erroneous confinement in the amount of \$ 573,412.35, and attorney's fees in the amount of \$ 9,571.45 to the Law Office of Brown, Goldstein &

Levy, LLP.

"The Board of Public Works shall pay the compensation ordered [by the Office of Administrative Hearings] under subsection (d) of this section in:

(1) one initial payment equal to the annual amount of the State's most recent median household income to be paid within 60 days after

(2) (i) after the initial payment under item (1) of this subsection, installments paid over a period not to exceed 6 fiscal years; or (ii) in accordance with an expedited payment schedule recommended

under subsection (d)(1)(iv) of this section."

Remarks: Conviction & Release. On January 25, 2019, Mr. Tull was convicted of rape in the second degree, sexual offense in the third degree, and assault in the second degree, and released from confinement on November 14, 2024.

Actual Innocence. On November 14, 2024, Mr. Tull's conviction was vacated in the Wicomico County Circuit Court pursuant to granting a *Motion to Vacate Judgment* filed by the Wicomico County State's Attorney's Office, and that office subsequently entered a *Nolle Prosequi* in the matter. The Administrative Law Judge found that the evidence clearly and convincingly demonstrates that Mr. Tull did not commit the felony for which he was convicted.

Compensation. In its decision, the Administrative Law Judge found that: (1) Mr. Tull was confined for 2,121 days, (2) the current annual income figure to use is \$ 98,678.00, and (3) under the statutory formula he is entitled to \$ 573,412.35 in compensation.

Fifty percent of the monetary award is to be paid by the jurisdiction where the erroneous conviction occurred, Wicomico County, as provided in the Budget Reconciliation and Financing Act (BRFA) of 2025 (CH 604 of 2025).

Recommended Expedited Payment Schedule. Pursuant to SFP § 10-501(d)(1)(iv), Mr. Tull requested that the balance of his compensation after the statutorily required initial payment be paid to him in a lump sum by December 1, 2025. The Administrative Law Judge found that such a schedule was "appropriate and in the Claimant's interests in light of the negative consequences of his wrongful conviction..." The Department of Budget and Management has reviewed the Order, and concurs with the Administrative Law Judge's recommendation.

Attorney's Fees. Pursuant to SFP § 10-501(d)(1), the Administrative Law Judge ordered \$ 9, 571.45 in attorney's fees and expenses for the work of Brown, Goldstein & Levy, LLP on this petition.

The Wetlands Administrator recommends annual compensation of \$50,460, calculated as follows:

- 2. Require mitigation in the amount of \$17,313.48 for impacts to shallow water habitat resulting from the dredging.

The loan was structured with 1% annual interest-only payments and 1% deferred interest, with final maturity on October 1, 2025.

Remarks (cont'd):

The borrower defaulted on the loan by failing to make reserve for replacement and escrow payments, failure to submit audited financial statements, and failure to have a management company in place acceptable to the Department. At the time of the default, the project suffered from physical and financial distress, including four vacant and uninhabitable units, significant capital needs, and unpaid liabilities exceeding available cash. With no corrective action taken, on October 18, 2024 the Department accelerated the loan, made demand for repayment, and referred the Loan to the Office of the Attorney General. A court-appointed receiver was subsequently approved to stabilize and manage the property pending disposition. With Court approval, the Receiver engaged a broker to market and sell the property. The broker obtained six qualified offers. The highest and best offer of \$750,000 was selected and has been accepted by the Receiver, the Court and the Department, subject to Board of Public Works approval.

The Department believes that the sale proceeds, while not sufficient to repay the entire outstanding indebtedness, represents the best financial outcome and will maximize the recovery to the State. Accordingly, the Department seeks approval to release its lien on the Property in exchange for the net proceeds of the sale.

The Property is the sole collateral for the Loan and the Loan is non-recourse - meaning that the Department's sole financial source of recovery for repayment of the Loan is the Property. Accordingly, following sale of the Property and release of the lien, the Borrower will not be obligated to repay the Loan and there is no reasonable expectation of repayment. Accordingly, the Department seeks approval to forgive the balance remaining indebtedness following application of the net sales proceeds to the indebtedness.

This proposal will help eliminate blight caused by a prolonged vacancy and deterioration of the property. The forgiveness of accrued interest and acceptance of partial principal repayment will not have a material fiscal impact on the Department and will support an orderly resolution of the asset. Board of Public Works approval is required prior to releasing the Department's lien for less than the total amount of the indebtedness and forgiving the accrued interest on the RHPP loan and partially forgiving principal, resulting in the release of the Department's lien on the collateral.

Remarks (cont'd):

Each GMP has a separate MBE participation goal based on the availability of MDOT-certified firms. A total project participation goal of 45.00% has been established and is expected to be met by the end of all the GMPs combined. GMP-B includes MBE firm participation of 55.97% with a cumulative project total of 36.09%. To date, payments made to MBE firms are 100% of the total payments to date made to the prime firm, Barton Malow Builders/Warren-Builds.

This request is for the Board of Public Works to approve the full contract amount and full cash expenditure of GMP-B, for a cumulative cash expenditure of \$11,339,674 to date (inclusive of all prior approvals to date). The design is approximately 50% complete; the University will return to the board for approval for future GMPs as they will be released in stages, while the design progresses.

The existing Science Complex is comprised of four buildings: Carnegie, Calloway, Spencer, and Key Halls. The oldest of these buildings (Carnegie Hall) was constructed in 1919 and the newest (Key Hall) in 1964. Spencer Hall was renovated in 1989, and the three other buildings were last renovated in 1992. The renovations were poorly done and created substandard spaces that do not meet modern-day building codes. The mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems in the buildings are obsolete and need to be replaced. There is insufficient space in the Science Complex to appropriately serve the Biology and Chemistry departments due to growth in the science disciplines. In addition, the configuration of the building does not lend itself to the type of instructional and research spaces required to support the University's science programs.

The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will continue to manage the Construction Manager's work with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

Specifically, EC Section 10-628(b) of the Act authorizes the Authority to issue and have outstanding up to \$1.2 billion face amount of bonds (whether taxable or tax exempt) to be divided equally between M&T Bank Stadium (the "Football Stadium") and Oriole Park at Camden Yards (the "Baseball Stadium" and with the Football Stadium, the "Stadiums"). Bonds may be issued to finance construction, renovation, and related expenses for construction management, professional fees, and contingencies of the Stadiums, and sports facilities (as defined in the Act) related thereto.

Chapter 112 (HB 524 Session 2023) amended the Act by, among other things, creating separate funds for bonds issued for the Stadiums for the purpose of receiving lottery deposits pursuant to State Government Article Section 9-120, and managing debt obligations in connection with bonds issued for each Stadium. Section 10-629 of the Act requires the Authority's debt service payment obligations with respect to the Series 2025 Bonds be secured by, and payable from, the property or receipts of the Authority which may include taxes, fees, charges or other revenues payable to the Authority, or any combination thereof. The Authority expects the Series 2025 Bonds will be solely secured by, and payable from, the Camden Yards Baseball Sports Facility Supplemental Financing Fund (see EC § 10-652.2). The Authority remains below its \$600 million debt limit [...].

The details of the proposed bond issuance are set forth in the Comprehensive Financing Plan. Bonds issued under the Act will not constitute a debt, liability, or pledge of the faith and credit or the taxing power of the State, the Authority, or any other governmental unit.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) Light Rail Maintenance of Way team has identified and reported vertical movement and settlement of the light rail tracks at the Clipper Mill Grade Crossing. Subsequent inspections confirmed significant subgrade loss beneath Track 2, and failed underdrains that are in place to convey stormwater beneath the slab that supports the rails. Currently, both northbound and southbound light rail trains are using Track 1 while Track 2 remains closed.

This results in delays that extend across the entire Light Rail line and fewer trains able to operate for the 20,000 daily commuters who depend on the full span of stops of the light rail service to go to work, school, medical appointments, and other activities. Furthermore, failure to act promptly may lead to further structural void deterioration, potentially compromising Track 1. If this occurred it would result in full disruption of Light Rail service between Falls Road and North Avenue stations, with even greater impacts to Light Rail service and its patrons.

Basis for Selection: Given that time was of the essence and this repair required immediate and around-the-clock work to ensure the safety of the traveling public, a formal competitive solicitation could not be conducted. An emergency was declared, and MTA contacted three vendors known to be capable of providing these services to encourage competitive pricing. Of the three bids received for this emergency procurement, Amtrac Railroad Contractors of Maryland, Inc. (Amtrac) provided the lowest price. MTA confirmed that Amtrac could complete the work at the pricing offered and is a qualified and experienced vendor that has successfully completed construction work for the MTA in the past. Although no MBE or VSBE participation goal was established for this contract, Amtrac Railroad Contractors of Maryland, Inc. is a Certified Minority Business Enterprise and Small Business in addition to being a resident Maryland business.

This Intergraph platform integrates many public safety, security and life safety systems and functions including Fire Detection and Alarm Monitoring, Closed Circuit Television System, Controlled Access Security System, Crash Notification, Mass Notification System, Instant Recall and Recording, Maryland Emergency Medical Services, Anti-Hijack, Terminal Evacuation System, Pre-Arrival Medical Instructions and Fires Station Alerting.

This contract allows for three one-year renewal periods at fixed rates established at the time of contract award. When the original project was approved in 2023, the renewal maintenance costs were compared to the pricing proposed in the base term. In 2023, it was discovered that the funds were getting low on existing Contract MAA-SV-21-003. Therefore, on March 15, 2023, solicitation MAA-SV-24-002, Financial Planning and Analysis Services at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN State Airports was advertised with proposals due on May 24, 2023. After issuing the Notice of Recommended Award, an error was discovered in the solicitation documents. Therefore, in accordance with the Code of Maryland Regulations 21.06.02.02, Cancellation of Invitations for Bids or Request for Proposals, MAA rejected all proposals and cancelled the procurement on November 17, 2023.

On January 03, 2024, the BPW approved Modification No. 1 for Contract MAA-SV-21-003, which added \$550,000 to the current contract authority. On January 29, 2024, a new solicitation, MAA-SV-25-004, Financial Planning and Analysis Services at BWI Thurgood Marshall and MTN State Airports was advertised.

In October 2024, MAA was finalizing the recommendation for award of the new contract MAA-SV-25-004, however, the existing contract's authority was near exhausted. In October 2024, MAA stopped almost all consultant work to avoid exceeding the contract authority. However, MAA was in the middle of a critical bond sale for the remaining funds to complete the A/B Connector and Baggage Handling System Project, which is currently under construction. Delaying the bond sale would have been detrimental to the A/B Connector and Baggage Handling System Project as there would be insufficient Transportation Trust Fund funding to make payments to the construction contractors actively on site. The consultant's support under MAA-SV-21-003 was essential to continue a critical document required for the bond sale, Report of Airport Consultants, as well as provide financial modeling assistance in facilitating other materials required for the sale. As a result, MAA continued to allow services to be provided on the contract to ensure execution of the bond sale in November 2024. In addition, MAA expended \$53,000.00 on the Aviation Facilities Company (cargo facilities management) Supplemental Contract negotiation. MAA was in the middle of the negotiation and services were needed to complete it before the contract expired. This Supplemental Contract provided the cost structure in which a key cargo facility building reverted back to MAA.

MAA was unable to achieve the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation goal due to reduced subcontracting opportunities on the tasks assigned to the Prime Contractor. Frasca was tasked with assisting MAA with Capital amortization work and had intended to use an MBE subcontractor who specialized in these calculations, but calculations were not required. LeighFisher was primarily tasked with assisting MAA in the revenue bond sale which had no subcontracting opportunities, and the PFC Applications task was re-assigned to Frasca. Unison was primarily tasked with assisting MAA with financial analysis and utilized their subcontractor.

MAA is seeking \$57,583.60 in retroactive authority to pay the two final invoices on this contract. No additional billing will be done on this contract after these two invoices. MAA has completed the procurement for the new financial planning and analysis contract, MAA-SV-25-004 which was approved by the Treasurer's Office and effective November 27, 2024. All future services will be performed under the new contract.

RETROACTIVE approval is requested pursuant to § 11-204(c) State Finance & Procurement Article. Six bids were received and opened on March 27, 2025. Maryland Works granted a waiver for these services. A protest was electronically sent on April 1, 2025, from Titan Industrial Services indicating that the bid of the apparent low bidder be rejected based on unreasonable and unrealistic prevailing wage rate quotation in their bid. They also stated that the bid submitted by Professional Facility was unbalanced due to the hourly wage listed for the Traffic Foreman.

The protest was later withdrawn on April 2, 2025. Of the six bids received, two were deemed non-responsive and two were rejected. One bid was deemed non-responsive because it exceeded the maximum allowable participation by the prime contractor of 50% towards satisfying the MBE goal, and the other bid was deemed non-responsive because they were unsuccessful in their MBE waiver application. Additionally, the two bids that were rejected were due to high percentage deviation from the engineer's estimate respectively (90.39% and 111.52% over the engineer's estimate).

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20231215-0924. It is recommended to declare the +/- 13.44 acres—located on the southwest side of MD Route 26, near the intersection of MD Route 27 in Mt. Airy, Carroll County—surplus to the needs of the State upon consideration of the Maryland Department of the Environment's qualifying comments. None of the local or state agencies that provided review comments expressed an interest in acquiring the properties.

Requesting Agency Remarks: On July 27, 2023, the State House Trust approved a concept to place a memorial to honor African American soldiers who served in the Revolutionary War on the grounds of the State House. The monument aims to honor and acknowledge the overlooked history of the African American community in early Maryland, the majority of whom were free Blacks.

In collaboration with the Commission on Artistic Property (of the Maryland State Archives), the Department of General Services, and the Maryland Public Art Commission (of the Maryland State Arts Council), a national call to artists was issued via a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) from artists or teams of artists to design and create a memorial to honor Black Patriots who served in the Revolutionary War.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Applications received in response to the RFQ were evaluated by staff of the Maryland Public Art Commission and those deemed eligible based on advertised criteria were advanced to the Monument Advisory Committee (MAC) which was established to evaluate artist proposals and select a single concept for the development of the monument. Four teams of artists were ultimately selected by the MAC as semi-finalists and were invited to develop artwork concept proposals for the Committee's review.

Subsequent to the semi-finalist presentations of their respective concepts, the MAC, in consultation with staff of the Maryland Public Art Commission, Maryland State Archives, and Maryland Department of General Services, ultimately selected Branly Cadet, Sculptor to enter into a contract with the Department of General Services to execute the winning design concept. Mr. Cadet's concept was deemed most responsive to the stated goals of the RFQ. An item for Mr. Cadet's contract was submitted to the Board for its consideration.

This item represents a consultant contract to provide architectural and engineering services to support the artist in development of the site upon which the monument will exist. The consultant team will develop grading, landscaping, hardscaping, lighting and irrigation system engineering concepts and designs in concert with the selected artist who does not possess the expertise to provide these necessary services for the complete development of the monument site.

Over 150 Maryland African Americans, a minority of whom were enslaved people, are known to have enlisted and served in the Revolutionary War. Their existence and contribution have been largely unknown in Maryland's public history. With the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 2026, and in coordination with the MD250 Commission, Maryland has the opportunity to honor these soldiers and their military service to the creation of this nation. The concept for such a memorial artwork was initially proposed by Steven X. Lee, the author of 'The Story of Mr. Thomas Carney - A Maryland Patriot of the American Revolutionary War.' Carney was one of many Maryland African Americans, who enlisted and served in integrated units during the Revolutionary War. Just like their white counterparts, the Black Patriots traveled with an army that included free and enslaved women and children who were integral to its functioning. Their contributions have been overlooked in historical narratives. Their legacy is but one of the omitted chapters in the heritage of early Maryland's extensive Black community.

The purpose of the proposed monument is to honor these unsung Patriots who were members of the Continental Army community and to expand public understanding of the people who contributed to the fight for American independence. Requesting Agency Remarks: On July 27, 2023, the State House Trust approved a concept to place a memorial to honor African American soldiers who served in the Revolutionary War on the grounds of the State House. The monument aims to honor and acknowledge the overlooked history of the African American community in early Maryland, the majority of whom were free Blacks.

In collaboration with the Commission on Artistic Property (of the Maryland State Archives), the Department of General Services, and the Maryland Public Art Commission (of the Maryland State Arts Council), a national call to artists was issued via a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) from artists or teams of artists to design and create a memorial to honor Black Patriots who served in the Revolutionary War. Applications received in response to the RFQ were evaluated by staff of the Maryland Public Art Commission and those deemed eligible based on advertised criteria were advanced to the Monument Advisory Committee (MAC) which was established to evaluate artist proposals and select a single concept for the development of the monument.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Four teams of artists were ultimately selected by the MAC as semi-finalists and were invited to develop artwork concept proposals for the Committee's review. Each of the semi-finalist teams were awarded stipends of \$5000 to produce their concepts and presentations to the MAC. Subsequent to the semi-finalist presentations of their respective concepts, the MAC, in consultation with staff of the Maryland Public Art Commission, Maryland State Archives, and Maryland Department of General Services, ultimately selected Branly Cadet, Sculptor to enter into a contract with the Department of General Services to execute the winning design concept. Mr. Cadet's concept was deemed most responsive to the stated goals of the RFQ.

Over 150 Maryland African Americans, a minority of whom were enslaved people, are known to have enlisted and served in the Revolutionary War. Their existence and contribution have been largely unknown in Maryland's public history. With the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 2026, and in coordination with the MD250 Commission, Maryland has the opportunity to honor these soldiers and their military service to the creation of this nation. The concept for such a memorial artwork was initially proposed by Steven X. Lee, the author of 'The Story of Mr. Thomas Carney - A Maryland Patriot of the American Revolutionary War.' Carney was one of many Maryland African Americans, who enlisted and served in integrated units during the Revolutionary War. Just like their white counterparts, the Black Patriots traveled with an army that included free and enslaved women and children who were integral to its functioning. Their contributions have been overlooked in historical narratives. Their legacy is but one of the omitted chapters in the heritage of early Maryland's extensive Black community.

The purpose of the proposed monument is to honor these unsung Patriots who were members of the Continental Army community and to expand public understanding of the people who contributed to the fight for American independence. This Monument will celebrate the contributions of Maryland's free Black population to our State and Country through figurative depictions and the selected artist's interpretation. The monument will be located on the southeast lawn of the State House, in front of the original 18th century entrance to the building. In addition, the funding increase will support initiatives identified in February 2024, Moore-Miller Administration's State Plan for making Maryland a Leader in Clean Energy and the Greenest State in the Country, the June 2024 Leadership by State Government: Implementing Maryland's Climate Pollution Reduction Plan Executive Order, the July 2025 Valuing Opportunity, Inclusion, and Community Equity (VOICE) Executive Order, and other recent state directives.

The increase in total contract amount is requested as a result of the State of Maryland's increased emphasis on understanding and reducing MDOT's impact on the environment. An expansion of MDOT TSO's Office of the Environment (OE) by roughly triple that of its size when the contract was originally awarded has led to greater demand for the contract's services; while the scope of work remains the same the demand for services has increased.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Moreover, due to ambitious State of Maryland environmental goals, OE has launched additional projects and initiatives that require highly specialized technical support in which the Contractor is able to address OE's needs. Due to the nature of this highly specialized work, MDOT TSO OE is unable to address the increased demand with in-house staff capacity.

Current and ongoing projects include the following:

- Implementation of the Maryland's Climate Pollution Reduction Plan's transportation components and development of a new Zero-Emissions Vehicle Infrastructure Plan pursuant to Governor Moore's June 2024 Climate Executive Order.

- US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Monarch Butterfly Candidate Conservation Agreements with Assurances (CCAA) support to protect endangered species from construction and maintenance projects.
- MDTA Environmental Management System and environmental compliance support.
- Dedicated subject matter expert (SME) providing environmental subject matter expertise and technical support to the MDOT Office of Environment and the Office of Active Transportation and Micro-mobility.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The RFP for the replacement contract was advertised on June 23. 2025. The procurement timeline has influenced MIA's ability to award a new contract prior to the expiration of the current contract.. This extension will provide sufficient time to complete the new procurement and prevent any lapse in service when the current contract expires. MIA procurement initiated the RFP draft on time to solicit a new procurement in April of 2024. The Procurement timeline required to draft an RFP up to the award of the contract is a significant factor that played into the request for modification of the current contract. The delays in completing a new contract before the current contract expires stems from a multitude of factors, broadly categorized as those within and beyond MIA's control. Some common delay causes include Procurement backlogs due to shortage of MIA Procurement Staff, OSP delay in the review of the draft RFP and approval of the RFP for publication (beyond the procurement schedule required) at all stages and other administrative delays. The RFP was submitted to OSP on time. MIA Procurement sent the RFP to OSP on Tuesday, March 25, at 1:24 PM, and OSP approved it on Wednesday, June 18, at 1:19 PM. Additionally, MIA did not have a Procurement Officer available to finalize the RFP draft that was initiated in April 2024. The Procurement Officer returned to work after an extended FMLA leave in late December. The AAG review policy at MIA also plays a role in this process, as AAG reviews typically take several weeks or more to complete.

All these administrative factors contributed to the prolonged timeline for completion.

The timeline for awarding a contract in response to any RFP solicitation depends upon several factors, including, for example, the time for evaluation of proposals received, and time needed to secure any required approvals of the recommended contract award. Typically, it takes approximately 12 months from the date the RFP is published.

This Modification #II is to extend the current contract with Prometric for an additional one (1) year (from 9/30/2025 to 9/30/2026) to allow time to complete a new procurement for a replacement contract. Allowing a lapse in examination contracts would prevent the MIA from performing these functions and it would have a negative impact on potential licensees and Maryland citizens..

This contract is a pass-through contract. The end user pays Prometric directly for services at the pre-determined and pre-approved per-course or per-exam fee. The MIA is mandated by Sections 10104 - 10-109 of the Insurance Article of the Maryland Annotated Code to conduct examinations for obtaining an insurance license. The MIA is also responsible for the review, approval, and monitoring of pre-licensing education courses.

MDTA referrals increased significantly after the award of the contract. At the award there were just over 4.3 million accounts placed for collection. Since the resumption of referrals, the inventory increased by an additional 16.3 million accounts. In April of this year we determined that we would require additional funding for the service contract and placed an item on the May 21st BPW meeting to add additional funds. In June we discovered that there was an administrative error, and the funds were not added. The error required us to seek approval retroactively.

Accounts referred to the outside collection agency typically consist of 85% in-state accounts and 15% out-of-state accounts. CCU normally refers debts to the Contractor after six-months of unsuccessful collection efforts by CCU. Debts are referred monthly via electronic files. The Contractor, as the primary outside collection agency, is authorized to make collection efforts for six months before returning uncollected accounts by electronic media to CCU. The contractor's role is pivotal to ensure thorough and effective collection procedures are utilized in a manner calculated to achieve maximum recovery from debtors.

DGS OSP Remarks: RETROACTIVE approval requested pursuant to § 11-204(c) State Finance & Procurement Article. DGS OSP has determined that this contract should be treated as voidable rather than void because: (1) all parties have acted in good faith; (2) ratification for the procurement contract would not undermine the purposes of the Procurement Law; and (3) the violation, or series of violations, was insignificant or otherwise did not prevent substantial compliance with the Procurement Law.

Requesting Agency Remarks: When DHCD originally procured the software in 2009, there was no cloud-based option available at that time. Since then, DHCD has identified business needs relating to its partner agencies which necessitates this as a business decision for optimal efficiency. From a technical standpoint, a cloud-based solution also allows much more scalability than hosting it on-site, reduces capital expenditures for infrastructure, and provides more cost efficiency. It also ensures optimal security and updates statuses with the systems and removes a point of vulnerability with internal DHCD networks for threat actors to attack.

The Department uses the Section 8 System Suite to transmit household eligibility information, including the amount of assistance and inspection status, to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This software is principally used in the Department's Eastern Shore Regional office and is also used to manage the Money Follows the Person Bridge Subsidy Program.

The Department has developed highly specialized programmatic interfaces between the Section 8 System Suite and the State FMIS accounting system to facilitate correct vendor payments for voucher recipients. The programmatic payment interface is unique to the Section 8 System Suite, and support can only be obtained directly from the owner of this proprietary software.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. DHCD compared the proposed annualized cost of MRI Software, LLC at \$88,552.57 (based on a total of \$281,307.70 over three years) to other industry providers. Comparable software solution costs that DHCD compared this contract to ranged from approximately \$65,000 per year to \$205,000 per year. While each of these software solutions is unique and MRI Software, LLC's price is not lowest of the prices encountered by DHCD, their price is well within a competitive range and offers significant value due to its proprietary integration with existing financial systems and its ability to meet HUD program requirements. The critical nature of the custom interfaces and the benefit of transitioning to a more scalable and secure cloud-based environment will be of great benefit to the State.

SDAT is charged with the recording and maintaining of all business entity Charter Filings for any business wishing to do business in the State of Maryland. These documents include charters for Maryland corporations and qualifications and registrations for foreign corporations. The Charter division encompasses service of process functions, requests for copies of documents, Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) filings, and issuance of certificates of good standing. The unit is also the custodian of Ground Rent Filings. SDAT is also charged with assessing business personal property, utility personal property, and franchise tax payments. All of the aforementioned functions are processed through the MBES.

The Department is also responsible for other functions, such as real property assessments and the issuance of tax credits, that are administered through systems other than MBES.

- 1. Maryland Business Entity System is a major system SDAT uses within the Annapolis Data Center (ADC) mainframe system and is composed of nine (9) subsystems: Charter Filings, UCC, Rate Stabilization, Service of Process, Transfer of Controlling Interest, Personal Property Filings, Ground Rent Redemptions, and Ground Rent Registrations. The Service of Process subsystem will be the focus of the proof of concept, since its coding is the least entangled with other subsystems. The ninth subsystem is an accounting component that generates files that are dropped into FMIS (the State Accounting System). Various API calls and stored procedures are also used to interact with other systems; including Maryland Business Express (Charter's online filing portal and search). The Charter division is the central repository of all records of business entity information and filings (charters, limited liability companies, limited partnerships and business trusts). This division provides resident agent information for service of process on these entities and accepts service in certain circumstances on their behalf. It also records trade names. Approximately 286,038 Charter documents, trade name filings, and copies and certificates of status were processed and approved in FY21. The UCC division is the place of filing for most financing statements under the Uniform Commercial Code. Roughly 50,000 filings are processed per year. All legal entities are required to submit an Annual Report, and legal and non-legal entities that own, lease, or use personal property are required to submit a personal property return. Approximately 380,000 of these documents were submitted in FY21.
- 2. Personal property assessments are calculated based upon the information contained in the returns and certified to each of the 23 counties, Baltimore City and incorporated towns in Maryland. Assessments for the current tax year are sent to the taxing jurisdictions bi- monthly starting July 1 of each year. The taxing jurisdictions then issue tax bills and collect the associated monies.



Reference: Approval is requested for the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, Department of Agriculture, to accept option contracts for the purchase of agricultural preservation easements on the following properties. All purchases outlined below have been reviewed and approved by the MALPF Board.

Special Conditions: Grantor relinquishes all rights to develop or subdivide the land for industrial, commercial, or residential use. Land shall be preserved solely for agricultural use in accordance with provisions of the Agricultural Article. No commercial signs or bill boards are permitted, and there shall be no dumping on land except as is necessary to normal farming operations. Grantor shall manage the property in accordance with sound agricultural practices. Grantee shall have the right to enter land for inspection. No public rights are granted. The term of these easements shall be in perpetuity pursuant to Agriculture Article Section 2-514.1.

- A) As to items 1 through 5, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve the right to apply for release of a lot to convey to himself or his children for the purpose of constructing a dwelling for personal use as follows: one lot of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 20 acres, but less than 70 acres, two lots of one acre or less if the subject property is at least 70 acres, but less than 120 acres, or three lots of one acre or less if the subject property is 120 acres or more.
- B) As to items 6 through 14, pursuant and subject to the provisions of Agriculture Article Section 2-513, Grantor has elected to reserve to himself, and his assigns, the right to apply for release of one unrestricted lot, that may be conveyed to himself or others. Background: The Jefferson Patterson Park & Museum (JPPM) was established following a conveyance from Mary Marvin Breckinridge Patterson to the State of Maryland by deed executed by BPW on behalf of the State dated June 16, 1983. The conveyance, consisting of 512 acres located along the Patuxent River in St. Leonard, was made subject to a Trust Agreement of the same date that provides that the 512-acre property shall "be administered by [MHT] for the benefit of the citizens of the State of Maryland and for the purpose of establishing the Jefferson Patterson Historic Park and Museum". The Trust Agreement further states that the property shall be used for the purpose of "maintaining, preserving, and promoting interest in historical, archaeological, agricultural, cultural, scenic and environmental significance," including "recreational use". Since 1983, JPPM's acreage has expanded to approximately 560 acres through five separate acquisitions of contiguous properties between 1986 – 2002. JPPM's lease portfolio currently includes nine (9) properties: five (5) residential properties, two (2) storage facilities, and one (1) agricultural property (125 acres of farmland). At this time, BPW approval is sought for lease considerations for one (1) residential property.

As required by the Trust Agreement, all rental income generated by JPPM's leasing activities is used to support JPPM's public mission including: salaries of contractual employees who perform educational programming at the Park, costs related to providing educational programming, and facilities maintenance.

Remarks: This retroactive lease occurred due to the extraordinary time demands placed upon the Morgan State University and JPPM teams and their respective needs to address issues associated with the federal budget cuts implemented earlier this year. The retroactive lease was necessary to provide an ongoing revenue stream for the maintenance of the JPPM properties and to assist Morgan State University's Patuxent Environmental and Aquatic Research Center (PEARL) with housing for their summer interns.

DGS has previously informed MHT of the importance of submitting leases earlier to DGS to avoid retroactive requests. The JPPM leases are managed and signed off for legal form and sufficiency by MHT and are not in the portfolio of leases overseen by DGS. To provide a greater level of support, DGS will schedule a meeting with MHT and will extend an offer to send future reminders for their expiring leases.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Request to approve the modification based on the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) protest decision. These tools are critical to have efficient National Public and Non-Public Private School lunch programs. Currently, many highimpact variances and policy changes to workflows are managed by both MARS. There continues to be a programmatic need to continue the support and maintenance services under the current contracts to avoid disruption in the processing. Work performed under this modification is pursuant to the original terms of the existing contracts.

The Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA) sustained GCOM Software's protest and ruled that MSDE's procurement was unlawfully conducted and did not provide fair and equal treatment to all offerors. MSDE is currently considering its options for the future solicitation to ensure proper procurement procedures are followed and that there is no lapse in services.
