Requesting Agency Remarks: The College seeks approval to award a contract to Barnes & Noble College (B&N College) with a projected revenue of \$674,472. B&N College will manage all services and content to fully operate the BCCC bookstore, including revamping and updating the physical store. BCCC reached out to several vendors for proposals to outsource the bookstore operations. Only Follet Corporation and B&N College submitted proposals for both online and on-premises bookstores. After reviewing both proposals, B&N College was found to be more beneficial for BCCC and its students.

The College expects to receive an estimated annual revenue of \$126,000 from an equitable program provided by B&N College. Students will be charged a fixed fee per credit based on the total number of credits taken during a semester. They will be automatically enrolled in the 1st Day Complete program but can opt out if they choose. This program aims to be more economical and affordable, ensuring students receive all course materials for a semester. The College will add a markup to the price per credit hour that B&N College charges students participating in the 1st Day Complete program. The estimated revenue is based on the number of credited students enrolled per semester, which may vary. Additionally, the College will receive a 12% commission on all general merchandise sold. The projected revenue from general merchandise is based on current bookstore sales and is expected to increase over the course of the contract.

The contract includes a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) goal of 6.5%. This goal applies only to services that can be subcontracted and does not cover course materials and general merchandise sold in the bookstore.

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the Maryland Stadium Authority issuing a series of bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$450,000,000 (the "Series 2024 Bonds"); the proceeds of which will be used to partially finance the construction of public school facilities in Baltimore, Cecil, Charles, Garrett, Howard, Kent, St Mary's, Talbot, Worchester counties and Baltimore City (collectively, the "2024 Project").

The approval of this Item will authorize the Stadium Authority to issue up to \$450,000,000 of its revenue bonds as Series 2024 with the proceeds to be used to:

- Pay costs related to the issuance of the bonds;
- Capitalized interest; and
- Pay for the design, construction, renovation, rehabilitation, equipping and furnishing of the 2024 Project

Approval of this Item includes approval of the following:

- Comprehensive Financing Plan, which was approved by the Stadium Authority Board on and submitted to the fiscal committees of the General Assembly for review and comment on August 6, 2024.
- *Authority*: Sections 10-628 and 10-649 of Economic Development Article, Maryland Code Annotated; and Chapter 20 of the Acts of 2020 of the Maryland General Assembly as amended.

Background: In 2020, the General Assembly passed the Built to Learn Act of 2020 (2020 Md. Laws Ch. 20) (the "Act") authorizing the Authority to issue up to \$2.2 billion in debt as limited obligations of the Authority for the construction of public school facilities throughout the State. The Act took effect upon the General Assembly's override on February 12, 2021 of the Governor's veto of 2020 Senate Bill 1000 / House Bill 1300 captioned *Blueprint for Maryland's Future – Implementation*.

Debt service on the bonds is secured by the Supplemental Public School Construction Financing Fund (the "Financing Fund") established under the Act. The Act provides that in accordance with State Government Article § 9-1A-30, the Comptroller shall deposit a portion of the money in the Education Trust Fund (the "ETF") into the Financing Fund as follows: (i) \$60,000,000 in fiscal year 2023; (ii) \$125,000,000 in fiscal year 2024; and (iii) \$127,000,000 in fiscal year 2025, and each fiscal year thereafter.* Prince George's County has entered into a public-private partnership agreement for public school construction (as set forth in the Act), and accordingly, MSA is required to transfer \$27,000,000 annually from the amounts deposited into the Financing Fund from the ETF to the Prince George's County Public-Private Partnership Fund. Therefore, annual debt service for bonds issued for public school construction under the Act is limited to \$100,000,000.

Background (cont'd):

The Authority has previously issued two series of tax-exempt revenue bonds under the Act on October 19, 2021 and March 10, 2022 in the combined principal amount of \$630,065,000 (the "Existing Bonds"). The annual debt service on the Existing Bonds is \$36.5 million annually through fiscal year 2052. The 2024 Bonds will be the third series of Bonds issued under the Act and will fund the 2024 Project.

Pursuant to the Act, the Interagency Commission on School Construction (the "IAC") is required to approve public school construction on a rolling basis with the first approved projects to be funded from the Financing Fund being those the IAC has deemed eligible for funding, but State funding for the projects has been deferred due to fiscal constraints. The 2024 Project represents the IAC's approval based upon the eligibility criteria and priorities set forth in the Act and the concurrent approval of the Authority. If the IAC and the Authority determine that it is in the best interest of the State and the Program, an individual 2024 Project may be substituted with another eligible public school project under the Act after issuance of the Bonds.

Bonds issued under the Act will not constitute a debt, liability, or pledge of the faith and credit or the taxing power of the State, the Authority, or any other governmental unit.

*The \$30,000,000 deposit required by the Act in FY 2022 did not occur as a result of the delayed effective date of the bill.

Remarks: This GMP #1 bid package represents the trade packages needed for building demolition (including interior hazmat/abatement), sitework, concrete, mechanical, electrical, & plumbing packages to begin the project. As outlined prior, the MSA identified the intent to return with GMP packages if CAM's pre-construction performance was satisfactory and an acceptable construction phase bid package was negotiated. Construction packages were advertised and documents were issued by the CM for trade contractor participation on August 1, 2024 in the following publications: eMaryland Marketplace, MSA's website, Building Connected, CM's website, as well as directly solicited to numerous trade contractors.

Pre-bid and site visit meetings were held on August 8, 2024. All attendees were provided with summary project information and afforded the opportunity to tour the project site and attended by MSA, numerous trade contractors, and other representatives regarding contracting, MBE participation, and local hiring opportunities. Additionally, outreach and networking opportunities were conducted by the CM in advance of the project bidding, including direct solicitation of MBE trade contractors, and informing the subcontractors and vendors about the project.

On August 29, 2024 competitive, sealed trade contractor bids were received and opened at the CM's offices in Timonium. Post-bid scope review meetings were conducted, and all bid openings and scope reviews were attended by MSA. The CM solicited 139 firms and received 42 bid submissions for the 8 packages advertised.

Efforts to maximize Maryland's commitment to protecting the environment and incorporating green building standards to reduce the effects on climate change resulted in the project attaining 30% water use reduction, 27% site storm water runoff reduction, and 32% energy savings by using efficient MEP systems, fixtures, and equipment.

This is the first GMP bid package presented. As such, no MBE firm participation payments have been made to date. The MSA Procurement Review Group (PRG) established goal on the contract was 30%, and the CM is exceeding the PRG goal with a 45.18% MBE participation goal for the GMP #1 bid package.

Upon analysis and evaluation of the proposals, the MSA procurement office determined that one of the responses was not reasonably susceptible for award. The Selection Committee reviewed three proposals and advanced two firms in the process. The Selection Committee held oral presentations and requested financial proposals from both firms. Financial proposals included a fixed fee for preconstruction services, estimated general conditions and percentage mark-ups for insurances, bonds, construction contingency and CM fee to be used in the calculation of future Guaranteed Maximum Price packages. After review of the financial proposals and upon receipt of clarifications from both firms regarding the financial proposals and contractual terms, the Selection Committee recommends awarding to Clark Construction Group, LLC.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency (from the original Emergency Contract Report, Sec. Appendix A5, 07/03/2024, BPW): On March 26, 2024, the merchant vessel Dali struck Pier 17 of the FSK Bridge in Baltimore. This 1.7-mile-long bridge spans the navigable Patapsco River and is on MD Route 695. Pier 17 was one of the four supports of the continuous through truss spans of the FSK Bridge. Upon impact, Pier 17 collapsed, causing all of the truss sections of the Bridge to collapse into the Patapsco River below. The collapsed spans include the 1,200 ft. main span over the navigation channel and the two adjacent truss spans, each of which is 720 ft. in length. The length of the collapse truss spans is about 2,644 ft. An additional 900ft. of girder spans also collapsed. The collapse rendered the highway impassable and blocked the shipping channel into the Port of Baltimore. Thus, this event constitutes a catastrophic failure as defined in 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 668.103 and an emergency under COMAR 21.05.06.

The debris in the federal channel of the river was removed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The MDTA is responsible for removing the debris from the areas outside of the federal channel. Expeditious removal of the debris from the Patapsco River is essential for opening the waterway to boat traffic, minimizing underwater hazards to watercrafts, and allowing for use of boats and watercrafts needed for the inspection, repair, and other necessary activities for the safe operations. The expeditious clearing of the remaining channels will also facilitate the USACE's clearing of the main channel. Procuring the debris removal through competitive bidding would have delayed the removal by a minimum of eight months. COMAR 21.05.06 permits waiving of competitive requirements when "an emergency arises and the agency's resulting need cannot be met through normal procurement methods."

Remarks (cont'd):

A Report of Emergency Procurement Action was drafted in conjunction with the emergency declaration on March 26, 2024, while emergency was still being assessed. The final contract award occurred on April 23, 2024, as stated above, for a term of 182 calendar days and in the amount of \$50,285,000.00. MDTA was also able to establish an overall 3% DBE goal for this emergency contract.

Due to the risk of underwater demolition, the urgency of completion, and additional coordination with other salvage/ recovery companies, MDTA procured an emergency negotiated contract using a cost-plus methodology to compensate the contractor. Tracking of materials, equipment, and labor is similar to force account methodology. The MDTA will use standard Blue Book rental rates for equipment and Davis-Bacon wage rates for labor. MDTA anticipates that this work is eligible for federal reimbursement. Federal Highway Administration Emergency Relief Funds will be reimbursed after utilization of MDTA funds.

The MDTA Procurement Review Group (PRG) partnered with the MDOT-SHA PRG to review the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing a DBE participation goal. A 3% DBE participation goal was established for this contract. Due to the specialized nature of this work, the Prime will need to self-perform large portions of this Contract.

Basis for Selection:

- 1. To perform the debris removal, MDTA has utilized Skanska USA Civil Southeast, Inc. who is currently working on MDTA's Harry W. Nice/Thomas "Mac" Middleton Bridge Replacement Project (Nice/Middleton Bridge). This contractor has successfully demolished the existing Nice/Middleton Bridge across the Potomac River and they are qualified and equipped to perform operations similar to what is needed in this emergency.
- 2. Moreover, the contractor is already mobilized at the Nice/Middleton Bridge site, and it was expeditious for the contractor to perform the said work at the collapse site.

Modification 1 (this Item): As a result of the catastrophic collapse of the Francis Scott Key bridge, carrying I-695 over the Patapsco River and through Baltimore County, the initial schedule for the estimated durations and anticipated levels of effort for removal of the collapsed bridge sections from the River were based on the similar demolition work previously accomplished for the ultimate replacement of the Governor Harry W. Nice Memorial/Senator Thomas "Mac" Middleton Bridge, which carries US 301 over the Potomac River in Charles County. However, once the contractor and its subcontractors were on-site and able to perform field verification and inspections of the actual conditions, large bridge sections were found to have settled into the bottom of the river. Removal of these specific sections required additional specialized equipment be located and mobilized to the site.

Remarks (cont'd):

Additionally, as MDTA and its contractors were responsible for debris removal from the nonfederally managed channel, and the US Army Corps of Engineers was responsible for the federally managed portion of the channel, it required the coordination of respective work schedules. The ultimate scheduling of the sequence and timing of state and federal debris removal activities was a challenge as there were multiple ship removal operations in the main channel that the Contractor's crew had to efficiently manage. The MDTA and Skanska adjusted the initial baseline schedule to meet the new requirements which, despite the significant increase in the level of effort to remove the sections, only added approximately two weeks to the initial estimate.

The \$21 million contract modification compensates the contractor for additional cranes; large hopper barges; labor and equipment costs for an additional two weeks of marine activities; and processing of main span steel, which was not considered in the initial cost estimate.

The U.S. Department of Transportation awarded \$60 million in "quick release" Emergency Relief funds to fund the initial cost of recovery efforts. The Emergency Relief program provides funding to states, territories, tribes, and federal land management agencies for highways and bridges damaged by natural disasters or catastrophic events. These "quick release" Emergency Relief funds are an initial installment to help restore essential transportation connections. MDTA anticipates that this work is eligible for federal reimbursement. Federal Funds will be reimbursed after utilization of MDTA funds. Additionally, a portion of the insurance proceeds are available for debris and salvage.

Sixteen (16) proposals were received and were evaluated by an Evaluation Committee which included representatives from UMB's office of Construction & Facilities Strategic Acquisitions and UMB's Facilities and Operations. Six (6) firms were shortlisted to submit additional proposals and participate in Oral Interviews. After review by the Evaluation Committee, four (4) firms were shortlisted to submit costs consisting of maximum hourly labor rates and percentages for construction fees, insurance, and bonds. Requesting Agency Remarks: This Request for Proposal (RFP), intended to result in the award of multiple contracts, was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on November 26, 2019, which notified approximately 2,367 vendors. MPA also shared the solicitation with the Maryland Minority Contractors Association, the Md. Washington Minority Companies Association, and directly solicited 240 companies.

In an effort to significantly expand the State of Maryland's dredged material reuse efforts and longterm containment facility capacity, MPA solicited sealed proposals for applied research and development projects to explore feasible means for reuse of material dredged from Baltimore Harbor channels. The RFP defines "reuse" as the recycling of dredged material for use in another product or application, including residential, recreational, commercial, and industrial uses.

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Contracts issued under this procurement will support MPA's research and development of dredged material applications to further the State's efforts to recover capacity in and extend the lifespan of the Cox Creek Dredged Material Containment Facility (DMCF). Successful results of this research and development effort could lead to MPA developing a separate, long-term contract for the reuse of significant volumes of dredged material. These efforts will give MPA an opportunity to understand better the potential for large-scale, long-term cost-effective capacity recovery in the DMCF. As a result of contracts resulting from this RFP, MPA will be evaluating lessons learned, adaptive management approaches, and scalability with an eye on future opportunities to recover capacity in DMCFs.

The RFP provided that there would be no fixed deadline for submission of proposals until MPA established a deadline by published amendment to the solicitation. Instead, proposals would be considered for award as they were submitted, even while other proposals were under consideration or had resulted in contract awards, until MPA closed the solicitation to the submission of new proposals. On October 11, 2023, MPA closed the solicitation by published amendment. The proposal that is the subject of this agenda item was submitted prior to the closure date, and this is the final proposal under consideration.

HarborRock Holdings, LLC submitted a proposal to demonstrate the feasibility of using dredged material from Baltimore Harbor as lightweight aggregate and supplementary cementitious material. The contractor will procure a small quantity of dewatered dredged material generated from Cox Creek DMCF, send the samples to production facilities to produce lightweight aggregate and supplementary cementitious material, and test the strength, chemical properties, and environmental suitability of the products, and report the results to MPA. If the project is successful, the result could be a separate, long-term contract with MPA under which dewatered dredged material from Cox Creek DMCF could be used to make lightweight concrete block, other concrete products, and cement that binds the ingredients of concrete together, expanding the commercial value of dredged sediments, and cost-effectively recovering valuable capacity in the DMCF. This award was approved by the Maryland Port Commission on September 5, 2024.

MPA received 16 proposals. The Board of Public Works previously approved seven awards, and MPA awarded an eighth contract to the University of Maryland College Park Engineering Department as an intergovernmental or interagency agreement. Of the remaining seven proposals, four were deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award: two because the proposed reuses would not significantly preserve or recover capacity in DMCFs, one because it offered services not requested by the solicitation, and one because the proposal was so lacking in important information as to warrant no consideration. Three proposals were abandoned by the offerors when discussions could not resolve questions and concerns of MPA.

After the Series 2024A Bonds are issued their payment will be secured on parity with the Series 2021A Revenue Bonds and the Series 2021B Revenue Bonds (collectively, the "STP Revenue Bonds"). Payments on the STP Revenue Bonds will be backed by operating revenues of MDOT Maryland Aviation Administration (MAA), excluding revenues from certain fees from the consolidated rental car facility and passenger facility charges. The STP Revenue Bonds are not general obligations of MDOT, the State of Maryland, or any political subdivision of the State and do not constitute a debt or pledge of the full faith and credit of the State.

STP Revenue Bonds are included in the MGA's definition of MDOT's nontraditional debt. The MGA establishes an annual limit on nontraditional debt outstanding. As approved by the MGA General Assembly during the 2024 legislative session, the total aggregate outstanding and unpaid principal balance of nontraditional debt that may be outstanding as of June 30, 2025, is \$887,865,000.

The State subsidizes the premiums for certain plans, but the Member pays the entire premium for other plans. The State's total benefit expenditures for CY2022 were approximately \$2.3 billion.

Grantor shall manage the property in accordance with sound agricultural practices. Grantee shall have the right to enter land for inspection. No public rights are granted. The term of these easements shall be in perpetuity pursuant to Agriculture Article Section 2-514.1.

A) As to items 1 through 5, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve the right to apply for release of a lot to convey to himself or his children for the purpose of constructing a dwelling for personal use as follows: one lot of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 20 acres, but less than 70 acres, two lots of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 70 acres, but less than 120 acres, or three lots of one acre or less if the subject property is 120 acres or more.

B) As to items 6 through 26, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve to himself, and his assigns, the right to apply for release of one unrestricted lot that may be conveyed to himself or others. Note that as to Items 9-11, 15, 17, and 26, the unrestricted lot will be a building envelope that will not be subdivided from the farm.

C) As to items 27 through 35, the Grantor is waiving the right to request any additional lots.
