#### 5. <u>BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS</u> *Wetlands Licenses*

## ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY

22-1224 *HERRINGTON HARBOUR, INC* – To improve navigable access and marina safety by mechanically and hydraulically maintenance dredging areas, transporting dredge material to a disposal site, and providing for periodic maintenance dredging for six years.

North Beach, Herring Bay Special conditions: Time of year restrictions. Requirements for maintenance dredging, dredge material transport and disposal, if hydraulically dredging – turbidity limits and dredge material pipelines, if Licensee does not obtain approval from the U.S. Coast Guard -- submitting an application and revised plans for a modification, and if an inadvertent release of dredge material occurs.

Additionally, the Administrator recommends the Board assess annual compensation of \$2,500 to be deposited into the MDE's Wetlands and Waterways Program Fund and require mitigation in the amount of \$5,572.44.



*Remarks:* There is an existing Memorandum of Understanding between the Department of General Services (DGS) and MES, dated August 11, 2020, that established an agreement to transfer procurement responsibility and funding from authorized Program Open Space (POS) funds for the design and construction of infrastructure improvements on various water and wastewater projects located on, or serving, DNR facilities. There is a Park Service Critical Maintenance Fund within DNR created as part of the Great Maryland Outdoors Act of 2022 (CH39).

The project scope of work at Swallow Falls State Park in Garrett County includes the repair of a damaged culvert. The project scope of work at Point Lookout State Park in St. Mary's County includes repaying the northern campground loops. Trucks entering and leaving the water and sewer line replacement project site at Point Lookout State Park damaged the paying due to poor soils. This change order will repair the roads after the utility work is completed. MES has contractors currently under contract on these projects who can perform this work. This transfer moves the work up in the schedule to help facilitate the overall completion of construction activities in these two facilities.

Approval for the use and transfer of capital POS funds have been considered by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), and they respectfully concur with this agreement. MES will be the agency responsible for management of the design and construction tasks related to these projects, on behalf of DNR.

*Fund Source:* Natural Resources Development Fund FY 2024 Program Open Space Park Critical Maintenance Fund PCA II2A1 for a total transfer of \$1,650,000.

Because the project is located outside of a Priority Funding Area, on October 15, 2018, the Department of Planning issued an exception to the Priority Funding Area law due to the project being necessary to protect public health or safety. Work includes modification of existing septics for installation of STEP systems, new small-diameter sewer connections and low-pressure force mains. 

**Remarks**: This is one of several deferred maintenance improvement projects at Morgan State University (MSU). This project will rebuild portions of the slope from Stadium Way to the Herring Run and rebuild and resurface Stadium Way inclusive of all utilities, walks, fencing, and walls. etc. The contractor will be working from the top down to stabilize the slope at approximately 80 feet. Additionally, portions of the slope will be stabilized using a method that only a few firms in the state are qualified to perform.

*Basis for Selection*: The project was publicized on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA), and both a pre-bid conference and a site visit were conducted during the solicitation period. Despite receiving only one proposal, subsequent post-bid scope review meetings and discussions were held. It was verified that the Offeror possesses the necessary experience and a qualified team to undertake the highly specialized task of stabilizing roads and rebuilding stream slopes.

Following a procurement review, it was determined that MBE subcontracting goals would be relevant to the project. 
The Request for Proposals for this project was issued on March 5, 2024. The procurement followed MSA's Competitive Sealed Proposal process and was based on the requirements outlined in the RFP. The RFP outlines the specific scope of work for the project and describes the requirements for submitting a technical and financial proposal. The RFP clarifies that technical criteria will be given more weight than financial criteria.

Four firms submitted technical proposals and the Selection Committee recommended the shortlisting of all firms to participate in the oral presentation phase of this procurement. Upon completion of the oral presentations, the committee short-listed all firms to participate in the financial proposal phase of the procurement. Each firm was issued a Financial Proposal form that required them to provide a fee for preconstruction services, estimated general conditions, construction administration, percentage mark-ups for bonds and insurances, and contingency fee to be used in the negotiation of a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for construction. A Best and Final Offer was requested from the two highest-ranked Offerors. Upon review of all submissions and completion of evaluation, North Point Builders of Maryland, LLC was deemed the Offeror to provide the most advantageous fee structure and the overall best value to the project.

North Point Builders of Maryland, LLC meets the established overall MBE goal of 10% for preconstruction services.

The Authority intends to return with a recommendation to modify the contract upon negotiating an acceptable GMP, which is estimated to exceed \$3,000,000.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: An underground pipe leak was initially detected at the State Center in Baltimore on October 26, 2023. This leak resulted in a loss of water pressure that affected the power plant's ability to bring heat to the nearby Department of Labor building. The Department of General Services (DGS) Office of Facilities Management (OFM) obtained a contractor, Ferguson Trenching, through a small procurement under DGS OFM authority for \$7,523.62. The contractor was able to dig to a depth of five feet, but the pipe was below that level, and the contractor did not have the equipment to proceed further.



# A1. **DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES** (cont'd)

This situation was brought to the attention of DGS Leadership on November 3, 2023. Due to the immediate necessity of conducting repairs to mitigate the threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the 800 State employees and visitors to the Department of Labor building, the DGS Secretary declared an emergency. DGS OFM could not wait up to 48 hours for the DGS Chief Procurement Officer (CPO) to approve the request to conduct an emergency procurement; therefore, OFM proceeded with an emergency procurement to start immediate repairs.

*Basis for Selection:* Three vendors were contacted to provide quotes for the emergency repairs. One vendor was not able to respond in a timely fashion. Another vendor did not have the equipment to dig down to the pipe. The third vendor, J.M. Mechanical, was called in and completed the necessary repairs to mitigate the threat to public health, safety, and welfare (this reported emergency contract award).

*Reason for Late Report:* A new OFM employee was handling the mitigation of the emergency. The employee did not know the process for reporting an emergency procurement or the required paperwork and documentation. As a result, the proper paperwork was not completed at the time of the emergency.

DGS OFM's Facilities Administration became aware of the emergency upon receiving invoices from the contractor. At that point, OFM discovered that the emergency procurement documentation had not been completed and is now rectifying the paperwork to support the efforts.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: The Department of General Services has declared an emergency for the design of the HVAC and structural systems of the William Donald Schaefer Tower (WDST) located at 6 St. Paul Street in Baltimore. The building houses several state agencies, including the Office of the Governor, that provide services to the greater Baltimore region. The building requires immediate significant upgrades to the HVAC systems due to the failing cooling tower which provides cooling in the summer and temperature balancing in the winter. Additionally, the underground garage structure requires upgrades and repair. Due to the speed of the project requirements, it is essential that the design team start work immediately without delay due to contracting or initial study of the building. Completing the emergency design will allow DGS to make the completed repairs and replacements while the building stays occupied. Any delay can result in the closure of the building if the systems fail.

*Basis for Selection:* Reasonable efforts to obtain at least three oral quotes, in accordance with COMAR 21.05.06.02C(1), were NOT made due to the practicality of meeting the design criteria with the building emergency requirements. Murphy and Dittenhafer Architects concluded the Program Study of the WDST in February of 2023. As part of the published study, immediate critical repairs were noted. Murphy and Dittenhafer has intimate working knowledge of the critical needs of the building and is the only design firm with the ability to immediately initiate design. Murphy and Dittenhafer have worked directly with multiple stakeholders who are involved in the project and who have knowledge of the building's requirements. As part of the study, Murphy and Dittenhafer and their team spent nearly a year studying the building and its requirements. Utilizing any other firm will delay the timeframe of the repairs out for one year due to the procurement processes and requirement of the initial study of the building.

Total contract amount for this emergency is \$2,772,397.64 which will include the Schematic, Design, Design Development, and Construction Documents.

*Reason for Late Reporting:* This emergency procurement was originally submitted to the BPW on November 9, 2024, in a timely manner; however, it was discovered that the contract documentation used was a small procurement contract that did not have all of the mandatory terms and conditions. A new contract was fully executed with all mandatory terms and conditions and submitted to the BPW once it was reviewed and verified by the DGS Office of State Procurement and the Office of the Attorney General.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: On May 12, 2024, a wastewater backup from the third floor bathroom caused a flood of wastewater to overflow onto the second and third floor of the Maryland Reception, Diagnostic and Classification Center (MRDCC). The overflow spread to various sections of the facility, including the elevator pits. As a result, emergency services were requested to stop the overflow, drain and remove the wastewater from the elevator pit, and repair and restore elevator services.


The elevator pit has been sanitized of wastewater, but repairs to restore elevator service are ongoing. The elevator pits sustained extensive water damage due to the flood of wastewater. The electrical relays, fuses, and other critical control infrastructure for the operation of the elevator are located below the elevator carriage in the elevator pit. As a result of the flood of wastewater, many of the relay control boards, fuses, and critical electrical components were shorted out and damaged beyond repair. Parts to replace these damaged relays, fuses, and boards have been ordered and repairs will continue once these parts are delivered.

*Basis for Selection:* This work was time sensitive due to the acute health and safety hazard the wastewater backup presented to the incarcerated individuals and staff at MRDCC. Clean up and sanitation of the affected area were of paramount importance to mitigate the ongoing health and safety hazard. An emergency call was made to a vendor that is known to respond timely, is familiar with facilities and their associated security protocols, and which had done similar work for the Department prior. Century Elevator, Inc. (Century) has proven to perform satisfactorily on other projects and was deemed capable of executing the scope of work for this project. Due to the time sensitivity of the emergency, Century's familiarity with the Department's security protocols, and the existing relationship with this vendor, the price quoted by Century was deemed to be fair and reasonable.

Due to the time sensitivity of the emergency, competition was not sought. The presence of standing wastewater on several levels of MRDCC represents an acute health and safety hazard to the incarcerated individuals and staff of the facility and a speedy remediation and sanitation was required to alleviate that hazard.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: On May 16, 2024 a severe steam leak in the mechanical room of the 128 Building at the PATX flooded the electrical and mechanical rooms with steam. The 128 Building houses the facility's senior incarcerated individuals. The condensing vapors from the steam tripped the electrical breakers in the mechanical room, which then tripped the main breaker for the 128 Building. The cause for the steam leak could not be identified by the PATX maintenance team unless the area was evacuated to examine the underground steam lines.

The contractor uncovered 150 feet of underground steam lines and found a massive steam leak traveled through the chase pipe into the mechanical and electrical rooms of the 128 Building. The line was capped off temporarily in order to allow steam to flow to other buildings. The electric panels that were covered in water from the steam leak have dried out. The electrical panels were re-energized on May 21, 2024. The contractor began removing the rotten underground steam pipe on May 23, 2024. The timeline for steam to be restored to the 128 Building is approximately three to four weeks. There is currently no hot water to the 128 Building until the steam is restored.

*Basis for Selection:* To be competitive, emergency calls for quotes were made to three vendors that are known to respond, are familiar with DPSCS facilities and security protocols, and have done similar work successfully. JPG was available to respond and has proven to perform satisfactorily on other projects. The other firms were M&M Welding and Maryland Mechanical, both who did not have the workforce at the time to respond in a timely manner. These repairs are vital to continue a safe and healthy environment for the incarcerated population. This work is time sensitive and without this service, no hot water will be available to the 128 Building until steam is restored. Additionally, not addressing the matter could leave the Department and State open to litigation from incarcerated individuals.

**Remarks:** Nature of Emergency: On March 26, 2024, the merchant vessel Dali struck Pier 17 of the FSK Bridge in Baltimore. This 1.7-mile-long bridge spans the navigable Patapsco River and is on MD Route 695. Pier 17 was one of the four supports of the continuous through truss spans of the FSK Bridge. Upon impact, Pier 17 collapsed, causing all of the truss sections of the Bridge to collapse into the Patapsco River below. The collapsed spans include the 1,200 ft. main span over the navigation channel and the two adjacent truss spans, each of which is 720 ft. in length. The length of the collapse truss spans is about 2,644 ft. An additional 900 ft. of girder spans also collapsed. The collapse rendered the highway impassable and blocked the shipping channel into the Port of Baltimore. Thus, this event constitutes a catastrophic failure as defined in 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 668.103 and an emergency under COMAR 21.05.06.

The debris in the federal channel of the river was removed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The MDTA is responsible for removing the debris from the areas outside of the federal channel. Expeditious removal of the debris from the Patapsco River is essential for opening the waterway to boat traffic, minimizing underwater hazards to watercrafts, and allowing for use of boats and watercrafts needed for the inspection, repair, and other necessary activities for the safe operations. The expeditious clearing of the remaining channels will also facilitate the USACE's clearing of the main channel. Procuring the debris removal through competitive bidding would have delayed the removal by a minimum of eight months. COMAR 21.05.06 permits waiving of competitive requirements when "an emergency arises and the agency's resulting need cannot be met through normal procurement methods."

A Report of Emergency Procurement Action was drafted in conjunction with the emergency declaration on March 26, 2024 while the emergency was still being assessed. The final contract award occurred on April 23, 2024, as stated above, for a term of 182 calendar days and in the amount of \$50,285,000. MDTA was also able to establish an overall 3% DBE goal for this emergency contract.

Due to the risk of underwater demolition, the urgency of completion, and additional coordination with other salvage/ recovery companies, MDTA procured an emergency negotiated contract using a cost-plus methodology to compensate the contractor. Tracking of materials, equipment, and labor is similar to force account methodology. The MDTA will use standard Blue Book rental rates for equipment and Davis-Bacon wage rates for labor. MDTA anticipates that this work is eligible for federal reimbursement. Federal Highway Administration Emergency Relief Funds will be reimbursed after utilization of MDTA funds.

The MDTA Procurement Review Group (PRG) partnered with the MDOT-SHA PRG to review the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing a DBE participation goal. A 3% DBE participation goal was established for this contract. Due to the specialized nature of this work, the Prime will need to self-perform large portions of this Contract.



Nice/Thomas "Mac" Middleton Bridge Replacement Project (Nice/Middleton Bridge). This contractor has successfully demolished the existing Nice/Middleton Bridge across the Potomac River and they are qualified and equipped to perform operations similar to what is needed in this emergency.

#### Reason for Late Report:

Because recent revisions to the procurement law for emergencies under SF&P §13-108(b) do not contain an exemption for MDOT capital expenditures, BPW staff, with the advice of the Office of the Attorney General provided, revised guidance to MDTA on 5/31/24 indicating that the capital expenditures exemption does not apply to emergency procurements. 





**Project Description:** Acquisition of this CREP easement permanently protects water quality by retaining forested and vegetative buffers along a tributary of Broad Run in the Catoctin Creek watershed. **Remarks:** The University System of Maryland requests Board of Public Works (BPW) approval for revisions to its Procurement Policies and Procedures. A workgroup was established in the fall of 2023 to undertake a comprehensive review of these policies and make recommendations for revisions. The workgroup was comprised of procurement officials from four USM institutions, the System Office and the Office of Attorney General. The proposed revisions were reviewed and approved by all USM procurement directors, institution vice presidents for administration and finance and the presidents of all USM institutions. Notification was also sent to the Joint Committee on Administrative, Executive & Legislative Review of the Maryland General Assembly. There were no comments received from the committee.

The major changes include:

- clarified that any revisions to these policies require BPW approval and the requirement for seeking BPW approval for contracts that fall under an exclusion—only Intercollegiate Athletics and High Impact Economic Development Activities related contracts do not require BPW approval;
- 2) added two new exclusions for utilities and accreditation fees;
- 3) added a provision allowing for the cancellation of solicitations;
- 4) added the existing USM Policy on Service Contracts to the USM Procurement Policies and Procedures consistent with a formal opinion of the Office of Attorney General; and
- 5) added a provision on Liquidated Damages per statutory requirement.







**Requesting Institution Remarks:** This Construction Management at Risk contract was initially awarded for pre-construction services. As design progresses and design information becomes available, the contractor will sequentially and competitively bid construction packages. This is the first of four bid packages. The Colwell Center, originally built by a commercial developer and later acquired by the University System of Maryland, has an aesthetically unique roof that has a complex design with four large clerestory skylight sections and curved rooflines. The original roof design and engineering was delegated to a specialty roofing subcontractor, so the mathematical modeling and template generation for the structural integrity of the roof, shape of the roof, and attachments to the steel support structure are proprietary to this subcontractor. A deviation from the original design would result in a change to the roof aesthetic profile, a start from scratch with a new design and engineering, and likely the need for major structural upgrades to the steel structure; the latter two would undoubtedly increase the overall roof replacement cost and extend the project schedule. Accordingly, the University made the determination that this bid package should not be competitively bid and instead sole sourced and awarded to the original roofing subcontractor that installed the roof over two decades ago.

This bid package is for the early purchase of long lead time roofing materials, which will keep the project on schedule and facilitate completion of the roof by late fall of 2025. The Colwell Center roof material is a polytetrafluoroethylene (PTFE) coated woven fiberglass membrane that is made-to-order and only produced in a few factories abroad. The roofing material for this project will be fabricated in a factory in Japan and shipped to Baltimore.

There is no MBE compliance at this stage of the project since only pre-construction services have been awarded to date. This bid package has no MBE participation as the roofing material can only be procured from international manufacturers. The University will meet the MBE goals established for this project.

*Sustainability:* The roof replacement will consist of an R-5 Tensotherm composite added as a part of the new tensile roof fabric membrane. This improved roofing membrane material will contribute to the goal of reducing both the load on the mechanical systems and the building's energy use intensity.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Modification No. 4 allows for the Contractor to include portions of the original project scope that was previously deferred due to funding while maintaining the December 2025 delivery schedule for public occupancy. Deferred items include the provision of a new inbound baggage claim system. The original system is at the end of its expected useful life and requires repairs on a regular basis. The availability of additional funding allows MAA to complete program needed improvements to existing infrastructure and complete the original A/B Connector and BHS Improvement Project objectives. The replacement will be completed within the committed program delivery dates. Completing the scope of work now will ensure that the equipment and materials provided are of the same type, model, construction type, installation methodology and similar factors, and are uniform throughout the project. This will also ensure that the same subcontractors are responsible for the entirety of the scope of work. This is critical not only for the construction but also to the efficient long-term maintenance and operation of the terminal.

The modification will provide for automated unmanned exit doors from the Sterile Area Concourses back into the public non-secure side of the terminal. These automated unmanned exit doors are within the footprint and scope of the original project but were deferred. The inclusion of these items allows the doors to meet security requirements per the Transportation Security Administration while allowing technology and automation to negate the need for manned security to monitor these exits. This represents both a major operational improvement as well as labor cost savings for the airport over the life cycle of the project.





*Requesting Agency Remarks:* The solicitation was advertised on February 22, 2024, via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage notifying 150 firms, the Maryland Aviation Administration's website, and by way of direct solicitation to 18 firms. One bid was received on April 17, 2024.

To encourage competition, MAA reached out to the original manufacturer of the equipment, who was able to identify one potential firm. MAA directly solicited the firm; however, the firm indicated it could not meet the response time requirements. Additionally, MAA reached out to the firms who attended the pre-bid conference via email and phone before the bid due date, to inquire if the firms planned to submit a bid and to request the no-bid feedback notices if they were not going to submit a bid. MAA received three no bid responses, two stating the firms would not be participating due to prior commitments and one stating they could not meet the required resolution response time. The Procurement Officer reached out to the incumbent to inquire why they did not bid and found the incumbent had other commitments that precluded participation at this time, however they look forward to working with us in the future.

In an effort to receive more competition, MAA reviewed the required response time and determined because this contract is essential to the safe flight operations at BWI Thurgood Marshall and due to the nature of the work, the required response time was adequate. Additionally, MAA utilized air traffic controllers to communicate with pilots via radio waves. This communication system is responsible for preventing aircraft collisions during all stages of flight and cannot be inoperative for extended periods of time. Without an equipped contractor, operation could be affected daily, delaying critical operations for tenants such as the Maryland Air National Guard. In accordance with COMAR 21.05.02.20, the procurement officer determined prospective bidders had reasonable opportunity to respond.

In an effort to determine if the price is fair and reasonable, the Procurement Officer compared Brown's Enterprises, Inc. price to MAA's current contract and found the price for this contract is approximately 21% below the current contract price. Therefore, MAA considers the price fair and reasonable. The contractor has confirmed its pricing.

The MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. Although no MBE / VSBE participation goals were established due to the limited scope of specialized work, the vendor is an MDOT-certified MBE firm and a certified small business.





Solicitation MAA-MC-20-010 was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and on the MAA's website. A total of two bids were received. On December 4, 2019, the BPW approved Contract MAA-MC-20-010, Plumbing Repair Services at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports. This contract had a term of five years beginning March 1, 2020.

By February 2023, just prior to contract year three beginning, MAA discovered that only a third of the contract value remained due to staffing challenges in the MAA Plumbing Section. Consequently, the contract was used to provide non-emergency and emergency repair response, and to supplement MAA staff on shifts that have no MAA plumber. Therefore, on May 4, 2023, MAA modified the contract to add \$50,000, pursuant to MAA's delegated authority to ensure contract continuity while a new procurement was advertised and awarded. On November 8, 2023, the BPW approved a new contract, Contract MAA-MC-24-016, Plumbing Repair Services at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN Airports for a five-year base term commencing December 1, 2023. The award was made to the incumbent Contractor.

On April 11, 2024, MAA discovered \$28,168.03 of unpaid invoices existed for services rendered under Contract MAA-MC-20-010. An invoice in the amount of \$12,365.00 for services rendered in 2022 was overlooked due to the invoice being disputed and miscommunications. A second invoice in the amount of \$15,803.03 was for an emergency leak service in November 2023. Currently, \$7,912.35 remains under Contract MAA-MC-20-010, therefore the MAA requests \$20,255.68 to pay for services already performed that exceed the previously approved contract authority.

MDH has since relocated this function and is now seeking to complete the remaining renovation, so Cottage 2 can be used as a fully dedicated unit.

This was originally an emergency contract and MBE and VSBE participation was not assigned. DGS strongly encourages vendors responding to emergency procurements to include MBE participation. Baltimore Contractors is an MBE prime and has achieved a rate of 7.27% MBE subcontractor participation thus far on this project.



The recommended offeror Hagerty Consulting, Inc. was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and highest overall.

Hagerty Consulting, Inc. has significant working knowledge of Maryland's pandemic response and understands the current level of support needed along with significant experience with COVID-19, FEMA/PA, the ARPA response, and federal grant policies for recouping funds for the State. Currently, Hagerty Consulting, Inc. has submitted over \$800 million in reimbursement claims and has \$1,030,736,746.58 obligated and paid to date. Their staff have proven exemplary results in their capabilities and have unique knowledge and experience of Maryland's pandemic response, and financial structure.

The Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM) has continued to assist the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) in the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursement process. As multiple funding sources have been passed to address the pandemic, DBM, in conjunction with MDEM and MDH, requires staff to support the FEMA reimbursement project, ARPA, and other related fund sources. Due to the fluidity of the ARPA bill, when it was being considered and passed by the federal government, there was a very clear overlap between FEMA spending and the pandemic response.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on October 2, 2023. A total of 27 potential contractors were solicited. Seven proposals were received and two were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Five were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because the technical proposals did not meet the minimum technical proposal evaluation score. The recommended offeror KPMG LLP was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and was lowest in price.

KPMG's proposal was superior as they have a deep understanding of the work and provided responses to the scope of work that supported their understanding of the full rate reviews/HSCRC policies/ benchmarking and the work and process that would support this project. They have experienced staff with relevant experience specifically in Maryland. They are best qualified to understand HSCRC industry specifics, including Maryland reimbursement, annual filing and other data availability, and policies that may impact full rate applications and benchmarking. Additionally, KPMG's proposal offered a complete team with a wide range of expertise, strong national experience with the HSCRC annual filing, and experience with rate setting and other HSCRC functions.

In evaluating the offeror's proposal related to the economic benefit to the State, consideration was given to awarding this contract to the firm that will have the most direct and indirect benefits to Maryland's economy. The awardee's subcontractors provide direct and indirect services on this contract and are located in Maryland.

In the solicitation, it was specified that the bid structure established for this solicitation the HSCRC budgeted three million dollars for this contract over the three year contract term. As the amount and timing of services are to be determined, the contract award for this solicitation was set with no commitment by the State to incur the full amount. As the total contract amount is a fixed indefinite quantity cost, the offeror's financial proposals were evaluated based on a comparison of hourly rates for various categories of staff across a hypothetical distribution of 1,000 hours. After evaluating the offeror's technical and financial proposals it was determined that KPMG, LLP presented the most favorable offer.




The contract provides a single audit for 24 MVA Branch Offices and 18 VEIP stations which will assist in the monitoring and measurement of MVA's ongoing compliance of federal, state, and local environmental requirements. Prior to this contract, the MVA entered into the Voluntary Agreement (VDA) Audit with the U.S. EPA in 2008 and the last MVA Audit under the EPA VDA audit process was conducted in 2011. This is not a regular service, and Maryland Environmental Service has provided spot audits when required to the MVA from 2011 to present.

Per BPW Advisory 2001- 1, the MVA Procurement Review Group and DGS Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve (SBR) designation. **Requesting Agency Remarks:** A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage and the DHS website on September 19, 2023 and thirty-one potential offerors were directly solicited. Two proposals were received in response to the RFP and both were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Conduent State & Local Solutions, Inc. determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and was lowest in price.

The contractor will deliver, operate, and maintain applicable enhancements and modifications to the statewide EBT system for the delivery of Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA), Temporary Disability Assistance Program (TDAP) and SNAP benefits through, Point-of-Sale (POS) devices, online purchasing, and (for cash only) ATMs in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws and regulations and Quest® Operating Rules. They will implement a fully tested and functioning EBT system and improve the quality, efficiency and effectiveness of services provided to the public, ensure customer satisfaction, and reduce the risk of fraud in EBT transactions.

The Family Investment Administration (FIA) is the largest service program within DHS, accounting for 67% of the Department's \$4.1 billion budget and serves an average of 943,000 Marylanders annually. The FIA team administers federal economic assistance programs that ensure seniors don't have to choose between buying medicine they need and paying their rent. We help struggling families put food on the table. We help keep children in their homes. We foster meaningful connections to workforce development and career opportunities, so Maryland does not continue to leave potential on the table. And we serve to unlock opportunities for Marylanders, particularly in communities that have been underestimated and underserved.

Maryland's method for serving 943,000 Marylanders is the Electronic Benefit Transfer System (EBT). Through the EBT system, over 382,000 households access Supplemental Nutrition Access Program (SNAP) benefits and over 32,000 households access cash benefits. The EBT card is called the Independence Card. It is a debit-type card that can access SNAP and/or cash benefits that are deposited into an EBT food or EBT cash account of a DHS customer each month. Once benefits are deposited into an EBT account and the availability date is reached, the customer can begin using them with their Independence Card. The Independence Card can be used at any retailer authorized by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) or Automated Teller Machine (ATM) in the United States, Guam and the Virgin Islands displaying the Quest® logo. The cardholder must use a four-digit Personal Identification Number (PIN) with the Independence Card to authenticate each transaction.



#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

A protest was received on April 17, 2024, alleging the evaluation is arbitrary, capricious, and unlawful, and failed to adhere to the selection process and criteria set forth in the RFP. DHS responded to the protest with a denial letter on April 29, 2024, because the evaluation of the proposal was conducted in accordance with the RFP and COMAR 21.05.03. Additionally, there were no latent defects in the RFP and no facts or other information to substantiate the reasons for the alleged defect. An appeal was filed on April 30, 2024 to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals. As of May 3, 2024, a hearing date by the Board of Contract Appeals has been scheduled for July 31, 2024.

DHS is requesting that the BPW approve the contract award notwithstanding appeals in order to protect substantial State interests. The overriding substantial State interest is the protection of Marylanders from benefits theft and saving State funds that are being used to replace those benefits when they are stolen.

Maryland will pay more for both the extension of the current system contract until a new system is successfully awarded with customer benefit safeguards, and pay more in state funds for the replacement of stolen benefits because the current contract lacks the new enhanced security requirements to help protect our customers.

1. The new contract moves the State to next generation Eurocard, Mastercard, and Visa (EMV) "chip" technology and other security enhancements that will reduce the theft of benefits, ensuring that our customers actually receive their benefits;

2. There is no procurement remedy available to the appealing vendor, FIdelity Information Systems (FIS), through the Board of Contract Appeal that would allow for an automatic award to FIS. The only solution would be for a new solicitation and request for proposals which will cause needless delay in implementing benefit protections; and

3. Will reduce the amount of time and money that the State must continue to pay to maintain the existing contract with less security requirements.

Theft of public assistance benefits is a national problem. In Maryland, Governor Moore and the General Assembly took decisive action in the 2023 session through the passage of Senate Bill 2 (SB 2) when the previous administration's strategy was to do nothing. SB 2, which took effect as an emergency measure, required certain security enhancements to Maryland's EBT system:



## Agency Remarks (cont'd):

1. The inclusion of an embedded microchip in all EBT cards issued on or after October 1, 2023;

2. The use of two-way fraud alerts;

3. Connectivity for universal benefits cards;

4. Provide at initial benefit approval and each redetermination of eligibility, written notice of fraud risk and instructions on how to reduce the risk of theft, including updating Personal Identification Numbers regularly and avoiding the use of common Personal Identification Numbers;

5. Enabling Electronic Benefits Transfer cardholders to place certain limits on the use of their cards, including limiting transactions during certain hours or prohibiting out–of–state transactions; and

6. Monitoring transactions for suspicious activity by leveraging user behavior analytics of Electronic Benefits Transfer user data to detect when data is being inappropriately accessed or is compromised.

These requirements were included in DHS' September 2023 request for proposals. Specifically, with the microchip/EMV requirement, the RFP included in Section 2.5.1.2 "the EBT processor shall

include a proposed implementation solution incorporating circuit chip/EMV technology or other similar technology, as applicable."


The current EBT system does not contain these requirements, and although in 2023, DHS partially implemented the following security enhancements, benefits theft has continued:

1. PINs;

2. IVR Fraud Analysis and Activity alerts; and

3. Card Lock and Unlock.

To date, over 40,000 Maryland households have been reimbursed over \$24 million in stolen benefits. If we choose to do nothing or delay, this amount will only continue to increase in 2024-25. Further, the impact on the State budget will increase as federal funding for stolen benefit replacement ends on September 30, 2024 with little likelihood, based on the current federal political environment, that additional funds will be appropriated in a future federal budget. In spite of the likely elimination of federal funding, Governor Moore proposed, and the General Assembly accepted, albeit in a reduced amount, continued state general funding for FY2025 to replace stolen benefits. With the increased security benefits in this proposed new award, we fully expect to substantially decrease stolen benefits so that Marylanders can safely receive the benefits for which they are eligible without fear of ongoing theft. This will decrease customer frustration, duplication of government work, and reduce the amount of state general funds needed to replace stolen benefits.



### Agency Remarks (cont'd):


By moving forward now, DHS can begin to focus our resources on building the services and protections noted above, eliminating continued expense for a system that does not proactively respond to Marylanders and reducing the cost of replacing benefits stolen by thieves, all at a direct cost to the general fund of the State of Maryland. Further, our federal funding partners have indicated that moving forward with the protections afforded by the new system is preferred. The other options available to us will only cause unnecessary delay that directly impacts the lives of Marylanders. Specifically, should FIS prevail at the Board of Contract Appeals, DHS would have to cancel the recommendation of award and re-solicit. Should the new solicitation and award be approved, any new selected vendor would need 6-12 months to implement their new system.

Marylanders would be faced with a minimum of 9 months of delay if the Board of Contract Appeals upholds DHS' denial of the bid protest, the Board then approves the new contract, and there is a six month period to implement the new system, or up to 24 months if DHS has to solicit, award, and transition to a new vendor's system. Additional delay in implementing the next generation EBT system only harms 943,000 Marylanders as it will require DHS to further extend the current EBT system contract resulting in the State paying more for a system that fails to provide the services that they deserve.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The Baltimore Sun is the only general daily newspaper with Sunday and Wednesday advertising that is distributed throughout the Baltimore metropolitan area. As part of the advertising package, if agencies purchase multiple days of advertising, i.e. Sunday and Wednesday, there is an additional discount on each advertisement of 10% for two days, 15% for three days, and 25% for four days.

This package provides agencies the option to purchase a 30-day MaxRecruit Platinum online job posting with Social Network Add-On at \$474 when bundled with a print advertisement.

Historically, the advertising purchases by individual State agencies varied, with some agencies paying much higher rates than others. Some agencies only advertise once a year, while others advertise once a month.

This contract allows the State to obtain the lowest available pricing, a 29% reduction from the open rate, to run advertisements. The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable.

MBE and VSBE participation was not established for this contract because there are no subcontracting opportunities.

The modification is necessary to continue providing post-adoptive services without service disruption to children, youth, and families while the new solicitation is completed in 2024. The new solicitation has been delayed due to changes in key staff used to draft the Scope of Work. The Department also incorporated new services related to the RFP that include Post-Guardianship and Post-Reunification services. The new solicitation is currently under review by the Department of General Services, Office of State Procurement.

In 15 years, none of the 350 families who received services experienced an adoption dissolution during their time in treatment. Prior to the Center for Adoption Support and Education (C.A.S.E.) contract, the Department was struggling with high rates of dissolution and children re-entering the system.

C.A.S.E.'s current office locations, in Baltimore, Montgomery and Prince George's counties are well positioned to serve more than 63.3% of the target population. They plan to open two additional office locations to better serve Frederick and Carroll counties and Baltimore City, increasing ease of access for face-to-face therapy to approximately 71.8% of the target population.



DHS recognizes that retroactive procurements are not desirable; in this instance, DHS believes that there is an urgent need to place the youth in question with a provider to receive the appropriate clinical services. The Department will work diligently to avoid retroactive activities and will continue to be proactive moving forward by ensuring that our provider contracts have the necessary contractual flexibility in terms of clinical services, funding, and time. Jumoke Community Based Care, Inc. has been a contracted Residential Child Care (RCC) Provider for more than four years. They specialize in meeting a number of complex needs while providing RCC services to youth who are in care. As of May 20, 2024, there are no open or pending corrective actions identified for this Provider. The last monitoring visit took place on March 13, 2024, where there were no deficiencies.



DHS received notice of the closure from the originating provider on April 22, 2024. Jumoke, Inc.'s capacity at the time of notification was for 22 Independent Living Program (ILP) beds. The two providers worked together in partnership on a transition plan to have the replacement beds available by July 1 to ensure continuity of care for the currently placed youth. The transition plan between the providers was finalized on May 9, 2024. To accommodate the additional 30 beds, Jumoke, Inc. had to re-submit their request for rate and budget approval for the increased beds to the Interagency Rate Committee (IRC). The IRC FY 2025 rates will be distributed on June 15, 2024, to become effective on July 1, 2024.

Private IPLs are defined in COMAR 07.05.04.02 as programs that provide services and supervision to children who live in their own apartments that meet the requirements of COMAR 07.05.01. This licensed provider provides ILP services that address the specialized needs of youth ages 17-20 to assist with the transition from foster care to living as independent adults. They are licensed and physically monitored by the DHS's Office of Licensing and Monitoring (OLM).





The MDTA is responsible for financing, constructing, operating, and maintaining Maryland's toll facilities. It also provides MDOT with conduit financing for other revenue producing transportation projects.









The increased warranty period and addition of Wi-Fi capability increase the per-unit cost by \$502.60. This represents a total cost increase of 9.49%. Accounting for the increased warranty period and added Wi-Fi capability, the actual price increase is 1.58% over the 2022 price for the same product. This cost increase is nominal and is considered to be fair and reasonable.





**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The Department utilizes steam boilers that create energy by heating water to produce steam, and then the steam cools down and becomes a condensate, a by-product of the heat transfer in a steam system. The condensate is then reused and reheated to produce steam in a closed system. Since October 3, 2024, the Department has been trying to repair the existing three steam boilers. Once the boilers were deemed to be operable, the Department turned the boilers on and realized that they were still malfunctioning. Further investigation determined that the boilers' condensate was not returning to the system. A contractor inspected the condensate issues and determined that major repairs were necessary that may take around 18-24 months to complete.

M & M Welding & Fabricators, Inc. is the only source that can meet the requirements and the compatibility of equipment and accessories. M&M Welding was originally selected through an Emergency Procurement on November 8, 2023, Secretary's Agenda A1, 11/08/2023. Three vendors were contacted to provide an emergency rental boiler, but

M & M Welding & Fabricators, Inc. was the only vendor that could install a 200 horsepower rental boiler within 48 hours. Rental boilers with less horsepower are available, but the Department would have to install at least two rental boilers and there is limited space available. The longer delivery time would result in a loss of hot water during the delivery time and would open the Department to litigation. The boilers provide heating and hot water to multiple housing units, the gym, the Maryland Correctional Enterprise (MCE) shops, and the maintenance building. Since the initial Emergency procurement, the term of the contract has been extended multiple times in order to maintain steam and hot water service to the facility and maintain a healthy and safe environment for inmates and staff.

M & M Welding & Fabricators, Inc. installed gas lines and welded pipes together to connect to the rental boiler, and another vendor would not be able to connect their rental boiler to the piping welded together. The Department paid \$57,950 for the freight, hook-up, and startup of the rental boiler and disconnecting the existing rental boiler for another vendor to reinstall would potentially cost another \$50,000.

The cost has been determined to be fair and reasonable based upon a comparable item. The proposed rental price for a temporary boiler/trailer unit to be installed is \$10,000.00 per month, which is a 41.17% decrease based upon the monthly rate the Department was paying for a similar temporary boiler/trailer unit.







A process has begun where DHCD, Maryland Department of Planning (MDP), and Maryland Department of General Services (DGS) will develop a proposal to donate or sell the property to a nonprofit organization for use as affordable housing, or if that is not feasible, to sell the property at auction.

A total of 797 potential contractors were solicited and 58 were directly solicited. Two proposals were received, and one was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible for award due to the denial of the MBE waiver for lack of a good-faith effort to find subcontractors. The recommended offeror HDR Engineering, Inc. was determined to be most advantageous to the State.


### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

HDR Engineering, Inc. submitted a detailed proposal that demonstrated relevant experience and demonstrated experience with the Extended Producer Responsibility Programs, an important component of the needs assessment. They also provided a detailed procedure to help improve the quality and credibility of the assessment.

The firm demonstrated that they made a good-faith effort to find subcontractors to meet the MBE participation and documented those efforts. MDE granted a partial waiver of the originally established 35% MBE participation and the 7% VSBE participation.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. There have been a handful of states who have performed studies, although they are not as extensive as Maryland's. MDE received \$1,000,000 to conduct this RFP and award a contract. Based on the compressed timeline and the number of requirements in the Legislation, MDE anticipated that this effort could cost \$1,000,000. California budgeted approximately \$4 million for their study. Washington State did a smaller study of plastics that cost between \$350,000 and \$400,000. Vermont did a waste composition study for \$253,900.

The Maryland Department of Health issued this solicitation to procure on-site visual communication services for a deaf resident of the Potomac Center with an intellectual disability. Pursuant to Federal regulations by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), 42C.F.R. § 483.430 and 42 C.F.R. § 483.440 and The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Maryland facilities are required to provide sign language translation services for any deaf or hard of hearing persons residing at the facility during the individuals' waking hours. These services are provided from 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM seven days a week, including holidays, and include accompanying the individual during off-site medical appointments and/or community outings. All services must be provided in compliance with licensure, certification, and accreditation standards, including but not limited to, the Office of Health Care Quality (OHCQ), MDH, as well as all applicable Maryland and federal laws and regulations governing Interpreters for the deaf.

The pricing is determined to be fair and reasonable based on historical billing rates for these services. The pricing represents a six percent decrease from the previous annual contract cost of approximately \$484,000.

MBE and VSBE participation were not established for this contract due to the specialized nature and location of the services. However, over 80 vendors with a combination of Airport Concessionaire Disadvantaged Business Enterprise, Disadvantaged Business Enterprise, Minority Business Enterprise, and Small Business Enterprise, were directly solicited for the services. Through an eMMA vendor search, twenty-two MBEs were identified with none located within reasonable proximity to the Potomac Center.
