8. <u>DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES</u> Naming of the Lonacona Loop Trail at Dan's Mountain State Park

Recommendation: The Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the naming of the Perimeter Trail at Dan's Mountain State Park the Lonacona Loop Trail, in honor of an American Indian, Lonacona, who lived and adventured alongside Daniel Cresap on the mountain known as Dan's Mountain.

Background: Dan's Mountain State Park is an approximately 481-acre park in Lonaconing in Allegany County. The park features a fully accessible swimming pool, four large group pavilions, a playground, trails for hiking and mountain biking, and a pond for fishing.

The Perimeter Loop Trail project was completed in May of 2023 and includes an approximately 4.5-mile natural surface trail for hikers and mountain bikers. The moderately challenging trail winds through mixed hardwood forests and groves of conifers, creating a thrilling and alluring experience year-round.

Naming the new trail the Lonacona Loop is in honor of Nemacolin's son and Daniel Cresap's friend, Lonacona, who resided and adventured on Dan's Mountain. Lonacona is the namesake of the town of Lonaconing, and George's Creek. This name is proposed to honor an historic, Indigenous resident of Dan's Mountain, who is closely associated with the park's namesake and who would have intimately known the diverse terrain and rugged challenges that Dan's Mountain, and the new trail, provide.

Recommendation:	The Maryland Historical Trust recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the activities of the Maryland Maritime Archaeology Program as proposed for the 2024 field season. This Item also summarizes the Program's 2023 activities.	
Authority:	§§5A-333–5A-346, State Finance & Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland	

Background: The Submerged Archaeological Historic Property Act established the Maryland Maritime Archaeology Program (MMAP) within the Maryland Historical Trust. This Act charges the Trust with identifying and managing the State's submerged archaeological sites. Under the Act, anyone seeking to excavate or disturb submerged archaeological sites on State lands must obtain a permit from the Trust. The law specifically exempts the Trust from the permit requirement. Instead, the Trust must obtain Board of Public Works approval before undertaking any activity that would otherwise require a permit. In 2024, the Trust proposes to carry out a number of activities that require Board approval.

PROPOSED 2024 ACTIVITIES REQUIRING BOARD APPROVAL

The 2024, MMAP field season will include survey of known sites as well as work in new survey areas around the State. Investigations will use remote-sensing technology and visual inspection. Limited testing and excavation may be undertaken. This may entail the recovery of diagnostic artifacts to determine site age and significance. Trust staff will conserve and analyze these objects and write a report. MMAP also provides opportunities open to volunteer participation. All proposed activities are dependent on funding and on necessary health and safety considerations.

Mallows Bay (Charles County)

MMAP will continue to partner with Charles County, DNR, and NOAA, as well as the Sanctuary Advisory Council on education and outreach programs as well as the management of the historic vessels and cultural resources in the Mallows Bay-Widewater Historical and Archaeological National Register District, now also the Mallows Bay-Potomac River National Marine Sanctuary. MMAP will provide guidance and oversight for graduate students conducting research in the sanctuary; at present one is from East Carolina University, and one is from Texas A&M University.

U-1105 Historic Shipwreck Preserve (St. Mary's County)

MMAP will continue to support fieldwork related to ongoing research and condition assessment of U-1105 undertaken by the non-profit organization Battle of the Atlantic Research and Expedition Group. Support in 2024 is expected to include MMAP staff-lead archaeological training activities. This organization has received an Historic Preservation Non-Capital Grant from the Maryland Historical Trust.

Patuxent River and Buzzard Island Creek (Calvert County)

MMAP plans to complete the documentation of this vessel, initiated in 2023. MMAP was notified that a Chesapeake Bay log canoe, which was discovered submerged and embedded in Buzzard Island Creek during 2020, had been removed from the river in June 2023 and was in danger of rapid deterioration. MMAP staff redirected some 2023 field efforts to begin documenting its construction, which was found to exhibit rare and possibly unique construction details. The vessel represents a Chesapeake Bay boatbuilding tradition dating from the 19th century.

Chester River (Kent County)

MMAP has chosen a stretch of the Chester River where 7000-year-old artifacts have been recovered by watermen from what are believed to be intact, submerged, and buried archaeological sites to initiate a study which combines archaeological and geological desktop research with data collection using a parametric sub-bottom profiler, side scan sonar, and subsurface sampling. This study will employ various data collection and analysis techniques related to paleo landscape reconstruction to assist in the assessment of potential for the preservation of submerged and buried archaeological sites which were inundated during creation of Chesapeake Bay. This initial effort will include instrument testing and preliminary data collection necessary to develop a more extensive research plan for 2025.

Diverse field investigations (Various Counties)

MMAP will continue to conduct site inspections as needed to assist with review of projects in accordance with state and federal historic preservation laws. These will be undertaken while observing all practices necessary for health and safety.

MMAP will continue to provide lectures, courses, field activities, and other educational programming related to maritime archaeology. Staff will continue to provide hands-on experiences in site recording methods and remote sensing to volunteers, interns, and members of non-profit volunteer organizations which work in Maryland. These services may be provided virtually when required to ensure they may be undertaken in a safe and healthy manner or in person.

MMAP will continue to facilitate the updating of the U.S. Coast Guard and EPA Emergency Response Area Contingency Plan, MMAP reviews and evaluates shoreline and submerged archaeological historic properties to prioritize protection and response strategies. This is primarily conducted remotely with occasional in person meetings as needed.

MMAP will continue to participate in and provide guidance to state and federal agencies, such as the Department of Natural Resources regarding aquaculture and development in Maryland waters; the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management on issues related to offshore wind energy development; with the Department of Homeland Security's Maritime Security Committee; and the Maryland and Potomac Area Contingency Planning Committee. These activities may require limited field investigations.

Potential Fieldwork (depending on staff availability)

Curtis Bay and Curtis Creek (Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County)

MMAP will undertake the recording and documentation of the historic vessels located in several loci within Curtis Bay and Curtis Creek.

Upper Potomac River (Allegheny, Washington, and Frederick Counties)

MMAP will initiate a multi-year study to relocate previously recorded native and colonial fish traps and fish weirs to assess their condition, as well as to survey for undocumented traps and weirs noted in historic documents, from aerial survey or reported but not recorded officially. Survey for the remains of other historic structures in these areas will also be included.

SYNOPSIS OF THE 2023 FIELD SEASON

The 2023 MMAP field season was impacted by ongoing supply chain disruptions in obtaining equipment.

U-1105 Historic Shipwreck Preserve (St. Mary's County)

MMAP continued to support fieldwork related to ongoing research and condition assessment of U-1105 undertaken by the non-profit organization Battle of the Atlantic Research and Expedition Group (BAREG). Support in 2023 included MMAP staff-lead archaeological training activities. This organization received a Historic Preservation Non-Capital Grant from the Maryland Historical Trust and is collecting data that will benefit all the agencies managing this Preserve.

Mallows Bay (Charles County)

MMAP continued to partner with Charles County, DNR, and NOAA, as well as the Sanctuary Advisory Council on education and outreach programs as well as the management of the historic vessels and cultural resources in the Mallows Bay-Widewater Historical and Archaeological National Register District, now also the Mallows Bay-Potomac River National Marine Sanctuary. MMP continued to facilitate research by a doctoral student from East Carolina University.

Upper Potomac River (*Washington County*) **Postponed.**

MMAP was planning to revisit known sites and undertake survey in several areas of the upper Potomac to assess the condition of previously reported Native American and Colonial fish weirs and search for and assess navigational structures related to commerce on the river that culminated in the C&O Canal. This project will take several years and include other counties over time. A motor for the metal survey vessel was backordered for a year forcing the postponement of this survey. The motor was delivered late in the year.

Curtis Bay and Curtis Creek (Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County) Postponed.

MMAP will undertake the recording and documentation of the historic vessels located in several loci within Curtis Bay and Curtis Creek. A motor for the metal survey vessel was backordered for a year forcing the postponement of this survey. The motor was delivered late in the year.

Patuxent River and Buzzard Island Creek (Calvert County)

MMAP was notified that a Chesapeake Bay log canoe which was discovered submerged and embedded in Patuxent River during 2020 had been removed from the river in June 2023 and was in danger of rapid deterioration. MMAP staff redirected its field efforts originally planned for August and October to begin documenting its construction which was found to exhibit rare and possibly unique construction details. The vessel represents a Chesapeake Bay boatbuilding tradition dating from the 19th century. This work is ongoing as staff time and weather allow.

Severn River and Chesapeake Bay (Anne Arundel County) Postponed.

MMAP had planned to begin remote sensing surveys of Severn River and active artificial reefs where no prior archaeological surveys have been conducted. Magnetic survey and sonar imaging of Little Round Bay and Hackett Point was also planned.

Unforeseen maintenance issues with the survey vessel and a lack of transient slip availability forced the postponement of this survey. A survey on the St. Mary's River was undertaken in its place using a smaller vessel and different equipment configuration (below).

St. Mary's River and St. George Creek (St. Mary's County)

MMAP followed up on reports of potential historic shipwrecks, inspected shipwrecks of uncertain significance referenced on navigation charts, and revisited archaeological site locations recorded the State's Archaeological Site Files in the vicinity of St. George Creek and Cherryfield Pt. This work involved survey and site remote inspection using side scan sonar and visual inspection by diving and resulted in identification of a site suitable for in water training of volunteers.

Other Educational Programming (Various Counties)

In 2023, staff provided and organized various virtual lectures on maritime archaeology, and virtual trainings for students, volunteers, interns, and members of non-profit volunteer organizations, which work in Maryland.

Diverse field investigations (Various Counties)

MMAP continued to conduct site inspections as needed to assist with review of projects in accordance with state and federal historic preservation laws, while observing all necessary health safety practices and social distancing where advisable.

MMAP continued to facilitate, virtually, the updating of the U.S. Coast Guard and EPA Emergency Response Area Contingency Plan and partnered with the Dept. of Interior to develop a Regional Unanticipated Discoveries Plan and a cultural resources Job Aid for responders. MMAP reviews and evaluates shoreline and submerged archaeological historic properties to prioritize protection and response strategies.

MMAP continued to participate in and provide guidance to state and federal agencies, such as the Department of Natural Resources regarding aquaculture and development in Maryland waters; the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management on issues related to offshore wind energy development; with the Department of Homeland Security's Maritime Security Committee; and the Maryland and Potomac Area Contingency Planning Committee. Meetings were conducted in generally hybrid formats.

Remarks: Historical flow records indicate significant leakage is present in the existing underground water distribution system at Camp Fretterd Military Reservation. Portions of the existing piping system are likely to be more than 70 years old and consist of asbestos-cement, and galvanized steel pipe. The age and composition of these two pipelines make them susceptible to leakage and significant pressure losses. Proposed upgrades include the replacement of approximately 8,100 LF water mains with new pipes to reduce leakage and to provide a more reliable supply of water for domestic and fire flow demands. This contract is for bidding and construction phase services related to the proposed enhancement of the water main infrastructure at Camp Fretterd Military Reservation.

Remarks: Morgan State University, an agency and instrumentality of the State of Maryland, located at 1700 East Cold Spring Lane, Baltimore, Maryland 21251, in Baltimore City, Maryland, is a historically Black institution with the unique designation as Maryland's *Preeminent Public Urban Research University*. Currently, the University enrolls approximately 9,808 students and employs over 2,000 individuals. Morgan has a comprehensive mission that encompasses instruction, research, and public service. Classified as a Carnegie doctoral /research II institution, Morgan offers 50 Undergraduate Programs, 33 master's Programs, 16 Doctoral Programs, and 6 Online Degree programs.

Our diverse student population comes from a broad range of academic backgrounds, and many are first-generation college students with significant financial needs. We are committed to increasing access to traditionally underrepresented communities. At the same time, we are focused on improving the number of high-ability students and students from diverse backgrounds. To that end, we are expanding our academic programs and our research focus.

Unlike other institutions that experienced enrollment decline because of the pandemic, we are experiencing rapid enrollment growth. That coupled with the ongoing creation of research centers aimed at propelling Morgan to an R-1 research status and limited opportunities for expansion within the campus borders have resulted in significant space challenges.

Although new, state-of-the-art facilities have been added, the University has yet to keep pace with the rapid growth exacerbated by aging facilities in dire need of renovation and demolition. We are grappling with growing pains and need creative planning strategies to meet immediate and long-term needs.

The last comprehensive Master Plan covered the 2015-2025 planning horizon. A number of the projects included in the Plan have been or are being implemented, including but not limited to the School of Business and Management (2015), New Jenkins Behavioral and Social Sciences Building (2017), New Student Support Center (Tyler Hall) (2021), New Health & Human Services Building (currently under construction, expected completion 2024), and New Sciences Building (under design). Other projects must be re-evaluated in response to exponential growth, a growing research agenda aimed at becoming the first (or among the first) HBCUs to achieve R-1 status, and our recently completed Strategic Plan and rapidly changing environment.

This is a request for the Board of Public Works to approve the awarding of a contract by Morgan State University to Ayers Saint Gross for Architectural and Engineering Consulting services. The total contract amount is \$2,619,236, and it includes Add Alternates A1 Digital Interactive Master Plan, A2 Final Plan Video Animation, and A4 Campus Dining Survey.

The project was procured through a competitive procurement process. The RFP was advertised on eMMA and received two Proposal submissions. Both firms were interviewed, and fees were negotiated with the top-ranked firm.

The procurement process for GMP Package #5 proceeded as follows:

Starting on December 8, 2023, Gilbane advertised the project for trade contractor participation in the following publications/services: eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, Maryland Stadium Authority website, Maryland Washington Minorities Companies Association, and via direct solicitation. An MBE outreach event was previously conducted by Gilbane and a pre-bid site walkthrough was held at M&T Bank Stadium. Attendees were provided with summary project information.

Gilbane advertised for bids on construction packages for demolition, misc. metals, waterproofing, doors, frames, and hardware, and reverse roofing. Several other packages were also bid but are being included in a future GMP to give more time for bid reviews. Competitive bids were received between January 3rd and February 16th on various due dates by representatives from Gilbane.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on January 31st, 2024 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and Gilbane and MSA representatives were in attendance.

Gilbane submitted GMP #5 Package on February 26th, 2024

Future GMP Package(s) will be presented to the Board of Public Works for approval.

The overall MBE participation goal for the construction phase of this project was set at 35% with sub-goals of 8% African American-owned and 11% Women-owned. The MBE goal for this project is a total goal inclusive of all GMPs. There are no GMP specific goals. This is the fifth of several anticipated GMPs.

At the time of the Bond Approval, the Memorandum of Agreement between the Authority and the City of Aberdeen with respect to Leidos Field at Ripken Stadium ("Ripken Stadium") had not been finalized. The Memorandum of Agreement with the City of Aberdeen for preliminary design services associated with desired future capital improvements to Ripken Stadium was approved by the Authority at its meeting on December 5, 2023. Ripken Stadium is an eligible project under the Act; was included in the Financing Plan approved by the Board on October 4, 2023 as an anticipated project for Series 2023 Bond funding; and has been reviewed and consented to by the Authority's bond counsel. The Act requires the Board approval of the Memorandum of Agreement prior to bonds being issued for a Sports Entertainment Facility. The Authority has confirmed that the interest earnings on the Series 2023 Bonds are sufficient to pay the costs of preliminary design services for Ripken Stadium estimated to be \$55,750.00, with no adverse effect on funding for the (original) Stadium projects.

Therefore, the Authority is requesting the Board to approve the Memorandum of Agreement by and between the Authority and the City of Aberdeen which includes of the terms and conditions required by the Act as if the Memorandum of Agreement had been included with and approved as part of the October 4, 2023 Board Agenda item.

Requesting Agency Remarks: On April 6, 2016, the BPW voted unanimously to approve a 36year, performance-based P3 Agreement with Purple Line Transit Partners to design, build, finance, operate, and maintain the Purple Line Transit Project. On August 3, 2016, the Project's Record of Decision was vacated as a result of a lawsuit filed against the Federal Transit Administration. The Record of Decision was later reinstated through the appeals process but resulted in project delays. After more than two years of inability to reach agreement on the amount of time and compensation for the delay, the design-build contract held by Concessionaire was terminated, construction work stopped, and MTA assumed control of over 150 contracts and purchase orders. To continue to advance the project while the contractual issues were resolved, MTA identified a package of work that it would continue to advance while MTA and Concessionaire continued settlement discussions.

The Board of Public Works (BPW) approved a Settlement Agreement (Modification No. 2) between MTA and Concessionaire in December 2020 to settle all claims and terminate litigation related to the project. Pursuant to the Settlement Agreement, the Concessionaire remained on the project, a process and timeline was established for the Concessionaire to procure a replacement design-build contractor and to obtain new financing for the remaining cost to complete the Project, and settlement Agreement (Modification Nos. 3, 4, and 5) to provide additional time to select a new design-build contractor.

In accordance with the Settlement Agreement, the BPW approved the selection of Maryland Transit Solutions, a joint venture of Dragados USA, Inc. and OHLA USA, Inc., as the replacement design-build contractor and approved an increase to the contract amount, an extension of the contract term, and revisions to language contained in the P3 Agreement as Modification No. 6 in January 2022.

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Financial close occurred in April 2022 and the Concessionaire resumed construction activities. Modification No. 6 included modifications to the P3 Agreement to reflect the construction work being completed by MTA and provided a contractual relief event, including both time and compensation, if the completion of the MTA work was delayed and those delays impacted completion of the Project.

The MTA encountered delays In the completion of its work that impacted the project schedule. In accordance with the P3 Agreement, those delays are considered a relief event, and the Concessionaire was due, time and compensation as a result. Modification No. 7 provided Concessionaire with interim contractual relief of additional time and money, as well as modification of certain contract terms, for delayed completion of work being completed by MTA and concurrent project delays by the Concessionaire. The relief was interim relief only since the MTA work was not yet complete and the delays were continuing.

In late 2023, the MTA completed the work that it had undertaken to advance the project when the previous design-build contractor left the project. With completion of MTA work, MTA and Concessionaire negotiated Modification No. 8 for a final settlement of various project issues, including time and compensation for project delays that resulted from delays in MTA work, closure of numerous open claims from Concessionaire, and commitments from Concessionaire on several key issues.

Modification No. 8 includes an extension of 234 days to the Revenue Service Availability Deadline (extending the date from Spring 2027 to Winter 2027), compensation of up to \$415,023,759 to Concessionaire, modifications to certain terms of the P3 Agreement, an extension of the grant program to businesses impacted by Purple Line construction, enhanced incentives for environmental compliance and pedestrian access during construction, additional workforce commitments, and changes to certain contract terms and provisions. Payment of compensation to the Concessionaire is made over several years and is contingent on achieving certain project milestones, including arrival and assembly of the first light rail vehicle in Maryland (expected later this year), completion of major construction work on the University of Maryland campus, the reopening of the Capital Crescent Trail, and the commencement of systems testing.

2023 was the year of progress on the project and 2024 is a year of momentum. The agreement between the MTA and Concessionaire marks two important milestones for the project – the closure of delays stemming back to the previous design-build contractor and a strong partnership with the Concessionaire to achieve our shared goals of delivering this important project to the citizens of Maryland. Work along the entire 16-mile project alignment continues to advance. The project is more than 65% complete and construction is actively advancing along the entire alignment from New Carrollton to Bethesda at more than 60 active construction sites.

With approximately 17,000 linear feet of rail installed and construction underway at 13 of 21 stations, the Purple Line has transitioned from a massive utility relocation effort to the construction of Maryland's first new light rail service in more than two decades.

- Advancing the shared mission to improve the quality of life and economic vitality in our communities by creating and sustaining an integrated, convenient and reliable transportation network;
- Creating several new multimodal connections across the region, linking to three WMATA Metro lines, three MARC commuter rail lines, Amtrak, and a host of bus services;
- Greatly expanding transit opportunities in Maryland's two most populous and fastest-growing counties;
- Creating convenient, dependable east-west access to jobs, educational centers, shopping, recreation and attractions, as well as quicker public transportation access to Washington, D.C., the Baltimore metropolitan region, and cities along Amtrak's Northeast Corridor;
- Project construction supports small and minority-owned businesses with participation goals of 26% for design services and 22% for construction work;
- Relieving automobile congestion on major arteries and local roads in one of the most congested areas in the nation;
- Providing significant environmental benefits through the operation of clean electric energy light rail vehicles and taking 17,000 cars off the road daily, thus reducing emissions caused by single occupancy vehicle drivers;
- Spurring economic growth along the Purple Line alignment in and between Prince George's and Montgomery counties; and
- Revitalizing communities and providing much-needed opportunities for transit-oriented developments, many of which are already under development in anticipation of completion of the Purple Line.

A total of 159 potential contractors were notified of the solicitation. Sixteen vendors received direct solicitations. Two offers were received on June 7, 2023 and one was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. One proposal was determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because the vendor refused to remove exceptions to the mandatory contract clauses. The recommended offeror Myers and Stauffer LC was determined to be most advantageous to the State.

The pricing is consistent with pricing from the prior contract. However, a longer contract term and additional services included within the scope resulted in a higher total evaluated price. A total of 26 vendors were directly solicited. Seven proposals were received, and three were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Four were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Their proposal included superior analytical, research, and reporting capabilities, evidence of project management likely to produce highly reliable and timely deliverables, added value on approach to solving problems, strong experience in the Maryland Total Cost of Care (TCOC) model, and overall understanding and response to the quality of technical ability specific to their qualifications/expertise.

In evaluating the offeror's proposal related to the economic benefit to the State, consideration was given to awarding this contract to the firm that will have the most direct and indirect benefits to the State of Maryland's economy. The awardee purchases supplies, equipment, and services from 25 firms located in Maryland. Also many of their staff live in Maryland, including key members of the proposed project team.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's (TRF) Second Chances Program provides housing for retired thoroughbred racehorses and a vocational training program for incarcerated individuals through the Grooms Elite Program. This program provides a rigorous training curriculum for incarcerated individuals to learn about horse anatomy, how to care for injuries, equine nutrition, and other aspects of horse care. The program has been successful in past years, and certifications are provided to individuals upon successful completion.

The program is managed and operated as part of the Central Maryland Correctional Facility (CMCF) incarcerated population work programs and services. TRF occupies a 10-acre parcel of State-owned land located in Sykesville, to provide these work programs and services. While there is no financial transaction between the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS) and TRF, DPSCS bears the expense of providing a State-employed officer and supervisor for the program, utilities for the property, and salaries of incarcerated individuals. This amounts to an estimated \$111,330 per year or a total of \$556,650 over the course of each five-year renewal option. The breakdown for that total estimated annual contract value is as follows:

- Labor, including incarcerated individuals: \$94,824
- Equipment: \$12,100
- Utilities: \$4,256
- Classroom supplies: \$150

To qualify for this program, incarcerated individuals must meet the Standard Outside Detail Criteria and be within five years of their release date, have a security classification of minimum or pre-release, have no escape history within the last ten years, have no open or un-adjudicated charges with any other jurisdiction, and cannot have convictions for sexual offenses, violence against a vulnerable class, or animal abuse.

Requesting Agency Remarks: In December 2021, The Department of Budget and Management, Office of Personnel Services and Benefits (DBM OPSB), working in concert with the Department of General Services, Office of State Procurement (DGS OSP), issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to provide State Medical Director (SMD) services. Subsequently, a sole source contract was awarded to our current contractor to bridge the time that DBM OPSB anticipated it would take to publish, evaluate, and award a new multi-year contract for these medical services.

Due to inadequate competition, it was determined in November 2022 that the best course of action would be to cancel the RFP and re-solicit. [...]

DGS OSP believes that if the new solicitation is designed to align with the market analysis, it will create competition within the marketplace. The market research and revisions to the State's existing solicitation requirements have proven to be time-consuming and complex.

These services are mandatory and must be provided per both Federal and State law and regulation. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the State to extend this contract to allow time for a new contract to be solicited and implemented.

This contract provides occupational medical services for applicants and employees across all State agencies. All services are available during normal working hours and on a limited basis on weekends and evenings. Certain services are also available on a 24-hour-a-day, 7-day-a-week basis. The services are varied but critically important. They include providing the statutorily required position of State Medical Director, in addition to providing employee physicals, drug and alcohol tests for commercial drivers governed by US Department of Transportation regulations, psychological examinations for police officer job applicants, and bloodborne pathogen training for the Department of Juvenile Services.

A 13% MBE participation and a 1% VSBE participation was established for the original solicitation. The contractor committed to exceeding it and achieving 17.5% MBE participation and 1% VSBE participation. Considering the vendor's history of exceeding the MBE participation, the department is confident they will meet or exceed the MBE and VSBE participation.
