Wetlands Licenses

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board grant a license for projects involving filling and dredging in the navigable waters of Maryland.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY

19-0910 **RODRICK JABIN** – To create wetland habitat and reduce shoreline erosion by reconstructing a stone revetment, eradicating invasive *Phragmites*, constructing a stone containment groin, filling and grading with sand, planting marsh vegetation, constructing a revetment, and extending drainpipes through the revetment.
Annapolis, Heron Lake and Chesapeake Bay
Special conditions: Requirements for design and construction of revetment, construction of marsh establishment area, signing and acceptance of marsh maintenance plan, obtaining a General Permit for Discharges from the Application of Pesticides, and planting of Spartina patens and Spartina alterniflora. Restrictions on using asphalt rubble in the revetment.
Wetlands Created: 8,050 square feet

22-0517 **JAMES E. WEAVER** – To reduce shoreline erosion and reconfigure piers by removing existing piers and associated pilings, constructing a pier with a pier extension, a fixed platform, finger piers, and mooring piles, replacing a revetment, constructing a low profile stone sill with vents, excavate, fill, and grade with sand, and plant marsh vegetation.
Deale, Rockhold Creek
Special conditions: Requirements for removing existing piers, design and construction of revetment, construction of marsh establishment area, signing and acceptance of marsh maintenance plan, and annual photograph submission. Restrictions on use of asphalt rubble in the revetment.

Mitigation***

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board:

1. Grant a tidal wetlands license to mechanically dredge an area, and
2. Require mitigation in the amount of \$498.87 for impacts to shallow water habitat resulting from the dredging.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with the recommendations.

Authority: Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland: “*The Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents.*” See also COMAR 23.02.04.

Mitigation: Mechanically dredging an area will result in permanent impacts to 241 square feet of shallow water habitat. MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the 241 square feet of impact to shallow water habitat at a 1:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by paying \$498.87 into the MDE Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund.

$$241 \text{ feet} \times \$2.07 \text{ per square foot} = \$498.87$$

22-1341 *GREGORY PAGE* – To provide deeper water for boating and navigation by mechanically maintenance dredging an area, mechanically dredging another area, transporting dredge material to a disposal site, and providing for periodic maintenance dredging for six years.

Special conditions: Time of year restriction. Requirements for dredge material transport and disposal, maintenance dredging, staking dredged area, post dredge bathymetric survey, and payment into Tidal Wetland Compensation Fund prior to construction.

Mitigation***

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board:

1. Grant a tidal wetlands license to construct a revetment and living shoreline, and
2. Require mitigation in the form of planting *Spartina alterniflora* for impacts to open water habitat resulting from the revetment.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with the recommendations.

- Application received June 23, 2023
- Public comment period ended March 1, 2024
- MDE Report and Recommendation July 2, 2024

Authority: Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland: “*The Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents.*” See also COMAR 23.02.04.

Mitigation: Constructing a revetment will result in permanent impacts to 4,425 square feet of open water habitat. MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the 4,425 square feet of impact to open water at a 2:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by planting low marsh. The 55,120 square feet of marsh planting with *Spartina alterniflora* exceeds the required mitigation amount of 8,850 square feet.

4,425 square feet of impact x 2 (2:1 ratio) = 8,850 square feet of required mitigation

ST MARYS COUNTY

Special conditions: Requirements for construction of marsh establishment area, signing and acceptance of marsh maintenance plan, and design and construction of revetment. Restrictions on use of asphalt rubble in revetment.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This revenue-generating transaction results from a resource sharing agreement between Maryland Department of Transportation’s Maryland Transportation Authority and Baltimore Gas and Electric Company. For this proposal, the State receives the benefit of 40% of all sublease monetary compensation for use of BGE tower space in support of telecommunications antennas located on State rights of way at the cloverleaf of I-895, Washington Blvd, and US 1 near Elkridge, Baltimore County. Since the monetary value of the lease over the 30-year term is more than \$100,000, this item was submitted to the Legislative Policy Committee for review and comment and was posted on *eMarylandMarketplace*.

Location: Statewide

Project Description: As provided for under the Bay Restoration Fund Act, up to 10% of the annual revenue generated from wastewater treatment plant users deposited with MDE may be allocated for operation and maintenance costs of a wastewater treatment plant operating at the enhanced nutrient removal level. MDE’s grant recommendations are based on base-grant of \$30,000 for every million gallons per day of design capacity, with a minimum grant award of \$30,000 (unless prorated for partial year of operations), and maximum award of \$300,000 per year for any plant. In addition to the base-grants, additional grants are being recommended for plants achieving better than the enhanced nutrient removal level. These plants have successfully achieved the goals of effluent levels at or below Total Nitrogen of 3 mg/l and Total Phosphorous of 0.3 mg/l, reducing nitrogen discharged to Chesapeake Bay by over 10,957,000 pounds per year, and phosphorus by over 1,149,000 pounds per year.

Remarks: The Maryland Food Center Authority (the “Authority”) plans to continue to lease the Property to long-term tenant, Sea-Cap, Inc. (the “Tenant”), under a new ten (10) year lease, with two (2) additional ten (10) year renewal options. The Property is part of the original 398-acre site in Jessup, Maryland that the Authority has developed into a wholesale food market and distribution center (the “Center”). The Authority currently owns and operates the Maryland Market Center, formerly known as the Maryland Wholesale Seafood Market, and the Maryland Wholesale Produce Market within the Center. As part of its development of the Center, the Authority constructed a warehouse facility on the Property in 2003.

The Tenant previously entered into a lease with the Authority that commenced on January 1, 2004 and that, after an extension in 2022, will expire on August 31, 2024. The Authority and Tenant entered into an extension to provide the Authority and Tenant the opportunity to negotiate a new long-term lease for the Board of Public Works approval, which included the anticipation of the Tenant expanding its warehouse and operations. The Tenant abandoned the expansion project and the Authority incurred costs of \$95,448.61, which shall be repaid in full by the Tenant in monthly installments of \$1,590.81 over five years, with no prepayment penalty. The Tenant operates a refrigerated warehouse and storage business and employs approximately 60 employees.

Remarks: The Stadium Authority recommends CAM Construction Company, Inc. (CAM) for preconstruction services related to the Commodore John Rogers Elementary/Middle School project, and intends to return with a recommendation to award a Guaranteed Maximum Price contract recommendation if the pre-construction performance is satisfactory and an acceptable construction phase bid package is negotiated.

The procurement was initially advertised as a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) in August 2016. Fifteen firms were deemed qualified by the selection committee and given the opportunity to receive the project specific Request for Proposals (RFP), determined by project type and cost categories.

The RFP for this Project was issued on April 18, 2024. Eight of the pre-qualified firms submitted technical proposals. The selection committee shortlisted five firms, held oral presentations, and requested financial proposals from three firms. Financial proposals included pre-construction phase pricing, as well as the construction phase pricing related to fee and estimated labor hours and costs. After review of the financial proposals, the selection committee unanimously selected CAM, who had the highest overall score and offered the lowest combined fee. . Additionally, CAM surpassed the established MBE goal of 29%, achieving a participation commitment of 31.62%.

Remarks: The Board approved the contract with Gilbane Building Company for design and pre-construction services at its meeting on October 4, 2023 (Secretary's Agenda, Item 17). The Authority represented as part of that approval that it would return to the Board with a recommendation to modify the design and pre-construction contract upon negotiating an acceptable GMP.

The procurement process for this GMP proceeded as follows:

An onsite MBE outreach event was conducted on the project site on May 15, 2024 among the DB, the Authority, interested trade contractors and other representatives seeking contracting opportunities and MBE participation.

On June 20, 2024 Gilbane Building Company advertised the structural steel package for trade contractor participation in the following publications/services: eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, MSA's website, Gilbane's website, Maryland Washington Minority Companies Association (MWMCA) website and via direct solicitation. A pre-bid meeting was held on the project site on July 1, 2024 for trade contractors where summary project information was provided and attendees were afforded the opportunity to tour the site.

On June July 9, 2024 competitive sealed trade contractor bids were received and opened using Gilbane Building Company's online bidding system. Starting July 10, 2024, post-bid scope review meetings were conducted to ensure the bids were both responsive and complete. The post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually.

GMP #1 represents the first of multiple GMP submissions for the Project.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: On April 29, 2024, an emergency was declared at PATX due to a wastewater backup which required emergency cleaning services to remove the wastewater backup, repair a wastewater pump, replace a failed wastewater pump, and rent an additional backup pump while work was to be completed. On June 21, 2024, DPSCS became aware that an emergency change order was necessary to revise the original emergency declared on April 29, 2024.

The original emergency declaration said DPSCS would rent an additional backup pump so wastewater would continue to flow through the facility while one pump was replaced and the second pump was repaired. Unfortunately, repairing the pump has turned out to be unfeasible as there is a 52-week lead time for the required pump parts and the cost to continue renting the pump for another 52-weeks would exceed a million dollars. The contractor contacted a distributor who said they have new pumps available and can be shipped to PATX within a couple of weeks. As a result, this change order would revise the scope of work to purchase and install two new wastewater pumps in order for the DPSCS to complete the work necessary to bring the issue to resolution.

Basis for Selection: At least two vendors were contacted when the original emergency was declared in April 2024, but JPG was selected for their availability and familiarity with the facility and security protocols. As the current contractor performing work, JPG was selected to manage the emergency change order request. These repairs are vital to continue a safe and healthy environment for the inmate population. This work is time sensitive and without this service, sewage will overflow and backup into other facility areas, creating a health and sanitation hazard. Additionally, not addressing the matter could leave DPSCS and the State open to litigation from incarcerated individuals.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency (from the original Emergency Contract Report, Sec. Appendix A3, 10/25/2023, BPW): Around the middle of August, the Department of Labor (MDOL) recognized that the likelihood of a federal government shutting down was imminent. At this juncture, MDOL began meeting internally to assess what resources were available, what exactly would be needed, and what the ultimate software solution would look like. Labor also started researching vendors who may be able to stand up an individual management software solution in a very short time, given the window available.

In most cases, the ideal situations surrounding an emergency procurement are those where the agency knows exactly what is needed, is aware of vendors who can meet the agencies needs within a given time and allows the agency to have all the necessary information available. In this regard, MDOL needed to engage the Treasurer and Comptroller's Office to gain insight and additional information on the best way to move forward. This period of planning and information gathering took several days. Upon recognizing that this project would entail a vendor that specializes in this level of work, MDOL reached out to the Department of General Services Office of State Procurement (DGS-OSP) to obtain approval, after receiving internal approval to use the Emergency Procurement method.

MDOL added a 19.3% MBE goal to the procurement for the customer support piece of the Scope of Work. The contactor requested and received a full waiver of the MBE goal as the contractor is based in Montana, is not a Minority Business Enterprise, and because of the timeline, did not believe it had adequate time to seek a partner in this space to meet the MBE goal. Due to the early October anticipated shutdown date, the vendor was limited to using native platform solutions that were used before, had existing contractual agreements in place, and could deliver the solution required within the timeline provided by MDOL to administer the program.

While the federal government shutdown has been delayed, MDOL intends to proceed with this contract as there is still a risk of a shutdown occurring in mid-November. On September 30, 2023, the U.S. Congress passed a 45-day continuing resolution to fund the federal government through November 17, 2023, averting an October 1 shutdown. If Congress fails to pass appropriations within that 45-day period or does not pass another continuing resolution, a full or partial federal government shutdown will begin on Saturday, November 18, 2023.

Basis for Selection: MDOL selected Submittable Holdings, Inc., a vendor based in Missoula, Montana, because of its experience standing up individual management software solution of this nature and their ability to provide the service MDOL sought. Three vendors were contacted and all three submitted their costs to MDOL. Submittable Holdings provided the lowest price proposal. Submittable Holdings is a technology firm that has been in business for the last 13 years, with niche expertise in emergency relief payment programs. Since inception, Submittable Holdings has served over 11 thousand clients; has created over 134 thousand programs on its platform; has had over 21.8 million submissions and applications collected; has been on the Inc.

5000 fastest growing private companies list and has also received a few prestigious technology and SaaS awards over the years.

Modification 1: Additional funds, delegated by MDOL, were added to the existing contract due to additional costs incurred by the vendor due to continuing resolutions by the Federal Government, which led to the deadlines for the shutdown being pushed from Fall 2023 into January/February 2024.

Emergency Modification 2 (this Item): Nature of Emergency: On March 26, 2024, a cargo ship leaving the Port of Baltimore, in Baltimore, Maryland, struck the Francis Scott Key Bridge and caused the bridge to collapse. An Executive Order by Governor Moore created the Worker Support Program on April 5, 2024, which was authorized by the Maryland General Assembly through the Maryland Protecting Opportunities and Regional Trade (PORT) Act, 2024, Maryland Laws Ch. 3 (S.B. 1188).

The PORT Act was signed by the Governor on April 9, 2024, and required the Maryland Department of Labor (MDOL) to establish a program to assist individuals impacted by the reduced operations of the Port of Baltimore. MDOL needed "as soon as practicable" to establish a temporary relief program to aid individuals who (1) regularly performed paid work at the Port of Baltimore; (2) were unable to perform work through no fault of their own due to the reduced operations of the port; (3) were unable to work and available for work, but unable to find suitable work; and (4) did not qualify for unemployment insurance benefits or qualified for an amount of unemployment insurance benefits less than the individual's earnings attributable to the individual's employment at the Port at the time the reduced operations of the Port began.

The PORT Act gave MDOL authority to establish program procedures and eligibility criteria for the Worker Support Program. MD DOL's mandate was similar to the program required by Maryland's Federal Shutdown Paycheck Protection Act (2019), which would provide financial assistance to federal employees with worksites in Maryland impacted by a federal shutdown. The already existing emergency contract with Submittable Holdings, Inc. was created to administer the program required by the Paycheck Protection Act because of the threat of shutdown in fall 2023.

The contract with Submittable Holdings, Inc., will be utilized to accommodate the mandates of the PORT Act and Executive Order 01.01.2024.11. MDOL requires a software solution for an application portal for Port workers, applicant eligibility determination, and fraud prevention, as well as customer support services. Because Submittable Holdings, Inc. was contracted to do similar work to support MDOL in administering the federal shutdown program and in the interest of providing services to impacted Port workers as quickly as possible, MDOL believed it was administratively advantageous to impacted residents and to the state to utilize the current contract. An MBE vendor was engaged to provide project management services for this body of work for the Port workers.

Emergency Modification 3 (this Item): Changes were made to the change order under Modification #2 to extend project management support from August 8, 2024, to the end of the contract term, September 21, 2024, and to extend customer support from the original end date of 6/12 to ensure there is no break in support.

Basis for Selection: The Federal Government passed a final funding package to avoid a shutdown on March 23, 2024. On March 26, 2024, the Key Bridge collapsed, leading to an immediate state of emergency and the need for MDOL to engage a vendor that could provide the necessary services to accommodate the workers affected by this tragedy. The existing emergency contract with Submittable, with a modification, could provide the much-needed service to MDOL and within the time frame to adhere to the PORT Act meet the obligations that were now expected by MDOL.

Reason for Late Report: There were revisions needed to the original submission, and since another modification was in progress, Labor was advised to complete it and submit a single agenda with both modifications.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: On July 10, 2024, the Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center (CTPHC) experienced the failure of one (1) coil in the air handling unit located in the North Wing of the facility. Evaluation of the air handling unit showed that replacement of one coil cannot be completed without significant risk of failure of the second coil. Two fully functioning coils are required to provide adequate cooling of the building. Replacement of the equipment needed was beyond MDH's capabilities.

Remarks (cont'd):

CTPHC is the State's only maximum security forensic psychiatric hospital, which has a capacity of 289 patients and currently maintains a waitlist. The MDH Healthcare System adult psychiatric facilities operate 1,056 beds at or near full capacity - patients from CTPHC can only be transferred to other MDH facilities subject to the availability of beds and clinical stability of patients of medium/minimum security environments. Hospital licensure and accreditation standards require that patient care units and medication storage be at appropriate ambient temperatures.

Due to current capacity limitations and the diagnosis of the patients at the location, alternative housing solutions are not possible for that population. Additionally, there are significant negative effects and impacts on the patient population due to improper ambient temperatures as well as the maintenance of psychiatric medications stored for administration within that unit.

Due to the nature of the patient population, and to mitigate serious damage to the health, safety, and welfare of the patients within the care of CTPHC, MDH could not wait the requisite 48 hours for Chief Procurement Officer approval and moved forward on July 10, 2024 with the retention of a vendor to diagnose the situation and to recommend a solution.

The vendor was able to locate a supplier that could fabricate and expedite the delivery of two (2) replacement coils for installation by the vendor.

Basis for Selection: MDH contacted two vendors for pricing for the sourcing, delivery, and installation of the coils. The selected vendor responded with a quote that was responsive to the scope. Due to the urgent nature and need to restore the functionality of the cooling system of the facility as soon as possible for patient units, MDH selected the vendor that responded with the capacity to source, deliver, and install the required equipment to meet the emergency need. The selected vendor is a certified MBE and also a contractor on the DGS General Construction and Related Services contract and is a statewide contractor and has successfully been used during emergency responses and other state-contracted work.

A Corrective Action Plan is in place as RailWorks Track Services, LLC (RailWorks) works to meet the MBE goal. The owner of the primary MBE subcontract RailWorks relied upon to meet their goal passed away; the company subsequently withdrew from the MBE program, per the program policy. RailWorks replaced the decertified MBE firm and continues to work towards meeting the goal. Since the approval of Renewal Option No. one on March 15, 2023, RailWorks has increased MBE compliance from 3.56% to 16.04%.

Approving this contract modification will allow MTA to meet FRA requirements and allows MTA to ensure the safety of MTA’s customers and employees, which is in the best interest of the State.

(JFGH), a nonprofit organization, for the cost of acquiring a two-story building at 1500 East Jefferson, Rockville, Maryland. JFGH serves individuals with developmental disabilities. This building provided space to house staff and expand services to families and individuals with developmental disabilities.

In accordance with Subtitle 6 of Title 24 of the Health-General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, JFGH recorded a State's Right of Recovery (ROR) in the Land Records of Montgomery County in Liber 33258 Book 202.

Currently the Jewish Foundation for Group Homes, Inc. is in the process of selling the First Property. To complete the sale, the ROR on the First Property must be released. To protect the State's interest the ROR is to be rolled onto the Second through Fifth properties, the properties have adequate unencumbered equity to cover the One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollar (\$1,500,000.00) State's ROR. The Right of Recovery shall expire on 10/26/2036.

The release of the ROR on the First Property is contingent upon the recordation, in the Land Records of Montgomery County, of the ROR on the Second through Fifth Properties by the Jewish Foundation for Group Homes, Inc.

DGS needs to add another 59,000 SF to the building. The AE firm will have to reconfigure the equipment in the Central Utility Plan to upsize and rearrange the mechanical and electrical equipment. BGE has requested the reconfiguration of the electrical service for the Baltimore City Pretrial Complex. DoIT requested the addition of a 400 SF Data Center to the Food, Laundry, and Warehouse.

The 15% MBE compliance represents only the schematic design and part of the design development phases of the contract. The scope of the work for each trade is different in the different phases of the project. The majority of the scope of work for the MBE/VSBE subcontractors are in the future phases of the project which are the remaining design development and construction documents phases. The contractor remains committed to achieving the MBE participation

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals was advertised in eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on May 10, 2023. Direct solicitations were sent to 49 prospective vendors. Three proposals were received and two were rejected due to incurable deficiencies with their MBE documentation. Karen Belinko Appraisals, LLC has been found responsible and its bid responsive. The bid pricing has been confirmed.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. DHCD estimated an hourly rate for services and compared that hourly rate to labor cost data published in the General Services Administrations and found the price to be competitive. The cost for 160 hours to complete one multi-family appraisal is \$8,235 per appraisal, approximately \$52 per hour. The published hourly rate on GSA’s website for real estate appraisal is \$106 per hour.

As part of DHCD’s mission to enhance access to quality affordable housing throughout the State, the Community Development Administration (CDA) provides a number of financial resources not available in the private sector for the construction and rehabilitation of rental housing. CDA typically creates or preserves between 2,000 and 3,000 rental units annually. In support of these activities, CDA requires the services of a real estate appraisal firm to appraise multifamily rental housing properties throughout the State.

Contracting with this provider will increase in-State residential capacity to ensure youth receive appropriate clinical services to prevent hospitalizations and to provide services for youth currently in hotels and hospital overstay. The site being requested is licensed for four beds and all are being placed under contract. The last monitoring visit was May 9, 2024, and no deficiencies were found. This provider will service youth in the State of Maryland from any jurisdiction that meets the criteria.

If the youth is discharged before the end of the contract term, there is no additional cost to the State as these are reimbursement contracts and providers are paid solely for the actual number of youths placed with them during each year, and then only for the actual number of days each child is placed with the provider.

Youth are monitored via monthly caseworker visits and case reviews to assess progress, readiness for discharge, and permanency goals. Additionally, the provider's performance and compliance are reviewed at the monthly Children's Check-In call, facilitated by the Maryland Department of Health's (MDH) Office of Health Care Quality, which includes representatives from other state agencies.

No MBE or VSBE participation goals were established for this contract since the specialized core services (psychiatric services/evaluations, case management, therapy, recreational therapeutic programs, educational services, etc.) are available within the facility and require specialized training, certification, and clearances.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on July 11, 2023, notifications were sent to 227 vendors and 491 vendors were directly solicited. A total of 20 proposals were received and 14 were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Two proposals were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because they did not submit a technical response to the RFP. Two proposals were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because their proposals failed to address the elements in the RFP. Two proposals were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because their proposals failed to meet the threshold that a reasonable person in the market will pay for the services provided under the functional areas. One letter of intent to award was rescinded due to failure to submit the required documentation in support of its waiver request in accordance with COMAR 21.11.03.10B.(7). There will be a second level of competition through Purchase Order Requests for Proposals (PORFPs) sent to all Master Contractors within the appropriate functional area. Each Offeror was asked to submit a fully loaded hourly rate for each contract year for the functional area they proposed. This hourly rate was multiplied by 5000 to reach an estimated yearly usage figure. Those figures were used to establish the financial rank. The NTE is based on historical usage. Offerors were permitted to respond to either or both functional areas.

This procurement was designed to provide the State agencies with a wide selection of Master Contractors who offer an extensive variety of cable and wiring inside plant services. Agencies will obtain materials, equipment, maintenance, and installation/repair, design/site survey services quickly and efficiently, and specific to their needs. This contracting vehicle is also available to Maryland local and county government jurisdictions and not-for-profit entities within the State of Maryland, as defined in State Finance and Procurement 13-110(a)(5) - (7).

An overall MBE subcontracting goal of 10% applies to Functional Area 1 and will apply to each individual PORFP under Functional Area 1. [...] Functional Area 2 has no subcontracting opportunities for MBEs as it is a single element of work. No VSBE participation was established due to the absence of adequate numbers of VSBE firms certified to perform this work. SBR designation will be determined at the PORFP level since the work will vary in size and scope.

Requesting Agency Remarks: MTA researched transit trip planning applications currently available on the market and based on required functionality found that Transit App Royale was the only product on the market that met all requirements. This is a sole source agreement because this vendor is the sole owner of the proprietary software which is used in the Transit mobile application. This contract will provide paid tier Royale functionality at no cost to MTA riders that will improve the rider experience with features like Detour Detection, which provide real-time detour routes and visualization within the app, offline trip planning for riders who are unable to access the Internet, and user-sourced Ride Quality Insights, which will enable MTA to enhance rider experiences. The application will also provide MTA with rider route usage data, which will help MTA plan for future service adjustments and improvements.

Pricing is considered fair and reasonable as MTA explored developing this functionality on its own and determined that there was significant cost and time savings to the State. MTA estimated that an in-house solution would take a minimum of 22 months to complete at a minimum cost of \$2,075,000. The proposal from Transit could be implemented almost immediately at a cost of \$1,800,939.

Although DoIT reported on the original CATS+ BPW agenda item (DOIT 3-IT, 04/03/2013) that it had set a 20% MBE participation goal for CATS+, it noted, “This MBE participation goal is only an overall goal for this contract. Agencies evaluate each individual TORP or RFR to maximize opportunities for MBE participation.” Some task orders, depending on the subcontracting opportunities available, are assigned an MBE goal greater than 20%, some less than 20%, and some - no MBE goal due to a lack of subcontracting opportunities. This delay was partly due to the manufacturer's reluctance to provide pricing more than 90 days away from issuing a purchase order and changes in the manufacturer's account management team.

There was a further delay to the procurement process when the original submission was rejected on May 1, based on the decision that New Relic was a cloud-based software. This decision was later reversed, allowing the renewal process to continue.

These combined delays caused the procurement process to miss the June 5, 2024, Board of Public Works meeting agenda submission deadline, and, consequently, the June 30, 2024, renewal date.

No commercial signs or billboards are permitted, and there shall be no dumping on land except as is necessary to normal farming operations. Grantor shall manage the property in accordance with sound agricultural practices. Grantee(s) shall have the right to enter land for inspection. No public rights are granted. The term of these easements shall be in perpetuity pursuant to Agriculture Article Section 2-514.1.

- A) As to items 1 through 20, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve the right to apply for release of a lot to convey to himself or his children for the purpose of constructing a dwelling for personal use as follows: one lot of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 20 acres, but less than 70 acres, two lots of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 70 acres, but less than 120 acres, or three lots of one acre or less if the subject property is 120 acres or more.

Note that as to Items 21, 23, 24, and 32, the unrestricted lot will be a building envelope that will not be subdivided from the farm.
- C) As to items 35 through 49, the Grantor is waiving the right to request any additional lots.

Requesting Agency Remarks: These contracts provide specialized psychotherapeutic services and supervision of sexual offender inmates throughout the State. Specialized sexual offender assessment and treatment are essential elements of the containment approach to sexual offender management and will enable Division of Parole and Probation (DPP) agents to develop appropriate supervision plans and implement effective supervision strategies.

When the solicitation was advertised in 2022, the intent was to make sure all 24 jurisdictions (23 counties & Baltimore City) would receive services. Bidders submitted bids for individual jurisdictions with the goal of having a single awardee for each jurisdiction, except for Baltimore City where there would be three awardees due to the volume of work. Unfortunately, 11 of the jurisdictions received no bids and Baltimore City ended up with a single bid/awardee.

The 11 jurisdictions that received no bids still needed service and the four awardees have provided service in those jurisdictions. In addition, the other awardees were brought in to Baltimore City to help the single awardee due to the workload. The values of the contract awards were based on providing service at 13 jurisdictions, not 24. As a result, funds are depleting and a modification to provide additional contract authority for all four awardees is required in order to ensure that these services can continue to be provided across the state.

These contracts include a provision from the original solicitation that allows the contractors to provide services to offenders living in other jurisdictions where there is no awarded services contract.

Department of Health, Office of Enterprise Technology

Recommendation: The Maryland Department of Health on behalf of its Office of Enterprise Technology is requesting approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.06.03

Contract Description: The Office of Enterprise Technology (OET) on behalf of the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Health (MDH or the Department) manages software renewals for the Department. MDH is currently utilizing Smartsheet software department-wide for both internal and public-facing applications. MDH currently has 481 licensed Smartsheet users, and approximately 2,000 unlicensed users, utilizing the Smartsheet software for internal business workflow, procurement tracking and management, contract management, project management, budget management, grant management and administration, pool vehicle management, public event registration, conducting public feedback surveys, and a wide variety of internal human resources processes.

In December 2023, OET began working on a one-year renewal for the existing MDH Smartsheet subscription which expired on April 16, 2024. Because the previous procurement for the Smartsheet subscription renewal executed on April 12, 2023, was well below the Board of Public Works (BPW) approval threshold, OET anticipated the 2024 renewal to also be below the threshold. However, when a Manufacturer Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) quote was solicited directly from Smartsheet, it was discovered that an increase in overall number of licenses from 319 in 2023 to 481 in 2024, and significant software product costs increase, brought the one-year renewal cost above the \$200,000.00 BPW approval threshold. As a result of this new information, MDH was unable to solicit and award a single or multi-year renewal contract prior to the April 16, 2024, subscription expiration date.

To immediately ameliorate the situation, and ensure continued access to the Smartsheet software, a small procurement bridge contract was executed to extend the existing subscription for 3 months, making the new expiration July 16, 2024. During this extension period OET collaborated with the Smartsheet manufacturer to identify all renewal possibilities and associated costs, and the Office of Procurement and Contract Management (OCMP) to identify the best approach for soliciting the renewal. It was ultimately decided that a renewal would need to be procured through the competitive sealed bid (CSB) process as there were no existing statewide contract vehicles to procure cloud-based software platforms such as Smartsheet.

A second small procurement bridge contract was executed to extend the subscription to October 17, 2024. On July 15, 2024, the Maryland Smartsheet account representative informed MDH that Smartsheet could not accommodate another short-term bridge contract to extend the subscription expiration date past October 17, 2024.

As such, an expedited procurement to renew the MDH Smartsheet software subscription is needed to prevent service disruptions that would be catastrophic to a variety of internal and external processes and mitigate potential harm to Marylanders who utilize the external forms that the MDH Smartsheet subscription facilitates. Failure to renew the MDH Smartsheet subscription would result in a loss of all MDH sheets, forms, workflows, reports, and dashboards in the Smartsheet system. This loss of data and work product would have negative impacts on MDH's ability to provide timely services to Marylanders interacting with the Department. Because of the risk associated with subscription expiration, MDH requests authorization to use the Expedited Procurement method to solicit a vendor to provide a 2-year subscription renewal for Smartsheet in order to mitigate and avoid a critical impact on the public health, safety, and welfare of Marylanders.

Pursuant to Maryland State Finance & Procurement Article (SFP) § 13-108 (d)(1), MDH's Procurement Officer, with approval of the Agency Head, has determined that this procurement should be expedited because: (1) urgent circumstances require prompt action; (2) an expedited procurement best serves the public interest; and (3) the need for the expedited procurement outweighs the benefits of making the procurement on the basis of competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals. However, the procurement officer shall attempt to obtain as much competition as reasonably possible per SFP § 13-108(d)(2).

Requesting Agency Remarks: DBM issued a Multi-Step Invitation for Bids (MS-IFB) for Pharmacy Benefits Plan Management Services and Pharmacy Purchasing Pool Management to procure services for the State of Maryland in connection with the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program and the Maryland Rx Program on January 23, 2024 VIA the eMarylandMarketplace (eMMA).

DBM administers the Plan that covers Active Employees, State Retirees, Satellite Account Employees and Retirees, Direct pay enrollees, and their respective eligible dependents. The plan is self-funded by the State and is an employee-sponsored health plan administered as part of the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program. The State requested services to be provided in two Functional Areas. Functional Area (FA) 1 – Active Employees, non-Medicare Retirees, and State of Maryland Rx Purchasing pool. Functional Area (FA) 2 – Medicare Eligible Retirees Employer Group Waiver Program (EGWP). In accordance with Chapter 397 of 2011, the State is in the process of transitioning Medicare-eligible retirees to Medicare Part D effective January 1, 2025. However, FA-2 EGWP has been included on a contingent basis. Thus, DBM does not plan to execute a notice to proceed for FA-2 EGWP at this time.

The State engaged The Segal Group, Inc. (Segal) as the Department's benefits consultants and Milliman as the reverse auction provider. Both teams actively assisted the State in this procurement as consultants and observers. The State also had several observers monitoring the procurement process, including representatives from the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees of Maryland and the Maryland Prescription Drug Affordability Board. The State posted the MS-IFB to eMMA on January 23, 2024, and held a pre-bid conference on January 30, 2024. After the pre-bid conference was held, the potential bidders were offered a period of time to identify their questions, and those were submitted to the State on February 13, 2024. The final set of answers to the questions was posted to eMMA on March 27, 2024. Four amendments were issued regarding timelines throughout the Question-and-Answer period, and one amendment was made to Attachment B. These were all posted to eMMA for bidders and the public to view.

The State conducted this procurement in three phases: Minimum Qualifications (Phase I), Participant Bidding Agreement (PBA) (Phase II), and the Reverse Auction (Phase III), consisting of three rounds. The State utilized Milliman's Secure Transfer Portal RFP360 platform to conduct each round of this procurement and bidding process to ensure the results were safely handled and secured.

The final round of bidding closed on May 22, 2024, and results were posted to eMMA, identifying each bidder's identity, on May 28, 2024. MedImpact submitted the lowest total projected cost and is recommended for award. MedImpact's bid over the full seven-year contract term was \$368,724,168.00 lower than Caremark's bid, a difference of 15.1%.

Following a thorough review of all information, including consultation with our contractors, the State finds that this is the best outcome, and the results evidence the cost savings contemplated by existing PBM specific legislation. DBM recommends that MedImpact be awarded this contract. On June 4th, 2024, the incumbent Contractor Caremark protested DBM's contract award to MedImpact. DBM denied this protest on June 26th, 2024. An appeal was submitted to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) on July 8, 2024. A hearing for the motion to dismiss the Caremark appeal was heard by the MSBCA on August 1, 2024, and the appeal was dismissed.

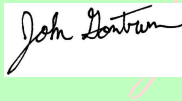

A notice of the availability of the Expedited Request for Proposals (ERFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on February 23, 2024. The agency understood there to be a limited number of vendors that could meet the requirements of the program. A total of 47 potential contractors were solicited. A pre-proposal conference was held on March 6, 2024, where representatives from six vendors attended. The ERFP closed on March 25, 2024. One proposal was received and was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.
