Wetlands Licenses

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board grant a license for projects involving filling and dredging in the navigable waters of Maryland.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY

24-0723 *YOLANDE LYNCH*- To stabilize an eroding shoreline by constructing a living shoreline consisting of marsh edging, a hooked groin, and a stone sill, and enhancing existing marsh by excavating *Phragmites* via mechanical means and planting high and low marsh vegetation over sand fill.

Shady Side, Chesapeake Bay

Special conditions: Requirements for marsh establishment area, signing and acceptance of marsh maintenance plan, constructing vents, excavated material disposal, and planting the excavated Phragmites area with native vegetation.

***Wetlands License -- #24-0635 – Ferry Cove Project, LLC
Mitigation***

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board:

1. Grant a tidal wetlands license to construct a boat ramp, and
2. Require mitigation for impacts to submerged aquatic vegetation (SAV) by expanding an existing oyster reef.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with the recommendations.

Mitigation: Constructing a boat ramp will result in permanent impacts to 272 square feet of SAV. MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the 272 square feet of impact to SAV at a 6:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by constructing 1,632 square feet of oyster reef that will be planted with oyster spat.

272 square feet of impact x 6 (6:1 ratio) = 1,632 square feet of required mitigation

TALBOT COUNTY

24-0635 ***FERRY COVE PROJECT, LLC*** – To provide water access for harvesting oysters by constructing a boat ramp.

Special conditions: Time of year restriction. Requirements for constructing and maintaining a cofferdam or similar containment structure, maintaining and monitoring the mitigation site, and mitigation project compliance with specific plans.

*Maryland Historical Trust
Maryland Maritime Archaeology Program*

Recommendation: The Maryland Historical Trust recommends that the Board of Public Works approve the activities of the Maryland Maritime Archaeology Program as proposed for the 2025 field season. This Item also summarizes the Program's 2024 activities.

Authority: Sections 5A-333–5A-346, State Finance & Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland

Background: The Submerged Archaeological Historic Property Act established the Maryland Maritime Archaeology Program (MMAP) within the Maryland Historical Trust. This Act charges the Trust with identifying and managing the State's submerged archaeological sites. Under the Act, anyone seeking to excavate or disturb submerged archaeological sites on State lands must obtain a permit from the Trust. The law specifically exempts the Trust from the permit requirement. Instead, the Trust must obtain Board of Public Works approval before undertaking any activity that would otherwise require a permit. In 2025, the Trust proposes to carry out activities that require Board approval.

PROPOSED 2025 ACTIVITIES REQUIRING BOARD APPROVAL

The 2025 MMAP field season will include survey of known sites as well as work in new areas around the State. This work may include activities involving limited ground disturbance which requires archaeological permits from the Trust or Board of Public Works approval. These activities include recovering artifacts to help determine site age, and probing, testing, or sampling to determine the site size and integrity. Trust staff will conserve and analyze any recovered materials and write a report. All work and participation of volunteers and interns are dependent on staff availability, funding, training, and necessary health and safety considerations.

Mallows Bay (Charles County)

MMAP will continue to partner with Charles County, DNR, and NOAA, as well as the Sanctuary Advisory Council on education and outreach programs as well as the management of the historic vessels and cultural resources in the Mallows Bay-Widewater Historical and Archaeological National Register District, now also the Mallows Bay-Potomac River National Marine Sanctuary. MMAP will provide guidance and oversight for graduate students conducting research in the sanctuary; at present one is from East Carolina University, and one is from Texas A&M University.

U-1105 Historic Shipwreck Preserve (St. Mary's County)

MMAP will continue to support ongoing research and condition assessment of U-1105 undertaken by the non-profit organization Battle of the Atlantic Research and Expedition Group. Support in 2025 is expected to include MMAP staff-lead archaeological training activities.

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12. DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING (*cont'd*)

Patuxent River and Buzzard Island Creek (Calvert County)

MMAP plans to inspect a number of anomalies identified by NOAA's Office of Coast Survey in Patuxent River which may represent archaeological resources and continue its documentation and monitoring of a log-built vessel discovered in 2020 which exhibits rare and possibly unique construction details.

Chester River (Kent County)

MMAP has chosen a stretch of the Chester River where 7000-year-old artifacts have been recovered by watermen from what are believed to be intact, submerged, and buried archaeological sites to initiate a study which combines archaeological and geological desktop research with data collection using a parametric sub-bottom profiler, side scan sonar, and subsurface sampling. This study will employ various data collection and analysis techniques related to paleo landscape reconstruction to assist in the assessment of potential for the preservation of submerged and buried archaeological sites which were inundated during creation of Chesapeake Bay. This initial effort, originally scheduled for 2024, will include instrument testing and preliminary data collection necessary to develop a more extensive research plan. Work was postponed until 2025 because of the late delivery of equipment needed for this project which was not received until October 2024.

Diverse field investigations (Various Counties)

MMAP will continue to provide lectures, courses, field activities, and other educational programming related to maritime archaeology virtually and/or in person. Staff will continue to provide hands-on experiences in site recording methods and remote sensing to volunteers, interns, and members of non-profit volunteer organizations which work in Maryland. Site recording and remote sensing experiences include fieldwork that does not require ground disturbance, artifact recovery, sampling, or probing.

MMAP will continue to conduct site inspections as needed to assist with review of projects in accordance with state and federal historic preservation laws. These will be undertaken while observing all practices necessary for health and safety.

MMAP will continue to facilitate the updating of the U.S. Coast Guard and EPA Emergency Response Area Contingency Plan, MMAP reviews and evaluates shoreline and submerged archaeological historic properties to prioritize protection and response strategies.

MMAP will continue to participate in and provide guidance to state and federal agencies, such as the Department of Natural Resources regarding aquaculture and development in Maryland waters; the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management on issues related to offshore wind energy development; the Department of Homeland Security's Maritime Security Committee; and the Maryland and Potomac Area Contingency Planning Committee. These activities may require limited field investigations.

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12. DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING (cont'd)

SYNOPSIS OF THE 2024 FIELD SEASON

The 2024 MMAF field season was impacted by ongoing supply chain disruptions in obtaining equipment.

U-1105 Historic Shipwreck Preserve (St. Mary's County)

MMAF continued to support fieldwork related to ongoing research and condition assessment of U-1105 undertaken by the non-profit organization Battle of the Atlantic Research and Expedition Group (BAREG). Support in 2024 included MMAF staff-lead archaeological training activities and guidance related to inspection and sampling which will benefit all the agencies managing this Preserve.

Mallows Bay (Charles County)

MMAF continued to partner with Charles County, DNR, and NOAA, as well as the Sanctuary Advisory Council on education and outreach programs as well as the management of the historic vessels and cultural resources in the Mallows Bay-Widewater Historical and Archaeological National Register District, now also the Mallows Bay-Potomac River National Marine Sanctuary. MMAF continued to facilitate research by a master's student and a doctoral student from East Carolina University, and a doctoral student from Texas A&M University.

Patuxent River and Buzzard Island Creek (Calvert County)

MMAF was notified that a Chesapeake Bay log canoe which was discovered submerged and embedded in Patuxent River during 2020 had been removed from the river in June 2023 and was in danger of rapid deterioration. MMAF staff redirected its field efforts originally planned for August and October 2023 to begin documenting its construction which was found to exhibit rare and possibly unique construction details. Documentation was completed in 2024 of additional vessel parts recovered from Buzzard Creek.

Curtis Bay and Curtis Creek (Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County)

(Postponed due to staff availability)

MMAF will undertake the recording and documentation of the historic vessels located in several loci within Curtis Bay and Curtis Creek.

Upper Potomac River (Allegany, Washington, and Frederick Counties)

(Postponed due to staff availability)

MMAF will initiate a multi-year study to relocate previously recorded native and colonial fish traps and fish weirs to assess their condition, as well as to survey for undocumented traps and weirs noted in historic documents, from aerial survey or reported but not recorded officially. Survey for the remains of other historic structures in these areas will also be included.

SYNOPSIS OF THE 2024 FIELD SEASON (cont'd)

Diverse field investigations (Various Counties)

Staff provided and organized various lectures on maritime archaeology, and hands-on experiences in site recording methods for students, volunteers, interns, and members of non-profit volunteer organizations. Some of these activities involved fieldwork, but none required ground disturbance, artifact recovery, sampling, or probing.

MMAP continued to conduct site inspections when needed to assist with review of projects in accordance with state and federal historic preservation laws. Staff reviewed 775 projects in 2024 which included activities with potential to impact submerged archaeological sites, few required site inspections and no sampling, testing, or excavation was conducted.

MMAP continued to facilitate the updating of the U.S. Coast Guard and EPA Emergency Response Area Contingency Plan and partnered with the Dept. of Interior to develop a Regional Unanticipated Discoveries Plan and a cultural resources Job Aid for responders. MMAP reviews and evaluates shoreline and submerged archaeological historic properties to prioritize protection and response strategies.

MMAP continued to participate in and provide guidance to state and federal agencies, such as the Department of Natural Resources regarding aquaculture and development in Maryland waters; the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management on issues related to offshore wind energy development; with the Department of Homeland Security's Maritime Security Committee; and the Maryland and Potomac Area Contingency Planning Committee.

14. MARYLAND STADIUM AUTHORITY

Football Stadium – MOA Regarding Funding for Capital Works

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve a Memorandum of Agreement related to funding for Capital Works Projects at the football stadium at Camden Yards Sports Complex by and between the Maryland Stadium Authority and the Baltimore Ravens Limited Partnership.

Background: On January 4, 2023, the Maryland Stadium Authority (“MSA”) and the Baltimore Ravens Limited Partnership (the “Team”) entered into an Agreement Relating to Football Stadium at Camden Yards Sports Complex (the “Agreement”) extending the Team’s tenancy at the football stadium (the “Stadium”) for an additional 15 years. See Secretary’s Agenda, Item 18 (1/4/2023). The Agreement identified certain capital works projects (the “Initial Projects”) to be undertaken at the Stadium, and which MSA and the Team agreed would be funded by proceeds of bonds to be issued by MSA.

In July 2023, MSA issued a two series of bonds (the “2023 Bonds”). The proceeds of the 2023 Bond were used to fund certain obligations MSA had under the Agreement with respect to initial funding of an emergency reserve fund and a capital works fund, and to pay the costs of select Initial Projects. See Secretary’s Agenda, Item 12 (5/17/2023). A confluence of several factors, including increased construction costs, design modifications, and changes to the project schedules (moving up the desired completion date of certain projects) has resulted in a funding shortage of \$55 million over and above what is available from the 2023 Bonds. Because of limitations on available funds for debt service, MSA cannot issue more bonds or incur additional debt for the Stadium until June 2026.

In order to maintain the current desired schedule of Initial Projects, as amended and modified by the mutual agreement of MSA and the Team, the Team has agreed to make a financial commitment that combines up to \$20 million in Team funds with no expectation of reimbursement from MSA or the State, and \$35 million of Team funds with the possibility of reimbursement from bonds MSA expects to issue in 2026.

An investigation was conducted to find the root cause of the failure which revealed multiple leaks in the system. JCI maintenance personnel have implemented temporary repairs to restore heat in the immediate-term, but these fixes are considered short-term solutions and are not expected to hold up under the strain of the significantly colder temperatures predicted in the near future.

It is likely that the heating system will fail again under the strain of these colder temperatures, leaving the affected areas without heat. This work is time sensitive and without this service, there will be no heat provided to these areas until the steam system is repaired and heat is restored. Additionally, not addressing the matter could leave the Department and State open to litigation from incarcerated individuals or their families.

Basis for Selection: To remain competitive, emergency calls for quotes were made to two vendors; JPG Plumbing and Mechanical Inc. (JPG) and Caribbean Piping and Welding (Caribbean). Both vendors are known for responding promptly to facility maintenance requests, are familiar with DPSCS facilities and security protocols, and have successfully completed similar work in the past. JPG was selected due to their immediate availability to assess the site and commence work. Caribbean did not have the workforce at the time to respond in a timely manner

It was necessary to address this issue immediately in order to prevent the spread of mold spores through the facility and into units housing IIs.

Basis for Selection: To remain competitive, emergency calls were made to two vendors; JPG Plumbing and Mechanical Inc. (JPG) and Maryland Mechanical Systems, Inc. (MD Mechanical). Both vendors are known for responding promptly to facility maintenance requests, are familiar with DPSCS facilities and security protocols, and have successfully completed similar work in the past. MD Mechanical was selected due to their immediate availability to assess the site and commence work. JPG, however, did not have the necessary trained staff and equipment readily available to locate and repair leaking steam traps.

A separate contract was awarded for the professional services required to implement with the AssetWorks solution. The contract was awarded in the amount of \$959,350 for the professional service fees. The awards for the software and the services were made within the University's delegated authority; however, the University is now seeking the approval of the Board of Public Works to add additional service hours that were unanticipated at the time of initial contract award. This is due to the following:

- At contract onset, the AssetWorks software implementation was timed in alignment with the original Workday launch schedule due to the need for HR, Finance, Procurement, and Billing feeds anticipated between these two systems. When the Workday implementation was delayed, the project team determined it was necessary to plan for integration with UMD's legacy systems. The AssetWorks implementation later faced a delay necessitating a return to the original plan aligning the implementation to occur after the revised Workday implementation date of November 15, 2024. Additional costs were incurred because AssetWorks performed work for both legacy and future systems which was not originally anticipated
- Since the original contract award, additional campus facilities partners have joined the effort, such as Public Safety, which added scope to the project.
- The project has added project scope including drawing services, custom interfaces, and custom reporting that were not planned for as part of the original contract but have since been determined to be necessary.
- Facilities organizations on campus have recognized a need for an alternative implementation for a project management tool: the revised and updated implementation during phase 1 will allow UMD to meet the needs of small projects and operations and maintenance (O&M) upgrades. This alternative scope is included in this modification.

- Documenting existing business processes and crafting new business processes required more time than originally expected. The time commitment has been considerable as each Facility Organization had different processes. An enterprise-wide solution required that 6 departments standardize their different processes for a wide variety of facilities related activities, impacting the work of more than 1,000 people. This has been a substantial lift and is expected to lead to greater efficiency and consistency in the treatment of facilities and equipment across the institution. Completion of this work was necessary for configuring the AssetWorks solution for use by campus facilities staff.

The conditions to negotiate and prepare the required contract documents further delayed the proper commencement of the contract term. This retroactive contract seeks to correct the TSA's and Contractor's unintentional circumventing of commercial activity requirements at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport. The contractor currently has a Lease and Concession Contract granting it the non-exclusive right to manage and operate a Registered Traveler Passenger Program at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport (Contract No. MAA-LC-20-062, Approved Item 1-GM, April 1, 2020) but the contract did not include the TSA program. Under that Contract, Contractor provides expedited security screening to its customers using enrollment areas and dedicated lanes at each security checkpoint and MAA collects 11% of gross revenue from this activity.

Pursuant to the TSA Modernization Act, part of H. R. 302, the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018, the TSA is required to enter into an agreement(s) to increase the methods and capabilities available to the public to enroll in the popular TSA PreCheck™ program. TSA has entered into an agreement with the Contractor to satisfy this requirement at all airports served by TSA, including BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport.

Contractor identified enrollment locations and developed its TSA PreCheck™ enrollment system at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport. TSA is required to review the system to ensure it meets the latest cybersecurity requirements before Contractor can enroll customers.

TSA PreCheck™ is an expedited screening program that enables low-risk travelers to enjoy an expedited and efficient screening experience at more than 200 U.S. airports and with 73 airlines. For TSA PreCheck™ travelers, there is no need to remove shoes, laptops, 3-1-1 liquids, belts or light jackets.

This type of revenue-producing contract at a transportation facility is outside the scope of the State Procurement Law (State Finance and Procurement Article §11-202(3); COMAR 21.01.03.03.B(1)(d). However, the Contract and any modifications must be approved by the Board of Public Works because the Contract constitutes a use of State Property under State Finance and Procurement Article, §10-305.

GSH's labor rate renewal pricing was found to be 5% less than the No. 2 overall ranked Offeror. Based on the price analysis conducted, the Maryland Aviation Administration determined the renewal price to be fair and reasonable.

The Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and Veteran Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) goals, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. An MBE participation goal of 21% was established for this contract. No VSBE goal was set due to a lack of certified firms to perform these services. Although a 21% MBE participation goal was established, the contractor is at a 22.70% attainment. An eMMA search yielded an insufficient number of certified small businesses.

Block A, located at 2323 Eastern Boulevard, Middle River, Baltimore County, Maryland consists of 12.06 acres of land along with a 141,000 square foot office building and is zoned Manufacturing Heavy (MH) and Industrial Major (IM). Block D, Chesapeake Park, Wilson Point Road, Middle River, Maryland consists of 11.775 acres and is zoned MH, IM, and RC-8 (Environmental Enhancement).

Ownership of these parcels will allow the MAA to relocate airport tenants and equipment which do not require airfield access, freeing up scarce airport property for more traditional aeronautical-use tenants and businesses. Additionally, secondary opportunities exist for the use of portions of Block D for compensatory environmental mitigation within the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area.

Amount: Contractor shall pay a \$1.00 annual rental fee and a percentage concession fee of 10% of net revenues during the Operational Period if net revenues are greater than \$1 million, 12.5% if greater than \$2 million and 15% if greater than \$3 million.

Procurement Method: Exclusive Lease and Concession Contract

Requesting Agency Remarks: This contract grants exclusive rights to operate approximately 25 acres of land and 141,323 square feet of building through Primary Uses (exhibition of Maryland historical aircraft, education, fundraising, management and administration) and Ancillary Uses (retail sale of food, and gifts, subleasing of space and other commercial uses. The Contractor currently operates and maintains approximately 1,528 square feet of office/museum space and 49,000 square feet of aircraft exhibition space at Martin State Airport under Contract No. MAA-LC-94-022, approved Item MDOT 14-L October 13, 1983. This contract promotes and preserves the aviation and aerospace history in the State of Maryland.

MDOT has made the recommendation to the BPW for the land and facilities (Block A and Block D) to be transferred to MAA under MDOT 5-RP.

Pending BPW approval, the Contractor will vacate Martin State Airport and occupy this space as its permanent location. The Contractor currently occupies 63,207 square feet at Martin State. Upon vacating this space, the space will be able to use for revenue generation activities.

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The current occupied space includes 1,200 square feet for the Museum, 1,600 square feet for the gallery, 2,407 square feet for archives and 58,000 square feet for aircraft storage at Strawberry Point.

Relocating the museum and leasing the space to the Contractor, will provide a multitude of benefits to the MAA and the state of Maryland. First, the lease will relieve MAA of all financial burden of this property and ultimately provide shelter for the historical aircraft. The museum will be a place to provide a celebration of Maryland's contribution to aerospace and provide an educational opportunity for tourists. Most importantly, the museum's primary goal is to inspire students to enter Aviation careers. The Contractor has partnered with the Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC). CCBC will oversee and administer all education programming associated with the College's existing Aviation Program.

The Contractor's vision of the facility is as follows

- Basement – storage of priceless documents and conference rooms
- First Floor – events area, auditorium, conference rooms, eatery and office space
- Second Floor – library/research center, gift shop, Maryland Aerospace Hall of Fame, Glenn L. Martin Gallery and Maryland Aviation Gallery
- Third Floor – STEM learning center
- Fourth Floor – CCBC and/or other aviation school programs
- Fifth Floor – offices for museum and other leases as needed.

The Contractor anticipates an additional 500,000 tourists a year based on the Seattle's Museum of Flight which hosts 750,000 visitors a year. The Contractor's facility would be much larger than Seattle's. The tourism would provide an economic impact to Maryland and reshape the Middle River community to a cultural destination.

The Contractor plans to erect a 50,000 square foot hangar to house the aircraft collection and it will be connected to the main building.

Additionally, the state of Maryland and Baltimore County have committed grants to support the Contractor's mission and development of the museum.

The Contractor provided a 10-year profit & loss statement. It is estimated that in year one the income generated will total \$3.5 million annually (\$1.9 million from entrance fees, membership donations, grants and fundraising, \$1.1 million in rental income and \$500 thousand from gift shop sales). Operating expenses are expected to total \$2.0 million annually.

The Contractor plans to expand its endowment by setting aside \$300,000 per year for the next 10 years to create a \$3 million fund for operational costs and protection from economic variables.

The Contractor is responsible for all capital improvements and operational expenses included utilities.

BI Incorporated specializes in tailored offender monitoring solutions, including electronic monitoring, GPS tracking, and alcohol detection, and has a proven track record of reliable service across the nation.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Utilizing this contract for electronic monitoring provides significant time and cost efficiencies by avoiding the transition expenses associated with switching to a new provider. Changing providers would require replacing existing equipment and could lead to operational delays, increased costs for staff training, and equipment compatibility issues. Such disruptions could jeopardize public safety by causing interruptions in monitoring and confusing offenders with new protocols. Offenders are already accustomed to the current system and may struggle to comply with unfamiliar tools, potentially leading to noncompliance or tampering with devices. Maintaining the existing system ensures consistent and reliable monitoring, which is essential for community safety.

BI Incorporated's pricing under the OMNIA agreement offers significant cost savings compared to the current contract. Key highlights include a \$0.75 reduction in daily rates for GPS devices and services, 22.7% decrease, and a \$1.59 reduction for Radio Frequency (RF) devices and services (38.4% decrease). The agreement also provides unlimited coverage for lost and damaged equipment, resulting in potential savings of \$90 to \$800 for RF items and \$185 to \$800 for GPS items. Agencies can maintain three spare units for every ten active units at no extra charge, improving upon the NASPO policy. Overall, BI Incorporated's rates are competitive and include all necessary hardware, software, and services, reducing the risk of unexpected costs.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on March 1, 2024. A total of 2,192 potential vendors were notified of the solicitation.

Seven proposals were received and three were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected. Four were determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award because. One proposal arrived after the deadline, one proposal did not complete the required MBE forms, one offeror did not provide relevant financial documentation, and one was rejected after their oral presentation showed deficiencies. The recommended offeror Attain Consulting Group LLC was determined to be most advantageous to the State as its proposal was both ranked highest technically and was lowest in price.

Attain Consulting Group LLC exhibited exceptional clarity in their proposal and oral presentation. Their solution builds around the Regent product suite. These pre-built features address over 65 percent of the required Maryland Student Information System (MDSIS) functionality out of the box. Building upon tested product components reduces development time, cost, and risk. The remaining required functionality is custom-configured for the non-core portals. As a result, MHEC receives a fully functional, secure, scalable, and feature-rich MDSIS closed-based application that transforms the user experience. The system will offer the State the lowest risk and a higher-value solution.

Two bid protests were filed, one on Friday October 11, 2024, alleging arbitrary and capricious, and was in violation of Maryland Law, the RFP, MHEC rules. MHEC denied the protest on November 1, 2024. The other protest was filed on November 6, 2024, alleging unrealistic timeline. MHEC denied the proposal on November 22, 2024. The vendor filed an appeal with the MSBCA on December 2, 2024. MSBCA granted the Motion to Dismiss on February 5, 2025. The Motion was granted with prejudice.

The current infrastructure of MHEC's existing Maryland College Aid Processing System (MDCAPS) is no longer adaptable to new technologies. The legacy system is over 10 years old and is beyond its design capacity to take on new advanced technology features. MHEC requires a financial aid management system that is flexible, extensible, scalable, accessible, and secure to deliver a modern user experience where students and other customers can self-serve. A newly developed customized management tool, MDSIS, for OSFA staff is necessary for faster and quicker results to improve services to customers.

Although DoIT reported on the original CATS+ BPW agenda item (DOIT 3-IT, 04/03/2013) that it had set a 20% MBE participation goal for CATS+ it noted, "This MBE participation goal is only an overall goal for this contract. Each agency will be evaluating each individual TORFP or RFR to maximize opportunities for MBE participation." Some task orders, depending on the subcontracting opportunities available, had an MBE goal greater than 20%, some less, and some that had no goal at all. Heritage has 50 years of experience in the booth-building industry and maintains a regional office in Landover, Maryland. Due to the exclusive contractual relationship between SelectUSA Summit and Heritage, Commerce will enter into a sole source contract with Heritage for the SelectUSA 2025 Maryland Booth.

Under the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.05.02 Sole Source Procurement – Conditions for Use, a sole source procurement is not permissible unless a requirement is available from only one vendor. The determination as to whether a procurement shall be made as a sole source shall be made by the procurement officer, with the approval of the agency head or designee.

Under COMAR 21.05.05.02(A)(1), a sole source procurement is permissible when only one source meets the requirements. Here, Heritage is the only vendor available that can meet the requirements for the booth build and deliver it to the SelectUSA Summit in May 2025.

An Office of State Procurement (OSP) Procurement Review Group (PRG) meeting was held for this sole source procurement on January 15, 2025, and it was determined that neither the Small Business Reserve nor Minority Business Enterprise nor Veteran-Owned Business Enterprise goals were appropriate for this contract.

Requesting Agency Remarks: On May 10, 2024, DGS advertised a notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). Additionally, DGS sent automated notifications to 2,332 vendors through eMMA and directly solicited 220 vendors (with more than 600 certified minority-owned businesses from the MDOT MBE Directory included among these figures). Ultimately, DGS received a total of 200 proposals. Fifty-four (54) proposals were not reasonably susceptible for award for various deficiencies, such as failing to complete and submit the required MBE and VSBE forms and proposing to more than one Functional Area. One hundred and forty-six (146) proposals were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for contract award—fifty-nine (59) in FA 1, thirty-six (36) in FA 2, and fifty-one (51) in FA 3.

Functional Area 1 – The RFP stated that up to 15 awards would be made in FA 1. The top 14 offerors, who ranked overall from #1 to #14, are recommended for awards because they were determined to be the most advantageous to the State. These offerors provided proposals that fully addressed the RFP's evaluation criteria, contained little or no material weaknesses, and offered prices DGS deemed reasonable.

Functional Area 2 - The RFP stated that up to 20 awards would be made in FA 2. The top 20 offerors who ranked overall from #1 to #20 are recommended for awards because they were determined to be the most advantageous to the State. These offerors provided proposals that fully addressed the RFP's evaluation criteria, contained little or no material weaknesses, and offered prices DGS deemed reasonable.



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INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (*cont'd*)

Functional Area 3 - The RFP stated that up to 5 awards would be made in FA 3. The top 5 Offerors, who ranked overall from #1 to #5, are recommended for awards because they were determined to be the most advantageous to the State. These offerors provided proposals that fully addressed the RFP's evaluation criteria, contained little or no material weaknesses, and offered prices DGS deemed reasonable.

Throughout the term of the Contract, each request for IT resources or teams and/or the combination will be governed by a work order process in accordance with pre-approved Labor Categories with the fully loaded rates contained in the offerors' financial proposals or financial best and final offers. The State will rotate work assignments among the awarded contractors by issuing work order requests in the order of highest to lowest overall ranked Contractor. This sequence will repeat as necessary throughout the life of the Contract for each functional area.

This procurement is designed to provide State agencies with Contractors who offer an extensive variety of Agile services. As a result of the awards from this solicitation, State agencies will obtain agile IT resources quickly and efficiently and specifically to agencies' needs. This contracting vehicle is also available to Maryland local and county government jurisdictions and not-for-profit entities within the State of Maryland, as defined in State Finance and Procurement 13-110(a)(5) - (7).

An overall MBE subcontracting goal of 25% applies to all Functional Areas. All awardees have committed to meeting the goal. Two awardees, ServBeyond Solutions LLC and Cyquent, Inc., have committed to exceeding the goal by 5% for an overall 30% MBE goal. An overall 5% VSBE participation was established for all three Functional Areas. All awardees have committed to meeting the goal, and several awardees have committed to exceeding the goal. BH Zion, LLC committed to exceeding the goal by 15% for a total VSBE participation of 20%. IStream Infotech, Inc. committed to exceeding the goal by 7.5% for a total of 12.5% VSBE participation. CW Professional Services committed to exceeding the goal by .5% for a total of 5.5 % VSBE participation. Cyquent, Inc. committed to exceeding the goal by 1% for a total of 6% VSBE. Functional Area 3 was designated as SBR only.

Twenty-one protests were received. Eighteen were denied, two sustained, and one pending DGS response (Attachment III). The protests raise concerns about flaws in the evaluation process, failure to follow RFP criteria, and discrepancies in the award process. Several protests also allege unclear evaluation standards, particularly regarding undefined terms like "best value" and improper consideration of partnerships or experience. Additionally, several protests argue that the lack of opportunity for oral discussions prevented offerors from clarifying misunderstandings or addressing minor issues. In response, DGS maintains that the evaluations were conducted in strict adherence to the RFP requirements and that all proposals were assessed based on the established RFP criteria.

Given the shortcomings identified in all submissions, none of the proposals protested met the necessary standards for an award and, therefore, were determined not to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for an award. Ten appeals were filed with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA), one of which was dismissed with prejudice on February 7th. No hearing dates have been set for the remaining nine appeals.

At this time, DGS is requesting approval of these contract awards, based on the substantial state interests outlined below, in the face of the ongoing protests and nine remaining appeals to ensure the continuity of essential services that meet Maryland citizens' health and welfare needs.

The Statewide Agile contract is integral to supporting the operational requirements of Maryland's health and human services benefit programs on the MD THINK platform. These programs serve vital state departments, including the Department of Human Services (DHS), Maryland Department of Health (MDH), Maryland Health Benefit Exchange (MHBE), and the Department of Public Safety and Corrections (DPSCS). The contract provides the necessary resources to maintain daily operations, perform critical platform maintenance, and implement essential system enhancements and new functionalities. Without the award of this contract, the State would be unable to deliver a range of essential services, such as:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA)
- Home Energy Programs (OHEP) & Energy Assistance
- Emergency Assistance to Families with Children (EAFC)
- non-Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) Medicaid
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- eMedicaid Provider Portal
- Medicaid Enterprise Systems Provider Management Module
- Medicaid Long-Term Services and Support (LTSS)
- Maryland Health Connection
- Child Support Collections & Distributions
- Child Welfare Support
- Foster Case Services
- Adult Protective and Social Services
- Vital Records Registration (Birth Registration System, Death Registration System)
- Eligibility Validation System Interactive Voice Response



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These programs are funded through significant federal support, which mandates state preapproval for any contracts receiving Federal Financial Participation (FFP) (45 CFR 95.611). The approval process for these contracts typically requires 60 days, and no work orders can be issued until that approval is obtained. As such, awarding these contracts is critical to ensuring the uninterrupted delivery of these essential services that millions of Maryland residents rely on.
