Description: The Queen Anne's County Area Agency on Aging seeks to replace the flat and sloped roof, including replacement of the roofing system, flashing, coping, gutters, and downspouts, at the Kent Island Senior Center located in Stevensville. The existing senior center roof has experienced damage and leaks beginning in 2016, resulting in interruptions in service due to closures of sections of the building to perform drying, cleanup, and repairs. The roof has undergone multiple temporary patches and repairs in effort to prolong the existing roof, however, the roof is due for a full replacement. The roof replacement will prevent any further damage to the building and ensure the center can remain open, without any gaps in service due to building damage or safety concerns.

The Maryland Department of Aging has determined that the cost includes sufficient amounts for the project to conform to building, fire, accessibility requirements for persons with disabilities, and other code requirements, and that the project may be reasonably completed with the funds being requested.

Currently, the Turner Station Preservation project is an adaptive reuse of a school campus, with the original school building facing Pine Street and additional apartments constructed along both Oak Street and Chestnut Street, with one building in the center.

A combination of CDA resources will be used, including a tax-exempt loan, Rental Housing Works funds, MEEHA-EmPOWER funds, and 4% Low-Income Housing Tax Credits. Additional funding sources will include Baltimore County HOME funds, a Seller Note, Interim Income, and Deferred Developer Fee.

- 5. Provide SEER 18 heat-pump systems (individual unit) with condensers programmable thermostats.

There are no recognized environmental conditions requiring remediation on the Project. However, the handling of future mold, moisture, and mildew is addressed within the design documents and specifications.

Remarks: From 2016 through 2017, Morgan State University (MSU) procured unarmed security guard services from Allied Universal through the DC Water Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement. Beginning in 2017, MSU continued to obtain these services from the same vendor, independent of the DC Water contract, to ensure the continuous protection of University personnel, students, and property.

In an effort to establish a compliant and competitively awarded contract, the University issued Invitation for Bid (IFB) No. 22-PRO-0025-S in May 2022; however, the solicitation was subsequently canceled due to material deficiencies in the procurement process. Thereafter, MSU issued Request for Proposal (RFP) No. 23-PRO-0018-S on November 21, 2022. Following consultation with the Office of the Attorney General in March 2023, the RFP was also canceled due to concerns identified during the evaluation phase.

To strengthen procurement compliance and integrity of evaluation, MSU initiated the development of an improved solicitation and review process. However, these efforts were disrupted by the resignation of the University's Procurement Director in June 2023. Recognizing the critical importance of uninterrupted security services, MSU sought and obtained retroactive approval from the Board of Public Works (BPW) on December 21, 2022, for services rendered through June 30, 2023.

Since that time, Allied Universal has continued to provide essential unarmed security guard services under University-issued purchase orders, ensuring continuous campus safety. All payments have been made strictly for services rendered and within available budgetary authority.

The University now requests Board of Public Works retroactive approval for the continued utilization of Allied Universal's services from June 2023 through November 20, 2025 to maintain the security and safety of the campus community while the University completed a new competitive procurement.

Morgan is expected to receive approximately \$12.5 million over five years from the \$85 million Department of Defense grant that is expected to be awarded to JHU. The lease is contingent upon the grant award, as well as approval from the Morgan State University Board of Regents and the Board of Public Works. All costs associated with the facility, including any fit-out costs, are to be borne by the grant.

The lease provides the necessary facilities to execute the grant objectives. The Washington Avenue facility is approximately 21k square feet and is in proximity to the Morgan State University Hoen Lithograph facility. The term of the lease is 60 months from the date the facility is ready for occupancy, which is expected to be January 1, 2027, with two 3-year options to extend the lease. Rent escalates at 3% per year. The lease may be terminated in the event the grant award and related funding are terminated or cancelled.

Agency Remarks: This contract is to renovate the Montgomery Hall academic building, which has remained essentially unchanged since its opening in 1979. The building currently houses the departments of Art, Theater Dance & Performance Studies, English, and Philosophy. The College had a Building Condition Assessment (BCA) completed in 2023 by Terracon Consultants, Inc. Based on the BCA's findings and the ever-increasing costs to maintain the facility; and the deteriorating conditions of the major building components: HVAC, electrical, plumbing, emergency power, fire protection, roofing, masonry facade, window, and doors; the recommendation is for the facility to receive a major renovation of all non-structural building components.

In response to advertisement on eMaryland Marketplace, a total of 15 technical proposals were received. The technical proposals were scored based on an evaluation criterion of two sub-factors of Relevant Experience and Past Performance. Four firms were shortlisted and evaluated as among the top of the group of 15, having received technical scores Outstanding to Acceptable and within budget. The other 11 firms were rated based on their proposals being less responsive or over budget and with lower technical ratings having a lower range of Acceptable to Marginal.

The proposed contractor, Hord Coplan Macht, of Baltimore, presented a highly qualified team of architects and engineers, and proposed a very competitive price to provide the full scope of services requested for the project. The Hord Coplan Macht team has excellent experience designing similar architectural renovations projects within the past 5 years and has the expertise to design within the historic character of the St. Mary's College setting. The evaluation committee determined Hord Coplan Macht team's technical qualifications as Outstanding. As its financial proposal is competitive with the other most qualified firms, Hord Coplan Macht, is the Best Value selection.

St. Mary's College is seeking approval of the contract award at this time, and the College will return to the Board with an Action Agenda Item proposing to use preauthorized funds once they have been appropriated and the future MCCBL has taken effect.

Pursuant to sections 10-601 et seq. of the Economic Development Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, the Maryland Stadium Authority is authorized to issue bonds at any time for any of its corporate purposes. Specifically, Economic Development Article Section 10-628(c)(1)(vii) authorizes the Authority to issue and have outstanding up to \$400 million face amount of bonds for racing facilities as defined in the statute. Bonds may be issued to finance acquisition, construction, renovation, and related expenses for construction management, professional fees, and contingencies for racing facilities.

The Maryland Stadium Authority expects the Series 2025 Bonds will be solely secured by, and payable from, the Racing and Community Development Financing Fund established under Section 10-657.2 of the Economic Development Article. Pursuant to State Government Article Section 9-120(b), the Comptroller shall deposit, cause to be deposited, or pay into the Financing Fund \$17 million each fiscal year until bonds issued for a Racing Facility have matured. The Authority remains below its \$400 million debt limit for racing facilities with issuance of debt in the proposed amount not to exceed \$250 million.

The details of the proposed bond issuance are set forth in the Comprehensive Financing Plan. Bonds issued under the Act will not constitute a debt, liability, or pledge of the faith and credit or the taxing power of the State, the Authority, or any other governmental unit.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: The Jail Industries Building (JIB) is located at 531 E Madison St, Baltimore, MD 21202. The building is a DGS owned facility that DPSCS operates within. With the building having been built in 1922, the building has had a number of issues for many years with the primary problem being that the building floods every time it rains. In March 2025, DGS asked for DPSCS to develop a plan to vacate all personnel from JIB by November 2025. DPSCS decided that the second floor of the REF building on 319 W. Monument Street (formerly the home of DPSCS's Community Treatment Re-Entry Facility) could be the new office space for JIB's staff but only after some significant renovations were completed.

Remarks (cont'd):

However, the situation only worsened over the summer and the conditions within JIB have threatened the health and safety of DPSCS's employees. JIB has faced electrical issues, elevator failures, and a total failure of the AC. The final straw was on July 10^{th} when an air quality test revealed high levels of asbestos, lead, and mold. At that point, staff was instructed to vacate the building immediately. The staff at JIB have been temporarily relocated to any available space DPSCS has in other facilities. The only staff that remains within JIB at the present moment is the K-9 Unit, which includes staff and police dogs. Until the REF building is ready, there is nowhere for the K-9 Unit to relocate in the Baltimore region that meets their requirements for response time.

Since the sudden evacuation in July, the timeline to rehab the REF building has been fast-tracked. DPSCS has executed several contracts (sole sources and small procurements) over the last month within our delegated authority to get the REF building rehabbed. This included procurements for the following services: moving services, paint services, services to plaster & sand walls, and services to repair and restore loose bricks. DPSCS is in need of a contractor to design and install several systems (HVAC & electrical) for the REF building and make some structural repairs. Due to the current unsafe state of the REF building, DPSCS cannot move the displaced JIB employees and most importantly, the K-9 Unit who still operates within JIB, into the building until the HVAC, electrical, and structural repairs are complete.

Basis for Selection: Thirty-six vendors were solicited and two site visits were scheduled. Only one vendor attended a site visit. The bid opening date was extended twice to provide more time for potential bidders to bid. Despite the Department's efforts, Maryland Mechanical, Inc. was the only vendor that submitted a bid.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: On August 21, 2025, the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) learned of a potential cybersecurity incident. Upon detecting the incident, which involved unauthorized access to certain MTA systems, the State of Maryland's cybersecurity teams at MTA and the Maryland Department of Information Technology (DoIT) immediately acted to investigate the nature and scope of the incident, to contain the threat, and to secure MTA systems. MTA systems have been negatively impacted by the incident which has compromised the main desktop computers in the office, which greatly affects the day-to-day operations. This emergency procurement will help with remote work in response to an urgent and unforeseen disruption in productivity and flexibility.

In accordance with COMAR 21.05.06.02(A), the procurement was limited to the scope necessary to address the emergency. MTA made an initial purchase of 25 HP Notebook laptops as a competitive small procurement under \$50,000 and purchased an additional 70 laptops on September 19, 2025. The incident is still being resolved, so the need to purchase additional laptops is a continuation of the existing emergency. As part of the next phase of system recovery to restore operations, additional laptops were identified as requiring replacement and is necessary to continue day-to-day MTA operations. MTA does not anticipate any additional laptops being purchased.

Basis for Selection: As the emergency conditions have not been resolved, and MTA needed additional laptops, the MTA determined that issuing an emergency modification would be permissible. MTA utilized the unit pricing received under contract EM-26-006-IT, the initial small procurement, and issued an emergency modification to add an additional 50 HP Notebook laptops.

In addition, eight firms were directly invited to participate, resulting in five (5) submitted proposals. All submissions were reviewed, and the Evaluation Committee shortlisted the top four ranked firms for further technical and financial evaluation. Only two firms progressed to the Best and Final Offers stage, as their proposals were deemed responsive to the service requirements, a determination that was reinforced by their financial submissions. Following this process, Liaison International emerged as the highest-ranked firm based on both technical merit and cost and is recommended for award as the most advantageous option for the University.

Although services in this sector are predominantly delivered in-house due to reliance on proprietary tools, a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation goal of 5% was established to foster inclusivity and encourage subcontracting opportunities. This target was designed to incentivize firms to identify and engage qualified MBE partners within their service offerings. Liaison requested a waiver from the 5% MBE goal and the University granted this waiver as the firm demonstrated good faith efforts to meet the goal. This documented effort included outreach to forty (40) MBEs via email, phone calls, and formal correspondence. The outreach focused on firms classified under NAICS code 32311 – Commercial Printing, Digital Printing, specifically targeting professional on-demand printing services. Despite these proactive measures, Liaison did not receive any responses from potential MBE subcontractors.

Although no additional funding is required, and the overall contract budget remains unchanged, the modification to a cost component of this contract is valued at \$96,000.00 and will be funded through the Extra Work Allowance currently on the contract.

Promobot Corp provides scheduled preventive maintenance (cleaning, calibration, component inspection), replacement of worn-out parts (e.g., belts, sensors, actuators), emergency repairs or on-site service visits, battery health checks and replacements, firmware and controller updates, hardware diagnostics, and troubleshooting for the Promobot Robots at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport.

MAA has determined that after five years of operational usage the Promobots' most effective role is for targeted single-unit deployment. The two customer service robots will be strategically positioned on the arrivals/baggage claim level of BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport. They provide multi-lingual wayfinding in five different languages and answer frequently asked questions to enhance customer service for patrons utilizing the airport's public parking services, facilities, and other amenities in the terminal, without the need for direct human-to-human contact. Based on these findings, MAA is refining the annual maintenance contract to cover two units instead of the current six units. This strategic adjustment will transition the robot program to a more efficient and resilient state with the following clear benefits: Reliability - establishes a formal primary/backup system, ensuring a fully operational robot is always available for public engagement and eliminating downtime risk. Requesting Agency Remarks: On June 5, 2024, the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) advertised a solicitation in The Daily Record and on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). The solicitation sought to award one Certified Small Business contract valued at \$2 million for operational asset management and support services. A total of 124 firms were notified through eMMA, with 89 receiving direct solicitations. MDTA received six technical proposals; however, one firm later withdrew, leaving five proposals for evaluation.

MDTA followed a qualifications-based selection process and ultimately identified one consultant as eligible for contract award. No protests were filed.

The scope of services includes the design, review, evaluation, and analysis of traffic control devices, as well as the design and analysis of ancillary structures such as sign supports, foundations, and other related elements. Services also encompass geotechnical investigations, utility identification, and the analysis and design of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and electrical systems. Additional services include roadway design and analysis, roadside hardware evaluation and design, pavement assessments, and the evaluation, analysis, and design of roadway and sign lighting. The scope further includes asset management and program support—such as asset inventories, condition inspections, and data management. Support will also be provided in the development and review of Maintenance of Traffic plans and Temporary Traffic Control typical applications. Other services involve traffic data collection and analysis, travel demand modeling and forecasting, traffic safety studies, transportation management plans related to specific projects and programs, cost estimating, and assistance to MDTA with overall project and program management.

The MDTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the scope of work to assess the potential for Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) participation. Eighteen technical proposals were received. Fifteen proposals were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award and the offerors responsible. Three proposals were rejected because the offerors failed to meet the minimum qualifications. There will be secondary competition among the prequalified master contractors within each region for each project. The evaluation process included the firm's qualifications and responsibilities as demonstrated by providing three references from the past five years that were able to attest to its experience providing HVAC/Boiler services for a commercial portfolio of work and valued at \$100,000 minimum for individual projects.

An evaluation of Marian House, Incorporated's (Marian House) technical proposal was conducted and based on the standard criteria set forth in the RFP, no substantial weaknesses were found; therefore, it was deemed acceptable and reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Marian House's technical proposal demonstrated that the offeror has the proper experience, strong intake and assessment processes, and robust support services. An award is recommended to Marian House as having the most advantageous offer for the State.

Upon award, Marian House will provide Transitional Housing and support services such as counseling, education, employment training and addiction recovery. In addition, essential needs such as meals, hygiene products and transportation are met. The primary goal is to support women, under the supervision of the Division of Parole and Probation, in achieving a drug-free, independent, and law-abiding lifestyle.

The Department has determined that the price offered is fair and reasonable for the services to be provided, based on historic pricing. The incumbent contract awarded in 2019 had a value of \$1,946,745. After applying the rate of inflation using the Consumer Price Index (CPI), the 2019 incumbent contract would be worth \$2,505,636 today which is more than the value of the new contract.

The official MBE participation goal established for this contract is 22%. The goal included MBE sub goals of 2% for Hispanic Americans, 3% for Asian Americans, and 10% for Women. Marian House requested and was granted a full waiver for the individual sub goals and has voluntarily committed to an overall 23% MBE participation goal.

The VSBE participation that had been established for this contract was 0.5%. Marian House requested and was granted a full waiver for the entire VSBE participation goal.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Board of Physicians contracts with the Center for a Healthy Maryland, Inc. (CFHM) to provide rehabilitation services to impaired practitioners, ensuring they can safely practice and deliver care. CFHM monitors and treats licensees referred by the Board and reports their progress to confirm fitness to practice.

Per Maryland Annotated Code, Health Occupations Article §14-401.1(g), the Board must contract with a nonprofit to deliver these services. In compliance, the Board entered into contract #21-18481 with CFHM, effective 01/01/2021 through 12/31/2025, to support practitioners with behavioral, cognitive, or physical impairments who pose a public safety risk.

A new procurement is underway for a new contract award recommendation to be submitted to the BPW for a new contract start date of January 1, 2027. The modification is needed to complete the new procurement for these services.

The Board and CFHM agreed to extend the current contract through December 31, 2026 with revised rates. This modification reflects revised participant rates and a reduced quarterly participation cap that does not exceed the current contract amount. The modification perparticipant price will increase by 48% (down from a proposed 50%), and the participant cap will decrease from 75 to 68. Historical data shows quarterly participation has not exceeded 57 since 2021.CFHM justified the increase based on rising case complexity, inflation, staffing costs, and insurance expenses. The Board supports the adjustment, recognizing that costs have significantly risen since CFHM's 2020 proposal. The Board values CFHM's performance and considers the extension critical to maintaining public safety and compliance with state law.

The \$3,000,000 amount was a not-to-exceed (NTE) amount for the entire contract term. The NTE has not been completely utilized and has enough funding remaining to cover the one-year extension period for this modification based on the new pre-participant rates and the participant caption maximum. Therefore, the modification amount is zero dollars.

Based on research, it was determined that there were no MBEs or other potential vendors that could provide rehabilitation and behavioral monitoring services for health care professionals. Keywords used were "rehabilitation, monitoring, physician, and physician monitoring." There were vendors listed for rehabilitation services; however, none of them provided rehabilitation and behavioral monitoring services specifically for health care professionals. Therefore, no MBE participation goal was established for this contract.

The GL module serves as the foundation of CDA's accounting and reporting framework. It consolidates financial data from all operational modules, supports compliance with state accounting standards, and enables timely reconciliations and financial reporting. The integration between the GL and related modules — particularly Debt Service, Cash Management, and Investment — ensures that transactions flow automatically and accurately, eliminating manual entries and reducing the potential for errors. The Debt Service module allows CDA to monitor bond obligations, manage payment schedules, and ensure timely debt service reporting. The Cash Management module supports monthly reconciliation and tracking of cash activity. The Investment module tracks and reports investment activity ensuring accurate reflection in the General Ledger.

In fiscal year 1985, DHCD competitively procured the AOD system. Since then, DHCD has contracted with the owners of AOD for additional enhancements and system modules; maintenance; training; and customizations. The contractor provides routine patches and upgrades for all users. Technical support must be provided by qualified technicians who have expertise with the software. Their pricing submission complied fully with RFP instructions, and they committed to a 10% MBE participation with Applied Technology Services (ATS), a Maryland-based, woman-owned MBE with proven positive performance on prior SBE projects.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department of Information Technology (DoIT) requires the renewal of the Socrata Connected Government Cloud (SCGC) manufacturer's annual software maintenance and platform subscription to support the State of Maryland's Open Data initiatives. This subscription is critical to maintaining and advancing the statutorily mandated Open Data program, ensuring continued public access to government data, and enhancing internal data governance and management capabilities across state agencies.

The SCGC platform aligns with and supports the State's obligations under the Maryland Open Data Act (State Government Article, Chapter 69, Section 10-1501 through 10-1504), enabling the secure publication, management, and sharing of government data with both internal stakeholders and the public. It also ensures the technical compliance and continuity of the Open Data portal infrastructure, which is essential to DoIT's strategic data initiatives.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Due to the proprietary nature of the Socrata Connected Government Cloud platform, which is owned and exclusively maintained by Tyler Technologies, Inc., Tyler Technologies is the sole provider and only authorized source of licensing, technical support, and subscription services for the Socrata software. There are no authorized resellers for the SCGC platform or the associated maintenance and upgrade services required for this procurement. As such, the software and its support services cannot be competitively procured from any other source.

To determine price reasonableness for this Sole Source procurement, DoIT compared the proposed FY26 pricing to the previous fiscal year's contract. In FY25, Tyler Technologies was awarded \$248,063 for a 9-month term supporting 500 users, equating to approximately \$27,562.56 per month or \$55.13 per user per month. The FY26 proposal totals \$396,000 for a 12-month term supporting 800 users, or \$33,000 per month and \$41.25 per user per month. Although the total contract value represents a 59.64% increase, this aligns with a 60% increase in users and a longer contract term. Furthermore, the FY26 subscription includes an upgrade to the Tier 3 platform which introduces enhanced capabilities beyond those provided under the prior agreement. Notably, the per-user cost has decreased by approximately 25%. Based on these factors, the proposed pricing is deemed fair and reasonable.

This contract is retroactive because the GIS Software as a Service (SaaS) Master Contract was approaching expiration and was subsequently extended through June 30, 2026. During the transition period, the associated Sole Source Award action was inadvertently delayed, resulting in the need for retroactive approval to ensure continuity of services under the extended Master Contract.. DoIT is working to prevent retroactive activities in the future by developing a contract database that notifies the department of upcoming contract due dates.

MBE / VSBE participation goals were not established for this contract because no subcontracting opportunities are available.

DGS OSP Remarks: RETROACTIVE approval requested pursuant to § 11-204(c) State Finance & Procurement Article. DGS-OSP requests that the BPW determine this void contract to be voidable, based on DGS-OSP's opinion that: (1) all parties have acted in good faith; (2) ratification for the procurement contract would not undermine the purposes of the Procurement Law; and (3) the violation, or series of violations, was insignificant or otherwise did not prevent substantial compliance with the Procurement Law.

Approval of this time extension is being requested in accordance with Finance and Procurement Article 8-128 (c) which states "Except to the extent that money authorized by an enabling act for a State project or program has been encumbered by the Board, authorization of State debt shall automatically terminate 7 years after the date of the authorization unless, ... in an emergency, the Board unanimously grants a temporary exception for 1 year". Work for this \$95,792,138 construction contract at the Pratt Library was substantially completed in 2019, and the facility is in use. To move from substantially complete to complete, however, a punch list of corrective work items needs to be completed, and \$62,000 of this work remains.

Additionally, and as identified in 2019, there are moisture infiltration issues with the building envelope, if left untreated, it will cause damage to the completed work and render portions of the building unusable. The exact cause of the moisture problem has not been specifically identified, so exploratory work to determine the root cause and corrective action is required to solve this problem. An allowance of \$300,000 is required to address the problem correctly, and any unused funds will be reverted back in 2026. While this required additional work is out of the original scope of work for the construction contract, it is essential for continued use of the facility. Use of these funds will be administered as a construction change order(s) over the next year and will only be used for this specific issue.

Due to the highly specialized nature of the services under the contract and because the majority of costs are for specialized personnel who are certified in cancer record coding, the ability to subcontract work is limited, and no MBE or VSBE participation was established. However, the single proposal vendor selected is an MBE (certification #15-366665).

On November 14, 2024, a notice announcing the availability of the Request for Proposal (RFP) was published on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). In addition, the solicitation was directly sent to eighteen (18) prospective vendors. A total of two (2) proposals were received in response.

Following its review, the Evaluation Committee determined that one (1) proposal was not reasonably susceptible for award and rated the technical proposal as *Unsatisfactory*. The proposal lacked adequate risk-mitigation strategies, failed to clearly outline secure migration procedures, and did not sufficiently demonstrate compliance with security and privacy standards or the ability to protect sensitive data. In addition, the Offeror declined to submit the required SOC 2 report, opting instead to provide a heavily redacted alternative assessment that the Committee was unable to properly evaluate.

The remaining Offeror, Myriddian, LLC, also the incumbent Contractor, was deemed reasonably susceptible for award based on the evaluation of proposals.

The proposed pricing was evaluated against historical contract data to determine fairness and The annual cost over the five-year term ranges from \$1,275,525.27 to reasonableness. \$1,327,576.93, which is lower than the \$1,370,291 currently being paid by the Maryland Cancer Registry for the same services in Fiscal Year 2025. Myriddan LLC has reduced its rates annual by at least 3.12%. Based on a comparison of historical rates offered to the State of Maryland, it has been determined that the pricing is fair and reasonable.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This is an Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement (ICPA) procurement through OMNIA Partners' Information Technology Solutions Products and Services Contract # 2024056-02 for the purchase of Tetrus CareLink. SHI International Corp. (SHI) was selected for this procurement as SHI is the only public sector distributor for Tetrus CareLink. OMNIA Partners awarded their Cooperative Contract to SHI as the result of a competitive bid process conducted by the State of Utah which selected SHI as the only provider of software products to eligible entities. SHI is also the only public sector distributor for Tetrus Carelink and the necessary integration services.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Maryland Department of Human Services has engaged with SHI International Corp. and Tetrus Corp. to design, develop and implement the Tetrus CareLink solution. Every state has a number of children in their foster care system. Many of these children have complex traumatic histories leading to more intensive physical and behavioral health care and psychosocial service needs. These vulnerable children often see several different healthcare providers within human service agencies or in the community. The State of Maryland has similar situations for foster care children residing in Maryland.

In Maryland, when a foster care child is placed in the custody of foster parents, sometimes the foster parents do not have access to the child's medical history. When a foster care child is taken to the hospital for a healthcare visit, the Child Welfare Case system needs to be able to send an alert to the healthcare facility to inform the healthcare providers that the child is a ward of the State. In addition, there is a need for informed consent between the parents (biological/foster care), child (if not a minor), and the keeper of the child's data for the data to be seen by a provider as well as consent either by the Case Worker or the parents (biological/foster care) for any procedure the child may require.

Department of Human Services and SHI with Tetrus are proposing to utilize the CareLink solution to meet the needs of Maryland described above.

Background:

There was no Minority Business Enterprise goal for this procurement and no Veteran Owned Small Business Enterprise goal.

From a cost perspective, the MSRP for the CareLink software licensing is \$75,000 per year. The software license pricing for Tetrus CareLink on the OMNIA Partners' Information Technology Solutions Products and Services Contract is \$69,440. Also, the standard labor rate for Tetrus' hourly services is \$175.00 per hour. Through the ICPA, the hourly service rate is \$155.00 per hour which is below Tetrus' standard rate.

DHS compared the pricing, features, and architecture provided by Tetrus and CORDATA and in accordance with COMAR 21.05.09.04 determined that the use of this Inter-governmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement provides a viable process for the State to acquire CareLink.
