Remarks: Conviction & Release. On April 30, 1992, following a jury trial, Mr. Hall was convicted by the Baltimore City Circuit Court of second-degree murder, unlawful use of a handgun, and wearing a handgun. He was released on parole from his 50-year sentence on March 1,2017.

Actual Innocence. On March 15, 2023, Mr. Hall's convictions were vacated in the Baltimore City Circuit Court pursuant to granting a *Writ of Actual Innocence*, and on April 18, 2023 the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office dismissed the charges. That Writ is not dispositive for eligibility under the Lomax Act, and a contested hearing regarding Mr. Hall's actual innocence for purposes of this petition was held before the Office of Administrative Hearings. Following a review of several records (including from the hearing before the Circuit Court on the *Writ*) and taking additional witness testimony, the Administrative Law Judge found that Mr. Hall "has carried his burden of proving he did not commit the crimes of which he was convicted and sentenced."

Compensation. In its decision, the Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Hall was confined for 9,072 days, (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$ 94,991.00, and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$ 2,360,988.00 in compensation.

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, the decision *In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Anthony Hall, Claimant v. Board of Public Works* recommended an expedited payment schedule over two and a half years. The Department of Budget & Management has reviewed this recommendation and concurs.

Remarks: The water treatment plant, which was constructed 29 years ago, needs important upgrades because its current equipment has reached the expected lifespan and it's becoming increasingly difficult to find replacement parts. This project aims to reduce the high iron levels in the current well and turn the test well into another production well so the system has redundancy. This project includes replacing the outdated treatment system with updated treatment process equipment, redeveloping two wells, installing a raw water line, and building a well control house with electrical systems to ensure reliable water service.

The project was advertised on both eMaryland Marketplace and the MES Bonfire website. Emails were sent to twenty-six general contractors on the MES bidder's list. Fourteen companies requested bid packages, seven expressed the intention to bid, three actively participated in the pre-bid meeting, and two visited the site. However, only one bid was received.

MES surveyed all plan holders to find out why they did not submit bids. Their reasons for not bidding included the remote nature of the project site which they deemed to be out of their service area, the potential difficulty of the geological conditions, which may require specialized rock drilling experience; a scarcity of equipment and material suppliers in the area; and difficulties in meeting the MBE goal for subcontractors. Furthermore, local contractors holding solicitation plans who were contacted as a part of the survey stated that they opted to be subcontractors to Carl Belt, due to the difficulties.

MES approached the single bidder, Carl Belt, requesting a pricing revision for certain items to negotiate a more favorable overall cost. In response, Carl Belt, Inc. made a small reduction of \$25,520, signaling an alignment of their prices with the current construction market standards.

Considering the unique circumstances of the project, characterized by its remote location and the absence of detailed multiple bids, the design engineer concludes the contract price is fair and reasonable. Carl Belt has successfully performed upgrades at several State water and wastewater facilities.

The MES Board of Directors approved this procurement at the January 25, 2024 meeting.

Requesting Institution Remarks: In March 2021, with an infusion of resources from the HBCU Settlement funds, the University of Maryland Eastern Shore issued a solicitation for a Brand Identity Study and Marketing Strategy Services to assist with increasing brand awareness and improving student recruitment and admissions numbers. The solicitation was advertised in eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and the University's Procurement website attracting 16 responses. The University awarded the contract to TBC, Inc. at a contract price of \$168,180. This firm was determined to be the most qualified to support the University in its marketing endeavors. The award was made within the University's delegated authority. The Board of Public Works subsequently approved a contract modification to include media purchases in the amount of \$1,320,000 (USM Item 3-S, 10\12\2022 BPW). That modified contract expired on 8\31\2023. The University is now seeking the approval of the Board of Public Works for a sole source contract to continue paid advertising and related marketing services for an additional two

years. This new contract will include creative and production work by TBC for the University for use in video, social media, and print media.

The ad campaign has substantially improved the University's enrollment to its highest level in 8 years. TBC has been a valuable partner in helping the University advance its brand through the development of creative content and the purchase of ad space across multiple media. TBC filmed more than nine hours of footage to help produce a 7+ minute video announcing the public phase of the University's Capital Campaign. The University plans to use much of that content to produce multiple videos to recruit students, raise funds for the UMES Capital Campaign, and further promote the UMES brand for key audiences. The University and TBC collaborated effectively to film and produce the content for a single video and believes strongly that working with the same team is the most efficient and effective way to produce considerably more content from the remaining footage. This sole source contract is justified due to the existing branding partnership that will continue creative services (including production; digital design and development; media research, planning and buying; as well as special marketing and advertising projects that will arise from video content and new ad possibilities) work in a seamless fashion. It would not be feasible to begin a new solicitation, assessment, and contract process. A new procurement process would result in an extended delay in executing the University's marketing plan, force it to start from scratch with a new vendor, disrupt the continuation of the ad buy metrics that allow us to track and evaluate their effectiveness, and inhibit the University's ability to continue these necessary services.

A sole source contract with this firm is justified given the extensive creative work that has already been produced and their unique ability to drive the results that UMES is seeking. Further, if a new solicitation had to be conducted it would prevent the University from getting an extensive ad buy into the field in a timely fashion—effectively shutting the University out of the competition for the 2024 fall incoming class. In addition, a delay would disrupt the marketing plan and the continuation of the ad buy metrics that allow the University to track and evaluate their effectiveness.

There is no MBE goal as the University did not identify and sub-contracting opportunities on this contract, the majority of which (\$2.5 million) is for paid advertising.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on July 5, 2023. A total of 114 vendors were solicited via eMMA, with 4 vendors being directly solicited. The bid due date was originally due on August 23, 2023; however, the due date was extended to September 6, 2023, in efforts to increase competition.

On the date of the public bid opening, only one (1) bid was received. The bid was from Dynalectric Company. ("Dyna") in the amount of \$542,965. Initially, three (3) companies attended the pre-bid meeting, with only one of those vendors attending the site visit. Prior to the bid due date, two companies confirmed that bids would be submitted; however, only one bid was received. Procurement reached out to the two vendors who did not submit bids, including the incumbent. The incumbent opted not to bid for reasons undisclosed to MDOT MTA, and the other vendor did not respond or provide an explanation for its lack of interest.

The MDOT MTA Procurement conducted an initial review the bid package to confirm responsiveness, and to see if the vendor met the minimum requirements of the solicitation. The vendor met all requirements listed in the IFB and satisfied all minimum qualifications. The bid received is approximately 15% less than the engineer's estimate. The MDOT MTA conservatively estimated higher on parts and materials due to the volatility of the economy and the availability of parts; however, MDOT MTA is confident that the vendor can perform their work at their quoted price. For this reason, it was determined that the bid is fair and reasonable.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and/or VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve (SBR) designation. MTA's PRG determined that this contract qualified for a 0% MBE and VSBE goal as there were no sub-contractable opportunities.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This contract supports a full range of systems development, maintenance, migration, and enhancement requests to support MPA's Port Operations and Security System. The need for senior programmers and database administrators is ongoing and cannot be fulfilled by MPA with its own employees. With this possible future need in mind, the original solicitation provided that MPA could acquire additional resources under the contract, by modification and subject to necessary approvals.

MPA now needs to add three resources to fulfill the requirements of a 2021 Federal Port Security Grant to upgrade MPA's access control system by: (1) analyzing the existing system; (2) planning solutions to integrate Optical Character Recognition and Quick Response technologies into MPA's marine terminal access security control system, to enhance the identification verification process required to gain entrance into MPA owned and operated facilities, and to replace hard copy permits with a machine-readable optical label that contains the permit information; and (3) implementing the solutions adopted by MPA. The Port Security Grant requires that all grant funds must be spent no later than September 1, 2024, or the unspent grant funds will be forfeited.

Once the upgrade has been completed, the original resource and the three additional resources added under this contract will continue to maintain and support the MPA's information technology needs.

Since the 2021 grant application was approved, the MPA Office of Information Security and Technology (OIT) has been utilizing the On Call Temporary Contingent Labor Services Contracts of the MDOT's Secretary's Office to obtain the technical resources necessary to complete the work required by the grant. However, the On Call Temporary Contingent Labor Services Contracts will end February 2024. Therefore, MPA must obtain the necessary resources by other means. In addition, MPA is looking to secure long-term resources, rather than short-term resources offered by the On Call Temporary Contingent Labor Services contracts.

Since Contract 219031-IT already authorizes additional resources, the fastest contracting vehicle now available to MPA is to add three additional resources; one senior programmer and two database administrators under the current contract in order to complete the grant project by the Federal deadline of September 1, 2024. Obtaining three additional resources under this existing contract will allow MPA to obtain long-term technical resources. Therefore, MPA should obtain necessary approvals to add the additional resources, to enable the contractor to locate and offer suitable individuals as resources.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on October 25, 2022. A total of 171 potential contractors were solicited including 58 Small Businesses and 55 Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) firms. Two proposals were received and one was deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was determined to be not reasonably susceptible for award because they were not licensed. The proposal from Laboratory Corporation of America Holdings was determined to be the most advantageous to the State considering both technical and financial factors.

Laboratory Corporation of America Holdings will assist the Department to resolve paternity when a child is born to an unmarried mother and the paternity of the child is in question. They will provide genetic paternity testing services to determine the likelihood that a putative father is the biological father. The determination usually requires collection of genetic samples from the mother, child, and putative father. The cost to determine the likelihood of paternity of one child will be \$138. The contractor must provide the test results to the local jurisdiction in a notarized report within 14 calendar days from the date that the last of the specimens is collected.

The price per test is almost double the previous contract, due to the increase in inflation during the past three years. Based on the typical cost of a paternity test with court-admissible results for child support and child visitation ranging between \$300 to \$500, the price for these services is determined to be fair and reasonable.

Specifications within the solicitation require the contractor to comply with the American Association of Blood Banks (AABB) standards for genetic paternity testing services. The standards have specific quality control goals for ensuring the highest level of responsibility and accountability rests with the testing laboratory. Included in the standards are process control procedures that affect the quality of services provided by the testing laboratory. Due to the AABB standards, MBE partnering opportunities are limited to ensure non-contamination of genetic testing samples. It was determined that MBE opportunities exist in the area of equipment for color printers, cameras, independent auditing, and supplies.

Requesting Agency Remarks: MDH is seeking approval for awarding a 5- year base contract with one 2- year renewal options for an ASO to provide MDH with the following services: management of behavioral health authorizations, utilization, claims processing, provider management and auditing functions. The ASO provides MDH the following: management of behavioral health authorization control, claims processing, provider education, provider training, provider compliance, and auditing functions. The ASO also provides reimbursement for a range of recovery and support services, including mental health case management, mobile treatment/assertive community treatment, psychiatric rehabilitation, residential rehabilitation, supported employment, rehabilitation services, and specific substance use disorder services. The ASO is responsible for addressing provider quality and service coverage and quality supporting MDH using data to drive positive outcomes for Marylanders using behavioral health services.

On January 10, 2023, a Request for Proposals (RFP) was posted on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, and the solicitation was directly sent to potential offerors including managed care organizations currently doing business in Maryland under the HealthChoice Program, and three entities performing as administrative service organizations. An MBE subcontracting goal of 18% and a VSBE subcontracting goal of 2% has been established for this contract. The recommended awardee has committed to the 18% MBE participation goal and a 4.38% VSBE participation goal.

This RFP was published for a total of 98 days. There were four responses to this Request for Proposals. One was disqualified for not meeting minimum qualifications and another for not meeting MBE/VSBE requirements.

The Evaluation Committee met to evaluate the technical proposals from Carelon Behavioral Health, Inc. (Carelon) and Magellan Healthcare, Inc. (Magellan). Each vendor had the opportunity to respond to clarification questions from the committee and each was invited to, and each provided an oral presentation to demonstrate their proposed solution. In this procurement technical proposals received greater weight than financial proposals.

The Evaluation Committee unanimously recommended awarding this contract to Carelon who was the highest ranked Offeror both technically and financially. The technical ranking was based on an evaluation of four primary criteria: Understanding the Scope of work; Experience and Qualifications of Proposed Staff; Offeror Qualifications and Capabilities; and Economic Benefit to the State.

Remarks (cont'd):

The recommended awardee, Carelon has performed similar functions to those required in this RFP both in Maryland in the past and is presently performing for other states in contracts of equal size and breadth. The Evaluation Committee unanimously recommends that the contract be awarded to Carelon based on its technical proficiency and the significant value represented in its financial proposal and is based on the best value to the State.

Magellan has protested the award of the contract. MDH denied the protest on January 18, 2024. The window for Magellan to file an appeal of the protest denial was January 29, 2024. As of February 8, 2024, MDH has not received notice that Magellan has filed an appeal with MSBCA.

To ensure a smooth transition between vendors, MDH requires the longest design, development, and implementation (DDI) period as possible. The recommended awardee is committed to completing the DDI period in ten (10) months and is confident that the system will be fully operational on January 1, 2025.
