Special Conditions: Listed Below

Application: US Wind Inc. seeks a State tidal wetlands license to construct a 353 foot long by 30 foot wide concrete pier with associated timber fenders and to construct 383 linear feet of replacement steel bulkhead as part of a proposed US Wind's Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Facility on the Sinepuxent Bay in Worcester County.

Report & Recommendation: MDE held a public hearing and received public comments. MDE's Report and Recommendation (R&R) to the Board recommended the license be granted.

Public Comment to the Board: Since opposition was expressed at the March 25th MDE hearing, the Wetlands Administration solicited email comments from 179 interested persons who attended the hearing, mailed letters to 16 interested persons, and posted MDE's R&R on the Board's website. Wetlands Administration received 882 responses against the project, most in the form of five different one-page form letters. Specifically, 835 commenters submitted form letters. Ten comments in favor were received*. Opposition comments focused on the following points:

- The project will create crowding in the West Ocean City Harbor. Industrialization will add large ships and increase air and water pollution.
- The project is a threat to marine heritage of the area. It will lead to a decline in real estate values, tourism, wildlife, and the tax base while increasing noise.
- The project's resultant industrialization will lead to more noise, traffic, safety issues, and reduced water and air quality. The local marine heritage will be jeopardized. Commercial interests will win out over residents.
- Replacing the two fish houses will impact or destroy commercial fishing and local consumers. In 2019, \$7,000,000 was generated in the West Ocean City Harbor.
- The project will have huge negative impact to sport fishing, affecting revenues, tourism, and local businesses. Industrialization will negatively affect sport fishing, causing increased shoaling pollution, and safety concerns.

Wetlands Administrator's Review: The Wetlands Administrator visited the site, reviewed MDE's R&R, as well as the many comments submitted. Additionally, the Wetlands Administrator discussed the project with DNR, commercial fishermen, interested persons, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the applicant.

The applicable legal standard from COMAR 23.02.04.09 states the Board shall:

"take into account (a) The varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values that the project presents; and (b) The State's public policy to preserve the wetlands and prevent their despoliation and destruction."

After reviewing comments, applying the appropriate legal standards, and considering the previously stated five values, the Wetlands Administrator determined that this project's evaluation, for license issuance recommendation purposes, should be limited only to the impacts of the proposed filling work in the affected wetlands. Specifically, the Board's evaluation of the license is confined to the impacts of the proposed bulkhead replacement and pier construction in the wetlands. The proposed licensed activity is consistent with past licensed work in State tidal wetlands. The Board has licensed numerous similar pier and bulkhead projects over the past five years. The pending application does not propose any unique impacts to the State's tidal wetlands relative to other previously approved projects. Additionally, in reviewing public comments submitted directly to the Board, two of the 882 comments against the project cited reasons related to the impact of the bulkhead replacement and pier construction on the State's tidal wetlands. These concerns centered on marine traffic and boat access as a result of the project – the licensee provided information that the O&M facility will be accessed

Wetlands Administrator's Review (cont'd):

only a few times daily, the size of the O&M boats will not exceed commercial boats currently in the area, and current boat activity in the area is not expected to be disrupted. Furthermore, relevant to the economics of commercial fishing in Ocean City, while not connected to the wetlands license activity, are current discussions being spearheaded by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to establish a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with US Wind Inc. by early 2025 to provide for several forms of fisheries compensatory mitigation should this project move forward. U.S. Wind Inc. recently signed a Letter of Intent with DNR addressing this approach for fisheries compensation for the benefit of commercial and for-hire recreational (charter) fishermen. DNR met with commercial fishermen related to this MOU on September 24th and will meet again before the end of 2024.

Conclusion: Based on the record herein, MDE and the Wetlands Administrator concurs that the Board should grant the license. The Wetlands Administrator recommends the following proposed special conditions for this project included in the Department of the Environment's Report and Recommendation.

Proposed Special Conditions:

- 1. The Licensee shall remove an existing pier and associated structures prior to the commencement of the construction of a new pier.
- 2. The Licensee shall deploy a turbidity curtain around the entire area of demolition to contain any fine materials that may be generated during the process of demolition prior to the commencement of work.
- 3. The Licensee shall submit a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for the proposed Operations and Maintenance facility to the Water and Science Administration, Tidal Wetlands Division, for review and approval prior to the commencement of operations at the facility.
- 4. The Licensee shall submit a General Discharge Permit application to the Water and Science Administration, Industrial Discharge Permits Division for review and approval, as determined necessary, prior to the commencement of work at the facility. The Licensee shall send confirmation to the MDE, Tidal Wetlands Division.
- 5. The Licensee shall complete the construction of the bulkhead prior to filling behind the bulkhead. The bulkhead shall be designed and constructed to prevent the loss of fill material to waters of the State of Maryland. Only clean fill, which is free of organic, toxic, contaminated, or deleterious materials, shall be used.
- 6. The Licensee shall perform all works in accordance with the required Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan as approved by the County Soil Conservation District for the County in which the works are performed.
- 7. The Licensee shall assure that there is no discharge of sanitary wastewater from any boat or vessel moored, berthed, or docked at this mooring or docking facility, except as prescribed by federal or State regulations.
- 8. The Licensee shall assure that the storage and handling of petroleum products shall be

Proposed Special Conditions (cont'd):

in strict accordance with the Oil Pollution Regulations of the Maryland Department of the Environment. The Licensee shall employ measures to prevent and control spills of fuels or lubricants from entering the waters of this State.

- 9. The Licensee shall assure that all boat maintenance at the pier shall be restricted to those activities that can be performed without materials entering the waterway.
- 10. The Licensee shall assure that trash and garbage containers will be conveniently located, and the facility owner/operator shall be responsible for adequate disposal of collected materials. Such waste shall not be discharged to the waterway.
- 11. The Licensee shall not perform any in water work from May 15th through July 15th of any year due to horseshoe crab spawning.
- 12. To minimize acoustic impacts on marine life the Licensee should use best management practices such as using vibratory hammers for some or all of the pile placement and construction phasing to minimize acoustic impacts, using a "soft start" or "ramping up" pile driving (e.g., driving does not begin at 100% energy), driving piles as deep as possible with a vibratory hammer prior to using an impact hammer, and using cushion blocks when using an impact hammer.
- 13. Under COMAR 23.02.04.04, the performance of project work under this license is contingent upon the licensee receiving all other State and local approvals and permits.

*After publication of this meeting agenda item, Wetlands Administration identified an additional 367 emails in support of the item that were provided during the comment period, but not received due to email filter issues. The emails have since been reviewed by Wetlands Administration.







Remarks: GMP-A is the first of many GMP contracts that will be issued for the construction of the New Science Center. Work in GMP-A includes, but is not limited to, building a new storm water culvert which currently runs diagonally through the site; this will also be the start of multiple utility packages for the facility. A total of 3 competitive and responsive bids were received for 1-bid category. The bid category in this GMP was awarded based on best value as the procurement process.

Each GMP will have a separate MBE participation goal based on the availability of MDOTcertified firms. A total project participation goal of 45.00% has been established. GMP-A includes MBE firm participation of 17.40% with a cumulative project total of 15.12%. To date, payments made to MBE firms are 50.85% of the total payments to date made to the prime firm Barton Malow Builders/Warren-Builds.

This request is for the Board of Public Works to approve the full contract amount and full cash expenditure of GMP-A, for a cumulative cash expenditure of \$6,383,778 to date (inclusive of Pre-Construction and GMP-A). The design is approximately 25% complete; the University will return to the board for approval for future GMPs as they will be released in stages, as the design progresses.

The existing Science Complex is comprised of four buildings: Carnegie, Calloway, Spencer, and Key Halls. The oldest of these buildings (Carnegie Hall) was constructed in 1919 and the newest (Key Hall) in 1964. Spencer Hall was renovated in 1989, and the three other buildings were last renovated in 1992. The renovations were poorly done and created substandard spaces that do not meet modern-day building codes. The mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems in the buildings are obsolete and need to be replaced. There is insufficient space in the Science Complex to appropriately serve the Biology and Chemistry departments due to growth in the science disciplines. In addition, the configuration of the building does not lend itself to the type of instructional and research spaces required to support the University's science programs.

The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will continue to manage the Construction Manager's work with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: On Thursday, September 26, 2024, MSPAC Helicopter N382MD was performing ground run checks, which are required to be completed satisfactorily, before the aircraft could be returned to service following a heavy inspection. Following ground checks, an inspection of the engine bay was conducted and fuel was found to be leaking from the Fuel Management Module (FMM). The FMM is a critical engine component responsible for delivering the proper amount of fuel to the engine during operation. A fuel leak in the engine bay can quickly lead to a catastrophic fire due to the high operating temperatures of the engine. After troubleshooting, it was found to be an internal failure of the FMM. Immediate replacement was necessary to ensure the aircraft could be returned to service.

Remarks (cont'd):

Each section is a 24/7 operation, and each aircraft at the section must be airworthy and operational at all times. The Maryland State Police Aviation Command (MSPAC) has a public safety mandate to protect and improve the quality of life through the airborne delivery of emergency medical transportation, law enforcement, search and rescue, homeland security, and disaster assessment services. When an aircraft becomes inoperable, it must be taken out of operation, and the aircraft is grounded. In order to bring this aircraft back into service, an Emergency Procurement was declared, and a FMM was purchased.

Basis for Selection: Sole Source. Only parts made by the Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) can be used on the aircraft's engines. The OEM, Pratt & Whitney Canada, has appointed VSE Aviation, Inc. to distribute spare parts.

Further investigation showed that not only had the aging steam coils failed, but there were failures in the condensate lines that contributed to the overall failure of the heating system.


Large holes were discovered in the heating coils along with rusted pipes and pumps for the condensate return.

These repairs are time sensitive and vital to ensure a safe and healthy environment for the incarcerated population. Without this service, multiple housing units will have no heat or hot water until the system is repaired. Additionally, not addressing the matter could leave the Department and State open to litigation from incarcerated individuals.

Basis for Selection: In order to solicit competition, emergency calls for quotes were made to three (3) vendors that are known to respond, are familiar with the Department's facilities and security protocols, and have done similar work successfully. JPG Plumbing and Mechanical, Inc. (JPG) was available to respond and has proven to perform satisfactorily on previous projects. The other firms directly solicited were M&M Welding and Maryland Mechanical, but neither had the appropriate workforce available at the time to respond to the solicitation in a timely manner.

This incident left hot water pooling on the ground and heated vapor blowing through the sally port. If the Department did not act in an urgent manner, JCI would be unable to provide heat or hot water to the incarcerated population, thereby creating a health and safety concern. This service will include the replacement of the steam and hot water pipes.

JPG was selected due to their availability and ability to respond to the scope requirements. A second vendor declined to provide pricing because their crew was unavailable to start work on this repair immediately. The emergency aspect of the required repair work with leaking heated vapor and pooling hot water at the sally port required the successful responsible vendor to start work immediately to stop the leak with an estimated timeframe for total repair of four weeks. A third vendor did not provide a quote for the repair work.


Requesting Institution Remarks: The University requests approval to convey these properties to Zahlco Development, LLC. Like many student housing operations, the occupancy of Fayette Square was severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and has not fully recovered. UMB has incurred significant annual losses during the last four years because of its obligations under a contingency agreement that guaranteed MEDCO's bond refinancing of the properties. It is anticipated that these subsidies will persist into the foreseeable future, posing an unsustainable burden on UMB's operations. In addition, additional capital investments of \$5-\$10 million for short-term maintenance and modernization to enhance the project's competitiveness with newer developments within the submarket. Due to the property's underwhelming financial performance, there are no accumulated university funds to cover such capital expenditures.



5-RP. <u>UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, BALTIMORE</u> (cont'd) Sale of the Fayette Square Apartment Complex

State Clearinghouse/BPW/Board of Regents: The State Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20220609-0452. It was recommended to declare the properties as surplus. It was recommended to declare the properties as surplus, contingent upon the satisfaction of certain requirements of the Maryland Historical Trust ("MHT"). UMB has consulted with MHT and further independently confirmed that a portion of the properties is subject to an historic preservation easement on the property known as the Thomas Eddy House. Any improvements or alterations to this property will be required to adhere to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Guideline for Archeological and Historic Preservations. Express language will be in the title deed conveying the properties to Grantee, confirming the easement on that portion of the property.

The Board of Public Works approved the surplus declaration on April 3, 2024 (USM Item 6-RP). The University System of Maryland sent a letter dated April 11, 2024 to the Senate Budget and Taxation and House Appropriations Committees for review and comment on the disposition, and no comments were received. The USM Board of Regents approved this sale on April 19, 2024.



Requesting Agency Remarks: The solicitation was advertised on June 4, 2024, via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage notifying 324 potential contractors, the Maryland Aviation Administration's website, and by way of direct solicitation to eight prospective bidders. Four bids were received on July 17, 2024; however, two bids were determined to be non-responsive. Bidder one failed to submit a bid bond as required in the solicitation. Bidder three did not use the correct bid forms issued via Addendum number three. Because Bidder three failed to use the revised forms, pricing was not submitted for all items as required. Therefore, both bids were rejected pursuant to COMAR 21.06.02.03B. No protests were submitted.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The solicitation was advertised on March 29, 2024, via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage notifying 17 potential contractors, the MAA's website, and by way of direct solicitation to eight prospective bidders. One bid was received on May 8, 2024.

Historically, there has been limited competition for these services due to the specialized nature of work and requirement for the Contractor's repair facility to be within 100 miles of BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport. The 100-mile radius requirement is needed to minimize the amount of travel and aircraft downtime to transport the aircraft to the Contractor's facility.

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The previous contract provided for aircraft avionics and mechanical repair services. During the contractual period, MAA discovered the awarded Contractors subcontracted the avionics repairs. With intentions of seeking bids from Contractors that perform avionics repairs with its own forces, the MAA unbundled the new project to solicit aircraft avionics repairs and aircraft mechanical services separately. MAA reached out to potential bidders to request No-Bid Feedback notices to ascertain reasons for not bidding. One company reported that its Avionics Division was out of state; one company reported that the contract was too small, and it could not prioritize MAA's work; and one company reported that it has done MAA's work before, but only as a subcontractor and subcontracting is its business model.

The contract amount is based on the final budget amount. The bid amount is a representative bid amount based on hourly labor rates. The Contractor is bound by the fixed hourly labor rates bid for the duration of the contract. In an effort to determine if the single bid price is fair and reasonable, the Procurement Officer compared the single bid pricing to the 2021 awarded Avionics Mechanic Services contract bid costs. The 2021 rates accounted for mechanical and avionics labor. The Procurement Officer discovered that the new labor rates are only averaging 7% higher than Air Repair Inc's pricing and MAA is realizing a savings of 26% in comparison to Avdyne Aeroservices, LLC year 3, 2024 pricing. Based on the analysis conducted, the Procurement Officer determined the rates to be fair and reasonable.

The MAA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. No MBE / VSBE participation goals were established due to the project having a single element of work and no sub-contracting opportunities. An eMMA search of small businesses yielded less than three eligible certified small businesses.



MDTA is requesting approval of this modification to ensure the continuation of essential services for existing assigned tasks, including design and preliminary engineering services for the construction of capital projects, as well as inspection, evaluation, and engineering studies for strategic efforts to maintain MDTA's assets. Additionally, the funding is needed for other critical ongoing tasks. Governor Moore signed an Executive Order on November 17, 2023, that authorizes Project Labor Agreements (PLA) for construction projects. The decision to require the use of a PLA is made on a project-by-project basis after a feasibility study is performed. At the time that this contract was developed, the number of projects MDTA considered for a project labor agreement was small, determined on a case-by-case basis, and outside of the standard project development process. The Executive Order requires that a larger pool of projects consider use of a PLA, becoming a standard consideration in the development of construction projects. Studies performed to consider the use of and demonstrate the benefit of a PLA were not contemplated at the time of contract award and resulted in an increase in contract spend. Furthermore, there is a heightened focus on project communication for public outreach across various media platforms, leading to increased project development costs. Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MDTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals. A total of 39 potential contractors were solicited and four were directly solicited. Three proposals were received and all were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The recommended offeror Voicecast Systems (InTouch) was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and highest overall.

DigiDoc, Inc proposed an existing system, which could not be customized specifically to MDH requirements. The DigiDoc, Inc solution did meet MDH requirements, but also included many additional functions which resulted in a substantially higher price.

The evaluation committee determined that Voicecast Systems (InTouch) has the most complete system and is the most user friendly. They presented a comprehensive and detailed plan for the implementation of messaging services. Their plan outlined specifics for initiation, configuration, training, quality assurance, and responsibilities.

The Agency, Maryland Office of the Public Defender ("OPD"), is an independent State agency that advocates for securing justice, protecting civil rights and preserving liberty on behalf of the indigent in Maryland. The Agency's work spans criminal, juvenile, parental defense and involuntary commitment proceedings statewide. The mission of Justice, Fairness and Dignity for All rests on five core values: Client Centered, Tenacious Advocacy, Diversity and Inclusion, Culture of Excellence, and United in our Mission.

The Maryland Office of the Public Defender last commissioned an attorney and staff workload assessment study that established caseload standards in 2005. Since that time, the practice of criminal law has changed dramatically with the near-universal adoption of body-worn cameras by police departments and use of cell-site tracking data, both of which require significant time expenditures to process in discovery and review in preparation for trial. While the Rand Corporation recently released a National Public Defense Workload Study, it specifically calls for individual jurisdictions to establish standards and limits to prevent work overload.

The recommended offeror, Rand Corporation, was determined to be most advantageous to the State through a historical Price Analysis. In a report that provides an overview of efforts to quantify, with reliable data and analytics, maximum caseloads for public defenders, the firm Lawyer Hanlon concluded that total costs for workload studies often exceed \$250,000. Our experience corroborates that analysis as OPD's previous workload study contract in 2003 cost \$187,000 (\$323,978 in 2024 when adjusting for inflation). The distinction in our current contract is that while most workload studies review only criminal trial cases, RAND Corporation will review criminal trial cases and Parental Defense, Appellate, Post Conviction, and Mental Health cases. The latter cases are an additional 20% of the total attorney workload.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. In a report that provides an overview of efforts to quantify, with reliable data and analytics, maximum caseloads for public defenders, the firm concluded that total costs for workload studies often exceed \$250,000. Our experience corroborates that analysis as previous workload study contract in 2003 cost \$187,000 which would be \$323,978 in 2024 when adjusting for inflation. The distinction in the current contract is that while most workload studies review only criminal trial cases, this contract will review criminal trial cases and Parental Defense, Appellate, Post Conviction, and Mental Health cases. The latter cases are an additional 20% of the total attorney workload.

This Sole Source contract brings the previous contract, Maryland Unemployment Insurance IT Modernization Project which was originally approved in 2015 for the purpose of designing, developing and implementing a new system that supports the UI programs in Maryland, to its sunset. The previous contract covered the implementation of the modernization project, had a higher MBE goal and allowed for more areas within the contract that could be subcontracted. This contract addresses enhancements and changes to the Operations and maintenance phase of the modernization project. As a result, subcontracting opportunities are available only in the areas of Operation and Maintenance. As a result, the MBE goal is set at 10%, which is lower than the 20% percent that was set when this project was first approved in 2015. The MBE goal is lower for this contract because ongoing maintenance requires fewer opportunities to subcontract than the original agreement in 2015 that was to build the entire system. The 2015 contract offered opportunities to sub-contract for system development, analysis and design where this contract is more limited to the more narrow function of maintenance.

To implement this the system uses a unique proprietary software framework. Sagitec Solutions, LLC is the owner of the framework and the only company that can provide the necessary expertise, skill and ability to perform the requested services of maintenance and enhancements. They have the unique skills, knowledge, expertise and legal authority to perform these functions under the proprietary software framework used in the system.

There is little reliable information available for a state-by-state comparison of unemployment modernization costs. However, LABOR's extensive experience with the system over the years provides critical information that can help estimate expected future costs. The following is what the Maryland Department of Labor has spent over the years on the BEACON System: Implementation Costs - Between 2015 - 2024 \$86,351,098.81 Maintenance & Operations (Projected) - 2024 - 2027 - \$26,247,800.05. 

METRC, LLC is the sole provider of the solutions needed for statutorily required oversight of the legal cannabis market. MCA must maintain the current proprietary solutions to ensure continuity of service as well as quality of products available to patients and consumers. METRC, LLC pioneered track-and-trace for the cannabis industry in 2013, currently contracting with 25 regulatory agencies across the United States and supporting over 50,000 cannabis businesses as well as over 400,000 users.

In Maryland, there are currently 156 industry users employing over 8,000 agents trained to use the METRC, LLC system, retraining alone would cause a significant market disruption across the state immediately impacting patients as well as consumers. Additionally, transition of current and historical product data to a different system would cause significant market disruption. Currently, all regulated cannabis product and testing data is housed within Metrc's database via the RFID tag on each plant and product. This includes products at the cultivation and processing level and products on dispensary shelves. Historical data is also housed within METRC, LLC for MCA use in investigations of serious adverse events, product recalls, and complaints. Migrating current and historical data would require time and expertise to avoid negatively impacting market continuity.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. METRC, LLC annual hosting price averages \$200,000 while a second commonly utilized track and trace system annual hosting price averages \$250,000. METRC, LLC also offers additional functionality including custom integration with MCA's business licensing portals, on-going training for state and industry users, item approval functionality required for edibles compliance, proprietary workflows required for taxation, data analytics, and agent badging.

The Maryland Cannabis Administration (MCA) was established as an independent unit of State government that is responsible for establishing and administering a safe, accessible, and equitable cannabis industry in Maryland. The primary responsibilities of the MCA include licensing and regulating cannabis businesses, administering the patient registry and medical cannabis program, developing rules and regulations to ensure product safety and quality, inspecting licensed and registered businesses to ensure compliance with the laws and regulations governing the cannabis industry, and educating stakeholders on cannabis laws and regulations in the State and safe and responsible cannabis use.



On September 16, 2015, the Board of Public Works approved a contract between the Maryland Department of Labor (representing a consortium of two states, Maryland and West Virginia "MW") and Sagitec Solutions, Inc. The consortium was formed in 2011 to replace the aging mainframe systems used to administer the Unemployment Insurance (UI) program and provide the participating states with improved efficiencies and cost savings for the operations and maintenance of the system. Goals for the project were to achieve significant savings through the joint development of a common UI system and a long-term, shared, centrally managed maintenance and support model. Maryland was selected as the consortium lead state to manage and administer the vendor contracts and overall project budget.

In October 2015, the development vendor, Sagitec, began working on the MW Consortium UI modernization project (known as "MWC UIM Project"). In order to fully exploit the advantages of both methodologies, the MW Consortium blended the waterfall and agile methodologies to complete project activities. From October through December 2015, the project team completed the first two milestones of the project. In February 2016, the project team initiated the third and biggest milestone, Iterative Development, System Testing, and Iterative User Acceptance Testing (IUAT).

Due to the vendor not meeting the MBE goal, the item was removed from the agenda (DGS-24-IT-OPT, 6/21/2023) and LABOR was instructed to work on a new sole source contract, close the current contract, and resubmit both items together. Due to the item being withdrawn from the BPW agenda, this renewal option became retroactive. The vendor was previously notified of Labor's intent to renew the contract, and the vendor continued providing these services to the agency during the years 2023-2024 without payment and worked until November 2024. As a result, the renewal period was modified to extend through 11/20/2024. The implementation is complete, and the project is currently in its maintenance and operational phases. Approving this retroactive item will allow the agency to compensate the vendor for the work done during the 2023-2024 fiscal year and a few months into fiscal year 2025, and officially end this contract and begin to work with this vendor on a separate sole source contract.

The Grants. In 2022 and 2023, the State, through its Capital Grant and Loan program, granted a total of \$18,000,000 in general obligation bond proceeds to the Grantee, the County Executive and County Council of Howard County "For the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of Jug Handle Connector" and "for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Route 29 Nort-South Jug Handle Connector". The grant funds were used to extend Symphony Woods Road to create a jughandle road connection to the intersection of Merriweather Drive and Symphony Woods Road. The Howard Research and Development Corporation owns the grant-funded property and leased the grant-funded property to Howard County. The Grantee intends to transfer parcels 4 of 5 "Donation Plats" to the State Highway Administration.

Grant Agreement. Paragraph 13 of the grant agreements between the State and the Grantee states:

Disposition of Property. Grantee may not sell, lease, exchange, give away, or otherwise transfer or dispose of any interest in real or personal property acquired or improved with Grant funds unless the BPW gives prior written consent. This includes transfer or disposition to a successor on the merger, dissolution, or other termination of the existence of Grantee. Grantee shall give the BPW written notice at least 60 days before any proposed transfer or disposition. When consenting to a transfer or disposition, the Board of Public Works may in its sole discretion require the grantee to repay a percentage of the proceeds that are allocable to the grant.


