Office of Administrative Hearings Compensation to Erroneously Confined Individual, Mr. Jerry Lee Jenkins

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works pay Mr. Jerry Lee Jenkins compensation

for erroneous confinement in the amount of \$ 202,995, and Miller & Chevalier Chartered attorney's fees in the amount of \$ 40,750.

(1) one initial payment equal to the annual amount of the State's most recent median household income to be paid within 60 days after

(ii) in accordance with an expedited payment schedule recommended

under subsection (d)(1)(iv) of this section."

Remarks: Conviction. On July 2, 1987, Charles County Circuit Court convicted Mr. Jerry Lee Jenkins of First-Degree Rape, and First-Degree Sexual Assault. On January 8, 2001, after numerous post-conviction proceedings, the State offered, and Mr. Jenkins accepted, an *Alford* plea in this matter, with an agreement to modify his sentence immediately, and again in 2010 with a maintained record of good behavior.

Release. On July 15, 2010, Mr. Jenkins was released from prison pursuant to the 2001 agreement, and subsequent resentencings.

Actual Innocence. On June 7, 2013, the Charles County Circuit Court vacated Mr. Jenkins' convictions, after the State located DNA evidence that revealed another individual had committed the rape. Subsequently, Governor Lawrence J. Hogan granted Mr. Jenkins a full pardon, as his convictions had been conclusively shown to be in error.

Compensation. After considering the complicated relationship between the sentence in this matter and the sentence in an unrelated matter, the Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Jenkins was confined for 780 days solely as a result of the erroneous conviction; (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$94,991; and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$202,995.00 in compensation.

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, "Based on the interests of the Claimant, including his time of wrongful incarcerations, his current financial need, his current age, the years it took to clear his name, his efforts to exonerate himself, and his overall financial need..." the decision In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Jerry Lee Jenkins, Claimant v. Board of Public Works recommends an expedited payment schedule over approx. 3 months (the statutorily required payment of \$94,991.00 within 60 days of the November 22, 2023 order; and then an additional payment of \$108,004.00 by February 29, 2024). The Department of Budget and Management has reviewed this recommended schedule and reports it can be accommodated within budgeted accounts.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Section 34 of Chapter 101 of 2023 (Budget Bill for FY 2024) authorizes the Board of Public Works to create additional positions beyond the Rule of 100 established in provided that 1.25 full-time equivalent (FTE) contractual positions are abolished for each regular position added and if there is no increase in agency funding in the current budget or the next two budgets.

The Maryland Department of Health requests 135 new positions via contractual conversions to support critical programming that impacts all Marylanders. Following the COVID-19 pandemic response, it became apparent that an experienced, knowledgeable, stable public health workforce is essential to perform many critical state-level functions that support the health and safety of Marylanders. Converting current contractual employees to permanent state merit positions will provide stability not offered by contractual employment and ultimately strengthen the state public health workforce that we are rebuilding. These conversions will help support programming in our Departmental Disabilities Administration and Behavioral Health Administration. Additionally, this conversion request will bolster our facilities through the conversion of over 70 contractual security attendants to promote the safety and well-being of our patients and staff. This conversion request helps to meet the Moore-Miller Administration's objective of filling State Government vacancies.

The Department identified 168.75 contractual FTE to be abolished to create the 135 regular positions listed above. This is a ratio of 1.25 contractual FTE abolished to 1 regular positions created.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The Maryland Department of the Environment is requesting additional permanent positions to align with the Governor's goal to fully utilize federal funding and leave no unspent federal funds. The Land and Materials Administration, Land Restoration Program's Federal Facilities Assessment and Remediation Division receives consistent, permanent federal Defense State Memorandum of Agreement Cooperative Agreement funding from the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) to ensure that environmental remediation and environmental restoration projects at Department of Defense facilities are performed in a manner consistent with state law. The three Geologist I positions, supported by the Administrative Specialist II, will review Department of Defense facility environmental plans and assessments and identify and oversee the mitigation of potential threats to human health and the environment.

Additionally, the Land and Materials Administration, Mining Program's Abandoned Mine Land Division received long-term Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding to enable the Division to reclaim and restore former abandoned coal mining sites which will improve water quality and ecosystems. The Regulatory Compliance Engineer I will manage reclamation and restoration projects from the design to construction phases. The Natural Resources Planner I position will prepare and review project plans and perform environmental, cultural resource, water quality, and habitat analyses and evaluations.

The Air and Radiation Administration received \$3 million from the EPA's Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Planning Grant program in July 2023. MDE has allocated \$2.1 million of the grant budget over four years (FY24-27) to hire staff of one program manager and four administrators—included in the above table—to deepen the Climate Change Program's capacity to work with local governments and other stakeholders to identify and implement greenhouse gas emission reduction projects. This work will enable MDE to be well positioned to lead Maryland's efforts to secure CPRG Implementation Funds, totaling \$4.6 billion nationwide, and increase Maryland's competitiveness for other funding opportunities, like the EPA's Greenhouse Gas Reduction Funds, totaling \$27 billion nationwide.

The requested positions are needed immediately as federal funds have already been awarded to the department for these purposes. Additionally, it should be noted that the CPRG positions will be required to assist in the completion of a Priority Climate Action Plan, which is due March 1, 2024.

The archives include approximately three million photographs, several thousand letters, back issues of the newspaper's thirteen editions, and personal audio recordings of U.S. Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The Upton Mansion will serve as the permanent home and research center for this collection, allowing it to be available to the public.

Although currently displaced, Mannie Scott Post No. 193 members continue to host African American-centered community events throughout Caroline County including Juneteenth celebrations, parades to honor community veterans, community block parties, community cookouts, and fundraising events to assist in the building's renovation.

This project aims to preserve the cemetery and become a place of heritage tourism in Annapolis.

F. Brown's UMC Multi Cultural Heritage Center, Inc. 1710 Parkers Creek Road, Port Republic, MD 20676, Calvert County

Grantee: Browns UMC Multi Cultural Heritage Center, Inc.

Description: Exterior and interior rehabilitation including siding repair/replacement; foundation and masonry repair/replacement; metal and carpentry repair/replacement; roof repair/replacement; flooring repair/replacement; finishes and painting; window and door repair/replacement; selective demolition; mechanical/electrical/plumbing installation; drainage improvements and utilities; thermal/moisture barrier; and associated architectural; engineering; and consulting services. Once restored, the center will once again act as a place where the community can gather for educational programming and other partnerships.

Shortly after the Civil War, the congregation helped establish an African American school in 1866. This school was replaced in the 1920's by a Rosenwald School. This project aims to preserve the building so it can host educational programs about the lives, actions, struggles and achievements the members of the community. It also aims to preserve the cemetery.

Description: Exterior and interior rehabilitation including carpentry repair/replacement; finishes and painting; mechanical/electrical/plumbing upgrades; accessibility improvements; utilities; insulation installation; and associated architectural, engineering, and consulting services. [Total project costs \$245,000 estimated.]

Remarks: The Charles "Hoppy" Adams Jr. House project aims to convert the home into a historic house museum. Adams' home served as a refuge for Black entertainers during segregation in Annapolis. The goal is for the home to interpret the life of Hoppy Adams, his legacy, and African American life in Annapolis during Jim Crow.

Remarks: The James Stephenson House, Quarters located within the Susquehanna State Park and Lower Deer Creek Valley Historic District, aims to restore one of its detached dwellings. When the James Stephenson House was surveyed in 1979, the former servants' quarters were described as a smokehouse. It is unique in that it is one of few documented surviving detached/free-standing enslaved/servants quarters known to exist on public land. The goal is for the dwelling to become a featured stop on the Susquehanna State Park trail system, by building a spur trail off of the existing Ivy Branch Trail directly to and by the former Stephenson property, and specifically the servant's quarters. Interpretive waysides will be included at the site, and the structure will be opened to the public for special events and by request.

L. Fruitland Community Center 300 Morris Street, Fruitland, MD 21826, Wicomico

Grantee: Fruitland Community Center, Inc.

Remarks: The Fruitland Community Center located in the Forktown, Fruitland Survey District is housed in a building constructed in 1912 and formerly known as the Morris Street Colored School. Since 1985, the building has been used as a community center that assists low-income youth in Fruitland by providing an after school program that seeks to provide educational activities and teaching African American history. The center is hoping to continue this legacy by completing their archival room and other restoration work.

The future learning center could educate white residents and other non-blacks about how African Americans contributed to the town's development and how they suffered discrimination under segregation.

The Hearse House represents the rich history of Kent County African American-owned businesses. It is a stop on the Historical Society of Kent County's African American Heritage Walk. The proposed project aims to increase heritage education and tourism in the Calvert Street business and residential corridor by creating permanent signage for the Walley family and the neighborhood in which their business existed.

Since the houses were inhabited by African American ships' caulkers, these houses hold primary significance in African American maritime labor history, in "mobtown" history, and in immigration/social history in a workingman's community.

Remarks: The Stadium Authority recommends awarding a contract to The Whiting-Turner Company for design and preconstruction services for the Harry Grove Stadium Improvements project. The procurement process proceeded as follows:

The RFP for this Project was issued on July 12, 2023 via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, the MSA website and GovDelivery. The procurement followed MSA's Competitive Sealed Proposal process and was based on the requirements outlined in the RFP. The RFP outlines the specific scope of work for the project and describes the requirements for submitting a technical and financial proposal.

A selection committee (hereinafter "the Committee") comprised of members from MSA and City of Frederick was formed to review and evaluate the proposals, oral presentations and all other submissions related to this RFP.

Two firms submitted technical proposals on August 28, 2023. The Committee evaluated each proposal based on the requirements established in the RFP. Upon completion of proposal evaluations and the review of technical clarifications, the Committee recommended the short-listing of both firms to participate in the oral presentation phase of this procurement. Oral presentations were conducted the week of September 25, 2023. Upon completion of the oral presentations, the committee short-listed both firms to participate in the financial proposal phase of the procurement. Each firm was issued a Financial Proposal form that required them to provide a fee for design and preconstruction services, estimated general conditions, construction administration, and percentage mark-ups for bonds and insurances, contingency and fee to be used in the negotiation of a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for construction. Password-protected financial proposals were submitted on August 28, 2023 and passwords were requested from short-listed firms on October 25, 2023. Upon review of all submissions and completion of evaluation, The Whiting-Tuner Contracting Company was deemed the Offeror to provide the most advantageous fee structure and the overall best value to the project.

The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company exceeds the established overall MBE goal of 31% for design and preconstruction services and has committed to meeting the overall goal of 32% participation established for construction services.

The Authority intends to return with a recommendation to modify the contract upon negotiating an acceptable GMP, which is estimated to exceed \$15,000,000.

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) and other conservation easements funded by POS Stateside

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works:

- 1) Approve the expansion of CREP Statewide (from the current 9 counties);
- 2) Approve an exemption from §1-109(c)(1), Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland to allow a land trust, local government or resilience authority to contract directly with a property owner for CREP and other easements funded with Program Open Space, Stateside, subject to Board approval; and
- 3) Approve an exemption from §1-109(b), Natural Resources Article, to allow DNR to continue to use the easement valuation system for CREP, with modifications.

Authority:

- 1) DNR, with the approval of the Board of Public Works, may acquire real property. §1-109, Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland; and
- 2) The Board may exempt DNR projects from §1-109 acquisition requirements. §1-109(f), Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

Background & Explanation:

The Board approved the CREP permanent easement program in 2009 (see Item 9A, Secretary's Agenda, 9/16/2009). CREP is a two-tiered program improving water quality and wildlife habitat by compensating farmers for removing highly erodible cropland and marginal pastureland from production and implementing best management practices. Landowners first enter into 10-15 year Federal contracts with the Farm Service Agency (USDA), then landowners can choose to make their contract practices permanent by selling a CREP easement to DNR. Due to POS funding challenges in 2009, permanent easements were only available in 9 targeted counties with the highest levels of nitrogen and phosphorus loading into the watershed. Data on the increased combined loading of nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment throughout the watershed supports statewide expansion.

Easement Valuation System: The 2009 approval included an easement valuation system (EVS) based on fair market values for each county established through the MALPF (Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation). DNR requests approval to continue with the established EVS, making necessary adjustments needed to expand to all counties.

As with the current EVS, the calculations for the value of the easement will start with the same percentage (%) of the MALPF FMV that provides the "anchor" for the EVS. Percentage points will be added for the width of buffers and the amount of land in the CREP contract covered by the easement. However, the new EVS will provide different percentage caps ranging from 55% to 75% of the full MALPF FMV depending on whether the easement provides whole farm protection as well as extinguishment of development rights.



14A. PROGRAM OPEN SPACE STATE SHARE (cont'd)

Easement Valuation System (cont'd):

The proposed final easement price will be capped and never exceed 75% of the MALPF FMV.

Board of Public Works: DNR shall present each proposed POS Stateside conservation easement for approval.

Local Notification: Pursuant to §1-109(c)(2), Natural Resources Article, DNR shall provide notification to local governing bodies that DNR proposed to acquire a conservation easement interest within their jurisdiction.

Process: Transactional processes with CREP and POS Stateside easements would be aligned in a manner similar to the Rural Legacy Program, providing for more consistency. DNR shall provide legal documents and title for review and approval by the Office of the Attorney General.

The survey is currently conducted each month at more than 25 international airports located in the United States. The program is critical to the NTTO's efforts to assist businesses in Maryland and across the U.S. to improve their competitiveness and effectiveness in the international travel market. Many state tourism offices, including the Maryland Office of Tourism, and convention and visitors' bureaus are dependent upon the program as the source for comparable state and city visitation and international traveler trend information. In addition to the benefits for the Maryland Office of Tourism outlined above, the SIAT survey will enhance the collection of data from international travelers utilizing BWI Thurgood Marshall. The monthly cost to conduct the surveys is \$2,680 or \$32,160 annually. MAA deemed the price fair and reasonable based on a similar contract that MAA pays for the Airport Counsel International Airport Service Quality Surveys at a monthly cost of \$2,682 or \$32,186 annually.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. A 20% MBE goal and 2% VSBE goal was established for this contract. Unison Consulting, Inc is currently exceeding the MBE goal to achieve participation compliance of 41.91%. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Solicitation was advertised on June 6, 2023, via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, the MAA website, and by way of direct solicitation to four (4) firms. Three (3) proposals were received on July 24, 2023. All proposals were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

The Maryland Environmental Noise Act of 1974 provides for the protection of citizens from the impact of transportation-related noise. The aviation portion of the Act, codified in the Annotated Code of Maryland, Transportation §5-801 through §5-824, and in regulations COMAR Transportation §11.03.03.01 through §11.03.03.06 and §11.03.01.12, requires the MAA to adopt an ANZ and NAP that eliminates or reduces impact of land uses in the ANZ at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport and prevents incompatible land development around the Airport. COMAR also requires MAA to update the ANZ approximately every five years to account for changes in total annual aircraft operations, aircraft types, and aircraft flight paths that may result in changes to the overall aircraft noise levels.

After completion of the evaluation process the Selection Panel (Panel) determined all firms offer value to the MAA and recommended that all firms be awarded contracts. As stated in the RFP, technical rankings carried a higher weight than the financial offer rankings. The Panel ranked HMMH the highest of the offerors considering the combination of HMMH's years of experience providing noise related consulting services focused on noise-abatement for airports and the technical expertise of the staff. The Panel ranked ESA second considering the combination of ESA's experience with the Noise Program (ESA is currently supporting the FAA noise program), and ESA is the developer of "fly quiet" programs. The Panel ranked HNTB third considering the experience of their key staff. Specifically, HNTB's Airspace Analyst is a licensed FAA control tower operator with 45 years of experience in airspace modeling and noise abatement and the Program Software/Support staff member is a certified web developer with 26 years' experience as a lead software development engineer with extensive software programming, application development and mobile applications.

Tasks will be assigned to the contractors based on technical expertise. MAA will utilize the hourly rates submitted in the cost proposals through the duration of the contract. The award amount is based upon the final budget amount. None of the contractors have a guaranteed minimum or maximum amount, except for the overall budget limitation. The financial cost was for evaluation purposes only and was based upon a model number of labor hours by job classifications and fixed hourly rates for those classifications.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing a DBE participation goal, as well as a Small Business Enterprise designation. An 8% DBE participation goal was established for this contract.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The MAA is requesting additional funding in the amount of \$550,000 for continuity of services, while MAA procures a new contract. The MAA did not anticipate the pandemic's impact on this contract. Specifically, unplanned expenses included the issuances of two revenue bonds, increased financial planning, debt structure reviews and rating agency inquires due to COVID impacts, accelerated the spending on this contract. The COVID impacts required MAA to reassess its debt structure and various other contractual obligations. In February 2021, the MAA refunded the MEDCO and Parking Facility Bonds to 2021A Revenue Bonds, which was unanticipated due to enplanements levels decreasing by 95%. In FY 2021, MAA vacancies in Capital Programs and Financial Planning & Analysis soared to over a 67% rate. Therefore, the consultants were utilized more than planned to perform functions for financial analyses; financial reporting; development of strategies; cost analyses; airline rate setting, and reconciliation as provided for in the contract.

The additional funding is particularly critical to the financial performance of MAA. This contract is utilized to maintain MAA's airlines rates & charges model which is used to generate all airline revenues. In FY 2023, airline revenues to MAA totaled an estimated \$150 million per annum. It is a complex financial model that requires detailed knowledge of MAA's use & lease agreement currently in place until June 30, 2026.

MAA is in the process of procuring a new contract for Financial Planning and Analysis at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports, which is anticipated to advertise in January 2024.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. A 20% MBE goal was established for this contract. LeighFisher, Inc. is not meeting the established 20% MBE goal, as Leigh Fisher has been assigned specialized task specific to the revenue bond sales resulting in 0% MBE participation. Frasca & Associates, LLC is currently exceeding the goal to achieve participation compliance of 28.7%. Unison Consulting, Inc. is currently achieving 8.95% compliance. As more tasks are assigned, the firms will continue to utilize the MBEs for the services they are approved to perform. No VSBE goal was established for this contract due to the limited subcontracting opportunities outlined in the statement of work.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on December 12, 2022. A total of 71 potential contractors were solicited. Four proposals were received on January 5,2023 and three were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because the offeror did not submit a complete MBE Utilization and Fair Solicitation Affidavit and MBE Participation Schedule.

Gray, Kirk, VanSant Advertising (GKV) was selected by the evaluation committee and is one of Maryland's largest advertising firms with many clients from diverse sectors (government agencies, nonprofits/associations, financial services, health insurance etc.). GKV's technical proposal provided insights into the diverse Maryland media market and outlined different strategies that appeal to different audiences. They provided details on how they will implement their campaigns and collaborate with their various partners with different strengths and qualifications. They have previous understanding of tobacco control issues impacting Maryland audiences and the local media market and have fostered partnerships at the community level during their COVID 19 campaign across Maryland which will be beneficial for future tobacco control campaigns. They have extensive experience in developing targeted, culturally, and linguistically relevant media placements for different Maryland populations.

GKV detailed the items they considered while developing their budget including research activities, concepting, development and revision of creative materials, costs associated with royalty free photos and video footage, materials production. GKV took into consideration that newly developed campaigns require substantial investment in the initial stages to ensure development of quality products.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends mass-reach health communications as an essential evidence-based element of a statewide tobacco control program that also includes state and local level programming, cessation support, community-based programs, and other initiatives. Implementing these initiatives is a best practice comprehensive approach to reducing tobacco-related death and disease and eliminating health disparities.

A 10% MBE participation was established for this contract. GKV has committed to exceeding the participation to achieve 14% MBE participation.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The previous contract expired on September 23, 2023, prior to a request for extension. This contract will act as a bridge until the new contract begins on July 1, 2024 so that installations of upgraded septic systems can be completed. The solicitation for the new contract was not completed prior to the expiration of the contract due to internal administrative challenges.

The Bay Restoration Fund's (BRF) septic BAT program provides grants to homeowners and businesses to upgrade conventional septic systems with nitrogen-reducing units as part of the Chesapeake Bay restoration effort. The program is administered by the counties that receive a grant from the State. Applicants can apply for grant money to pay for a BAT system, with priority given to those with failing septic systems.

To effectively monitor pricing to ensure equity across the state, MDE conducted this procurement to obtain approved bid prices from BAT Contractors that install the technology. The counties, as part of the BRF grant awarded to them, engage the contractors to provide the services for the BAT installation and undertake a final inspection. After the county accepts the installation, the contractors invoice the county for the price approved by the State. The counties then seek reimbursement from MDE under the Bay Restoration Fund grant award.

The Department is working on a new solicitation and anticipates advertising it in January 2024. The solicitation was not completed prior to the previous contract expiration date due to internal administrative challenges.

No MBE or VSBE participation was established for this contract because MDE does not contract with the contractors directly, the homeowners do. Since there is not a contractual relationship MDE could not establish MBE or VSBE participation.
