# 7. MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT Maryland Water Quality State Revolving Loan Fund

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Public Works approve new funding as described.

**Authority:** Maryland Water Infrastructure Financing Administration Act

**Project:** Extended North Tunnel GMP 1

**Recipient**: Howard County

**Amount:** Up to \$23,500,000

**Location:** Howard County/Legislative District 9B

*Project Description*: The Extended North Tunnel project is one of the key components of Howard County's overall Safe and Sound Flood Mitigation Plan to protect Historic Ellicott City from intense and frequent storm events as the result of climate change. The project entails the construction of an approximately 18 feet diameter 5,300 feet long rock tunnel with three drop shaft locations to convey large storm flows, like the flooding events that occurred in July 2016 and May 2018. The tunnel starts from Papillon Road, runs under the Historic Ellicott City and CSX Railroad to Patapsco River. The project will result in additional stormwater conveyance, reduce the risk of building and roadway flooding and damage, minimize threat to public safety, and provide resiliency from the impacts of climate change. This project is consistent with Maryland's climate change adaptation and resiliency objectives through the reduction of runoff that is exacerbated by increased precipitation or flooding events.

#### Financing Description:

- A. New Loan (up to) \$21,000,000 Water Quality State Revolving Loan Fund Term. Period not to exceed 30 years following project completion Rate. The standard interest rate of 50% of the average of the Bond Buyer 11- Bond Index for the month preceding loan closing. (Based on this formula, in fiscal year 2023, loan recipients received interest rates ranging from 1.70% to 1.90%) Security. Borrower will deliver its bond, along with its full faith credit endorsement, to the Maryland Water Infrastructure Financing Administration.
- B. New Loan Forgiveness (up to) \$2,500,000 Water Quality State Revolving Loan Fund This funding is provided under the Water Quality State Revolving Loan Fund Program. The principal forgiveness loan terms/grant conditions are enforceable should grantee default.

Background about the Francis Scott Key Bridge Litigation

On March 26, 2024, a container ship, M/V DALI allided with the Francis Scott Key Bridge (Key Bridge), resulting in its collapse. Eight construction workers were on the Key Bridge at the time, two of whom were injured and six of whom died. The shipping channel was blocked, and all ship traffic was halted to/from that portion of the Port of Baltimore, located northwest of the former Key Bridge and encompassing the majority of marine terminals. The collapse of the bridge, which carried I-695, and the close of the shipping channel caused immediate and ongoing harm to the State of Maryland, county and local jurisdictions, and individuals and businesses in Maryland and nationwide.

The Key Bridge collapse has necessitated a massive response by more than 15 State agencies, all of which are represented by the OAG, including but not limited to:

- Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT)
- Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) owns/operates the bridge
- Maryland Port Administration (MPA) owns/operates public marine terminals in the Port
- State Highway Administration (SHA)
- Maryland Department of Labor (MDOL)
- State Treasurer's Office (STO)
- Board of Public Works (BPW)
- Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM)
- Maryland Insurance Administration (MIA)
- Department of Commerce (COMM)
- Department of Natural Resources (DNR)
- Department of the Environment (MDE)
- Maryland Environmental Service
- Department of Budget and Management
- Maryland State Police (MSP)
- Maryland Lottery and Gaming (MLGCA)
- Department of Human Services (DHS)

Numerous Federal agencies, such as the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB), the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), the US Navy (USN), and the US Coast Guard (USCG), as well as county governments have also been mobilized.

#### Remarks (cont'd):

The Attorney General intends to identify and hold accountable the parties responsible for the Key Bridge collapse and to recover compensation for the damages and other harm suffered by the State. The Assistant Counsel will support the OAG's representation of the State of Maryland, its agencies, and instrumentalities in evaluating and pursuing potential litigation. This will include advice and representation in connection with the pending maritime limitation of liability action filed by the ship owner, *In the Matter of the Petition of Grace Ocean Private Limited et al for Exoneration from or Limitation of Liability*, case no. 1:24-cv-00941, United States District Court for the District of Maryland.

#### Assistant Counsel Contract

The law firms listed above as contractors were selected to serve as Assistant Counsel to the Attorney General pursuant to State Government Code, §6-105(b), for purposes of the Francis Scott Key Bridge Litigation. As required by the statute, the Attorney General sought prior approval from Governor Moore to procure the services of an Assistant Counsel. Governor Moore approved the Attorney General's request by letter dated 3/28/24. Compensation under the contract is by contingent fee.

The Attorney General has long interpreted that a contingent fee contract for legal services requires additional approval from the Board of Public Works under State Finance & Procurement Code, §10-305(a), which governs the disposition of state property. 74 *Opinions of the Attorney General* 136, 140-42 (1989). The BPW has approved contingent fee contract provisions requested by the Attorney General in tobacco, environmental and antitrust cases over the years. That approval is being sought again now, this time for litigation relating to the bridge disaster.

Counsel Selection. After receiving the Governor's approval to retain Assistant Counsel on 3/28/24, the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) on 4/5/24, with a deadline of 4/17/24. The RFP was widely distributed by posting on the RFP page of the OAG website, and by email to 23,660 people subscribed to the RFP email list, 27 attorneys/firms that requested to receive notice of bridge-related RFPs, 24 attorneys/firms identified from the MDOT Directory of Certified Firms, and 10 minority bar/legal associations and organizations.

The OAG received 34 proposals, 14 of which proposed joint ventures of multiple firms, involving a total of 63 firms. After narrowing the field, the OAG conducted interviews of six firms/joint ventures on 4/22/24, and now recommends a joint venture composed of the five firms, listed above as contractors, to serve as Assistant Counsel for purposes of this litigation.

#### Remarks (cont'd):

**Fee Arrangement.** The Attorney General seeks to compensate Assistant Counsel on a contingent fee basis, with a percentage of recovery as described above in the 'Amount' field. This is a unique legal matter and it is difficult to compare the fee schedule to that used in other litigation. The fee schedule is favorable compared to the arrangements offered by other firms considered for this engagement. It is also similar to the fee schedules in other Assistant Counsel contingent fee contracts that have been approved by the Board. If the State recovers less than \$350 million, the law firm will not be entitled to any compensation from the State.

# 12. MARYLAND THOROUGHBRED RACETRACK OPERATING AUTHORITY Approval of Master Agreement.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Public Works approve the Master Agreement between the Maryland Thoroughbred Racetrack Operating Authority ("MTROA") and 1/ST Holdings, the Maryland Jockey Club of Baltimore City, Inc. ("MJC"), the Laurel Racing Association, Inc., Laurel Racing Association Limited Partnership, 1/ST Maryland LLC, and 1/ST Laurel LLC inclusive of the following transaction agreements:

- 1. The sale and transfer of ownership of the Pimlico Race Course ("Pimlico") from 1/ST Racing to MTROA;
- 2. A lease agreement between 1/ST Racing and MTROA for the use of Laurel Park as a transition facility while redevelopment and construction activities take place at Pimlico;
- 3. A license agreement between 1/ST Racing and MTROA for intellectual property related to the Preakness States and the Black-Eyed Susan Stakes;
- 4. A loan agreement between 1/ST Racing and MTROA to display the Woodlawn Vase; and
- 5. An operating agreement transferring the right to conduct all thoroughbred horseracing in the State of Maryland from 1/ST Racing to MTROA.

Authority:

Sections 10–1005 and 10-1006, Economic Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

**Remarks:** The Maryland Thoroughbred Racetrack Operating Authority ("MTROA") was established by Chapter 111 of the 2023 Session. To maintain and grow the thoroughbred horseracing industry in the State of Maryland, the MTROA requests approval of the proposed Master Agreement containing the five transaction agreements summarized below.

#### Pimlico Transfer Agreement

MJC, the 1/ST Racing affiliate that owns the Pimlico, will transfer ownership of Pimlico to MTROA as of July 1, 2024 pursuant to a Pimlico Transfer Agreement, for a purchase price of \$1.00. The transfer will include the Pimlico real estate, and all trademarks associated with Pimlico and Maryland Jockey Club.

This purchase and transfer of property is part of a comprehensive negotiation between 1/ST Racing and MTROA, memorialized in the Master Agreement, regarding the future of thoroughbred racing in Maryland. Therefore, MTROA requests a waiver of the appraisal requirements contained in Board of Public Works Advisory 2005-3.

#### Laurel Park Agreement

Laurel Racing Association Limited Partnership ("LRALP"), the 1/ST Racing affiliate that owns the Laurel Park Race Course ("Laurel Park") in Laurel, Maryland, will make Laurel Park available to MTROA as of January 1, 2025 pursuant to a Lease Agreement, which will enable MTROA to use Laurel Park as a transition facility while new racing facilities are constructed at Pimlico and new training facilities are constructed elsewhere, after which all racing at Laurel Park will cease and the property will be sold or redeveloped by LRALP. The lease term is three years, with one option to renew for an additional one-year period. The rent is \$1.00 per year for the initial term, and \$3,500,000 for the optional renewal period. MTROA will be responsible for maintaining and operating Laurel Park during the term of the lease. Should the MTROA exercise the sole renewal option of this Lease Agreement, it will not be subject to Board of Public Works review in accordance with \$10-1005, Economic Development Article.

#### Exclusive License Agreement

1/ST Racing will exclusively license intellectual property related to the Preakness Stakes and the Black-Eyed Susan Stakes to MTROA as of July 1, 2026 pursuant to a long-term exclusive license agreement (the "License Agreement"). The initial term of the License Agreement is 10 years. The initial term will automatically extend for successive 5-year periods unless and until MTROA provides 1/ST Racing with a notice of non-renewal at least 18 months prior to the expiration of the then-current term. In consideration of the rights licensed to MTROA, commencing in 2027, MTROA will be obligated on an annual basis to pay 1/ST Racing a \$3 million base fee which will be subject to an annual escalator of 2.5% plus 2% of the handle from the Races.

#### Woodlawn Vase Loan Agreement

1/ST Racing will lend the Woodlawn Vase to MTROA commencing on January 1, 2027. The license will be co-terminus with the License Agreement. During the term, MTROA has the right to (i) display the Woodlawn Vase at Pimlico or at any other venue as determined by MTROA; (ii) present the Woodlawn Vase to the connections of the winners of the Preakness Stakes during the trophy presentation ceremony immediately following the running of the Preakness Race in each year included within the term, consistent with past practice and custom; (iii) make or commission reproductions and/or copies of the Woodlawn Vase which may be transferred to the connections of the winners of the Preakness Stakes and major sponsors of the Preakness Stakes; and (iv) take photographs or make other visual reproductions of the Woodlawn Vase solely (A) to promote the Preakness Stakes and/or Pimlico, including any exhibitions or venues within Pimlico in which the Woodlawn Vase may be displayed; (B) for educational purposes; and/or (C) for archival purposes.

Woodlawn Vase Loan Agreement (cont'd)

1/ST Racing retains the right to sell, transfer or otherwise assign any or all of its right, title and interest in and to the Woodlawn Vase at any time during the term, subject to MTROA's rights under the Woodlawn Vase Loan Agreement.

#### Thoroughbred Horseracing Rights Transfer

1/ST Racing will transfer the right to conduct all thoroughbred horseracing activities in Maryland to MTROA as of January 1, 2025, except that 1/ST Racing will agree to conduct the Preakness Stakes, Black-Eyed Susan Stakes, and related undercard races (collectively, the "Races") in the years 2025 and 2026.

An associated entity of MTROA qualified under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "501(c)(4) Entity") will as a general matter offer continued employment to any person employed by 1/ST Racing providing services at Pimlico or Laurel Park. The 501(c)(4) Entity will also assume 1/ST Racing's obligations under the Maryland Race Track Employees Pension Plan and existing collective bargaining agreements.

The Master Agreement further provides for MTROA's assumption of certain 1/ST Racing operational agreements designated by MTROA following its completion of a due diligence review of such agreements.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: On March 21, 2024, an inspection performed by Travelers Insurance revealed that a combination of damaged steam coils within the steam driven HVAC system in the mechanical room degraded HVAC condensate lines that run under the mechanical and electrical rooms, and heavy rain, had flooded the mechanical room and water had made its way across the hallway into the main electrical room of the DD Building within PATX. The leaks from the steam driven HVAC system were a result of the steam coils cooling and converting steam back into water. Unfortunately, the Department could not turn off the heaters by law until April 15, 2024, when the cooling season began. As a result, the DD building remained heated, while at the same time the leaks from the HVAC system continued to flood the mechanical and main electrical rooms until the heaters could be turned off on April 15, 2024.

Emergency services to make repairs to the HVAC system in the mechanical room are necessary to maintain the health and safety of staff and incarcerated individuals at the facility. The main electrical room in the DD Building houses the electrical components for multiple systems essential to the safe and efficient operation of the facility, such as jail cell doors, refrigeration for food, and CCTV security cameras. The presence of water in the electrical room poses a security and life safety concern in the event an electrical short occurs – an electrical short could result in a power failure to the building which could create a cascade effect of problems that could potentially place the employees and occupants of the immediate area at high risk of harm.

Basis for Selection: Quotes from two vendors were obtained. Of the two quotes submitted, Maryland Mechanical Systems, Inc. offered a more permanent solution at a lower price.

If the University and the Contractor agree to a cost for construction, the University will return to the Board with a recommendation to modify the contract to include the actual construction costs, which includes the CM's construction services fee. While there is no MBE participation in the pre-construction phase of this project, the overall MBE goal is 8%. Once trade packages are solicited for the construction phases of the project, the University will return to the Board requesting approval of the bid packages along with the MBE participation commitment.

**Sustainability:** Opportunities for environmentally sustainable materials and systems will be identified and explored throughout the design into construction by the University, AE, and the firm. The new HVAC system that is installed will be a high efficiency system designed to assist in achieving the energy goals for the University.

Ground Lease for New Graduate Student Housing

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Public Works approve the University of

Maryland, College Park (UMCP) ground leasing property to Maryland Economic Development Corporation (MEDCO) to provide new graduate student housing on the UMCP campus (the

"Project").

**Description:** The proposed Project includes the development of approximately 741 beds of new graduate student housing on campus. The Project will be financed through a privatized financing structure where the State for the use of the University System of Maryland on behalf of its constituent institution, UMCP, will enter into a ground lease for approximately 1.9 acres with MEDCO (the "Ground Lease"), which terminates upon the final payoff of the bond debt, which will be the earlier of forty (40) years, i.e., the terms of the bonds, or 45 years (a "tail" period of 5 years beyond the term of the financing).

MEDCO will issue tax-exempt bonds to fund the Project costs, plus the cost to construct off-site improvements on contiguous University land, which off-site improvements include roads, sidewalks, surface parking and (in a shared location) a green open space situated on top of underground stormwater management infrastructure. MEDCO will own the graduate student housing for the term of the financing. The University will maintain the off-site improvements for the benefit of the Project pursuant to a related easement agreement.

At UMCP's direction, MEDCO will enter into a development agreement with a selected developer, engaged to enter into contracts for the project design, development and construction, and into a property management agreement with a to-be-named property manager. At the end of the term of the Ground Lease, ownership of the graduate student housing will transfer to UMCP.

Ground Landlord: State of Maryland for the use of the University System of

Ground Rent: MEDCO will pay ground rent to UMCP in an amount equal to the

net annual surplus generated from operations after paying debt

service and operating expenses, and funding reserves.

Requesting Institution Remarks: UMCP seeks to enter into a ground lease with MEDCO. MEDCO will contract with underwriter RBC Capital Markets, LLC for the negotiated sale of the bonds, the proceeds of which will be used to fund the design and construction of the Project and the related infrastructure improvements. The Project is to be located in UMCP's Discovery District (east of Baltimore Avenue and just south of Campus Drive) and is consistent with UMCP's master plan. The projected rents per bed to students initially will range from \$975 to \$1,425 per month depending on room configuration.

**Developer:** In November 2021, UMCP and Terrapin Development Company (TDC) issued a joint Request for Expression of Interest seeking to identify qualified developers to create a master plan and redevelop the "Leonardtown Area," a 10.75-acre site in UMCP's Discovery District. Phase 1 of this redevelopment—the graduate student housing project for which approval is now sought—will be built entirely upon UMCP property.

Ten development teams submitted proposals to develop the Leonardtown Area. In April 2022, UMCP selected a joint venture team led by Mosaic Development Partners JV LLC and Campus Development Partners, LLC as the most qualified development team. The development costs are not expected to exceed \$176 million (including construction costs, development costs, soft costs, and financing costs). Developer will provide 100% performance and payment bonds for the construction of the facility, consistent with the terms of the ground lease.

**Financing:** The project will be 100% funded through tax-exempt bonds issued by MEDCO. The bonds will not constitute a debt, liability or a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State, the University System of Maryland, UMCP or any governmental unit. The term of the bond financing is 40 years; however, the ground lease term may be for 45 years. This represents a "tail" period to make the financing possible because it provides bondholders additional assurance of continued collateral to secure repayment.

**Board of Regents Approval:** The University System of Maryland Board of Regents approved this Ground Lease on June 16, 2023.

Requesting Institution Remarks: On April 22, 2020, the Board designated the NextGen Energy Public-Private Partnership Program (NextGen Program or NextGen) as suitable for a public private partnership (P3) procurement and approved UMD's proposed procurement process (USM Item-3-GM). UMD released a Request for Qualifications on April 27, 2020. Thirteen teams responded. UMD shortlisted five teams to which it sent the Request for Proposals (RFP) in November 2021.

Two teams submitted initial proposals in May 2022. While MEIP's proposal was stronger technically and financially and creatively advanced UMD's sustainability initiatives, UMD determined that its interests were best served by maintaining competitive tension while negotiating with the finalists to develop a single, detailed capital program along with a fully-articulated standard form contract to define with precision the NextGen's allocation of risk, compensation structure, project schedule, Key Performance Indicators (KPIs), liquidated damages if those KPIs are not achieved, and all other provisions that impact pricing and the provision of highly reliable energy services.

Upon completion of these negotiations, in December 2022, UMD called for each of the finalists to submit a Best and Final Offer (BAFO) based upon the standard scope and contract terms. Once again, MEIP submitted a strong, well-developed proposal. Two weeks before the BAFO deadline, the other finalist notified UMD that it would not be submitting a BAFO.

As required by the RFP, UMD performed an enhanced and detailed open book analysis (including cost estimates from two independent design/build firms with substantial experience in estimating energy project costs), to test the reasonableness of MEIP's pricing compared to the cost of similar higher education/energy infrastructure renewal projects and the prevailing market conditions. UMD concluded that MEIP's BAFO responded to the RFP's requirements and its pricing was fair and reasonable. UMD's evaluation of MEIP's BAFO determined that each member of its consortium has the financial capacity to perform in accordance with negotiated contract terms.

**Board of Regents Approval:** On February 16, 2024, the University System of Maryland's Board of Regents authorized the implementation of the NextGen Program by (1) entering into the Ground Lease; and (2) authorizing UMD to enter into the Concession Agreement and associated agreements.

*Legislative Notice*: UMD submitted the Concession Agreement to the General Assembly's budget committees on April 12, 2024. for review in accordance with the P3 Statute's Section 10A-203(a)(1).

*Other Notices and Reviews*: On April 12, 2024, UMD submitted the Concession Agreement to the Comptroller, the State Treasurer, and the Department of Legislative Services and posted the Concession Agreement online.

**MEIP's Project Team.** MEIP's team is comprised of:

- Plenary Americas US Holdings Inc. Lead Member and Co-Equity Partner;
- Kiewit Development Company/Kiewit Power Constructors Co. Co-Equity Partner and Lead Design-Builder;
- Honeywell International, Inc. Lead Operator; and,
- Ramboll Americas Engineering Solutions, Inc. Specialized Design Services.

NextGen Program Description. The NextGen Program continues UMD's reliance on the P3 business model for central energy services that began with its Energy and Utility Infrastructure Program in 1999 (1999 Program). NextGen ensures that UMD receives reliable, efficient, affordable, and sustainable energy services over the Concession Agreement's 33-year term through (1) capital improvements to address immediate energy facility reliability needs; (2) comprehensive strategy development for achieving carbon-free energy systems in 2035; (3) verifiable and enforceable performance metrics backed by liquidated damages to require high quality, efficient, and sustainable system operations; and (4) academic collaboration initiatives that utilize scholarships, internships, research support, and education events to advance UMD's work of attracting talent to campus, addressing global energy issues, and producing leaders of tomorrow with an entrepreneur's practical sensitivity to issues of energy production, consumption, and sustainability in the 21st Century.

<u>Capital Improvements</u>. Campus heating and cooling production equipment and the associated distribution systems are inefficient and well past their useful lives, threatening major energy service outages that could significantly disrupt campus operations. The NextGen Program's capital improvements ensure the reliability of these critical facilities and increase their efficiency and sustainability (23% reduction in annual carbon emissions (29,508 metric tons); 38 million gallons of annual water savings (50% of total plant requirements), while preserving UMD's flexibility to realize greater decreases in carbon emissions and deploy innovative energy technologies.

- *CEP Renewal* will reduce cogeneration capacity by 40% and install high-efficiency electric generation and steam production units that are capable of co-firing hydrogen (when commercially available) with natural gas or RNG to reduce carbon emissions. UMD qualifies for a direct payment from the federal government of \$69 million to \$79 million under the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022's reimbursement of construction costs for new, high efficiency cogeneration facilities (see *Program Financing* section below for additional details).
- *North Campus Cooling Service Electrification* will install new high-efficiency electric chillers, increase chilled water system capacity, and retire inefficient steam-driven chillers.
- Steam Distribution System/Condensate Return Repair will replace the main steam line under Baltimore Avenue that supplies North Campus and install new equipment to collect and return condensate to the CEP.

<u>Decarbonization Strategy</u>. During the NextGen Program's first 18 months, MEIP will assess campus energy use on a building-by-building basis and identify specific projects and funding sources that will inform UMD's decisions for further carbon reductions. The strategy will evaluate low-temperature hot water districts, geothermal or air source heat pumps or electric boilers for hot water production, building and facility renovations to increase energy efficiency, and other sustainable generating and micro-carbon sequestration technologies to accelerate energy system decarbonization.

In addition, in FY 2025, UMD will implement an RNG pilot program for purchasing approximately 5% of the CEP's annual fuel requirements. UMD anticipates that market experience gained through this program will lead to procuring greater volumes.

<u>Energy Systems Operation and Maintenance</u>. MEIP will (a) manage, operate, and maintain the campus energy systems in accordance with high availability, efficiency, and sustainability KPIs over the full term and will pay UMD liquidated damages for compliance failures; and (b) prepare rolling five-year performance improvement plans to provide UMD budget predictability for equipment replacements and repairs of portions of the energy systems that are not replaced during the initial capital improvement program.

Academic Collaboration. The NextGen Program includes comprehensive academic collaboration and experiential learning initiatives to support instruction and research, train future energy and environmental professionals, and educate all students on how to incorporate sustainability into their life and work. MEIP will fund \$50,000 biennial faculty sustainability-focused research grants and will make real-world Energy System data available to students and faculty for modeling prospective sustainability projects. It will also sponsor ten \$5,000 annual scholarships during NextGen's first contract years and five scholarships for the subsequent thirty contract years equal to 50% of in-state tuition. MEIP will support ten paid internships annually with MEIP-affiliated companies during the first two contract years and five paid internships annually for the remainder of the program's term, will provide industry-leading training programs to prepare students for their careers, and will recruit students for positions in engineering, human resources, safety, quality, and business management. Academic collaboration could extend to local public schools through extra-curricular enrichment programs.

Legal Structure. The NextGen Program utilizes the Design, Build, Finance, Operate and Maintain project delivery model. Implementing this structure will be the 33-year, performance-based Concession Agreement, the Ground and Equipment Lease (Ground Lease), the Easement Agreement, and other typical project financing agreements and certificates. All of the documents to which the University System or UMD are parties have been reviewed by the Office of the Attorney General for form and legal sufficiency.

#### **MBE Participation:** MEIP has committed to the following:

- 15% (approximately \$37 million) of the total cost of the initial capital program (excluding financing, insurance, and major energy equipment costs) and subgoals of 8% for MBEs classified as African American-Owned Businesses and 11% to those classified as Women-Owned Businesses.
- 30% (approximately \$183 million) of Concessionaire's annual fixed operations and management fee throughout the NextGen Program's term (excluding insurance, equipment, supplies, or fees and services unavailable for purchase from an MBE) and subgoals of 8% to MBEs classified as African American Owned-Businesses and 11% to those classified as Women-Owned Businesses.
- 50% of the total cost of any future design and construction work required for Thermal Distribution System capital improvements.
- 30% of the total cost of any future additional capital improvements (other than Thermal Distribution System capital improvements).

State Economic Benefits. NextGen will generate a significant revenue stream for the State and Prince George's County. Construction of the initial capital improvements is estimated to create 120 annual full-time trade employment opportunities at prevailing wages that will generate up to \$10 million in tax revenue and recycle over \$70 million through in-State businesses (over half of which will flow to Prince George's County businesses).

**Program Financing**. MEIP will finance approximately 85% of all costs associated with the above-noted capital improvements and decarbonization strategy development using *taxable municipal bonds* issued by the Maryland Economic Development Corporation (MEDCO) (non-recourse to UMD and the University System) in an aggregate principal amount sufficient to generate proceeds of approximately \$345.7 million. MEIP will finance the remaining 15% of such costs with equity contribution by its equity partners of approximately \$59 million that will remain at risk throughout the Concession Agreement's term. MEIP's weighted cost of capital for this financing structure will be approximately 6.81%, which will be set at financial closing and can be reduced through defeasement of the Program Debt as noted below.

UMD will pay MEIP a monthly Availability Payment beginning at the actual substantial completion date for the capital improvements described above (approximately 3 years after construction commences).

The Concession Agreement grants UMD and the University System two options for reducing the Availability Payment:

- Defeasement. The University System could defease a portion of the MEDCO-issued bonds during the NextGen Program's first 10 years by utilizing some or all of the proceeds from the federal government's reimbursement of construction costs. Under the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, tax-exempt higher education institutions, for the first time, can qualify for direct payments (tax credit for private sector entities) that will reimburse up to 50% of the eligible costs of a highly energy-efficient cogeneration facility, such as that proposed by MEIP. UMD's tax advisors have estimated that this payment's proceeds could reimburse from \$69 million to \$79 million of the CEP's capital improvements eligible for the credit. The Concession Agreement requires the establishment of specific ongoing recordkeeping, reporting, and monitoring requirements with which MEIP must comply so that UMD is able to maximize the amount of the payment.
- 10-Year Par Call. UMD has the option at the end of the first 10 years of the NextGen Program's term to require MEIP to refinance the Program Debt if the interest rate environment is attractive.

**UMD Budgetary Impact.** The current level of UMD's annual utilities budget (as increased over time for projected long-term inflation of 2.5% per annum) will fund the NextGen Program's Availability Payments (the cost of the proposed capital improvements) and Energy Services Charge (the cost of managing, operating, and maintaining the energy systems).

Requesting Agency Remarks: In May 2023, MPA's Office of Information Security and Technology (OIT) planned to advertise an IT Staff Augmentation contract for 15 resources which would have included the two resources under Contract No. 218035-IT. However, in late June 2023, OIT decided that MPA should not add the two resources to the IT Staff Augmentation contract but instead should move forward with the advertisement of a new procurement to secure the resources then provided under 218035-IT. PRG approval was received in June 2023, and fund certification was received in July 2023. RFP No. 224010-IT for IT Database Management Support Services was advertised on August 23, 2023, with proposals due on September 22, 2023.

After an offeror protested the rejection of its proposal on November 13, 2023, the procurement of 224010-IT was delayed necessitating an extension of Contract 218035-IT. On December 5, 2023, the Maryland Port Commission approved a six-month extension of Contract 218035-IT, and on December 23, 2023, the Board of Public Works approved the six-month extension, to allow time for the replacement contract (224010-IT) to be awarded. Contact 218035-IT now expires June 30, 2024.

The issues raised in the protest of 224010-IT and elsewhere by the protestor affected multiple contracts supporting OIT and OIT's internal operations and planning, necessitating a lengthy review involving Procurement and OIT staff and the Office of the Attorney General. On February 13, 2024, the Procurement Officer denied the protest under RFP No. 224010-IT. While the protest was pending, the procurement of 224010-IT could not be completed and further progress on the procurement was delayed.

The protestor did not appeal the February 13, 2024, Procurement Officer decision to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals, removing the impediment to moving forward with the procurement of 224010-IT. However, insufficient time remains to complete the evaluation of other proposals, selection of a contractor, and approval by the Maryland Port Commission and the Board of Public Works before the current contract, 218035-IT, expires on June 30. Therefore, MPA is seeking an additional six-month extension to allow time to complete the evaluation process and make an award under 224010-IT.

MPA OIT requires the services of at least two qualified database management resources to support essential business functions under normal operating conditions. Contract No. 224010-IT, currently in the procurement process, was initiated to satisfy this need in the long-term, but the procurement will not be completed in time to hire the necessary resources before the current contracts expire on June 30, 2024. Losing experienced personnel with deep institutional knowledge, without having an opportunity for knowledge transfer, poses a very high risk of potential impacts to the essential business functions they support, including MPA Terminal Security Operations and MPA Financial Support systems. MPA OIT considers it imperative to extend contract 218035-IT to ensure the uninterrupted engagement of these resources pending completion of procurement 224010-IT. Therefore, this six-month extension is necessary to protect MPA and the State of Maryland until the new contract can take effect.

Meanwhile, MPA was informed that Client Network Services, LLC changed its name to Acentra Health, LLC, a limited liability corporation of the State of Delaware. In accordance with Board of Public Works Advisory No. 2002-2, the name change was documented with a contract modification, Modification No. 4.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This solicitation was published on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, which notified 34 firms. MPA also directly solicited the Maryland Minority Contractors Association and the Md. Washington Minority Companies Association. Eight vendors attended the preproposal meeting. Maryland Works provided a waiver of its procurement preference on March 14, 2023. The Maryland Port Commission approved this award on May 7, 2024.

MPA received seven proposals. Two proposals were rejected as not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award, one for failure to submit a technical proposal containing the essential information required by the solicitation and the other for failure to submit a technical proposal at all. The remaining five proposals were evaluated. The recommended contractor submitted the offer most advantageous to MPA considering technical merit and price, based on superior experience and qualifications at providing guard services at facilities similar to those of MPA and based on the contractor's good record of providing these services to MPA since 2014. MPA has received a security rating of Excellent from the U.S. Coast Guard for 15 consecutive years, thanks in large part to the quality of services provided by the selected contractor.

The contractor will be reimbursed at two hourly rates, one for guards and one for supervisors. MPA evaluated prices using an average of 2,664 guard hours and 757 supervisor hours per week. Actual hours and guard posts will vary from week to week as security needs on the marine terminals change. The contractor will be compensated only for the actual number of guard and supervisor hours provided.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MPA Office of Fair Practices and Procurement Review Group approved of no MBE goal because the scope of work consists of a single element, the provision of people, and the contract prohibits the subcontracting of security guards to enhance terminal security by avoiding a command structure divided among two or more separate employers. The procurement was not designated a Small Business Reserve because a Small Business Reserve designation would have excluded from competition the companies most capable of maintaining the high level of security required of a major world port.

These identity verification services are still necessary to reduce the threat of fraudulent claims. Fictitious employers attempt to report wages on their accounts and then file claims against these wages for benefits payments. LexisNexis has a system that analyzes the data provided during the registration and identifies which of these accounts are at high risk of being a fictitious employer. They use this data to determine if the account should be reviewed further or canceled to prevent fraud from occurring.

It is imperative that the Maryland Department of Labor continues to protect against fraudulent claims. Additionally, all security features must be tested during the implementation phases, which cannot be completed until LOCCS has been implemented.

Delays have occurred in the solicitation and transition from the current phone system to the new system. The next vendor has agreed to meet the terms, and the new contract award is being finalized so it can be presented to the BPW for approval later this summer. Remarks: The lease to relocate the Comptroller's administrative headquarters was approved by the Board of Public Works at the October 26, 2022 agenda meeting as Item #53-LT. The Comptroller's Taxpayer Services Division commenced partial occupancy of 6,872 square feet of space on January 1, 2024 with the rent abated per the original lease approval. The remaining portion of the leased space is scheduled for occupancy June 1, 2024 following inspection and approval by the Department of General Services (DGS). The Supplemental Lease Agreement will commence the original 10-year term for the entire demised premises on June 1, 2024 subject to DGS inspection and approval and restructure the base rent so that the remaining portion of the 6-month abatement is spread across the first year of the lease term, with the partial occupancy abatement accounted for. The first-year rental rate will be \$12.75 per square foot. It should be noted that the building was sold in December 2023 and the new owner is Baltimore Tower Properties, LLC.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on November 14, 2023 notifying 1,212 vendors of the solicitation. The solicitation was also sent directly to 11 prospective vendors. Three proposals were received on January 19, 2024 and two were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Centurion of Maryland, LLC was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and was lowest in price.

A protest was filed on April 23, 2024 alleging that the Department improperly determined the offeror to be not responsibly susceptible of being selected for award and should not have disqualified them from further evaluation. The protest was denied on May 3, 2024, based on the Procurement Officer properly determining they were not a responsible Offeror in accordance with COMAR 21.06.01.01.B.(2)(a). The vendor's financials indicate a company in distress and the Department is not confident they are capable of performing adequately on a contract of this scope and magnitude. The Department anticipates that this protest decision will be appealed to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA). In spite of this, the Department wishes to award this contract to Centurion of Maryland, LLC in the face of protest.

The recommended awardee, Centurion of Maryland, LLC (Centurion), provided the proposal with the superior technical ranking and best financial value to the State. With Centurion's corporate headquarters located in Northern Virginia, local office located in Lutherville and approximately 22% of its corporate staff residing in Maryland, the proposal forecasts that \$1,490,772,762 of the contract's value will be reinvested back into the Maryland economy. Additionally, Centurion's proposal indicates efforts to form recruitment partnerships within Maryland focusing on relationships with local universities to draw new talent into correctional healthcare.

The Department is requesting that the BPW approve the contract award notwithstanding the protest in order to protect substantial State interests. The substantial state interests include:

- The Department currently provides medical and mental health services through separate contracts, but there have been challenges with coordinating continuity of care for incarcerated individuals between two separate vendors. The Department intends to award new contracts based on the population served, pre-trial and sentenced, rather than the type of medical care provided, medical and mental health, for the entire population. This will allow for a cohesive system that ensures that the quality of care remains consistent and uninterrupted for the Incarcerated Individuals across all of the Department's facilities.
- A timely and orderly transition to the new contractor is essential to meet the contract start date and ensure uninterrupted mental and medical healthcare services for incarcerated individuals and the Maryland communities.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

- The Department has already modified the existing medical healthcare contract to extend its term, which has increased the monthly costs without improving the quality of service. Under the proposed new contract, the Department anticipates an increased level of performance and quality of service to the State. The Department cannot afford to delay the implementation of a medical and mental health care contract that will so significantly improve the lives of the incarcerated individuals under its charge.
- Several key economic benefits in the new contract include:
  - The MBE goal (31%) is 181.82% higher than the established contract goal on the current medical healthcare contract (11%) and 121.43% higher than the established contract goal on the current mental healthcare contract (14%). This equates to approximately \$531,194,892.10 that will go to certified MBE vendors.
  - The VSBE goal (2.193%) is 100% higher than both currently established medical healthcare and mental healthcare contract goals (1% on both contracts). This equates to approximately \$34,270,638.20 that will go to certified VSBE vendors.
- Centurion will make substantial enhancements to the Department's current healthcare
  infrastructure that will improve the Department's quality of care, service range and
  efficiency for our Incarcerated Individuals.
- Providing staffing with higher hourly rates will attract more qualified professionals, solve ongoing vacancies issues, and provide a better quality of care to Incarcerated Individuals. While also ensuring that the Department is able to hold the vendor accountable for its performance of the contract.

The Department is seeking approval of this contract award, notwithstanding the protest, based on the substantial State interests to obtain a more comprehensive and robust contract in order to provide the incarcerated individuals under the Department's care with better overall medical and mental healthcare services. The Department is confident that the protest will not be successful and will only result in the unnecessary delay of the much needed contract for medical and mental health care and utilization services.

Per COMAR 21.10.02.11.A(1), the BPW should find that execution of the contract without delay is necessary to protect substantial State interests, and authorize the recommended contract notwithstanding the protest.

The solicitation was also sent directly to seven prospective vendors. Three proposals were received on December 18, 2023 and two were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Centurion of Maryland, LLC was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and highest overall.

A protest was received on April 16, 2024 and DPSCS denied it on May 3, 2024. The protest asserted that their proposal showed a superior technical proposal and a lower overall price and, therefore, should have been the recommended offeror. However, they did not provide substantiating evidence to demonstrate that an incorrect determination was made. They submitted a Supplemental Protest on May 7, 2024 alleging the Department's evaluation was flawed based on information they received in their debriefing on April 30, 2024. The Department denied this supplemental protest on May 9, 2024 as the supplemental protest was not timely and even if it had been, it was based on conjecture, not fact. The Department anticipates that this protest decision will be appealed to the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA). In spite of this, the Department wishes to award this contract to Centurion of Maryland, LLC in the face of protest.

The recommended awardee, Centurion of Maryland, LLC (Centurion), provided the proposal with the superior technical ranking and best value to the State, despite being the more costly proposal. With Centurion's corporate headquarters located in Northern Virginia, their local office located in Lutherville, Maryland, and approximately 22% of its corporate staff residing in Maryland, the proposal forecasts that \$615,209,229 of the contract's value will be reinvested back into the Maryland economy. Additionally, Centurion's proposal indicates efforts to form recruitment partnerships within Maryland focusing on relationships with local universities to draw new talent into correctional healthcare.

The Department is requesting that the BPW approve the contract award notwithstanding the protest in order to protect substantial State interests. The substantial state interests include:

• The Department currently provides medical and mental health services through separate contracts, but there have been challenges with coordinating continuity of care for pre-trial detainees and incarcerated individuals between two separate vendors. The Department intends to award new contracts based on the population served, pre-trial and sentenced, rather than the type of medical care provided, medical and mental health, for the entire population. Per COMAR 21.10.02.11.A(1), the BPW should find that execution of the contract without delay is necessary to protect substantial State interests, and authorize the recommended contract notwithstanding the protest.

Centurion commits to achieving 29.992% of the 30% MBE goal and exceeding the 1.5% VSBE goal with a commitment of 1.86% VSBE participation. DPSCS determined it was in the State's best interest to grant the MBE waiver request of .008% due to the amount of effort provided by the vendor to achieve the MBE goal and the lack of availability of any additional MBE firms.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** Due to staff shortages, MDH was not able to complete the new solicitation prior to the expiration of the current contract. Additionally, the revised draft has undergone several enhancements aimed at fostering increased vendor participation in the upcoming contract which has delayed the solicitation. The IFB draft is currently under review by the Department of General Services and is anticipated to be advertised in summer 2024.

Extending the contract will continue to provide services that will supplement existing MDH resources in support of Medicaid Eligibility Determination services for Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) applicants and recipients of Medicaid. These functions include:

- Providing Medicaid eligibility determination services for the MAGI population under the direction of MDH, Healthcare Financing Administration, Office of Eligibility Services, Eligibility Determination Division, and
- Receiving and processing documents from MAGI applicants and recipients of Medicaid. Information received from the MAGI population will also be scanned or data-entered, as appropriate.

It is in the State's best interest to extend the above-referenced contract because it will secure the placement of supplemental Medicaid Eligibility Staff in support of Medicaid Eligibility Determination services for MAGI applicants and recipients of Medicaid during the contract resolicitation process. Failure to maintain the critical supplemental staff will put providing timely access to required health benefits for eligible participants at risk.
