**Remarks**: Conviction & Release. On June 16, 1987, Mr. Washington was convicted in Baltimore City Circuit Court of first-degree murder and use of a handgun in a crime of violence. He was released from his sentence of life imprisonment, with a consecutive 20 years, on October 29, 2018.

Actual Innocence. On August 20, 2018, Mr. Washington's convictions were vacated in the Baltimore City Circuit Court pursuant to granting a *Writ of Actual Innocence*, and on January 15, 2019 the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office dismissed the charges. That Writ is not dispositive for eligibility under the Lomax Act, and a contested hearing regarding Mr. Washington's actual innocence for purposes of this petition was held before the Office of Administrative Hearings. Following a review of several records (including from the hearing before the Circuit Court on the *Writ*) and taking additional witness testimony, the Administrative Law Judge concluded "By clear and convincing evidence that the Claimant did not shoot and kill Mr. Ali and was not involved in the crime as an accomplice or accessory."

*Compensation.* In its decision, the Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Washington was confined for 11,459 days, (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$ 94,991.00, and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$ 2,982,204.75 in compensation.

*Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule.* Under SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), if an Administrative Law Judge determines it is in the best interests of the exoneree, they are to include a recommendation for an expedited payment schedule in their order. Accordingly, the decision *In the Matter of the Wrongful Conviction of Gary Washington, Claimant v. Board of Public Works* recommended an expedited payment schedule over two and a half years. The Department of Budget & Management has reviewed this recommendation and concurs.

Attorney's Fees. In a subsequent separate opinion (dated February 26, 2024) the Administrative Law Judge denied payment of attorney fees as untimely requested.

*Appeal.* The State's Attorney for Baltimore City noted a timely appeal of the administrative law judge's opinion and order of Jan. 2, and filed a Motion to Stay payment under the Act. In an opinion dated April 5, 2024, the Circuit Court affirmed the judgment of the Office of Administrative Hearings.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Approval of this revenue-generating transaction results from a resource sharing agreement between Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Maryland Department of Information Technology, and Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless. The original agreement contemplated a non-exclusive use of the State telecommunications tower in support of private industry telecommunications antennas along with designated ground space and equipment shed. Approving this modification provides for a termination for convenience provision to be included in the contract starting upon execution of the third and final renewal option. Approving this Amendment allows the parties to continue their mutually beneficial agreement whereby the State continues to receive monetary compensation and the Company continues its use of the State asset in Queen Anne's County.

**Project Description**: This project involves the planning, design, and construction of enhanced nutrient removal (ENR) upgrades at the Cheltenham Youth Detention Center Wastewater Facility. Upon completion of these upgrades, the 43,750 gpd design capacity plant will discharge effluent with an annual average Total Nitrogen goal of 3.0 mg/L and Total Phosphorus goal of 0.3 mg/L, which will reduce nutrients to Piscataway Creek and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay. This project will be constructed in accordance with coastal and non-coastal resiliency guidelines developed as part of the Coast Smart Program to reduce climate change risks to such projects.

Since then, the Department has made good faith efforts to extend the life of the existing chillers but have been unsuccessful. The Department has determined that both chillers are unable to be repaired and will proceed with replacing the chillers to prevent a similar emergency from occurring in the future.

*Basis for Selection:* Due to the time sensitivity of the rapidly approaching cooling season, the lead time for the installation of the portable chiller, and the security requirements of the facility, no competition was sought. Due to concerns that there was limited interest from the small business community as well as concerns that there may be capacity issues due to the size, scope, and length of the project, six vendors that attended the initial preproposal meeting and site visit were contacted to gauge interest to assist MPA in determining whether there would be adequate competition as a Small Business Reserve. Of the six contacted, two were not interested in submitting an offer, one was a supplier and would not submit an offer, one was not a Small Business, and two were planning on submitting offers. Upon readvertisement, 179 potential offerors were notified via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, and MPA sent notice of the solicitation to the Maryland Washington Minority Companies Association and the Maryland Minority Contractors Association, Inc. Fifteen companies attended the preproposal conference and site visit. Two proposals were received.

Although the technical proposal of Ruff Roofers, LLC was ranked second, its proposal was deemed most advantageous to the State because there was an insignificant difference in the company's technical capability compared with that of the other offeror while the price of Ruff Roofers, LLC was approximately one million dollars lower.

The work includes demolition and removal of building roof insulation sprayed on the interior side of the existing metal roof panels; demolition and removal of building roof panels and existing gutters, downspouts, fascia, and trim; demolition and removal of existing abandoned duct work penetrating the existing roof system, coordination and installation of interior and exterior protection from demolition work and debris; installation of stiffeners, bracing, an insulated standing-seam metal panel roof system, ridge ventilation, expansion joint, flashing, counterflashing, gutters, downspouts, facias, and other components required to terminate the roofing system.

The new roof will significantly reduce heating and cooling costs within the shed. The current roof panels with a sprayed-on insulation will be replaced with insulated roof panels which will increase insulation efficiency by up to 500%.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MPA Office of Fair Practices and Procurement Review Group reviewed this contract for potential MBE and VSBE goals and SBR designation and established a 17% MBE goal. No VSBE goal was established based on a limited number of certified VSBEs for these services. Additionally, the PRG did not designate the resolicitation as a Small Business Reserve because the initial solicitation was designated as Small Business Reserve and upon meeting with potential vendors only two small businesses expressed an intent to submit a proposal.

The Maryland Port Commission approved this award on April 2, 2024.

The project is to renovate the first and second floors of the Resource Center that compose the Takoma Park/Silver Spring Campus Library (TP/SS Library) and construct various Resource Center building system improvements at the Takoma Park/Silver Spring campus of Montgomery College (MC). Originally constructed in 1978 with recent upgrades to the HVAC system, the Resource Center is a two-story facility that houses the TP/SS Library; Writing, Reading, and Language Center (WRLC); Career/Transfer Center; large lecture room; several classrooms; and some faculty offices. This project will create space that supports a new functional library service model, includes additional student-centered group study spaces, addresses the Resource Center's deferred maintenance backlog, and advances the College's goal of providing a common student experience across campuses. This project will resolve the facility problems of inadequate and insufficient space and age and poor condition of facilities. The existing facility layout primarily supports physical media, creates conflict between various study space types (quiet, collaborative, etc.), and ultimately inhibits the provision of contemporary library services and learning paradigms. The aesthetics of the library are outdated and uninviting. Many of the building systems are original to the facility's construction, have exceeded their useful lives, and must be replaced or upgraded to prevent building system failure and to ensure code compliance.

The evaluation process included the firm's qualifications and responsibilities as demonstrated by providing three references from the past five years that were able to attest to their experience providing general construction services for a commercial portfolio of work and valued at \$50,000 minimum for individual projects.

MBE and VSBE participation for task orders issued via secondary competition will be determined by the Procurement Review Group (PRG) process. Thirteen of the 33 master contractors are certified MBE firms.

This Indefinite Quantity Contract (IQC) can be utilized by state Executive Agencies, county and municipal governments. The previous General Construction IQC was only available for use by DGS and it was used to its capacity. DGS anticipates that given this new IQC is available to multiple state, local and municipal government agencies, there will be increased activity. Additionally, with various mandates and requirements around the state's goal of decarbonization and associated infrastructure improvements, DGS anticipates increased use of this procurement methodology by all eligible agencies. The Board approved the purchase of the Property, pursuant to the terms of a Conditional Purchase Agreement on May 15, 1985. The purchase price for the Property was \$14,775,000.00. A disagreement arose between the City and the State regarding the payment of additional construction costs, which were over and above the costs originally agreed to by the parties. In recent years, it was determined by the State that ownership of the property was not in the State's best interest. The State executed a lease on behalf of the Department of Human Services, the agency which has occupied the Property, to move to another location within the central business district of Baltimore City. Under the terms of the Release and Termination of Conditional Purchase Agreement, the State and the City will terminate the Conditional Purchase Agreement. Fee simple title to the Property will remain with the City, and the State will release any claim upon the Property. The State will vacate the Property on or before July 1, 2024, unless the parties agree in writing to an alternative date, which shall not require further approval by the Board of Public Works or the City's Board of Estimates, provided such date shall not be later than one (1) year later.

The City's Board of Estimates approved the Release and Termination of Conditional Purchase Agreement on March 20,2024.
