MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the 280 square feet of impact to shallow water habitat at a 2:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by paying \$1,159.20 into the MDE Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund.

280 square feet x 2 (2:1 ratio) x \$2.07 per square foot\* = \$1,159.20

3,367 square feet of impact x 2 (2:1 ratio) = 6,734 square feet of required mitigation Mitigation provided = 7,334 square feet

MDE's grant recommendations are based on base-grant of \$30,000 for every million gallons per day of design capacity, with a minimum grant award of \$30,000 (unless prorated for partial year of operations), and maximum award of \$300,000 per year for any plant. In addition to the base-grants, additional grants are being recommended for plants achieving better than the enhanced nutrient removal level. These plants have successfully achieved the goals of effluent levels at or below Total Nitrogen of 3 mg/l and Total Phosphorous of 0.3 mg/l, reducing nitrogen discharged to Chesapeake Bay by over 11,666,000 pounds per year, and phosphorus by over 1,231,000 pounds per year.

Term: The air rights and ground lease term expires 7/1/2070 to

accommodate bond financing for a 40-year term plus five (5) years beyond the latest issue of bonds for the Harper-Tubman House, for a total 45-year term, that will finance the renovation of the Harper-Tubman Student Housing Facility. The five (5) years beyond the 40-year Bond payment term represents a "tail" period for the ground lease that is standard in student housing public-private partnerships

that provides bondholders additional payment assurance.

**Rent:** The Maryland Economic Development Corporation ("MEDCO")

will pay ground rent to the University in an amount equal to the annual surplus generated from operations after paying debt service

and operating expenses and funding reserves.

**Remarks:** This Ground Lease Amendment gives the University the ability to further defer the payment of ground rent to provide additional economic support for the projects and to provide prospective bond holders with additional confidence the projects would have sufficient liquidity to meet the obligations under the bond documents. The current air rights and ground lease

provides for a deferment of ground lease rent payments through FY 2025 (June 30, 2025) which would be payable to the University upon completion of the FY 2025 audit for the projects.

The air rights and ground lease is part of a cross-collateralization structure with the MEDCO-Morgan View Project (completed in 2002), the Thurgood Marshall Housing Facility (completed in 2022), the Legacy Tower (completed 2024) added to the Thurgood Marshall Housing and Dining Services facility, and the Harper-Tubman Student Housing Renovation Project (under construction).

The collective projects secure the existing Morgan View Bonds, the existing Thurgood Marshall Housing Bonds, the existing Legacy Tower Bonds and the new Harper-Tubman Student Housing Bonds for the renovation of Harper-Tubman, with the properties and cash flow as collateral.

Each Project is financed through a privatized financing structure where the State of Maryland, on behalf of MSU, entered into an amendment to the existing air rights and ground lease (the "Ground Lease") with MEDCO for a term extending beyond the duration of the financing. MEDCO will develop, renovate and operate. The revenues from the Projects are used for and pledged by MEDCO to secure the repayment of the Bonds. The rent payable to MSU under the Ground Lease is paid at the conclusion of the audit for the previously completed fiscal year, at which time the surplus funds, after operations, reserves and debt service, are paid to MSU.

The existing air rights and the ground lease will be amended to permit MSU to independently determine the amount and period of the deferral of annual rent beyond FY 2025, as determined by MSU to be for the benefit of the existing projects and the development of future projects with MEDCO.

*Board of Regents:* The Morgan State University Board of Regents approved this Amendment to the Ground Lease on August 19, 2025 at its regular meeting.

Competitive bids were received on varying dates between June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2025 and June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025 by representatives from Gilbane / Warren Builds.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and Gilbane / Warren Builds and MSA representatives were in attendance.

Gilbane / Warren Builds submitted GMP #3 Package on July 28th, 2025.

Future GMP Package(s) will be presented to the Board of Public Works for approval. The overall MBE participation goal for the construction phase of this project was set at 32% with sub-goals of 8% African American-owned and 11% Women-owned. The MBE goal for this project is a total goal inclusive of all GMPs. There are no GMP specific goals. This is the third of several anticipated GMPs.

Gilbane / Warren Builds has demonstrated the good faith effort required to satisfy the goals of the MBE program and remains committed to meeting the MBE participation goals established for the Project.

#### 13. MARYLAND STADIUM AUTHORITY

Amendment to the Lease Agreement between the Maryland Stadium Authority and Baltimore Ravens Limited Partnership

Recommendation:

The Stadium Authority recommends that the Board of Public Works approve amending the lease between the Maryland Stadium Authority and Baltimore Ravens Limited Partnership to:

- 1. Allow the Ravens to market all events in the Team Exclusive Rights Areas as defined in the Agreement dated January 4, 2023 as well as in the club level of the Stadium, and
- 2. Change MSA's form of compensation from a percentage of revenues collected by the concessionaire minus certain expenses to a fee of \$431,085 for FY 2025, subject to adjustment for availability, and compounded annually at 3% for subsequent years.

Background: On January 4, 2023, the Maryland Stadium Authority ("MSA") and the Baltimore Ravens (the "Team") entered into an Agreement Relating to Football Stadium at Camden Yards Sports Complex (the "Agreement") with respect to the Team's occupancy and use of M&T Bank Stadium (the "Stadium"). The Team and the Stadium Authority now seek to amend the Agreement between them as it pertains to MSA's ability to conduct certain events at the Stadium.

The Agreement currently allows MSA to conduct events that use the banquet and other dining facilities of the Stadium (such as proms, weddings, birthdays, etc.) ("MSA Events"). MSA Events may not be conducted in the Team Exclusive Use Areas. MSA Events may not conflict with events already scheduled by the Team. MSA must use the Team's concessionaire to provide catering, food, and beverage service for MSA Events. MSA retains net revenues from MSA Events after payment to the Team's concessionaire on substantially the same economic terms as the Team pays for NFL-Related Events held in the banquet and other dining facilities of the Stadium. Effectively, this means MSA receives a percentage of the revenues collected by the concessionaire after deduction of certain expenses.

MSA is not allowed to conduct these events in the Team Exclusive Use Areas of the Stadium. Team Exclusive Use Areas include "the Team's office and administrative facilities, locker rooms, storage areas, suite spaces, and any areas or clubs adjacent to and used in support of suites, including the new service-level clubs and areas adjacent to field level and press box suites." Therefore, MSA's right to conduct MSA Events is effectively restricted to the club level of the Stadium and the team may conduct events in other suitable areas.



#### 13. MARYLAND STADIUM AUTHORITY (cont'd)

#### Background (cont'd):

The proposed amendment would provide the Team with the unified right to conduct all catered events in all areas of the Stadium in exchange for the following:

- MSA would be compensated for the loss of revenue related to club-level events with the
  annual Club Level Events Payment. The initial compensation amount was determined by
  using averages of the past 11 years of revenues, excluding the three COVID years 2020 2022 and the lowest revenue from a non-COVID year. The Club Level Payment may be
  subject to equitable adjustment for periods that the club level of the Stadium is not
  available for catered events.
- While the Ravens will have the general right to conduct catered events in all areas of the Stadium, MSA will retain the right to conduct up to 12 not-for-profit catered events on the club level of the Stadium for the benefit of MSA, the State (including any agency thereof), a political subdivision of the State (including any agency thereof), or a nonprofit organization, with the Team's concessionaire providing its goods and services at cost.

The proposed amendment was approved by the Maryland Stadium Authority Board of Directors at its August 5, 2025 meeting.

The University had originally anticipated five bid packages, however after a further evaluation of the mechanical system throughout the design process, the University made the decision to replace the building air handling units since they are near their expected life cycle and in need of replacement.

The MBE goal is 8%. There is limited MBE compliance to date because most payments have been for pre-construction and materials contracts. The MBE goal will be met through this and future bid packages.

**Sustainability:** The roof replacement will consist of an R-5 Tensotherm composite added as a part of the new tensile roof fabric membrane. This improved roofing membrane material will contribute to the goal of reducing both the load on the mechanical systems and the building's energy use intensity.

A Q&A period was made available to vendors which closed Wednesday, February 5, 2025, at 3:30 PM, no questions were presented from the vendor community. For in-State providers, the State's Office of Children, through the Interagency Rates Committee (IRC), sets standardized rates for these services. **Requesting Agency Remarks:** The Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) requests approval to enter into a sole source contract with The Johns Hopkins University (JHU), Department of Emergency Medicine, Division of Special Operations (DSO), to provide Tactical Medical Director Services in support of the MDTA Police Tactical Medical Program.

JHU-DSO will provide critical services, including 24/7 on-call Tactical Physician coverage (in-State), a dedicated all-hours Emergency Medical Consultation line, and a specialized educational program in Tactical Medicine. These services are essential to maintaining MDTA's operational readiness and compliance with COMAR 30.03.03.03, which requires physician oversight for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) operational programs, and the Tactical Emergency Medical Services protocols issued by the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems.

The MDTA Police Tactical Section relies on this support to ensure its tactical medics are certified, properly trained, and fully equipped to provide emergency medical care during high-threat, large-scale, or extended-duration law enforcement operations. JHU-DSO is the only provider in Maryland capable of delivering the full scope of specialized services required, including deployable Maryland Licensed tactical physicians and subject matter expertise in regulatory compliance and tactical EMS training.

Historically, MDTA Police accessed similar services through a Memorandum of Understanding with the Maryland State Police; however, that opportunity no longer exists. To maintain service continuity, MDTA entered into a sole source small procurement contract with JHU-DSO on August 16, 2023, which is set to expire on August 15, 2025. MDTA has arranged for a temporary Medical Director through the State to provide oversight until the replacement contract is approved and established. The temporary arrangement is limited in duration and will not provide the same depth of service or operational integration offered by JHU-DSO.

MDTA conducted extensive internal and external research, including a review of contracts available through the Department of Budget and Management, Maryland State Police, and other agencies. However, MDTA was unable to identify any other providers with the ability to meet MDTA's unique requirements. JHU-DSO's qualifications, statewide partnerships, and field experience make them uniquely qualified to provide these services. In accordance with COMAR 21.05.05.02A, MDTA is requesting to use the sole source procurement method, as the required services are only available from a single vendor and compatibility of services is critical.

Pricing for this contract has been determined to be fair and reasonable, as other Maryland organizations (Howard and Carroll Counties) utilizing JHU-DSO's services receive equitable hourly rates to the one MDTA received. This consistency across multiple jurisdictions confirms that the rate is standard and reflects fair market value for the specialized services provided.

MBE and VSBE participation was not established for this contract because there were no subcontracting opportunities.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The solicitation, Emergency Preparedness Support RFP – R00B4600183, was released on February 13, 2025, with a proposal due date of March 10, 2025, in accordance with Maryland State procurement guidelines. The Maryland State Department of Education conducted a competitive procurement process to ensure a thorough evaluation of both the technical and financial proposals. This included a pre-proposal conference on March 6, 2025, and subsequent RFP clarifications in the form of four addenda. The Technical Evaluation Committee began reviewing the proposals on April 17, 2025.

Eleven vendors were directly solicited, two have addresses in Maryland, one is a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), and public notice of the solicitation was provided on eMaryland Marketplace. Outreach efforts to encourage MBEs, small businesses, and resident businesses included a comprehensive review of the agency's vendor repository to identify businesses registered to operate in Maryland. Additionally, research was conducted to explore potential engagement and participation from Historically Black Colleges and Universities. A total of nine proposals were received. Of the nine proposals received, seven were responsible bids for the solicitation and two were deemed not reasonably susceptible.

Services provided under this contract support the Maryland Center for School Safety, an independent agency within MSDE, in reviewing school-based emergency plans; designing and delivering emergency preparedness training; developing and conducting exercises aligned with the Federal Emergency Management Agency/Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP); and updating State-level school emergency plans.

The offeror recommended for the award brings over a decade of experience in emergency management, with a strong regional presence and prior work with school districts in Maryland and the District of Columbia, as well as multi-year support to MSDE/MCSS. Their proposal reflects a clear understanding of the scope, outlining how each element will be addressed through the specialized skills of their team. Their personnel are highly experienced and certified, with a background in emergency planning, exercises, and disaster recovery. Although the recommended offeror was not the highest ranked technical offeror it was the lowest priced offeror, and the magnitude of its price differential was judged to outweigh the comparatively slight technical differences between it and any other offeror.

This is a new solicitation for a contractor to provide emergency preparedness support to the MD Center for School Safety. MCSS currently does not have internal staff with the expertise required to develop and deliver these services to Maryland school personnel.

The contract value, estimated at \$11 million, reflects largely pass-through wages for program members. Approximately 88% of the contract total will be used to directly fund member wages, with only a small percentage (estimated 12%) applied to administrative fees and overheads. The wages paid to members are funded primarily through Special Funds, but DSCI is not retaining those funds; instead, they are being processed and disbursed by Infojini in accordance with State and federal labor laws.

This structure ensures that members are paid accurately and on time, while reducing the burden on especially small host site partners—many of whom lack in-house payroll capacity. In order to ensure program sustainability, cost-sharing arrangements are being put in place: DSCI will pay member wages and the associated PEO service fee, while host site partners will be responsible for fringe costs such as payroll taxes and required benefits (e.g., healthcare). Infojini has agreed to bill both parties, accordingly, including provisions for monthly advance invoicing and reporting safeguards to ensure timely payments and member support.

Requesting Agency Remarks: At the Baltimore County Council meeting on April 4, 2022 the Council approved a sole source contract between Helicopter Applications, Inc. and Baltimore County, Maryland to provide for the aerial application treatment of Bactimos WDG for the suppression of nuisance midges in Back River in Baltimore County, Maryland. On March 29, 2022, the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) and Baltimore County (BC) entered into a memorandum of understanding for these services. In order to cover the costs for this program, and consistent with the nuisance insect statute which requires 50/50 cost share (Agriculture §5-1003(c)), MDA and BC each agreed to pay 50% of the cost of the project. Midge control was implemented starting in the spring of 2022 for one year with 4 one-year renewal options. The treatments of Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis (Bti) (Bactimos WG) were applied once a month each year of the contract, beginning in April through the end of September.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

There was no MBE/VSBE goal assigned to this contract due to no sub-contracting opportunities for these services.

During MDA's most recent audit, the Office of Legislative Audits (OLA) determined that MDA did not have the necessary contract documents in place and had not sought Department of General Services (DGS) and Board of Public Works approval for the contract. Unfortunately, prior to DGS/OSP development and giving procurement authority to all Departments, MDA did not handle any procurements in-house. They were done by the Department of General Services, Department of Information Technology and/or the Department of Budget Management. After being provided with procurement delegation, MDA hired a procurement officer who we thought was experienced and up to date with the procurement processes and COMAR since she was a Certified Maryland Procurement Officer. We later found out that this was not the case and she no longer works for MDA. MDA has hired new procurement staff and will ensure and continue to ensure that these individuals will receive all DGS/OSP procurement trainings and will adhere to COMAR.

This project is a joint venture between MDA and Baltimore County. The total cost for this project is - \$4,036,560. We are seeking retroactive approval for the cost allocated to MDA, which is 50% of the total cost -\$2,018.280. MDA is not solely responsible for the entire contract cost as 50% will be paid by Baltimore County, and 50% will be paid by MDA to the Contractor.

For price justification; the cost per billing cycle for this procurement was \$126,000.00 in the years 2022, 2023, and 2024 respectively. And the cost for the year 2025 billing cycle is \$129,720.00 which indicates a 2.95% increase from the previous years, due to inflationary measures. Therefore, the cost is deemed fair and reasonable.

Helicopter Applications, Inc. has continued the work as outlined in the contract and MOU through June 30, 2025, while MDA sought this retroactive approval. Midge spraying is time sensitive work that has to occur during this time of year in order to be effective and mitigate the further spread of the nuisance insect. Since MDA does not have any money in FY26 for these services, MDA will not be moving forward with the final renewal of the memorandum of understanding and therefore the contract expired June 30, 2025.

MDA requests your forgiveness and understanding as we seek your retroactive approval of this contract. We assure you that we have learned from this experience and will take all necessary measures to prevent a similar situation in the future. Thank you in advance for considering this item.

Spongy moth surveys did not conclude until early spring due to weather conditions. This survey helps determine the number of acres to be sprayed. The IFB was created when completed surveys established treatment acres, and funding for the project was made available. The solicitation had to be advertised on eMMA for 21 days after the survey. For spongy moth suppression to be effective, spraying must occur during the correct and precise stage of larval (caterpillar) and leaf development. This short window of time is critical to the success of the project in preventing defoliation and mortality loss. There was no MBE/VSBE goal assigned to this contract due to no sub-contracting opportunities for these services.

The reason for the retroactivity is that MDA was notified at the end of March 2025 that our federal funding for this work was cut. As a result, the Department was unable to confirm the funding level for the contract in time to submit a Board of Public Works (BPW) petition promptly. BPW approved additional general funds from the FY25 Contingent Funds of \$135,000 at their April 23, 2025, meeting. These funds, along with those that MDA was later able to secure from counties and the Department of Natural Resources, allowed the Department to fully replace the federal funding that was cut.

The price from Helicopter Applicators, Inc., at \$44.73 per acre has been determined to be fair and reasonable. Last year's price per acre was \$35.78, reflecting a 22.23% increase. This increase is due to the reduced number of acres sprayed for the 2025 suppression project. The previous year's treated area was 25,679 acres, which is three times the 8,061 acres treated this year. The total funding for Spongy Moth Suppression is \$360,568.53, enough to treat 8,061 acres in 2025. Typically, prices decrease with larger acreage due to bulk discounts. Additionally, considering inflation and material costs for this specialized project, the price was deemed fair and reasonable.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The Maryland State Department of Education Division of Rehabilitation Services is reducing the current contract value and extending the contract through December 31, 2025, to continue day-to-day statewide vending services for Regions I–IV under the Maryland Business Enterprise Program (MBEP) for the blind. Due to the dissolution of Accent Food Company by Frontline Food Services LLC, the renegotiation of contract terms was not afforded due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Between fiscal years 2023-2025 the Maryland State Department of Education's Division of Rehabilitation Services acknowledges a disparity in MBE participation between the prime and the subcontractor, and because of missing data, the agency's MBE compliance report appears unbalanced. The data reconciliation challenges and discrepancies between the prime contractor's data and agency records required extended reconciliation efforts. These discrepancies included invoice dates, vendor changes, and differing transactions. These issues have now been resolved, and the data accurately reflects the annual spend of the prime versus the subcontractor. Furthermore, Vend Central, the subcontractor, has reported monthly distributor spend exceeding \$75,000. Despite this, there may still be reporting gaps due to transactional influx through the authorized distributor acting on behalf of Sodexo Operations LLC in designated regions.

Additionally, the agency reconciliation process has addressed the primary discrepancies, and the data now provides a reliable overview of spending, continued monitoring and coordination with all reporting entities, recommended to ensure ongoing accuracy and completeness.

Based on these considerations, Sodexo Operations LLC proposed a 10% reduction in commission rates across all statewide regions. This includes lowering the rate for vending at Rest Stops and Welcome Centers from 32.50% to 22.50%, and State Office Buildings from 30.00% to 20.00%. Commissions would continue to be calculated on gross sales, with no deductions for taxes or other fees.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Due to staff turnover and limited file management, the Office of Procurement and Contract Management was unable to locate the original contract award, resulting in a retroactive, 100% revenue-generating contract with a 15% MBE subcontracting goal. The prime vendor has exceeded their 15% MBE goal by achieving an 18% participation rate, representing a 20% improvement over the minimum requirement. With \$2.66 million in MBE subcontractor payments out of \$15.1 million total contract value, they have consistently overperformed in four of five fiscal years, including reaching 53% participation in FY2025. This sustained overachievement demonstrates genuine commitment to minority business partnerships beyond mere compliance requirements.

**DGS OSP Remarks: RETROACTIVE** approval requested pursuant to § 11-204(c) State Finance & Procurement Article. DGS OSP has determined that this contract should be treated as voidable rather than void because: (1) all parties have acted in good faith; (2) ratification for the procurement contract would not undermine the purposes of the Procurement Law; and (3) the violation, or series of violations, was insignificant or otherwise did not prevent substantial compliance with the Procurement Law.

Due to inflation, the price of this renewal Option that was negotiated in CY 2023 is more favorable to the State than if the price had been negotiated in CY 2025. The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable.

While this is the first and final renewal Option for this Contract, OPS does not intend to re-solicit for a replacement contract for these services. OPS is in the process of awarding its new Preferred Drug List and Supplemental Rebate Development and Management for Maryland Medicaid Fee-For-Service Participants (PDL) RFP Contract. The services in this Sole Source have been added to the service requirements of the new PDL RFP. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Cannabis Administration (MCA) was established as an independent unit of State government that is responsible for establishing and administering a safe, accessible, and equitable cannabis industry in Maryland. The primary responsibilities of the MCA include licensing and regulating cannabis businesses, administering the patient registry and medical cannabis program, developing rules and regulations to ensure product safety and quality, inspecting licensed and registered businesses to ensure compliance with the laws and regulations governing the cannabis industry, and educating stakeholders on cannabis laws and regulations in the State and safe and responsible cannabis use.

Citrin Cooperman has been providing financial and corporate structure investigations and audits since August 2020. This service was originally procured through a State-Wide Auditing services contract through competitive bidding. The current contract awarded to Citrin Cooperman is expected to expire on 08/31/2025 with 2-one year renewal options.

The goal of this request is to retain MCA's auditing services and ensure continuity of service in supporting MCA's ability to conduct financial and business structure investigations that would enable MCA license over 179 recently pre-approved applicants who are currently at various stages of being fully licensed and operational in Maryland. Transiting to a new vendor at this stage would compromise the continued success of MCA operations.

Additionally, although the original contract provided for 25% MBE participation, over the course of the current contract the vendor is now at 10% MBE participation. MCA will follow up the contractor to ensure that they are compliant with the MBE goals.

In their MBE report, the contractor noted that there is an outstanding invoice from one subcontractor which has not yet been received by Citrin Cooperman. It is expected that on account of the steady nature of the work related to the social equity applicants that the MBE percentage will increase greatly over the next year on account of the repetitive nature of the current workload. Past work has mainly been related to training and investigations related to specific facts and circumstances which have not been easy to outsource. Additionally, Stage II applicants were outsourced to some of the MBEs but have still yet to complete the process with the MCA to obtain licensure so work has been halted until those are ready to be licensed. Three of the four subcontractors under this contract have not been able to provide any scheduled working hours to dedicate to this project.

We have one subcontractor who now has dedicated staff to this project which is why we believe that the MBE percentage will increase over the renewal period of this contract.

While the price for the option years was quoted five years ago, the vendor has agreed to continue the service at the same rates. We therefore recommend the approval of the option to exercise this one-year renewal

The subcontractor's involvement, specifically in supporting health benefit fairs, is scheduled to take place during the statewide Employee Benefits Open Enrollment period in the fall and will span several months. The absence of in-person enrollment events in recent years has limited the prime contractor's ability to fully utilize the subcontractor. A corrective action plan was implemented to support the contractor in engaging with its subcontractor and allocating additional resources as needed. Updated MBE compliance data is expected to be available following the conclusion of the Open Enrollment period in December 2025.

The Agency is recommending a not-to-exceed contract limit of \$280,000 to give the Board of Trustees (Board) the flexibility they need to make a market rate offer to a new CIO based on the objective criteria approved by the Board under Maryland law.

Requesting Agency Remarks: On June 6, 2024, Department of General Services (DGS), on behalf of the Department of Information Technology (DoIT), advertised a notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). Additionally, DGS sent automated notifications to 3,623 vendors through eMMA, and direct solicited 1,641 vendors, (with 1,530 certified minority-owned businesses from the MDOT MBE Directory included among these figures). Ultimately, DGS received a total of 72 proposals. Thirty-six (36) proposals were not reasonably susceptible for award for various deficiencies, including failure to complete and submit with their proposals the required MBE and VSBE forms. Thirty-six (36) proposals were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

The RFP stated that up to eight (8) awards would be made. The eight (8) highest-ranked offerors are recommended for award because their proposals were determined to be the most advantageous to the State. The pool of eight (8) contractors may all perform the full suite of services. This is a Fixed Price / Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract, pursuant to COMAR 21.06.03.02 and 21.06.03.06, with labor-hour-based Work Orders. Work will be assigned on a rotational basis and priced in accordance with pre-approved labor categories using fully loaded rates proposed by the Contractors.

These offerors submitted proposals that fully addressed the RFP's evaluation criteria, contained little or no material weaknesses, and offered prices DoIT deemed reasonable.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Throughout the term of the Contract, each request for IT support will be governed by a work order process in accordance with pre-approved Labor Categories with the fully loaded rates contained in the offerors' financial proposals or financial best and final offers. The State will rotate work assignments among the awarded contractors by issuing work order requests in the order of highest to lowest overall ranked Contractor. This sequence will repeat as necessary throughout the life of the Contract.

This procurement is designed to provide State agencies with Contractors who offer a broad range of digital services, including content strategy, web experience, accessibility, and application development. As a result of the awards from this solicitation, State agencies will obtain digital solutions that meet their Agency's and their user's specific needs, streamline procurement, and enhance government service delivery. This contracting vehicle is also available to Maryland local and county government jurisdictions and not-for-profit entities within the State of Maryland, as defined in State Finance and Procurement §13-110(a)(5) - (7). These non-State users may procure goods and services under the same terms, conditions, and pricing as State agencies.

An overall MBE subcontracting goal of 25% applies to all areas with the exception of Fearless, who has committed to exceeding the goal by .5% for an overall 25.5% MBE goal. An overall 5% VSBE participation goal was established. All awardees have committed to meeting the VSBE goal.

As the solicitation progressed, eight (8) protests and three (3) appeals were received. As noted below, one protestor also contacted the MBSCA and was advised to seek a final response from DGS-OSP, which subsequently reaffirmed its denial. Below is a summary of the protests:

Eight (8) protests were received in total. Of these, six (6) were denied and two (2) were sustained. (See Attachment III). The protests raised concerns about alleged flaws in the evaluation process, including improper application of evaluation criteria, misinterpretation of proposal content, unequal treatment of offerors, and procedural inconsistencies such as mid-evaluation changes and unclear oral presentation procedures. Some vendors also alleged bias in favor of small businesses and challenged the responsiveness and responsibility determinations of selected awardees. Two appeals were filed with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA). The first appeal was dismissed on February 25, 2025, upon MSBCA's grant of the State's motion for summary decision.

The second appeal was dismissed on June 16, 2025. At this time, there are no pending protests or appeals related to this solicitation. DGS maintains that all evaluations were conducted in accordance with the RFP and applicable procurement law.

Competitive bidding is not feasible at this time due to the upcoming expiration of the current contract and the critical need to preserve institutional knowledge during active development. Additional features are continually being added to the system, which requires both in-depth expertise with the modernized platform and exclusive familiarity with legacy components. The vendor's unique institutional knowledge and proven expertise are essential to ensuring uninterrupted system functionality, compliance with State requirements, and progress toward scalable, secure, and modular technology solutions.

This sole source procurement is not intended to avoid competition, but rather to maintain service continuity while a full competitive procurement is completed. WCC plans to release a new RFP in fall 2025, with an award recommendation by late spring 2026, allowing sufficient time for vendor onboarding and knowledge transfer to ensure a smooth transition.

#### Category 1 – Bizagi Support

Category 1 Bizagi Support positions which are special and available from a limited number of vendors. These positions are filled by subject matter experts (senior Bizagi developers) in developing low-code/no-code software solutions. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) requests approval of the first renewal option under Contract No. 34-IT-MOD, originally approved by the Board on September 20, 2023. This sole source contract provides critical software support, maintenance, and enhancements for the Maryland College Aid Processing System, or MDCAPS. MDCAPS is the central system MHEC uses to manage and process state financial aid for Maryland students. Each year, MHEC processes approximately 260,000 applications and forms, handles 40,000 incoming calls, and responds to over 20,000 emails from students, families, postsecondary institutions, and legislators.

The original contract, approved by the Board on August 22, 2018, included four one-year renewal options. In 2023, the Board approved a modification to exercise the total contract term through August 31, 2025, with the understanding that MHEC would begin development of a replacement system as mandated by Chapters 639 and 640 of the 2022 Laws of Maryland (House Bill 1030).

That law requires MHEC to implement a unified scholarship application and financial aid processing system to replace MDCAPS by September 1, 2025. However, development of the new system is ongoing and will not be completed by the statutory deadline. Full implementation is now expected by September 2026.

To ensure uninterrupted operation of Maryland's financial aid processing infrastructure, MHEC seeks approval to exercise Option Year 1 of 2, extending the contract from September 1, 2025, through August 31, 2026, at a total cost of \$402,939.50. This renewal, requested under COMAR 21.05.05.02A(2) (continuity of service), ensures continuity of operations, maintenance, and system enhancements during the critical final year of MDCAPS use.

MHEC sincerely apologize for the delay in meeting the two-meeting rule for the BPW approval process. Initially, we were under the impression that the new MDSIS system would be ready in time to meet the submission deadline. However, after further assessments, we have learned that the system will not be fully operational by the expected date of September 2025. This unexpected delay contributed to our timing challenges.

Additionally, we have been diligently working with our current vendor to evaluate the option year renewal, as well as researching all past contract modifications under the existing MDCAPS contract. Due to the extensive research and coordination required, we were unable to meet the two-week submission requirement. We sincerely appreciate your understanding and patience as we work through these critical steps.

There were no MBE or VSBE subcontracting opportunities identified at the time of the original procurement, and none are associated with this renewal. The procurement was executed as a sole source due to the proprietary nature of the MDCAPS platform and the specialized vendor expertise required for its support.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** This contract involves replacing existing fareboxes on transit buses and is part of the new Electronic Fare Collection System. The new bus fareboxes will interface with central software, assist operators with fare identification, and comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The contractor will be responsible for removing and disposing of the existing fareboxes and equipment, furnishing and installing new fareboxes and related equipment, and implementing system software for the new fareboxes.

The MTA is seeking approval to purchase 97 additional farebox units, which include 75 for installation and 22 spare units for maintenance and repairs. Since the original contract award, the MTA has increased its fleet to allow for the replacement of buses being decommissioned, without service interruption, and for adherence to the Federal Transit Administration Rolling Stock Spare Ratio Policy of 20% of operational fleets. To align with the Spare Ratio requirement the MTA must bring their fleet size from 750 to 833, which brings the total number of fare boxes needed from 853 to 950. The 950 total number of units is inclusive of installed and spares. All current fleet that are later decommissioned, will have the new fare box equipment removed, reconditioned, and added to MTA's available stock on hand.

This modification also includes a material change, the addition of 958 thermal printers to the contract. The printers will allow riders to continue to purchase Day Passes at the farebox. In the calendar year 2024, 1.4 million Day Passes were sold, generating nearly \$6.5 million in revenue. Maintaining Day Pass printers at bus fareboxes reflects a philosophical shift away from implementing a cashless fare collection system. The change will allow MTA to continue to support the large percentage of riders that use cash while incentivizing them to adopt "digital cash" payment options through a low-income fare program and fare capping.

These printers are a farebox component, so the printers cannot be sourced through a third-party vendor. Out of the 950 units, 825 will be installed, 125 units are spares, and 8 are for lab bench testing. The pricing of the printer accessories and installation was compared against the engineers estimate and had only increased by 1.05% per unit. MTA will also save over \$826,050 by having the component installed at the factory, while mitigating potential risks to equipment and the project delivery schedule. For the reasons listed above, the MTA found the pricing offered for the thermal printers to be fair and reasonable.

This will lead to the much higher price of \$616,000.00 per year, instead of the current cost of \$215,502.00 for the legacy pricing model which includes collaborators, a difference of \$400,498.00 per year, for DHS.

The extension period will also allow the Department the necessary time to research other viable and cost-effective solutions for these vital business functions.

The item does not comply with the two meeting rule because it was submitted to the Office of State Procurement timely, but the submission did not include an ICPA Procurement Officer's determination for the modification. DHS did not know that an ICPA determination was necessary for the modification and there was a delay obtaining signatures for the determination.

Requesting Agency Remarks: MDH Laboratories Administration was awarded a Bipartisan Infrastructure Law grant from EPA that funds the purchase of a high-resolution mass spectrometer for the identification of unknown contaminants as part of an MOU with the Maryland Department of the Environment (PCA = J443S, BPO U00B4600035). The ability of this state-of-the-art technology to identify trace levels of unknown chemicals depends entirely on its ability to resolve them within mixtures. This instrument separates the contaminants in the gas phase using a circular path (cyclic ion mobility) such that nearly infinite resolution can be achieved because the contaminants can be sent around the circular track as many times as the operator sets. What makes this feature a sole source is MDH Laboratories Administration requires this unique circular path feature. All similar mass spectrometers on the market use a fixed linear path, which is insufficient for the program's need to identify trace unknown contaminants.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

If this instrument became unavailable, MDH Laboratories Administration would be limited in its ability to identify unknown contaminants, which would severely hinder environmental investigations and emergency responses.

The quoted price of \$887,791.75 for the Waters High-Resolution Mass Spectrometer is determined to be fair and reasonable based on recent historical pricing and value-added discounts. In 2020, the Department of Commerce purchased the same equipment for \$820,763.67, and in 2021, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) paid \$954,755.71 due to inflation and supply chain impacts. The current quote reflects a \$66,963.96 reduction from the DHHS price.

#### Additional justifications include:

- A 47.8% discount from the list price of \$1,653,216.00
- A tariff waiver saving \$60,584.77
- A 35% discount on the second-year extended warranty, saving \$34,826.76
- Compatibility with existing laboratory systems, avoiding integration costs

These factors collectively support the conclusion that the pricing is fair, reasonable, and in the State's best interest.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The Department of General Services issued an RFP in late 2022, and evaluations have been completed. However, the contract award has been delayed due to extended negotiations over key terms. The current fleet management contract is set to expire, and negotiations for a replacement contract remain unresolved. To ensure continuity of services, approval is requested to extend the current contract and increase funding as a bridge contract, with an anticipated term of up to 18 months, allowing time to revise requirements, assess market interest, and conduct a new competitive solicitation.

The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) will work aggressively with DGS-OSP to pursue a new competitive award with business terms that optimize cost-effectiveness for the State while exploring ways to enhance MBE/VSBE participation as well. DBM is assessing the current operating model for fleet maintenance and repair as part of the Government Modernization Initiative, and this work will inform future procurements for maintenance and repair.

The services provided under this contract are highly specialized and essential to State operations. The contractor serves as a management provider responsible for overseeing all conventional maintenance, repairs, glass replacement, and preventative maintenance for State-owned vehicles. The scope also includes oversight of original equipment manufacturer (OEM) recalls and access to maintenance experts through a centralized technical support center. These experts review and approve maintenance and repair services, which are available 24/7, 365 days a year via toll-free access. The contract further includes emergency roadside assistance, such as towing services and the transport of State personnel from accident or breakdown sites to safe locations. These centralized services are critical to ensuring the safety, operability, and cost-efficiency of the State fleet; therefore, continuation of these services is essential.

At the time of the original award, a secondary service was not available, and therefore, an MBE participation goal was not established. However, a 10% MBE participation goal has been included in the new solicitation.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Contract provides MDH Datacenter hosting, electrical, security and environmental services at Tierpoint BWI and Tierpoint TX for the MDH primary and disaster recovery MDH Datacenters. TierPoint is the only facility available which possesses the required NetworkMaryland connectivity to provide these services. This information was confirmed by DoIT, who, along with other State agencies, has also utilized Sole Source Procurements for these same services. In 2020 MDH was directed by the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) to procure hosting at the TierPoint facility as part of a multi-agency relocation of agencies from the Baltimore State Center facility. MDH procured Tierpoint hosting services under a sole source five-year contract, which is very similar to the services already procured by the MD Department of Information Technology (DoIT) and the Maryland Comptroller via sole source vehicle.

TierPoint's Baltimore/BWI facilities are among the largest aggregation points for the State's private fiber network. Multiple agencies, including DoIT and the Comptroller, already operate in these facilities making them strategic hubs.

MDH received a quote from Tierpoint March 27<sup>th</sup> for a five-year renewal of hosting services, which is being used to create a new Tierpoint sole source replacement contract. A contract extension of the current Tierpoint hosting contract is necessary to allow time to process a new Tierpoint Sole Source contract. MDH reviewed proposed services and costs, newly added products for managed backup and recovery services, and addressed Tierpoint's concerns about current and future increase in electric surcharge costs for hosting MDH data center. The replacement contract is expected to be submitted to BPW in time for December 2025 BPW.

Pursuant to COMAR 21.05.09.04, it has been determined that it is in the best interest of the State to continue its participation using the newest OMNIA Partners' Master Agreements. Microsoft licensing is currently being used by State agencies; therefore, it is crucial that DGS-OSP maintain in place contracts to avoid any uninterrupted flow of services. This purchasing agreement provides the State of Maryland with favorable contract terms, and a variety of technology solutions as detailed above. SHI offers a discount off a verifiable price list from the manufacturer.

SHI shall provide a minimum 18.25% discount off the Estimated Retail Price (ERP) on Cloud (Monthly Subscriptions) and a minimum 16.25% discount off the ERP of On-Premises Products (Perpetual Licenses and Software Assurance).. This model presents the most aggressive pricing that SHI can offer based on how Microsoft prices out its products and takes into consideration both current agency needs, as well as future growth. As a result, SHI's price has also been determined to be fair and reasonable.
