serves as a deterrent against potential threats and unauthorized access.

Several DPP field offices already had unarmed guards through Statewide contracts. To increase security, the Department reached out to the three Statewide contractors on the Statewide Armed and Unarmed Uniformed Guard Services contract (BPO Nos. 001B3600361, 001B3600362, & 001B3600363) and the Department's own Unarmed Uniformed Guard Services contractor (BPO No. 001B2600401) to modify the contracts from unarmed to armed guards, and to inquire if additional armed guard services could be provided to the remaining DPP field offices. The three Statewide contractors can provide modified services, but require additional time to recruit and train candidates to become armed guards. As a result, this emergency request is to cover the DPP field sites that the Statewide contracts cannot cover in a timely manner.

*Basis for Selection:* Direct solicitations were made to 37 vendors. For each of the 14 DPP field offices, a range of four to eight bids were received for each one (see Attachment I). The awardee for each DPP field office was selected based upon the available start date and then the lowest hourly rates for each DPP field office jurisdiction. Four different vendors were selected as the awardees.

DPSCS first became aware of the roof's deterioration and began plans to repair the roof in 2023. The Department of General Services (DGS) completed an assessment and has plans to add it to their list of capital maintenance projects, but this project did not make it onto the FY 2025 list. With the uncertainty of whether DGS would select the project for an upcoming fiscal year, DPSCS determined an emergency declaration was necessary.



# Remarks (cont'd):

The MCE Woodshop employs a significant number of incarcerated individuals to create furniture and other items. However, MCE has had to close the Woodshop due to safety concerns for the incarcerated individuals as the roof's deterioration has allowed rain to leak into the building. DPSCS is also concerned about the building's electrical systems and Woodshop equipment, as the damaged roof makes the interior of the building susceptible to the elements. It is in the Department's best interest to repair the roof as quickly as possible, since a damaged roof will only worsen over time and cause bigger structural issues to arise as a result.

*Basis for Selection:* DPSCS had previously obtained quotes from vendors when the roof's deterioration was first discovered in 2023. After the emergency declaration was declared, DPSCS reached out to the vendor who had previously provided the Department with the lowest quote.

# 16A. <u>RURAL LEGACY PROGRAM GRANTS</u> *Fiscal Year 2025*

*Recommendation:* The Department of Natural Resources recommends that the Board of Public Works approve:

- 1) Allocation of \$15,329,028 in FY 2025 Grant Awards (Sub-Items 1-7, & 9-15);
- 2) Three (3) Rural Legacy Area Boundary Changes (Sub-Items 5, 8 & 15); and
- 3) Designation of one (1) new Rural Legacy Area (Sub-Item 4).

**Background:** The Rural Legacy Program is designed to preserve large blocks of contiguous open space that are among the State's most valuable because of the existence of a multitude of agricultural, forestry, natural and cultural resources. To protect these resources, the Rural Legacy Program, acting through local government or private land trust sponsors, purchases conservation easements from willing property owners, based on Rural Legacy Plans that have been reviewed by the Rural Legacy Advisory Committee and approved by the Rural Legacy Board.

The Rural Legacy Program Fiscal Year 2025 grant awards total \$15,329,028. DNR will submit individual contracts to purchase conservation easements to the Board of Public Works as the specific transactions arise.

Authority: Subtitle 9A - Rural Legacy Program, Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

**1.** Agricultural Security Corridor - Eastern Shore Heartland Rural Legacy Area: *Caroline, Dorchester, and Talbot Counties* 

**Grant:** of \$1,205,070.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in three counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.



# **2.** Agricultural Security Corridor - Harvest Crescent Rural Legacy Area: *Cecil and Kent Counties*

**Grant:** of \$1,295,502.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect a range of resources that includes forests, farmlands, wetlands, historic sites, and endangered species habitat in the Agricultural Security Corridor in two counties on the Eastern Shore. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including agricultural production of grains, hay, dairy, beef and poultry operations. The Board approved the designation of the Agricultural Security Corridor Rural Legacy Area encompassing five counties in 1998 and split it into three separate and distinct RLAs in January of 2020.

## 3. Anne Arundel South:

## Anne Arundel County

**Grant:** of \$891,655.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect agricultural, woodland, natural and cultural resource values and tributaries to the Chesapeake Bay and Patuxent River. The Board approved the designation of the Anne Arundel South Rural Legacy Area in 2000.

#### 4. Bishopville-Showell Rural Legacy Area: Worcester County

**Designation** of the **11,743-acre** Bishopville-Showell Rural Legacy Area in Worcester County. This new Rural Legacy Area includes a portion of the northern most coastal bays watersheds in Maryland and the last remaining contiguous area of farmland in the northern coastal bays watershed, an area that continues to be under the most intense development pressure in Worcester County. It includes portions of Birch Branch, Middle Branch, Carey Branch, Slab Bridge Prong and Bishopville Prong, tributaries of the St. Martin River. The Bishop-Showell Rural Legacy Area is highly productive, with over one-third of the area determined to be prime farmland. Local agricultural and forestry industries rely on this expanse of land for productivity and viability. Additionally, protecting the area provides access to local farm products, beautiful vistas, and preservation of a rich farming history. Twenty-two historic sites, including houses, churches, and stores, dot the landscape. The Bishopville and Showell villages are also a part of the rural fabric, and their integrity will be enhanced by preserving land in their surrounds. Protecting the land will also help keep impervious surface low, thereby protecting water quality in the Isle of Wight and Assawoman Bays.

**Grant:** of \$800,000.00 to acquire conservation easements to preserve prime farmland, forests, and vistas of an historic landscape surrounding the unincorporated rural villages of Bishopville and Showell, which are part of the rural fabric of this region of the County. The Area contains the last remaining contiguous area of farms and forests in the northern coastal bays' watershed. Conservation of land in this Area will protect water quality in the Isle of Wight and Assawoman Bays.



5. Deer Creek Rural Legacy Area: Harford County

**Grant:** of \$1,060,500 to acquire conservation easements within the watershed of Deer Creek River, a State-designated Scenic River, and adjacent to Rocks and Susquehanna State Park to protect historic farmland, forests, natural and cultural areas. This Area is located within the Lower Susquehanna Heritage Greenway, a certified Maryland Heritage Area. The Board approved the designation of the Lower Deer Creek Rural Legacy Area in 1999.

• **Expansion:** of 31,323.73 acres that will expand the boundary north of the current Rural Legacy Area to Pennsylvania and follow the historic Mason-Dixon Line east to the shores of the Susequehanna River. The expansion includes additional land within the Deer Creek & Conowingo Dam Susquehanna River Watersheds, as well as the entire Harford County portion of the Broad Creek Watershed. Within the expansion area are highly valuable agricultural, ecological, historical, and cultural resources that are at risk due to increasing development pressure.

# 6. Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area:

Somerset and Worcester Counties

**Grant:** of \$585,000.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect significant woodland, farmland and wetlands. The Area includes one of the most pristine and ecologically significant watershed basins on the mid-Atlantic. It includes exemplary plant and wildlife habitat, prime farmland, large blocks of working forests, and over 10 miles of shoreline of Dividing Creek. The Board approved the designation of the Dividing Creek Rural Legacy Area in 2008.

# 7. Fair Hill Rural Legacy Area:

#### Cecil County

**Grant:** of \$1,009,720.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas and historic sites in the northeast corner of Cecil County contiguous to Fair Hill Natural Resources Management Area. Conservation of property in this Area will support the local resource-based economy, including equestrian activities. The Board approved the designation of the Fair Hill Rural Legacy Area in 1999.



- 8. Gunpowder Rural Legacy Area: Baltimore County
  - **Expansion:** of 7,560 acres that largely follows watershed boundaries, encompassing Bee Tree Run and 4th Mine Run in Northern Baltimore County. The Area was chosen to provide connectivity of key resources that includes headwater streams that impact the water quality of the Gunpowder River and the Loch Raven Reservoir, and the Torrey C. Brown Rail Trail that provides recreational opportunities for large portions of the Mid-Atlantic region. The expansion places virtually the entire length of the trail (18 of the 21 miles of the trail) within the Gunpowder Rural Legacy Area.

# 9. Huntersville Rural Legacy Area:

St. Mary's County

**Grant:** of \$1,080,000.00 for partnership with the U.S. Navy's Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) funds to acquire conservation easements to protect forests, natural and archeological areas, farmland, and historic sites. Portions of the Area are designated by the Smithsonian Center for Natural Areas as critical wildlife habitat in need of protection. The Board approved the designation of the Huntersville Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

# **10. Harriet Tubman Rural Legacy Area:**

Dorchester County

**Grant:** of \$1,200,000.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodland, natural and historic landscapes associated with the legacy of Harriet Tubman and the history of the Underground Railroad. The Board approved the designation of the Harriet Tubman Rural Legacy Area in 2018.

# 11. Lands End Rural Legacy Area:

Queen Anne's County

**Grant:** of \$1,062,189.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect environmentally significant tributaries of the Chester River, the Corsica River, and Southeast Creek, including farmland, forested lands, wetlands, and wildlife habitat. The Board approved the designation of the Lands End Rural Legacy Area in 1998.



# **12.** Little Pipe Creek /Upper Patapsco Rural Legacy Areas: Carroll County

**Grant:** of \$877,500.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, woodland, natural and cultural land within the Little Pipe Creek and upper Monocacy River Watersheds. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits not only for the two watersheds, but also for the underground aquifers that supply many residents with drinking water. The Board approved the designation of the Little Pipe Creek Rural Legacy Area in 1998 and Upper Patapsco Rural Legacy Area in 2004.

# **13.** Mid-Maryland Frederick/Carrollton Manor Rural Legacy Areas: *Frederick County*

**Grant:** of \$1,299,892.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forestland, Civil War historic sites and a greenbelt around the historic Town of Burkittsville. Conservation of property in the Area will protect the view surrounding the Appalachian Trail and South Mountain Battlefield State Park, which are nationally significant natural and cultural resources. The Board approved the designation of the Mid-Maryland Frederick Rural Legacy Area in 1998 and the Carrollton Manor Rural Legacy Area in 2004.

# 14. Mid-Maryland Washington Rural Legacy Area:

#### Washington County

**Grant:** of \$1,544,000.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests and Civil War sites within view of Washington Monument State Park, South Mountain Battlefield State Park, Antietam National Battlefield and its approaches. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Potomac River, a Maryland designated Scenic River. The Board approved the designation of the Mid-Maryland Washington Rural Legacy Area in 1998.



**15. Piney Run Rural Legacy Area:** *Baltimore County* 

**Grant:** of \$1,418.000.00 to acquire conservation easements to protect farmland, forests, natural areas and historic properties within and near National Register Historic Districts. Conservation within the Area will provide water quality benefits to the Prettyboy and Loch Raven Reservoirs, two of the drinking supply reservoirs for the Baltimore Metropolitan Area. The Board approved the designation of the Piney Run Rural Legacy Area in 1998.

- **Expansion:** of 16,210 acres in two new areas. The first is north of Shawan Road and West of Cuba Road, which is an area under significant development pressure due to proximity to Hunt Valley Town Center. The second area is north of the current Rural Legacy Area boundary and extends to the Prettyboy Reservoir. Preservation in this area will protect the Reservoir, which is a significant water source for a large portion of the Baltimore Metropolitan Area.

*Recommendation:* That the Board of Public Works approve revisions to the USM Procurement Policies and Procedures.

*Authority:* Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, §12-112.

**Remarks:** The University System of Maryland requests Board of Public Works (BPW) approval for revisions to its Procurement Policies and Procedures. A workgroup was established in the fall of 2023 to undertake a comprehensive review of these policies and make recommendations for revisions. The workgroup was comprised of procurement officials from four USM institutions, the System Office and the Office of Attorney General. The proposed revisions were reviewed and approved by all USM procurement directors, institution vice presidents for administration and finance and the presidents of all USM institutions. Notification was also sent to the Joint Committee on Administrative, Executive & Legislative Review of the Maryland General Assembly. There were no comments received from the Committee.

The major changes include:

- clarified that any revisions to these policies require BPW approval and the requirement for seeking BPW approval for contracts that fall under an exclusion—only Intercollegiate Athletics and High Impact Economic Development Activities related contracts do not require BPW approval;
- 2) added two new exclusions for utilities and accreditation fees;
- 3) added a provision allowing for the cancellation of solicitations;

Hourly rates may increase in the renewal option term based on increases in the Consumer Price Index (CPI). **Requesting Agency Remarks:** The solicitation was advertised as a Small Business Reserve (SBR) Procurement on November 30, 2023, via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage notifying 64 potential contractors, the MAA website, and by way of direct solicitation to four prospective bidders. One bid was received on February 27, 2024.

#### Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Historically, there has been limited competition for these services due to the specialized nature of work. MAA previously advertised Inspection, Repair and Maintenance of Hangar Doors at MTN in 2022, in which two bids came in over the estimated budget. Due to lack of interest in the project, the MAA removed the SBR designation via Addendum on December 11, 2023, directly solicited additional potential bidders, and extended the bid due date several times. MAA reached out to the previous bidders and potential bidders to inquire if the firms planned to bid or to request No-Bid Feedback notices. A prior bidder advised that after careful consideration they would not be bidding on the project; no other feedback was provided.

In an effort to determine if the single bid price is fair and reasonable, the Procurement Officer compared the single bid pricing to the 2017 awarded Hangar Door contract bid costs. The Procurement Officer discovered that the new labor rates are only averaging 5% higher than the 2017 bid, however the inspection and maintenance costs are 20% higher. This increase is consistent with the inspection and maintenance pricing received for the 2022 cancelled Hangar Door project. Based on the market and the specialized nature of maintaining the aging doors, the MAA considers the price fair and reasonable.

The MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. The procurement was designated Small Business Reserve however, the designation was removed to increase competition. While the Small Business Reserve designation was removed, National Door Services, Inc. is to a certified small business. No MBE / VSBE participation goals were established due to the project having a single element of work.

This contract includes a provision authorizing an extension for a reasonable, limited, and defined period of time to spend the funds remaining on the contract as provided in Board Advisory 1995-1.

*Requesting Agency Remarks:* These six consulting contracts encompass comprehensive preliminary and final design services associated with the preparation of construction contract plans and documents as directed by MDTA.

MDTA is requesting approval of this essential modification to ensure the continuation of services for existing assigned tasks, including design and preliminary engineering services for the construction of capital projects, as well as inspection, evaluation, and engineering studies for strategic efforts to maintain MDTA's assets. Additionally, the funding is needed for other critical ongoing tasks. Governor Moore signed an Executive Order on November 17, 2023, that authorizes Project Labor Agreements (PLA) for construction projects. The decision to require the use of a PLA is made on a project-by-project basis after a feasibility study is performed. At the time that this contract series was developed, the number of projects MDTA considered for a project labor agreement was small, determined on a case-by-case basis, and outside of the standard project development process. The Executive Order requires that a larger pool of projects consider use of a PLA, becoming a standard consideration in the development of construction projects. Studies performed to consider the use of and demonstrate the benefit of a PLA were not contemplated at the time of contract award and resulted in an increase in contract spend. New regulatory changes in environmental permitting, including resiliency reviews, have necessitated more extensive designs, reviews, and coordination for both new and existing construction projects. There have also been increased wage rates for architectural and engineering design services.

Furthermore, there is a heightened focus on project communication for public outreach across various media platforms, leading to increased project development costs. MDTA has determined that the funding for the existing contracts will be depleted before the new contracts are procured, with an anticipated award date of 2025.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MDTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals. A 24% MBE and 1% VSBE goal was established for each contract. Whitney, Bailey, Cox & Magnani, LLC/Dewberry Engineers, Inc. (JV) are currently exceeding the goal to achieve participation compliance of 30.26%.

Rummel, Klepper & Kahl, LLP, Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc, and Whitman, Requardt & Associates, LLP, and AECOM Design Services, Inc./Wallace, Montgomery & Associates, LLP, and WSP USA Inc./Prime A/E Group, Inc. are on target to reach the MBE goal with 17.39%, 20.09%,17.34%, 12.14%, and 12.92% compliance respectively.

Work to be conducted by the certified VSBE subcontractors has yet to be assigned and will occur later on each contract.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** This modification requests approval for MTA to increase vehicle maturity from 7 to 10 years and increase the maximum odometer reading from 800,000 to 1,000,000 miles. MTA will continue to reserve the right to remove any motor coach from service if it does not meet MTA safety standards or DOT inspection requirements. The MTA also requests a reduction to the required performance bond to \$100,000 for each contract for the remaining term of the various contracts. The modification to the performance bond gives rise to a material change in the contract. (See Attachment 1).

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MTA Procurement Review Group reviewed each contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. The MBE subcontractors provide fuel to the Commuter Bus Contractors and as a commodity, the 60% rule is applied to each contract. Each of the vendors committed to meet the MBE goal for each contract subcontracting participation goal as provided in the IFB with the goal subject to the 60% rule (*See attachment 2*). The certified subcontractor hired by all Contractors lost its MBE certification in October 2022. MTA required all Contractors to submit updated MBE forms B and D with its new certified MBE provider.

The modification for these contracts will assist the Contractors with loss of revenue due to the reduction in services for each contract due to the state's new Commuter Bus Plan, effective July 1, 2024.

Therefore, MAA deems the price fair and reasonable.

The awardee has five members of their proposed project team residing in Maryland, who pay state and local income taxes. The subcontractors are headquartered in Maryland and purchase supplies, equipment, and services in the state.

Presently RGGI consists of eleven Northeast and Mid-Atlantic States: Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Virginia.

RGGI, Inc. is a non-profit, non-stock corporation that provides technical, scientific, and auction support services to the RGGI states in the development and implementation of the multi-state cap and trade, greenhouse gas control program. RGGI, Inc. subcontracts for several specific services: auction platform design and implementation; emissions and allowance tracking system; auction verification and market monitoring; and offset system development. Each RGGI state is responsible for its share of RGGI Inc.'s expenses based on the percentage of that state's annual allocation from the regional CO<sub>2</sub> allowance cap. Maryland is responsible for funding approximately 15% of RGGI, Inc.'s annual budget, including operating expenses and support of vendor contracts. Most states, including Maryland, will use auction revenue to pay for its share of RGGI, Inc. expenses.

Currently, the Pennsylvania court system prohibits the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection from participating in the program. Pennsylvania would have the largest allowance in the allocation of funds from the regional  $CO_2$  allowance cap. Additionally, Virginia has ongoing litigation and currently is not participating in the program. MDE has completed a significant amount of electrical sector (IPM) modeling as well. These factors have contributed to increased costs that MDE has had to absorb.

MDE will continue to complete IPM modeling and complete the program review which will decrease the modeling costs on the future contract.

A replacement procurement for this contract is currently underway.

There is no MBE or VSBE participation established for this contract because MDE does not have discretion over the subcontractors that Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative, Inc utilizes for the nine Northeast and Mid-Atlantic States cooperatives.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** During the procurement process for the replacement contract, multiple protests were received regarding the specifications. As a result, MVA extended the procurement several times to allow time to respond to the protests and to complete the procurement. Although an appeal has been filed with the Board of Contract Appeals, MVA anticipates the new contract will be in place and presented to the BPW within the term of this modification. MVA will terminate this extension for convenience after the award of the new replacement contract and the transition period.

Since 1984, the VEIP contract has been a cornerstone program for Maryland's air quality efforts and has been very effective in advancing the state's significant progress towards achieving its air quality goals. VEIP identifies and ensures that vehicles emitting excessive levels of pollutants are repaired. Pursuant to Maryland Transportation Article 23-202, an emissions control program shall be established in the State in accordance with the Federal Clean Air Act. Furthermore, 23-202 through 23-404 of the Maryland Transportation Article stipulates the emissions control program requirements, which includes testing requirements on vehicles that must be tested and the testing frequency.

During the pandemic, VEIP stations were closed and used for COVID testing centers for several months following March 2020, which had a negative impact on MBE participation. Envirotest Corporation has worked closely with MVA to continue the efforts outlined in their Corrective Action Plan. These efforts include aggressively recruiting and increasing technician staffing with expanded weekend and evening coverage utilizing MBE firms. Since the previous extension began, in September of 2022, Envirotest Corporation has been paid \$17.4 million and has paid MBE subcontractors \$7.7 million, or 44%, increasing their overall compliance by 1.503%.

**Description:** The Maryland Department of Labor (LABOR), Division of Unemployment Insurance (UI), is undergoing a multi-phased, multi-project telecommunications upgrade. The goal is to procure a state-of-the-art Commercial-Off-The-Shelf (COTS) application, delivered as either premises based or Software as a Service (SaaS), omni-channel contact center solution including, but not limited to, IVR, agent desktop, (ACD), virtual assistant, knowledge base, workforce optimization, quality management, voice and agent desktop recording, transcription, and analytics. The modern contact center solution has been given the name LABOR Omni-channel Contact Center System (LOCCS). LOCCS will be the voice, email, chat, and web form interaction repository for all of LABOR/UI.

On September 20, 2023, a contract was presented before the Board of Public Works and awarded to the selected vendor. Shortly after, the vendor indicated that they could not meet the requirements of the contract and scope of work, including the assigned MBE goal.

The State of Maryland currently has an Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement in place, which was considered, but due to the cost of this project, the vendor cannot accommodate the magnitude of this project.

LABOR decided that conducting an Expedited Procurement for this vital service was in the best interest of the State.

On April 15, 2020, LABOR entered into a contract with Accenture for its call center capabilities and services to support the UI. This contract is set to expire in December 2024. Throughout the duration of the contract, the UI experienced a buildup of claimant issues due to inexperienced contractors handling claimant inquiries, leading to substantial delays in resolving claims and making payments. Furthermore, the costly contract had significantly impacted UI's bottom line. In State Fiscal Year 2024 UI expended \$35 million for services from Accenture.





# **39-EX. EXPEDITED PROCUREMENT REQUEST** (cont'd)

For the program's benefit and to improve service for the people of Maryland, LABOR will transition these services to experienced in-house UI merit staff using LOCCS. With the purchase of the system (\$6 million for the first year) and the hiring of additional staff (\$5 million), LABOR expects to save over \$20 million annually. This cost-saving measure significantly reduces expenses and enables UI to provide high-quality service to the people of Maryland.

With the LOCCS procurement, Labor will have a new telecommunication/video system and will no longer use Accenture contractual staff to manage communications with unemployment assistance.

The LOCCS system will enable experienced state staff to promptly respond to claimants' inquiries, assist with filing claims, and explain and address complex unemployment issues that contractual staff are unable to handle. Currently, it takes several days for claimants to contact experienced unemployment staff. However, with LOCCS, claimants' inquiries will be addressed immediately.

The LOCCS telecommunication/video system and the in-house call center will enhance the program's quality. This will lead to more accurate claim filing, faster claim processing, reduced claim issues, and fewer repeat callers. Additionally, claimants will experience shorter wait times when seeking answers.

The in-house LOCCS system will allow UI to monitor real-time calls for quality assurance. This will improve customer service and provide UI with real-time data tracking through reports and dashboards, which will enhance our training and customer service.

Pursuant to Maryland State Finance & Procurement Article (SFP) § 13-108 (d)(1), LABOR's Procurement Officer with approval of the Agency Head has determined that this procurement should be expedited because: (1) urgent circumstances require prompt action; (2) an expedited procurement best serves the public interest; and (3) the need for the expedited procurement outweighs the benefits of making the procurement on the basis of competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals. However, the procurement officer shall attempt to obtain as much competition as reasonably possible per SFP § 13- 108 (d)(2).

### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable when comparing the cost of each of the three potential venues is 63.61% less, but the event has outgrown the available space and there would be significant cost and risk to the State associated with trying to create temporary space at the venue. The Gaylord National Resort in comparison is 29.67% less, however it offers 23.53% less meeting space which impacts the cost and offers only one date in the 2024 calendar year, which would cause scheduling conflicts for key guests. Lastly, the Baltimore Marriott Waterfront is 12.07% more and doesn't have sufficient space for breakout meeting rooms which was a primary consideration for the event. Given space and date availability, the Hilton is the only viable option.

MBE and VSBE participation were not established for this contract because there were no subcontracting opportunities. However, other associated State contracts will be utilized to provide support in the planning, management and facilitation of the Summit, resulting in MBE participation for the Summit overall.
